## 2021 Postseason Notes

### 2021 AUBURN FOOTBALL WRAPUP

» Auburn finished the season with a 6-7 overall record, going 3-5 in SEC play, 4-3 at home, 2-3 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites. This was the Tigers' 129th season of football.

### THE HARSIN DEBUT

» Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron. Harsin now holds an 82-31 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009. Auburn's 142 points in the first three contests set a new program record for the most points in a head coach's first three games.

### TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn scored 30 or more points six times this season including 60 and 62 point efforts in its first two games of the season. This was the third season Auburn scored at least 60 points in each of its first two games, along with 1932 and 1922. The Tigers have scored 30+ points in three of their last five SEC games.

» Auburn overcame double-digit deficits to win consecutive games for the first time since 2010. The Tigers trailed Georgia State 24-12 before scoring the game's last 22 points in a 34-24 victory, highlighted by a 13-play, 98-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

At LSU, Auburn was down 13-0 in the second quarter before rallying for a 24-19 victory, the Tigers' first win in Baton Rouge since 1999. That was the Tigers' largest come-from-behind win on the road since the 2010 Iron Bowl. The game-winning drive totaled 92 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 1-yard Jarquez Hunter TD run with 3:11 remaining.

» Auburn's 1,151 yards of total offense through the first two games to start the season were the most in recorded history, surpassing the 2009 season (1,145).

» Since 2001, Auburn is 161-33 (.829) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 217-41-1 (.843) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 557-61-9 (.896) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 350-10 (.972) when scoring 30 points, 176-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

### KICKOFF COVERAGE

» TE John Samuel Shenker set the Auburn single-season records by a tight end for catches and receiving yards. He had 33 receptions for 413 receiving yards

» Auburn was third in the SEC in net punting (41.79) and ranked 20th nationally in that stat. Oscar Chapman was second among the league's punters with a 44.1 average, 30th nationally

» The SEC coaches selected cornerback Roger McCreary as a first team all-conference honoree; linebacker Zakoby McClain and edge Derick Hall were second team all-SEC selections. Jarquez Hunter is on the SEC all-freshman team

» Auburn was fourth in the SEC and 17th nationally in team TFL at 7.39 per game (966 total TFL for the season)

» The Tigers ranked 13th nationally in 4th-down defense percentage (.370)

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms are CoSIDA first team Academic All-Americans

» Auburn's wins over Arkansas and Ole Miss were the Tigers' first wins over ranked teams in consecutive games since the 2013 season

» All-America cornerback Roger McCreary, a Reese's Senior Bowl invitee, was among 18 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award; he earned first team All-America honors from The Athletic, AP and ESPN

» With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He was the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms are first team CoSIDA Academic All-America selections for 2021. Carlson was also a 2020 first team honoree.

» Auburn football had 17 representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. **AD HONOR ROLL**

» Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 16 players honored in 2020-21, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Luke Deal, Tyler Fromm, Trey Lindsey, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Tommy Nesmith, Bo Nix, Ben Patton, David Shannon and Brooks Walton.

» Auburn has scored in 117 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

» Auburn piled up 613 total yards against Akron, 20th most in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards vs. Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in an opener in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).

» The duo of Jarquez Hunter and Tank Bigsby averaged 130.2 rushing yards per game this season (1,692 total yards) and totaled 13 TD on the ground.

Hunter ranked 21st among all FBS players and eighth among freshman averaging 6.67 yards per carry, 11th on Auburn's single-season yards per carry list.

Bigsby had five 100-yard games this season, while Hunter had two.

» With 1,099 yards this season, sophomore Tank Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games this season; that gave him four consecutive 100-yard rushing games back through last season, the first Auburn RB to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

The 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards, he ranks 20th with 1,933 career yards and 15 career scores.

Against Alabama State, he rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries; his 51-yard run in the third quarter was a career long.

Against Akron, Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win. He added 102 yards and two scores at Penn State and 140 yards rushing with a TD vs. Ole Miss.

Bigsby's 164 yards rushing on 22 carries at South Carolina with a 7-yard touchdown was the second-largest yardage total of his career.

» In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

» True freshman Jarquez Hunter ranked ninth among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 597 yards.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run tied for seventh longest in the nation this season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

» Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

» Shaun Shivers became Auburn's 49th career 1,000-yard rusher against Georgia; he finished with 1,020 career rushing yards, 49th among Auburn career rushing leaders.

Shivers' five receptions for 38 yards at LSU were both career highs for the senior; he eclipsed those marks with six catches for 40 yards at Texas A&M.

Shivers had 22 receptions for 163 yards and one receiving score for the season.

» Auburn averaged 240.1 passing yards per game, the fourth-most productive season through the air in Auburn history. With 3,121 passing yards, the Tigers posted the third-best total in Auburn history.

» Quarterback Bo Nix passed for a career-high 377 yards on 27-of-41 passing with two touchdowns in the Tigers' loss to Mississippi State last week. Nix suffered an ankle injury during the second half and will miss the remainder of the 2021 season.

Transfer QB T.J. Finley made his first start in an Auburn uniform at South Carolina, his sixth career start. As a true freshman in 2020 at LSU, Finley threw for 941 yards on 80-140 passing with five touchdowns and five interceptions. He rushed for 34 yards on 29 attempts with one touchdown.

Finley led LSU to wins over South Carolina and Arkansas. At South Carolina (10/24/20), Finley completed 17-21 passes for 265 yards and two touchdowns (one interception), as the Tigers won, 52-24.

The South Carolina contest was the first time in 60 games, dating back to the 2016 season, that Auburn's starting QB wasn't named Jarrett Stidham or Bo Nix. The last time an Auburn signal caller besides Stidham or Nix started was Sean White against Oklahoma in the 2017 Sugar Bowl.

» Nix went 628-1057 (59.4%) in his career for 7,251 yards and 39 passing scores. He ranks second in career pass completions (628) and attempts (1,057), third in career passing yardage (7,251) and tied for fifth in career TD passes (39).

Against Mississippi State, he had a career-high 377 passing yards (27-41) with two TDs. His 377 yards were seventh most in AU history and the most since Nick Marshall's school-record 456 passing yards at Alabama in 2014.

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against Akron. In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

» Nix rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another in the win over Ole Miss. He was 22-30 passing, gaining 276 yards with a TD pass to Jarquez Hunter and two TD runs.

Nix had nine career games with a passing and rushing TD, passing Cam Newton (7) for the most such games among Auburn quarterbacks since 2000.

» In Auburn's win at LSU, Nix made things happen on the ground and through the air, rushing for 74 yards and a TD, and showing off his fancy footwork on a pair of fourth-down conversions where he scrambled from multiple would-be tacklers, finding Tyler Fromm for a touchdown and Demetris Robertson to keep alive a late second-quarter drive. Nix earned SEC offensive player of the week honors.

Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

» Nix threw a school record 256 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to last year's Iron Bowl before his interception against Georgia. The junior had three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including the previous school record 250 consecutive passes without an INT from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.

» Nix made 34 consecutive starts at quarterback from the 2019 season opener vs. Oregon through this year's Mississippi State game.

That tied for the second most consecutive starts by an Auburn signalcaller since 1969 with Phil Gargis (1974-76); the career record in consecutive QB starts is 45 by Stan White (1990-93).

» T.J. Finley engineered a 13-play, 98-yard go-ahead scoring drive against Georgia State, culminating in a 10-yard fourth-down touchdown pass to Shedrick Jackson with just 0:45 remaining. Only six Auburn scoring drives since 1970 have been longer than 98 yards.

» Tight end John Samuel Shenker's 33 catches this season set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn season record for tight ends.

» In the Birmingham Bowl, Shenker also moved up the list in career numbers. Shenker is seventh in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 48, and he is fifth in career tight end receiving yardage at 571.

» Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times this season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

» Shedrick Jackson caught the go-ahead 10-yard pass from T.J. Finley with 0:45 remaining in the Georgia State game, one of four receptions against the Panthers.

Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled just 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

For the season, Jackson had 40 receptions for 527 yards and one score.

» Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score, and was Auburn's leading receiver against Penn State (66 yds) and Georgia State (76 yds).

Hudson led the squad with 44 receptions for the season for 580 yards and four scores.

Against Mississippi State, Kobe Hudson had eight catches for 107 yards while Ja'Varrius Johnson had four for 102 yards, both career-high yards for each. It was the first time Auburn had a pair of 100-yard receivers in a game since Sammie Coates (206) and Duke Williams (121) at Alabama in 2014. It was the sixth time in Auburn history that two Tigers had 100 receiving yards in the same game.

Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips.

» Auburn has had 31 players taken in the first round (most recent in 2020 Derrick Brown 1/7 and Noah Igbinoghene 1/30) and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 17 of the last 21 Pro Bowls, and Auburn has had at least one former player in 13 of the last 16 Super Bowls, including Super Bowl LV starters Carlton Davis and Jamel Dean for the world champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers

» Grad transfer Demetris Robertson was an important addition to the Auburn offense, adding 37 receptions for 489 yards and four touchdown catches, along with a rushing score.

Robertson scored his first Auburn touchdown in the second quarter against Alabama State, a 6-yard reception from Bo Nix. His second TD reception was 28 yards in the third quarter and he added a 36-yard rush for a third score, the first Auburn player with three TD in a game since JaTarvious Whitlow vs. Mississippi State in 2019. The last Tiger with two TD catches in a game was Seth Williams vs. Kentucky last season.

Robertson had a team-best six receptions for 60 yards in the win at LSU and a 71-yard TD catch at Arkansas.

**FOR THE DEFENSE**

» With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, linebacker Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He's the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016.

» Auburn did not allow a fourth-quarter point in any of its three SEC wins (at LSU, at Arkansas, vs. Ole Miss). In those three SEC wins, Auburn outscored its opponent 27-0 in the fourth quarter.

» Auburn held consecutive opponents Ole Miss and Texas A&M without a passing TD. It's the first time the Tigers have held consecutive opponents without a passing touchdown since 2017, when they did it against Georgia Southern and Clemson.

It was the first time Auburn has gone consecutive games without allowing a passing TD when both games were against SEC opponents since 2006, when the Tigers held Mississippi State and LSU without a passing score.

» Sophomore Colby Wooden was named SEC co-defensive lineman of the week with four tackles and two sacks in the win at Arkansas. He repeated that weekly conference award with five tackles against Ole Miss.

» The 10 points allowed by Auburn in the first two games of the season marked the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in any two-game span since giving up three points each vs. Ole Miss and Tennessee Tech in 2007.

That was the fewest points Auburn allowed in the first two games of a season since the Tigers opened the 1996 season with shutouts of UAB and Fresno State.

The shutout of Alabama State was the 244th all-time shutout for Auburn.

» The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards). LSU rushed for 33 yards, Alabama State gained only 46 yards on the ground, Mississippi State gained 72 rush yards, Alabama gained 71 and Penn State was held to 94 yards rushing.

» Zakoby McClain led the nation with 113 tackles in 2020, averaging 10.3 per game. That average ranked third in the SEC and 19th nationally. He was the first Auburn player to average 10 tackles per game since Dontarrious Thomas in 2001 (10.2 avg.).

» McClain, a Lott IMPACT Trophy quarter-finalist, had 13 career double-figure tackle games (five last season) and he led the Tigers in tackles 14 times in his career, including seven tackles in the opener vs. Akron, 10 against Alabama State, 12 at LSU, 15 at Arkansas, 14 vs. Ole Miss and 13 vs. Mississippi State.

The junior finished with 267 tackles for his career, the fourth-most tackles recorded by any Auburn player since 2000.

With 96 tackles to date in the 2021 campaign, McClain fell just short of becoming Auburn's first player with 100+ tackles in back-to-back seasons since Takeo Spikes in 1996 (119) and 1997 (136).

» Auburn was fourth in the SEC and ranked 17th nationally in tackles for a loss, recording 96 this season (7.39/gm).

Derick Hall (12.5), Eku Leota (10.0), Smoke Monday (9.0), Colby Wooden (8.5), Zakoby McClain (8.0), T.D. Moultry (7.5) and Marcus Harris (6.0) led the Tigers individually; 23 different Auburn defenders had a hand in at least one TFL this season.

» Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 61 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 173 total TD during that 78-game span (2.22 per game).

» Bednarik Award semifinalist Roger McCreary led the SEC and ranked seventh nationally with 1.3 passes defended per game (2 interceptions and 14 PBU).

» With 38 career passes broken up, McCreary is second in career PBU among Auburn players since 1996; the leader in that group is 2004 Thorpe Award winner Carlos Rogers (40 from 2001-04).

With 14 PBU for the season, McCreary tied with Rodney Crayton (1999) and Jonathon Mincy (2013) for second among single-season leaders; the recordholder is Chris Davis, with 15 in 2013.

» The Tigers had nine interceptions for the season as a team.

Donovan Kaufman recorded his first career interception in the South Carolina game, with a 38-yard return.

Jaylin Simpson's key fourth-quarter interception vs. Ole Miss was the first of his career and Auburn's fifth pick of the season.

Bydarrus Knighten's interception of a fourth-down LSU pass with 1:09 remaining sealed Auburn's win at Tiger Stadium, and Knighten added another pick in the Iron Bowl.

Smoke Monday's 36-yard interception for a touchdown with 0:31 remaining sealed the win over Georgia State; it was the senior's third career pick six (also Tennessee, 2020, and Alabama, 2019).

Roger McCreary, who had a pick six against Alabama State, was the first Tiger to record interceptions in consecutive games since Jeremiah Dinson vs. Southern Miss and Mississippi State in 2018.

McCreary scored his first career touchdown with a 35-yard interception return against Alabama State; his interception at Penn State gives him six picks for his career.

In 2020, McCreary was the first Auburn player to record three interceptions in a season since Joshua Holsey in 2016.

Chandler Wooten and Nehemiah Pritchett recorded interceptions in the Birmingham Bowl.

» Auburn is 63-27 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-10 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 11-15 when it fails to force a turnover.

The Tigers lost only 11 turnovers this season in 898 plays: seven fumbles and four interceptions. That tied for 10th nationally.

Auburn's total of four interceptions thrown for the season tied for sixth among all FBS teams.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

» Senior preseason All-America kicker Anders Carlson suffered a season-ending knee injury at the end of the Mississippi State game. He is the younger brother of former Tiger All-America kicker Daniel Carlson.

The game at South Carolina was the first time since 2013 that someone not named Carlson served as the primary placekicker.

The Carlson brothers have combined to attempt Auburn's last 182 field goals and 308 of its last 313 extra points.

Before the South Carolina game, Auburn's last field goal made by someone other than Anders or Daniel was a 22-yard field goal in the 2014 BCS National Championship game by Cody Parkey.

Current kicker Ben Patton converted a PAT earlier this season and made two during the 2019 campaign. Former Tiger Sage Ledbetter also hit 2-2 PATs in 2019.

» Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, ranks third in Auburn career scoring with 352 points.

He ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 7.7 points per game this season and was fifth in the league with 1.40 field goals made per game.

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fourth in career PAT made (151) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (67). He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT this season.

Carlson made 20 of 22 field goal attempts in 2020, and has made 36 of his last 39 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

His older brother Daniel, a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders.

» Against Mississippi State, Carlson had his national leading streak of 14 consecutive games with a field goal snapped.

» Carlson ranks second in career field goals made (67); he's among five AU kickers to make 15+ FG in multiple seasons:

» With 826 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Nehemiah Pritchett's 165 kickoff return yards against Georgia State ranked seventh-best for a game in Auburn history. Pritchett's 72-yard return was the longest by Auburn since Noah Igbinoghene (96 yards) in the 2020 Outback Bowl.

» Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (166) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Second among SEC punting leaders, Oscar Chapman had a then-career-high seven punts at Texas A&M. His four punts inside the 20 against the Aggies also marked a career high.

His 63-yard punt in the third quarter was the third-longest of the Aussie's career. With his 65-yarder vs. Ole Miss, it marked the first time that Chapman has recorded 60+ yard punts in back-to-back games in his career.

Against Alabama, Chapman punted 10 times, averaging 42.7 yards per punt with four inside the 20.

» Auburn ranked third in the SEC in net punting (41.79) and 20th nationally in that stat. Oscar Chapman was second in the SEC with a 44.1-yard punting average, 30th nationally.

» Barton Lester blocked a punt against Alabama State, Auburn's first of three blocked kicks this season.

Colby Wooden blocked an Alabama State field goal attempt; it was recovered by Nehemiah Pritchett for a 80-yard return and his first career score. It was Auburn's first blocked field goal for a touchdown since Neiko Thorpe vs. Kentucky in 2009 (69 yards).

Auburn blocked a punt and a field goal in the same game for the first time since the 2013 Alabama game.

Caylin Newton blocked a Georgia State punt returned by Barton Lester for a touchdown; Newton also tipped a Mississippi State punt. The Tigers have recorded seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.

#### N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

» Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

#### RANKINGS

» Auburn is 116-172-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 54-45-2 at home against ranked teams, 29-74-2 on the road and 33-53-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn is 56-104-3 all-time against AP top 10 teams (27-29-2 at home, 29-75-1 away from Auburn).

» The Tigers are 92-137-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (44-36-2 at home, 29-66-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 60-55-3 overall (30-11-1 at home, 19-34-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 334-126-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 191-34-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 142-91-4 all-time.

When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 82-80-4 (37-14-1 at home, 22-43-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

#### MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» Auburn made its 46th bowl appearance all-time, and its ninth straight, tying the school record for the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling nine straight years from 1982-90. Auburn is 24-20-2 all-time in bowl games.

» Auburn QB Bo Nix (ankle) and PK Anders Carlson (knee) both suffered season-ending injuries against Mississippi State. Nix started 34 consecutive games and is in the top three in nearly every school career passing category; Carlson is third at AU in career scoring, points kicking and field goals made.

» Edge defender T.D. Moultry played in 59 Auburn games, most on the current squad and setting the Auburn record of most games played in a career, breaking the previous mark of 54 set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10).

» On the 2021 Auburn roster, 51 players have at least one college start to their credit, 27 on offense and 24 on defense.

Thirteen Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrus Knighten (48 overall; 43 games at SE Missouri State), Brandon Council (38 overall; 24 at Akron), Caylin Newton (26 overall; 25 at Howard), Bo Nix (34), Nick Brahm (33), Owen Pappoe (29), John Samuel Shenker (27), Smoke Monday (24), Colby Wooden (24), Roger McCreary (23), Brodarious Hamm (20), Keiondre Jones (20) and Zakoby McClain (20).

» Auburn has an all-time record of 338-88-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .794 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 60 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest this season against Alabama.



» Auburn outscored opponents 56-10 in the fourth quarter in its six wins this season, including 27-0 in the Tigers' three SEC victories. In those three SEC wins, Auburn has outgained its opponents 366-185 in the final period.

Overall, the Tigers outgained their opponents 656-305 in the fourth quarter in six victories this season and scored six offensive TDs while allowing just one score in the final quarter of those games.

» On the 2021 Auburn regular season roster, 29 players had earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best in the FBS and most in the SEC. Six more received bachelor's degrees during December, 2021, commencement.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 333-262-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 142-64-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-197-12 overall.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 257-70-6 (.781). Auburn has won 15 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.

# BRYAN HARSIN » HEAD COACH



## HARSIN FILE

>> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.

>> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 82-30 overall as a head coach - including one season at Arkansas State - and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.

>> His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.

>> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

>> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

>> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

>> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

>> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 431 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 338, losing 88 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .789 against some of the best teams in college football.

GAME 1 // AUBURN 60, AKRON 10 // SEPT. 4, 2021 // SEC+|ESPN+ // JORDAN-HARE STADIUM (83,821) // AUBURN, ALA.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the 2021 season opener.

Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on first-and-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead. Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Bigsby eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in his career on his second carry of the second half, a 32-yard pickup. Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-0 lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

Making his first start in his 50th Auburn game, T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles. Marquis Burks made two of Auburn's six sacks. Moultry, Derick Hall, Colby Wooden and Marcus Harris also registered sacks.

The Tigers scored on their first eight possessions and did not punt until the 5:11 mark of the third quarter. Auburn welcomed the return of full stadium capacity, with 83,821 on hand to witness Harsin's debut.

Demetris Robertson scored three touchdowns and No. 25 Auburn scored on defense and special teams to shut out Alabama State 62-0 on a record-setting Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Robertson caught a pair of touchdown passes from Bo Nix before scoring on a 36-yard reverse, the latter two TDs coming in Auburn's 35-point third quarter.

Colby Wooden blocked a field goal that Nehemiah Pritchett returned 80 yards for a touchdown, and Barton Lester blocked a punt that led to a field goal to help Auburn take a 20-0 halftime lead.

Roger McCreary returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown to put Auburn ahead 41-0 midway through the third quarter.

For the second straight game, Tank Bigsby and Jarquez Hunter both rushed for more than 100 yards, with Hunter gaining most of his on one carry, a 94-yard burst that marked the longest run in Auburn history and gave the Tigers a 55-0 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Hunter led Auburn with 147 yards on eight carries. Bigsby added 122 yards on 11 rushes, helping the Tigers pile up 364 rushing yards on 39 carries, an average of 9.3 yards per carry.

Nix completed 9 of 17 passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns. Finley was 2-for-2 for 66 yards and a touchdown.

Anders Carlson kicked a pair of field goals to give Auburn a 6-0 lead after the first quarter. Nix and Robertson connected from 6 yards to put the Tigers on top 13-0 early in the second quarter.

T.J. Finley relieved Nix in the third quarter and threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Johnson Jr. Zakoby McClain led Auburn with 10 tackles, his eighth career double-digit performance. The Tigers recorded 11 tackles for loss, including sacks by T.D. Moultry and Eku Leota.

The Tigers held the Hornets to 46 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.6 yards per rush. Auburn has scored 60 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1932.

A crowd of 82,745 enjoyed a sunny afternoon on the Plains, in which Auburn honored first responders on the 20th anniversary of 9/11.

Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 Saturday at Beaver Stadium.

Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left. Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38-yard line with 38 seconds left and no timeouts.

Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent defense as time expired.

Tank Bigsby recorded his third 100-yard game of the season, rushing for 102 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns. Freshman Jarquez Hunter added 63 yards on nine carries.

Auburn's defense stopped Penn State on fourth-and-1 on the opening drive to give the Tigers possession on Auburn's 44. Bigsby rushed for 18 yards on the Tigers' first play and Anders Carlson gave Auburn a 3-0 lead with a 45-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions scored on Sean Clifford's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jahan Dotson to cap an 88-yard drive to lead 7-3 with 2:24 left in the first quarter.

Auburn answered with an 11-play, 75-yard drive, converting three third downs. Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards on third-and-2, then on third-and-12, Nix hit Kobe Hudson for 36 yards to PSU's 13.

Bigsby took over from there with three consecutive runs, completing the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run on third-and-1 to regain the lead for Auburn, 10-7 at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter.

Penn State responded with a 91-yard touchdown drive, reclaiming a 14-10 lead on Clifford's 2-yard pass to Brenton Strange with 1:23 remaining in the half.

Penn State took advantage of an Auburn turnover on the opening play of the second half, driving 20 yards in four plays and taking a 21-10 lead on Tyler Warren's 2-yard rush.

Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including Bigsby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third quarter.

Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 28-20 on Noah Cain's 3-yard run to cap a 75-yard drive with 10:48 to play, but Chandler Wooten's tackle for loss on third down forced a punt that led to the first of Auburn's two late scoring chances. Wooten led Auburn with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Nix was 21 of 37 for 185 yards, adding 29 rushing yards. Clifford completed 28 of 32 attempts for 280 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

T.J. Finley's 10-yard touchdown pass on fourth down with 45 seconds left capped a 98-yard drive to give No. 23 Auburn a 34-24 comeback victory Saturday over Georgia State on Homecoming.

Backed up at its 2-yard-line and trailing 24-19 with 3:23 to play, Jarquez Hunter gave Auburn breathing room with an 18-yard run. Finley, who relieved Bo Nix in the second half, hit Kobe Hudson for 15 yards on third-and-11, then Finley rushed for 16 yards to cross midfield. Finley connected with Elijah Canion for 12 yards to GSU's 30, then hit John Samuel Shenker for 19 yards to the 11 with 1:19 remaining.

Three plays netted 1 yard, setting up the stage for Finley and Jackson's fourth-down heroics. Facing a GSU blitz, Finley avoided multiple rushers, stepping up in the pocket and firing off-balance to a leaping Jackson in the end zone to give Auburn a one-point lead in the final minute.

Finley hit Hudson for a 2-point conversion that gave Auburn a 27-24, then after an incomplete pass, Smoke Monday returned an interception 36 yards to secure victory for the Tigers.

Trailing 24-12 in the second half, Caylin Newton blocked a punt that Barton Lester recovered in the end zone for a touchdown that cut GSU's lead to 24-19 with 4:44 left in the third quarter.

Auburn's defense forced four consecutive three-and-outs and shut out the Panthers in the second half.

Chandler Wooten made a career-high 12 tackles. T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high nine tackles, including two of Auburn's 10 tackles for loss.

Anders Carlson kicked four first-half field goals to account for Auburn's scoring before intermission.

After Georgia State took a 3-0 lead, Nehemiah Pritchett returned the kickoff 72 yards to set up Carlson's game-tying 41-yard field goal.

Auburn's defense delivered a three-and-out, leading to Carlson's 23-yard field goal that put the Tigers on top 6-3 after the first quarter.

The visiting Panthers produced three touchdown drives in the second quarter, the first on a 12-yard pass from Darren Grainger to Jamari Thrash to retake a 10-6 lead.

Carlson's third field goal, a 28-yarder, trimmed GSU's lead to 10-9 with 9 minutes left in the half.

Grainger threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Roger Carter to give Georgia State a 17-9 lead.

Carlson's fourth field goal with 2:54 left in the second quarter made it 17-12, but Tucker Gregg's 50-yard touchdown run gave Georgia State a 24-12 halftime lead.

Bo Nix avoided four LSU rushers before finding Tyler Fromm for a 24-yard pass on fourth-and-2 for Auburn's first points, Jarquez Hunter scored a late touchdown, and Bydarrus Knighten's interception sealed Auburn's 24-19 comeback victory over LSU Saturday before 97,717 at Tiger Stadium.

Hunter capped a 92-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to give Auburn its first lead with 3:11 to play. Hunter's 44-yard run was the drive's key play. The freshman rushed for 65 yards on six carries.

Knighten intercepted LSU on fourth-and-6 with 1:09 to play to secure Auburn's first victory at Tiger Stadium since 1999. Trailing 13-0 late in the second quarter, Nix rolled right, scrambled left and found Fromm running free in the end zone near the Auburn fan section, a highlight-reel play that energized the visitors' sideline.

Auburn trimmed LSU's lead to 13-10 before halftime on Anders Carlson's 49-yard field goal. Nix completed 23 of 44 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown and added 74 rushing yards and a TD on 12 carries. Cade York kicked a pair of field goals in the third quarter to give LSU a 19-10 lead heading to the final quarter.

Nix scored on a 5-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive and pull Auburn within two points at 19-17.

Tight ends figured prominently in Auburn's offense, with John Samuel Shenker making five catches for 102 yards and Fromm adding three for 40.

Zakoby McCain led the Tigers' defense with 12 tackles. Derick Hall added eight tackles and 1.5 sacks. After allowing a touchdown on LSU's first possession, Auburn kept LSU out of the end zone the rest of the game.

LSU built a 13-0 lead on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Max Johnson to Kayshonn Boutte and a pair of York second-quarter field goals before Nix's razzle dazzle.

Auburn defeated Georgia State the previous week on a fourth-down touchdown pass from T.J. Finley to Shedrick Jackson.

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns and Auburn took the lead on a defensive score in the third quarter to help the Tigers beat No. 17 Arkansas 38-23 Saturday at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Leading 31-23, the Tigers put away the game with a 12-play, 75-yard drive that chewed up 6 minutes and 11 seconds, culminating on Nix's 23-yard touchdown run with 2:30 to play.

Nix completed 21 of 26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns, adding 42 rushing yards on five carries and a TD.

After Oscar Chapman's 57-yard punt pinned the Razorbacks at their 11-yard-line, Colby Wooden's second sack set up third-and-15 at the Arkansas 6. Derick Hall sacked Jefferson in the end zone, forcing a fumble that Marcus Harris recovered for a touchdown to give Auburn a 21-17 lead. Harris made another huge play on the next drive, stopping Jefferson short of a first down on fourth-and-3 at Auburn's 29-yard-line.

The Tigers scored on the next play when Nix connected with Demetris Robertson for a 71-yard touchdown pass to put Auburn ahead 28-17 with 4:16 remaining in the third quarter.

The Razorbacks drove 75 yards in 13 plays, scoring on a 10-yard touchdown run on the final play of the third quarter.

Roger McCreary broke up the Razorbacks' pass on a 2-point attempt, preserving Auburn's 28-23 lead as the fourth quarter commenced.

After Anders Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 31-23 lead with 10:35 to play, Auburn forced a three-and-out, giving Auburn possession at its 25-yard-line with 8:41 to play, setting the stage for Nix's touchdown run.

Auburn marched 75 yards on six plays on the game's opening drive with Nix completing all five of his pass attempts for 72 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 7-0 Tigers lead.

After Arkansas kicked a field goal to trim Auburn's lead to 7-3 after the first quarter, the Tigers made it 14-3 with 9:59 left in the half on Tank Bigsby's 1-yard touchdown run. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 36 yards, including a 19-yard completion to Landen King on third-and-4.

Bigsby rushed for 17 yards to the Razorbacks' 1-yard line before scoring two plays later. Bigsby led the Tigers with 68 rushing yards on 18 carries.

Late in the half, the Razorbacks drove 84 yards on 12 plays, scoring on KJ Jefferson's 11-yard touchdown pass to Treyton Burks with 18 seconds left to trail 14-10 at halftime before 73, 370 at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Zakoby McClain led Auburn with 15 tackles while fellow senior linebacker Chandler Wooten added 10.

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns, Tank Bigsby rushed for 140 yards and No. 18 Auburn kept No. 10 Ole Miss out of the end zone in the second half in the No. 18 Tigers' 31-20 win Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Jaylin Simpson's end zone interception in the fourth quarter preserved Auburn's two-score lead and the Tigers stopped the Rebels three times on fourth down inside Auburn's 20-yard line in the second half.

The Tigers' defense held Ole Miss (6-2, 3-2) to a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter, forcing two three-and-outs. Zakoby McClain led the way with 14 tackles and two sacks.

In SEC West wins over LSU, Arkansas and Ole Miss, the Tigers have outscored opponents 27-0 in the fourth quarter.

Anders Carlson's 28-yard field goal gave Auburn a 31-20 lead with 10:52 remaining in the fourth quarter to culminate an 11-play, 76-yard drive that included a 24-yard Bigsby run and a 24-yard pass from Nix to Kobe Hudson.

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its five first-half drives to take a 28-17 halftime lead.

The Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays on their opening possession with Nix rushing for an 11-yard touchdown. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 33 yards while rushing for 18 yards, including another of his patented, sack-avoiding scrambles.

Picking up where he left off in Auburn's win at Arkansas, Marcus Harris set the tone defensively with a tackle for loss on the Rebels' first play, one of seven TFLs for the Tigers' defense.

After Ole Miss kicked a 29-yard field goal on its first drive, Auburn answered with a 10-play, 72-yard touchdown drive. Bigsby began the drive with a 26-yard run, then went airborne on third-and-goal from the 1 to put Auburn ahead 14-3 late in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Ole Miss drove 88 yards in 15 plays, cutting Auburn's lead to 14-10 on Snoop Conner's 13-yard touchdown run.

Auburn answered quickly, gaining 35 yards on Nix's pass to Demetris Robertson and scoring on Nix's 7-yard touchdown run to lead 21-10 with 6:20 left in the half.

Ole Miss quarterback Matt Corral led the Rebels on a 75-yard drive, scoring on an 11-yard touchdown run to trim Auburn's advantage to 21-17 with 2:42 remaining in the second quarter.

The Tigers executed their two-minute offense to perfection, driving 69 yards in 11 plays and scoring on Nix's 9-yard pass to Jarquez Hunter with 11 seconds left in the half.

Nix completed 22 of 30 passes for 276 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 30 yards and a pair of TDs.

In a game that featured no offensive touchdowns, No. 13 Texas A&M beat No. 12 Auburn 20-3 Saturday in front of 109,835, the second largest crowd in Kyle Field history.

Texas A&M's Michael Clemons recovered a fumble and returned it 24 yards early in the fourth quarter for the game's only touchdown. The Aggies added a two-point conversion pass to lead 17-3.

After a long Texas A&M run, Donovan Kauffman forced a fumble that Roger McCreary recovered at Auburn's 5-yard line. Auburn (6-3, 3-2) drove 41 yards but came up 1 yard short on fourth down to give the Aggies possession at the Tigers' 46 with 6:50 to play.

Ladarius Tennon's 4-yard tackle for loss on the first play of the second half led to a three-and-out. Tennon registered a career high eight tackles. Smoke Monday led Auburn with nine tackles.

The Tigers then drove 56 yards on 10 plays but missed a chance to take a lead when a 33-yard field goal attempt was wide right.

Texas A&M (7-2, 4-2) used a 49-yard completion to set up a 29-yard field goal to take a 6-3 lead with 3:39 remaining in the third quarter.

Seth Small's third field goal gave the Aggies a 9-3 lead with 13:40 left in the game. Small's fourth field goal made it 20-3 with 3:16 remaining.

After Texas A&M kicked a field goal on its first drive of the game, Auburn answered with a 14-play drive of its own, with Shaun Shivers twice moving the chains on third down, first with a 10-yard catch-and-run on third-and-9, then a 7-yard run on third-and-5.

Auburn earned first downs on three consecutive plays beginning with the Shivers run, then Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 12 yards, followed by Nix's 11-yard rush, setting up Anders Carlson for a game-tying 32-yard field goal with 15 seconds left in the first quarter.

Auburn's defense forced back-to-back three-and-outs in the second quarter, but the Tigers were unable to capitalize on favorable field position.

Auburn's defense prevented the Aggies from converting on all six third-down attempts in the first half, leading to a 3-3 halftime tie. The Aggies finished 3-for-13 on third down while Auburn was 4-for-16.

Bo Nix completed 20 of 41 passes for 153 yards. Tank Bigsby rushed for 69 yards on 15 carries, a 4.6 average per rush. Shenker led Auburn with 50 receiving yards on four catches. Shivers caught all six of his targets for 40 yards.

Tank Bigsby rushed for 164 yards and a touchdown, and Shedrick Jackson set career highs with 111 receiving yards on seven catches, but South Carolina defeated Auburn 21-17 Saturday at Williams-Brice Stadium.

With 2:11 to play in the fourth quarter, Auburn forced a punt that South Carolina downed at the Tigers' 20-yard line, but replay overturned the call on the field, ruling that the ball first contacted an Auburn player, giving the Gamecocks possession and allowing South Carolina to run out the clock.

In his first start, T.J. Finley completed 17 of 32 passes for 188 yards and a touchdown. Derick Hall recorded Auburn's fourth sack to force a punt early in the fourth quarter, but the Tigers' drive stalled at midfield. After forcing a three-and-out on the opening possession of the second half, Auburn drove 63 yards in nine plays to take a 17-14 lead on Ben Patton's first career field goal, a 37-yarder.

Bigsby's 29-yard run, Auburn's longest gain of the night, set up Patton's field goal. Bigsby averaged 7.5 yards per rush on 22 carries, logging his fifth 100-yard game of the season and ninth of his career. South Carolina answered with a 67-yard touchdown drive, taking a 21-17 lead on Jason Brown's third touchdown pass, a 7-yarder to Josh Vann on third-and-goal at the 4:57 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn drove 67 yards in 15 plays, including a 19-yard pass to Jackson on fourth-and-16, but the Tigers missed a 25-yard field goal attempt with 14:10 remaining in the game.

Auburn built a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, forcing a three-and-out on South Carolina's first possession thanks to Eku Leota's third-down sack that gave the Tigers possession at midfield after a Gamecocks punt.

Auburn drove 49 yards in six plays, scoring on Finley's 10-yard touchdown pass to Demetris Robertson for a 7-0 lead. Finley was 3-for-3 for 36 yards on the drive.

Donovan Kaufman ended South Carolina's next drive with his first career interception at Auburn's 1-yard line, returning it 38 yards.

The Tigers then marched 61 yards on seven plays, with Finley connecting twice with Jackson for 42 yards to set up Bigsby's 7-yard touchdown run that made it 14-0 late in the first quarter.

With a ferocious pass rush and precision coverage, Auburn kept No. 3 Alabama out of the end zone until the final minute before falling 24-22 in quadruple overtime Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Iron Bowl.

Bryce Young's two-point pass to John Metchie accounted for the winning points after Auburn went first and threw an incomplection in the fourth overtime.

The first overtime in Iron Bowl history began with Alabama's 6-yard touchdown pass from Young to Slade Bolden to give the Crimson Tide its first lead of the night at 17-10. Auburn answered when Landen King scored his first career touchdown with a spectacular one-handed catch of T.J. Finley's 5-yard pass to tie at 17-17 after Ben Patton's extra point.

Patton delivered again in the second OT, giving Auburn a 10-0 lead with a 49-yard field goal. Will Reichard's 38-yard field goal sent the game to a third extra period with a 20-20 tie.

In the third overtime, a one-play shootout from the 3-yard line under new NCAA rules, Young hit Metchie for a 22-20 lead but Auburn answered when Finley rolled right and tossed back to his left to John Samuel Shenker to tie it at 22-22, sending the game to the decisive fourth OT.

Auburn took advantage of a short field by driving 39 yards in four plays for the only touchdown of the first half. On third-and-14, Finley threw a back-shoulder pass to Demetris Robertson for 29 yards, Auburn's longest gain of the game. On the next play, Finley found Kobe Hudson in the slot 2 yards behind the line of scrimmage. Hudson faked out one defender and outraced another to the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown that put the Tigers ahead 7-0 with 6:50 left in the first half.

Patton's 33-yard field goal gave Auburn a 10-0 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter. Alabama's next drive ended when Bydarris Knighten intercepted Young at Alabama's 45-yard line.

On their next possession, the visitors drove to Auburn's 19, but a mishandled hold denied Alabama a chance to attempt a 36-yard field goal, preserving the Tigers' 10-0 lead after three quarters.

After Derick Hall ended Alabama's next possession with a sack on fourth-and-2, the Crimson Tide intercepted Auburn's deflected pass on the next play at Alabama's 42-yard line.

Alabama drove to Auburn's 7, but Hall made another sack on third-and-goal, forcing a 30-yard field goal at the 8:44 mark of the fourth quarter. Hall recorded three of Auburn's seven sacks, a career best.

Tank Bigsby rushed for 22 yards to start Auburn's next drive, which ended when Shedrick Jackson downed Oscar Chapman's punt on Alabama's 2-yard line.

After driving to their own 46, Alabama went for it fourth-and-1, but the Tigers stopped running back Trey Sanders for no gain. Alabama used its remaining timeouts to stop the clock, Chapman and Jackson again pinned the Crimson Tide at their 3-yard line with 1:35 to play.

Alabama drove 97 yards on 12 plays, scoring the game-tying touchdown with 24 seconds left on Young's 28-yard pass to Ja'Corey Brooks, sending the game to overtime.

John Samuel Shenker broke Auburn's single-season records for tight end receptions and yards but Houston scored on a late fourth-quarter touchdown pass to win the Ticketsmarter Birmingham Bowl 17-13 Tuesday at sold-out Protective Stadium.

After allowing a touchdown on Houston's opening drive, the Tigers kept the Cougars out of the end zone until Most Valuable Player Clayton Tune threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Jake Herslow with 3:27 remaining in the game.

Needing to drive 75 yards for a game-winning TD, Tank Bigsby gained 8 yards on Auburn's first play but three straight incompletions ended the possession.

Trailing 10-6 in the third quarter, Auburn drove 78 yards on 11 plays to take a 13-10 lead on T.J. Finley's 12-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Hudson on third-and-goal, helping the Tigers overcome the Cougars' 10-0 first-half lead.

Finley completed 19 of 37 passes for 227 yards and a touchdown. Bigsby led Auburn with 96 rushing yards on 19 carries and 68 receiving yards on five catches, including a career-long 51-yarder that led to Auburn's first points on Ben Patton's 35-yard field goal late in the first half.

The Tigers made two interceptions and a fourth-down stop in the second half, helping turn a 10-3 halftime deficit into a 13-10 lead.

After Hudson's touchdown, Nehemiah Pritchett intercepted Tune but a long return was negated by a targeting penalty on a block by Smoke Monday, costing Auburn 50 yards of field position.

In his final Auburn game, Chandler Wooten led the Tigers with 12 tackles, including a fourth-down stop early in the fourth quarter, and an interception on a double pass midway through the final period.

Shenker made two clutch grabs to set the records, a third-down conversion in the first half and a 41-yard gain on Auburn's touchdown drive that passed Fred Baxter's 391 yards in 1991.

Trailing 10-3 at the half, Auburn came out hot to start the third quarter. After Finley began the drive with a 9-yard pass to Shedrick Jackson, Bigsby rushed for 15 and 32 yards on successive plays to set up Patton's 35-yard field goal that trimmed Houston's lead to 10-6.

Houston drove 87 yards on 12 plays on the game's opening possession, taking a 7-0 lead on Tune's 5-yard touchdown pass to Alton McCaskill.

In the second quarter Auburn drove 55 yards on 12 plays but video review overturned a fourth-and-3 completion at Houston's 21-yard line. The Cougars then drove 45 yards and took a 10-0 lead on Dalton Witherspoon's 52-yard field goal.
