FOOTBALL VISITS LSU

» No. 9 Auburn (6-1, 3-1) visits No. 2 LSU (7-0, 3-0) on Saturday, October 26, for a 2:30 p.m. game at Tiger Stadium in Baton Rouge, La., televised by CBS.

SERIES HISTORY

» Auburn trails the all-time series with LSU 30-22-1. LSU has won the last nine matchups in Baton Rouge; the home team has won 16 of the last 19 in the series. Ten of the last 15 meetings in the series have been decided by seven points or less, including the last three, which have been decided by a total of 11 points.

Since the SEC moved to two divisions in 1992, LSU leads the series just 15-12. In 23 of the last 24 meetings between Auburn and LSU, at least one of the teams was ranked at the time of the game; in 13 of those, both teams were ranked. From 2002-2014 at least one team was ranked in the AP Top 10 at the time of the matchup, with both teams ranked in the top 10 three times in that stretch (2006, 2008 and 2010).

» This will be the tenth time Auburn has faced the nation's No. 1 or No. 2-ranked team during the Gus Malzahn era. The Tigers are 3-6 in the previous nine games (3-4 vs. No. 1, 0-2 vs. No. 2). This will be the fifth all-time matchup of Top 10 teams in the Auburn-LSU series; others were in 1972, 2006, 2008 and 2010. The series is tied 2-2 in those games.

» Auburn is 314-163-18 (.652) all-time in October. Auburn's October home record is 172-35-3 (.828). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 142-128-15 (.521) in October. Auburn is 17-7 in October under Gus Malzahn. Auburn is 10-5 on October 26 all-time, and 3-2 against SEC teams on that date.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn kickers set an NCAA record converting 304 consecutive PAT attempts. The streak ran from the 2013 Tennessee game through Saturday's game at Arkansas; previous record was 302 by Florida State (2012-16)

» Tigers have earned nine SEC weekly player of the week awards through seven games: Derrick Brown (DL/2), Marlon Davidson (DL/3), Jeremiah Dinson (DPOW), Mike Horton (OL), Bo Nix (FR/2)

» Auburn held four of its first seven opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing (90 yds by #11 Oregon; 92 by Kent State; 56 by #17 Texas A&M; 52 by Arkansas). The Tigers have now held 16 of 46 opponents below 100 yards rushing since the start of the 2016 season

» The LSU game is Gus Malzahn's 100th as a collegiate head coach; he is 59-28 at Auburn and went 9-3 at Arkansas State in 2012

» With 10 fumble recoveries and 11 forced fumbles, Auburn ranks third nationally behind UAB and Illinois (12) in both categories

» As a team, Auburn is tied for ninth nationally with 20 rushing TDs this season, just five shy of the Tigers' total from the entire 2018 season. Auburn is averaging 239.6 rushing yards per game, 11th among FBS schools. The Tigers have run for 978 yards after halftime, fifth among FBS teams

» Auburn is one of 10 FBS teams that haven't allowed more than 24 points in a game this season; others: California, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, Ohio State, Penn State, San Diego State, UAB, Wisconsin

» Auburn is tied for 16th nationally with 21 plays from scrimmage of at least 30 yards, just three less than it had in all of 2018

SEC HONOR ROLL

» There were 21 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2018 season, including current team members Chris Bobo, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Tanner Dean, Josh French, Phelps Gambill, Marquel Harrell, Alec Jackson, Trent Kelley, Traivon Leonard, Spencer Nigh, Jordyn Peters, Jacob Rogers, Prince Micheal Sammons, Sam Sherrod, Bill Taylor and Barrett Tindall. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athletes will also be recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 12 players honored in 2018-19, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Tanner Dean, Jack Driscoll, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Erik Piedy, Jacob Rogers, Malcolm Russell, Sam Sherrod and Anthony Schwartz.

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had 13 representatives on the 2018-19 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Devonte Booker, Jack Driscoll, Jalil Irvin, Jacob Jasinski, Harold Joiner, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Cameron Payne, Erik Piedy, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, Cord Sandberg and Brooks Walton.

FRESHMAN DEBUT

» Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946, a 13-12 Auburn win vs. Southern Miss in Montgomery. Nix was the first SEC true freshman quarterback to start a season opener since Tennessee's Brent Schaeffer in 2004.

» Against Mississippi State, Nix posted the first 300-yard passing game of his career, completing 16-21 attempts for 335 yards and two touchdowns. He was also Auburn's leading rusher with 56 yards and a rushing TD, earning SEC freshman of the week honors.

» Nix was 13-31 for 177 yards passing with two scores vs. Oregon, with 4-6 passing on the gamewinning drive, capped by a 26-yard TD to Seth Williams, and converting a 4th-and-3 rushing, earning SEC freshman of the week.

Against Tulane, Nix was 19-37 passing for 207 yards including a 31-yard touchdown pass to Will Hastings. He added touchdown passes to Eli Stove vs. Kent State and again to Seth Williams at Texas A&M and at Florida.

Nix had three TD passes and a rushing score at Arkansas.

For the season, Nix is 95-169 passing for 1,301 yards with a 136.44 efficiency rating, three touchdown runs and and 11 TD passes.

» Bo Nix' father Patrick made his starting debut as an Auburn junior in the 1994 season opener at Ole Miss, a 22-17 Auburn win. Patrick Nix was 17-5-1 as a starter during his career.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn totaled 633 yards of total offense against Kent State, the 21st 600-yard game in program history, the most yards since recording 688 yards vs. ULM in 2016 and 10th-most in program history.

There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 27 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 18 times; the latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State, and nine times against SEC teams, including a 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss last year.

» Auburn has scored in all 87 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

» The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 32 times in 86 games, 50+ points 16 times and 60+ points three times.

» Auburn has scored first in 28 of its last 38 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including nine times last season. The Tigers are 44-13 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

» Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 60-87 (.689) games, with 35 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State, the sixth time the Tigers have gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.92 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 53 of 87 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Thirteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (67 100-yd performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 42-11; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

Auburn is 21-1 since the start of 2017 when the Tigers rush for 130+ yards, with 16 straight victories.

» The Tigers' 467 rushing yards against Kent State were the sixth most in program history and the most since running for 543 yards vs. Arkansas in 2016.

Auburn had three players with 100+ rushing yards – JaTarvious Whitlow (135), Joey Gatewood (102), Shaun Shivers (102) for the first time since 1983 -- Tommie Agee (219), Lionel James (115), Bo Jackson (105) vs. Maryland.

» Current players' 100-yard rushing games: **JaTarvious Whitlow (5)**: Alabama St, 2018 (122); LSU, 2018 (104); Ole Miss, 2018 (170); Oregon, 2019 (110); Kent St, 2019 (135).

Kam Martin (3): Alabama A&M, 2016 (176); Georgia Southern, 2017 (136); Liberty, 2018 (116)

» With his 135-yard, 2 TD performance against Kent State, Whitlow became Auburn's 47th career 1,000-yard rusher. Whitlow gained 787 yards as a freshman and started this year with a 110-yard performance vs. Oregon and 96 yards against Tulane, with a 14-yard score.

He scored three first-half rushing touchdowns against Mississippi State, gaining 55 yards on just 10 carries. Whitlow has 13 career rushing touchdowns (seven this season, second in the SEC) and two career TD receptions.

This season, Whitlow's production in the second half has netted 351 rushing yards on 66 second-half carries (5.32 ypc), an average of 70.2 yards per game in the second half.

With 1,331 career rushing yards, the sophomore ranks 38th among Auburn leaders.

» The Tigers have run for 978 yards after halftime, fifth among FBS teams, including 32 runs of 10+ yards after intermission (2nd). Auburn has gained 518 fourth-quarter ground yards (5th), including six TDs (T-7th). The Tigers' 18 runs of 10+ yards in the final period are tied for third-most among FBS teams.

» Auburn is tied for 16th nationally with 21 plays from scrimmage of at least 30 yards, just three less than it had in all of 2018.

» Entering 2019, Auburn's 99 combined career starts from its starting offensive line ranked 10th among FBS schools; Oregon was the leader with 153. The AU line has 134 combined starts through seven games.

» The Tigers rank 14th nationally with 50 rushes of 10+ yards, are tied for 13th with nine rushes of 30+ yards and are tied for 11th with 17 pass plays of at least 30 yards.

» Sophomore Seth Williams posted the second 100-yard receiving game of his career with a career-best 161 yards on a career-high eight catches against Mississippi State, including touchdowns of 39 and 32 yards from Bo Nix (the most yards in a game by an Auburn receiver since 2014; Sammie Coates 206 vs. Alabama).

Williams is tied for 11th nationally with seven receptions of at least 30 yards, and is 17th nationally with 10 catches of 20+ yards. His seven TD catches already exceed his 2018 season total (5).

Williams, who scored the game-winning touchdown against Oregon on a 26-yard reception from Bo Nix with just 0:09 remaining, caught three passes for 44 yards on the game-winning drive. He added a 40-yard reception in the win over Tulane and a 9-yard TD catch from Nix at Texas A&M.

After a 32-yard TD reception from Nix at Florida and TD catches of 48 and 15 yards at Arkansas, Williams now has seven touchdowns for the season and 12 career TD catches. He's the first Auburn player with TD catches in four straight games since Darius Slayton in 2017.

With eight receiving yards vs. LSU, Williams will become the 28th player in Auburn history with 1,000 career receiving yards.

In his career, 42 of Williams' 51 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on all five of his red zone receptions and four of his eight catches in the fourth quarter.

» Redshirt junior Eli Stove has surpassed 1,000 career yards from scrimmage (75 receptions for 697 yards and two scores and 47 rushing attempts for 502 yards and four TD).

Stove's first score of the 2019 campaign was an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon; he added a 4-yard rushing touchdown against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

» Anthony Schwartz's 57-yard touchdown run at Texas A&M was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play this season. After adding a 13-yard TD run against Mississippi state, Schwartz recorded a 28-yard catch at Arkansas and now has seven career rushing scores and 10 overall scores. This season, 13 of his 18 touches have resulted in a TD or first down.

Last year, Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the season and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

» Auburn is 12-14 in the red zone with 12 TDs in SEC play. The Tigers' 85.71 TD percentage is 14 percentage points higher than any other team in the league. LSU, which has scored a TD on 71.43 percent of its red zone trips, is second.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

» Marlon Davidson has been selected as the SEC defensive lineman of the week three times this season, recording six tackles, 2.0 TFL and three QB hurries against Tulane and six tackles, 2.5 sacks vs. Kent State.

He added a team-best five tackles, 3.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery at Arkansas, making him the first Auburn player to record multiple sacks, TFL and force/recover a fumble in the same game since Nick Fairley at Alabama in 2010.

Davidson has 29 tackles, 8.5 TFL (2nd in SEC) and 5.5 sacks this season.

With 46 consecutive starts, Davidson ranks second nationally among FBS players in consecutive starts, behind Louisiana Tech OL Ethan Reed (47).

» A Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist, Derrick Brown was the SEC defensive lineman of the week vs. Texas A&M with four tackles, two sacks, three TFL, a forced fumble and two PBU against the Aggies; he was the Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week, Bednarik player of the week and a nominee for Lott IMPACT Trophy national player of the week. Two sacks and three TFL were career single-game bests for Brown.

Brown added four tackles, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and a 9-yard sack in his dominant performance at Florida, earning another SEC weekly award; he has 137 career tackles, 26.0 TFL and 12.0 sacks.

» Senior safety Jeremiah Dinson earned SEC defensive player of the week honors with his 13-tackle performance against Oregon; he also had two TFL and a 6-yard sack.

Dinson followed that performance up with an interception and a team-best six tackles vs. Tulane in week two and a team-high eight tackles vs. Kent State. He had four tackles, a 16-yard sack and a fumble recovery vs. Mississippi State.

Dinson leads the squad with 46 tackles this season and ranks 17th in the SEC in tackles averaging 6.6 per contest.

» Auburn has held 15 of 47 opponents (14-1 record) below 300 yards total offense in Steele's four seasons. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 10 first-quarter touchdowns in the last 38 games, and only nine in the opening period since the start of 2017 (four last season).

» Auburn has allowed only 18.09 points per game in Kevin Steele's four seasons as coordinator, seventh among FBS teams.

Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.

» Auburn joins Alabama, Clemson and Washington as the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense each of the last three seasons.

» Auburn has allowed a touchdown on just 58 of its opponents' 134 red zone chances in Steele's tenure as defensive coordinator. The 43.3 red zone touchdown percentage is best in the country since the start of the 2016 season.

» In 20 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 22.7 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (40.0 percent).

Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked opponents to 17 or fewer points (18.4 percent).

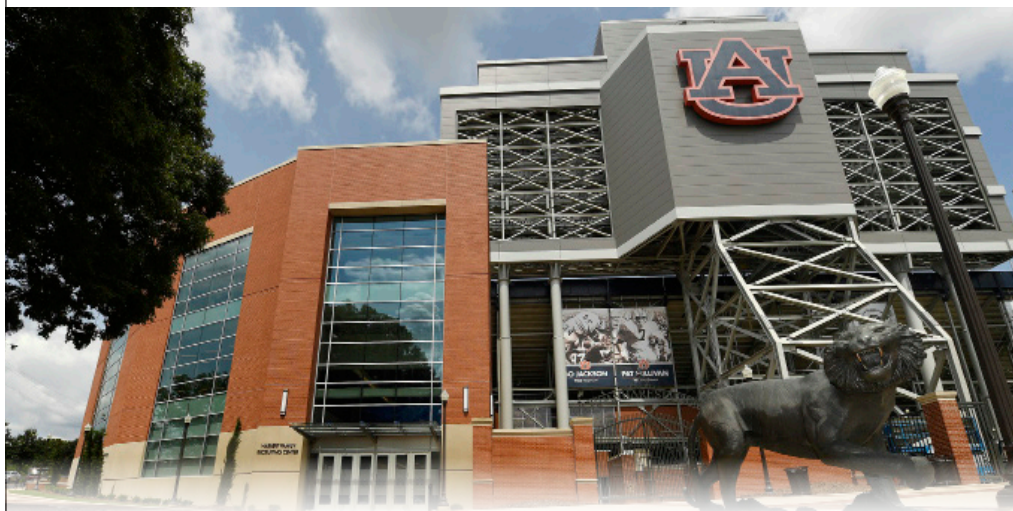

» Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 32 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 94 total TD during that span.

» Auburn is one of 10 FBS teams that haven't allowed more than 24 points in any game this season; others: California, Clemson, Georgia, Iowa, Ohio State, Penn State, San Diego State, UAB and Wisconsin.

» Under Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 38 times, including 21 of the last 23 games (not including season openers), the latest being vs. Arkansas. In 30 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.

» Five current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles at Auburn:

» Auburn has at least five TFL in every game this season and is tied for 19th nationally (2nd in SEC) with 54 TFL; the Tigers lead the league with 8.0 TFL per game in SEC play.

In 47 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 120 sacks (2.55 per game) and has been held without a sack only six times.

Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 30 of those games, most recently 11.0 at Florida, 9.0 at Arkansas and 7.0 at Texas A&M.

The Tigers have forced 69 turnovers (33 INT, 36 FR) and allowed only 31 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» At Arkansas, the Auburn defense recorded two interceptions in a game (Javaris Davis, Chandler Wooten) for the first time since last season's Music City Bowl. Career interceptions by current players:

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» Auburn recovered four opponent fumbles at Florida, the most for the Tigers in a game since 2002 vs. Mississippi State. Auburn recovered three fumbles in the first quarter; in records dating back through 1996, it was the first game Auburn recovered three fumbles in a quarter. The last time Auburn recovered two fumbles in a quarter was vs. Arkansas in 2017 (third quarter).

At Florida, Derrick Brown recovered two of the fumbles, and his 42-yard return was a career long. Brown, K.J. Britt, Daniel Thomas and Christian Tutt forced Gator fumbles; the recoveries were by Brown (2), Tyrone Truesdell and Chandler Wooten.

» Big Kat Bryant's 83-yard fumble recovery against Oregon was the first of his career and the longest fumble return by Auburn through records back through the 1996 season; the previous long during that period was an 82-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Justin Garrett vs. Louisville in 2015.

» Jeremiah Dinson grabbed the season's first interception with a third-quarter pick against Tulane, his third career interception. Javaris Davis and Chandler Wooten had interceptions at Arkansas.

Daniel Thomas forced and recovered a fumble at Texas A&M. Zakoby McClain and Owen Pappoe forced fumbles vs. Mississippi State, and Jeremiah Dinson and Jordyn Peters had fumble recoveries against the Bulldogs.

» Auburn is 30-8 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 14-5 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-15 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +34 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's head coaching tenure.

The Tigers are 21-5 when they play turnover-free football and 41-14 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn.

» Auburn is 50-18 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 31-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 9-10 when it fails to force a turnover.

» The Tigers are 17-4 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn has won 20 straight games (18-0 mark under Malzahn) when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers have scored 22 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, nine interceptions and one missed field goal.

» Here's a breakdown of Auburn's offensive production on first, second, third and fourth down, in terms of the plays run, yards gained and average gain:

» Auburn's offensive TDs have come 17 times on first down (9 rush, 8 pass), 13 times on second (9 rush, 4 pass), twice on third down (1 rush, 1 pass) and once on fourth down (1 rush).

RANKINGS

» The Tigers, which defeated #11 Oregon 27-21 in the season opener and won 28-20 at #17 Texas A&M, join Arizona State, BYU, Colorado, LSU, Penn State, Southern Cal and Temple as the only teams to defeat two teams ranked in the AP Top 25 this season.

Auburn's two wins are two of only 15 over top 25 opponents away from home this season in college football; Auburn and the Sun Devils are the only teams with two wins over ranked opponents away from home this season.

It's the first time since 1974 Auburn has beaten two ranked teams in its first four games of a season (#14 Tennessee, #16 Miami).

» Auburn is 112-160-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 51-41-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-69-2 on the road and 33-50-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn has played 38 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 87 games as the Tigers' head coach (43.7 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 21 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 18-20 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 7-14 against Top 10 teams.

» Auburn is 16-19 all-time against ranked non-conference opponents in regular-season action, including 10-7 at home, 3-7 on the road and 3-5 at neutral-site locations.

» The Oregon game was the fifth time in Gus Malzahn's seven seasons as Auburn's head coach that the Tigers have played a regular-season non-conference game against a ranked opponent (3-2 record). Prior to Malzahn's tenure, Auburn had only played four such games in the previous 22 seasons combined.

» Auburn is the only FBS team to open the last two seasons with a win over an AP-ranked opponent (#6 Washington, #11 Oregon).

» The Tigers are 88-129-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (41-32-2 at home, 28-62-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 57-49-3 overall (27-9-1 at home, 19-30-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

The last time the Tigers lost a game in which it scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Onterio McCalebb kickoff return to start the second half.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Auburn kickers converted 304 consecutive PAT attempts between the 2013 Tennessee game and this year's Arkansas contest, setting the NCAA record.

Cody Parkey (2013) Daniel Carlson (2014-17), Ian Shannon (2015-18) and Sage Ledbetter (2017-19) were Auburn's other kickers during the streak; Daniel Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating.

The previous NCAA record was 302 consecutive PAT kicks made by Florida State from 2012-16.

» Auburn is tied with Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (137) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Last season, Anders Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

This season, Carlson is 30-31 on PAT and 8-10 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida. He is 34-45 on touchbacks on kickoffs, 13th nationally.

» With 617 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (708 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally last year in net punting (41.91), the highest net average at Auburn back through 1996. Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards. His career best was a 60-yarder vs. Arkansas.

Siposs is ranked 39th nationally this season with a 43.3 average.

» Christian Tutt is fourth in the country averaging 15.4 yards on 13 punt returns this season. Tutt is tied for third nationally with four returns of at least 20 yards. He is tied for second in the nation with two returns of 30+ yards and is one of 35 players with a return of 40 or more yards (41 yards vs. Oregon).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 324-116-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 182-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-85-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 79-72-4 (34-12-1 at home, 22-38-1 away and 23-22-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» Senior offensive lineman Jack Driscoll, an MBA student, is a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, recognizing the best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

» Derrick Brown is one of 30 nominees for the Senior CLASS Award, presented to an FBS senior with notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

» Derrick Brown is also a Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist, recognizing the collegiate defensive player who makes the biggest IMPACT on his team both on and off the field nationally. IMPACT stands for Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity.

» Five of Auburn's first eight games are away from Jordan-Hare Stadium, including all three games in the month of October. It is the first time since September, 1978, that the Tigers will play all of its games in a calendar month away from home (min. 3 games).

The Tigers travel 2,520 miles this regular season, second-most in the SEC, trailing only Texas A&M (2,534 miles).

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 322-251-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 135-59-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 187-191-12 overall. The Tigers are 31-21 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

» In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 253-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 26-6.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 146-26 (.849) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 202-34-1 (.854) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 541-54-9 (.903) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 339-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 171-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 80-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» Team captains for 2019 are DL Derrick Brown and Marlon Davidson and DBs Jeremiah Dinson and Daniel Thomas.

» On the 2019 squad, 37 players now have at least one college start to their credit, 22 on offense and 15 on defense.

Auburn had six first-time starters against Oregon: Bo Nix, Marquis McClain, Spencer Nigh, Shaun Shivers, K.J. Britt and Owen Pappoe. Tyrone Truesdell was a first-time starter against Tulane, and Bailey Sharp made his first start versus Kent State. James Owens Moss was a first-time starter at Texas A&M.

Ten Tigers now have at least 20 college starts: Marlon Davidson 46, Jack Driscoll 39 (20@UMass), Derrick Brown 33, Javaris Davis 31, Jeremiah Dinson 31, Mike Horton 27, Prince Tega Wanogho 26, Marquel Harrell 26, Daniel Thomas 22 and Eli Stove 20.

» A linebacker at Auburn from 2000-03, Dansby earned All-America honors as a senior, recording 84 tackles, 5.5 quarterback sacks, 13 tackles for loss and four caused fumbles while helping an Auburn defense that finished fifth nationally in total defense. Twice first team all-SEC, Dansby recorded 218 tackles, 10 sacks, 31 TFL and eight interceptions. The 2003 Atlanta Touchdown Club DB of the Year, Dansby helped Auburn to a pair of SEC West titles. A 2004 second-round pick of the Arizona Cardinals, Dansby enjoyed a 14-year NFL career with four teams, becoming one of five players in NFL history to record 40 career sacks and 20 interceptions. He concluded his career with 1,417 tackles, 43 sacks, 127 tackles for loss and 20 interceptions in 212 games.

#12 LSU 22, #7 AUBURN 21

>> JaTarvious Whitlow rushed for 104 yards and a touchdown but No. 12 LSU kicked a field goal as time expired to beat No. 7 Auburn 22-21.

LSU, aided by two pass-interference penalties, drove 52 yards on 14 plays to set up Cole Tracy's 42-yard game winner.

Leading 14-10 in the third quarter, Jarrett Stidham's 4-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton on third-and-goal gave Auburn a two-score lead.

Slayton's touchdown marked 21 unanswered points for Auburn, turning a 10-point deficit into an 11-point lead. Auburn's drive began at its own 45, after LSU's fake punt jump pass fell incomplete.

LSU kicked a field goal late in the third quarter to cut the lead to 21-13, then scored on a 71-yard pass from Joe Burrow to Derrick Dillon to make it 21-19 with 8:18 to play.

LSU went for two, hoping to tie, but Jamel Dean broke up Burrow's pass in the end zone, preserving Auburn's lead.

Deshaun Davis led Auburn's defense with 13 tackles, a sack and four tackles for loss. Derrick Brown added nine tackles.

Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter after an LSU field goal, Auburn drove 75 yards on 10 plays for its first score.

On third-and-6, Stidham connected with Slayton for 9 yards, then found Seth Williams for 19 yards across midfield.

From the 7, Whitlow ran up the middle for Auburn's first touchdown, trimming LSU's lead to 10-7.

Auburn's defense responded with a three-and-out, with a third down sack from Davis forcing an LSU punt, giving the home team possession again less than a minute after its touchdown.

The Tigers marched 66 yards on nine plays to take the lead, mixing passes from Stidham to Williams and Chandler Cox with runs by Whitlow and Shaun Shivers.

Shivers gave Auburn a 14-10 lead with a 7-yard touchdown run to the left with 1:31 remaining in the half.

Stidham completed 16 of 28 passes for 198 yards and a touchdown. Whitlow averaged 4.7 yards on 22 carries, including a 19-yarder.

LSU led 7-0 after capitalizing on an interception on Auburn's first possession at Auburn's 34. The Bengal Tigers added a field goal with 8:37 remaining in the second quarter to lead 10-0.

GUS MALZAHN » HEAD COACH

FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.

» Now beginning his seventh season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **58**, **Gus Malzahn (6)**; **48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **29**, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4).

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 23 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season three times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win a SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 43-10 (.811) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018 and 3-0 in 2019 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In eight seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 70 of 86 games (82%).

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 54 of 84 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 415 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 327, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Nine years ago, Auburn beat Oregon on a last-second field goal. On Saturday night, quarterback Bo Nix didn't want to put it on the kicker again. Instead, the true freshman tossed a 26-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams with nine seconds left to lead the Tigers past Oregon, 27-21, in the season opener.

On the play before, Nix completed a 13-yard pass to Williams to put the Tigers in field-goal range with a chance to win. But rather than play it safe, he took a shot on the next play, throwing a jump ball to Williams who wrestled it away from the defender at the goal line.

The touchdown gave Auburn its first lead of the game and capped a 15-point second-half comeback. It was the largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game when the Tigers overcame a 24-point deficit to win 28-27.

What changed? For starters, the defense clamped down in the second half and made a huge stop on fourth down midway through the fourth quarter to thwart an Oregon drive and keep it a one-point game. The offense also found its rhythm with Nix under center.

Nix, the first true freshman to start at quarterback for Auburn since 1946, threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 42 yards in his first college game. His first career touchdown pass came late in the third quarter when he threw a quick pass to Eli Stove who took it in from 11 yards out to cut the Oregon lead to 21-13.

On the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Auburn used a heavy dose of running back Ja'Tarvious Whitlow to get down to the goal line where it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who took his first snap and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 21-20.

Whitlow recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 24 carries. The sophomore also surpassed 1,000 career all-purpose yards (897 rushing, 173 receiving). As a team, the Tigers ran for 206 yards and threw for 177 yards in Saturday's win.

Defensively, senior safety Jeremiah Dinson led Auburn with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack - the third of his career. K.J. Britt, making his first at middle linebacker, finished second on the team with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

It was also a career night for defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell, another first-time starter, who made two clutch stops late and recorded six tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

At the half, Auburn trailed, 14-6, and it could have been worse if not for an 83-yard fumble recovery from Big Kat Bryant that led to an Anders Carlson field goal and swung the momentum. It was the longest fumble return by an Auburn player through records dating back to 1996.

With the win, the Tigers open the season 1-0 for the third straight year. They will return home next week to face Tulane in the first game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn did not allow a touchdown in the No. 10 Tigers' 24-6 home-opening win Saturday over Tulane.

"Defensively, we did a super job against an offense that's been averaging a lot of points and a lot of yards rushing," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "They were 2-of-15 on third down. It was just a great third-down plan and execution."

Jeremiah Dinson's interception led to a touchdown as the Tigers shut out the Green Wave in the second half.

"The defensive line got a good push," Dinson said. "The quarterback tried to hit the tight end and the ball was in the air for a long time. I was the middle field safety, just ran it down and made a play."

After Dinson picked off Tulane at Auburn's 18-yard line, the Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays with Ja'Tarvious Whitlow rushing for a 14-yard touchdown and a 21-6 Auburn lead with 1:51 left in the third quarter.

Whitlow led Auburn with 96 yards on 23 carries.

Anders Carlson kicked a 22-yard field goal with 12:36 left in the game for the final score.

Bo Nix completed 19 of 37 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown.

"The offense played well in the second half and the defense played lights out the entire game," said Nix, who made his Jordan-Hare Stadium debut. "In college football, any win is great."

Dinson, Daniel Thomas and Marlon Davidson paced Auburn's defense with six tackles each. Davidson made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

The Tigers gained 152 of their 172 rushing yards in the second half, outgaining Tulane 379-223 for the game.

"Second half, we changed it up a little bit and we got our groove," offensive lineman Jack Driscoll said. "In big-time games coming up, we've got to be able to establish the run in the first half."

Trailing 3-0 after the first quarter, Nix hit Will Hastings for a 31-yard touchdown pass to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 12:54 left in the half. Hastings gained 75 yards on five receptions.

"It felt really, really good," said Hastings, who rehabilitated from two knee surgeries in the past 18 months. "It was awesome getting in the end zone and celebrating with my teammates."

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix connected with Seth Williams for a 40-yard gain to Tulane's 1.

Eli Stove capped the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run to increase Auburn's lead to 14-3. Tulane kicked a 32-yard field goal with 40 seconds left in the second quarter to make it 14-6 at the half.

A crowd of 85,317 attended the Tigers' home opener. Auburn (2-0) remains at home next week, hosting Kent State at 6 p.m. CT for Homecoming.

"I think it's a quality win and we took care of business," Malzahn said. "They played extremely hard and that was a quality opponent. We're 2-0 and we're looking forward to playing at home next week."

Revvng up the running game, No. 8 Auburn rushed for 467 yards and six touchdowns in a 55-16 Homecoming win over Kent State Saturday in the Tigers' tune-up for SEC play.

JaTarvious Whitlow gained 135 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns. Shaun Shivers and Joey Gatewood each rushed for 102 yards. It's the first time since 1983 a trio of Auburn rushers has topped the 100-yard mark.

Kam Martin added 71 yards and a touchdown on seven carries. Quarterbacks Bo Nix (one) and Gatewood (two) added rushing touchdowns. The Tigers averaged 7.5 yards on 62 carries.

SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Marlon Davidson recorded 2.5 of Auburn's five sacks. Tyrone Truesdell had 1.5 sacks with Big Kat Bryant getting one.

After Kent State kicked a field goal on the game's opening drive, Auburn answered with Whitlow rushing for a 3-yard TD with 5:47 left in the first quarter to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead.

Martin made it 14-3 on a 35-yard scoring run with 11 seconds remaining in the opening quarter.

After a Kent State 53-yard touchdown pass, Nix hit Sal Cannella on a 27-yard pass to set up Nix's 1-yard TD run.

Anders Carlson kicked a 45-yard field goal at the end of the half to give Auburn a 24-10 halftime lead.

Whitlow scored his second rushing touchdown on the opening drive of the second half putting the Tigers on top 31-10.

Nix hit Eli Stove on a 49-yard flea-flicker for a 38-10 Auburn lead. Nix was 12 of 16 for 161 yards and a touchdown.

Shivers' 27-yard run set up Carlson's second field goal, a 37-yarder on the opening play of the fourth quarter to make it 41-10.

After Kent State's second touchdown, Malcolm Askew intercepted the Golden Flashes' pass to negate a two-point attempt.

Gatewood scored on a pair of 2-yard runs in the fourth quarter.

A Homecoming crowd of 84,542 saw the Tigers improve to 26-6 in non-conference games in the Malzahn era.

Auburn (3-0) plays its SEC opener next Saturday at Texas A&M at 2:30 p.m. CT on CBS.

Auburn's perfect record in Kyle Field remains intact after the 8th-ranked Tigers went on the road Saturday and knocked off No. 17 Texas A&M, 28-20, in their first SEC game of 2019. With the win, Auburn is now 4-0 all-time in College Station.

The Tigers struck early and often in Saturday's contest. On their opening drive, sophomore wide receiver Anthony Schwartz took a reverse and went 57 yards to the house to make it 7-0. It was Auburn's longest rush of the season and the longest rush in Schwartz's career. It was also the longest rush by any Auburn in the series against Texas A&M.

Two drives later, Auburn found the end zone again. This time, it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who connected with John Samuel Shenker on a six-yard touchdown pass. For Gatewood, it was his first career touchdown pass.

The Tigers took a 14-3 lead into the locker room at halftime.

In the second half, it was the Auburn defense that served as the catalyst. After allowing just 12 yards rushing to Texas A&M in the first half, the Tigers caused a turnover on the first play of the second half when safety Daniel Thomas forced a fumble and recovered it himself.

The turnover led to another Auburn score as starting quarterback Bo Nix marched the offense down the field and found Seth Williams for a 9-yard touchdown reception to make it 21-3.

Nix, a true freshman who was playing in his first true road game, finished 12 of 20 through the air for 100 yards and the touchdown. He also rushed 12 times for 38 yards, including a 7-yard run on third-and-five late in the fourth quarter to put the game away.

As a team, the Tigers outgained Texas A&M on the ground, 193-56.

The Aggies didn't score their first touchdown until early in the fourth quarter, but Auburn responded with a 12-play, 69-yard drive that took over six minutes and was capped off by an 8-yard touchdown run from JaTarvious Whitlow. The sophomore running back led the Tigers with 67 yards on 18 carries.

Senior Derrick Brown was dominant for the Auburn defense with four tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks, two pass break-ups and a forced fumble. The two sacks and three tackles for loss were single-game career highs for the preseason All-American.

Fellow defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell also added a sack, and the Tigers won the battle up front as they recorded seven tackles for loss, seven quarterback hurries and held Texas A&M to just 56 yards rushing, the fewest by the Aggies all-time in the series.

Auburn, who is now 49-32-5 all-time in SEC openers, moves to 4-0 on the season and will return home to face Mississippi State next Saturday. The game is set to kick off from Jordan-Hare Stadium at 6 p.m. CT and will be televised on ESPN.

A touchdown on the Tigers' first offensive play set the tone Saturday in No. 7 Auburn's 56-23 dismantling of Mississippi State at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

"I'm really excited about the win tonight," Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn said. "The way the game started, our fans were electric and really got into the game and helped us. Our defense and special teams gave the offense some short fields, and they capitalized with touchdowns. It really gave us some momentum."

Quarterback Bo Nix completed 16 of 21 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns, adding 56 rushing yards and a third touchdown.

Auburn (5-0) scored six touchdowns in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission. Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.

The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19. Nix scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second touchdown from three yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark. Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss.

"Overall, I'm proud of our team," Malzahn said. "We had a big, emotional win last week on the road, and it could have been easy to let up or look forward to the next game. Our guys didn't do that. We played our best football game as a team to date tonight."

No. 7 Auburn suffered its first loss of the season Saturday as the Tigers dropped a 24-13 contest on the road at No. 10 Florida.

"Disappointing loss," Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn said. "We've got a very disappointed locker room. Our guys fought. Our defense played outstanding, had four turnovers, gave the offense the ball on some short fields. We just didn't get it done offensively. That starts with me. I have to do a better job of preparing our guys and having our guys ready."

The Gators struck first with a long touchdown on their first possession, but the Auburn defense responded with three turnovers on the next four Florida drives. Two of the turnovers led to field goals (48, 39) by Anders Carlson, who made it 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Sophomore Christian Tutt forced the first turnover when he sacked Florida quarterback Kyle Trask and jarred the ball loose. Chandler Wooten fell in on it for the fumble recovery. It was the first career forced fumble for Tutt and first career fumble recovery for Wooten.

Then, on the very next Florida possession, Auburn linebacker K.J. Britt made a big hit on the running back to pop the ball loose. This time, it was defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell who came up with it for his second career fumble recovery.

And then with Florida knocking on the door late in the quarter, it was the Auburn defense that came up with yet another fumble and recovery. Senior Marlon Davidson shot off the edge and hit Trask just as he was trying to throw the football. Fellow defensive lineman Derrick Brown picked up the loose ball and returned it 42 yards.

In records dating back through 1996, this was the first game the Tigers recovered three fumbles in a quarter.

The Auburn offense found the end zone early in the second quarter when, on the first play after a failed fake punt attempt, quarterback Bo Nix connected with Seth Williams on a 32-yard touchdown pass. It was Nix's eighth touchdown pass this season, and the fifth receiving touchdown for Williams, who now has 10 for his career.

Williams led the Tigers with four catches for 79 yards and the touchdown. Auburn still trailed 17-13 at the half, and it stayed that way for most of the second half until late in the fourth quarter when Florida extended the lead with an 88-yard touchdown run from Lamical Perine.

Prior to that, Brown made another game-changing play early in the fourth quarter when he got to Trask, knocked the ball away and then grabbed it out of the air for his second fumble recovery of the game. The last Auburn player to with two fumble recoveries in a game was Montravius Adams at Mississippi State in 2016.

As a unit, the Auburn defense finished with seven tackles for loss, four sacks and the four fumble recoveries. Sophomore linebacker Zakoby McClain led the way with 10 tackles.

The Tigers are now 5-1 (2-1) heading into an open week, and then in two weeks, it's back on the road for another SEC tilt at Arkansas.

Marlon Davidson and Derrick Brown set the tone on the opening series while the Tigers' quick-strike offense scored seven touchdowns in No. 11 Auburn's 51-10 SEC West victory at Arkansas.

Arkansas won the toss and elected to receive, hoping to gain early momentum. Instead, it was Auburn's defense making a statement from the get-go.

On the second play, the 320-pound Brown ran down Razorbacks running back Rakeem Boyd for no gain. On the next play, Davidson sacked quarterback Ben Hicks, forcing and recovering a fumble at the Arkansas 22-yard line.

Two Bo Nix passes to Anthony Schwartz gained 18 yards, then Nix kept for a 4-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 Auburn lead with 12:38 left in the first quarter.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Kam Martin began another three-play touchdown drive by racing down the right sideline 52 yards to the Razorbacks' 11-yard-line.

Shaun Shivers' 6-yard TD run put Auburn ahead 14-0 fewer than five minutes into the game.

Auburn made it 17-0 with 51 seconds left in the first quarter on Anders Carlson's 44-yard field goal, capping a 13-play, 55-yard drive.

Davidson recorded his second sack on third-and-8 early in the second quarter. On the next play, Chandler Wooten made his first career interception on Arkansas' fake punt pass.

The Razorbacks kicked a 27-yard field goal after a 16-play, 77-yard drive that took half of the third quarter to make it 17-3.

Auburn answered quickly, scoring 14 points in 22 seconds, with Nix hitting Seth Williams for a 48-yard touchdown pass at the 4:10 mark of the third quarter.

Carlson's extra point was Auburn's 303rd consecutive PAT, an NCAA record streak that started in 2013.

Javaris Davis' diving interception immediately regained possession for Auburn, then after Schwartz gained 28 yards on a reverse, Nix and Schwartz combined for a 28-yard touchdown pass and 31-3 Auburn lead.

Arkansas scored its only touchdown on a 45-yard pass after recovering a fumble, trimming Auburn's lead to 31-10 after three quarters.

Nix and Williams hooked up for their second touchdown of the game and seventh TD of the season to put Auburn on top 37-10. After 304 consecutive PATS, Auburn missed the extra-point try.

Joey Gatewood relieved Nix and completed a 17-yard touchdown pass to Jay Jay Wilson, his first Auburn TD.

Harold Joiner capped the scoring with a 32-yard touchdown run.

Davidson, Brown, Roger McCreary and Jamien Sherwood each tallied five tackles to lead Auburn's defense. Michael Harris recovered a fumble for Auburn's fourth takeaway.

Auburn improved to 9-0 after open dates under Malzahn. The Tigers (6-1, 3-1) play their final road game of the regular season next Saturday at LSU at 2:30 p.m. CT.
