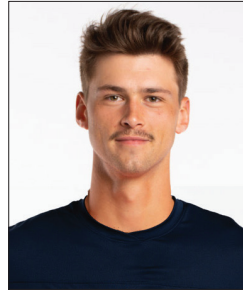

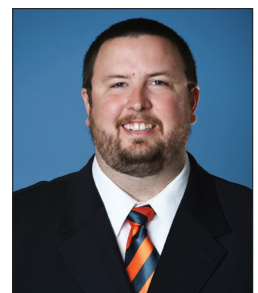

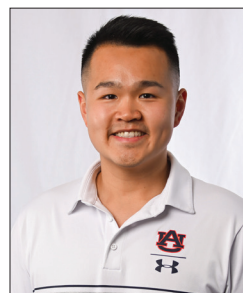

BOBBY REYNOLDS

HEAD COACH

A veteran of competition at the highest levels of collegiate and professional tennis, Bobby Reynolds is beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Auburn Tigers. He was named head coach at Auburn in June, 2016.

Reynolds had a 12-year career playing professional tennis, retiring in 2014. In 2009, he reached a career-high ranking of No. 63 in singles and No. 46 doubles. Reynolds appeared in 17 main draw grand slam events in singles and 20 main draws in doubles. Twice, he advanced to the third round of a grand slam event in singles (2005 Australian Open, 2008 Wimbledon) and did so four times in doubles.

The Atlanta, Ga., product was the 2003 SEC player of the year and NCAA tournament Most Outstanding Player, leading Vanderbilt to the NCAA finals that season. He played 12 seasons of professional tennis, appearing in 17 grand slam main draws for singles

and 20 for doubles, and was the 2012 MVP of World Team Tennis for the Washington Kastles.

The most decorated player in Vanderbilt tennis history, as a junior, Reynolds led the Commodores to the 2003 NCAA Final and was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Reynolds finished the 2003 season ranked No. 1 in the nation in singles and was named SEC Player of the Year. He chose to forgo his senior year and pursue professional tennis.

Reynolds is a 2019 inductee to the Vanderbilt Sports Hall of Fame.

Reynolds spent the 2015-16 season as an assistant coach with Oklahoma men's tennis, helping the Sooners advance to the NCAA championship match.

"I know how passionate the Auburn family is about all its teams, and I know we can succeed, thrive and do great

things in tennis here," said Reynolds. "I'm looking forward to working with the members of the team and drawing from all my experiences to put my stamp on the program and its development."

Reynolds led the young 2021 Tigers to a ranking as high as No. 39 with NCAA individual qualifiers in singles (Tyler Stice) and doubles (Tad Maclean and Finn Murgett). Tad Maclean and Finn Murgett were 2021 NCAA doubles finalists.

Coach Reynolds and his wife Dr. Josie Reynolds, an All-America pentathlete and heptathlete at Vanderbilt, have three sons - Parker, Mason and Blake.

CHRIS HOOSHYAR

ASSISTANT COACH

Chris Hooshyar is in his ninth season at Auburn and fourth season with the men's tennis program. A noted recruiter, Hooshyar has been instrumental in bringing some of the top talent in the world to Auburn.

In 2021 Hooshyar helped Auburn advance as No. 39 in the ITA rankings in 2021, with individual NCAA qualifiers in singles (Tyler Stice) and doubles (Tad Maclean and Finn Murgett). Maclean and Murgett were 2021 NCAA doubles finalists.

In Hooshyar's five seasons with the Auburn women's program, he helped lead the Tigers to two straight NCAA Sweet 16 appearances. Three Tigers were named All-SEC – Alizee Michaud (First Team), Andie Dikosavljevic (Second Team) and Taylor Russo (Freshman) – while Michaud and

Dikosavljevic advanced to the Round of 64 in the NCAA Championship Singles Competition. Michaud and Russo advanced to the semifinal round of the NCAA Championship Doubles Competition.

In 2016, the assistant from Manchester, England, helped lead the Tigers to many program firsts. Finishing the season 24-8 (9-4 SEC), Auburn set program records for single season wins and single season SEC wins. The Tigers also hosted a NCAA Regional for the first time in program history. As a result of these accomplishments, Hooshyar was named the 2016 National ITA Assistant of the Year.

As a player, Hooshyar captained the SMU men's team for his final two seasons and compiled more than 35 singles victories in his four years. He

posted the third-highest win total on the team in singles during his final year and second-highest in doubles.

Hooshyar's best season arguably came during his sophomore year when he went 14-8 in singles play, including a singles win in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament against Texas A&M. In that match, Hooshyar defeated Mike Beatty at the No. 6 spot in straight sets, 6-0, 7-6 (6), for his first NCAA victory.

As a junior player in England, Hooshyar was ranked as the top player in England throughout the junior process.

Chris is married to the former Meagan Surrency, who currently serves as Auburn's assistant athletics director for student-athlete experience. They have two daughters, Charlotte and Halton.

Fall 2022: Went 5-4 in singles including two wins over No. 89 Connor Thomson from South Carolina ... had a 3-3 doubles record during the fall.

YARBROUGH TENNIS CENTER



In 2005, Auburn University set out to make its men’s and women’s tennis teams the best programs in the country, starting with a state-of-the-art facility. In August 2006, construction began on Auburn’s new facility. On Nov. 2, 2007, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center opened as a new phase in Auburn tennis.

The facility has 33,314-square feet of indoor space with six indoor courts, 12 outdoor courts with stadium seating and 16 clay courts. The Yarbrough Tennis Center also houses a pro shop, men’s and women’s locker rooms, concessions and a meeting area. All 12 courts are world-class lighted courts used for both competition and practice by the Auburn tennis teams.

“This outstanding facility is the result of the hard work and dedication of numerous people from the City of Auburn and Auburn University,” said then-Auburn athletics director Jay Jacobs. “One of the finest tennis facilities in the Southeastern Conference, the Yarbrough Center will be a tremendous asset for the men’s and women’s tennis programs at Auburn for years to come.”

As one of the best facilities in the Southeastern Conference, Auburn hosted the 2008 SEC women’s tennis championships and the men’s tournament in 2009. The facility was named the 2015 Public Facility of the Year by the Professional Tennis Registry.

The City of Auburn/Auburn University Tennis Center replaced the Luther Young Tennis Complex, Auburn’s tennis home since 1978.
