### SCOUTING MONTEVALLO

» The Div. II Falcons have been to the NCAA Div. II Tournament in 10 of the past 12 seasons, all under head coach Danny Young. The Falcons are picked to finish third in the preseason Peach Belt Conference coaches poll behind Augusta University and Young Harris College. Montevallo is looking to claim its sixth consecutive West Division title and have advanced to at least the semifinal round of the Peach Belt Conference Tournament every year they have been a member. The Falcons shared the West Division championship with Columbus State last season with a 19-10 record overall, 14-5 in conference.

Montevallo will have one of the most experienced teams in the Peach Belt with seven seniors, including guard Kevin Kelly, who is the leading returning scorer with 7.5 ppg, 3.3 rpg and 2.2 apg. Senior forward Talan Whitaker is the leading returning rebounder at 5.2 rpg and 7.1 ppg.



**RECRUITING TRENDS**

» Auburn and coach Bruce Pearl have the No. 1 ranked recruiting class in 2017, No. 25 in 2016, No. 15 in 2015 and No. 32 in 2014.

Newcomers this season include Auburn's highly-touted recruiting class of Mustapha Heron, the first 5-star in school history, 4-star Jared Harper, 4-star Anfernee McLemore, University of Houston graduate transfer Ronnie Johnson, Bethune-Cookman graduate transfer LaRon Smith along with redshirt freshman Danjel Purifoy. Johnson, Smith and Purifoy are not counted in the recruiting ranking.

**PPG/RPG RETURNING**

» Auburn returns 41.2 percent of its scoring and 31.1 percent of its rebounding from last season, which ranks 10th and 12th in the SEC, respectively.

**AT LEAST 7 NEWCOMERS EACH YEAR**

» In Bruce Pearl's three seasons at Auburn, he has had at least seven newcomers each season.

In his first season in 2014-15, he had seven newcomers while inheriting just six scholarship players.

Auburn had nine newcomers in 2015-16 and nine this season.

**BP 2nd in SEC**

» Bruce Pearl is ranked second in the SEC in career winning percentage (.725), winning percentage as a SEC head coach (.629), average wins per year as a SEC head coach (21.4) and SEC games only winning percentage (.561).

**ACADEMICS UNDER BP**

» Under Pearl, Auburn is a perfect 11-of-11 graduating players in Malcolm Canada, Chris Denson, Asaun Dixon-Tatum, KT Harrell, Allen Payne, Cinmeon Bowers, Jordon Granger, Josh Dollard, Dylan Spencer, C.J. Holmes and Jonathan Walker.

» Auburn has sold out of season tickets for the third straight time in 2016-17, all under Pearl, to continue the school record streak. Prior to Pearl, the only other time the Tigers sold out of season tickets came in the 1999-2000 season.

**2015-16 QUICK REVIEW**

» • First time in 48 years since the 1967-68 season that Auburn defeated Kentucky, Alabama, Tennessee, Georgia and Arkansas in the same season in 2015-16.

- Auburn defeated Kentucky and Alabama in back-to-back games for the first time since 1967 and the third time in its 110 seasons of basketball. The Tigers defeated #13 Kentucky 75-70 on Jan. 16 followed by an 83-77 victory over Alabama on Jan. 19. Previously, the Tigers defeated the Wildcats and Crimson Tide in back-to-back games in both 1958 and 1967.

- Auburn snapped an 18-game losing streak to Kentucky in 75-70 win over the #13 Wildcats Jan. 16, dating back to 2000.

- Auburn snapped its 15-game losing streak to ranked teams against No. 13 Kentucky, which dated back to a 65-55 victory over No. 23 Miss. State on Feb. 18, 2012, in Auburn.

- It was Auburn's first win against a team ranked as high as the Wildcats since beating SEC Champion and No. 11 LSU 69-53 on March 7, 2009, in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. In the final 15:29 of Auburn's 75-70 win over No. 13 Kentucky after trailing 47-35, the Tigers outscored them 40-23.

- Auburn snapped an 8-game losing streak to Tennessee in an 83-77 win over the Vols on Jan. 2, dating back to 2009.

- Auburn snapped an 8-game losing streak to Arkansas dating back to 2010 and 5-game losing streak in Fayetteville, dating back to 2009. Auburn entered the game 2-19 in Bud Walton Arena and now Bruce Pearl is 1-0 with the Tigers there.

- Auburn averaged 8,216 in its 15 home games in 2015-16, which is 90 percent capacity at Auburn Arena. Auburn ranked 2nd in the SEC in percent capacity behind Kentucky for the 2nd straight season.

- In the last 2 years, Auburn's non-conference strength of schedule was ranked 29 in 2015-16 and 54 in 2014-15 compared to 262 and 303 in the 2 seasons prior to Bruce Pearl.
- Bryce Brown set an Auburn freshman record with 78 made 3-pointers & is tied for 7th on Auburn's single-season 3-pointers made list. He averaged 10.1 points and 1.8 rebounds in 24.7 minutes while starting 11 games. Brown is the first Auburn freshman to average in double figures since Rasheem Barrett in 2005-06, 10 years ago. Brown scored a career-high 27 points (9-14 3s), 1 off the Auburn 3-pointers made record (Lance Weems), in the win at Arkansas.
- Horace Spencer ranked 3rd in the SEC with 2.1 blocks per game and led all SEC freshmen.

- Led Tennessee to an average of 25.2 wins per season, an average year-end RPI of 8 and 6 straight NCAA Tournament appearances

- Reached the NCAA Tournament Elite 8 in 2010 and played in four Sweet 16s in 2005, 2007, 2008 and 2010

- Reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 or better in four of last nine years as a head coach

- In the 2015 SEC Tournament, Auburn won three games in three days for the first time in 30 years and reached the semifinals for the first time since 2009. The Tigers defeated Mississippi State and two postseason teams Texas A&M (NIT) and LSU (NCAA) before falling to undefeated Kentucky.

- Auburn defeated five NCAA Tournament teams last season: LSU (twice), Xavier, Georgia and Texas Southern

- It took Auburn just three games under Bruce Pearl to score 100 points in a 105-point output against Louisiana, a feat that hadn't been accomplished since 2003 vs. Grambling State, a span of 340 games.

- Pearl led Tennessee to its first-ever No. 1 national ranking after the Vols upset top-ranked Memphis at the FedExForum in February 2008

- On Nov. 17, 2009, Pearl was able to record victory number 100 at Tennessee, the second-fastest UT coach to reach the century mark, as his team defeated UNC-Asheville 124-49. The 124-point total was the most ever scored by Tennessee in a regular season game. Tennessee's 34 assists also set a school record and its 16 3-pointers tied another.

- On Jan. 10, 2010, Tennessee defeated the #1 ranked Kansas in Knoxville, 74-68. This was the first time that Tennessee defeated a #1 ranked team at Thompson-Boling Arena.

- On March 26, 2010, Tennessee advanced to its first Elite 8 in school history with a 76-73 defeat of Ohio State. On March 28, the Volunteers narrowly missed a trip to the Final Four, losing 70-69 to Michigan State in the Midwest Regional Final in St. Louis.

- Tennessee's 65 regular season SEC wins from 2006-07 to 2010-11 were the most in the SEC over that period.

- Tennessee under Coach Pearl won the 2008 SEC Championship with a 14-2 record and finished with the second-best record in the SEC in his first two years at Tennessee. It was Tennessee's first outright SEC Championship in 41 years.

- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 16 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg.

- Has as coached a league's leading scorer

- Tennessee won 37 straight home games under Coach Pearl, eclipsing the previous record of 33 from 1966-68.

- Tennessee was ranked in the top five nationally in attendance in each of Coach Pearl's six seasons in Knoxville.

- In 2005-06, Tennessee had the largest increase in attendance in the nation (5,504 per game) to rank fifth nationally with an average of 17,954

- Pearl and his wife, Brandy, also remain committed to giving back to those in Alabama as the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic has remarkably raised over half a million dollars in its first two years. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families.

- Pearl started **AUTLIVE** at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. **AUTLIVE** raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients.

He initiated the **OUTLIVE** program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease.

- Pearl donated \$250,000 to the Auburn University comprehensive campaign in September 2016, helping push it over the ambitious \$1 billion goal ahead of schedule.

- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015. Pearl accepted a \$10,000 donation to an endowed scholarship in his name to Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children with disabilities.

- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain.

- Every Tennessee player who played under Coach Pearl for four years graduated

- Tennessee had 31 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections in Coach Pearl's six seasons. Nine members of the basketball team (more than half the squad) earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition in 2006-07.

- Pearl took over as head coach of UW-Milwaukee in 2001. In just four seasons, he compiled 86 wins (including a school-record 26 in 2005,

and a new Horizon League record for winning percentage) and led Milwaukee to its first NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003 and 2005. Pearl led them to the Horizon League tournament title in both of those years. He also led the school to its first ever NIT bid, as well as its first-ever NCAA D-I postseason victory, in 2004. Milwaukee's 2005 NCAA Tournament run capped the best season in school history, as the Panthers won both the regular season and conference tournament titles, defeating the Detroit Titans in the championship game. Using an intense full-court press, the Panthers scored two upsets in three days over Alabama and Boston College en route to the Sweet Sixteen. The Panthers finished their season 26-6 and were ranked in the coaches' poll at the end of the season for the first time ever (# 23). Pearl left UWM after the 2005 season, his fourth, as the Horizon League's leader in all-time winning percentage (51-13, 79.7%).

- In 1992, Pearl got his first head-coaching job, at the University of Southern Indiana. He inherited a Screaming Eagles team that had won just 10 games in the previous season. Pearl posted a 22-7 record in his first season, and led the Eagles to nine straight NCAA D-II tournaments in addition to winning four Great Lakes Valley Conference titles.

- In 1994, USI finished with a 28-4 record en route to a loss in the D-II championship game; in 1995, the Eagles won 29 games and claimed the D-II championship. A team from the GLVC played for the National Championship every year after his first season at USI. Pearl was named the NABC Division II coach of the year after his national championship. He left USI with a 231-46 record over nine years.

- Coach Pearl was the 2009 recipient of the prestigious Knoxville Award, which recognizes individual contribution to the community through encouragement of volunteerism, philanthropy and community involvement.

- Coach Pearl was actively involved in Camp Koinonia, an outdoor education program for children ages 7-22 who have multiple disabilities. Pearl created the Bruce Pearl "Fore the Kids" Golf Tournament to benefit the camp.

- Named the 2008 "Knoxvillian of the Year" by the Knoxville Metro Pulse
