## Auburn Women's Basketball Ouick Hitters

- Katie Frerking needs just 16 points for 1,000 in her career
- As of Dec. 23, Auburn ranks third in the nation in turnovers forced (24.7/game), is seventh in the nation in steals (13.3/ game), and sixth in turnover margin (+8.5)
- Auburn is $32-3$ in home non-conference games under Terri Williams-Flournoy and $41-7$ in all non-conference games at Auburn Arena
- This is the second all-time meeting between Auburn and Jacksonville; Auburn won 85-49 in 2012
- The Tigers are $4-1$ all-time vs. opponents from the Atlantic Sun Conference (1-1 vs. FGCU; 1-0 vs. Jacksonville, USC Upstate, Stetson)
- Auburn has held six of 13 opponents at least 10 points below their season scoring average
- Six of Auburn's 11 opponents have been held to a season-low scoring total
- Auburn was ranked No. 23 in the Week 4 AP Top 25; it was the first ranking for Auburn since 2009
- Auburn is $6-0$ this season and $34-6$ under Coach Flo when forcing $25+$ turnovers; Auburn forced 38 vs. Troy, 27 at North Carolina A\&T, 30 at East Carolina, 27 vs. Ball State, 30 vs. Marist; 28 vs. Savannah State
- Eleven of 13 Auburn opponents have committed at least 20 turnovers
- Auburn scored 62 points in the second half vs. Drake; the most in a half since 2008 and two points shy of a school record for points in a half
- Auburn trailed Indiana by 17 points in the fourth quarter before mounting a comeback for a $71-67$ win on Nov. 27
- Auburn's 32 fourth-quarter points vs. Indiana were the most in a single period since women's basketball went to a
four-quarter game in 2015-16
- The Tigers scored 31 points in both the third and fourth quarters vs. Drake
- Janiah McKay scored a career-high 28 points and helped force overtime vs. Virginia Tech (12/18); she followed that up with 25 points vs. Drake (12/21)
- Katie Frerking leads Auburn with 16.5 points/game; Brandy Montgomery is second with 15.5 points/game
- Frerking also leads Auburn in rebounds (7.8), assists (3.1) and steals (3.2)
- Frerking scored a career-high 30 points and had 11 rebounds at Louisiana Tech (12/14)
- Frerking has double-doubles in four games this year; she had two in her career entering the season
- Frerking leads the SEC and ranks among the nation's leaders with 3.1 steals per game
- Frerking had a career-high 7 steals in the win at N.C. A\&T, then matched that with 7 vs. Indiana
- Montgomery scored 28 points in the comeback win over Indiana, including 16 in the fourth quarter and 10 straight over
a 2-minute stretch to tie the game
- Auburn's 32-point win over North Carolina A\&T was its largest margin of victory in a road game since Nov. 11, 2011 at Mercer (34 points; 77-43)
- Jessica Jones set career-highs in rebounds (8), steals (5) and blocks (4) in the first two games; she bettered her rebounding high with 11 against Drake and matched her blocks high with 4 vs. West Virginia

Auburn closes out non-conference play at home on Wednesday, Dec. 28, as the Jacksonville Dolphins visit Auburn Arena at 6 p.m.
") The Tigers enter Wednesday's game at 9-4, coming off a 1-1 week at the Tulane Classic in New Orleans. Auburn defeat Drake 85-80 before falling to Tulane 61-59.
" Jacksonville is 9-3 on the season. The Dolphins fell to North Carolina 87-57 in their last game.

## LAST TIME OUT

" Auburn fought back from a 14-point thirdquarter deficit but came up just short Thursday night in a 61-59 loss to Tulane in the championship game of the Tulane Classic.
" After a slow start, the Tigers (9-4) shot 51.8 percent in the second half and made a late charge to within one point midway through the fourth quarter, but Tulane (8-4) hit several clutch shots down the stretch to hold on for the win.
" Auburn was led by Katie Frerking, who scored all 15 of her points in the second half. She also led the Tigers with six rebounds and six steals. Janiah McKay shook off a slow start to finish with 13 points, and Brandy Montgomery added 11. Erica Sanders matched a career-high with four steals; the Tigers had 15 as a team. Frerking and McKay were named to the alltournament team.
" After forcing just four Tulane turnovers in the first half, Auburn came away with 16 in the second half, turning the Green Wave's 20 turnovers into 27 points. But Tulane was able to control the offensive glass, pulling down 13 offensive rebounds and converting those into 11 points. Both teams made 22 field goals, and both teams made nine 3-pointers matching a season-high for Auburn.

## UP NEXT

The Tigers open SEC play on New Year's Day as they travel to Gainesville, Fla., to face Florida at 1 p.m. CT.

## SERIES HISTORY

" This is the second meeting between Auburn and Jacksonville. Auburn won the previous meeting on
Dec. 22, 2012, in Auburn, 85-49.

## SCOUTING JACIKSONVILLE

" Jacksonville is 9-3 on the season and saw a seven-game winning streak snapped in their last
outing, a 87-57 neutral site loss to North Carolina. Three of the Dolphins' wins are against non-DI opponents, but JU's other two losses are to top-25 teams Florida State and South Florida.
" The Dolphins average 71.0 points per game and outscore their opponents by an average of 10.9 points. JU excels at rebounding, averaging 44.0 per game (22nd nationally), and getting to the free throw line with 273 FT attempts on the year (16th nationally).
" Sherranda Reddick is the nation's 22nd-leading scorer with 20.1 points/game to lead the Dolphins. She ranks fifth nationwide in 3-point FGs with 3.8 per game, and she is 25 th in the nation in 3 -point percentage (46.5\%). Kimberly Dawkins leads JU in rebounds with 8.8.
" Jacksonville upset Florida Gulf Coast in the Atlantic Sun Championship Game last season to earn a berth to the NCAA Tournament. The Dolphins finished 22-11 overall, 11-3 in the ASun, and return four starters from that team.

## LAST MEETING: AUBURN 85, JU 49 (12/22/12)

" Auburn picked up its seventh-straight win and 10th of the season with an 85-49 victory over Jacksonville Saturday at Auburn Arena. The Tigers improved to 10-2, while the Dolphins fell to 4-7.
" Despite not scoring, Najat Ouardad picked up one third of Auburn's assists, setting her career-high with nine.
" Tra'Cee Tanner led the Tigers in scoring and notched her first double-double with 21 points and 12 rebounds. Tanner shot 83 percent from the floor with a career-high 10 field goals made. She and her sister, Tyrese, combined for their best game of the season with 37 points and 15 rebounds. Tyrese Tanner tied her season high in field goals made, shooting 7-for-15 from the floor, to score 16.

## SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn is 9-4 with one game remaining in nonconference play. All of Auburn's losses have come by five points or less, and the Tigers have had the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead in the final seconds of regulation in all four games.
" The Tigers are one of the nation's top teams in forcing turnovers with 24.7 per game (3rd in NCAA). Auburn is seventh in the nation in steals per game (13.3) and first nationwide in total steals (173). The Tigers lead the SEC and rank sixth in the nation in turnover margin (+8.5).
" Katie Frerking is Auburn's leading scorer

## PRESEASON ALL-SEC: BRANDY MONTGOMERY

" Senior Brandy Montgomery was named preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches.
Montgomery was Auburn's leading scorer in 2015-16, averaging 14.0 points per game.

with 16.5 points/game. She also leads the Tigers in rebounds (7.8), steals (3.2) and assists (3.1). Her 3.2 steals per game lead the SEC and rank 22nd in the nation. Frerking has posted all four of Auburn's double-doubles this season and had a career-high 30 points in a win at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 14.
" Brandy Montgomery is Auburn's second-leading scorer with 15.5 points/game. She was named to the preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches. She scored a season-high 28 points - 16 in the fourth quarter - to lead Auburn's comeback from a 17-point deficit against Indiana on Nov. 27.
" Junior forward Jessica Jones has been a force defensively for the Tigers, posting a career-high four blocks twice already this year and pulling down a career-high 11 rebounds vs. Drake. She leads the Tigers in blocks with $1.3 / \mathrm{game}$. She also had five steals in the opener vs. Troy.
" Sophomore point guard Janiah McKay and junior forward Jazmine Jones are the Tigers' other two returning starters. McKay scored a career-high 28 points to lead Auburn's comeback against Virginia Tech, then scored 25 in a victory over Drake three days later. She contributed a career-high eight assists in a Dec. 11 win over Savannah State.
" Jones started all 33 games as a sophomore and had one of the best shooting percentages on the team, shooting $51.5 \%$ from the floor. She scored a seasonhigh 10 points and had a career-high five steals vs. Drake on Dec. 21.

## COMEBACK KIDS

" Auburn trailed Indiana by 17 points early in the fourth quarter on Nov. 27, but outscored the Hoosiers 32-14 in the final period to earn a $71-67$ victory at home. Brandy Montgomery scored 16 points in that fourth quarter, including 10 straight at one point, to lead the Auburn comeback. Erica Sanders hit the goahead jumper with 50 seconds left to give Auburn the lead for good.

## BIG NUMBERS IN THE BIG EASY

" After scoring just 23 points in the first half against Drake, the Tigers scored 62 in the second half, their highest-scoring half in eight years, to post an 8580 win. It was the highest-scoring half since scoring 62 in the second half vs. Sam Houston State in 2008, and the Tigers came within two points of a school record for points in a half ( 64 vs. Jacksonville State, 1/19/99).
" Along with 87 points vs. Virginia Tech on Dec.
18, Auburn's 85 points vs. Drake gave it a two-game
scoring total of 172 points. That's the most points for Auburn in consecutive games since Nov. 15 \& 18, 2012, when Auburn scored 80 vs Alabama State and 93 vs. Alabama A\&M for 173 points over two games

## WORKING OVERTIME

" Auburn is 19-20 all-time in overtime games and 0-1 this season. Auburn fell to \#24 Virginia Tech 92-87 in OT on Dec. 18. It was Auburn's first home overtime loss since 1986.

## GETTING DEFENSIVE

" Through games of Dec. 23, Auburn is the nation's top team in total steals with 173 this season. The Tigers are averaging 13.3 steals per game (7th NCAA) and forcing 24.7 opponent turnovers per game (3rd NCAA). Auburn has forced six of 13 opponents into at least 25 giveaways this season and 11 of 13 into at least 20.
" Auburn has held all but two opponents thus far under their season scoring average, and six have been held 10 or more points below their average.

## SHE'S FRERKING AWESOME

" Through 13 games, senior Katie Frerking leads Auburn in four of five major categories: scoring (16.5 ppg ), rebounds (7.8/game), assists (3.1) and steals (3.2).
" Frerking scored a career-high 30 points along with 11 rebounds in Auburn's win at Louisiana Tech (12/14). She was 9-14 from the field, 5-9 from 3-point range, and 7-8 at the free-throw line. She added 26 points vs. Drake (12/21) and now has four 20-point games this season and seven in her career.

## PLAYER TO WATCH: KATIE FRERKING

"Senior Katie Frerking has recorded four double-doubles this season, and she is Auburn's leader in scoring, rebounds, assists and steals. She leads the SEC and ranks 23nd in the nation in steals (3.2/game).

" Frerking's effort at Louisiana Tech was Auburn's first 30-point game since Montgomery had 30 against Alabama in the 2015 regular-season finale (3/1/15).

## SEEING DOUBLE

" Auburn has four double-doubles so far in 201617, all from senior Katie Frerking.
" $\quad$ Frerking had three double-doubles in four games from Nov. 20-24. She had 10 points and 13 rebounds in a win at East Carolina $(11 / 20), 13$ points and 10 rebounds in Auburn's next game vs. Ball State (11/22), and 18 points and 10 rebounds in a close loss to No. 19 West Virginia (11/24).
" Frerking's fourth double-double came at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 14 when she scored a careerhigh 30 points and had 11 rebounds. It was Auburn's first double-double with 30 points scored since DeWanna Bonner had 32 points and 13 rebounds vs. Ole Miss on Feb. 5, 2009.
" The last Auburn player to have back-to-back double-doubles was Tra'Cee Tanner, who pulled off the feat against Florida Gulf Coast and Kentucky last season.

## CLUB PRESS STILL OPEN FOR BUSINESS

" Through 13 games, Auburn has forced an average of 24.7 opponent turnovers per game. That leads the SEC and ranks third in the nation.
" Auburn has forced 25+ turnovers in six games this year ( 38 vs. Troy; 27 at NC A\&T; 30 at ECU, 27 vs. Ball State, 30 vs. Marist; 28 vs. Savannah State). The Tigers are 6-0 this season and 34-6 under Coach Flo when forcing 25+ turnovers.
" In Auburn's season opener vs. Troy, the Tigers forced the Trojans into 38 turnovers, which ranks fifth all-time in Auburn history. Auburn had 22 steals in the game, two shy of the school record.
" Indiana's 20 turnovers on Nov. 27 were a seasonlow for an Auburn opponent at the time, but the Tigers capitalized with a season-high 33 points off turnovers. " Auburn forced Virginia Tech into a season-high 22 turnovers, turning that into 34 points. VT ranked 3rd in the nation for fewest turnovers coming into the game, averaging 11 per game.
" Auburn forced an average of 21.1 turnovers per game last season, which ranked 12th in the nation.
The Tigers were ninth nationally in steals, averaging 11.2 per game.

## IN DECEMBER

" Auburn is 225-55 all-time in the month of December (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that year).
" Under Coach Flo, the Tigers are 25-8 in December.

## TOUGH SCHEDULE

" In addition to the rigors of the Southeastern Conference, Auburn faces a non-conference schedule that includes as many as 10 opponents that advanced to postseason play in 2016.
" Auburn faces NCAA participants Troy, North Carolina A\&T, West Virginia, Indiana, Kansas State and Jacksonville along with WNIT participants Ball State, Drake and Virginia Tech. The Tigers could also face Tulane, another WNIT team last year.
" A record nine SEC teams made the NCAA
Tournament last season. Auburn will play nine games against those teams - two against South Carolina, one against the other seven NCAA teams - and twice against WNIT participant Alabama.

## SISTER ACT

" For the fifth-straight season, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin juniors Jazmine and Jessica Jones return for the Tigers.
" Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-16); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha Hobbs (2006-10), and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola Bolton (1984-88).

## NEW FACES

" Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2016-17, with two freshmen, one sophomore and two juniors.
" Joining the Tigers to compete this season are freshman G Daisa Alexander (Decatur, Ga.); freshman G Tyra Johnson (Decatur, Ala.) and sophomore G Emari Jones (Chicago, Ill.). Ekiya Gray, a junior transfer from Blinn College, played in eight games before leaving Auburn.
" Junior C Justice Wright (Macon, Ga.) transferred to Auburn from Clemson during the offseason, but she will be ineligible for the 2016-17 season due to NCAA transfer rules.
" Junior G Sira Toure (Kennewick, Wash.) will be eligible to compete beginning with the second semester this season. She transferred to Auburn in January 2016.

## WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

" The Tigers signed Kiyae White (6-2, F, Macungie, Pa.), Abigayle Jackson (6-3, F, Little Rock, Ark.) and Unique Thompson (6-3, F, Theodore, Ala.) in the early signing period, and all will begin competing at Auburn in the fall of 2017.

## BACK IN THE TOP 25

" At No. 23 in the Nov. 28 AP poll, Auburn was a ranked team for the first time since the final poll of the 2008-09 season, a span of 137 weeks of rankings since the last appearance.

Game 1: Nov. 11, 2016
Auburn 61, Troy 52 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.








AUBURN --Auburn came within striking distance of a school record for turnovers, forcing 38 in a season-opening 61-52 victory over Troy at Auburn Arena Friday night.

The Tigers struggled to finish on the offensive end at times, shooting 31.9 percent from the floor, but the Auburn defense held the Trojans more than 28 points below their season average from a year ago, when they were the seventh-best scoring team in the nation.

The 38 forced turnovers were the most for an Auburn team in 13 years, dating back to Dec. 29, 2003, when the Tigers forced Alabama A\&M into 39 giveaways. That game - along with a 2001 game against Tennessee State - are the school records for turnovers by a Division I opponent; Auburn forced 40-plus against a pair of Division II foes.

Auburn also picked up 22 steals, two shy of the school record, led by five from junior Jessica Jones. Four players - Brandy Montgomery, Katie Frerking, Janiah McKay and Erica Sanders - had three apiece.

Auburn was only able to convert those turnovers into 25 points, letting the Trojans hang around much longer than they might have otherwise. Auburn led by as many as 14 late in the game but were unable to pull away further despite numerous fast-break opportunities.

Montgomery led the Tigers with 22 points, her 18th career game with 20 points or more. Frerking missed a double-double by one rebound, scoring 12 points and pulling down nine boards, along with three assists, three blocks and three steals. McKay contributed a 10-point outing.

Freshman Tyra Johnson and transfers Emari Jones, Ekiya Gray and Tiffany Lewis all saw their first action for the Tigers. Johnson and Jones found the scoresheet for the first time at the free-throw line.

It looked as though Auburn would pull away early, knocking down four 3-pointers in the first quarter. But the Tigers would hit just one long-range attempt - out of 17 - the rest of the night. Numerous missed layups in the second and third quarter prevented the Tigers from putting distance between themselves and the Trojans, despite a stellar defensive effort.

## Game 2: Nov. 17, 2016 Auburn 68, North Carolina AGT 36 Corbett Sports Center Greensboro, N.C.



GREENSBORO, N.C. --Sparked by a 25-2 run that spanned most of the second quarter, Auburn women's basketball pulled away early and cruised to a 68-36 victory at North Carolina A\&T Thursday night.

For the second straight game, the Tigers (2-0) forced their opponent into 25 -plus turnovers, pushing the Aggies (1-2) into 27 giveaways turned into 26 Auburn points. The Tigers also held the Aggies to single-digit scoring in three of four quarters.

Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers for the second straight game with 18 points. Katie Frerking added 15 points, at least six rebounds, five assists and a career-high seven steals. Junior Tiffany Lewis found the scoresheet for the first time as a Tiger, knocking down three 3-pointers in the fourth quarter to finish with nine points.

The Tigers shot an even 50 percent from the floor (27-of-54) and were 5-of-15 (33.3\%) from 3-point range. Auburn out-rebounded the Aggies 42-34; Jessica Jones led the way with eight boards.

Auburn's starters were able to play fewer minutes in the second half with the game in hand, a goal of Wil-liams-Flournoy coming into tonight's game.

After a sluggish first quarter for both teams, Auburn opened the second period on a 10-0 run over the first five minutes, holding the Aggies scoreless until the 4:45 mark of the quarter. From there, Auburn would score 15 straight - many on fastbreak opportunities off Aggie turnovers - before A\&T knocked down a 3-pointer in the final seconds.

The run persisted well into the third quarter - Auburn opened that period on an 8-2 run - as the Tigers' lead swelled to 30 points at the 6:07 mark. North Carolina A\&T would get no closer than 25 the rest of the way.

Dana Brown led North Carolina A\&T with 16 points, and Kala Green added eight.

## Game 3: Nov. 20, 2016 Auburn 61, East Carolina 52 Minges Coliseum Greenville, N.C.



GREENVILLE, N.C. -- Katie Frerking picked up her third career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team kept up the defensive pressure to remain unbeaten with a 61-52 victory at East Carolina Sunday afternoon.

The Tigers (3-0) led by as many as 18 late in the third quarter but went cold late, going the final 6:40 of the game without a field goal. As such, East Carolina (3-1) was able to cut the Auburn lead to single-digits in the final two minutes. But clutch free-throw shooting sealed the win for Auburn as the Tigers went 7-for-10 in the fourth quarter and 15 -for- 20 at the line for the game.

Frerking recorded her third career double-double and Auburn's first of the season with 10 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. She also added three assists, three steals and a block. Janiah McKay led Auburn with 17 points, including five key free throws in the fourth quarter, and Brandy Montgomery added 10 points.

For the third straight game, Auburn forced 25-plus opponent turnovers with 30 giveaways by ECU. Those turned into 32 Auburn points, a season-high in points off turnovers. Auburn also out-rebounded the Pirates 37-31, dominating the offensive glass with 17 offensive boards that turned into 16 second-chance points.

The Pirates outshot the Tigers 46 percent to 34 percent, but the Tigers got up 20 more attempts than did the Pirates. ECU managed just 39 field goal attempts for the game.

Auburn led 28-20 at halftime on the strength of scoring 17 points off 18 ECU turnovers. The Tigers shot just 33 percent in the opening half to ECU's 44 percent, but Auburn took 17 more shots, thanks to the turnovers and 10 offensive rebounds. An 8-0 run to start the second quarter and another burst late in the period pushed Auburn to as much as a 10-point lead before two late ECU free throws cut the halftime deficit to eight.

The Tigers saw their lead balloon to as many as 18 points in the third quarter. A seven-point burst from junior Tiffany Lewis helped spark a 21-point third period for the Tigers, and Auburn held a 49-33 lead after 30 minutes of play.


SAVANNAH, Ga. -- A second straight double-double for senior Katie Frerking and a big run to open the fourth quarter helped push the Auburn women's basketball team to a $54-40$ win over Ball State at the Savannah Invitational.

Auburn forced 27 turnovers, the fourth straight time forcing at least that many. A lean second quarter gave way to some big shots in the second half, and a 13-0 run to open the fourth quarter put the game away for the Tigers.

Frerking finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds, a mirror-image of her 10-point, 13 -rebound effort at East Carolina on Sunday. It was the fourth double-double of her career and the first time she's picked them up in back-to-back games.

Brandy Montgomery led the Tigers with 15 points, and Janiah McKay added nine and a game-high five assists. Jazmine Jones and Khady Dieng contributed five points each, and Jessica Jones pulled down a career-high nine rebounds.

Auburn shot 35.6 percent for the game, lowered by a dismal second quarter that saw the Tigers make just 3 -of-16 shots from the field. That still outpaced the Cardinals' 34-percent night, and both teams knocked down five 3 -pointers.

The Tigers out-rebounded a taller Ball State team $39-34$ with 19 of those coming from Frerking and Jessica Jones.

Auburn led 17-11 after one period, turning eight Cardinal turnovers into 10 points in the opening 10 minutes. But the Tigers went cold in the second quarter, missing their first 10 shots of the period as Ball State briefly took a 23-20 lead. But Tyra Johnson connected on a 3 -pointer to tie the game with 3:43 left, and the Tigers would never trail again.

From Johnson's 3-pointer through the midpoint of the third quarter, the Tigers went on a 17-2 run to take a 3725 lead. Ball State cut the margin to eight at the end of the third, but Auburn opened the fourth quarter on a 13-0 run to take a 52-31 lead.

## Game 5: Nov. 23, 2016 Auburn 52, Marist 51 Savannah Civic Center Savannah, Ga.



SAVANNAH, Ga. -- Auburn withstood a 3-point barrage from Marist and held on to remain unbeaten on the season with a 52-51 victory at the Savannah Invitational.

The Tigers saw Marist knock down 10 3-pointers - 10 of the Red Foxes' 13 field goals on the night were from long-range - and have a chance to tie the game on the last shot as Auburn led 52-49 with five seconds to play. But Marist's Maura Fitzpatrick drove to the basket and banked in a layup with 0.4 seconds left to cut the lead to one point, and the Red Foxes were unable to stop the clock as Auburn ran out the final ticks.
Auburn forced Marist into 30 turnovers - the third opponent in five games with at least 30 - turning those into 21 points. The Tigers scored 20 points in the paint to Marist's two.
Brandy Montgomery led Auburn with 16 points and was one of four Tigers with three steals. She joined all three Joneses - Jazmine, Jessica and Emari - with three swipes on the night as the Tigers totaled 17 steals.
Jazmine Jones and Katie Frerking had eight points each, and Jones pulled down a season-high 10 rebounds. Frerking had seven boards and Jessica Jones had six. Tiffany Lewis also contributed eight points off the bench.

Despite only making three 2-point field goals, Marist out-shot Auburn 31.0 percent to 30.8 percent. The Tigers were 20-of-65 from the field, including a 26.7 -percent mark in the second half. Auburn did out-rebound Marist, 39-37. The Red Foxes were lights-out at the free-throw line, knocking down 15-of-16 attempts while Auburn shot 8-of-14 at the stripe.

Several times it seemed as if Auburn would pull away, pushing the lead to as much as 10 in the second quarter. But every time Auburn had a seemingly comfortable lead, Marist answered with a 3 -pointer. Marist briefly moved ahead $34-33$ with $2: 41$ left in the third after making its first 2-point basket of the night. But Montgomery scored four straight, then Lewis added a jumper to push Auburn's lead back to five.

## Game 6: Nov. 24, 2016 \#19 West Virginia 56, Auburn 52 Savannah Civic Center Savannah, Ga.



SAVANNAH, Ga. -- Auburn fought back from a 14-point second-quarter deficit and pushed No. 19 West Virginia to the final seconds, but the Tigers fell just short in a $56-52$ loss Thanksgiving night in the Savannah Invitational championship game.

The Tigers tied the game at $52-52$ with just over a minute to go on a layup from Jessica Jones, then had an opportunity to take the lead in the final minute. Auburn's shot wouldn't fall, and WVU answered at the other end with 11 seconds left to take a 54-52 lead.

Auburn tried a 3-pointer with seven seconds left, but WVU got the rebound, and Auburn had to foul three times before the Mountaineers could get to the line with less than a second to play.

Katie Frerking was named to the All-Tournament Team after recording her third double-double in four games with 18 points and 10 rebounds. She knocked down five 3 -pointers on the night to tie a career-high, and she also grabbed three steals.

Janiah McKay contributed 15 points to the Auburn effort, including a 5 -for- 6 night at the free-throw line. Sanders pulled down four rebounds and had a team-high four steals in 17 minutes off the bench.

Auburn again struggled from the field, shooting 27.6 percent for the night (16-of-58) but solid free-throw shooting - 15 -for-20 ( $75 \%$ ) - kept the Tigers in the game and helped spur the comeback in the second quarter. WVU out-rebounded Auburn 42-39, but Auburn had a season-low 14 turnovers and forced the Mountaineers into a season-high 22.

WVU jumped out to a big early lead, moving ahead 2213 at the end of one quarter and pushing that advantage to 14 points early in the second. But the Mountaineers got into foul trouble and Auburn was in the bonus for the last seven minutes or so of the quarter. Auburn took advantage, knocking down 7-of-10 free-throw attempts in the period.

Meanwhile, Frerking hit four 3-pointers in the half, and a layup from Montgomery briefly tied the game at 28-28, but the Mountaineers hit a 3 -pointer in the closing seconds to take a $31-28$ lead to halftime.

## Game 7: Nov. 27, 2016 Auburn 71, Indiana 67 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN -- Trailing by 17 with less than nine minutes to play, the Auburn women's basketball team mounted a furious fourth-quarter comeback to earn a 71-67 victory over Indiana Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers scored 32 points in the fourth quarter - 16 of them from senior Brandy Montgomery - and went 11-for-12 at the free-throw line in the final period to put the Hoosiers away in the closing seconds.

After a dismal third quarter where Auburn scored a season-low nine points, Indiana led 56-39 with just over nine minutes to play in the fourth. But Montgomery took over down the stretch as the Tigers gradually chipped away at the lead. She hit a 3-pointer with 5:44 to play to cut the lead to single-digits at 60-52, then she scored 10 straight points over a two-minute stretch, tying the game at 63-all on a pair of free throws with 2:06 left.

After two misses by Indiana, Erica Sanders pulled down an offensive rebound from a Montgomery miss and knocked down a 5-foot jumper with 59 seconds to play to give Auburn its first lead since the first quarter at 65-63.

Katie Frerking then grabbed her seventh steal of the day and was fouled in short order, giving Auburn a 67-63 lead when she made two free throws. Indiana answered at the other end twice in the final 20 seconds, but both times Janiah McKay made two free throw attempts to keep it a two-possession game, icing it with 1.2 seconds to play.

Montgomery finished with a season-high 28 points, and Frerking added a season-high 21 and matched a career-high with seven steals. Frerking was also Auburn's leading rebounder with six. McKay finished with 12 points, including a perfect 6-for-6 night at the free-throw line.

Auburn shot 46.2 percent for the game, its sec-ond-best mark of the season, including a 64.3-percent mark ( 9 -for-14) in the fourth quarter. The Tigers were also a season-best 18-of-22 (81.8\%) at the free-throw line. Auburn's 32 fourth-quarter points were the most scored by the Tigers in a single period since women's basketball went to a four-quarter game last season.

## Game 8: Dec. 1, 2016 Kansas State 71, \#23 Auburn 66 Bramlage Coliseum Manhattan, Kan.



MANHATTAN, Kan. -- Senior Katie Frerking scored a season-high 22 points, but No. 23 Auburn could not overcome foul trouble and a big rebounding deficit Thursday night in a 71-66 loss at Kansas State in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

The Tigers (6-2) had three players - two key rebounders - foul out and saw an early rebounding advantage turned into a big deficit by the end of the game. Despite that, the Tigers rallied to take a five-point lead midway through the fourth quarter but could not hang on.

Frerking's 22 points led all scorers as the Tigers shot 37 percent (23-of-62) from the field. Auburn hit a season-high eight 3-pointers, three of them from Brandy Montgomery, who finished with 11 points. Janiah McKay added 15, and Emari Jones finished with a season-high eight. Auburn also had its best free-throw shooting night of the season, hitting 12-of-14 attempts (85.7\%).

K-State (7-0) was 47 percent from the floor (24-of-51), led by a 16-point night from Kindred Wesemann. The Wildcats pulled down 39 rebounds to Auburn's 25, and the much taller Wildcats scored 32 points in the paint to Auburn's 22.

Auburn moved ahead by five with just over five minutes to play after a sequence where McKay got a steal and a score, then Frerking got fouled and was the beneficiary of a K-State technical. She made all four free throws to put Auburn ahead 62-57. Wesemann answered quickly with a 3-pointer, and the Tigers made just one of their final seven field goal attempts as the Wildcats finished the game on a 15-4 run.

K-State led 34-32 after a first half that featured big runs by both teams. The Tigers, who outrebounded the Wildcats in the first quarter 14-3, led by as many as 10 early in the second quarter. However, the Wildcats stormed back with a 13-2 run to take a 26-25 lead with 4:00 to play. The teams traded buckets the rest of the way as the lead changed hands four times in the first half.

Auburn dealt with foul trouble as Jazmine Jones, Jessica Jones and Erica Sanders fouled out and Frerking finished with four fouls.

Game 9: Dec. 11, 2016 Auburn 75, Savannah State 46 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.


AUBURN -- Brandy Montgomery scored 22 points, and Auburn's bench played extended minutes as the Tigers built a big early lead and cruised past Savannah State 75-46 Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (7-2), coming off a nine-day break for final exams, showed no signs of rust as they jumped on Savannah State (2-7) early and never looked back.

Montgomery scored her 22 points in 22 minutes, shooting 9-for-15 from the field. It was the third time this season for the Auburn senior to top the 20-point mark. Tiffany Lewis scored a season-high 12 points - her first double-digit effort since playing for Clemson two seasons ago - to lead a season-best 28 points from the Auburn bench.

All 10 players that suited up for the Tigers scored in the game, including season-highs from freshmen Tyra Johnson and Daisa Alexander.

Sophomore Janiah McKay had a career-high eight assists along with seven points, and Jazmine Jones and Katie Frerking had four steals apiece. Jessica Jones contributed five points, five rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a steal.

For the sixth time in nine games, Auburn forced its opponent into 25 or more turnovers, turning Savannah State over 28 times. They were able to convert those turnovers into 37 points, a season-high.

Offensively, Auburn matched a season-best shooting percentage at 50 percent ( 28 -for-56) from the field. The Tigers also matched a season-high with eight made 3 -pointers and shot 84.6 percent from the free-throw line. Auburn's 75 points were also the high mark of the season.

Auburn jumped out to a 12-2 lead in the game's first four minutes, forcing a quick SSU timeout. SSU got back within eight right out of the timeout, but a Frerking jumper put Auburn back up by 10 . Savannah State would not get within single digits the rest of the way.
Game 10: Dec. 14, 2016 Auburn 76, Louisiana Tech 66 Thomas Assembly Center Ruston, La.


RUSTON, La. -- Senior Katie Frerking scored a ca-reer-high 30 points and picked up her fourth double-double of the season to lead the Auburn women's basketball team to a 76-66 win at Louisiana Tech Wednesday night.

The Tigers (8-2) overcame a sloppy start to put up their season-high scoring figure and overcame late foul trouble to hold off a fourth-quarter run by the Lady Techsters (5-4).

Frerking's 30-point, 11-rebound effort marked her sixth career double-double and fourth of the season. It was Auburn's first 30-point game since Brandy Montgomery scored 30 against Alabama in the 2015 regular-season finale. Frerking was 9-of-14 from the floor, 5-of-9 from 3-point range and was a perfect 7-for-7 at the free-throw line while playing a season-high 37 minutes.

Auburn shot 42 percent for the game (24-57) and made a season-high nine 3-pointers, five of them from Frerking. The Tigers were also 19-of-24 at the free-throw line and outrebounded Louisiana Tech 38-27.

Montgomery added 12 points for Auburn, and freshman Tyra Johnson had a season-high eight. Jazmine Jones pulled down eight rebounds.

A sluggish first quarter that saw Auburn score just eight points and shoot 17 percent gave way to a 28-point second period, giving Auburn a 36-27 lead at the break. The Tigers missed their first seven shots of the game but bounced back for a 52-percent second quarter. A Frerking 3-pointer to open the second quarter gave Auburn its first lead, and the Tigers would never trail again.

After a Frerking jumper at the buzzer gave Auburn a 20-point lead after three quarters, the Lady Techsters opened the fourth quarter on a 7-0 run. Tech would cut the Auburn lead to as little as 10 points as the Tigers found some late foul trouble and Tech scored 30 points in the fourth. But the Tigers were able to make free throws of their own and hold off the late rally.

Rochelle Vasquez led the Lady Techsters with 22 points, and Kierra Anthony added 14.

AUBURN -- Auburn made a stunning fourth-quarter comeback to send its game with No. 24 Virginia Tech to overtime, but fell just short in a 92-87 loss.

The Tigers (8-3) shot a season-high 50.8 percent from the field, scored a season-high 87 points and overcame a nine-point deficit in the final three minutes to force overtime, but the hot-shooting Hokies (11-0) made 12 3-pointers throughout the game and won it at the freethrow line in the extra period.

Sophomore Janiah McKay scored a career-high 28 points - including seven points in the final 1:08 of regulation - and got a key steal, a layup and a free throw to tie the game with 10 seconds to play. But she was lost to fouls early in the overtime period, and the Tigers' leading scorer watched the final 4:08 from the bench.

In a back-and-forth game that saw the lead change hands 10 times, Auburn found itself down by as many as 11 midway through the fourth quarter. The Tigers were able to cut that to six with a little more than a minute to go.

Trailing 75-69 with 1:08 to play in regulation, McKay made two free throws to cut it to four. After a Hokie offensive foul, McKay then knocked down a jumper with 30 seconds left to make it a two-point game. Auburn then had four fouls to give to get Tech to the free-throw line - McKay committed three of them.

After a pair of Hokie free throws pushed the lead back to four, Lewis was fouled and made the first, then after a miss, McKay stole a pass off the defensive rebound under the basket, got the layup to go and was fouled. Her free throw tied the game at 77-all, and the Hokies' last-second attempt missed to send the game to overtime.

Auburn led 81-79 with just over three minutes to play and held a one-point lead at the 1:56 mark, but the Hokies made nine free throws in the extra period to pull away for the win.

Brandy Montgomery scored 20 points, and Katie Frerking added 15. Jessica Jones had a season-high eight points and led Auburn with six rebounds, and Jazmine Jones added a season-high nine.

## Game 12: Dec. 21, 2016 Auburn 85, Drake 80 Fogelman Arena in Devlin Fieldhouse New Orleans, La.



NEW ORLEANS -- Auburn put together its high-est-scoring half in eight years and held off a late rally to earn an 85-80 win over Drake in the opening game of the Tulane Classic.

The Tigers (9-3) scored 62 points in the second half - two points shy of the school record for scoring in a half - to overtime a six-point halftime deficit and earn a hard-fought win. A key to the victory was holding Drake (6-4), one of the nation's top 3-point shooting teams, to a season-low four treys.

Four players scored in double-figures for Auburn, led by 26 from senior Katie Frerking and 25 from sophomore Janiah McKay. Frerking also had six rebounds, a career-high four blocks and three steals, and McKay made 10-of-14 free-throw attempts, both career-highs.

Brandy Montgomery added 12 points, and Jazmine Jones had 10 points along with six rebounds and five steals. Jessica Jones pulled down a career-high 11 rebounds. All 13 players saw action for the Tigers, including junior Sira Toure, who made her Auburn debut.

McKay has now scored 53 points over the last two games after a 28-point effort against Virginia Tech on Sunday. Frerking, meanwhile, has 56 points in two games in the state of Louisiana this season; she scored 30 at Louisiana Tech last week.

Auburn shot 58 percent in the second half to finish at 45.2 percent for the game, a remarkable turnaround after a cold first half that saw the Tigers shoot 32.2 percent and score just 23 points.

The Tigers won despite Drake shooting 52.9 percent, thanks in large part to forcing the Bulldogs into a season-high 24 turnovers, which Auburn turned into 34 points. Auburn also pulled down 12 offensive rebounds, turning that into 17 second-chance points.

Auburn finally took the lead for good on a Frerking 3-pointer with 4:54 left in the third quarter, making it 4037 Tigers. That would become a seven-point advantage at the end of a 31-point third quarter. A 17-4 run over the first four minutes of the fourth quarter gave Auburn its largest lead at 71-53.

## Game 13: Dec. 22, 2016 Tulane 61, Auburn 59 Fogelman Arena in Devlin Fieldhouse New Orleans, La.



NEW ORLEANS -- Auburn fought back from a 14-point third-quarter deficit but came up just short Thursday night in a 61-59 loss to Tulane in the championship game of the Tulane Classic.

After a slow start, the Tigers (9-4) shot 51.8 percent in the second half and made a late charge to within one point midway through the fourth quarter, but Tulane (8-4) hit several clutch shots down the stretch to hold on for the win.

Auburn was led by Katie Frerking, who scored all 15 of her points in the second half. She also led the Tigers with six rebounds and six steals. Janiah McKay shook off a slow start to finish with 13 points, and Brandy Montgomery added 11. Erica Sanders matched a career-high with four steals; the Tigers had 15 as a team. Frerking and McKay were named to the all-tournament team.

After forcing just four Tulane turnovers in the first half, Auburn came away with 16 in the second half, turning the Green Wave's 20 turnovers into 27 points. But Tulane was able to control the offensive glass, pulling down 13 offensive rebounds and converting those into 11 points. Both teams made 22 field goals, and both teams made nine 3-pointers - matching a season-high for Auburn.

Auburn started ice-cold, shooting 21 percent in the first quarter and 30 percent in the half as the Green Wave ended the half on an 11-0 run for a 30-20 lead. Tulane would push their advantage to as many as 14 points at 40-26 midway through the third quarter.

But Auburn fought back, ending that quarter on a 14-5 run to cut the deficit to 45-40 after three periods. After Tulane answered a Frerking layup with a basket of its own, Sanders picked up a loose ball at midcourt and took it in for the layup to cut the deficit to one point at 52-51 with 4:08 to play.

Auburn had chances to take the lead on its next two possessions but couldn't get shots to fall. Tulane then hit back-to-back 3 s at the other end to push its lead back to seven at 58-51 with 90 seconds left. Auburn scored five points in the final 40 seconds and benefitted from three missed Tulane free throws and had a chance at a final shot with just over a second to play, but it missed short.
