## WEEKEND STORY LINES

- Auburn, winner of eight of its last nine games, hosts Xavier this weekend for a three-game series. It is the first ever meeting between the two programs. Xavier enters at 4-6 following a series loss at No. 17 Louisville last weekend.
- The Tigers knocked off No. 28 Alabama 5-3 on Tuesday to improve to 6-1 all-time in the Capital City Classic in Montgomery.
- The Tigers have recorded double digit hits in their last five games for the first time since reaching 10+ hits in seven straight from 5/4-12/13. Auburn has averaged 7.2 runs per game over the span and have totaled 18 extra base hits while hitting .346.
- During his current 15-game hitting streak, which dates back to the final two games in 2014, Anfernee Grier is 27-of-60 (.450 BA) with 1 HR, 7 RBI, 17 R, 9 2B, 1 3B and 3 SB. He was named SEC Player of the Week on March 2.
- Junior OF Jordan Ebert (career .326 hitter) was 2-for-5 on Tuesday against Alabama to give him 40 career multi-hit games.
- Auburn's pitching staff has struck out more than a batter per inning on the season (124 Ks in 113.0 IP), including at least 10 Ks in six of the last eight games. On the season, Auburn has struck out at least 10 batters seven times.
- Auburn's win over No. 10 Oklahoma State last Saturday was the highest ranked non-conference opponent the Tigers have defeated at home since dropping No. 7 Arizona State 10-8 at Plainsman Park in 2011.
- Auburn has opened the season 10-3, a 3-game improvement over last season when the Tigers were 7-6 after 13 games.

**THE AUBURN SKIPPER**

Three-time Oklahoma Baseball Coaches' Association Coach of the Year (1998, 2001, 2010)  
 Four-time Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002)

Sunny Golloway, who enters his second season on the Plains in 2015, was named Auburn's 17th head baseball coach on June 14, 2013.

Golloway spent the previous eight seasons (2005-13) as head coach at the University of Oklahoma, where he led the Sooners to seven NCAA Regional berths, four NCAA Super Regionals and the 2010 College World Series.

**GOLLOWAY IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Golloway has been a proven winner at each of his head coaching stops. In 17 full seasons as a head coach - eight seasons each at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts as well as one at Auburn - Golloway has amassed a record of 709-365-1 (.660), including 12 seasons with at least 40 wins entering the 2015 season. He recorded a mark of 346-181-1 (.656) in eight-plus seasons as the Oklahoma head coach, an average of more than 40 wins per season. Prior to the 2013 season, Golloway's winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches.

**GOLLOWAY IN 19th SEASON AS HEAD COACH**

In 2013 at Oklahoma, Golloway led the Sooners to a 43-21 overall record, a Big 12 Tournament title, an NCAA Regional title and a Super Regional appearance. His final team at Oklahoma also produced a pair of All-Americans, including pitcher Jonathan Gray, the No. 3 overall pick in the 2013 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Under Golloway, Oklahoma posted the program's fifth-straight 40-win regular season in 2013, making Oklahoma one of a few programs nationally to win at least 40 games in five consecutive years. The Sooners finished third in the Big 12 standings while making the program's sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance (36th overall). OU finished the 2013 campaign ranked as high as No. 18 in the nation after falling to LSU in the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional.

The Sooners hosted three NCAA Regionals under Golloway while appearing in the program's only Super Regional appearances (2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013) and making it back to the College World Series in 2010 for the first time since 1995.

Golloway has 23 years' experience as a collegiate coach. He served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1992-95, helping lead the Sooners to three trips to the College World Series in those four years and a national title in 1994. He took over as head coach at Oral Roberts in 1996, and the Golden Eagles won the Mid-Continent Conference title and advanced to an NCAA Regional in each of his final six seasons at ORU.



**BIG LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Golloway has produced 83 MLB draft picks in his 18-year tenure as a collegiate head coach, and a total of 116 players have been draft selections in his 23 years in college baseball. He has also coached 95 all-conference selections between his three head coaching stops, including 61 All-Big 12 selections at Oklahoma from 2006-13.

Three of OU's recruiting classes under Golloway were ranked in the top 10 in Collegiate Baseball's national rankings, including the 2007 group of newcomers that was tabbed the fourth best in the country, the highest ranking since 1987 and tied for the second best in program history. At ORU, Golloway posted a mark of 335-156 (.682). He coached 16 All-Americans, three Freshman All-Americans and 26 of his ORU players were drafted or signed professional contracts. He was honored four times as Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year by his peers (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002).

Golloway is a former Team USA assistant and head coach of several collegiate summer teams. In the summer of 2002, he was selected to serve as pitching coach for the USA Baseball National Team. Under his direction, the team recorded the lowest ERA in its history. Golloway also helped team USA to a silver medal.

## NEWS & NOTES

### GETTING IN THE GROOVE

- In the first 13 games of the season, Auburn has scored 82 runs and has hit eight home runs and 40 extra base hits.
- In 2014, Auburn didn't score its 82nd run until the 18th game of the season. The Tigers didn't hit their eighth home run until the 22nd game last season or reach 40 extra until the 24th game.

### GRIER NAMED SEC POTW

- Anfernee Grier was named the SEC Player of the Week on March 2. He batted .500 with nine hits in 18 at-bats, including going 5-for-8 against No. 27 Georgia Tech and No. 10 Oklahoma State.
- Grier scored six runs and drove in three RBI. Also was a perfect 2-for-2 in stolen base attempts as Auburn posted a 3-1 record on the week.

### GRIER SETS THE TABLE

- Anfernee Grier has gotten a hit in each of the first 13 games of the season, extending his hitting streak to 15 games dating back through the final two games of the 2014 season.
- During his current 15-game hitting streak, which dates back to the final two games in 2014, Anfernee Grier is 27-of-60 (.450 BA) with 1 HR, 7 RBI, 17 R, 9 2B, 1 3B and 3 SB.

### KEEGAN DOMINATES

- In his last two starts against Georgia Tech and Alabama, Keegan Thompson has struck 21 batters in 14.1 IP against only one walk while posting a 2.51 ERA.
- His 12 punch outs vs. Alabama in the Capital City Classic were the most by an Auburn pitcher since Jon Luke Jacobs struck out 13 vs. Alabama State on Feb. 28, 2012 and the most vs. SEC competition since Grant Dayton had 12 vs. Mississippi State on May 2, 2008.

### OUCH!!!!

- Auburn's hitters have been hit by a pitch 89 times in 69 games under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Tigers were hit by a pitch a total of 92 times in the two seasons prior to him taking the reigns of the program (115 games).

### DEPTH TO SPARE

- Auburn has used 10 different batting orders in its first 13 games. The only player who has hit in the same spot in the lineup in every game is Anfernee Grier in the leadoff spot.
- Four different players have hit in the 4-hole, 5-hole, 8-hole and 9-hole while Auburn has hit seven different players in the sixth and seven spots in the lineup. Fifteen different position players have started at least one game.
- Auburn is 4-0 with a lineup of Grier, Haecker, Ebert, Robert, Tackett, Gillikin, Nulph, Logan and Deese, which is the only lineup Auburn has used more than once this season.

### RACKING UP THE K'S

- Auburn's staff has struck out more than a batter per inning on the season (124 Ks in 113.0 IP), including at least 10 Ks in six of the last eight games. On the season, Auburn has struck out at least 10 seven times.
- The Tigers rank third in the SEC with 124 total strikeouts this season.

### STOLEN BASE SUCCESS

- Auburn was 7-of-8 stealing bases against Jacksonville State and Oklahoma State. Prior to that, the Tigers had been successful on just two of their eight base stealing attempts on the season.

**NEWS & NOTES**

**BACK-TO-BACK JACKS**

- Against Alabama State, Auburn's Daniel Robert and Hunter Tackett hit back-to-back home runs in the fourth inning to cut its deficit to 3-2 in the game.
- It was the first time Auburn hitters had gone deep back-to-back since Cullen Wacker and Garrett Cooper did it at Texas A&M int he third inning on April 6, 2013.
- It was the first time the feat had occurred at Plainsman Park since Justin Fradejas and Dan Gamache went yard against Texas Southern on 4/27/11.

**TAKING CARE OF LEADOFF MAN**

- Auburn pitchers retired the leadoff batter in 20 of 27 innings in the three games against Binghamton.
- In those 20 innings, the Tigers allowed a total of five runs. In the seven innings that the leadoff man reached, Auburn allowed eight runs.
- Auburn did not allow a leadoff man to reach in the season opening shutout win.

**PINCH HIT SUCCESS**

- On the season, Auburn substitutes are batting .462 (12-of-26) and have scored eight runs. Those subs have also have nine RBI, two doubles and two triples.
- Leading the way off the bench is Damon Haecker (2-for-2) and Sam Gillikin (3-for-6). JJ Shaffer is 5-for-7 with three runs and three RBI.
- Auburn had success with pinch hitters against Binghamton. Players that pinch-hit had 12 official at-bats in the Saturday and Sunday games and recorded seven hits (.583).

**PITCHING DOMINATES RADFORD**

- Auburn pitchers allowed only one earned run to Radford in three games (24 innings of baseball). The staff only allowed three runs total and posted a team ERA of 0.38 for the series.
- Auburn's three earned runs allowed in the three-game series with Radford are the fewest allowed by the Tigers in a three-game series since holding Elon to just three runs from Feb. 28 - March 2, 2003. Auburn swept with 11-1, 3-1 & 7-1 wins.

**OPENING WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS**

- Auburn improved to 51-16 (.758) on Opening Day since 1949 and has won five straight openers. Coach Golloway improved his mark to 2-0 on opening day at Auburn. In 18 opening days as a head coach, he is 15-3 (6-2 at Oklahoma, 7-1 at Oral Roberts).
- The opening day shutout was the ninth for the Tigers since 1949.
- Junior OF Jordan Ebert homered in his first at-bat on Opening Day, becoming the first Tiger to accomplish that feat since Mike Bianucci against ETSU in 2008.
- Auburn's Keegan Thompson, Cole Lipscomb and Justin Camp combined for 15 Ks on Friday - the most since 2/28/2010.

**TIGERS IN THE DRAFT**

- Auburn has nine players on its team that chose to attend Auburn rather than signing a professional contract. Those nine players have been drafted a total of 10 times.
