• **SEC Offensive Player of the Week** – Texas A&M's Haley Pounds, a sophomore forward from Spring, Texas, played a part in five consecutive goals for the Aggies, including the last three goals of a 4-2 win at Rice and the first two goals of a 3-0 victory over Northwestern State. Pounds became the 11th Aggie in school history to log three assists in a game as she served up three perfect corner kicks against the Owls.

• **SEC Defensive Player of the Week** – Auburn's Sarah Le Beau, a freshman goalkeeper from Crystal Lake, Ill., led the Tigers to shutout victories at UC-Irvine and Long Beach State. Le Beau made nine saves on the weekend with nine coming on Sunday against Long Beach State. It is the third-most saves by an Auburn keeper in the last four seasons.

• **SEC Freshman of the Week** – Texas A&M's Kate Hajdu, a freshman midfielder from Dallas, Texas, became just the fourth Aggie freshman to notch two goals in a season opener as she helped A&M tally a 4-2 win at Rice. On Sunday, Hajdu assisted Janae Cousineau in the 30th minute to give A&M a 3-0 advantage over Northwestern State.

• Six SEC teams were mentioned in the latest NSCAA poll, including three in the top 11. Texas A&M is ranked fourth nationally while South Carolina was tabbed eighth, Florida 14th and Auburn 16th. Kentucky and Arkansas are listed among those receiving votes.

• SEC women's soccer is beginning its 23rd season deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated women's soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country and especially in the Southeast.

• Florida was predicted to win to the 2015 Southeastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the

17th time that the Gators have been tabbed by the coaches to win the title. The Gators received 167 points that included 11 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 149 points (two first-place votes). Kentucky received one first place vote.

• Fifty-two players were named to the Preseason SEC Watch List. Check page two of this release for a complete listing of the players.

• Four SEC students were among the 28 women named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch Lists. Mikaela Harvey (Texas A&M), Savannah Jordan (Florida), Christen Westphal (Florida) and Hannah Wilkinson (Tennessee) were listed on the preseason watch list for the most prestigious individual award in college soccer presented annually.

• Fourteen players that earned All-SEC honors last year return for the 2015 campaign. Included in that group are first team selections Simone Charley (Vanderbilt), Savannah Jordan (Florida) and Christen Westphal (Florida).

• Twenty-one regular season matches will be televised to a national television audience this year. SEC Network will broadcast 17 matches while ESPNU will show four. Additionally, more than 100 matches will be shown digitally on SEC Network +.

• The SEC Network will broadcast each of the first three rounds of the SEC Tournament while ESPNU will show the championship game.

• The SEC led all conferences with three teams (Florida, South Carolina and Texas A&M) in the 2014 NCAA Quarterfinals. The ACC and Pac-12 each had two and the Big Ten has one team.

• A record-tying eight Southeastern Conference soccer teams were among the 64 competing for the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Championship. It ties the league record set in 2011 and marks the seventh time in the last eight seasons that at least six SEC teams have received postseason bids.

### SEC Network

On August 14, 2014 SEC Network launched in 62 million homes nationwide. On that day, SEC Network became the most successful new channel launch in cable history and it hasn't stopped going since. Currently boasting 70 million subscribers, the network produced 1,500 events surrounded by 1,400 hours of original programming in its debut year.

- Thursday Night Game Of The Week package features soccer teams each week on SEC Network beginning Thursday, September 10.
- 17 regular season games are scheduled to be televised on SEC Network.
- Four regular season games are scheduled to be televised by ESPN.
- The entire SEC Tournament will be televised to a national audience. The first three rounds of the tournament will be televised by SEC Network and the championship game will be on ESPN.
- SEC Network + will make many more games available to SEC soccer fans. SEC Network + provides additional digital only events to fans through the WatchESPN app on smartphones, computers, and tablets, Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360 and Xbox One.

### Preseason Poll

Florida was predicted to win to the 2015 Southeastern Conference women's soccer title in voting by the league's 14 head coaches. This marks the 17th time that the Gators have been tabbed by the coaches to win the title.

The Gators received 167 points that included 11 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 149 points (two first-place votes). Kentucky received one first place vote.

Florida returns six starters, including 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy candidates – junior forward Savannah Jordan and senior defender Christen Westphal, from the 2014 team that advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinal Round.

Points were compiled on a 13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis, though each coach was not allowed to vote for their own team.

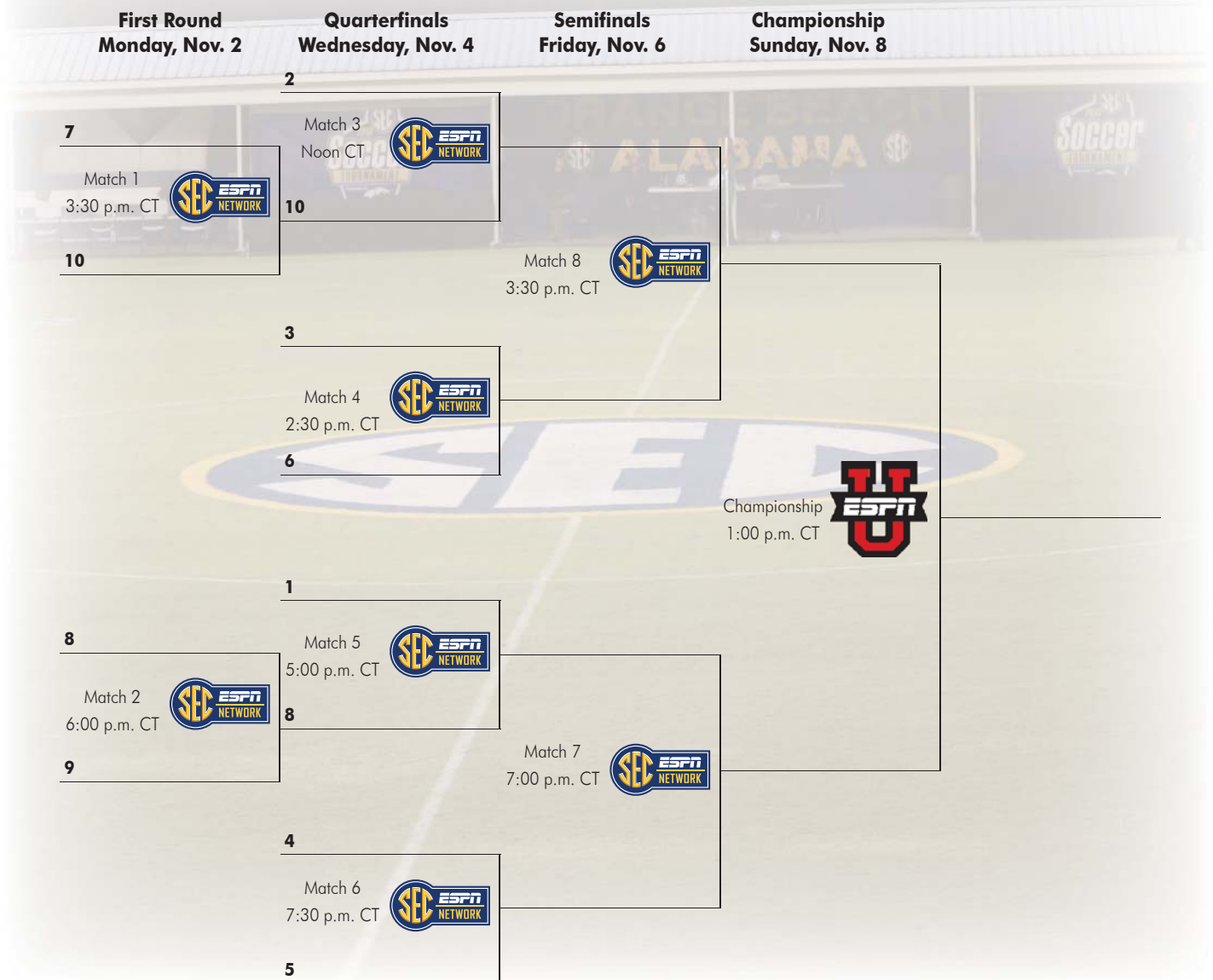

## 2015 SEC TOURNAMENT November 2-8 • Orange Beach Sportsplex • Orange Beach, Ala.



### Format

There shall be a single-elimination tournament of the top ten teams played at the conclusion of the SEC regular-season schedule. The tournament champion shall be the SEC representative to the NCAA championship.

The top ten teams with the highest point total, regardless of divisions, will participate in the tournament. The following point system is utilized to determine regular season standings and seeding for the tournament: a win counts as three points, a tie as one, and a loss as zero points. If a game(s) is cancelled, neither team will receive a point and the standings will be determined by average points per game. The tournament shall be played in a Monday-Wednesday-Friday-Sunday format with Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday designated as off/practice days.

### Seeding

The tournament will be seeded 1-10 regardless of division based on the point system implemented to determine regular season standings. If teams are tied, the following procedures, in order as follows, will be used to break the tie:

**Two-Team Tie** – The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the tied teams.
- B. Points earned versus common opponents.
- C. Goal differential versus common opponents.
- D. Goals scored versus common opponents.

E. Won-Lost record of the two teams versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.

F. Goal differential versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.

G. Goals scored versus highest seeded common opponent and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary.

H. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

**Three-Team Tie (or more)** – The following procedure will be used until the tie is broken. If at any time this tie breaker results in only two remaining tied teams, then the two-team tiebreaker will be used beginning with Subsection A in that procedure and continuing from that point:

A. If all teams have played one another, then most points earned in those matches only.

B. If all teams have not played, but one team has defeated all teams in the tie break, then that team breaks the tie and shall be placed highest. Remaining teams will continue with the tie break procedure.

C. If all teams have not played one another and a team does not have all wins over the tied teams, then use Subsection B in the two-team tie break procedures and continue through the two team tie-break procedures until ties between all teams are broken (except Subsection H will read "if three or more teams are still tied, the Commissioner will conduct a draw").

Alabama defeated the Troy Trojans by a final score of 1-0 in the team's 2015 home opener on Sunday night at the Alabama Soccer Complex. Sophomore Alexis Mouton scored the game's only goal in the 77th minute, sending the Tide to its first win of the 2015 season. Senior goalkeeper Emily Rusk saved two of Troy's eight shots to register her first shutout of the campaign. The victory marked the first career win for first-year head coach Wes Hart. Despite outshooting Troy 10-3 in the first half, Alabama was unable to get on the board as the two teams carried a scoreless tie into the break. Alabama newcomers Celia Jimenez (3) and Chatham DeProspero (2) each recorded multiple shots in the opening half, while Jimenez, Christina Martensson and Hailey Brohaugh each collected a shot on goal. The game would remain scoreless until sophomore Alexis Mouton – with just 13 minutes remaining in the contest – brought the ball to the box and drove her second career goal into the left corner of the net, lifting the Tide to its first victory this season. Following tonight's match, Alabama will play host to Wake Forest on Friday, Aug. 28 at 7 p.m. CT before traveling to Cookeville, Tenn. for a one-game stop against Tennessee Tech on Sunday, Aug. 30 also at 7 p.m. CT.

## TEXAS A&M AGGIES

Overall: 2-0-0  
SEC: 0-0-0

The Aggies started the season 2-0-0 for the second consecutive season after starting 1-1-0 for five consecutive seasons from 2009-2013. Kate Hajdu became just the fourth Aggie freshman to register two goals in a season opener and the first since Allie Bailey tallied two goals in the season debut against Fresno State (W, 4-2). Others to accomplish the feat included Jessica Hamilton in 2000 (5-0 win vs Central Florida) and Michelle Remington in 1998 (5-1 win vs. North Texas). With their win Friday, the Aggies improved to 22-0-5 (.907) mark against in-state rivals since 2008, including an 11-0-4 record against their former Big 12 Conference colleagues. This season, A&M is 1-0-0 against teams from Texas, toppling Rice 4-2 in the season opener. Last season, A&M went 2-0-0 against Lone Star foe, dropping Stephen F. Austin, 1-0, on August 24 and Houston Baptist, 5-0, in the NCAA Championship first round. After getting a year of seasoning under the auspices of last year's nine-player senior class, Texas A&M's four sophomores came out like gang busters in the season opening weekend. The quartet accounted for four goals and four assists in the 4-2 win at Rice and 3-0 victory against Northwestern State. On Friday, McKayla Paulson notched the first two goals of her career and Haley Pounds logged three assists on the evening. On Sunday, Pounds and Mikaela Harvey found the back of the net and Pounds added an assist. All four of sophomores played over 140 minutes, including Paulson playing all 180 minutes.
