AUBURN SOCCER

The steward of the Auburn soccer program since 1999, Karen Hoppa has guided the club to seven SEC Western Division Championships and nine NCAA Tournament berths over the past 12 seasons, including a school record five consecutive from 2006-10, and moved into elite status in the history of Division I women's soccer at the end of last season. A head coach since 1993, she became the 51st women's soccer coach to reach 200 career wins and just the 10th female head coach to reach that milestone when Auburn claimed a 2-1 overtime win over Alabama in the final regular season match of 2010.

With a career mark of 200-137-30 (.586) between her coaching stops at Auburn and Central Florida, Hoppa is the dean of the SEC West and has guided the program to a 136-93-21 (.586) mark since arriving on the Plains, the second-highest win total at a single SEC school by any current coach in the league. Since the start of the 2001 season, two years after her arrival at Auburn, she has guided the program to ten 10-win seasons and an astounding 37-11-4 (.750) mark against SEC West teams.

Hoppa's teams are a model of athletic success on the field and academic success off it. A consistent post-season entrant, Auburn has advanced to the SEC Tournament 10 consecutive times, the third-longest active streak in the conference, while maintaining one of the highest team GPAs on the Auburn campus, collecting a NSCAA Team Academic Award for eight straight years as over 75 percent of last year's team was on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Hoppa has also seen a pair of her players earn CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition in Jenn Johnson (2007 & 2008) and Erin Hinson (2003) while Katy Frierson was named the NSCAA Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2010.

Owning an eye for spotting talent and the ability to coach players to the best of their ability, Hoppa has helped five different players collect a total of 12 All-America honors, has coached 13 All-SEC First Team selections, 13 All-SEC Second Team selections, a pair of SEC Players of the Year (Sarah Steinmann - 2002; Ronda Brooks - 2006) and two SEC Freshmen of the Year (Megan Rivera - 2001; Frierson - 2008). There have also been 34 All-Region honors handed out to Auburn players during Hoppa's tenure.

Hoppa continually brings in some of the top recruiting classes in the nation, which included the 15th-best class in 2002 and the 17th-best class in 2006, with each class winning three SEC West Championships during their time at Auburn.

The 2010 season saw Auburn win a seventh SEC Western Division Championship, the most by any school in the West as no other school has won more than three. Finishing the year 11-8-2, 5-4-2 SEC, the club advanced to the NCAA Tournament as an at-large selection for a school-record fifth straight time. Again the accolades poured in at the end of the season as Frierson (eight goals, 12 assists, 28 points) and Julie King (four goals, two assists, 10 points) were each named First Team All-SEC and defensive stalwart Sammy Towne was voted to the second team. Frierson and King were also on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Season while Frierson was one of 15 players named to the semifinal list for the prestigious Hermann Trophy, a first for an Auburn student-athlete.

The 2009 season was the fourth straight in a string of nine NCAA Tournament appearances during Hoppa's Auburn tenure as the team was selected as an at-large team for the 2009 dance. Riding the deft scoring touch of First Team All-SEC midfielder Frierson (five goals, 10 assists, 20 points) and Second Team All-SEC forward Rebecca Howell (eight goals, one assist, 17 points), the team racked up 109 points, the second straight season Auburn has tallied at least 100 points offensively. With a high-octane offense pacing the team, the defense relied on the work of Second Team All-SEC defender Towne and SEC All-Freshman goalkeeper Amy Howard to limit its opponents to just 27 goals in 22 matches for a 1.16 goals against average. After a run to the semifinals in the SEC Tournament for the first time since the 2005 team appeared in the finals, the team then traveled to Tallahassee, Fla., for the NCAA Tournament before bowing out to California in a 2-1 overtime loss, finishing the season 10-9-3, 6-5-0 SEC.

Hoppa guided Auburn to its sixth SEC West Title in the last eight seasons in 2008, earning the school's third consecutive NCAA Tournament bid, and its second hosting opportunity, going 12-9-2 on the year, which included an incredible 9-3-0 mark at home and a 7-3-1 mark in conference play. Freshman midfielder Frierson and senior goalkeeper Allison Whitworth both had historic seasons in 2008 as Frierson was named to the All-SEC First Team and the SEC Freshman of the Year while Whitworth was also named to the All-SEC First Team, was the conference's Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was Auburn's first-ever WPS Draft pick. Frierson led the team in goals (nine) and points (25) while Whitworth established school records for

saves in a season (132) and a career (356) before the FC Gold Pride selected her in the eighth round of its draft in St. Louis, Mo.

The 2007 season produced Auburn's sixth NCAA Tournament trip with a 10-8-2 mark and a runner-up finish in the SEC West. Sophomore forward Caitlin King had one of the finest seasons in program history, collecting 13 assists and finishing the year with 23 points. The 13 assists tied a school record while her 23 points ranked eighth all-time. Whitworth also continued to blossom under the watchful eye of Hoppa, tying the school record for saves (102) for a second consecutive season and finishing with a 1.16 goals against average, seventh-best at Auburn.

Hoppa moved into elite company in the sport of women's soccer when she won her 150th career match on September 3, 2006, against William & Mary in a year in which the Tigers reclaimed what had been theirs for four straight seasons but eluded them in 2005 - the SEC Western Division Title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Keyed by a defense that allowed just 14 regular-season goals, the Tigers marched onto yet another SEC West title - the fifth under Hoppa. Leading the backline was SEC Defensive Player of the Year Ronda Brooks (the first from an SEC West school) while Whitworth played the entire season between the pipes, following in the footsteps of Hoppa as a tenacious goalkeeper and leader on the field.

Despite battling injuries to key players throughout the course of the 2005 season, Hoppa guided the Tigers to within one win of their fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and Auburn's first SEC Tournament title. Auburn knocked off third-seeded Florida and seventh-seeded Kentucky in the first two rounds of the conference tournament before losing a heart-breaker to top-seeded Tennessee, 1-0. At the conclusion of the tournament, Hoppa's players had picked up the Tournament MVP award (Brooks) and three more all-tournament selections (Ashley Eason, Jada Stewart, Kristin Stewart) to go along with the regular-season selections of Brooks to the All-SEC First Team, Eason to the second team and Jenn Johnson to the all-freshman team.

In 2004, Hoppa led the Tigers to its only undefeated season in SEC play with an Auburn-best 9-0-2 record, the team's fourth-consecutive SEC West title and fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament. The team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season, hosting the first and second rounds for the first time in school history at the Auburn Soccer Complex. At the conclusion of the season, the Tigers found themselves ranked 19th in the NSCAA/adidas National Rankings and 13th in the final Soccer Buzz poll, the highest final ranking in school history.

Finishing out their senior seasons in 2004, Chrissy Culver, Megan Rivera, Sarah Steinmann and Jenn Walters each earned All-SEC honors and Rivera became the Tigers' first four-time All-American, owning every Auburn goalkeeper record and three SEC records at the conclusion of her career.

Hoppa led the Tigers to their first Southeastern Championship title in 2002, three seasons after the team finished at the bottom of the conference standings. For her efforts in leading the team to a school record 15-5-2 mark in 2002, she was named as the SEC Coach of the Year.

Hoppa helped lead her team to the second round of the NCAA Tournament two years in a row, which is also a feat never reached by an Auburn team. Early in the 2002 season, Hoppa achieved the 100th win of her career in a 4-0 win over South Alabama on Sept. 15.

In 2003, Auburn finished 14-4-3 on the year including a second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament and ended the season with a No. 16 ranking. The ranking marked the first time Auburn was ranked at the conclusion of the season.

Hoppa kept busy away from Auburn as well in the summer of 2002. The head coaching veteran was named the United States National Team's Youth Goalkeeper Coordinator where her duties took her around the globe during the summer. Hoppa was a coach for the U19 National team in the inaugural FIFA Women's U19 World Championships helping lead the team, and 2004 Auburn senior Megan Rivera, to the World Championship title over host team Canada.

Hoppa led the Tigers to a 11-8-1 record in 2001, including an appearance in the championship match of the Southeastern Conference Tournament. Among the 11 victories were upsets over No. 6 Virginia, No. 16 Tennessee and No. 19 Georgia. The Tigers also received their first-ever national ranking, reaching No. 19 at one

point in the season.

In 2000, her second season at Auburn, Hoppa led the Tigers to a then school record 13-7-0 record with 11 newcomers, a solid group of returners and only two seniors. In 2000 Hoppa became just the 12th person to be inducted into the University of Central Florida Athletic Hall of Fame for her accomplishments as both an All-America goalkeeper and an academic All-American. Her off-season accomplishments did not end there either. Hoppa was then asked to join the Under 18 United States National Team in Bulgaria for the Albena Cup, a full national team tournament. She accepted the invitation and served as an assistant and goalkeeper coach for the U.S. Team that lost on penalty kicks in the championship game.

Hoppa also added assistant regional coach to her resume in 2000. She led the U16 Regional Team to an undefeated mark on a tour of Germany, Holland, Belgium and France in April and then traveled to Rhode Island, as an assistant coach for the U16 and U18 National team at the U.S. Soccer Festival. She then served as an assistant coach at the National Camp in California for U17 and U18 teams.

Prior to her coming to Auburn, Hoppa served as UCF's head coach from 1993-1998 and spent 1991 to 1993 as an assistant coach for the Golden Knights. All told, Hoppa spent a total of 12 years at UCF as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach. She led the program to two NCAA tournament appearances as a player, including a trip to the Final Four in 1987, five Trans America Athletic Conference titles and a trip to the 1998 NCAA Tournament as a coach.

Hoppa posted a 64-44-9 record at UCF, winning five TAAC titles including four in a row from 1993-96. In her final season at UCF, Hoppa guided the squad to a 12-8 mark and a perfect 4-0 in the Trans America Athletic Conference en route to the school's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1991. For her efforts, Richter (Hoppa) was named TAAC Coach of the Year.

Hoppa has also been very involved in the Olympic Development Program and various youth soccer programs in the United States. Prior to her appointment as the Region III head coach in February 2009, she spent two years as the assistant coach in the same Region. In August of 2007, Hoppa took seven Alabama ODP players to Denmark to play in the Dana Cup in Hjørring, Denmark, with the Fortuna Club as she has been coaching the Alabama ODP team for the 1990 birth year for the past two seasons and has had four players selected to the Regional Pool and two to the National Pool. In addition to her duties during the summer of 2002, she has spent time with the USYSA National teams, including preparing youth goalkeepers for international competition and assisting the team during the Adidas Cup in Orlando, Fla. From 1990 to 2001, Hoppa was also the head goalkeeper coach and regional staff coach for the USYS Region II ODP team.

A holder of a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "A" coaching license, she served on the coaching staff of the Florida Youth Soccer Association from 1990 to 1999. In 1997 she was the head coach of the Florida Women's State Select team that won the Southern Regional.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Central Florida, Hoppa was an assistant for the

Golden Knights for two seasons, 1991-93, and also served as an assistant for the nearby Lake Brantley High School boy's team during that same time. Hoppa also served as an assistant for the girl's team at Lyman High School in Longwood, Fla., for two years (1989-91). The Lyman team won the state championship in Hoppa's second year.

Hoppa's success at Central Florida wasn't limited to the sidelines, however. She made a name for herself as a one of the greatest goalkeepers in UCF and NCAA history. A three year starter from 1987-90, Hoppa allowed just 30 goals (0.594) in 48 career games in assisting her squads to a 43-13-7 record during her tenure. During her four years, Central Florida made two NCAA appearances, advancing to the Final Four in 1987 and the quarterfinals in 1988. Her 30 goals allowed, 0.594 goals against average, and 30.5 shutouts are still UCF career records.

As a senior, Hoppa was named the 1990 Adidas/ISAA Goalkeeper of the Year, the NCAA Goalkeeper of the Year and was a finalist for the Hermann Award. She helped UCF to a 9-4-3 record, including a 2-2 tie with national power North Carolina.

As a junior, she was named to the 1989 Soccer America MVP Team after leading Central Florida to a 11-1-2 record. In 14 games, her team posted 11 shutouts and allowed just four goals all season.

An excellent student as well, Hoppa graduated Magna Cum Laude with a degree in psychology, a 3.7 grade point average, and was a finalist as a senior for the prestigious Honda Award. She was also recognized as an Adidas/ISAA Scholar-Athlete during her junior and senior years.

During her collegiate career Hoppa was inducted into several national honor societies including Golden Key, Omicron Delta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi and Psi Chi. She also served on the 1991 College Student-Athlete Project: Women and Athletics Sub-Committee.

A three-sport standout at Naperville Central High School in Naperville, Ill., Hoppa earned All-America soccer honors and was a member of the National Youth Team in 1986. The Naperville native was also a member of the United States Olympic Festival's North squad in both 1987 and 1990. Along with her soccer success, Hoppa also competed on the softball and basketball squads.

In 1997 Hoppa returned to the field as a player, as a member of the Tampa Bay Extreme, a member of the United Systems of Independent Soccer Leagues (USISL) "W League." For two seasons, Hoppa was the starting goalkeeper for the Extreme. Hoppa is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and served as a volunteer club coach with the Seminole Soccer Club for five years (1989-93). She was a member of the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee (1995-97) and also served on the NSCAA Division I Women's Soccer Southeast Ratings Board (1996-98).

Hoppa (formerly Richter) married Scott Hoppa on Dec. 14, 2002. The couple resides in Opelika, Ala., and have a daughter, Bailey, born in 2011.

Amy Berbary

A veteran of six NCAA Tournament appearances throughout her prolific playing and coaching career, Amy Berbary begins her fourth season on the Auburn sidelines as one of Karen Hoppa's assistants in 2011. A standout in the SEC as a player and now as an assistant coach, she has helped Auburn win a pair of SEC Western Division Titles and advance to three straight NCAA Tournaments during her three years on the Plains.

Berbary came to Auburn in the spring of 2008 after a four-year run at Dayton and her offensive knowledge has paid immediate dividends. In her three seasons at Auburn, the team has scored 110 goals, which is the most in a three-year period since the team scored 113 goals from 2002-2004, and has also topped the 100-point total in each season, a first since the 1995-97 campaigns.

Berbary's arrival coincided with the arrival of Katy Frierson to the Auburn program and the offensive-minded midfielder has taken to the lessons taught by Berbary, earning First Team All-SEC honors three times so far, the only player to garner that recognition in each of her first three years in the Auburn program.

The 2011 season resulted in a SEC West Championship and a NCAA Tournament berth as the offense tallied 109 points on 34 goals and 41 assists. At the conclusion of the season, Frierson was a First Team All-SEC selection, a NSCAA All-America and a semi-finalist for the Hermann Trophy, the first in Auburn history.

The results in 2010 produced a Second Team All-SEC selection in forward Rebecca Howell, who led the team with eight goals, and a First Team choice for Frierson, who led the team with 20 points. Three of Auburn's forwards finished the season with double-digit points as senior Caitlin King had 17 and freshman Mary Coffed had 10 to go along with Howell's 17 points.

In 2008 Berbary help guide the team to its most goals (41), assists (53) and total points (135) since the 2002 SEC Championship team scored 46 goals and 144 points and the 2000 team collected a school-record 68 assists. Two of Auburn's forwards, Kara Kasten and Stephanie Fransoso, collected career-highs in goals under Berbary's tutelage as the team finished the year third in the SEC in goals scored and points.

After joining the staff at Auburn, Berbary immediately immersed herself in the Alabama Olympic Development program, coaching six players in the 2008 Dana Cup in Hjørring, Denmark, a position Auburn Head Coach Karen Hoppa had taken on in 2007. She has also served as an Ohio South ODP State coach for three years, coaching the 91 and 92 Ohio South Team in England in March of 2008. Berbary was a member of the Region II and Region III ODP region staffs in the summer of 2010 and continues to play a major role in the Alabama state ODP program.

Berbary joined Mike Tuckers's Dayton staff for the 2004 season and helped the Flyers to a four-year winning percentage of .691 and a NCAA Tournament appearance in her first season. She coached two Atlantic-10 Offensive Players of the Year in Reba Sedlacek (2004) and Mandi Bäck (2007) and seven All-Conference First Team selections. After taking over the role of recruiting coordinator, which she also handles at Auburn, she landed four A-10 All-Rookie selections and all of her recruiting classes were ranked both regionally and nationally.


Prior to her four years at Dayton, Berbary was the head coach at Gainesville High

School in Gainesville, Ga., for two seasons, guiding her teams to back-to-back regional championships and a 19-0-0 regional record. Her teams finished 14-4-1 and 13-5-1, respectively, and she was twice named the Region 7AAA Coach of the Year as well as the 2004 Women's Soccer Coach of the Year by the Gainesville Times.

As a student-athlete at Georgia, Berbary finished her career third on UGA's all-time goal scoring list (26) and points (58), leading the team in scoring for three straight seasons. A forward, she helped Georgia to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 1998 and the Second Round in 2001, graduating with a degree in Health Promotion and Wellness Education in 2002.

Originally from Alpharetta, Ga., where she played for the Tophat Club program, Berbary has also served as the assistant varsity coach at Oconee County High School in Watkinsville, Ga. She is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and holds a USSF "B" License.

Keidane McAlpine

One of the top tacticians in the collegiate coaching ranks, Keidane McAlpine returns for a sixth season as an assistant coach on Karen Hoppa's staff at Auburn. In his five previous seasons on the Auburn sidelines, the Tigers have advanced to five straight NCAA Tournaments and have won the SEC Western Division crown three times.

McAlpine has worked with every part of the Auburn offense and defense during his time on Hoppa's staff and this year he will again focus on the backs and goalkeepers, tutoring a young bunch of talented players.

For the past three seasons, McAlpine, who was hired on July 20, 2006, has focused primarily on the attacking players, specifically focusing on possession in the Auburn attack, while also handling scouting of upcoming opponents and assisting Hoppa with the goalkeepers. During that time he has played an important role in the development of midfielder Katy Frierson, who has been named to the All-SEC First Team three times and was also tabbed a NSCAA All-America and a Hermann Trophy semi-finalist in 2010.

Turning his attention to the midfield in 2008, he was instrumental in Frierson's run to a First Team All-SEC and SEC Freshman of the Year selection as she led the team in both goals (nine) and points (25). In addition, Auburn's midfielders accounted for half of the team's goals (21 of 41) in 2008 and 27 of the team's 53 assists, led by Gabi Rivera's nine. In 2009 the Auburn midfielders accounted for 31 percent of the team's goals and 44 percent of the team's assists as the team tallied 35 goals and 39 assists, marks that were essentially equalled in 2010 with 34 goals and 41 assists.

Charged with guiding the offense in 2007, he helped Caitlin King achieve a record-setting 13-assist campaign and Becca Howell's 19 point output as a sophomore, a 14-point increase over her freshman season.

In his first season on the Plains in 2006, McAlpine was crucial in the development of the Auburn attack as he helped a pair of offensive players, Kristin Stewart and Jenny Zazour, garner All-SEC accolades for the first time in their careers.

Before coming to Auburn, McAlpine spent the previous five years as the head women's coach at Birmingham-Southern where he took a Panthers' program that was competing at the NAIA level the year before his appointment to a Big South championship and an NCAA Tournament berth in 2004, transforming BSC into a winner at the Division I level from the get-go. In his first year alone, he guided the Panthers to a 5-0-1 mark against Big South Conference foes in their first provisional year in the conference.

McAlpine helped develop 12 all-conference selections and a Big South Freshman of the Year recipient as the Panthers went 40-48-11 (.460) in the first five seasons in NCAA play.

Before becoming the program's head coach, McAlpine served as an assistant at BSC from 1998-2000. During his three-year tenure as an assistant with the program, the Panthers compiled a record of 42-17-1 (.708) and enjoyed their most successful season in 2000. In that campaign, the Panthers went 18-4-1 and made their first appearance at the NAIA National Tournament, claimed the Region XI Championship, the TranSouth Conference Regular Season Championship and the

TranSouth Conference Tournament Championship.

Active in Region III ODP for many years, McAlpine was the head coach for the U-13 group and was on the U-14 staff in the summer of 2010 after joining the U-13 staff in the summer of 2009.

McAlpine holds a National "A" Coaching License from the United States Soccer Federation and a National Goalkeeping License, which is uncommon for a field player by trade to acquire. He has also been actively involved as a coach with the Alabama Youth Soccer Association Olympic Development Program and several club teams. In the summer of 2004, he was selected as a staff coach for the USYSA Region III squad.

McAlpine began his soccer career at Birmingham-Southern in 1992. He was a four-year starter on the BSC men's team, serving as a captain in 1996. During that season, the Panthers finished runner-up in the NAIA National Tournament after advancing to the semifinals the previous season.

After graduation, McAlpine spent the 1999 season playing for the Tennessee Rhythm of the A League.

McAlpine, a Huntsville native, earned a bachelor's degree in music business with a minor in computer science from Birmingham-Southern in 1997.

After finishing up a very successful playing career last fall, which included her being named Second Team All-SEC in both 2009 and 2010, Sammy Towne returns to Karen Hoppa's program for the 2011 season as a volunteer assistant coach.

A four-year starter on the backline, Towne played in 84 matches, tied for the second-most in school history, with 79 starts, which is 10th all-time at Auburn. A team captain and the team Defensive MVP as a junior and again as a senior, she won the Barbara Camp Unsung Hero Award as a sophomore, which goes to the player who consistently makes a difference on the field, but rarely gets the recognition she deserves. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 academic year, she was awarded the Female Inspirational Athlete of the Year awarded as she overcame a collapsed lung twice, including surgery after the second episode, prior to her senior year. She returned to the pitch, playing in 20 games in 2010, while helping the Tigers to a NCAA postseason appearance.

Towne will assist Hoppa and the rest of the coaching and support staff in both on-field training and off-the-field office duties while she completes her undergraduate degree.

A native of Dix Hills, N.Y., Froehlich is married to the former Stephanie Barnett of Huntsville, Ala. The couple has a son, Jackson (5) and the family resides in Auburn.

AUBURN SOCCER COMPLEX

The Auburn University Soccer Complex was constructed in 1994, with the opening game in the stadium coming in a 2-1 win over the University of Mobile on Sept. 3, 1994.

Auburn defeated Georgia Southern 5-1 on Sept. 27, 1994, on Stadium Dedication Day. President William V. Muse, Athletic Director David House and Board of Trustee member Bessie Mae Holloway presided over the dedication ceremonies at halftime.

The AU Soccer Complex had an original seating capacity of 600 and was expanded to seat 1,500 in 1995. There was another addition in the 2001 season as the Tigers added lights to the complex and remodeled the press box. In the summer of 2002, the drainage system was renovated and permanent bench covers and built-in restrooms were added.

Prior to the start of the 2005 season, the Tigers added a Daktronics scoreboard which includes video, shots, saves, corner kicks and fouls in addition to score and time of play.

In 2004, Auburn hosted not only the SEC Tournament, but was awarded its first NCAA Regional, hosting Birmingham Southern, Clemson and Washington. Auburn repeated that in 2008 when it played host to the First and Second Rounds of the NCAA Tournament, joining Belmont, Florida State and Mississippi Valley State.

Today, the AU Soccer Complex houses the six-time SEC Western Division Champion Auburn Tigers. During the 2002 season, head coach Karen Hoppa collected her 100th career victory at the AU Soccer Complex in a 4-0 win over South Alabama.

Heading into the 2011 season, the Tigers hold a 105-45-11 (.686) record at the AU Soccer Complex and posted a streak of 23 games without a loss on their home field (20-0-3) from 2001-2004. The last time Auburn suffered a loss at the AU Soccer Complex before the streak started was a tough 1-0 loss on Oct. 7, 2001 to Georgia. The streak was then broken by No. 6 Kansas on Sept. 19, 2004 in a 1-0 double-overtime loss.

Located across the street from the Auburn Athletic Complex, the soccer stadium's natural turf playing surface is 120 yards long, by 78-yards wide.

The Tigers played their inaugural season of intercollegiate soccer in 1993 at Wilbur "Bodie" Hinton Field on the Auburn campus before moving into its new home in 1994. AU defeated Spring Hill 4-0 at "Bodie" Hinton Field in the first intercollegiate soccer match in Auburn history.
