FOOTBALL VISITS PENN STATE

» No. 22 Auburn (2-0) makes its first road trip of the Bryan Harsin era when the Tigers visit No. 10 Penn State (2-0) on Saturday, September 18, at Beaver Stadium in University Park, Pa. ABC will televise the 6:30 p.m. CT non-conference prime time matchup.

THE HARSIN DEBUT

>> Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron.

Harsin now holds a 78-24 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State)

He was a 62-11 winner over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in his first game as head coach at Arkansas State in 2013. In his first game at Boise State, the Broncos fell 35-13 to No. 18 Ole Miss in the 2014 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta.

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009.

SERIES HISTORY

- >> The series between Auburn and Penn State is tied 1-1, with both previous meetings coming in bowl games. The Nittany Lions won the first matchup, a 43-14 victory in Tampa's Outback Bowl after the 1995 season. Auburn was a 13-9 winner in Orlando's Capital One Bowl following the 2002 campaign.
- >> This will be Auburn's third-ever regular season game against a Big Ten team; the last was a 1931 7-7 tie at Wisconsin (the Tigers' only other regular-season road game at a Big Ten stadium) and the first was a 0-0 tie with Ohio State in a game played in Montgomery, Ala., in 1917.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Auburn leads the nation in scoring offense (61.0 ppg) and is tied for the lead in scoring defense (5.0 ppg)
- Auburn and Baylor are the only FBS teams that have had two 100-yard rushers in each of the first two games this year. Those two teams are also the only with two players averaging at least 120 rushing yards per game
- » Auburn and Georgia are the only two FBS teams that have shut out their opponents in the first three quarters this season
- Tank Bigsby, who now has 1,075 career rushing yards, lead the SEC and is second nationally at 10.04 yards per rush this season
- » Bo Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, the seventh Auburn QB to top 5,000 career passing yards

- In 129 seasons of football, this will be only the third regular-season matchup for Auburn with a Big Ten team; the last was a 1931 contest at Wisconsin
- Freshman Jarquez Hunter's school-record 94-yard TD run vs. Alabama State is the longest run in the country this season by five yards. He has 257 yards through two games
- Auburn's 613 yards of total offense vs. Akron were the second most in a season opener in program history, behind only 695 yds vs. SW Louisiana in 1985
- The Tigers lead the nation in rush defense (21.5 ypg). Auburn held Akron to -3 rushing yards, the fewest rushing yards allowed since Florida in 2001 (-36 yards)

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2020, the 15th player so honored in Auburn history. Carlson graduated in December with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and is currently pursuing an MBA at Auburn. Carlson was a second-team All-American and a Lou Groza Award semifinalist in 2020.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

» There were 35 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2020 season, including current team members Tank Bigsby, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Shedrick Jackson, Jacob Jasinski, Tate Johnson, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Tashawn Manning, Zakoby McClain, Roger McCreary, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, Zion Puckett, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, John Samuel Shenker, Zykeivous Walker, Brooks Walton and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Elijah Canion, Oscar Chapman, Trey Elston, Brandon Frazier, Reed Hughes, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Sawyer Pate, J.J. Pegues, Jay Sharp, Wesley Steiner and Jeremiah Wright.

AD HONOR ROLL

Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 16 players honored in 2020-21, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, David Shannon and Brooks Walton.

The Tigers played a home-and-home with Nebraska in 1981-92 and faced Maryland in 1952, 198 and 1983 when those schools were members of other leagues.

The Tigers are 12-10-2 all-time against current members of the Big Ten, including games against Indiana, Rutgers, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin.

- Auburn holds an all-time football record of 6-2-2 against teams from the state of Pennsylvania, going 1-1 against Penn State, 4-1-2 against Villanova and 1-0 in a 1914 game with the Carlisle Indians. The Tigers went 1-1-1 in three games played at Villanova between 1937-41, Auburn's only previous contests played in the Keystone State.
- Auburn is 82-40-6 all-time in road openers and 380-358-39 all-time in all games played away from Auburn.

The Tigers have won 11 of their last 17 road openers; Georgia was a 27-6 winner in Athens in last season's road opener.

IN SEPTEMBER

Auburn is 180-58-5 (.749) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 114-22-1 (.834) all-time at home in September, and 66-36-4 (.633) away from Auburn in that month. Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 44 of 51 seasons.

The Tigers are 8-2 all-time in games played on September 18, 4-0 on the road.

AT JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Auburn has an all-time record of 336-85-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .793 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 56 capacity crowds of 87,451 since the seating was increased in 2004.

TOTAL OFFENSE

- The 122 points scored by Auburn in its first two games are the fourth-most ever at Auburn to start a season; most were 138 points in 1932. This is the third time Auburn has scored at least 60 points in each of its first two games, along with 1932 and 1922.
- Auburn's 1,151 yards of total offense through the first two games to start the season are the most in recorded history, surpassing the 2009 season (1,145).
- Since 2001, Auburn is 157-30 (.839) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 213-38-1 (.847) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 553-58-9 (.899) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 347-9 (.975) when scoring 30 points, 176-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

Auburn has scored in 105 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

- Auburn has scored first in 39 of its last 57 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign.
- Auburn piled up 613 total yards against Akron, a mark that ranks 20th all-time in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards against Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in a first game in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).

Auburn and Baylor are the only FBS teams that have had two 100-yard rushers in each of their first two games this season. Those teams are also the only teams to have two players averaging at least 120 rushing yards per game.

The last time Auburn had a pair of 100yard rushers in consecutive games was in 2014 vs. Louisiana Tech and LSU (Nick Marshall and Cameron Artis-Pavne).

The Tigers have won 34 straight games when they have multiple 100-yard rushers dating back to the beginning of the 1979 season.

Sophomore Tank Bigsby is the 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards; he currently ranks 45th with 1,075 career yards and seven career scores.

Against Alabama State, he rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries, his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and his third consecutive 100yard game dating back through last season. His 51-yard run in the third quarter was a career long; his previous was 42 yards against Texas A&M last season.

Against Akron, Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win.

In eight career games where the sophomore has gotten double-digit carries, he has averaged 116.1 yards on the ground and scored all seven of his career rushing TDs.

>> In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games and four total; previously only Bo Jackson (1982) and Michael Dyer (2010) rushed for three 100-yard games against SEC opposition as Auburn freshmen.

Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993. He leads the SEC this season and ranks second nationally at 10.04 yards per carry.

True freshman Jarquez Hunter already ranks 29th among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 257 yards in just two games.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history: the previous long was 92 vards by Ralph O'Gwynne vs. Lovola in 1936. It's the longest run in the nation this season by five yards.

Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to

open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

Third-year starting quarterback Bo Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's seasonopening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

>> Nix is now 460-773 (59.5%) in his career for 5,340 yards and 33 passing scores.

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against Akron. He now ranks eighth at Auburn with 33 career TD passes.

In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

- >> Nix has made 26 consecutive starts at quarterback back through the 2019 season opener. That ties him with Charlie Trotman (1977-79) for the fifth most consecutive starts by an Auburn signalcaller since 1969. The top four in consecutive QB starts:
 - 45 Stan White (1990-93)
 - Phil Gargis (1974-76)
 - 33 Pat Sullivan (1969-71)
 - 32 Jason Campbell (2002-04)
- Nix has currently thrown 139 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to last year's Iron Bowl. The junior has three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including a school record 250 consecutive passes without an interception from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.
- >> In 2019, Nix set the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16), earning SEC Freshman of the Year honors.

- Auburn has eight returning offensive linemen with at least one collegiate start; that's the eighth most of any FBS program.
- Shedrick Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

Sophomore Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips. Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score.

Against Alabama State, Malcolm Johnson Jr. had his first career score on a 49-yard catch from transfer T.J. Finley, his first Auburn TD pass, and Sean Jackson scored his first career TD on a 4-yard rush.

» Graduate transfer Demetris Robertson scored his first Auburn touchdown in the second quarter against Alabama State, a 6-yard reception from Bo Nix. His second TD reception was 28 yards in the third quarter and he added a 36-yard rush for his third score. He's the first Auburn player with three touchdowns in a game since JaTarvious Whitlow vs. Mississippi State in 2019. The last Tiger with two TD catches in a game was Seth Williams vs. Kentucky last season.

FOR THE DEFENSE

- The Tigers lead the nation in scoring defense (5.0 ppg) and rushing defense (21.5 ypg) and are third in total defense (182.0 ypg). The shutout of Alabama State was the 244th all-time shutout for Auburn.
- >> The 10 points allowed by Auburn in the first two games of the season mark the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in any two-game span since giving up three points apiece vs. Ole Miss and Tennessee Tech in 2007.

It is the fewest points Auburn has allowed in the first two games of a season since the Tigers opened the 1996 season with shutouts of UAB and Fresno State.

- The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards). Alabama State gained only 46 yards on the ground.
- >> Linebacker Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).
- Against Texas A&M last season, McClain posted a career-high 17 tackles, the most by an Auburn player since Demetruce McNeal (18) at Mississippi State in 2012.

McClain has eight career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he has led the Tigers in tackles 10 times in his career, including seven tackles in the opener vs. Akron and 10 against Alabama State.

The junior now has 189 tackles for his career. Only 15 Auburn players since 2000 have recorded more than 200 career tackles.

Wooden has started the 2021 campaign with 1.5 sacks; the Tigers recorded eight sacks against Akron, led by T.D. Moultry and Marquis Burks with two each.

- Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 54 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers allowed only 149 total TD during that 66-game span (2.26 per game).
- >> Auburn's defense has allowed only 20 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 55 games.
- >> Roger McCreary scored his first career touchdown with a 35-yard interception return against Alabama State, giving him five picks for his career. Last season, McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

- Auburn is 59-22 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-13 when it fails to force a turnover.
- The experienced Tiger linebacking corps counts 39 career starts and 422 career tackles at Auburn.

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 23-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Roger McCreary's interception return and Nehemiah Pritchett's return of a blocked field goal attempt against Alabama State.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks fourth in Auburn career scoring with 298 points.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fifth in career PAT made (130) at Auburn and is third in career field goals made (56).

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts last season, and has made 29 of his last 31 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including the last 10 in a row (tied for the fourth longest current streak nationally), a career long streak.

His 50-yard field goal vs. Northwestern was his fifth career FG of at least 50 yards:

- 53 Washington (2018)
- 53 Liberty (2018)
- 52 Alabama (2019)
- 50 Tennessee (2020)
- 50 Northwestern (2020)

In 2019, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl.

In 2018, Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

>> Carlson has eight career games with at least three field goals:

2020: Arkansas, South Carolina, Tennessee, Mississippi State;

2019: Alabama;

2018: Washington, Mississippi St., Liberty

Carlson ranks third among Auburn career leaders in field goals made (56); he's one of five AU kickers to make 15+ FG in multiple seasons:

Anders Carlson (2018, 2019, 2020)
Daniel Carlson (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017)
Wes Byrum (2007, 2009, 2010)
Jim Von Wyl (1990, 1991)
Win Lyle (1987, 1989)

With 772 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are now the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a

duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (156) without having a punt blocked; second is LSU (124). Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

MORE FROM THE ALABAMA STATE GAME

Auburn's Barton Lester blocked a punt in the first quarter, Auburn's first blocked kick of the season.

Colby Wooden blocked an Alabama State field goal attempt; it was recovered by Nehemiah Pritchett for a 80-yard return and his first career score. It was Auburn's first blocked field goal for a touchdown since Neiko Thorpe vs. Kentucky in 2009 (69 yards).

Auburn blocked a punt and a field goal in the same game for the first time since the 2013 Alabama game.

>> The 35 points in the third quarter tied the Auburn record for most points in a quarter (also vs. New Mexico State, 1993). It set the Auburn record for most points in the third quarter. The 42 points in the second half tied the Auburn record for most points in a second half (also vs. Florida State, 1985).

RANKINGS

- Auburn is 114-167-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 53-43-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-72-2 on the road and 33-52-2 on a neutral field.
- Auburn is 55-101-3 all-time against AP top 10 teams (26-27-2 at home, 29-74-1 away from Auburn).
- >> The Tigers are 90-134-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (43-34-2 at home, 28-65-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 59-53-3 overall (29-10-1 at home, 19-33-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).
- Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 331-122-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 189-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-89-4 all-time.
- When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 81-77-4 (36-13-1 at home, 22-41-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

- There are 22 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best of any FBS institution and most in the SEC.
- This marks the 15th different season that ESPN's College GameDay has originated from the site of an Auburn football game. The Tigers

are 10-12 all-time in those previous games.

- Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include Tank Bigsby (first team), Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Zakoby McClain and Smoke Monday (second team) and Brodarious Hamm, Roger McCreary, Bo Nix and Owen Pappoe (third team).
- >> Team captains for the 2021 season are linebackers Owen Pappoe and Chandler Wooten.

Additional game captains are also being selected: Nick Brahms, Bo Nix (Akron); Brodarious Hamm, T.D. Moultry (Alabama State).

- In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 256-69-6 (.782). Auburn has won 14 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.
- In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 330-257-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 141-61-6 alltime; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 189-195-12 overall.
- >> Edge defender T.D. Moultry has played in 51 Auburn games, most on the current squad and just two shy of tying the Auburn record of most games played in a career (54) set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10). Moultry made his first career start in the season opener against Akron and tied for the team lead in tackles (7).
- >> The Tigers have 784 total victories since 1982, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. All-time, 31 FBS programs have posted more than 700 wins.
- Among teams that played at least 10 games last season, Auburn (0.82) was one of just six teams averaging fewer than 1.0 turnovers lost per game; others were Texas A&M, Texas, BYU, Notre Dame and Alabama.

The Tigers have lost only one turnover this season in 117 plays, a fumble against Alabama State.

On the current Auburn roster, 42 players have at least one college start to their credit, 22 on offense and 20 on defense.

Six Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrius Knighten (44 overall; 43 games at SE Missouri State), Caylin Newton (25 at Howard), Brandon Council (31 overall; 24 at Akron), Bo Nix (26), Owen Pappoe (26) and Nick Brahms (23).

Next up, the Tigers host Georgia State September 25 for Homecoming at 3 p.m. CT at Jordan-Hare Stadium; the SEC Network will televise the game. Penn State hosts Villanova that day.

>> While Larry Johnson clamored for the ball, Ronnie Brown kept getting it.

Ronnie Brown carried the load all day, finishing with 184 yards on 37 carries and the MVP trophy.

Brown scored on a 17-yard touchdown run with 2:19 left and outplayed the Heisman Trophy finalist as Auburn (No. 22 ESPN/USA Today; No. 19 Associated Press) beat No. 10 Penn State 13-9 in the Capital One Bowl.

The final tally: Brown 184 yards, Johnson just 72.

Johnson, who ran for 2,015 regular-season yards, couldn't break a long one among his 20 carries in his final Penn State game.

Brown ran 37 times and scored twice as the Tigers (9-4) won a bowl game for the first time since 1998

Brown was voted the game's most valuable player.

Penn State quarterback Zack Mills was temporarily benched in the second half and couldn't convert two late drives into points.

Mills threw two consecutive incompletions before getting intercepted by Roderick Hood. That gave the Tigers the ball at Penn State's 27 with 1:49 left, but four consecutive runs by Brown only worked the clock down to 42 seconds.

With no timeouts left, Mills moved it to Auburn's 43 with a 14-yard scramble and two short passes to Matt Kranchick. His shuffle pass under pressure fell short of a first down on fourth down.

The Tigers beat their third top 10 opponent of the season.

Brown passed the 1,000-yard mark despite starting only five games.

Down 9-7, the Tigers started their winning drive at Penn State's 40 with 5:05 left after Robbie Gould's 36-yard punt. Brown carried on five of the six plays, but Jason Campbell's pass on the two-point attempt fell short.

The Nittany Lions' only points

came on Gould's field goals of 21, 27 and 31 yards. He missed a 33-yarder in the first half.

The Tigers borrowed a chapter from Paterno's playbook to take a 7-6 lead with 3:52 left in the third quarter. They ran it 13 consecutive times and milked nearly seven minutes off the clock, with Brown twisting into the end zone on fourth down from the goal line.

He carried on the first six plays and the last four, gaining 59 yards on the drive. The Nittany Lions had gone nearly 10 quarters without giving up a point in the postseason.

The Tigers trailed 6-0 at halftime, losing two turnovers, committing 74 yards in penalties and getting Damon Duval's 24-yard field goal try blocked.



- >> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.
- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 78-24 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him led the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 428 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 336, losing 85 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on firstand-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead. Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his

second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Bigsby eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in his career on his second carry of the second half, a 32-yard pickup. Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-Ó lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Marquis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks.
