FINAL NON-CONFERENCE GAME IN BEARD-EAVES-MEMORIAL COLISEUM

The Auburn vs. West Georgia game Tuesday is the final non-conference game for the Tigers in the 42nd and final season of the arena. Auburn is 6-2 at home this year.

3-GAME WINNING STREAK

Auburn is in the midst of its longest winning streak this season with three consecutive wins vs. Alabama State, Charleston Southern and Georgia Southern by an average of 17.0 points per game. The Tigers are averaging 88.7 points per game during the streak.

DISHING IT OUT

DeWayne Reed has averaged 5.0 assists (35) in the Tigers' last seven games. He dished out seven assists vs. both Virginia and Troy and five at Florida State. For the season, he is ranked sixth in the SEC with 4.4 assists per game.

GRADUATING TIGERS

Former Tigers Rasheem Barrett and Quantez Robertson graduated from Auburn University on Dec. 18. Their classmate, Korvotney Barber, graduated this

past August. Both Barrett and Robertson are playing professionally in Germany while Barber is playing pro in Belgium.

Barrett earned his degree in public administration while Robertson earned his in sociology.

This continues a trend of all Auburn players who stayed four years under coach Jeff Lebo having graduated.

Seniors Lucas Hargrove and DeWayne Reed and junior Larry Williams are each on track to graduate following the upcoming spring semester.

LAST TIME OUT**Auburn 95, Georgia Southern 75 (Jan. 2, 2010, in Auburn, Ala.)**

Brendon Knox notched his first career double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds while Auburn reached season-highs in points, 3-point field goals made and 3-point field goal percentage in a 95-75 win over Georgia Southern in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Auburn shot 54.2 percent from 3-point range, making 13-of-24, as six Tigers placed in double figures. DeWayne Reed added 16 points and 6 assists, Frankie Sullivan 15 points on 4-of-5 3-pointers, Lucas Hargrove 14 points, Tay Waller 13 points and freshman Andre Malone a career-high 11 points on 3-of-3 treys. The Tigers made 8-of-15 shots from 3-point range en route to a 39-33 halftime lead. Auburn outscored Georgia Southern 56-42 in the second half. Knox's layup gave Auburn a double-digit lead for good at 55-45 with 13:27 to play. Auburn pushed its lead to 24 at 77-53 with 7:07 remaining on a pair of Reed free throws and the lead never dipped below 15 points the rest of the way despite Lebo emptying the bench with four minutes to go. All 16 Tigers played. Georgia Southern, coached by former Auburn assistant Charlton Young who is in his first season at the school, was led by Antonio Hanson's 16 points and Colby Wohlleb's 10 points. Auburn shot 57.1 percent (32-of-56) from the field for the game and 66.7 percent (18-of-27) from the foul line. The Tigers outrebounded the Eagles 39-31 and held Georgia Southern to 41.7 percent shooting from the field.

QUOTING JEFF LEBO**(On how Auburn is prepared for SEC play)**

issue for us. Our best offensive group is our three smaller guys. We have to give up something there. That is a concern with SEC play right around the corner."

(On what are you looking for against West Georgia in the last game in preparation for SEC play)

"I want to be sharp. You want to be sharp and playing with confidence when you enter into the SEC. I think we are slowly starting to do some good things. I think the last few games our offensive efficiency has been much better which is nice to see. We are shooting the ball at a much higher percentage. You want to have some confidence. You have to have confidence. The way a basketball team, the more confidence you have and the more you are playing together well on a



particular night, the better shots you have. We have some deficiencies. There is no doubt about it, but the kids have continued to work hard. I think some of the kids that missed a lot of preseason are starting to round into a little bit better shape. You look at Kenny Gabriel, you look at Tay Waller who missed a ton of games and practice and is starting to get back into some playing shape."

SPEED REED

Senior DeWayne Reed is averaging a team-high 15.4 points and 4.4 assists in a team-high 31.6 minutes per game this year.

He scored a career-high 24 points in the comeback win vs. Niagara and scored eight straight points to begin Auburn's amazing 11-0 game-ending run.

He also tied his career-high with 24 points in the 80-65 win over IUPUI while also making 7-of-8 free throws.

Reed scored a team-high 18 points in the 68-67 win over Virginia and scored all 17 of his points in the final 20:01 in the loss to Florida State after playing only nine first half minutes after being saddled with foul trouble.

T(R)AY WALLER

Tray Waller is averaging 13.0 points and shooting 39.6 percent (21-of-53) from 3-point range this year.

with an injured quad, Tay Waller scored 13 points in 17 minutes in his first game of the season at Alabama A&M on Dec. 1. He went 3-of-4 from 3-point range.

Waller made his first start of the season in the Tigers' next game vs. Troy in which he scored 12 points and followed that up with 10 points vs. Virginia and had 15 points, four rebounds and three steals at Florida State.

Last season, he ranked second in the SEC making 100 three-pointers and was third in the league shooting 36.8 percent from 3-point range.

FRANKIESTEIN

Frankie Sullivan totaled 17 points and a career-high nine rebounds in Auburn's 76-72 loss at Florida State. He went 3-of-6 from 3-point range.

He had 10 points and a career-high tying six steals vs. Charleston Southern and followed that up with 15 points on 4-of-5 shooting from 3-point range vs. Georgia Southern.

FREE THROW FRANKIE

Auburn sophomore Frankie Sullivan made 27

straight free throws to open the season, the longest such recorded streak at Auburn.

His streak came to an end at Alabama A&M as he missed the first of a pair of technical free throws in Auburn's seventh game of the season on Dec. 1.

Sullivan leads the SEC in free throw shooting at 90.0 percent (45-of-50).

FORT KNOX

Brendon Knox is averaging 15.7 points in Auburn's last three games while shooting 78.3 percent (18-of-23) from the field.

The Georgetown, S.C., native recorded the first double-double of his career with a career-high tying 18 points and a career high 11 rebounds vs. Georgia Southern on Jan. 2. He went 7-of-9 from the field.

He scored a career-high 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field in 25 minutes vs. Alabama State and 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the field vs. Charleston Southern.

He made the first game-winning shot of his lifetime as he put back a DeWayne Reed missed shot with 1.4 seconds left to give Auburn a thrilling 68-67 victory over Virginia on Dec. 7.

Knox totaled 11 points and six rebounds vs. the Cavaliers. He scored a career-high 12 points in 15 minutes in Auburn's win over High Point. He also pulled down four rebounds.

Freshman Ty Armstrong totaled seven points, two rebounds and a block in seven minutes off the bench vs. Charleston Southern. He went 3-of-4 from the field.

Trailing 65-58 to Niagara with 1:30 to play in its season opener on Friday, Auburn closed with an incredible 11-0 run in the final 89 seconds for a 69-65 victory.

During the span, Reed made a conventional 3-point play with 1:29 left, stole a pass and dunked it on the other end with 52 seconds to go and then had another conventional 3-point play to close out the run.

Lucas Hargrove set up the go ahead basket with a huge game-saving block of Rob Garrison's layup with two seconds remaining.

"EASY E" 1ST FROSH TO START SEASON OPENER SINCE 2005

Earnest Ross became the first Auburn freshman to start a season opener since Quantez Robertson, Josh Dollard and Joey Cameron started the 2005-06 season opener vs. Lipscomb.

Ross started Auburn's first seven games in place of then injured senior guard Tay Waller.

REED PRESEASON ALL-SEC 2nd TEAM SELECTION

Senior DeWayne Reed was a pre-season All-SEC second team selection by both the SEC Coaches and by the media panel at SEC Basketball Media Day.

Reed averaged 13.2 points and 3.7 assists, 2.6 rebounds and 1.9 steals as a junior last year helping lead the Tigers to a 24-12 record (10-6 SEC). The Houston, Texas, native ranked third in the SEC in steals, sixth in assists and 17th in scor-



ing. He averaged 16.0 points in three NIT games, helping Auburn advance to the quarterfinals.

NEW AUBURN ARENA OPENS NEXT SEASON

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena is ahead of schedule and is on track to be finished this July prior to the start of the 2010-11 season.

The Auburn Arena, with an approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves,

with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation into a site for concerts, other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 41st year of service to the University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena, the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

Steele averaged 21 points, 7 rebounds and almost 5 assists per game as a junior last year in leading Knoxville Fulton High to back-to-back state championships as he was named the Class 2A State Tournament MVP in 2009. Steele, who made 100 three-pointers last season, has led Fulton to a 58-8 record as a sophomore and a junior.

TIGERS IN BEMC

In its 42nd and final year of play in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, Auburn boasts a 300-117 record (.719) over the past 27 seasons.

Overall, the Tigers are 387-179 (.684) since their first season in the Coliseum in 1968-69. Only five times in the 42-year history of the arena has Auburn experienced a losing record at home. The Tigers are 6-2 at home this season.

Auburn has a 44-43 (.506) record in overtime games in its history. The Tigers last overtime game was a 60-59 loss to Dayton in the Chicago Invitational on Nov. 28, 2008. Auburn has not played an overtime game this year.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Auburn plays its final SEC home opener in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum history against South Carolina (8-5) on Saturday at 12:30 pm and it will be televised on the SEC Network. The Gamecocks, who play host to Longwood on Tuesday prior to playing the Tigers, have wins over Richmond (76-58) and Western Kentucky (74-56) with losses to Baylor (85-74), at Boston College (85-76), at Clemson (68-61), Miami, Fla. (85-70) and at Wofford (68-61). The Tigers and Gamecocks have two common opponents in Alabama A&M and Georgia Southern. Auburn won at Alabama A&M 87-52 while South Carolina defeated the Bulldogs 88-50. Auburn defeated Georgia Southern 95-75 while South Carolina defeated the Eagles 90-66. Devan Downy ranks second in the SEC in scoring at 18.5 points per game, ranks first with 3.0 steals and eighth with 3.8 assists. South Carolina ranks second in the SEC in blocks (8.2), steals (9.6) and turnover margin (+5.2), but is 10th in scoring defense at 69.9 points per game, one slot ahead of Auburn.

Dennis Horner answered with a 3-pointer for the Wolfpack to tie it at 54-54 13 seconds later. An Earnest Ross driving layup put the Tigers back in front 56-54 with 1:01 to play, setting up the final second heroics. Smith, the tournament's MVP who finished with 11 points and 15 rebounds on 4-of-18 shooting, made a conventional 3-point play to allow the Wolfpack to regain the lead at 57-56 with 50 seconds remaining. Sullivan missed a trey on Auburn's next possession, and following a Tiger offensive rebound, Reed missed a 3-pointer short of the rim, but Hargrove collected the ball and laid it in to tie it at 58 with 12.4 seconds left. After scoring the final four points of the first half to take a 26-25 halftime lead, NC State continued with 7 straight points, closing an 11-0 run with a 35-25 lead almost 3 minutes in that grew to 39-28. Auburn answered with 10 straight points, capped on a Sullivan 4-point play, to draw the Tigers to within 39-38 with 11:31 to play. A Sullivan trey enabled Auburn to regain the lead at 43-41 and then Reed nailed another trey on the Tigers' next possession for a 46-43 lead. An Andre Malone free throw and a Johnnie Lett tip-in putback gave the Tigers their largest lead at 49-43, ending a 21-4 run in just over seven minutes midway through the second half. Auburn held the NC State scoreless for 5:35 and only four points in 11 minutes from the 15:41 mark to the 4:39 mark in the second half. After the dry spell, NC State drained back-to-back 3-pointers by Javier Gonzalez and Julius Mays to tie it at 49-49 with four minutes to play. Auburn only shot 5-of-15 free throws, was outrebounded 19-11 on the offensive end and was outscored 18-4 in second chance points.

DeWayne Reed scored all 17 of his points in the final 20:01 and Frankie Sullivan added 17 points and a career-high nine rebounds, but it wasn't enough as Auburn lost a 76-72 heartbreaker at Florida State. After trailing by as many as 14 points in the second half, Auburn went on a 24-10 run to tie it at 59-59 on a Sullivan 3-pointer with 6:46 left. That was the first time the Tigers were tied since holding a 12-10 lead. Tied at 63, Florida State scored four straight points. Lucas Hargrove sank a 3-pointer to bring the Tigers to within 69-67 with 1:01 left. Solomon Alabi, who scored a game-high 22 points for the Seminoles, made a conventional 3-point play with 36 seconds to go to give Florida State a 72-67 edge. Tay Waller hit two treys to open the game to give Auburn a 6-0 lead, but DeWayne Reed picked up two quick fouls in the first three minutes and went to the bench for the next 10:29 of the first half. Florida State got into the free throw bonus in only the first 5:42 of the game. Florida State didn't score a basket for nearly the final 7:29 of the first half until Deividas Dulkys sank his third 3-pointer of the period with one second to go as the Seminoles went up 33-25. The Seminoles did make five free throws during the span. Auburn only scored two baskets in the final 9:09, the last one on Sullivan's trey with 4:41 remaining, and added a Reed foul shot with 7.4 seconds left. The Tigers were saddled with serious first half foul trouble as three players, Reed, Lucas Hargrove and Johnnie Lett each had three fouls while Frankie Sullivan had two, and picked up his fourth only 3:12 into the second half. After being down by as much as 49-35, Auburn scored nine straight points to close to within 49-44 with 11:29 remaining. Auburn was only 7-of-13 from the foul line compared to Florida State's 24-of-34. Sullivan, Knox and Lett all fouled out for the Tigers.
