SERIES RECORD

LSU has a 103-74 advantage over Auburn in a series that began in 1907. LSU has won 15 of its last 19 games versus Auburn, but Auburn won two of three games over the Tigers last season at Plainsman Park. LSU has captured 13 of the last 20 SEC regular-season series between the clubs, dating back to 1999. LSU had won five straight series over Auburn before AU's series victory last season. LSU coach Paul Mainieri has a 25-12 career mark against Auburn.

LSU COACH PAUL MAINIERI

• LSU coach **Paul Mainieri** is in his 37th season as a college coach with six seasons at St. Thomas University (1983-88), six seasons at Air Force (1989-94), 12 seasons at Notre Dame (1995-2006) and he is in his 13th season at LSU (2007-present) ... **his overall record is 1,447-742-7 and he is 583-250-3 at LSU** ... he was inducted in January 2014 into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, and he served last summer as the head coach of the USA Collegiate National Team ... Mainieri is No. 3 on the NCAA Division I active coaches win list, and he is one of only 10 coaches in NCAA Division I history to win at least 1,400 games ... he earned National Coach of the Year recognition in 2008, 2009 and 2015 ... Mainieri directed LSU to the 2009 College World Series title, and he also has led the Tigers to CWS appearances in 2008, 2013, 2015 and 2017 ... he has directed LSU to eight NCAA Tournament National Seeds in the past 11 seasons ... Mainieri has guided the Tigers to seven NCAA Regional titles, five Super Regional championships, six SEC Tournament titles, six SEC Western Division titles and four SEC regular-season championships.

ABOUT LSU

• LSU is 15-12 in the Southeastern Conference and concludes the regular season with a three-game SEC versus Auburn beginning on Thursday
• The Tigers are No. 21 in the latest NCAA RPI rankings ... LSU has 17 wins over Top 50 RPI teams, which is the fifth-highest total in the nation
• Senior rightfielder **Antoine Duplantis** has homered in each of LSU's last two games, including a three-run blast in the eighth inning Saturday to lift LSU to a 3-2 win over fourth-ranked Arkansas ... Duplantis has two doubles, two homers and six RBI in LSU's last five games ... he has produced 18 RBI in LSU's last 14 games ... Duplantis is No. 3 in the SEC this season with 56 RBI ... he entered this season with four career home runs, but has already exceeded that total with 10 dingers in 2019
• **Antoine Duplantis** is No. 2 on the career LSU hits list with 337, 15 hits behind former first baseman Eddy Furniss (352 hits from 1995-98) ... Duplantis already holds LSU's record for career at-bats (1,048), and he shares the school's triples record (15) with former second baseman Todd Walker (1992-94)
• Junior right-hander **Todd Peterson** delivered a brilliant relief performance in Saturday's win at Arkansas ... Peterson entered the contest in the fifth inning and fired four shutout innings, limiting the Razorbacks to one hit with two walks and three strikeouts
• Freshman right-hander **Landon Marceaux** delivered his best outing of the season last Saturday at Arkansas, as he worked five innings and limited the Razorbacks to two runs on seven hits with three walks and two strikeouts
• Sophomore leftfielder **Daniel Cabrera** has two doubles, three homers and six RBI in the Tigers' last five games ... Cabrera launched a pair of solo homers in last Thursday's game at Arkansas, marking his second two-homer game of the season ... he also blasted two dingers in the Tigers' season opener on February 15 versus Louisiana-Monroe ... Cabrera is No. 8 in the SEC this season in slugging pct. (.590)
• Junior shortstop **Josh Smith** is ranked No. 9 in the SEC in batting average (.345) and No. 5 in runs scored (57)
• Six members of the 2019 LSU baseball squad were honored last Friday in a graduation celebration held at the team's hotel in Fayetteville, Ark. ... since the Tigers were playing in Arkansas last week and could not attend the commencement ceremonies on the LSU campus, the event was held at the hotel to honor the graduates ... team members graduating from LSU this semester are infielder **Brandt Broussard** (business administration), outfielder **Antoine Duplantis** (sport administration), undergraduate assistant coach **Jared Foster** (sport administration), pitcher **Caleb Gilbert** (civil engineering), pitcher **Clay Moffitt** (finance) and infielder **Chris Reid** (sport administration) ... also recognized Friday was former LSU outfielder Mark Laird, who has earned a degree in animal sciences and has been accepted into the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine.

27 Matthew Beck, RH Pitcher

6-7, 241, R-R, Jr., 2L Alexandria, La. (Alexandria HS)

- Excellent pitcher with a fastball that sits in the 90 mph range ... has fired significant relief innings for the Tigers since 2017
- A member of the 2018 Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll as a finance major
- Earned relief win on May 14 vs. New Orleans, firing two shutout innings with two strikeouts
- From March 2 through April 6, pitched 18 straight innings (10 appearances) without giving up an earned run, allowing just six hits with 15 strikeouts
- Made two appearances in Ole Miss series (May 4-5), allowing one run on two hits in two innings with no walks and three Ks
- Pitched 2.2 relief innings at Alabama (April 28), limiting the Tide to one run on one hit
- Worked three innings vs. Texas A&M (April 6), allowing no earned runs with two hits, no walks and two strikeouts
- Earned a relief win in Game 3 of the Kentucky series (March 17), blanking the Wildcats over 2.1 innings with no hits, one walk and three strikeouts

28 Devin Fontenot, RH Pitcher

6-1, 172, R-R, So., 1L The Woodlands, Texas (The Woodlands HS)

- A classic strike thrower with a good feel for his secondary pitches ... fastball will sit in the low to mid 90s with solid arm-side life
- Recorded two saves in the Alabama series on April 27-28 ... pitched a total of 2.1 innings in two appearances, allowing one run on one hit with one walk and three strikeouts ... he pitched 1.1 perfect innings on April 27 with two strikeouts to preserve LSU's 5-2 win ... on April 28, Alabama scored a run against Fontenot in the bottom of the ninth to narrow LSU's lead to 5-4, and the Crimson Tide loaded the bases with two outs, but Fontenot struck out Bama DH Keith Holcombe on three pitches to end the game and earn the save
- Earned a one-inning save at Missouri (April 12), retiring all three batters he faced with 10 pitches
- Credited with relief win over Texas A&M (April 5), firing 1.2 shutout innings with one hit, no walks, three strikeouts
- Earned his second save of the season April 3 vs. South Alabama, firing a perfect ninth inning with one strikeout
- Strong relief effort on March 29 at Miss. State -- 3.2 IP, one run on three hits with one strikeout in 10-5 LSU win
- Recorded a save in LSU's 1-0 win at Georgia (March 22), firing a perfect inning with one strikeout

6-5, 232, R-R, Jr., JC

Monroe, La. (Ouachita Christian HS/San Jacinto College)

- A huge presence on the mound as a physical power pitcher that comes from a very successful JUCO program, where he excelled as the closer for two seasons ... features a fastball in the low 90s and a swing-and-miss slider for his out pitch
- Pitched a scoreless inning at Southern (April 9) with no walks and two strikeouts
- Worked two shutout innings versus McNeese State (March 26) with two strikeouts
- Worked 2.1 innings vs. Texas Southern (March 13) with season-high three strikeouts
- Fired 1.2 shutout innings versus Holy Cross on March 6, allowing no hits with no walks and two strikeouts

18 Cole Henry, RH Pitcher

6-4, 214, R-R, Fr., HS Florence, Ala. (Florence HS)

MLB Draft: 38th Round in 2018 (Detroit Tigers) SEC Co-Freshman of the Week (April 22, 2019)

- Has a three-pitch mix of a mid-90s fastball, hard 12-to-6 curveball, and late fading changeup ... his physical attributes, combined with an advanced knowledge of pitching allow him to make a quick adjustment to the college game
- Named SEC Co-Freshman of the Week on April 22 after defeating Florida on April 19 with a superb effort, limiting the Gators to one run on four hits in 5.1 innings with no walks and a career-high 12 strikeouts ... his strikeouts total was the most by an LSU pitcher in an SEC game since March 30, 2017, when Alex Lange recorded 12 Ks against Texas A&M ... Henry's 12 Ks on also represented the most by an LSU freshman since Lange posted 13 Ks versus Kentucky in 2015
- Earned win over ninth-ranked Texas A&M on April 6 with a superb effort, limiting the Aggies to two runs on six hits in a career-long eight innings with no walks and a career-best nine strikeouts ... Henry threw 96 pitches in the outing, allowing two runs in the first inning before firing seven straight shutout frames ... he retired 10 consecutive Aggie batters to complete his outing
- Defeated Miss. State (March 29), limiting the Bulldogs to four runs on five hits in five innings with career-high 9 strikeouts
- Delivered an excellent performance at fifth-ranked Georgia on March 23, working a 7.1 innings and limiting the Bulldogs to two runs on two hits with one walk and a career-high eight strikeouts
- Earned first career win March 16 vs. Kentucky -- 5.0 IP, three runs on six hits with four walks and six strikeouts
- Solid outing in a start versus California (March 9), firing four shutout innings while allowing two hits and no BB with one K

2018 U.S. Collegiate National Team Member

- Has two plus pitches -- his fastball which has been up to 96 mph and a wipeout slider that gives him the potential to be in the same conversation as LSU greats like Kevin Gausman, Aaron Nola and Alex Lange by the time he finishes his college career
- A member of the 2018 SEC Academic Honor Roll as an interdisciplinary studies major
- Had worked all season as LSU's No. 1 weekend starter, but moved to the bullpen beginning with the May 3-5 series versus Ole Miss – Hess worked in the bullpen as a freshman over the final 2.5 months of the 2017 season, pitching 32.1 innings in 22 relief appearances while allowing nine earned runs (2.51 ERA) on 19 hits with 18 BB, 48 Ks and four saves
- Picked up his first save of the season on May 14 vs. New Orleans, working 1.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with one walk and three strikeouts
- Earned a relief win over Ole Miss on May 3, working four innings (55 pitches) and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and seven strikeouts
- Suffered a pulled groin muscle in the first inning at Missouri (April 12) and had to leave the game ... pitched in relief the following weekend vs. Florida (April 20), working 2.1 shutout innings with two hits and three strikeouts
- Excellent outing on April 5 vs. Texas A&M, limiting the Aggies to one run on five hits in six innings with five strikeouts
- Delivered a superb performance on March 22, as he posted a dominating win over fifth-ranked Georgia in Athens ... Hess blanked the Bulldogs through eight innings, scattering eight hits with no walks and nine strikeouts

- Talented pitcher that worked in LSU's 2018 weekend starting rotation as a true freshman ... has loose arm action with a very good 12-to-6 curveball that displays a lot of bite ... fastball sits in the upper 80s and touches the low 90s, and numbers could get higher as his body develops
- Solid outing in a start against Ole Miss (May 3), working four innings and limiting the Rebels to two runs on six hits with no walks and four strikeouts
- Effective in a relief outing at Alabama, allowing one run on one hit in three innings with one walk and four strikeouts
- Recorded five strikeouts in season-high 4.1 innings at Missouri (April 14), having to come off the bench in the first inning to replace starter Zack Hess after Hess suffered a pulled groin muscle
- Fired three perfect innings on April 3 versus South Alabama, recording no walks and five strikeouts
- Two shutout innings vs. Nicholls (March 20) with no hits, no walks and two strikeouts
- Worked two shutout innings March 12 at Northwestern State, allowing just one hit with three strikeouts

- Very polished pitcher with a four-pitch mix and ability to command the strike zone allowed ... also competed on a very high level for 18U USA Baseball, helping his team win the World Cup during his senior year in high school ... with his experience, skill set, and work ethic, he should transition very quickly and be in the mix to compete in the SEC as a freshman
- Effective start at Arkansas on May 11, working five innings and limiting the Razorbacks to two runs on seven hits with two strikeouts ... Marceaux was not involved in the decision of the Tigers' 3-2 win
- Has been limited this season by arm soreness, but made first career SEC appearance on April 28 at Alabama as the starter ... defeated Alabama to clinch the series for the Tigers ... he pitched five innings (82 pitches) against the Crimson Tide, allowing two runs on five hits with three strikeouts
- Worked three shutout innings as a starter vs. Lamar (April 23), allowing three hits with no walks and one strikeout
- Excellent outing at Northwestern State (March 12), firing three shutout innings with no hits, no walks and three strikeouts

35 Clay Moffitt, RH Pitcher

6-4, 247, R-R, Sr., 1L Baton Rouge, La. (Catholic HS/LSU-Eunice)

- Tremendous competitor who can contribute significantly to the LSU program ... defines what a winner and a leader should be ... a physical presence on the mound who competes with great ferocity and pitches in the upper 80s to low 90s with his fastball
- the son of LSU Football strength and conditioning coordinator Tommy Moffitt
- Pitched a career-high 5.0 innings with a career-best five Ks in a win over Grambling (April 2), allowing two hits with no walks

43 Todd Peterson, RH Pitcher

6-5, 230, R-R, Jr., 2L Lake Mary, Fla. (Lake Mary HS)

2018 SEC All-Tournament Team

- Strong right-handed pitcher that developed into an outstanding reliever in 2018 with six saves ... features a consistent low-to-mid 90s fastball and good feel for a curveball
- Has recorded nine strikeouts in his last 8.2 innings of relief work
- Brilliant relief effort on May 11 to earn a win at Arkansas, working four shutout innings and limiting the Razorbacks to one hit with two walks and three strikeouts
- From April 3-23, worked 12.1 consecutive innings over seven appearances without allowing an earned run, giving up only three hits in that period
- Earned his second save of the season April 19 with an outstanding effort against Florida, working 3.2 scoreless innings and limiting UF to three hits with no walks and one strikeout
- Brilliant in relief on April 12 at Missouri to earn his third win of the season ... Peterson entered the game at the start of the seventh inning with the score tied 11-11 and worked three perfect innings (33 pitches) with five strikeouts ... LSU scored the eventual winning run in the top of the 10th inning to give Peterson the victory
- Dominant one-inning relief outing on March 12 at Northwestern State, striking out all three batters he faced
- Earned a two-inning save vs. Bryant (Feb. 24), allowing no runs on two hits with one strikeout

30 Trent Vietmeier, RH Pitcher

6-3, 208, R-R, So., 1L Pittsburgh, Pa. (Montour HS)

- Athletic pitcher that displays a toughness on the mound with his presence and aggressiveness ... works on a good downhill angle with a fastball in the upper 80s and low 90s ... lettered in four high school sports (baseball, football, basketball, golf) and was an all-conference football defensive end
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless relief innings versus Ole Miss (May 4), allowing just one hit
- Fired eight straight scoreless innings over four appearances from March 28-April 9, allowing three hits with seven strikeouts
- Picked up a relief win on April 3 vs. South Alabama, working two scoreless innings with no walks and one strikeout
- Excellent relief outing at Miss. State (March 28), as he recorded 3.2 shutout innings with no hits and three strikeouts
- Fired a career-high six strikeouts and earned his first career save, as he worked the final four innings of Game 2 win over Kentucky (March 16)
- Fired 1.2 shutout innings versus Holy Cross (March 6), allowing no hits and no walks with four strikeouts

10 Eric Walker, RH Pitcher

6-0, 173, R-R, R-So., 1L Arlington, Texas (Arlington Martin HS)

2017 Freshman All-American 2017 Freshman All-SEC

- Outstanding pitcher who enjoyed a tremendous freshman season at LSU; however, he suffered a tear in the ulnar collateral ligament of his right elbow near the end of the season and underwent Tommy John surgery ... Walker missed the entire 2018 season, but returns to the mound in 2019
- Command of three pitches and his ability to fill up the zone with strike after strike is reminiscent of former LSU great Aaron Nola ... in addition to his great high school baseball career, Walker was a three-year starting quarterback for an outstanding football team at the 6A level in Texas
- A member of the 2017 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll and the 2018 SEC Academic Honor Roll as a finance major
- Defeated Alabama on April 27 as he recorded a career-best nine strikeouts in the win ... Walker limited the Crimson Tide to one run on five hits in 5.2 innings ... he allowed a solo homer to the first Alabama hitter he faced in the bottom of the first inning, but he blanked the Crimson Tide throughout the remainder of his outing
- Posted a win over Florida on April 20, limiting the Gators to two runs on six hits in 5.2 innings with no walks and five strikeouts
- Defeated Mississippi State on March 30 with a superb effort, blanking the Bulldogs in seven innings of work while allowing just four hits with two walks and three strikeouts ... the game was halted by rain in the top of the fifth inning for one hour, 19 minutes, but Walker returned to the mound after the delay to fire three more scoreless innings ... fired a total of 91 pitches in the outing, which was his longest of 2019 ... he did not allow an extra-base hit, and only one Mississippi State runner advanced beyond first base
- Worked 4.1 innings as starter March 17 vs. Kentucky – one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts
- Excellent relief outing in 2019 debut versus UL-Monroe (Feb. 15) – 2.1 shutout innings with one hit, no walks, two strikeouts

24 Cade Beloso, 1B

6-0, 227, L-L, Fr., HS River Ridge, La. (John Curtis HS)

- A left-handed hitting first baseman with power ... was named the 2018 Louisiana Player of the Year after leading John Curtis High School to the state championship ... powerfully-built slugger who has great bat control and rarely strikes out
