AUBURN VS. MINNESOTA IN THE OUTBACK BOWL

» Auburn (9-3, 5-3) faces No. 16 Minnesota (10-2, 7-2) in the Outback Bowl Wednesday, January 1, 2020, at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla. It will be the final game for 25 Auburn seniors: Wil Appleton, Derrick Brown, Sal Cannella, Craig Carter, Marlon Davidson, Javaris Davis, Jeremiah Dinson, Jack Driscoll, Phelps Gambill, Marquel Harrell, Will Hastings, Mike Horton, Trent Kelley, Kaleb Kim, Sage Ledbetter, Kam Martin, Spencer Nigh, Pace Ozmint, Jacob Rogers, Bailey Sharp, Sam Sherrod, Daniel Thomas, Gary Walker, Prince Tega Wanogho and Jay Jay Wilson.

Auburn is making its 44th bowl appearance all-time, and its seventh straight under Gus Malzahn, the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling eight straight years from 2000-07. Auburn is 24-17-2 all-time in bowl games and 2-2 in the Outback Bowl (wins over Ohio State, 1989, and Northwestern, 2009; losses to Penn State, 1995, and Wisconsin, 2014).

Auburn has a 26-37 record in all games played in the state of Florida, including games played in Gainesville, Jacksonville, Miami, Tallahassee and Tampa, and a 10-7 all-time mark in Florida bowl games. Its last postseason contest in the Sunshine State was in the 2014 Outback Bowl in Tampa against Wisconsin.

The Tigers have a 12-8-2 record against current members of the Big Ten, including games against Indiana (1-0), Rutgers (1-0), Maryland (2-1), Michigan (1-1), Michigan State (1-0), Nebraska (1-3), Northwestern (1-0), Ohio State (1-0-1), Penn State (1-1), Purdue (1-0) and Wisconsin (1-2-1). Auburn is 9-5 all-time against current Big Ten teams in bowl games, including last year's 63-14 victory over Purdue in Nashville.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn's 2019 schedule is the only one nationally that includes five of the top 13 of the final CFP rankings: #1 LSU, #5 Georgia, #6 Oregon, #9 Florida and #13 Alabama

» Tigers on the all-SEC coaches' and AP first and second teams: Derrick Brown, Marlon Davidson, K.J. Britt, Jeremiah Dinson, Christian Tutt, Prince Tega Wanogho

» SEC defensive player of the year Derrick Brown won the 2019 Lott IMPACT Trophy, and was a finalist for the Outland Trophy, the Bronko Nagurski Award, the Bednarik Award, the Wuerffel Trophy, the Senior CLASS Award and the Pop Warner college player of the year, and a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award and the Jason Witten Man of the Year Award

» With 13 fumble recoveries and 15 forced fumbles, Auburn ranks third nationally in recoveries and eighth in forced fumbles

» Christian Tutt is third nationally in punt returns, averaging 14.7 yards on 21 punt returns this season. Tutt is tied for second nationally with five returns of at least 20 yards

» As a team, Auburn is 20th nationally with 30 rushing TDs this season, five more than the Tigers' 2018 total. Auburn averages 211.0 rushing yards per game, 25th among FBS schools

» SEC freshman of the year Bo Nix holds the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,366), pass completions (200), pass attempts (351) and TD passes (15)

» Auburn, Alabama and Clemson are the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense each of the last four seasons

SERIES HISTORY

» This is the first meeting between the schools. Minnesota is the 84th team of 130 current FBS members that Auburn has played. Of the 83 FBS teams Auburn has played, the Tigers have defeated 77 at least once; the only exceptions: Oklahoma, Rice, SMU, South Florida and Texas Tech.

FRESHMAN DEBUT

» SEC freshman of the year Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946, a 13-12 Auburn win vs. Southern Miss in Montgomery. Nix was the first SEC true freshman QB to start a season opener since Tennessee's Brent Schaeffer in 2004.

» Nix holds the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,366), pass completions (200), pass attempts (351) and touchodwn passes (15).

For the season, Nix has a 124.29 efficiency rating, with five 200-yard and two 300-yard passing games. He has a current string of 165 pass attempts without an interception, an Auburn record.

» Versus Mississippi State, Nix had the first 300-yard passing game of his career, completing 16-21 attempts for 335 yards and two TD. He was also Auburn's leading rusher with 56 yards and a rush TD, earning SEC freshman of the week honors.

Bowl Notes

Nix posted another 300-yard game vs. Ole Miss, with 30-44 passing for 340 yards. His 340 passing yards were the second-most ever by an Auburn freshman passer, and his 30 completions (T-2) and 44 attempts (4) ranked among the all-time Auburn freshman top five.

» Nix was 13-31 for 177 yards passing with two scores vs. Oregon, going 4-6 on the gamewinning drive, capped by a 26-yard TD to Seth Williams, and converting a 4th-and-3 rushing, earning SEC freshman of the week.

Against Tulane, Nix was 19-37 passing for 207 yards including a 31-yard touchdown pass to Will Hastings. He added TD passes to Eli Stove vs. Kent State and again to Seth Williams at Texas A&M and at Florida.

Nix had three TD passes and a rushing TD at Arkansas, and added rush and pass TDs at LSU and against Georgia. His 50 pass attempts vs. Georgia were fifth-most in a game in Auburn history, and 30 completions tied his own mark for fourth-best ever in a game at Auburn.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn totaled 633 yards of total offense against Kent State, the 21st 600-yard game in program history, the most yards since recording 688 yards vs. ULM in 2016 and 10th-most in program history.

There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 29 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 18 times; latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State, and nine times against SEC teams (latest: 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss last year).

» The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 34 times in 92 games, 50+ points 17 times and 60+ points three times.

Auburn has scored 50+ points in four games for just the third season in program history; others were in 2010 (6) and in 2016 (4).

» Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 64-92 (.696) games, with 37 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State, the sixth time the Tigers have gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.97 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn has scored first in 31 of its last 43 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including six times this season. The Tigers are 46-14 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 55 of 92 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Fourteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (69 100-yd performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 43-12; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

» The Tigers' 467 rushing yards against Kent State were the sixth most in program history and the most since running for 543 yards vs. Arkansas in 2016.

Auburn had three players with 100+ rush yards – JaTarvious Whitlow/135, Joey Gatewood/102), Shaun Shivers/102 for the first time since 1983 -- Tommie Agee/219, Lionel James/115, Bo Jackson/105 vs. Maryland.

» Current players' 100-yard rushing games: JaTarvious Whitlow (6): Alabama St, 2018 (122); LSU, 2018 (104); Ole Miss, 2018 (170); Oregon, 2019 (110); Kent St, 2019 (135); Alabama, 2019 (114).

Kam Martin (3): Alabama A&M, 2016 (176); Georgia Southern, 2017 (136); Liberty, 2018 (116)

Shaun Shivers (2): Alabama St, 2018 (117); Kent St, 2019 (102)

» True freshman D.J. Williams posted his first 100-yard game with 130 yards on 13 carries at LSU, earning SEC freshman of the week honors. His 10.0 yards per carry was the highest average by an Auburn freshman in a SEC game (min. 100 yards) ever. Williams ranks 17th on the Auburn freshman season rushing list with 387 yards and two scores.

» Senior Kam Martin is 29th among Auburn's career rushing leaders, with 1,563 career yards, eight career rush scores and three 100-yard games. This season, he gained 332 yards on 60 carries with two rush TDs.

» With his 135-yard, 2 TD performance against Kent State, JaTarvious Whitlow became Auburn's 47th career 1,000-yard rusher. Whitlow gained 787 yards as a freshman and started this year with a 110-yard performance vs. Oregon and 96 yards against Tulane, with a 14-yard score. He scored twice in the first quarter vs. Samford and added a 114-yard rushing effort against Alabama.

He scored three first-half rushing touchdowns against Mississippi State, gaining 55 yards on just 10 carries. Whitlow has 15 career rushing touchdowns (nine this season) and two career TD receptions.

With 1,526 career rushing yards, the sophomore ranks 31st among Auburn leaders.

» The Tigers have run for 1,413 yards after halftime, 18th among FBS teams, including 44 runs of 10+ yards after intermission (t-14th). The Tigers' 24 runs of 10+ yards in the final period are ninth-most among FBS teams.

» Auburn is tied for 26th nationally with 32 plays from scrimmage of at least 30 yards, eight more than it had in all of 2018. The Tigers rank T-17th nationally with 13 rushes of 30+ yards. Auburn's 30 rushing TD rank 20th nationally.

» Sophomore Seth Williams led the team with 55 catches for 801 yards and eight touchdowns.

Williams posted his third career 100-yard receiving game with a career-best 13 catches for 121 yards against Georgia.

Williams posted his second 100-yard receiving game with a career-best 161 yards on a eight catches against Mississippi State, including touchdowns of 39 and 32 yards from Bo Nix (most yards in a game by an Auburn receiver since 2014; Sammie Coates 206 vs. Alabama).

Williams is tied for 22nd nationally with eight receptions of at least 30 yards, and is T-37th nationally with 13 catches of 20+ yards.

Williams, who scored the game-winning touchdown against Oregon on a 26-yard reception from Bo Nix with just 0:09 remaining, caught three passes for 44 yards on the game-winning drive. He added a 40-yard reception in the win over Tulane and a 9-yard TD catch from Nix at Texas A&M.

After a 32-yard TD reception from Nix at Florida and TD catches of 48 and 15 yards at Arkansas and 5 yards at LSU, Williams now has seven touchdowns for the season and 12 career TD catches. He's the first Auburn player with TD catches in five straight games since Emory Blake (seven games) in 2010-11.

Williams ranks 18th among Auburn career leaders in receiving, with 1,335 yards to date.

In his career, 64 of Williams' 81 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on six of his red zone receptions and 11 of his 16 catches in the fourth quarter.

» Redshirt junior Eli Stove has surpassed 1,200 career yards from scrimmage (91 catches for 816 yards and three scores and 48 rushing attempts for 503 yards and four TD).

Stove's first score of the 2019 campaign was an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon; he added a 4-yard rushing touchdown against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

» Anthony Schwartz's 57-yard touchdown run at Texas A&M was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play this season. After adding a 13-yard TD run against Mississippi State, Schwartz recorded a 28-yard catch at Arkansas and now has seven career rushing scores and 10 overall TD. He led the Tigers with nine catches for 89 yards vs. Ole Miss. This season, 27 of his 46 touches have resulted in a TD or first down.

Last year, Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's lon-

gest offensive play of the year and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

» Auburn finished 25-27 in the red zone with 21 TDs in SEC play. The Tigers' 77.78 TD percentage led the SEC in conference play. Over their last five games, the Tigers converted all 20 of their red-zone chances with 15 TDs.

» Bo Nix' 78-yard pass play to Harold Joiner vs. Ole Miss was Auburn's longest completion of the season and ties for the 13th longest pass play in Auburn records. It's the longest Auburn completion since 2013 (Sammie Coates from Nick Marshall vs. Arkansas, 88 yards).

DOMINATING DEFENSE

» Winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy and a Nagurski, Outland, Bednarik and Wuerffel finalist, Derrick Brown was named SEC defensive player of the year by the league's coaches and by AP. He's the first Auburn player since Tracy Rucker (1988) to win that nod from the coaches and the first since Nick Fairley (2010) to win the AP honor.

Brown was the SEC defensive lineman of the week vs. Texas A&M with four tackles, two sacks, three TFL, a forced fumble and two PBU against the Aggies; he was the Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week, Bednarik player of the week and a nominee for Lott IMPACT Trophy national player of the week. Two sacks and three TFL were career single-game bests for Brown.

Brown added four tackles, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and a 9-yard sack in his dominant performance at Florida, earning another SEC weekly award, and he picked up his third SEC weekly award with his team-best seven tackles and a TFL vs. Ole Miss. After recording seven tackles and 3.5 TFL against Alabama, he has 164 career tackles, 33.5 TFL and 13.0 sacks.

» First team all-SEC defensive lineman Marlon Davidson was selected as the SEC defensive lineman of the week four times this season, recording six tackles, 2.0 TFL and three QB hurries against Tulane and six tackles, 2.5 sacks vs. Kent State.

He added a team-best five tackles, 3.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery at Arkansas, making him the first Auburn player to record multiple sacks, TFL and force/recover a fumble in the same game since Nick Fairley at Alabama in 2010.

Davidson has 45 tackles, 12.5 TFL and 7.5 sacks this season.

» Senior safety Jeremiah Dinson is a second-team all-SEC selection (AP). Dinson earned SEC defensive player of the week honors with his 13-tackle performance against Oregon; he also had two TFL and a 6-yard sack. Dinson followed that performance up with an interception and team-best six tackles vs. Tulane and a team-high eight tackles vs. Kent State. He had four tackles, a 16-yard sack and a fumble

recovery vs. Mississippi State and an interception vs. Samford.

Dinson leads the squad with 79 tackles this season and ranks 11th in the SEC in tackles averaging 7.2 per contest.

» Linebacker K.J. Britt earned first team all-SEC honors from AP and second team all-SEC from the league's coaches. He totaled 61 tackles, 9.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble for the season.

» Auburn has held 18 of 52 opponents (16-2 record) below 300 yards total offense in Steele's four seasons. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 11 first-quarter touchdowns in the last 41 games, and only 10 in the opening period since the start of 2017 (five this season).

» Auburn has allowed only 18.34 points per game in Kevin Steele's four seasons as coordinator, ninth among FBS teams.

Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.

» Auburn, Alabama and Clemson are the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in scoring defense each of the last four seasons.

» Auburn has allowed a touchdown on just 68 of its opponents' 149 red zone chances in Steele's tenure as defensive coordinator. The 45.7 red zone touchdown percentage is best in the country since the start of the 2016 season.

» Auburn forced Georgia into nine 3-and-outs and Samford seven; the Tigers average 5.25 3-and-outs/gm (63 total), third nationally.

» In 23 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 23.61 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (36.4%). Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked foes to 17 or fewer points (18.4%).

» Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 37 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 107 total TD during that span.

» Auburn has at least five TFL in every game this season and is 18th nationally (second in SEC) with 82.0 TFL (7.46/gm); the Tigers lead the league with 6.71 TFL per game in SEC play.

In 51 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 127 sacks (2.5 per game) and has been held without a sack only six times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 32 of those games, most recently 13.0 vs. Samford, 11.0 at Florida, 9.0 at Arkansas, 7.0 at Texas A&M and 6.0 at LSU.

The Tigers have forced 75 turnovers (36 INT, 39 FR) and allowed only 33 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» Auburn had two interception returns for touchdowns vs. Alabama, by Smoke Monday (29 yards) and Zakoby McClain (100 yards); McClain's return was the longest by an Auburn player since the 2010 Outback Bowl (Walter McFadden). It's the first time Auburn has had two interception touchdowns in a game since 1994 vs. LSU.

At Arkansas, the Auburn defense recorded two interceptions in a game (Javaris Davis, Chandler Wooten) for the first time since last season's Music City Bowl.

» Auburn held Samford to 117 yards of total offense, the fifth time this season the Tigers held an opponent to less than 300 yards total offense and the 18th time in 52 games under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele, compared to just 15 such games in the previous 89 games (back to 2009).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» With 13 fumble recoveries and 15 forced fumbles this season, Auburn ranks third nationally in recoveries and eighth in forced fumbles.

» Auburn recovered four opponent fumbles at Florida, the most for the Tigers in a game since 2002 vs. Mississippi State. Auburn recovered three fumbles in the first quarter; in records dating back through 1996, it was the first game Auburn recovered three fumbles in a quarter. The last time Auburn recovered two fumbles in a quarter was vs. Arkansas in 2017 (third).

» Big Kat Bryant's 83-yard fumble recovery against Oregon was the first of his career and the longest fumble return by Auburn through records back through the 1996 season; the previous long during that period was an 82-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Justin Garrett vs. Louisville in 2015.

» Jeremiah Dinson grabbed the season's first interception with a third-quarter pick against Tulane, his third career interception. Javaris Davis and Chandler Wooten had interceptions at Arkansas, and Roger McCreary had his first career pick at LSU.

Daniel Thomas forced and recovered a fumble at Texas A&M. Zakoby McClain and Owen Pappoe forced fumbles vs. Mississippi State, and Jeremiah Dinson and Jordyn Peters had fumble recoveries against the Bulldogs. Christian Tutt's 57-yard interception return to run out the clock sealed the Ole Miss win.

» Auburn is 32-9 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 15-5 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-16 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +39 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's tenure.

The Tigers are 21-5 when they play turnover-free football and 43-16 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn.

The Tigers are 19-5 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

» Auburn is 53-19 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 33-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 9-11 when it fails to force a turnover.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn has won 21 straight games (19-0 mark under Malzahn) when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers have scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interceptions and one missed field goal, the latest being two interception return touchdowns vs. Alabama.

The last time the Tigers lost a game in which it scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Onterio McCalebb kickoff return to start the second half.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Christian Tutt is third in the country averaging 14.7 yards on 21 punt returns this season. Tutt is tied for second nationally with six returns of at least 20 yards. He is tied for third in the nation with three returns of 30+ yards; his long return was 41 yards vs. Oregon.

» Auburn is one game behind Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (142) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Auburn kickers converted 304 consecutive PAT attempts between the 2013 Tennessee game and this year's Arkansas contest, setting the NCAA record.

Cody Parkey (2013) Daniel Carlson (2014-17), Ian Shannon (2015-18), Anders Carlson (2018-19) and Sage Ledbetter (2017-19) were Auburn's kickers during the streak; Daniel Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The previous NCAA record was 302 consecutive PAT kicks made by Florida State from 2012-16.

» Last season, Anders Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

This season, Carlson is 45-46 on PAT and 17-24 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl, earning him SEC special teams player of the week honors. He is 42-73 on touchbacks on kickoffs.

» With 659 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (732 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally last year in net punting (41.91), the highest net average at Auburn back through 1996. Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards. Siposs is ranked 27th nationally this season with a 43.8 average. His 10 punts at LSU were a career high, and he had three punts for 50+ yards vs. Georgia.

» Auburn's offensive TDs have come 27 times on first down (15 rush, 12 pass), 15 times on second (11 rush, 4 pass), four times on third down (2 rush, 2 pass) and three times on fourth down (2 rush, 1 pass).

RANKINGS

» Auburn's 2019 schedule is the only one nationally that includes five of the top 13 in the final CFP rankings: #1 LSU, #5 Georgia, #6 Oregon, #9 Florida and #13 Alabama.

» Auburn's wins over then-#11 Oregon and #17 Texas A&M are two of only 29 over top 25 opponents away from home this season in college football; Auburn, Georgia, LSU, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon and Arizona State are the only teams with two wins over ranked opponents away from home this season.

It's the first time since 1974 Auburn has beaten two ranked teams in its first four games of a season (#14 Tennessee, #16 Miami).

» Auburn is 113-162-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 522-42-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-70-2 on the road and 33-50-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn has played 41 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 92 games as the Tigers' head coach (44.6 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 24 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 19-22 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 8-16 against Top 10 teams.

» This is the third time under Coach Gus Malzahn that Auburn has defeated three AP Top 20 opponents (also 2013 and 2014). A win over No. 16 Minnesota would give the Tigers four wins over AP Top 20 teams in a season for just the fifth time in program history (6 in 1983 and 2010; 5 in 1972 and 2004).

» Auburn is 16-19 all-time against ranked non-conference opponents in regular-season action, including 10-7 at home, 3-7 on the road and 3-5 at neutral-site locations.

» The Oregon game was the fifth time in Malzahn's seven seasons at AU the Tigers played a regular-season non-conference game against a ranked opponent (3-2). Prior to Malzahn's tenure, Auburn had only played four such games in the previous 22 seasons combined.

» Auburn is the only FBS team to open the last two seasons with a win over an AP-ranked opponent (#6 Washington, #11 Oregon).

» The Tigers are 89-131-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (42-33-2 at home, 28-63-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 58-51-3 overall (28-10-1 at home, 19-31-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 327-118-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 185-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-86-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 80-74-4 (35-13-1 at home, 22-39-1 away and 23-22-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 324-253-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 137-60-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 187-192-12 overall. The Tigers are 33-22 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 254-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 27-6.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 149-27 (.846) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 205-35-1 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 545-55-9 (.907) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 341-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 173-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» On the 2019 squad, 43 players now have at least one college start to their credit, 24 on offense and 19 on defense.

Eleven Tigers have at least 20 starts: Marlon Davidson 50, Jack Driscoll 44, Derrick Brown 38, Javaris Davis 36, Jeremiah Dinson 35, Mike Horton 31, Prince Tega Wanogho 31, Marquel Harrell 31, Daniel Thomas 27, Eli Stove 22 and Noah Igbingohene 21.

» Tigers earned 14 SEC weekly player of the week awards: Derrick Brown (DL/3), Marlon Davidson (DL/4), Jeremiah Dinson (DPOW), Zakoby McClain (DPOW), Anders Carlson (STPOW), Mike Horton (OL), Bo Nix (FR/2), D.J. Williams (FR). Auburn is the first team ever to win seven DL of the week awards in a season.

TAMPA, Fla. -- Auburn played it to the end, and then some, but it wasn't enough to beat Wisconsin and Melvin Gordon in the Outback Bowl. The Badgers won 34-31 in overtime when they made a field goal on their first possession, and Auburn missed a 45-yard try when it got the ball.

Gordon rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns, though Auburn had the lead with eight seconds left in regulation. Wisconsin tied the game a second later on a field goal, and won it in the first overtime period. The end of the game was like the rest of the game, a see-saw affair that featured big runs and good plays.

Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall picked one good play, and then another, in two drives near the end that gave the Tigers two leads. That's when Auburn found the proper balance between the run and the pass.

The Tigers answered two Wisconsin leads with decisive drives. Cameron Artis-Payne scored on a 2-yard run with 2:55 remaining. Before that, the Tigers had taken the lead a drive that saw Artis-Payne rip off a 21-yard run, Corey Grant run for 21, too, and Marshall throw a 21-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah.

Marshall came through after that, too. He led the Tigers to the Wisconsin 7, and, on fourth down, his pass to Sammie Coates may have been a TD had it not been for pass interference. It didn't matter. Artis-Payne scored on the next play.

Auburn finished the season with a 8-5 record. Wisconsin finished at 11-3.

The Tigers led at the half, but Gordon carried four times for 55 yards, including the final 25, on the first series of the second half to tie Auburn at 14-all.

On fourth-and-1, Gordon broke loose for a 53-yard touchdown run to give Wisconsin a 21-17 lead with 20 seconds left in the third quarter. But Auburn mixed it up on the Badgers from there, with Artis-Payne ripping off a 21-yard run, with Corey Grant doing the same, and with Marshall throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to Uzomah for a 24-21 lead with 11:21 left in the fourth quarter. Auburn regained the lead on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Daniel Carlson.

Wisconsin scored on its first series on a 7-yard pass from Joel Stave to Corey Clement, but the Tigers tied the game on a 2-yard touchdown run with 2:16 left in the first quarter, and went ahead on a Marshall 66-yard TD pass to Ricardo Louis. Those plays, and interceptions by Trovon Reed and Jermaine Whitehead, had Auburn ahead 14-7 at the half.

The first half was more of the same for Marshall, who threw for a single-game school record of 456 yards against Alabama in the previous game, then threw for 131 more in the first half against Wisconsin. Auburn hit halftime with those 131 yards passing and 46 yards rushing.

2019 Auburn Football Game Recaps

GAME 1 // #16 AUBURN 27, #11 OREGON 21 // AUGUST 31, 2019 // ABC // AT&T STADIUM (60,662) // DALLAS, TEXAS

True freshman quarterback Bo Nix tossed a 26-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams with nine seconds left to lead the Tigers past No. 11 Oregon, 27-21, in the season opener.

On the play before, Nix completed a 13-yard pass to Williams to put the Tigers in field-goal range with a chance to win. But rather than play it safe, he took a shot on the next play, throwing a jump ball to Williams who wrestled it away from the defender at the goal line.

The touchdown gave Auburn its first lead of the game and capped a 15-point second-half comeback. It was the largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game when the Tigers overcame a 24-point deficit to win 28-27.

What changed? For starters, the defense clamped down in the second half and made a huge stop on fourth down midway through the fourth quarter to thwart an Oregon drive and keep it a one-point game. The offense also found its rhythm with Nix under center.

Nix, the first true freshman to start at quarterback for Auburn since 1946, threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 42 yards in his first college game. His first career touchdown pass came late in the third quarter when he threw a quick pass to Eli Stove who took it in from 11 yards out to cut the Oregon lead to 21-13.

On the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Auburn used a heavy dose of running back Ja'Tarvious Whitlow to get down to the goal line where it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who took his first snap and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 21-20.

Whitlow recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 24 carries. The sophomore also surpassed 1,000 career all-purpose yards (897 rushing, 173 receiving). As a team, the Tigers ran for 206 yards and threw for 177 yards in Saturday's win.

Defensively, senior safety Jeremiah Dinson led Auburn with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack – the third of his career. K.J. Britt, making his first at middle linebacker, finished second on the team with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

It was also a career night for defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell, another first-time starter, who made two clutch stops late and recorded six tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

At the half, Auburn trailed, 14-6, and it could have been worse if not for an 83-yard fumble recovery from Big Kat Bryant that led to an Anders Carlson field goal and swung the momentum. It was the longest fumble return by an Auburn player through records dating back to 1996.

After Dinson picked off Tulane at Auburn's 18-yard line, the Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays with Ja'Tarvious Whitlow rushing for a 14-yard touchdown and a 21-6 Auburn lead with 1:51 left in the third quarter.

Whitlow led Auburn with 96 yards on 23 carries.

Anders Carlson kicked a 22-yard field goal with 12:36 left in the game for the final score.

Bo Nix completed 19 of 37 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown.

Dinson, Daniel Thomas and Marlon Davidson paced Auburn's defense with six tackles each. Davidson made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

The Tigers gained 152 of their 172 rushing yards in the second half, outgaining Tulane 379-223 for the game.

Revvng up the running game, No. 8 Auburn rushed for 467 yards and six touchdowns in a 55-16 Homecoming win over Kent State Saturday in the Tigers' tune-up for SEC play.

JaTarvious Whitlow gained 135 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns. Shaun Shivers and Joey Gatewood each rushed for 102 yards. It's the first time since 1983 a trio of Auburn rushers has topped the 100-yard mark.

Kam Martin added 71 yards and a touchdown on seven carries. Quarterbacks Bo Nix (one) and Gatewood (two) added rushing touchdowns. The Tigers averaged 7.5 yards on 62 carries.

SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Marlon Davidson recorded 2.5 of Auburn's five sacks. Tyrone Truesdell had 1.5 sacks with Big Kat Bryant getting one.

After Kent State kicked a field goal on the game's opening drive, Auburn answered with Whitlow rushing for a 3-yard TD with 5:47 left in the first quarter to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead.

Martin made it 14-3 on a 35-yard scoring run with 11 seconds remaining in the opening quarter.

After a Kent State 53-yard touchdown pass, Nix hit Sal Cannella on a 27-yard pass to set up Nix's 1-yard TD run.

Anders Carlson kicked a 45-yard field goal at the end of the half to give Auburn a 24-10 halftime lead.

Whitlow scored his second rushing touchdown on the opening drive of the second half putting the Tigers on top 31-10.

Nix hit Eli Stove on a 49-yard flea-flicker for a 38-10 Auburn lead. Nix was 12 of 16 for 161 yards and a touchdown.

Shivers' 27-yard run set up Carlson's second field goal, a 37-yarder on the opening play of the fourth quarter to make it 41-10.

After Kent State's second touchdown, Malcolm Askew intercepted the Golden Flashes' pass to negate a two-point attempt.

Gatewood scored on a pair of 2-yard runs in the fourth quarter.

A Homecoming crowd of 84,542 saw the Tigers improve to 26-6 in non-conference games in the Malzahn era.

Auburn's perfect record in Kyle Field remains intact after the 8th-ranked Tigers went on the road Saturday and knocked off No. 17 Texas A&M, 28-20, in their first SEC game of 2019. With the win, Auburn is now 4-0 all-time in College Station.

The Tigers struck early and often in Saturday's contest. On their opening drive, sophomore wide receiver Anthony Schwartz took a reverse and went 57 yards to the house to make it 7-0. It was Auburn's longest rush of the season and the longest rush in Schwartz's career. He also had the longest rush by any Auburn in the series against Texas A&M.

Two drives later, Auburn found the end zone again. This time, it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who connected with John Samuel Shenker on a six-yard touchdown pass. For Gatewood, it was his first career touchdown pass.

The Tigers took a 14-3 lead into the locker room at halftime.

In the second half, it was the Auburn defense that served as the catalyst. After allowing just 12 yards rushing to Texas A&M in the first half, the Tigers caused a turnover on the first play of the second half when safety Daniel Thomas forced a fumble and recovered it himself.

The turnover led to another Auburn score as starting quarterback Bo Nix marched the offense down the field and found Seth Williams for a 9-yard touchdown reception to make it 21-3.

Nix, a true freshman who was playing in his first true road game, finished 12 of 20 through the air for 100 yards and the touchdown. He also rushed 12 times for 38 yards, including a 7-yard run on third-and-five late in the fourth quarter to put the game away.

As a team, the Tigers outgained Texas A&M on the ground, 193-56.

The Aggies didn't score their first touchdown until early in the fourth quarter, but Auburn responded with a 12-play, 69-yard drive that took over six minutes and was capped off by an 8-yard touchdown run from JaTarvious Whitlow. The sophomore running back led the Tigers with 67 yards on 18 carries.

Senior Derrick Brown was dominant for the Auburn defense with four tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks, two pass break-ups and a forced fumble. The two sacks and three tackles for loss were single-game career highs for the preseason All-American.

Fellow defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell also added a sack, and the Tigers won the battle up front as they recorded seven tackles for loss, seven quarterback hurries and held Texas A&M to just 56 yards rushing, the fewest by the Aggies all-time in the series.

A touchdown on the Tigers' first offensive play set the tone Saturday in No. 7 Auburn's 56-23 dismantling of Mississippi State at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Quarterback Bo Nix completed 16 of 21 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns, adding 56 rushing yards and a third touchdown.

Auburn (5-0) scored six touchdowns in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission.

Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.

The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19.

Nix scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second touchdown from three yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark.

Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss.

No. 7 Auburn suffered its first loss of the season Saturday as the Tigers dropped a 24-13 contest on the road at No. 10 Florida.

The Gators struck first with a long touchdown on their first possession, but the Auburn defense responded with three turnovers on the next four Florida drives. Two of the turnovers led to field goals (48, 39) by Anders Carlson, who made it 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Sophomore Christian Tutt forced the first turnover when he sacked Florida quarterback Kyle Trask and jarred the ball loose. Chandler Wooten fell it on it for the fumble recovery. It was the first career forced fumble for Tutt and first career fumble recovery for Wooten.

Then, on the very next Florida possession, Auburn linebacker K.J. Britt made a big hit on the running back to pop the ball loose. This time, it was defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell who came up with it for his second career fumble recovery.

And then with Florida knocking on the door late in the quarter, it was the Auburn defense that came up with yet another fumble and recovery. Senior Marlon Davidson shot off the edge and hit Trask just as he was trying to throw the football. Fellow defensive lineman Derrick Brown picked up the loose ball and returned it 42 yards.

In records dating back through 1996, this was the first game the Tigers recovered three fumbles in a quarter.

The Auburn offense found the end zone early in the second quarter when, on the first play after a failed fake punt attempt, quarterback Bo Nix connected with Seth Williams on a 32-yard touchdown pass. It was Nix's eighth touchdown pass this season, and the fifth receiving touchdown for Williams, who now has 10 for his career.

Williams led the Tigers with four catches for 79 yards and the touchdown.

Auburn still trailed 17-13 at the half, and it stayed that way for most of the second half until late in the fourth quarter when Florida extended the lead with an 88-yard touchdown run from Lamical Perine.

Prior to that, Brown made another game-changing play early in the fourth quarter when he got to Trask, knocked the ball away and then grabbed it out of the air for his second fumble recovery of the game. The last Auburn player to with two fumble recoveries in a game was Montravius Adams at Mississippi State in 2016.

As a unit, the Auburn defense finished with seven tackles for loss, four sacks and the four fumble recoveries. Sophomore linebacker Zakoby McClain led the way with 10 tackles.

GAME 7 // #11 AUBURN 51, ARKANSAS 10 // OCTOBER 19, 2019 // SECN // DWRR STADIUM (54,619) // FAYETTEVILLE, ARK.

Marlon Davidson and Derrick Brown set the tone on the opening series while the Tigers' quick-strike offense scored seven touchdowns in No. 11 Auburn's 51-10 SEC West victory at Arkansas.

Arkansas won the toss and elected to receive, hoping to gain early momentum. Instead, it was Auburn's defense making a statement from the get-go.

On the second play, the 320-pound Brown ran down Razorbacks running back Rakeem Boyd for no gain. On the next play, Davidson sacked quarterback Ben Hicks, forcing and recovering a fumble at the Arkansas 22-yard line.

Two Bo Nix passes to Anthony Schwartz gained 18 yards, then Nix kept for a 4-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 Auburn lead with 12:38 left in the first quarter.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Kam Martin began another three-play touchdown drive by racing down the right sideline 52 yards to the Razorbacks' 11-yard-line.

Shaun Shivers' 6-yard TD run put Auburn ahead 14-0 fewer than five minutes into the game.

Auburn made it 17-0 with 51 seconds left in the first on Anders Carlson's 44-yard field goal, capping a 13-play, 55-yard drive.

Davidson recorded his second sack on third-and-8 early in the second quarter. On the next play, Chandler Wooten made his first career interception on Arkansas' fake punt pass.

The Razorbacks kicked a 27-yard field goal after a 16-play, 77-yard drive that took half of the third quarter to make it 17-3.

Auburn answered quickly, scoring 14 points in 22 seconds, with Nix hitting Seth Williams for a 48-yard touchdown pass at the 4:10 mark of the third quarter.

Carlson's extra point was Auburn's 303rd consecutive PAT, an NCAA record streak that started in 2013.

Javaris Davis' diving interception immediately regained possession for Auburn, then after Schwartz gained 28 yards on a reverse, Nix and Schwartz combined for a 28-yard touchdown pass and 31-3 Auburn lead.

Arkansas scored its only touchdown on a 45-yard pass after recovering a fumble, trimming Auburn's lead to 31-10 after three quarters.

Nix and Williams hooked up for their second touchdown of the game and seventh TD of the season to put Auburn on top 37-10.

Davidson, Brown, Roger McCreary and Jamien Sherwood each tallied five tackles to lead Auburn's defense. Michael Harris recovered a fumble for Auburn's fourth takeaway.

No. 9 Auburn, playing in its second top-10 matchup of October, held No. 2 LSU to a season-low 23 points Saturday, but the upset bid from the visiting Tigers came up short in a 23-20 loss on the road.

Auburn was up to the challenge early, holding LSU to 47 total yards and no points in the first quarter. It was only the second quarter this season that LSU was held scoreless. Thanks to a 30-yard field goal from Anders Carlson, Auburn led 3-0 after the first quarter.

Following an LSU touchdown, Auburn answered with a touchdown of its own when quarterback Bo Nix took it in from a yard out on 4th-and-1 to give his team the lead back late in the first half. The drive started deep in LSU territory after Jeremiah Dinson forced a fumble on a punt return that was recovered by teammate Jamien Sherwood.

LSU tacked on a late field goal to tie the score, 10-10, going into the locker room at halftime.

Auburn jumped out early in the third behind a 70-yard run from freshman D.J. Williams that led to another Carlson field goal to put the visitors back on top, 13-10. Williams recorded his first career 100-yard rushing performance with 130 yards on 13 carries.

It was the defense's turn after that as Auburn came up with two critical stops in the third quarter to keep LSU off the board.

First, the defense made a goal-line stand. Auburn stuffed three straight runs inside the 3-yard line, and on 4th-and-goal, Dinson and Noah Igbinoghene converged to make the tackle for no gain on a screen pass. Then, on the very next drive, sophomore cornerback Roger McCreary intercepted LSU quarterback Joe Burrow at the 1-yard line.

For McCreary, it was his first career interception at Auburn. It was only the fourth interception thrown by Burrow this year.

Burrow and the LSU offense responded, however, with a touchdown late in the third quarter and then another one early in the fourth to take a 23-13 lead.

Auburn continued to fight and with 2:32 to go, Nix connected with Seth Williams on a 5-yard touchdown pass to make it 23-20.

The ensuing onside kick was recovered by LSU, which all but sealed the outcome.

Defensively, five different Auburn players finished with 10 or more tackles - led by Dinson, who tied his career high with 15 tackles. Freshman linebacker Owen Pappoe also had a career high in tackles with seven and recorded 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

It was another outstanding performance from senior defensive lineman Derrick Brown, who finished with seven tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack.

A touchdown on the Tigers' first offensive play set the tone Saturday in No. 7 Auburn's 56-23 dismantling of Mississippi State at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Quarterback Bo Nix completed 16 of 21 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns, adding 56 rushing yards and a third touchdown.

Auburn (5-0) scored six touchdowns in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission.

Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.

The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19.

Nix scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second touchdown from three yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark.

Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss.

No. 13 Auburn rallied for two fourth-quarter touchdowns to earn two opportunities for game-tying drives before falling 21-14 Saturday to No. 5 Georgia at a sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

Trailing 21-0 after three quarters, Auburn's comeback began with Bo Nix's 3-yard touchdown pass to Eli Stove with 10:04 left in the fourth quarter, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

After a three-and-out by Auburn's defense, Auburn struck quickly, driving 57 yards on five plays in 68 seconds. Nix's 2-yard touchdown run, the first rushing TD allowed by Georgia this season, pulled Auburn within seven points with 7:03 remaining.

Again, the Tigers' defense came through, forcing a three-and-out to regain possession for Auburn at its 28-yard line with 6 minutes to play. On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Nix scrambled for 8 yards to keep Auburn's hopes alive at Georgia's 42. On fourth-and-2 at UGA's 34, Nix's pass to Harold Joiner was incomplete, giving the ball back to Georgia.

Once again, Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, giving the Tigers' possession at Auburn's 30 with 2:03 to play, but the Tigers were unable to get any closer.

Nix completed 30-of-50 passes for 245 yards and touchdown, adding 42 rushing yards on 13 carries and a TD.

Seth Williams made 13 receptions for 121 yards. Jeremiah Dinson led the defensive effort with eight tackles, while Daniel Thomas made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

Auburn trailed 21-0 heading to the fourth quarter after Georgia drove 88 yards on 12 plays, scoring on Jake Fromm's third touchdown pass, a 5-yarder to Eli Wolf with 13 seconds remaining in the third quarter.

Auburn then forced a three-and-out on Georgia's first possession, but the Bulldogs scored on their second drive on a 51-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Dominick Blaylock for a 7-0 lead with 5:56 left in the first quarter.

Near the end of the quarter, Auburn defensive linemen Derrick Brown and Marlon Davidson made tackles for loss on successive plays, with Brown's TFL on second-and-10 preceding Davidson's sack on third-and-12.

Auburn drove again into Georgia territory before being stopped on fourth-and-1 from the 37.

The Tigers' defense delivered three consecutive three-and-outs, allowing zero yards on nine plays.

After the second three-and-out, Nix and Williams connected on another slant for 28 yards, Auburn's biggest play of the half, advancing to Auburn's 45. In the half, Williams made seven receptions for 66 yards.

Georgia drove 81 yards to take a 14-0 lead on Fromm's 5-yard pass to Brian Herrien with 20 seconds left in the half.

Holding Samford to 114 yards while forcing four turnovers, No. 16 Auburn tuned up for the Iron Bowl with a 52-0 shutout Saturday at rainy Jordan-Hare Stadium.

In the first half, Auburn held the Bulldogs to 35 yards while recovering two fumbles and making an interception.

The takeaway parade began on the game's opening drive, when Christian Tutt recovered a fourth-down fumble and returned it 8 yards to midfield.

Auburn promptly drove 51 yards in nine plays with Ja'Tarvious Whitlow's 1-yard touchdown run giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. Jeremiah Dinson intercepted Samford's next play.

Whitlow made it 14-0 Auburn early in the second quarter with a 3-yard touchdown run after a 31-yard gain.

Auburn forced a third consecutive three-and-out, setting up Nix's 10-yard touchdown pass to Harold Joiner. Nix's 185 completions broke Stan White's freshman season record from 1990 and his 14th touchdown pass tied White's mark. He needs 49 more passing yards to break White's freshman record of 2,242.

Nix was 15 of 23 for 150 yards and a touchdown. Auburn gained 544 yards, including 293 rushing yards.

On back-to-back plays, Zakoby McClain made a tackle for a loss and forced a fumble, which Roger McCreary returned 15 yards to Samford's 19, Auburn's third turnover of the first half.

Auburn scored quickly, needing only three plays to make it 28-0 on Shaun Shivers' 4-yard touchdown run at the 7:14 mark of the second quarter. Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal gave Auburn a 31-0 halftime lead.

Early in the third quarter, Tutt returned an interception, Auburn's fourth takeaway, 26 yards to Samford's 9. Two plays later, D.J. Williams put Auburn ahead 38-0 with a 2-yard touchdown run.

Cord Sandberg relieved Nix and threw a pair of fourth-quarter touchdown passes to Zach Farrar covering 27 and 4 yards, respectively. Sandberg was 5-for-7 for 84 yards and two touchdowns, adding 31 rushing yards on six carries.

Auburn made 13 tackles for loss, including 2.5 from Marlon Davidson, who also had a sack.

No. 16 Auburn returned two interceptions for touchdowns, Anders Carlson kicked four long field goals and Shaun Shivers scored the game-winning touchdown in a back-and-forth 48-45 victory over No. 5 Alabama.

Smoke Monday and Zakoby McClain both returned interceptions to put the Tigers in front, but each time, the visitors responded with quick touchdowns in a game that featured 11 lead changes.

After Jaylen Waddle's fourth touchdown gave Alabama a 45-40 lead early in the fourth quarter, Auburn answered with a 77-yard game-winning drive, with Shivers crashing in on a sweep from the 11 for the go-ahead score. Bo Nix passed to Shedrick Jackson on the two-point conversion to put Auburn on top 48-45 with 8:08 remaining.

Alabama drove to Auburn's 10 before a potential game-tying 30-yard field goal attempt bounced off the left upright with two minutes to play. Needing one first down to run out the clock, the Tigers confused Alabama on fourth down by lining up Arryn Siposs at receiver with the regular offensive unit, resulting in an illegal substitution penalty on UA that effectively secured the win.

Auburn trailed 31-27 after a wild first half. After an early Alabama field goal, Christian Tutt's 36-yard punt return set up Bo Nix's 7-yard touchdown run with 2:07 left in the first quarter.

After Najee Harris' 6-yard TD run put Alabama ahead 10-7, Carlson kicked his first field goal, a 43-yarder, to tie it at 10-10.

Playing centerfield, Monday intercepted an overthrown pass, returning it 29 yards to give Auburn a 17-10 lead with 5:36 left in the half. Waddle returned the ensuing kick 98 yards to even the score at 17-17, then after an Auburn fumble, Alabama took a 24-17 lead on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 4:12 to go.

Auburn drove 75 yards, with Nix hitting Sal Cannella on a 14-yard touchdown, evening it 24-24 with 1:06 remaining in the half.

Waddle's 58-yard reception, put Alabama back on top 31-24 with only 33 seconds left in the half, but Auburn drove to the 34 with one second left, allowing Carlson to drill a 52-yarder to make it 31-27 as the half expired.

Carlson connected from 43 yards early in the third quarter to pull the Tigers within one point at 31-30.

Alabama drove to Auburn's 2-yard line, but Zakoby McClain intercepted a tipped pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards to give Auburn a 37-31 lead. Waddle's third touchdown, a 12-yarder, regained the lead for Alabama at 38-37 with 4:57 to go in the third quarter. Carlson's fourth field goal, a 44-yarder, gave Auburn the lead once more at 40-38 with 49 seconds left in the third quarter.

Waddle scored again early in the fourth quarter on a 28-yard pass to give Alabama a 45-40 lead, setting the stage for Shivers' game-winning score on an 11-play drive that consumed five and a half minutes.

Head Coach Gus Malzahn



In seven years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to seven consecutive bowl games, a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and an appearance in the 2014 BCS National Championship Game. Malzahn has directed Auburn to five New Year's Day bowl games.

Malzahn, 79-36 in seven seasons as a head coach, has directed teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 14 seasons as a collegiate coach, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship win over Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The second-longest active tenured head coach at one school in the SEC, Malzahn is one of only nine active FBS head coaches that have played in a national championship game. During his time at Auburn, the Tigers are one of three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

This season, the Tigers had one of the nation's most difficult schedules while posting a 9-3 record with wins over nationally ranked Oregon and Alabama to bookmark the regular season schedule. Auburn's schedule included four games against teams in the top nine of the final CFP rankings. Senior Derrick Brown was a consensus All-America and SEC Defensive Player of the Year while helping a Tiger defense rank in the top 20 nationally. Offensively, Auburn was led by true freshman quarterback Bo Nix, who was named the SEC Freshman of the Year. The Tigers concluded the regular season third in the SEC in scoring offense and fourth in total offense.

In 2018, the Tigers posted a 8-5 regular season record while facing six opponents that were ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 (four of those played away from home), including four teams of the top 11 teams. The Tigers capped the season with an impressive 63-14 win over Purdue in the Music City Bowl. With Malzahn at the helm calling the plays, the Tigers' 63 points were a new SEC bowl game record for points, and the 56 first-half points were the most ever by a college football team in one half of a bowl game.

In 2017, Malzahn's team reached as high as No. 2 in the College Football Playoff Poll and played in the SEC Championship Game for the second time in five seasons, knocking off No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama in a November to remember on The Plains. It was the first time in poll history that a program has defeated two top-ranked teams during the same regular season.

The 2017 Tigers were one of four FBS teams to average more than 225 yards rushing and 225 yards passing and averaged 37.1 points per game in league play. Auburn averaged 40.9 points and 491.1 yards in SEC action, both program bests, while winning five of seven conference games by 21 points or more.

In 2016, Malzahn's team won six consecutive games, the third longest win streak by Auburn in 12 years, while finishing second in the nation's most difficult division, the SEC West. Under his direction, the 2016 Tigers ranked in the top 50 nationally in total offense and total defense, an Auburn first since 2005.

Auburn's balance in 2016 was displayed by a team that ranked first in the SEC and sixth nationally in rushing, coupled with a defense that was seventh

in the country in scoring defense and 28th in total defense. The special team units, traditionally been a strong point under Malzahn, were led by the strong leg of All-America and Groza Award finalist kicker Daniel Carlson.

In 2015, the youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced 11 bowl teams en route to a Birmingham Bowl victory over Memphis. Malzahn's 2014 team was ranked in the nation's top 10 for a majority of the season before finishing 8-5 after navigating the nation's most difficult schedule featuring seven ranked foes.

He has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 14 seasons as a college coach, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron Artis-Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 despite missing significant time with injuries and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Since Malzahn's arrival, Auburn has the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 236.9 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) have come under Malzahn's leadership.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and

set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, while setting the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In Malzahn's seven seasons, a total of 206 players have been selected in the National Football League draft, including first round picks Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) of the 2014 draft. In the 2019 draft, Auburn had six players drafted, the most Tigers selected in one draft in the common draft era.

Malzahn has coached 13 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn while having one national award winner in Reese Dismukes who was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center.

The Tigers have faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's seven years on The Plains facing 34 ranked opponents, including 18 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four CFP Semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn and his coaching staff have been highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive Top 10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in the program's history.

Academically, Malzahn's Tigers have excelled as 100-plus players have graduated since his arrival. In the fall 2016 semester a program-best 56 players posted a 3.0 grade point average.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Award.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games. Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Ark., and played football at Arkansas and Henderson State, earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson in 1990.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander. The Malzahns have two grandsons, Anderson James Peek (March 2018) and Arthur Elliott Peak (December 2019).

Dr. Jay Gogue
Auburn University Interim President

Dr. Jay Gogue returned to his alma mater on July 16, 2007, as Auburn University's 18th president and retired as president emeritus on July 1, 2017. He was appointed by the university's Board of Trustees to serve as interim president effective July 8, 2019. The Waycross, Ga., native earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Auburn and a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

During his tenure as president, the academic strength of Auburn's student population increased, a new research center was established in Huntsville, Ala., a common book program that generates a shared academic experience was instituted, and outreach partnerships with underserved schools in surrounding communities were established. His leadership during a period of sharp reductions in state support for the university budget protected Auburn's academic quality and prevented elimination of academic programs. Since his retirement, Dr. Gogue has remained engaged in the realm of academia, advising colleagues at numerous universities and teaching a course on higher education leadership to Auburn students.

Dr. Gogue was selected in 2013 for the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2012, he was inducted into the Alabama Academy of Honor, a group of 100 Alabamians "chosen for accomplishment or service greatly benefitting or reflecting great credit on the State."

Before returning to Auburn, Dr. Gogue served as president of New Mexico State University beginning in 2000 and, in 2003, he was named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System. He started his higher education administration career in 1986 at Clemson University as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected him as provost in 1995.

Dr. Gogue is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. He met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Like Dr. Gogue, Mrs. Gogue also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the parents of three children and have one grandchild.



Allen Greene
Athletics Director

Allen Greene, known as a dynamic and energetic leader, is in his second year at Auburn after being named the program's 15th director of athletics on January 18, 2018. Greene served in the same capacity at the University at Buffalo from November 2015 until his arrival at Auburn.

One of the youngest athletics directors in the NCAA power five ranks, Greene, 42, is highly regarded by his peers. He is actively engaged in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, Minority Opportunities Athletics Association, and LEAD1, an association dedicated to preparing today's students to be tomorrow's leaders.

Auburn has achieved great success competitively under Greene's leadership as 22 programs have finished ranked in the top 25 nationally, including eight programs in the top 10. The Auburn equestrian program has won a pair of national championships since his arrival and the men's and women's golf programs each advanced to the national semifinals once.

The 2018-19 academic year was historic as the men's basketball program made its first-ever trip to the Final Four, while the baseball program returned to the College World Series for the first time in 22 years.

Academically during Greene's time at Auburn, 177 athletes have earned their degrees and 331 have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Greene's tenure as director of athletics at the University at Buffalo is noted for success on the field and in the classroom, as well as donor and corporate development efforts that led to an array of facility enhancements.

Prior to being named AD at Buffalo, Greene served as the senior associate athletic director for administration and deputy director of athletics at UB. Greene previously worked in fundraising at Ole Miss and two years as an athletics fundraiser for Notre Dame and five years in its compliance office.

A graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in finance, Greene was a three-year starter for the Fighting Irish baseball team and played three years in the New York Yankees minor league system. Greene later received his master's degree from Indiana University's South Bend campus.

Greene and his wife, Christy, have three children, daughters Rian and Seneca, and son Samuel.

Auburn's bowl history began in 1937 when the Tigers and Villanova tied 7-7 in the Bacardi Bowl, sometimes referred to as the Rhumba Bowl or the Cigar Bowl, the climaxing event of Cuba's annual National Sports Festival.

The game was played in Havana, Cuba, and was the first bowl game to ever be played outside the United States.

An Auburn drive in the first quarter stalled on the 10-yard line where the Wildcats took over on downs. After a Villanova punt, Auburn back Billy Hitchcock broke loose around left end and rambled 40 yards for the Tigers only score. The score at the half was Auburn 7, Villanova 0.

Auburn stopped a Villanova drive on its own 12-yard line during the third quarter but couldn't get field position. Villanova was able to tie the score when they blocked an Auburn quick kick and the ball bounced into the endzone where Wildcat lineman Matthews Kuber fell on it for the score. The PAT tied up the game.

Auburn's return to the States marked an end to more than 11,000 miles of football travel for the 7-2-2 Tigers that finished the season ranked 13th in the nation under coach Jack Meagher.

The game was played in a revolutionary atmosphere. Fulgencio Batista, the dictator who would be overthrown by Fidel Castro 22 years later, had just assumed power.

The game was almost canceled because Batista's picture was not in the game program. A quick trip to the printer saved the Bacardi Bowl and allowed Auburn's bowl history to get off to a significant and historical beginning.

Southeastern Conference officials lifted a ban which forbade SEC teams to play postseason games in bowls other than the Rose and Sugar Bowls and allowed Auburn to play Michigan State in the Orange Bowl.

A capacity crowd of 19,000 fans watched an aggressive Auburn team defeat the powerful Spartans, 6-0 limiting Michigan State to only two first downs, the first coming late in the third quarter, and 57 total offensive yards, 32 yards rushing and 25 passing. Auburn racked up 233 yards on the ground and 79 through the air for 312 total yards.

Auburn's only score was set up by a George Kenmore 60-yard punt return that put the Tigers on the Spartan 36-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage Kenmore passed to Ralph O'Gwynne at the Spartan two-yard line. On fourth and goal from the one, O'Gwynne circled left end for the only score of the game.

Coach Jack Meagher's Tigers finished the season with a 6-2-3 record.

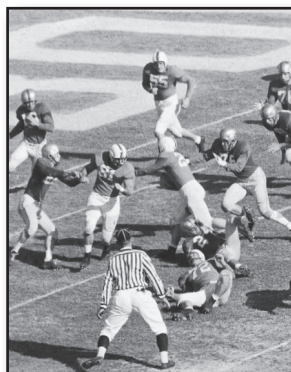

In Auburn's first bowl appearance in 15 years, and first bowl game under Ralph "Shug" Jordan, the Tigers starting offensive backfield included a future Governor of Alabama (Fob James) and a future coach of the University of Georgia (Vince Dooley), but Texas Tech was not impressed and handed the Tigers a 35-13 defeat.

Dooley guided Auburn to a touchdown the first time they had the ball as the Tigers went 60 yards in 10 plays, with James' 21-yard run being a key play in the drive. Bobby Duke scored from the one. A tough Auburn defense held the Red Raiders, the nation's highest scoring team, to just 11 yards in the first quarter. But it wasn't long before they would get on track.

Texas Tech scored early in the second period on a 30-yard pass from Jack Kirkpatrick to Bobby Cavazos. Auburn came back after an intercepted pass, and Dooley scored on a 10-yard run to end the drive. The Tigers led 13-7 at halftime, but it was all downhill from there.

Texas Tech scored the first two times they had the ball in the second half, once after blocking an Auburn punt, to lead at the end of three quarters, 21-13. Two touchdowns on two possessions in the fourth quarter made the final score read Texas Tech 35, Auburn 13.

Baylor fumbled the opening kickoff, Auburn recovered and five plays later "Joltin Joe" Childress scored the first Auburn touchdown.

Baylor came back with a nine-play, 63-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Auburn's two possessions of the second quarter resulted in a pair of touchdowns, a 43-yard run by Fob James and a four-yard Bobby Freeman to Jimmy Long pass which capped a 92-yard drive. Auburn led at the half, 21-7.

The Tigers scored twice in the second half, sandwiching their scores around a five-play, 66-yard drive by the Bears. Childress capped an

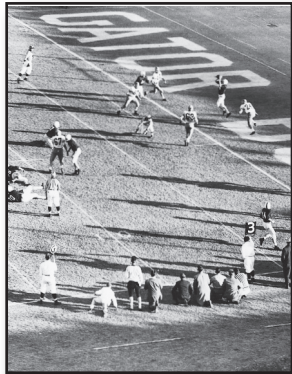

It was Auburn's third straight trip to the Gator Bowl and Vanderbilt's first bowl game ever, and that might tell the story of Auburn's 25-13 upset loss to the Commodores.

Vanderbilt scored first on a seven-yard Don Orr to Joe Stephenson pass which was set up by a Howell Tubbs fumble, the first of three for him that day, which gave the Commodores the ball on the Tigers' 39-yard line. Auburn scored early in the second quarter, driving 72 yards for the TD. Tubbs passed to Fob James for 38 yards and the touchdown. Vanderbilt scored quickly, going 76 yards in four plays as Orr scored from the three-yard line. The extra point was not good and the Commodores led at the half, 13-7.

Another Tubbs fumble set up Vanderbilt's first scoring drive of the second half. Recovering at the Auburn 45-yard line, Vanderbilt took eight plays to score with Phil King going over from the one, giving Vanderbilt a 19-7 lead. A poor punt and a 15-yard penalty gave the Commodores the ball on the Auburn 26-yard line after the Tigers were unable to move. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Charlie Horton scored from the Auburn one to give Vanderbilt a 25-7 lead. Auburn finished the scoring with a seven-yard Jimmy Cook to Red Phillips pass at the end of a six-play, 66-yard drive to make the final score 25-13.

Auburn fumbled five times with Vanderbilt recovering all five to set up the Tigers' most disappointing loss of the 1955 campaign. The Tigers finished with an 8-2-1 record.

Joe Childress was voted Auburn's outstanding player.

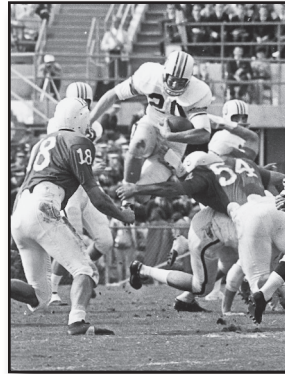

A trip to the Orange Bowl capped a near perfect season for the Auburn Tigers. Coach "Shug" Jordan led his Tigers to a 9-1 record with a rugged defense and an option offense featuring All-America quarterback Jimmy Sidle and halfback Tucker Frederickson. Auburn had defeated Alabama 10-8 to earn the chance to play the Big Eight powerhouse Nebraska Cornhuskers.

Auburn found itself in the hole on the second play from scrimmage as Nebraska quarterback Dennis Claridge sneaked off right guard for a 68-yard touchdown gallop that left Auburn trailing 7-0 before most of the fans were seated. Two Dave Theissen field goals gave the Cornhuskers a 13-0 lead with over 10 minutes remaining in the first half. That is the lead the Nebraska team took in the locker room.

The "Jekyll and Hyde" Auburn team was as dominating in the second half as they were inept in the first half. Sidle led the resurgence of the Tigers by capping off their only scoring drive with a 13-yard run in the third quarter. With only 1:30 left in the game, the Tigers were on the Nebraska 10-yard line. But a costly motion penalty and an incomplete fourth down desperation pass sealed the Cornhusker victory.

Auburn dominated in the second half, combining for 110 rushing yards and 101 passing yards while limiting Nebraska to 43 yards on the ground and nine in the air.

Sidle finished the day with 96 yards rushing on 21 carries.

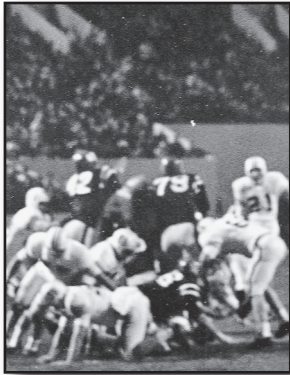

It was the Seventh Annual Liberty Bowl, but the first to be played in the present site of Memphis, Tenn., that saw the Ole Miss Rebels hold off a gallant Auburn comeback to win 13-7.

Ole Miss got the scoring started when Johnny Keyes connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first period. Auburn marched right back and scored when fullback Tom Bryan broke off left tackle and raced 44 yards for the touchdown. The score at halftime was Auburn 7, Ole Miss 3.

The Rebels took the opening kickoff and ran off nine consecutive rushing plays to march to the Tiger six-yard line. From there reserve quarterback Joe Graves went to the air and found wingback Doug Cunningham for a six-yard touchdown pass. The extra point gave Ole Miss a 10-7 lead. Keyes added another field goal to complete the scoring but not the action. Auburn marched deep into Rebel territory. But, with only seconds remaining, the Tigers' desperation fourth down pass fell incomplete, preserving the win for the Rebels.

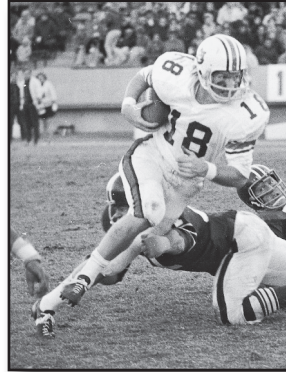

Auburn jumped to a 10-0 lead early in the game behind a 65-yard scoring pass from quarterback Loran Carter to halfback Mickey Zofko and a 52-yard field goal by John Riley. Arizona came back with a touchdown pass and field goal of their own to tie the score as the players headed for the locker room at the half.

Auburn reserve quarterback Tommy Traylor scampered nine yards to open the second half scoring for the Tigers on their first possession of the half. Two plays later, Buddy McClinton picked off an errant Wildcat pass, one of three interceptions for McClinton, and raced 32 yards for another Auburn score. Riley added another field goal and

Carter flipped a 43-yard touchdown pass to Tim Christian to complete the Tiger scoring.

The game's oddest play occurred when Auburn punter Connie Frederick had a punt blocked by Arizona. The Wildcats almost recovered the loose ball for a touchdown but Frederick managed to get to the ball first and was able to punt the ball a second time.

Auburn's defense combined for a Sun Bowl record of eight interceptions.

McClinton was named the game's Most Valuable Player while teammate David Campbell was named Most Valuable Lineman from his defensive tackle position.

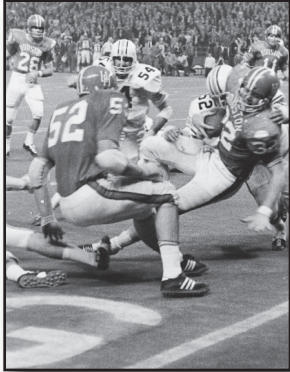

Houston executed its veer offense to perfection and executed Auburn in the process. Behind the leadership of sophomore quarterback Gary Mullins, the Cougars piled up Astro-Bluebonnet records for rushing yards with 376 and total yards with 516.

Auburn's Terry Beasley, just a sophomore, fumbled the ball away at the Tiger 29-yard line on the opening kickoff. The Cougars covered those 29 yards in seven plays with Mullins sneaking over from the one-yard line.

Later, Houston capped an 80-yard drive with a Carlos Lopez 27-yard field goal to take a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. A bowl record 57-yard punt by Auburn's Connie Frederick put Houston back at its own 16-yard line, but the Cougars stormed away with an 84-yard, five-play drive. Strong went 74 yards on the first play of the drive and scored the touchdown on fourth and goal from the one.

Auburn mounted its only scoring drive of the game, going 67 yards in five short plays in the second quarter. A 36-yard halfback pass from Mickey Zofko to Frederick finished the drive. The Tigers seemed to take the momentum into the locker room after blocking a Cougar 25-yard field goal attempt late in the quarter.

This game was billed as the "Battle of the Quarterbacks," and it was that and more. Auburn had Pat Sullivan, heir apparent to the Heisman Trophy the next year, and Ole Miss had Archie Manning, one of the top QBs in SEC his-

tory.

Auburn started off quickly as it was the familiar combination of Sullivan to Terry Beasley for a 13-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes gone in the game. Auburn scored twice more before Ole Miss could retaliate. Sullivan connected with Alvin Bresler for an eight-yard touchdown pass. On the first play from scrimmage after the kickoff, Auburn recovered a Rebel fumble and went up 21 points as Sullivan executed the quarterback draw for 37 yards and a touchdown.

Manning led a Rebel comeback by directing his team to a 79-yard, 10-play drive capping it off with a one-yard run. Manning later connected with Floyd Franks on a 34-yard touchdown pass to cut Auburn's lead to 21-14 at the half.

A 42-yard, Sullivan-to-Beasley pass set up Auburn's first score in the second half, as Mickey Zofko hit off right tackle for a six yard touchdown run early in the third quarter. Manning led his team back again with a 42-yard run to put the Rebels at the Auburn 23-yard line.

Auburn's final score came on a Larry Willingham 55-yard punt return with only nine seconds remaining in the third quarter, to take the Tigers to a 35-21 advantage.

Manning was again the key to the Rebels' final score as he scrambled for a 37-yard gain to the Auburn 34. From there Chumbler went over from the one to cut the Tigers' lead to seven.

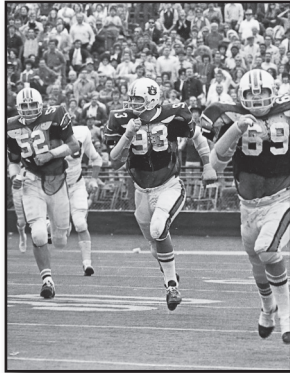

The game was not as close as the score indicated and the score was bad enough. Auburn's long-dreamed-of, much-hoped-for trip to the Sugar Bowl turned into a nightmare as the Oklahoma Sooners, capitalizing on three first half turnovers, executed their wishbone offense to perfection in building up a 31-0 halftime lead before cruising back to Norman with a 40-22 win.

The Sooners took the opening kickoff 77 yards in 13 plays and ran off over six minutes on the clock as they scored their first touchdown of the day on a Leon Crosswhite four-yard run, giving Oklahoma a quick 6-0 lead. The option was working to perfection five minutes later as quarterback Jack Mildren kept the ball for a five-yard touchdown run. A 71-yard punt return for a touchdown by Joe Wylie following Auburn's next possession opened the flood gates. Mildren scored twice more before the half on runs of four and seven yards to complete the first half whitewash and head into the locker room with a 31-0 lead.

After a 53-yard field goal by the Sooners, Auburn finally got on the scoreboard when Harry Unger dove over right guard from the one yard line. Oklahoma again scored on the option, this time Greg Pruitt sweeping around the left side from two yards out to make the

score 40-7.

Two Oklahoma fumbles set up the Tigers' last two scores as Sullivan connected with Sandy Cannon for an 11 yard touchdown pass and Unger again dove over from the one yard line. Final score, Oklahoma 40 - Auburn 22.

No one gave Auburn much of a chance in this, the 28th Annual Gator Bowl Classic. The Colorado Buffaloes were bigger, stronger and said to be quicker and meaner. Auburn lost its starting quarterback Randy Walls to a

knee injury at the start of the bowl practice and had to bring on virtually unknown and untested Wade Whatley to lead the offense. Those experts who didn't think Auburn had a chance just didn't know these Tigers. The Tigers were predicted to finish with a 2-9 record against the nation's toughest schedule. Instead they finished with a 10-1 record and earned the nickname "The Amazin's" because they never seemed to know the odds and they never admitted defeat. The Tigers defeated No. 2 ranked and unbeaten Alabama 17-16 after blocking two consecutive punts for touchdowns in the final minutes of the game. Coach "Shug" Jordan called "The Amazin's" his favorite team.

Gardner Jett opened the Tiger scoring in the Gator Bowl with a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter of action. A Colorado fumble on the ensuing possession gave the ball to the Tigers on the Buffalo 16-yard line. Five plays later, Whatley slid over from the one for Auburn's first touchdown.

Auburn's second touchdown of the game came with just over six minutes to play in third quarter when the Tigers executed the halfback pass to perfection. Mike Fuller received the pitch from Whatley and connected with Rob Spivey for a 22-yard score capping a six-play, 56-yard drive. Colorado scored

its only points of the game on a 33-yard Fred Lima field goal with 7:30 left to play in the game, which ended an 80-yard 14-play drive.

The Tigers retaliated with a fake field goal that resulted in Auburn's final score. Holder Dave Beck took the snap, straightened up and threw to Dan Nugent for a 16-yard touchdown with one minute left to play to make the final score.

Missouri's defense kept Auburn's offense off balance from the opening kickoff and stormed away with a 34-17 win in the 39th Annual Sun Bowl.

Auburn was able to score first following a Missouri fumble which Auburn's Rusty Deen recovered at the Missouri 49. Auburn's seven play drive could only muster 30 yards and the Tigers settled for a 35-yard Roger Pruett field goal.

After an exchange of punts, Missouri recovered an Auburn fumble at the AU 35-yard line. One play later, Missouri had the lead as quarterback Chuck Link passed to John Kelsey for the TD.

Missouri scored again one minute later following another Auburn fumble. Ray Bybee scored on a two-yard run capping a three-play, 24-yard drive.

Missouri continued to move the ball, scoring on a 10 play 48-yard drive, with Ray Smith connecting with Kelsey from two yards for his second touchdown, and a 21-3 Missouri lead.

With 3:08 to play in the first half, Auburn started on its only real offensive threat of the game. Quarterback Phil Gargis passed to Thomas Gossom from 17 yards out. Only eight seconds remained in the half and Auburn had cut the lead to 21-10.

On the ensuing kickoff, Missouri's John Moseley took the ball 84 yards for the touchdown. Missouri went to the locker room with a comfortable 28-10.

Missouri opened the second half scoring on a five-play, 33-yard drive that began after recovering an Auburn fumble. Smith found Jim Sharp in the corner of the endzone on a 14-yard scoring strike to make Missouri's lead 34-10.

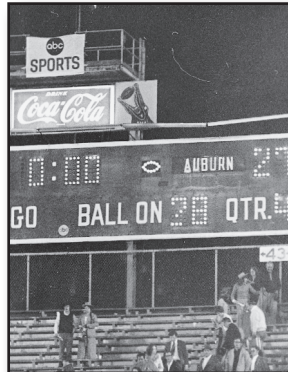

The Auburn Tigers made their sixth Gator Bowl appearance, and their third in five years, a success when they defeated the Darrell Royal-coached Texas Longhorns 27-3. Had not Auburn fumbled seven times, a bowl record, the

score might have been even more embarrassing as the Tigers dominated from the opening kickoff.

The Tigers stopped the Longhorns on the Texas four-yard line following the opening kickoff and Texas never seemed to recover. Auburn got its first chance with the ball at its 40-yard line and promptly drove 60 yards for its first touchdown. The drive was capped when quarterback Phil Gargis connected with Ed Butler for a seven-yard score.

A Longhorn fumble gave the Tigers the ball at the Texas 27. Two Mitzi Jackson runs covered the distance to the endzone as Auburn went up 14-0 with only nine minutes gone in the game.

Texas started a drive on its own 23-yard line. The Longhorns moved the ball to the Auburn 18-yard line, behind the running of freshman running back, Earl Campbell, before the drive sputtered. The Longhorns settled for a Billy Scott 35-yard field goal with 1:00 left

to play in the first quarter and Auburn led 14-3.

When Texas tried to punt the ball away from inside its own 10-yard line, Auburn's Jim McKinney blocked the punt out of the endzone for a safety.

Auburn scored its final points in the fourth quarter. Gargis passed to Butler for 14 yards and a touchdown for one score. The Tiger 29-yard drive was set up by a Mike Fuller interception of a Texas pass. Gargis passed to Dan Nugent for the two-point conversion. Chris Wilson kicked a 28 yard field goal with 0:09 showing on the game clock.

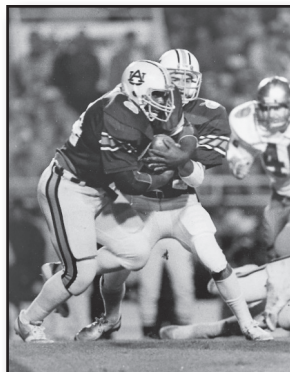

The Auburn Tigers, 8-3 on the year and yearning for national recognition, defeated Boston College 33-26 before a sellout crowd of 51,296 in the Tangerine Bowl.

The Tigers faced one of the nation's best passers in BC quarterback Doug Flutie, but in the end it was Auburn, not Boston College, who lived by the pass. Auburn QB Randy Campbell was named the game's Most Valuable Player, narrowly edging teammates Lionel James who gained 101 yards on 18 carries, and Mark Dorminey, who intercepted one of Flutie's passes and was the game's most valuable defensive player.

The Tigers traveled by land as well as air. Ten Auburn backs carried the football, with James' 101 yards and Bo Jackson's two touchdowns leading the way. In all, Auburn gained 490 yards against BC; 313 rushing, 177 passing.

Auburn led 23-10 at the half and stretched the lead to 33-10 before Boston College mounted a comeback against Auburn reserves. The Eagles scored on the last play of the game for the 33-26 final.

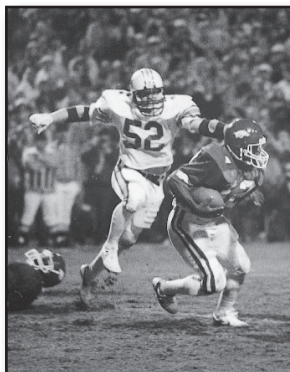

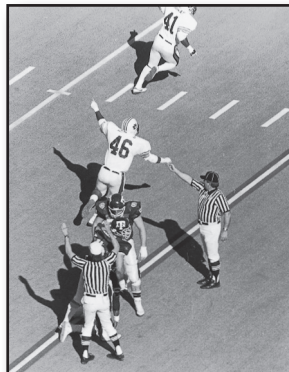

The Auburn defense held strong on the final Razorback offensive series and the Tigers held on to win 21-15. The victory marked the third consecutive bowl victory for the Tigers and gave Auburn the best three-year record in the Southeastern Conference with 29 total victories.

Heisman Trophy winner Bo Jackson's five-yard touchdown burst early in the first quarter gave the Tigers an early 7-0 lead, but two score by the Aggies gave A&M the lead, 12-7, at the end of the first period.

With 8:28 remaining in the first half, Jackson took a pass from QB Pat Washington and raced 73 yards for a touchdown to again give Auburn the lead 13-12. But a 26-yard field goal by Aggie PK Scott Slater with 50 seconds remaining in the half would give Texas A&M the lead for good.

Auburn managed only a field goal in the second half, a 26-yarder by freshman Chris Johnson, while Texas A&M romped to a 36-16 victory.

Twice in the fourth quarter, Auburn failed to convert fourth-down situations, one halting a drive at the Aggie two-yard line.

QB Pat Washington was two of seven for 82 yards and was replaced due to injury in the second quarter by Jeff Burger, who was five for 10 for 72 yards. 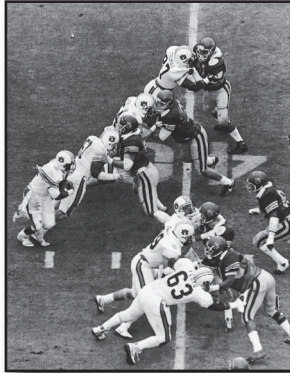

Auburn's January 1 date with Southern California in Orlando's Citrus Bowl marked the fifth consecutive bowl game for the Tigers, the third New Year's Day Bowl.

The Tigers' 9-2 regular season had left them one victory shy of becoming only the fifth team in Auburn history to win 10 games in a single season. Auburn's all-time football record stood at 499 victories. A 16-7 triumph over USC, the nation's winningest bowl team, gave the Tigers their 10-2 record and the 500th all-time Auburn win.

USC was the first on the scoreboard when linebacker Marcus Cotton intercepted a Jeff Burger pass and returned it 24 yards for a Trojan touchdown. But those were the only points USC scored the rest of the day.

In the second period, the Tigers culminated an 80-yard drive with Burger hitting tight end Walter Reeves with a three-yard touchdown pass. With 1:30 remaining in the first half, All-America tailback Brent Fullwood ran in from four yards out for a score. PK Chris Knapp kicked his second PAT of the quarter to give Auburn a 14-7 lead.

With 4:48 left, OLB Aundray Bruce hit USC QB Rodney Peete in the backfield, causing a fumble which was recovered by a teammate, Nate Hill on the Auburn 48-yard line.

The Auburn defense held strong throughout the second half. In the fourth quarter, Auburn DT Tracy Rocker dropped Peete for a 13-yard sack and a safety, making the score 16-7.

Bruce, who recorded three QB sacks and caused a fumble which set up an Auburn scoring drive, was voted the overall Citrus Bowl MVP.

Auburn finished the season ranked sixth in the nation in the final AP poll and eighth in the UPI rankings.

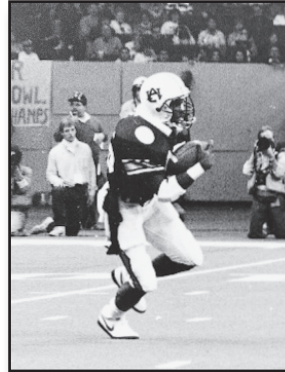

A 9-1-1 regular-season record and the 1987 Southeastern Conference championship earned the Tigers a trip to New Orleans and a January 1 date with unbeaten Syracuse in the USF&G Sugar Bowl.

Sophomore kicker Win Lyle's 30-yard field goal with one second remaining in the game gave the Sugar Bowl the first tie in its 54-year history, a 16-16 deadlock.

The game matched the best of the South against the best of the East — the sixth-ranked Tigers and the fourth-ranked Orangemen. Auburn's first touchdown was set up on a 58-yard flanker reverse pass from wide receiver Duke Donaldson to wide receiver Lawyer Tillman. With 5:45 remaining in the first quarter, quarterback Jeff Burger hit Tillman for a 17-yard score.

The Tigers held a 10-7 lead at halftime, but the Orangemen tied it at 10-10 by the end of the third quarter. Syracuse kicker Tim Vesling booted field goals of 32 and 38 yards in the fourth quarter while Auburn's Lyle was good on tries of 41 and 30 yards, the final kick tying the game for good.

Tillman, the game's leading receiver with six catches for 125 yards, was named the game's offensive MVP by ABC-TV.

The trip to New Orleans was Auburn's fourth New Year's Day bowl game in five years.

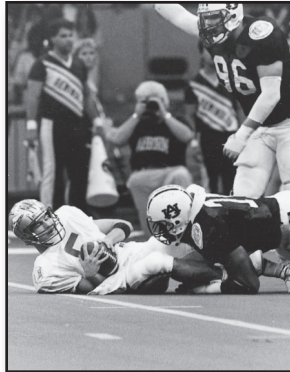

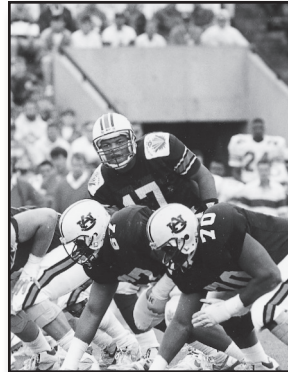

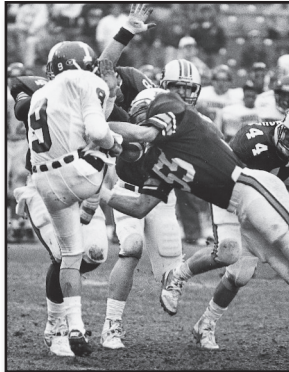

Quarterback Stan White put the lid on a late Auburn come-from-behind win when he scampered one yard on a fourth-down bootleg to lift Auburn to a 27-23 win over Indiana in the 1990 Peach Bowl.

White's game-winning touchdown was his second of the day as the Tigers finished the 1990 season 8-3-1. For his efforts the freshman was named the Offensive MVP of the game. Auburn linebacker Darrel Crawford was named the Defensive MVP as the Tigers limited Indiana to just 220 yards total offense.

Auburn opened the scoring with White's first touchdown of the day, a six-yard run with 3:37 to play in the first quarter. Indiana tied the game at 7-7 on the final play of the first period when Trent Green

scored from three yards out.

Auburn scored on an 11-yard White to Alex Smith pass and tacked on a 26-yard Jim Von Wyl field goal to take a 17-10 lead into the half.

Following a scoreless third period, the Hoosiers took a 23-17 lead into the game's final minutes on the strength of two more touchdown runs by Green. Green's third touchdown of the day came with just 2:27 to play.

White and receiver Herbert Casey converted on a pair of critical third down situations on Auburn's final drive of the game to set up White's game winner in the last bowl game Auburn would play with Pat Dye as head coach.

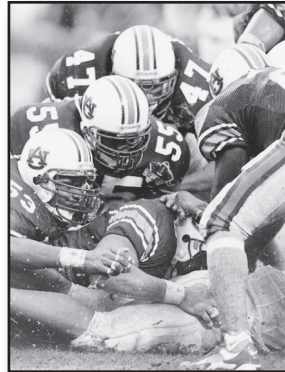

The Nittany Lions scored on all four possessions in the third quarter. In the first drive, Richardson capped an eighty-yard effort with a nine-yard strike to Engram.

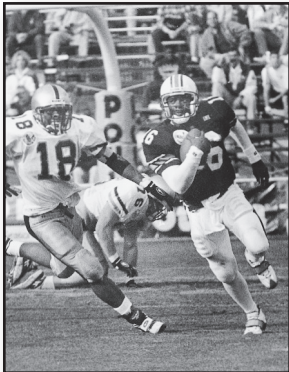

In winning its first bowl game in six years, Auburn utilized the talents of quarterback Dameyune Craig. Craig threw for an Independence and Auburn bowl record 370 yards while rushing for 75 more in earning Offensive MVP honors.

Craig led Auburn to the game's first 20 points, throwing touchdown strikes to Tyrone Goodson (30 yards) and Willie Gosha (seven yards) and setting up a pair of Jaret Holmes field goals.

Meanwhile, the Tiger defense held Army's option attack in check for most of the first half. The Cadets finally got on the scoreboard when Bobby Williams scored with 1:27 remaining in the first half to make it 20-7, Auburn.

Auburn built its lead to 32-7 in the third quarter on a 33-yard scramble by Craig and an 18-yard burst by Rusty Williams. Two-point attempts after both scores failed.

Army made a valiant comeback in the fourth quarter as Demetrius Perry and Bobby Williams both scored touchdowns to cut Auburn's lead to 32-21 with 5:52 left. Cadet quarterback Ronnie McAda then found Rod Richardson on a 30-yard catch-and-run for another touchdown with 1:27 remaining. Williams' two-point run made the score 32-29.

After recovering the ensuing on-side kick and moving the ball to Auburn's 10, Army tried the 27-yard field goal attempt by Parker on third down.

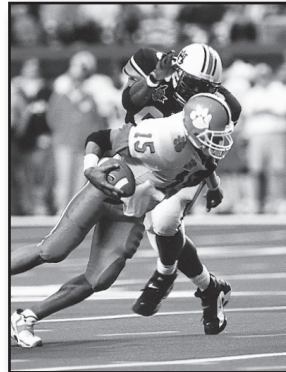

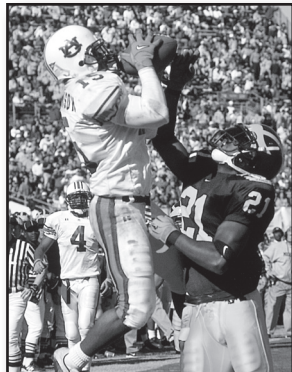

The 20th-ranked Auburn Tigers made a late fourth quarter charge, but fell short, losing to 17th-ranked Michigan Wolverines, 31-28, in the Capital One Florida Citrus Bowl.

The Tigers utilized the arm of senior quarterback Ben Leard, who set two Auburn bowl records by throwing for 394 yards and three touchdowns. Answering a first quarter 31-yard Wolverine touchdown pass from Drew Henson to David Terrell, Leard threw his first touchdown to Ronney Daniels in the second quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Auburn took the lead as Leard hit senior Clifton Robinson on a 20-yard touchdown with 11:04 before the half. But Henson connected on a four-yard pass to B.J. Askew to tie the game at 14-14. Michigan regained the lead on an 11-yard scamper from Anthony Thomas to end the first half at 21-14.

Michigan built its lead to 28-14 in the third quarter as Thomas, named the game's MVP, entered the endzone on a 25-yard burst, his longest of the day. Auburn junior running back Rudi Johnson crossed the goal line with 4:08 to go in the third, to bring Auburn within seven, 28-21. The Wolverines connected on a 41-yard field goal by Hayden Epstein to increase their lead to 31-21 to end the quarter.

Leard responded by connecting with freshman Deandre Green on a 21-yard pass in the endzone to trim Michigan's lead to three, 31-28, with 2:26 to go.

Duval's ensuing on-side kick was recovered by Michigan and the Wolverines ran out the clock to earn the 31-28 win.

Leard was named Auburn's offensive MVP while Javor Mills, who recorded six tackles and two sacks, was the Tigers' defensive MVP.

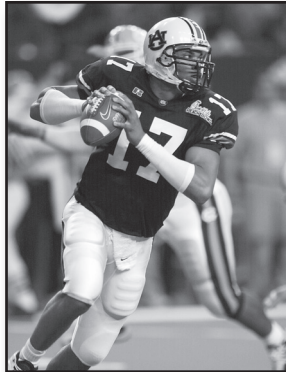

Atlanta.

In the first quarter, North Carolina recovered a fumble and returned it 18 yards to the Tiger 10-yard line. Two plays later, North Carolina tailback Willie Parker took the ball off right end for the UNC touchdown.

The only other score in the half came when the Tar Heels drove the ball 84 yards resulting in a field goal by kicker Jeff Reed.

North Carolina came out of halftime and added to their lead as Peach Bowl Offensive MVP QB Ronald Curry scrambled 62 yards for a touchdown putting UNC ahead 16-0.

The Auburn defense responded well, not allowing any more points for the rest of the game and treated football fans to a play that will be remembered in Auburn football history.

An errant Darian Durant pass was snatched out of the air by whip Karlos Dansby as he was falling out of bounds. Dansby then tossed the ball to linebacker Dontarrius Thomas to complete an amazing interception. The play was later nominated for the ESPY Awards' "Most Spectacular Play" of the year.

The Auburn offense, feeding off the momentum from the interception, moved the ball down the field. Jason Campbell connected with Casinious Moore on an 11-yard pass that set up Damon Duval's 34-yard field goal with 13:16 left in the game.

After recovering a muffed snap late in the fourth quarter, backup QB Daniel Cobb connected with tight end Lorenzo Diamond, who rumbled 12 yards for an Auburn touchdown, pulling the Tigers within six points.

North Carolina recovered the ensuing onside kick to hold on for the 16-10 win.

On a warm and windy day in Orlando, the 19th-ranked Auburn Tigers knocked off 10th-ranked Penn State behind a stymieing defense and Capital One Bowl MVP Ronnie Brown's 184-yard, two-touchdown

performance. Penn State's Larry Johnson, who finished third in the Heisman Trophy balloting, was unable to get on track as Auburn's defense limited him to only 72 yards on 20 carries.

Auburn fumbled on its first possession giving Penn State the ball on the 15-yard line, but the Nittany Lions were forced to settle for a 21-yard Robbie Gould field goal.

The Auburn defense held the Nittany Lion offense the rest of the half, allowing only a 27-yard field goal by Gould.

After a sluggish first half, the Tigers came out in the third quarter with a run-dominated offensive scheme and Ronnie Brown punished the Penn State defenders to the tune of 119 second-half yards.

Auburn took its first possession of the second half and marched 74 yards, scoring on a one-yard Brown touchdown run, which put Auburn ahead, 7-6. The fast Tiger defense took control, allowing Penn State only 31 yards of offense in the third quarter.

Penn State replaced quarterback Zack Mills with Michael Robinson, who sparked the Nittany Lion offense to a fourth quarter field goal, putting Penn State up 9-7.

On Auburn's next possession, Damon Duval's punt was downed at the one-yard line pinning Penn State deep in its own territory.

After a short punt by Penn State, Auburn drove the ball inside the red zone, where Ronnie Brown bounced a run to the outside taking it 17 yards for the game winning touchdown.

Brown's 184 yards rushing were the most ever by an Auburn player in a bowl, and it was the most yards rushing by anyone in the 2003 bowl season. Dontarrius Thomas was named the game's defensive MVP after helping hold Penn State to just 268 yards.

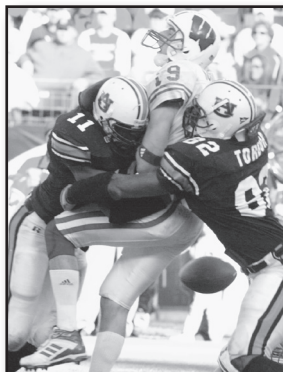

With the combination of a stellar defensive performance that included six sacks and the leadership of MVP Jason Campbell, Auburn put together 14 fourth-quarter points en route to a 28-14 Music City Bowl win over Wisconsin.

After a scoreless first period, Wisconsin started the second quarter by driving to the Auburn seven-yard line where the Badgers had a first and goal, but Auburn's defense forced Wisconsin to settle for a 20-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Auburn responded on the next drive as Ronnie Brown gained 43 yards on six carries culminating with a one-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead. Wisconsin managed another field goal before the half to make the score 7-6 at the intermission.

Auburn struck first in the second half, going 80 yards on 16 plays and taking 7:16 off the clock. Carnell Williams finished the drive with a one-yard plunge up the middle for the touchdown.

In the fourth quarter, Jim Sorgi led Wisconsin on a 52-yard drive, capping it with a 12-yard pass to Lee Evans for a touchdown and a two-point conversion pass to tie the game at 14.

The Badgers seemed to have the momentum in their favor until Carlos Rogers deflected a pass that Will Herring intercepted on the Auburn 13-yard line. Two plays later, Campbell connected with Jeris McIntyre on third and eight for a 51-yard gain to the Wisconsin 34-yard line. It took Auburn just three more plays to put it in the end zone as

Brown scored for the second time from two yards out.

Auburn put an exclamation point on the game during the ensuing Wisconsin drive when Reggie Torbor and Karlos Dansby sandwiched Sorgi, causing a fumble. T.J. Jackson recovered it, and two plays later Auburn put the final points on the board with a one-yard run by Williams to make the score 28-14.

Campbell passed for 138 yards, rushed for 67 yards and engineered two fourth-quarter scoring drives. Auburn's defense held Wisconsin to 261 yards. Torbor collected 2.5 sacks and Dansby totaled a team-high 10 tackles including 1.5 sacks.

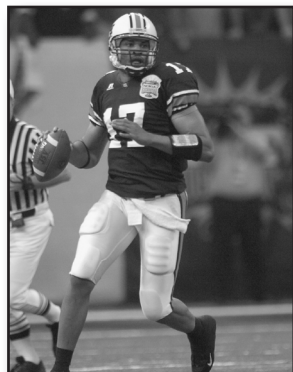

Auburn completed a perfect season as the No. 3 Tigers held off a late Virginia Tech rally for a 16-13 victory in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl at the Louisiana Superdome. The win improved the Tigers' record to 13-0

and ensured the first 13-win season in school history.

Auburn, just the seventh team to go undefeated in league play since the Southeastern Conference went to divisional play in 1992, jumped out to a 16-0 lead in the first three quarters before the Hokies got on the board. Two late fourth-quarter scores allowed Virginia Tech back into the game, but an onside kick with two minutes left was recovered by the Tigers.

Jason Campbell, voted the NOKIA Sugar Bowl's Most Valuable Player, threw for 189 yards on 11-of-16 passing and one score. Campbell, who played his last game in an Auburn uniform, connected with Devin Aromashodu on a 5-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter, giving the Tigers a 16-0 advantage.

The tandem of senior running backs Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams rushed for 68 and 61 yards, respectively.

Placekicker John Vaughn connected on three field goals in the first half from 23, 19 and 24 yards to send the Tigers to a 9-0 lead entering halftime. The three field goals tied an Auburn record in a bowl game, last set by Jaret Holmes at the 1998 Peach Bowl.

After Campbell connected with Aromashodu for a 16-0

AU lead, Virginia Tech's Josh Morgan found the end zone twice -- the first on a 29-yard reception from Bryan Randall and the second on an 80-yarder with two minutes to play.

The win gave Auburn three straight bowl game victories, a first for the school since 1982-84. It also sent Auburn to its 15th straight victory dating back to the 2003 season, the program's longest since 1993-94 and second longest streak in school history. The 15 consecutive wins gave the Tigers national prominence as the third-longest in the nation at the end of the season, trailing only Southern California and Utah.

However, Calhoun rushed for a 33-yard touchdown less than two minutes later, giving the Badgers the final 24-10 outcome.

Cox finished 15-of-33 for 137 yards and one touchdown, while Kenny Irons rushed for 88 yards -- giving him 1,293 on the season - the sixth-best single-season mark in Auburn history.

Ben Obomanu ended his Auburn career with five receptions for 62 yards. His senior counterpart, Anthony Mix, caught two passes for 11 yards, giving him 1,010 yards in his career.

Wisconsin opened the game's scoring when Stocco found Brandon Williams on a 30-yard reception at the 7:55 mark of the first quarter.

UW's Taylor Mehlhaff connected on his only field goal of the day, a 19-yarder, at the end of the first quarter, then watched as Stocco found

Owen Daniels for a 13-yard touch-

down pass in the second quarter.

John Vaughn connected on a 19-yard field goal, his 12th of the season, in the third quarter to put Auburn on the board.

Defensively, David Irons led the Tigers with 11 tackles.

Senior Wayne Dickens posted his second multiple-sack game of the season, finishing with two, while Stanley McClover had one.

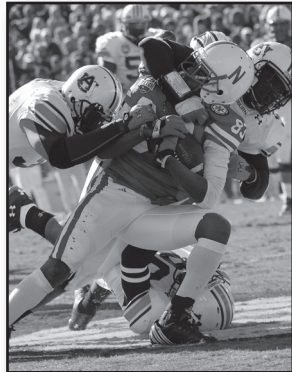

John Vaughn's 42-yard field goal in the third quarter proved to be the game winner as Auburn took the 71st AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic with a 17-14 victory over Nebraska in Dallas.

Vaughn connected on his 20th field goal of the season at the 6:20 mark of the third quarter, the game's only points of the second half, to give Auburn its 11th win of the season for the fourth time in school history.

The Auburn defense was stout against Nebraska, limiting the Cornhuskers to just 230 yards of total offense, including 73 in the second half. Karibi Dede began the defense's dominance in the first half, intercepting a Zac Taylor pass and returning it 52 yards to the Nebraska 9-yard line.

Just two plays later, the Auburn offense punched it in the end zone when Brandon Cox found Carl Stewart for a 9-yard score with 56 seconds remaining in the first quarter, evening the score at 7.

Early in the second quarter, the Tigers recovered a fumble at the Cornhuskers' 14 on a failed fake punt attempt. Four plays later, Stewart scored his second TD on a 1-yard run.

After Vaughn's third quarter field goal, the Huskers managed to get in Auburn territory just twice. They punted from Auburn's 34 in the third quarter, and Taylor threw a fourth-down incompleteness from Auburn's 30 late in the fourth quarter.

The Tiger defense finished with two sacks and 11 tackles for loss, highlighted by Sen'Derrick Marks' 2.5. Will Herring finished with seven solo tackles, including two for loss, and was named the game's outstanding defensive player.

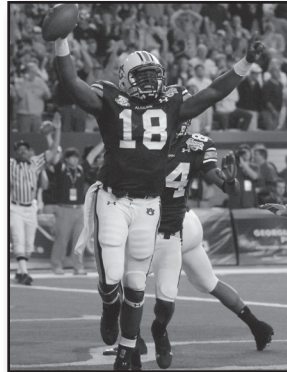
Kenny Irons paced the Tiger rushing game with 72 yards on 24 carries.

Kodi Burns scored on a 7-yard run in overtime to lift No. 22 Auburn to a 23-20 victory over No. 15 Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, in the first overtime game in Auburn's bowl history.

Burns' score put the finishing touches on a performance that saw the

Tigers record season highs in plays and yards with a spread offense. Auburn ran 90 plays for 423 yards, including 47 rushes and a season-high 43 passes.

Auburn scored first in a low-scoring first half, following a three-and-out by Clemson on the opening possession with an 11-play, 58-yard drive that culminated in Wes Byrum's 36-yard field goal.

After managing just 52 yards of offense in the first quarter, Clemson's C.J. Spiller raced 83 yards down the left sideline to give Clemson a 7-3 lead.

Auburn took the opening kickoff in the second half and marched 78 yards on 10 plays as Burns hit Mario Fannin with a 22-yard pass to give Auburn a 10-7 lead.

Clemson finished an 11-play drive with a 22-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter, knotting the score at 10-10.

After Cox was intercepted, Clemson quickly drove 32 yards for the go-ahead score when James Davis plunged in from a yard out with 11:24 remaining.

In overtime, Clemson settled for a 25-yard field goal on its first possession.

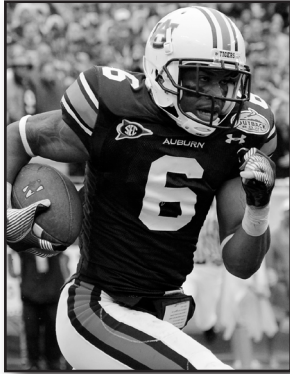
On Auburn's overtime possession, Cox found Rod Smith for 12 yards on 3rd-and-13, then snuck ahead for 2 yards and the first down. Two plays later, Burns powered in for the score, sending the Auburn sideline into a frenzy.

Cox connected on 25-of-39 passes for 211 yards in his final game for Auburn.

The Auburn defense, led by defensive MVP Pat Sims, held Clemson to just 293 yards of offense and 12 first downs.

Neiko Thorpe tackled Zeke Markshausen at the Auburn 2-yard line on a fake field goal attempt from the 5-yard line to preserve Auburn's 38-35 overtime victory over Northwestern after Wes Byrum's 21-yard field goal gave the Tigers the lead.

With the score tied 21-21, Ben Tate rushed for two touchdowns in the first eight minutes of the fourth quarter. The first came from 5 yards out with 10:10 left and the second was a 7-yard run that seemed to put the Tigers in control, 35-21 with 7:32 left.

Northwestern closed to 35-27 on a 2-yard Mike Kafka touchdown run with 3:20 remaining but the PAT was blocked by Antonio Coleman. With Auburn trying to run out the clock, Brad Phillips forced a Tate fumble at the Northwestern 31 with 3:11 to play. The Wildcats then drove 69 yards to score on a 18-yard touchdown pass from Kafka to Sidney Stewart with 1:15 to play and a tied the game on a successful two-point conversion.

Auburn's Demond Washington returned the ensuing kickoff to midfield before he fumbled, giving the ball back to the Wildcats with 1:03 to play. Northwestern then drove to the Auburn 26 where Demos missed a potential game-winning 44-yard field goal as time expired.

Auburn's defense picked off five Northwestern passes, with Walter McFadden and T'Sharvan Bell collecting two each and Thorpe one. McFadden's two interceptions came on Northwestern's first two drives and helped stake Auburn to an early 14-0 lead. His second interception was returned 100 yards for a touchdown.

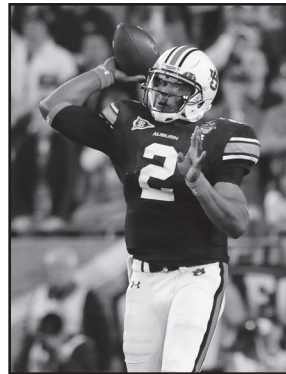

Wes Byrum kicked the sixth and biggest game-winning field goal of his career on the last play of the game from 19 yards to give No. 1 Auburn a 22-19 victory over Oregon in the BCS National Championship Game. It was Auburn's second national title in history and ninth comeback win in 14 games during

the 2010 season.

After Oregon had tied the score at 19 with a touchdown and two point conversion with 2:33 to go, the biggest drive in Auburn history began at its own 25-yard line. After a 15-yard pass from Cam Newton to Emory Blake, Michael Dyer, who was named the Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 143 yards on 22 carries, looked to be tackled after a short gain, but was never down while laying on top of an Oregon defender, and he bounced up to complete a 37-yard run to the Oregon 23.

After short gains by Dyer and Newton, Dyer followed with a 16-yard gain up the middle to the 1 with 10 seconds remaining. One play later, Byrum provided the final heroics.

Oregon scored on the second play of the second quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Rob Beard for the first points of the game. On Auburn's next possession, Newton threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to Kodi Burns for a 7-3 Auburn lead.

Oregon responded after taking over at the Duck 7 as Thomas threw an 81-yard pass on first down to Meahl, then found James on an 8-yard TD pass. A 2-point conversion run by kicker Rob Beard on a fake gave Oregon an 11-7 lead.

The Tigers then drove to the Oregon 1, but Newton's fourth-down pass to Eric Smith fell incomplete. On first down, Mike Blanc tackled James in the end zone for a safety to draw the Tigers to within 11-9 with 3:26 left in the half.

After Oregon kicked off following the safety, Auburn quickly covered 66 yards in six plays, capped by a Newton to Blake 30-yard touchdown pass to give the Tigers a 16-11 lead at the half.

On the opening drive of the second half, Wes Byrum kicked a 28-yard field goal to give Auburn a 19-11 lead.

Oregon then reached a first-and-goal on the Auburn 3, but the Tigers held the Ducks for four plays, capped by a stop on fourth and goal from the 1 as Mike McNeil and Nick Fairley hit Kenjon Barner just shy of the goal line. Fairley was named the Defensive Player of the Game after recording five tackles, including three for losses and one sack, while also forcing a fumble.

Auburn ran a season-high and BCS Championship Game record 85 plays. The Tigers outgained the Ducks 519 yards to 449 as Newton was 20-of-34 for 265 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 64 yards on 22 carries.

Offensive MVP Onterio McCalebb rushed for a season-high 109 yards and had 180 all-purpose yards, Emory Blake caught six passes for a career-high tying 108 yards and Barrett Trotter came off the bench to throw for 175 yards and one touchdown to lead Auburn to a 43-24 victory over Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in the Georgia Dome on Dec. 31.

Trotter completed 11-of-18 passes after he and Kiehl Frazier came in for injured starter Clint Moseley in the first quarter. Frazier had 16 carries for 55 yards and became the ninth Tiger to score two touchdowns in a bowl game. Tre Mason gained 64 yards on nine carries and had his first career rushing touchdown.

Auburn used a big second quarter as it scored 21 consecutive points to take control of the game, 28-14. After Virginia took a 14-7 lead, Auburn quickly answered as McCalebb ran it in from three yards out on third down to tie it 14-14 with 10:33 left in the half.

Then, Parkey successfully recovered his onside kick at the Auburn 41 as the Tigers went on to take the lead for good, 21-14, on Frazier's 1-yard third down rush with 8:44 left. Trotter completed a 50-yard pass to Blake to the Virginia 5. Auburn's 14 consecutive points came on 11 plays and 144 yards in 4:08.

On the ensuing possession, Chris Davis snuffed out a Virginia fake field goal after Eltoro Freeman broke up a Cavalier pass in the end zone the play before. Auburn scored a touchdown on its third-straight possession as Trotter completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to McCalebb with 59 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 28-14 lead.

Virginia scored first, but walk-on Garrett Harper stepped up to help the Tigers even the score on the next possession. Harper blocked the first punt of his career as Auburn took over on the Virginia 15. The Tigers tied it 7-7 as Frazier scored on a 3-yard touchdown run up the middle with 4:02 left in the opening quarter. McCalebb set it up with a 12-yard run the play before.

Mason scored his first career rushing touchdown to open the third quarter with a 22-yarder to put Auburn up 35-17 almost four minutes in.

Virginia scored with 6:20 left in the third, cutting the lead to 35-24, but the Cavaliers would come no closer.

Steven Clark pinned Virginia at its own 6-yard line and the Tigers defense held the Cavs to three and out as Gabe Wright made his first career sack at the 1-yard line. Then, Angelo Blackson blocked UVA's punt out of the end zone for a safety and a 37-24 lead with 1:57 remaining in the third. It's the first time Auburn had blocked two punts in the same game since 2003 vs. Louisiana-Monroe.

Quan Bray took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 57 yards to the Virginia 15. Parkey nailed a 45-yard field goal after a personal foul and false start penalty to make it 40-24 with 47 seconds to go in the third.

Parkey drilled his second field goal of the game, a 37-yarder, to give Auburn a 43-24 lead with 8:09 remaining.

Auburn came with a blink of an eye of winning its second national championship in the last four years.

FSU stole a page out of Auburn's playbook for the dramatic finish when Kermit Whitfield returned a kickoff 100 yards with 4:31 for a brief lead, and then Jameis Winston threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to Kelvin Benjamin with 13 seconds remaining to send Florida State to a 34-31 victory in the BCS Championship Game on Monday night in the Rose Bowl.

It prevented the biggest comeback story in college football history, though Auburn still finished with a remarkable season and a 12-2 record. The Tigers came within seconds of winning their second national title in the last four seasons.

Oh, Auburn tried to win with its usual heroics. Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's single-season rushing record when he scored on a 37-yard run with 1:19 remaining to give Auburn a 31-27 lead. But Winston, the Heisman Trophy winner, drove the Seminoles in for the game-winner.

Auburn had beaten Georgia, Alabama, and Missouri to get this far, and won four games in the final minute, or second. But not this night. Florida State was the one with the heroics.

Auburn led 21-3, then found itself up 21-20 with 10:55 left in the game. Florida State took the lead in the fourth quarter, but Mason's TD run gave the Tigers a late lead.

Auburn found new pages in its playbook in the first half, throwing touchdown passes to Tre Mason and Melvin Ray for the first time in their careers as Marshall out-played the Heisman winner Winston in the first half.

Marshall completed passes to seven different receivers in the first half. But even with the passing, Auburn stuck with its familiar successful formula of letting Mason run. The tailback who went for 304 yards on 46 carries hit halftime Monday night with 96 yards on 18 carries.

Marshall hit the break having hit 7-of-13 passes for 113 yards and those two touchdowns. Winston was only 6-of-15 passing for 62 yards and no touchdowns, though he did set up FSU's only first-half touchdown with a nice scramble to the Auburn 3.

Auburn got two early sacks against him, then forced him to fumble to set up the Tigers' third touchdown.

Credit punter Steven Clark for setting up Auburn's first touchdown when he flipped the field when he kicked the ball dead at the Florida State 2. The Seminoles couldn't move it, and, after a Chris Davis punt return, the Tigers found themselves in great field position at the FSU 25. Six plays later, Marshall threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Mason to make it 7-3 Auburn with 3:07 left in the first quarter.

Auburn scored on its next possession in a most surprising way when Marshall found Ray running alone down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead with 13:48 left in the second quarter.

Auburn kept hammering away at Winston, and, after a short run, recovered his fumble at the FSU 27. Marshall made it 21-3 when he ran around end on a 4-yard run with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Florida State got that touchdown back after successfully faking a punt, watching Winston run for 21 to the Auburn 3 and scoring on the next play on a Devonta Freeman run.

That made the halftime score 21-10.

Auburn played it to the end, and then some, but it wasn't enough to beat Wisconsin and Melvin Gordon in the Outback Bowl on Thursday.

The Badgers won 34-31 in overtime when they made a field goal on their first possession, and Auburn missed a 45-yard try when it got the ball.

Gordon rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns, though Auburn had the lead with eight seconds left in regulation. Wisconsin tied the game a second later on a field goal, and won it in the first overtime period.

The end of the game was like the rest of the game, a see-saw affair that featured big runs and good plays.

Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall picked one good play, and then another, in two drives near the end that gave the Tigers two leads. That's when Auburn found the proper balance between the run and the pass.

The Tigers answered two Wisconsin leads with decisive drives. Cameron Artis-Payne scored on a 2-yard run with 2:55 remaining. Before that, the Tigers had taken the lead a drive that saw Artis-Payne rip off a 21-yard run, Corey Grant run for 21, too, and Marshall throw a 21-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah.

Marshall came through after that, too.

He led the Tigers to the Wisconsin 7, and, on fourth down, his pass to Sammie Coates may have been a TD had it not been for pass interference. It didn't matter. Artis-Payne scored on the next play.

Auburn finished the season with a 8-5 record. Wisconsin finished at 11-3.

The Tigers led at the half, but Gordon carried four times for 55 yards, including the final 25, on the first series of the second half to tie Auburn at 14-all.

On fourth-and-1, Gordon broke loose for a 53-yard touchdown run to give Wisconsin a 21-17 lead with 20 seconds left in the third quarter.

But Auburn mixed it up on the Badgers from there, with Artis-Payne ripping off a 21-yard run, with Corey Grant doing the same, and with Marshall throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to Uzomah for a 24-21 lead with 11:21 left in the fourth quarter.

Auburn regained the lead on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Daniel Carlson.

Wisconsin scored on its first series on a 7-yard pass from Joel Slave to Corey Clement, but the Tigers tied the game on a 2-yard touchdown run with 2:16 left in the first quarter, and went ahead on a Marshall 66-yard TD pass to Ricardo Louis.

Those plays, and interceptions by Trovon Reed and Jermaine Whitehead, had Auburn ahead 14-7 at the half.

The first half was more of the same for Marshall, who threw for a single-game school record of 456 yards against Alabama in the previous game, then threw for 131 more in the first half against Wisconsin.

Auburn hit halftime with those 131 yards passing and 46 yards rushing.

2015 Birmingham Bowl

Jeremy Johnson helped Auburn close its 2015 season in fine fashion when he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 31-10 victory over Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl.

Johnson threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, ran for another score early in the fourth and brought life to what had been a hard-fought game. It was 10-10 on a rainy day before the dramatics began in front of a Birmingham Bowl-record crowd of 59,430 in venerable Legion Field.

Auburn running back Jovon Robinson was named the game's MVP after rushing for 126 yards. The Tigers' defense turned in an MVP performance, too, holding previously-potent Memphis to 205 total yards.

Johnson's play, coupled with an Auburn defense that allowed just three points and Peyton Barber crossing the 1,000-yard rushing barrier for the season, allowed the Tigers to finish the season with a 7-6 record. Memphis finished at 9-4.

Johnson, subbing for starter Sean White, threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jason Smith for the lead with 3:12 left in the third quarter. His 5-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter made it 24-10.

Barber's running allowed Auburn to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons.

Auburn showed a little trickery early in the game before pounding away at Memphis in the second half.

A fake punt set up a 20-yard Daniel Carlson field goal for Auburn's first score and Kerryon Johnson scored on an 8-yard run out of the wildcat formation for a 10-0 first quarter lead. Carlson's field goal was a record-setter. It gave him 23 on the season, a single-season Auburn record. Johnson's TD run came with 1:58 left in the first quarter.

A Memphis field goal and a Reggie Ball 56-yard interception return tied things up in the second quarter. Blake Countess came through with another big play for Auburn, blocking a Jake Elliott field goal try with 5:55 left before halftime.

2017 Allstate Sugar Bowl

Starting quarterback Sean White suffered a broken forearm on the first drive of the game and Oklahoma ran past the Tigers in the second half in a 35-19 victory in the Superdome.

Running back Kerryon Johnson threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Harris on the last play of the game, but that was Auburn's first touchdown since the first series of the game.

It was the most points Auburn allowed this season, and not even a 103 rushing game by Auburn 1,000-yard rusher Kamryn Pettway could change that.

The Tigers had surprised the skeptics this year. Auburn, picked to finish sixth in the SEC West in a preseason poll, finished tied for the second-best record in the league, and qualified for the Sugar Bowl as the highest-ranked SEC team outside of the playoffs. Auburn, which won six straight games when most everybody was healthy, finished 8-5, struggling late in the season as the injuries mounted. Oklahoma won its 10th straight game to finish 11-2.

White's star-crossed career includes touchdowns and injuries in each of his two seasons. He missed games last year, and then the final two regular-season game this season as well.

Coach Gus Malzahn said White was finally fully healthy in the days leading up to the Sugar Bowl. But the Sugar Bowl injury, likely in the first quarter, sidelined White again.

White knows the feeling. He suffered a shoulder injury at midseason this season and played through it before missing the Alabama A&M and Alabama games after aggravating the injury against Georgia in the 10th game of the season.

Oklahoma quarterback Baker Mayfield, a Heisman Trophy finalist, simply kept playing, scrambling and throwing touchdown passes. He raised his season TD total to 40 against Auburn.

The first half was a game of starts and stops. There were 11 penalties in the first 20 minutes. Most of them were by Oklahoma. The Sooners cleaned that up in the second half.

Auburn's offense looked good early, mixing things up, moving the ball smartly and scoring on its first drive of the game. Chandler Cox darted in from the 3 to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 9:04 left in the first quarter.

With White hurt, the Tigers turned to ol' reliable Daniel Carlson for their next two scores of the first half, a 49-yard field goal to put Auburn up 10-7 with 7:16 left in the second quarter, and a 39-yard field goal about 6 1/2 minutes later.

But Oklahoma hit halftime up 14-13 thanks to a 13-yard scoring pass from Baker Mayfield to Mark Andrews, then a 3-yard run by Joe Mixon. Oklahoma outscored Auburn 14-0 in the third quarter, on a Mayfield-to-Dede Westbrook 7-yard pass and a 4-yard run by Mixon. Then Samaje Perine scored on a 2-yard run to make it 35-13 with 12:40 left in the fourth quarter.

Oklahoma finished with 524 yards. Auburn had 339.

2018 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl

Auburn's bid to win 11 games came up short Monday as the Tigers dropped a 34-27 decision to UCF in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Despite the loss, it was a game where Auburn never stopped fighting.

After falling behind 13-6 in the first half, the Tigers scored two quick touchdowns in the second half to take back the lead. It began with a 72-yard kickoff return from Noah Igboghene that got the crowd at Mercedes-Benz Stadium back in it. Then two plays later, Jarrett Stidham connected with Will Hastings for 26 yards and a touchdown to tie the game.

Hastings finished with six receptions for 117 yards, both career highs.

The next time Auburn got the ball, the offense went 82 yards on 10 plays and scored on a four-yard touchdown run from Kerryon Johnson. It was Johnson's 18th rushing touchdown of the season and his 20th touchdown overall.

Johnson, who finished with 71 yards rushing on 22 carries, passed Stacy Danley for 11th on the Auburn career rushing list.

UCF responded with back-to-back touchdowns, but Auburn defensive tackle Derrick Brown kept the Tigers in it when he blocked a 23-yard field goal to keep it a one-possession game with just less than seven minutes remaining.

Even after Stidham threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown on the following drive, the sophomore quarterback responded with an impressive six-play, 89-yard drive that made it a one-possession game once again. Eli Stove capped the drive with a seven-yard touchdown run, but Stidham completed three straight passes to Hastings for 61 yards.

For the game, Stidham finished 28 of 43 for 331 yards.

Ultimately, Auburn's comeback bid fell short. The Tigers got down to the UCF 21-yard line with a chance to tie the game, but Stidham's last-gasp attempt was intercepted in the end zone.

It was a disappointing end to a season that included 10 wins, wins over Alabama and Georgia, and a division title. It was also the final game for a group of 19 seniors that left their mark both on and off the field during their time at Auburn.

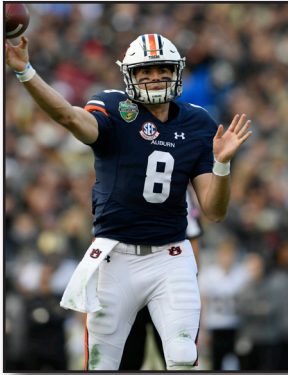

2018 Music City Bowl

Auburn blew out Purdue, 63-14, to win the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. The 63 points was a new SEC record for points scored in a bowl game, and the Tigers set a FBS bowl record with 56 of those 63 points in the first half.

The offense scored touchdowns on all seven of its first-half drives and finished with 586 total yards. Quarterback Jarrett Stidham completed 15 of 21 passes for 373 yards and a career-best five touchdown passes – which tied Auburn’s single-game record.

His first touchdown toss came on the third play of the game when he connected with running back JaTarvious Whitlow on a 66-yard touchdown pass to put Auburn on the board first. It was Whitlow who scored again on the next drive, plunging in from two yards out, and after a Javaris Davis interception, the freshman tacked on a third touchdown, a 1-yard run, in the first six minutes to give Auburn the early 21-0 lead.

After Whitlow scored his three TDs, it was Darius Slayton’s turn to get into the act. The junior wide receiver caught a 74-yard touchdown pass at the end of the first quarter and then scored on a 52-yard pass the very next drive to make it 35-7. He later added a third touchdown reception in the first half, hauling in a 34-yard reception over the top of a Purdue defender.

With 160 yards receiving on the day, Slayton posted the third 100-yard receiving game of his career.

The other first-half TD came courtesy of the defense when Big Kat Bryant returned an interception 20 yards to the end zone on a ball that was deflected at the line of scrimmage by Tyrone Truesdell. It was Bryant’s first career interception and score.

Not to be outdone by the offense, Auburn’s defense held a high-octane Purdue to 14 points and 263 total yards. The Tigers finished with seven TFL and three sacks, including a sack from senior LB Deshaun Davis, who led the way with nine tackles. Auburn scored another touchdown on its opening drive of the second half as the Tigers went 78 yards on 12 plays and found the end zone on a 5-yard pass to Ryan Davis, the first touchdown catch of the season for the senior.
