### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- After consecutive losses, Ole Miss has fallen out of the national rankings for the first time this year.
- No. 15 Auburn is the Rebels' sixth top-25 opponent in eight games ... Ole Miss is 1-4 against ranked foes this year.
- This is the Rebels' fifth straight SEC game in which their opponent is nationally ranked.
- Since 2014, the Rebels are 7-2 coming off a loss (2-1 this season).
- This is the 41st meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Auburn dating back to 1928 ... The Tigers lead the all-time series 29-11 and 10-3 in Oxford ... **Hugh Freeze** is 2-2 against the Tigers ... The road team has won this matchup each of the last two years.
- This is the first time since 2011 that Ole Miss has had a sub-.500 record after seven games.
- Ole Miss is second in the SEC in scoring (37.0 ppg) and first in passing (305.4 ypg).
- The Rebels have converted 31 of 33 red-zone attempts this year, tied for seventh best in the country (93.9 percent).
- Ole Miss is tied for fourth nationally with three defensive touchdowns this season.
- The Rebels have not trailed at halftime this season.
- Senior QB **Chad Kelly** has thrown a TD pass in 20 straight games, tied for the third-longest active streak in nation.
- Senior TE **Evan Engram** leads all TEs in the nation with 605 receiving yards.

**WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE:** Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Hugh Freeze at approximately 11:30 a.m., and quarterback Chad Kelly after Freeze. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m.

**PRACTICES:** Viewing is permitted for approved media for select portions of practice on Tuesdays during the season. If you do not regularly attend practices, please contact Media Relations prior to your visit for exact details on times and location. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until after the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and no formations. On available days, video is permitted for individual drills only, and media will be alerted which portions of practice (including stretch) are available for video. Use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Media & PR office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

**AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS:** Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Periscope and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Audio/video use of content from press conferences and media opportunities is limited to five minutes per individual (coach or student-athlete) per day, and use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Athletics. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of game highlights and interviews with coaches and players for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. **WEEKDAY PARKING:** Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking ([www.olemiss.edu/parking](http://www.olemiss.edu/parking)), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter at \$1 per hour. Day passes are also available for \$3 online to print at <http://www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html>. Parking is also available in the garage adjacent to The Pavilion at \$2 for the first hour and \$1 for each additional hour, up to a \$10 maximum charge for a 24-hour period. The garage will accept credit cards only as payment.

**WORKING CREDENTIALS:** To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: [www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss](http://www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss). Credential requests must be made by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. **PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

**MEDIA GATE:** Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location.

**GAMEDAY PARKING:** Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passed marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

**SIDELINE ACCESS (NEW):** Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/ videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted an armband for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. *During pre-game activities, media must remain in the southeast corner of the field (near the visiting team tunnel) until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.*

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS (NEW):** For home games, Coach Freeze will hold a postgame press conference in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Following the press conference, select players and assistant coaches will be available in the same room. Visiting team media availability will take place in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. *Postgame TV stand-ups should be conducted from the navy turf on the east sideline and not on the playing field.*

**October 31, 2015 • Auburn, Ala. • #19 Ole Miss 27, Auburn 19:** No. 19 Ole Miss held off a feisty Auburn team for a 27-19 victory at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Ole Miss racked up 558 yards of total offense, including 402 passing yards. Kelly's 33 completions tied a season high, and he was three yards short of a season best in passing yards. Kelly tossed a 45-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Jones and a 21-yard touchdown to Laquon Treadwell. Treadwell also completed a pass of his own for 21 yards.

**November 1, 2014 • Oxford, Miss. • #3 Auburn 35, #4 Ole Miss 31:** The No. 4 Ole Miss football team played a hard-fought game against No. 3 Auburn, but two fumbles near the Auburn goal line in the fourth quarter proved to be too costly to overcome and the Rebels lost 35-31. Trailing by four with less than two minutes to play, wide receiver Laquon Treadwell caught a pass down the middle. Dragging a defender, Treadwell fought his way toward the goal line, but had his ankle rolled over and fumbled into the end zone, and the Tigers recovered the ball. Bo Wallace completed 28-of-40 passes for 339 yards and two touchdowns, and ran for another 61 yards and one touchdown on 14 rushes.

**October 5, 2013 • Auburn, Ala. • Auburn 30, #24 Ole Miss 22:** Ole Miss had a chance late in the fourth quarter down one possession against Auburn, but the comeback fell short, as the Tigers held on for a 30-22 win at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Ole Miss was held to only three field goals before Bo Wallace threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Donte Moncrief in the third quarter.

**October 13, 2012 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 41, Auburn 20:** Ole Miss coach Hugh Freeze received a Gatorade bath and the Ole Miss faithful stood and cheered the team on in appreciation. After 16 long games, the Rebels finally snapped their Southeastern Conference losing skid with a 41-20 win over Auburn on Homecoming at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

**October 29, 2011 • Auburn, Ala. • #23 Auburn 41, Ole Miss 23:** Senior running back Brandon Bolden rushed for a season-high 114 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns, but Ole Miss fell to No. 23 Auburn 41-23 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

**OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE**

**Hugh Freeze** (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his fifth season at the Ole Miss helm. He inherited a team that went 2-10 and winless in SEC games in 2011 and has led the Rebels to four straight bowl games, including back-to-back "New Year's Six" bowl berths the last two seasons. He's the first coach to lead Ole Miss to four straight bowls since John Vaught, and he's the only Rebel coach to accomplish that feat in his first four seasons at the helm. A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze owns a 37-22 mark in Oxford and a career record of 67-29. His .627 winning percentage at Ole Miss is the third-best of any Rebel coach in the last 100 years. He was named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011, coming to Oxford after one year as head coach at Arkansas State where he led the Red Wolves to a 10-2 season and the 2011 Sun Belt Conference title and was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in school history.

**AUBURN HEAD COACH GUS MALZAHN**

Gus Malzahn (Henderson State, 1990) is in his fourth season as the Auburn head coach. He owns a 32-15 record as the Tigers' head man and a 41-18 mark in five seasons as a college head coach overall. Last year he directed Auburn to an 7-6 record and a victory in the Birmingham Bowl. In 2013, he led the Tigers to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA history, guiding them all the way to the BCS national championship game, which they lost 34-31 to Florida State. Auburn was SEC champion and Malzahn earned numerous SEC and national coach of the year honors. The previous year, Auburn had gone 3-9 overall and winless in SEC games. Prior to taking the Auburn job, Malzahn had a 9-3 record (and Sun Belt Conference title) in one season at Arkansas State. Malzahn was the Broyles Award winner when he was offensive coordinator for Auburn's national championship team in 2010. He has also served as offensive coordinator at Tulsa and Arkansas since joining the college ranks after a decorated high school coaching career in Arkansas.

**AUBURN SCOUTING REPORT**

Auburn is 5-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play entering this week's game with Ole Miss. After starting the season 1-2 that included losses to then-No. 2 Clemson (13-19) and then-No. 17 Texas A&M (16-29), AU has turned things around by winning four straight games. The Tigers are coming off a dominating 56-3 win over Arkansas in which they rushed for 544 yards. Auburn leads the SEC in rushing, averaging 302.9 yards on the ground to rank third in the nation. The rushing attack is led by Kamryn Pettway and Kerryon Johnson as the duo has combined for 1,235 yards and 12 touchdowns. The Tigers have found success in their passing game as well; quarterback Sean White leads the SEC in completion percentage (68.5) and passing efficiency (156.1), throwing just two interceptions in 143 pass attempts.

IN THE POLLS

- After back-to-back losses, Ole Miss dropped out of the rankings for the first time this season, snapping a streak of 13 straight weeks in the polls.
With all losses to ranked teams, Ole Miss is still receiving votes in the coaches poll.
The Rebels finished top 10 in last season's final polls (No. 9 coaches / No. 10 AP), marking their first top-10 final ranking since the 1969 season (No. 8 AP).
Ole Miss has appeared in the national rankings in 40 of the last 42 weeks, dating back to the 2014 preseason poll.
The Rebels' streak of 27 straight weeks in the national rankings from 2014-15 was the longest since appearing in 69 straight from 1957-62.
The Rebels rose as high as No. 3 in the polls in both 2014 and 2015, their best ranking since they were preseason No. 1 in 1964.
The Rebels have been ranked top 25 for a total of 45 weeks during Hugh Freeze's four-year tenure as head coach.

- Ole Miss is 1-4 against top-25 opponents this year, with a win over No. 11 Georgia as well as losses to No. 4 Florida State, No. 1 Alabama, No. 22 Arkansas and No. 23 LSU.
No. 15 Auburn represents the sixth nationally ranked opponent in Ole Miss' first eight games.
Ole Miss is the third SEC team in AP poll history to face multiple top-five teams in the first three weeks of the season ... The others were Tulane (1963) and LSU (1981), which also lost both contests.
Ole Miss was the only team in the country to face three top-15 teams in the first four weeks of the season.
Ole Miss went 5-2 against ranked foes last year with wins over No. 2 Alabama (43-37), No. 15 Texas A&M (23-3), No. 15 LSU (38-17), No. 21 Mississippi State (38-27) and No. 16 Oklahoma State (48-20).
The five wins over ranked teams were a school record.
In 2015, Ole Miss had multiple wins over AP top-15 teams in consecutive years for the first time since 1967-69.
The Rebels have eight wins over top-15 teams in the last three years ... They had five such wins in the previous 22.
Ole Miss is 69-153-2 all-time versus ranked teams and 11-16 with Hugh Freeze at the helm.

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM EXPANSION AND RENOVATIONS

What was already the site of one of the best gameday atmospheres in college football, Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, has been significantly improved for the 2016 season. When the Rebels hosted Wofford on Sept. 10, they played on a natural grass field for the first time since 2002 and set a state of Mississippi record for college football attendance with 64,232 (surpassed vs. Alabama - 66,176). The capacity of 64,038 is an increase of nearly 5,000 from last year.

The north side of the stadium has been closed in to provide additional student seating and has transformed into an exciting new "front door," which will be complete with a plaza and bell tower this spring. Other enhancements include three new videoboards, a new sound system and superior stadium lights.

As part of the \$200 million Forward Together capital campaign, the south end zone was also renovated to add 30 luxury suites and 770 club level seats, and the west suites were all refinished for the 2015 season.

## TICKET AND ATTENDANCE RECORDS AT RENOVATED VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY

- Thanks to a renovated and expanded Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, Ole Miss has posted its top four single-game attendances in history this season ... The crowd of 66,176 at the Sept. 17 game vs. Alabama broke the all-time Ole Miss and state of Mississippi attendance records for football.
- For the fourth straight season, Ole Miss has sold out of football season tickets.
- This year's total of 57,200 season tickets purchased broke last season's previous record of 52,375.
- Previous record-breaking season ticket sellouts were 51,316 in 2014 and 50,386 in 2013.
- The 2014 season attendance record of 430,829 fans is expected to be surpassed again this season.

## HISTORIC ROUT OF GEORGIA

The Rebels' 45-14 win over No. 11 Georgia on Sept. 24 was one for the record books:

- Most points in a game vs. Georgia

## ANOTHER CLASSIC AGAINST THE TIDE

For the third straight year, the Ole Miss-Alabama game was decided by less than a touchdown, but this time the No. 1 Crimson Tide was victorious. Alabama's 48-43 victory in Oxford snapped the Rebels' two-game win streak in the series. The game featured sizable leads by both teams, and a furious Ole Miss comeback in the final three minutes. But in the end, it was two defensive touchdowns and a punt return touchdown that put the Tide over the top, despite a career-best 421 passing yards and three TDs by Ole Miss QB **Chad Kelly**.

## BIG LEAD NOT ENOUGH FOR REBELS IN ORLANDO

Ole Miss led by 22 (28-6) against the No. 4 team in the nation on Labor Day, but it wasn't enough to put away the Florida State Seminoles in a 45-34 season-opening loss. The lead was the Rebels' biggest against a top-five opponent in the **Hugh Freeze** era. FSU reeled off 33 unanswered points before Ole Miss scored to make it 39-34 early in the fourth quarter. But the Seminoles, behind five sacks, put too much pressure on the Ole Miss passing game for the Rebels to regain the advantage. It was the first season-opening loss for the Rebels since 2011, the year before Freeze arrived.

## BIG BLOWS

Ole Miss suffered two big blows in the season opener in Orlando, losing starting CB **Ken Webster** and backup RB **Eric Swinney** to left knee injuries that will likely end both of their seasons. The Rebels took another hit against Wofford, as freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** (who scored TDs in each of his first two college games) went down with a broken foot that could also end his season.

**TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION RIGHT AWAY**

Several members of the Rebels' highly regarded 2016 signing class have seen immediate action in the first seven games of the season: WR **A.J. Brown** (15 catches, 201 yards, 2 TDs, 1 start), WR **D.K. Metcalf** (2 catches, 13 yards, 2 TDs), RB **D'Vaughn Pennamon** (19 rushes, 66 yards, 1 TD), OL **Greg Little** (significant playing time at left tackle), Rover **Myles Hartsfield** (24 tackles, 7 starts), S **Deontay Anderson** (18 tackles, 1.5 TFLs), DT **Benito Jones** (20 tackles, 2.5 TFLs), CB **Jaylon Jones** (16 tackles, 3 PBU, 1 FF, 1 FR), S **Jarrion Street** (3 tackles), TE **Octavious Cooley**.

**ODDS AND ENDS**

- With 21 points at LSU, the Rebels' streak of 30+ points was snapped at 10 games, dating back to last year.
- Ole Miss is 12-8 coming off a loss since **Hugh Freeze** took over as head coach, including a 7-2 mark since 2014.
- The Rebels have not trailed at halftime this year (have led five times, been tied twice).
- This is the first time Ole Miss has had a below .500 record after seven games since 2011, the year before Freeze became head coach.
- The Auburn game is the third of three this season against teams named the Tigers (Memphis, LSU).
- Ole Miss commits 4.9 penalties per game, second-fewest among SEC teams and 17th nationally.
- Opponents average 7.6 penalties and 63.6 penalty yards against the Rebels, which both lead the SEC.
- Ole Miss has increased its win total by one game each year under Freeze - 7 in 2012, 8 in 2013, 9 in 2014, 10 in 2015.
- Ole Miss has had a winning SEC record in back-to-back years (2014-15) for the first time since 1989-90.
- The Rebels face Wofford and Georgia Southern for the first time this year.
- Ole Miss is 30-6 under Freeze when leading at the half.
- Ole Miss is 32-4 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards, 5-18 when it rushes for less than 150 yards.
- Ole Miss is 35-5 under Freeze when giving up less than 30 points, 2-17 when opponents score 30 or more.

**OFFENSIVE NOTES**

- After topping the SEC in scoring, total offense and passing a year ago, Ole Miss is currently second in the league in scoring (37.0 ppg), fifth in total offense (454.3 ypg) and first in passing (305.4 ypg).
- The Rebels have topped 500 total yards in three of their last five games, including a season-high 624 vs. Memphis.
- The Rebels' aerial attack has been diverse and dangerous, as 13 different receivers have caught a pass and nine different players have caught a TD.
- The Ole Miss offense doesn't have many negative plays ... The Rebels rank third in the SEC and tied for sixth nationally giving up just 4.0 tackles for loss per outing ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** has not lost yardage on any of his 80 rushing attempts this season.
- **Evan Engram** is having a monster senior season, leading all TEs in the nation with 605 receiving yards and ranking second with 40 catches and five TD catches ... He tops all SEC players with 86.4 receiving ypg (21st in nation) and is second with 5.7 catches per game (29th in nation) ... His five TD catches are tied for third among all SEC players.
- With 605 receiving yards this season, Engram is only 58 yards shy of breaking his own school record for receiving yards by a tight end, set in 2014.
- The Rebels' running game came alive against Memphis, as both senior **Akeem Judd** and junior **Eugene Brazley** posted career-high rushing totals of 108 and 124 yards, respectively ... It was the first time two Rebels went over 100 rushing yards since the 2014 Presbyterian game.

Senior TE **Evan Engram** had four catches for 82 yards and a TD ... He is now tied with Barney Poole for the second-most TD catches by an Ole Miss tight end with 11 in his career ... Redshirt-freshman WR **Van Jefferson** led the team with seven catches for 79 yards ... Junior WR **Damore'ea Stringfellow** had six catches for a career-high 94 yards.

**DEFENSE:** Sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** snagged two interceptions and returned one of them 31 yards for a TD, his first career score ... It was the Rebels' second straight game with a pick-six ... Woods also led the team with eight tackles, including 1.5 TFLs ... Junior DE **Marquis Haynes** tallied six tackles with 2.0 TFLs and a sack ... He forced a fumble that led to a turnover and had another QB hurry that led to an INT ... Senior DT **D.J. Jones** collected a pair of Tiger turnovers with his first career fumble recovery and first career interception.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich** made both of his field goals, converting from 32 and 23 yards, and all six PAT tries ... Junior P **Will Gleeson** punted twice for a 40.5-yard average, landing both of them inside the 20, including one that was downed at the 1-yard line.

## ARKANSAS NOTES

**GENERAL:** This was the 63rd all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Arkansas ... The Razorbacks now lead 34-28-1 overall and have won three straight ... Attendance at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium was 73,786 ... This was the Rebels' first true road game of the year ... Ole Miss' record vs. top-25 opponents falls to 69-152-2 all-time and 11-15 under **Hugh Freeze** ... The Rebels are now 1-3 vs. ranked teams this season ... With Arkansas' first-quarter TD, it was the first time this year the Rebels didn't score first and the first TD given up by the Landshark D in the first quarter this season ... Ole Miss failed to score on its opening drive for the first time this year ... The Rebels trailed at the end of the first quarter (14-6) for the first time this year and failed to lead at the half for the first time this year.

**OFFENSE:** Ole Miss has now scored 30+ points in each of its last 10 games, dating back to last year ... The Rebels converted all five red-zone attempts in the game and have now converted 28 of 30 chances this season ... Senior QB **Chad Kelly** finished with 253 yards, completing 18 of 39 attempts with one TD and one INT ... He added a season-high 89 rushing yards and two TDs ... Kelly extended his own school record with his 19th consecutive game throwing a TD pass ... He had the fifth-longest active streak among FBS players entering the weekend ... With three total TDs (1 pass, 2 rush), Kelly moved past Archie Manning on the Rebel list for third-most TDs responsible for in a career (58) ... With 342 total yards, Kelly leaped Romaro Miller for fourth-most total yards in an Ole Miss career with 6,604 ... Senior TE **Evan Engram** had seven catches for 111 yards, 105 of which came in the first half ... His first-quarter 13-yard TD catch was the 12th of his career, tying him for the school record for TD catches by a tight end (Butch Veazey, 1971-73) ... Engram notched his third 100-yard receiving game of the year and sixth of his career ... He moves into a tie for fourth on the all-time Ole Miss charts with Shay Hodge and Mike Wallace ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** ran 11 times for 41 yards and scored on a second-quarter TD run, his third of the season and sixth of his career.

**DEFENSE:** The Rebel defense forced Arkansas into converting only five of their 16 third-down chances ... Junior DE **Marquis Haynes** came up with a big fourth-quarter interception, the first INT of his career ... He added five tackles and his team-leading fourth sack of the year ... Sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** led the team with 10 tackles, his second double-digit effort of the year ... Junior LB **DeMarquis Gates** had seven tackles and his third sack of the season ... Sophomore DT **Breeland Speaks** had four tackles and his first sack of the year, second of his career.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich** made his only FG attempt of the night, a 33-yarder ... He made 3 of 4 PATs, missing the first of his career ... He also punted twice for a 39.0-yard average ... Senior **Carlos Davis** looked to have returned a kickoff 100 yards for his first career score, but after review he had a toe out of bounds at the Ole Miss 39 ... He finished with four kick returns for a 22-yard average ... Junior P **Will Gleeson** punted twice for a 41.5-yard average, landing one inside the 20.

## LSU NOTES

**GENERAL:** This was the 106th all-time meeting between Ole Miss and LSU ... The Tigers now lead the series 60-41-4 all-time and 40-24-1 in Baton Rouge ... In the ninth edition of the Magnolia Bowl that began in 2008, LSU takes a 5-4 lead ... Attendance at Tiger Stadium was 101,720 ... This is the first time Ole Miss has had a losing record after seven games since 2011, the year before **Hugh Freeze** arrived ... Ole Miss' record vs. top-25 opponents falls to 69-153-2 all-time and 11-16 under Freeze ... The Rebels are now 1-4 vs. ranked teams this season ... The Rebels failed to score 30 points for the first time this season ... With no points in the second half, this was the first time Ole Miss was held scoreless in a half since the first half at Florida on Oct. 3 last year ... Ole Miss falls to 7-2 after a loss over the last three seasons ... The Rebels fall to 32-8 under Freeze when they score first.

**OFFENSE:** It was a tale of two halves for the Rebel offense, which had 13 first downs, 221 yards and 21 points in the first half to six first downs, 104 yards and no points in after the break ... The Rebels converted all three red-zone attempts in the game and have now converted 31 of 33 chances this season ... Senior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 20 of 33 passes for 218 yards with one TD and two INTs ... He added a team-high 56 rushing yards on 12 attempts ... Kelly extended his own school record with his 20th consecutive game throwing a TD pass ... He was tied for the third-longest active streak among FBS players entering the weekend ... Kelly passed John Fourcade into third in school history in career total offense (6,878) and moved into a tie with Jevan Snead for third in passing TDs (46) ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** ran 13 times for 39 yards and a TD, his fourth of the season and seventh of his career ... # @COACHHUGHFREEZE

Hugh Freeze refers to his tenure at Ole Miss as a “journey.” Suffice it to say the journey has moved at a quicker pace than even Freeze could have imagined.

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation’s top rising coaches, Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels’ 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

In the time since Freeze inherited a team coming off a two-win season and 14 straight Southeastern Conference losses, the Rebels have made four straight bowl appearances and won three of them. The team’s win total under Freeze has risen as consistently as possible – from seven in 2012 to eight in 2013, nine in 2014 to 10 last season.

Freeze is the first coach in school history to guide the Rebels to a bowl game in each of his first four seasons, including wins in the BBVA Compass, Music City and Sugar. Ole Miss is one of five programs in the country (along with Alabama, Florida State, Michigan State and Ohio State) to make consecutive New Year’s Six bowl appearances in the first two years of the College Football Playoff system.

Freeze’s 34 wins in his first four seasons at Ole Miss – which include a number of landmark victories over programs such as Alabama, LSU and Texas – are the most by a Rebel head coach in his first four seasons.

Freeze’s teams have shattered most of the offensive school records and had the nation’s No. 1 scoring defense in 2014. His high-flying tempo offense has helped shine the college football spotlight brightly on quarterbacks Bo Wallace and Chad Kelly and receivers Donte Moncrief, Laquon Treadwell, Evan Engram and others.

Seven Ole Miss players have been selected in the NFL Draft since Freeze arrived as head coach, including 2016 first-rounders Laremy Tunsil, Treadwell and Robert Nkemdiche.

Freeze and his staff have collected four straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The 2013 and 2016 classes were both among the top five in the country, which makes them the best two classes in recorded program history.

A total of 97 players have earned their University of Mississippi degrees since Freeze’s arrival, while the 2016 spring semester saw the team earn its highest cumulative grade point average in recorded history. Freeze’s staff has brought stability to the program’s academic standing and has emphasized the value of good character and brotherly love throughout all aspects of the team. Many players volunteer their time to community service projects in the Oxford area, and 19 players have participated in mission trips to Panama and Haiti over the last three spring breaks.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 20 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. Before returning to Oxford, the former Ole Miss assistant experienced a record-setting run at Arkansas State. With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with an 8-0 mark. In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. The Sun Belt Coach of the Year also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005.

## LAST MEETING VS. AUBURN: #19 OLE MISS 27, AUBURN 19

AUBURN, Ala. - Ole Miss (7-2, 4-1 SEC) racked up 558 yards of total offense, including 402 passing yards in a 27-19 win. Junior quarterback Chad Kelly went 33-of-51 through the air for 381 yards and two touchdowns.

After the Landshark defense forced Auburn to punt on its opening drive, the Ole Miss offense marched 72 yards down the field to set up a 27-yard field goal by Gary Wunderlich to give the Rebels a 3-0 lead with 8:30 remaining in the first quarter.

The Tigers answered with 10 straight points to take a 10-3 lead. But Akeem Judd would answer on a 25 yard run to tie the game, 10-10.

Getting the ball to start the second half, the Rebels once again scored on their first drive of the half. The offense orchestrated a nine-play 55-yard drive that was capped off by a Wunderlich 37-yard field goal, giving Ole Miss the lead back, 13-10.

The Tigers answered with a long drive of their own. Going 89 yards, Auburn set up first-and-goal at the six, but the Rebel defense forced the Tigers to settle for a 23-yard field goal. With 3:46 left in the third quarter, the game was tied once again.

The tie didn't stand for long as Ole Miss regained the lead on the next drive. In five plays, including four passes by Kelly, the Rebels went 75 yards to the house. The junior quarterback found Derrick Jones streaking down the sideline, and the wide receiver made a few shifty moves to cross the goal line from 45 yards out.

Auburn responded with a pair of field goals on back-to-back drives to cut the Ole Miss lead to one, 20-19, with 12 minutes to go in the game. Once again, the Rebels countered with a touchdown. Kelly found Treadwell in the back of the end zone for a 21-yard touchdown pass to increase the advantage to eight, 27-19.

BATON ROUGE, La. - No. 22 Ole Miss was outscored 17-0 in the second half as No. 23 LSU handed the Rebels a 38-21 setback in the Magnolia Bowl at Tiger Stadium. After going into the half tied at 21-21, the Rebels (3-4, 1-3 SEC) could not overcome a big night by LSU running back Leonard Fournette and a Tigers (5-2, 3-1 SEC) defense that stepped up in the final 30 minutes of play.

Fournette finished the game with 284 yards on the ground, and LSU defense limited the high-powered Ole Miss offense to 325 yards. Senior quarterback Chad Kelly once again led the Rebels through the air and on the ground. The Buffalo, New York, native threw for 218 yards on 20 of 33 passing, while rushing for 56 yards on 12 carries. His favorite receivers were Damore'ea Stringfellow and Van Jefferson, who caught four passes apiece. Stringfellow totaled a game-high 92 yards receiving, and Jefferson added 43 yards and a touchdown.

For the Landshark defense, junior defensive end Marquis Haynes had another huge game that included a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. The Rebels recorded a season-high 10.0 tackles for loss, led by career highs from Temario Strong (2.5) and Detric Bing-Dukes (2.0). Bing-Dukes also posted a team-best eight tackles.

After LSU forced the Rebels to punt late in the second quarter, it looked as if the Tigers would take a lead into the locker room. However, Haynes had something to say about that. As Etling dropped back to pass on first down, the speed rusher blew past the right tackle and drilled the LSU quarterback from his blind side. The huge hit caused the ball to pop loose and freshman Jaylon Jones jumped on it to give Ole Miss the ball inside the LSU 10. On third-and-goal, Akeem Judd plunged into the end zone for a Rebel touchdown. After an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on the Tigers, Ole Miss elected to go for two to try and tie the ballgame. Kelly's decision to keep the ball on a read option proved to be a smart one as he crossed the goal line to knot the contest at 21-21. After 30 minutes of football, the game stood where it started, all tied up.

## #4 FLORIDA STATE 45, #11 OLE MISS 34

Game #1 • Sept. 5, 2016

Attendance: 63,042 • Camping World Stadium • Orlando, Fla.

ORLANDO, Fla. — In front of a crowd of 63,042 at Camping World Stadium, No. 11 Ole Miss jumped out to a 28-6 over No. 4 Florida State, but the Seminoles took advantage of four Rebel turnovers and scored 30 unanswered points to down the Rebels 45-34.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly was 21-of-39 through the air for 313 yards, including four touchdowns and three interceptions. Classmate Evan Ingram caught a career-high nine passes for 121 yards and one touchdown in the setback. Freshmen D.K. Metcalf and Van Jefferson caught touchdown passes from Kelly, the first of their respective careers. Akeem Judd led Ole Miss (0-1) in rushing, accounting for 44 yards.

Ole Miss marched straight down the field to begin the game, leaning on the strong arm of Kelly, who went 4-for-5 for 59 yards on the drive, including a 36-yard hook-up with freshman A.J. Brown on third down. Kelly found Ingram twice for 20 yards on the drive before hitting Damore'ea Stringfellow on a three-yard slant for the touchdown.

Kelly accounted for 267 of the Rebels' 312 yards in the first half, throwing for 215 (14-of-23, 3 TDs) and rushing for 52. On defense, Ole Miss limited FSU to 14 yards during the opening half.

Another FSU score put the Rebels in an eight-point deficit heading into the final 15 minutes of play. Another FSU field goal pushed the margin to 11 points, but a 49-second drive put Ole Miss within single digits. Kelly threw a bomb to Ingram for 42 yards to get the Rebels into Seminole territory, and a 20-yard pass to Van Jefferson resulted in a touchdown. Quickly, the Red and Blue had some life left with 12:09 left in the contest.

However, FSU continued to move the ball down the field. Aguayo added two more field goals as the Rebels were unable to complete the comeback, dropping the season opener 45-34.

Kelly wasted little time getting the Rebels on the board after he guided Ole Miss 42 yards on the opening drive of the game and kicker Gary Wunderlich connected from 40 yards out to give the Rebels a 3-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

After the Landshark Defense forced a Terrier three-and-out, the Rebel offense took over on their own 19-yard line. Kelly marched Ole Miss 81 yards capped by a five-yard touchdown strike to Markell Pack that gave the Rebels a 10-0 lead with 7:11 to go in the first quarter. Kelly completed 20-of-27 passes and threw no picks in three quarters of football, while Pack finished with three grabs for 46 yards and a score.

Following another Wofford punt, Kelly led the Rebels on an 11 play, 92-scoring scoring drive culminating in a 10-yard touchdown pass to freshman wideout D.K. Metcalf to put the Rebels up 17-0 in the second quarter.

Senior running back Akeem Judd led the Rebel rushing attack with 64 yards on 11 carries as Ole Miss rushed for 174 yards on the ground. Junior Damore'ea Stringfellow posted a team-high five receptions for 40 yards, while redshirt freshman receiver Van Jefferson added 4 catches for 31 yards. Nine different Ole Miss receivers recorded a reception in the game.

The Ole Miss defense limited the Terriers to just 305 yards of total offense and only 72 yards through the air. It marked the fewest passing yards the Rebels have allowed in a game since giving up 67 yards passing to Presbyterian in 2014. Senior transfer linebacker Rommel Mageo led the team with eight tackles, including three solo stops, and the Rebels posted 6.0 TFLs as a team.

Pellerin found freshman A.J. Brown in the corner of the endzone from 12-yards out with 6:16 to go in the fourth quarter. Pellerin threw for 23 yards and that score in mop up duty and added 27 yards and a TD on the ground. The Terriers added a 50-yard field goal with 2:28 left for the final score of 38-13.

## #1 ALABAMA 48, #17 OLE MISS 43

**Game #3 • Sept. 17, 2016**

OXFORD, Miss. - Senior quarterback Chad Kelly threw for a career-high 421 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the final three minutes of action, but No. 17 Ole Miss dropped its Southeastern Conference opener 48-43 to No. 1 Alabama in front of a school-record crowd of 66,176 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Trailing 48-30 with 2:59 left in regulation, Kelly found wideout Damore'ea Stringfellow in the corner of the end zone to pull Ole Miss to within 48-37. Ole Miss then recovered the onside kick and Kelly hooked up with freshman wide receiver A.J. Brown on the next play from 37 yards out for the touchdown strike. The Rebels failed on the two-point conversion, but pulled to within 48-43 with 2:51 to go. Ole Miss kicked deep on the ensuing kickoff, but Alabama converted on a 3rd-and-inches from the Ole Miss 45-yard line to hang on for the win. Kelly completed 26-of-41 attempted for a career-high 421 yards and three TDs, while adding 48 yards on the ground.

In a back-and-forth game that featured a bit of everything, the Rebels took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards on seven plays in just under two minutes to grab a 7-0 lead. Kelly found tight end Evan Ingram for a seven-yard gain on third and long to keep the drive alive, then hooked up with Ingram again on a 25-yard pass over the middle to set Ole Miss up in Crimson Tide territory. Two plays later, senior Akeem Judd busted off a 23-yard rush up the middle for the early touchdown. Ingram tied a career-high with nine receptions for 138 yards and one score.

Alabama tied the game at 24 in the third quarter after Kelly was hit at the Ole Miss 1-yard line and fumbled the ball. Da'Ron Payne recovered for the Tide in the end zone for the score.

Wunderlich then converted his third field goal of the game, this time from 38 yards out, to pull Ole Miss within four 34-30.

## #21 OLE MISS 45, #11 GEORGIA 14

OXFORD, Miss. - The Rebels scored the first 45 points of the game, as No. 21 Ole Miss dominated No. 11 Georgia 45-14 in front of 65,843 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss (2-2, 1-1 SEC) posted 510 yards of total offense against Georgia (3-1, 1-1 SEC) and forced two Bulldogs turnovers, as the Rebels scored their most points ever against UGA. The 31-point win was also the largest margin of victory over a top-25 team since the Rebels defeated No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly paced the Ole Miss offense with an efficient 18 of 24 passing for 282 yards and pair of touchdowns. He also added 53 yards and a touchdown on the ground and passed Rebel legend Archie Manning for sixth place in school history with 5,901 yards of total offense. Kelly hit eight different receivers including tight end Evan Ingram, who posted six catches for 95 yards and a score.

Ole Miss was also effective in the ground attack, rolling up 180 rushing on 31 attempts led by Kelly's 53 yards. Four Rebels rushed for 30 yards or more, including Akeem Judd and D'Vaughn Pennamon, who combined for 13 carries for 78 yards and a touchdown.

Wide receiver-turned-cornerback Derrick Jones picked off UGA quarterback Jacob Eason on third down and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown to give the Rebels an early 10-0 lead. The Rebel defense limited UGA to just 4 of 16 on third downs for the game and allowed Georgia to convert only one of its first 12 third-down attempts.

Kelly broke free on a read option up the middle and raced 41 yards untouched for a touchdown that made is 45-0 with 8:34 left in the third period. The Bulldogs added two late touchdowns in the fourth quarter well after the game was decided.

## #16 OLE MISS 48, MEMPHIS 28

OXFORD, Miss. - The Ole Miss offense is accustomed to quick starts and Saturday was no different. The Rebels (3-2, 1-1 SEC) jumped out to a 27-7 lead and cruised a 48-28 victory over Memphis (3-1, 0-0 American) in front of 65,889 fans for homecoming at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Senior signal-caller Chad Kelly completed 30 of 44 passes for 361 yards and tailbacks Eugene Brazley and Akeem Judd each rushed for over 100 yards, as the Rebels posted 624 yards of total offense. That marked the first game since 2014 Ole Miss had two 100-yard rushers and was the most yards of total offense since the Rebels recorded 655 yards against New Mexico State last season. Not to be outdone, the Landshark defense forced four Tiger turnovers and held the high-scoring Memphis offense more than 23 points below its season average. Zedrick Woods led the way for the Ole Miss defense with eight total tackles, two interceptions and 1.5 TFLs.

The Rebel defense got into the act with 58 ticks remaining in the opening quarter when Woods picked off Tiger quarterback Riley Ferguson and returned it 30 yards for a TD. Woods added another pick late in the fourth quarter to seal the game for Ole Miss. Memphis added a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to pull within 27-21 with 3:36 left in the period, but Kelly responded for the Rebels with a seven-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown strike to Evan Engram that gave Ole Miss a 34-21 lead heading to the fourth quarter. The TD reception was the 11th of Engram's career, tied for second among Ole Miss tight ends all-time.

Brazley added a six-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter that extended the Rebel lead back to 20 points, 41-21, with 14:53 left in the fourth. The Tigers added a touchdown with 8:41 left regulation, but Brazley added the exclamation point with a 32-yard touchdown run up the middle of the Tigers defense that put the game away.

## #22 ARKANSAS 34, #12 OLE MISS 30

Fayetteville, Ark. - For the second straight season, the Ole Miss football team fell in a back-and-forth battle against Arkansas. A 6-yard run by Jared Cornelius with 2:20 remaining pushed the No. 22 Razorbacks (5-2, 1-2 SEC) to a 34-30 win over the No. 12 Rebels (3-3, 1-2 SEC) at Razorback Stadium.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly accounted for 334 total yards (253 passing, 89 rushing) and three touchdowns (one passing, two rushing) in the Southeastern Conference setback. Tight end Evan Engram hauled in seven passes for 111 yards and a touchdown, all team highs. The Powder Springs, Georgia, native recorded his third 100-yard game of the season while finding the end zone for the 12th time in his career.

Ole Miss finished with 403 yards of total offense compared to 429 by Arkansas. The Razorbacks were led by running back Rawleigh Williams III, who carried the ball 27 times for 180 yards. Arkansas quarterback Austin Allen was 19 of 32 for 229 yards as well as three touchdowns and one interception.

With the Razorbacks driving into Ole Miss territory, the Landshark defense came up with a much-needed turnover to swing the momentum in favor of the Rebels. A furious pass rush by Terry Caldwell forced an errant pass by Allen as the Arkansas QB threw it right to Marquis Haynes. The defensive end returned the ball 17 yards into Razorback territory, and the offense took over from there. Kelly ran 11 yards to get the Rebels in the red zone before he kept the ball and sprinted 17 yards into the end zone. The quarterback's second rushing touchdown of the night gave Ole Miss a 30-27 lead with nine minutes to go in the game.

Arkansas took the lead for good on a late scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Using 10 plays, the Razorbacks found the end zone as Cornelius scampered six yards for the game-winning touchdown. Kelly and the Rebels tried to rally but the quarterback was stopped just short of the first down marker on fourth-and-long, causing the ball and the game to be handed to the Razorbacks.

## #23 LSU 38, #22 OLE MISS 21

**BATON ROUGE, La.** - No. 22 Ole Miss was outscored 17-0 in the second half as No. 23 LSU handed the Rebels a 38-21 setback in the Magnolia Bowl at Tiger Stadium. After going into the half tied at 21-21, the Rebels (3-4, 1-3 SEC) could not overcome a big night by LSU running back Leonard Fournette and a Tigers (5-2, 3-1 SEC) defense that stepped up in the final 30 minutes of play.

Fournette finished the game with 284 yards on the ground, and LSU defense limited the high-powered Ole Miss offense to 325 yards. Senior quarterback Chad Kelly once again led the Rebels through the air and on the ground. The Buffalo, New York, native threw for 218 yards on 20 of 33 passing, while rushing for 56 yards on 12 carries. His favorite receivers were Damore'ea Stringfellow and Van Jefferson, who caught four passes apiece. Stringfellow totaled a game-high 92 yards receiving, and Jefferson added 43 yards and a touchdown.

For the Landshark defense, junior defensive end Marquis Haynes had another huge game that included a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. The Rebels recorded a season-high 10.0 tackles for loss, led by career highs from Temario Strong (2.5) and Detric Bing-Dukes (2.0). Bing-Dukes also posted a team-best eight tackles.

After LSU forced the Rebels to punt late in the second quarter, it looked as if the Tigers would take a lead into the locker room. However, Haynes had something to say about that. As Etling dropped back to pass on first down, the speed rusher blew past the right tackle and drilled the LSU quarterback from his blind side. The huge hit caused the ball to pop loose and freshman Jaylon Jones jumped on it to give Ole Miss the ball inside the LSU 10. On third-and-goal, Akeem Judd plunged into the end zone for a Rebel touchdown. After an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on the Tigers, Ole Miss elected to go for two to try and tie the ballgame. Kelly's decision to keep the ball on a read option proved to be a smart one as he crossed the goal line to knot the contest at 21-21. After 30 minutes of football, the game stood where it started, all tied up.
