At the Starting Line

► The 2009 Auburn cross country squads continue their 2009 campaign by traveling to the SEC Championship hosted by Ole Miss University in Oxford, Miss.

The meet will serve as a warm-up prior to the Nov. 14 NCAA South Regional Meet in Tuscaloosa. The forecast for the race looks to be perfect, with sunny skies and a high of 70 degrees being predicted.

► The women enter the race ranked behind Florida, Tennessee, and Georgia, who occupy three of the ton-four soots in the most recent NCAA South Begion of

three of the top-four spots in the most recent NCAA South Region poll. Alabama ranks a spot behind the Tigers with a No. 6 regional ranking, while the Vanderbilt Commodores are No. 7.

► For the fourth time in Four races, Holly Hnight was the top finisher for the Tigers at the NCAA Pre-National meet, coming in 21st place with a time of 21:10.4. Additionally, she was the top-SEC finisher in the race in what was her first 6k race of the season. Hnight will look to improve on her runner-up finish at the SEC Championship from a year ago as she finished 11 seconds behind meet champion Catherine White of Arkansas (20:18:52).

► Stephanie Barnes Finished second for the Tigers at Pre-Nationals for the third time on the year with a time of 21:32 to place 44th. She will look to hold steady as Auburn's No. 2 runner as she has been for much of the 2009 campaign. Senior Laurel Pritchard was Auburn's other top-20 finisher for the Tigers in last season's SEC Championship, as she clocked a 21:34:39 to place 20th. She has improved in each SEC Championship in her career, as she placing 37th as a freshman and 35th as a sophomore.

▶ Junior Allison Smith will run in her third championship meet, as she placed 81st as a freshman and 65th as a sophomore. Fellow junior Cathryn Albright will run in her second SEC Championship as she placed 84th with a time of 24:08.26.

<u>Men</u>

► The surging Auburn men's team moved up five spots in the most recent south region poll, as the team was ranked No. 8 prior to their sixth-place finish at NCAA Pre-Nationals. Alabama figures to be the team to beat, as the Crimson Tide are ranked No. 7 nationally and hold the No. 1 spot in the latest regional poll. Tennessee and Florida occupy the No. 4 and No. 5 spots in the regional rankings, followed by No. 7 Georgia.

► Junior Ben Cheruiyof, placed 10th at the Pre-National meet after he clocked a time of season-best 8k time of 24.03.5. Cheruiyot has now finished first in every Auburn meet this season. He enters Saturday's race knowing something about cross-country titles, as he captured the NJCAA National title for Rend Lake C.C. in 2007. The time is Cheruiyot's best of the season, as he previously ran a 25.05.4 at the Wisconsin adidas Invite.

► All-American Felix Hiboiywo, running in his second meet of the season at NCAA Pre-Nationals, placed 14th with a time of 24:08.4. Both runners finished No. 1 and No. 2 as SEC runners, as the closest finisher was Alabama's Julius Bor who placed 15th. Hiboiywo placed fourth at last season's meet with a time of 23:26.98, behind a pair of former teammates, Girma Mecheso who won the race [23:11.26] and Elkanah Hibet (23:20.35] who placed third.

▶ As a team last season, the Tigers finished second with 62 points, 30 points behind meet champion

► A pair of Auburn seniors will look to play a large role on Saturday in Jean-Pierre Weerts and Scott Novack. Novack will be competing in his fourth and final championship meet. In 2006, he was Auburn's top-finisher at the race with a 48th place finish, and placed 42nd as a sophomore in 2007. Last season, he played a key part in Auburn's runner-up finish, coming in as the Tigers fourth finisher with a 22nd-place finish.

► Weerts has been a steadying force for the Tigers this season, as he has finished been the Tigers second and third finisher on two occasions each. Last season, he placed 39th with a time of 25:22.22 at the league meet after missing the majority of the 2008 season due to injury.

Last Time Out:

► The men, running in the "blue" race at PRE-Nationals, were paced by the duo of junior Ben Cheruiyot and senior All-American Felix Hiboiywo, who ran their way to top-15 finishes. Cheruiyot placed 10th with a time of 24:03.5, while Hiboiywo placed 14th with a time of 24:08.4.

► The squad faced tough competition in their section, as defending national champions Oregon won the race with 79 points. Fellow SEC member Alabama was second with 114 points, followed by Northern Arizona (115 points), William & Mary (128 points) and Washington (183 points) before Auburn with 263 points.

Recapping the Wisconsin adidias Invitational

► Fresh off her SEC Athlete of the Week award, junior Holly Hnight took fifth overall in the race with a time of 17:18 in the 5H race and was the top SEC finisher. Junior Stephanie Barnes was Auburn's second finisher after coming in second with a time of 17:50, while senior Laurel Pritchard clocked a time of 18:49 place 70th, just ahead of junior teammate Cathryn Albright (18:52). The three teams Auburn defeated in the race were Texas A&M, Wisconsin, and Marquette to take 9th in the race out of 12 teams.

► The men were once again paced by junior Ben Cheruiyot in the 8k race with a time of 24:06 which was good enough to earn a seventh-place finish and a 4:50 mile pace. Cheruiyot was followed by senior John-Pierre Weerts who finished in 28th place with a time of 24:45. Senior Scott Novack was the 58th-place collegiate finisher with a time of 25:24. As the team, the Tigers finished 12th out of 13 teams.

► The women were once again led by junior Holly Knight, who placed 21st after she clocked a time of 21:32. Graduate student Steph Barnes was Auburn's second finisher after placing 44th with a time of 21:32. Laurel Pritchard ran her way to a 119th place finish after crossing the line with a time of 22:14.6. Auburn's final two finishers were Cathryn Albright (167th, 22:50.5) and Allison Smith (223rd, 23:43.6).

► The women placed 23rd as a team with 574 points in the "blue" section race. Colorado won the section with 94 points, and were followed by Florida St. [135] and Oregon with 169 points. The other SEC team in the race was Vanderbilt, who placed 25th with 615 points, two spots behind the Tigers.

▶ The Auburn cross country teams will enter meet five of the season with national and re-

gional rankings, the United States Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association announced earlier this week.

The men will enter this weekend's SEC Championship meet with a No. 24 national ranking and a No.3 south region ranking behind SEC foe Alabama. The women enter the race with a No.5 ranking in the south region, trailing Florida State as well as SEC opponents Florida and Alabama and Georgia.

Knight Named SEC Cross Country Athlete of the Week

► Junior Holly Knight was named the SEC Cross Country Athlete of the Week, the league announced Sept. 22. Knight placed second out of 92 runners at the Crimson Classic with a conference-leading 5k time of 17:16:30. Knight finished 3.5 seconds behind the race winner and 20 seconds before the race's third-place finisher in Alabama's Kelsey Johnson. With the second-place finish, Knight has now finished first and second in both of her races this season after winning the two-mile Troy Trojan Invitational to open the season with a two-mile time of 10:55:46.

Women Second, Men Third at Crimson Classic

► In the Crimson Classic hosted by Alabama, the men were led by Ben Cheruiyot for the second time on the young season, as the junior placed second with a time of 24:29.50. Also finishing in the top-10 were All-American Felix Kiboiywo and Jean-Pierre Weerts. The 2008 NCAA South Region champ finished with a time of 24:55 and placed fifth in his first race of the season, while Weerts was the 10th place collegiate finisher with a time of 25:36:40. Fellow senior Scott Novack placed 18th with a time of 26:04.50.

Also in action for the Tigers were sophomore Jeff Sanders who took 41st after clocking a time of 26:56. Freshman Kasey Hayes, who joined the team this past week, ran a 31:27.70 to place 90th overall.

Alabama took top billings on the men's side with 34 team points, while Tennessee placed second with 55 points. The Tigers earned 76 points, while Belmont finished a distant fourth with 153 points.

All-American Holly Knight took second in the race for the women, clocking a 17:16.90 in the 5K race. Knight was followed by Laurel Pritchard with a 17:58.10 and placed eighth, while Steph Barnes placed 10th with a time of 18:04.70 for the Tigers' third top-10 finish.

Also in action were juniors Allison Smith who took 26th with a time of 19:03.50, Cathryn Albright (19:10.20, 29th) and Freshman Grace Pritchard who placed 35th with a time of 19:25:40.

The women held their own against top-national competition, placing second as a team with 75 team points, behind Alabama who won the event with 43 points. Rounding out the top five was Tennessee with 88 points, Georgia Tech with 115 points, and Samford with 137.

Men, Women Open Season With Team, Individual Titles at Troy Trojan

▶ Both the men and women opened the season with team victories in the meet hosted by Troy University, as the women scored 19 team points to outlast the host institution, Troy, by 37 points. On the men's side, the Tigers finished 20 points ahead of the Trojans to take the team victory.

► Juniors Holly Knight and Ben Cheruiyot earned individual wins for the Tigers, respectively. Knight, who attained All-American status a year ago, crossed the line in the two-mile women's race with a time of 10:55:46. The time was good enough to narrowly outlast teammate Steph Barnes, who finished two seconds later with a time of 10:57:46 in her first race at Auburn.

For the men, Cheruiyot turned in a time of 15:24.29 in his first cross country race since capturing the 2007 NJCAA cross country title while at Rend Lake Community College. Junior Jean-Pierre Weerts took second place in the race with a time of 15:35.75.

Men Return Eight Letterwinners, Women Bring Back Five

► Highlighting the returnees on the men's side are All-American and 2008 NCAA South Regional Champion, senior Felix Hiboiywo, as well as classmate and fellow All-American Elkanah Hibet. Three other runners, seniors Scott Novack, Jean-Pierre Weerts, and junior Joby Peake who ran at last years NCAA Championships, return in hopes of making another trip to nationals. Joining the fold is Ben Cheruiyot, a former NJCAA champion, who could prove to be the latest standout from Rend Lake Community College that Auburn has established.

► The women return 2008 NCAA South Regional Champion and All-American Holly Hnight, who has her sights set on another All-American season, as well as defeding her regional championship from a year ago. Each of Auburn's No. 2 runners from last season in senior Laurel Pritchard and junior Amber Riley also return. Pritchard, a program staple for the past three seasons, returns for her senior season after finishing as AU's No. 2 runner in four meets a year ago, and seeks to improve on her 33rd place finish at the South Regional. Riley, who also was the No. 2 runner last season in four meets, placed 28th at South Regionals in 2008. New to the fold for the women is graduate student Stephanie Barnes of Clevedon, England, as well as Grace Pritchard, an AAU National Champion and USATF All-American, making this season a family affair for the Pritchard family.

Men Ranked No. 2; Women No. 4 in SEC Preseason Poll

► Auburn's men's and women's cross country teams were picked to finish second and fourth, respectively, in the announcement of the 2009 SEC Cross Country Coaches Poll by the league office. The men received a pair of first place votes, and return seven letterwinners along with All-American and 2008 South Region Champion, senior Felix Hiboiywo. The Tigers earned 23 points for the second place preseason ranking. The ranking comes on the heels of a second place finish at last year's SEC Championship.

On the women's side, Auburn returns 2008 All-American and South Region Champion, junior Holly Knight. As a team, the women ranked fourth with 45 points after finishing fifth at last season's SEC Championship. In all, the women return five letterwinners from a year ago.

MARK CARROLL Head Cross Country Coach First Season

Considered one of Ireland's greatest all-time athletes, first-year Head Coach Mark Carroll joined the Auburn track and field, and cross country program on August 7,

Carroll has most recently held the post of US Athlete Manager for Athletics Ireland, where he guided a trio of top Irish runners in Gareth Turnbull, Mark Christie and Liam Reale, while also training several other Irish runners stateside.

Throughout his world-class career, Carroll has competed in a variety of events, but has specialized mainly in the 3,000 and 5,000 meters. As a 19-year old, he earned the first major title of his career, capturing the 1991 European Junior Title in the 5H in Thessalonika, Greece.

Nine years later in 2000, he earned the title of European Indoor Champion in the 3K. In Budapest in 1998, he took third in the European Track & Field Championships to earn a bronze medal. In 1999, the Cork, Ireland, native was ranked No.1 in the world indoor mile ranking list with a time of 3:57.62.

Carroll is a four-time IAAF World Track and Field member, and holds the Irish-national record in the 3H (7:30:36), which was set in 1999, as well as the 5H set in 1998 with a time of 13:03:93. He also held the national record of 27:46:42 in the 10K that was set in 2000, a record that has since been broken.

He has participated in several marathons in the later stages of his career, highlighted by a sixth-place finish in the 2002 New York Marathon. His time of 2:10.54 sits only 61 second off of the Irish national record of 2:09.17.

Carroll missed the 1996 Atlanta Olympics due to injury, but participated in the 2000 Olympics in the 5K in Sydney, Australia, missing out on the final heat by one place. Four years later he competed in the 2004 Athens games, also in the 5K.

During his collegiate days at Providence College, the Corkman earned six All-American honors as well as seven Big East titles (cross country, 1,000 meters, 1,500 meters, 3,000 meters (twice), distance medley relay, and 4 x 800 meters). His crowning achievement as a Friar came at the 1995 NCAA Indoor Championships, as he won an NCAA Championship in the 5,000 meters.

Carroll holds a Coaching Ireland level two coaching certificate that he acquired in 2008.

Carroll married the former Amy Rudolph in October of 2005. Rudolph, an accomplished runner in her own right, is a two-time Olympian, as well as a U.S. Indoor Champion in the 3,000 meters.
