AROUND THE SEC

- Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 10 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.
- Ten of the SEC's top 25 scorers from 2009-10 return for 2010-11. Georgia's Trey Thompkins is the league's top returning scorer at 17.7 points per game.
- Fifteen of the league's top 25 rebounders from last season return for 2010-11. Georgia's Trey Thompkins is the SEC's top returner with 8.3 boards per game.
- Four players that earned All-SEC honors from the league's coaches are on SEC rosters for 2010-11. Georgia's Trey Thompkins earned first team All-SEC accolades while Florida's Erving Walker, Ole Miss' Chris Warren and Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor were second team selections.
- Each of the 96 conference games will be televised live as part of the SEC's historic 15-year agreements with CBS Sports and ESPN that began in 2009-10. Almost half of the SEC's league games will be distributed nationally with ESPN or ESPN2 televising 27 contests, ESPNU showing seven and CBS Sports five. The SEC's games on the ESPN family of networks will be exclusively branded as the "SEC on ESPN."
- National coverage of the SEC Basketball Tournament has been expanded with the semifinals and championship game broadcast on ESPN on ABC. The SEC Network will televise the first two rounds of the tournament which this year will be played March 10-13 in Atlanta.
- Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last eight editions of the NCAA Tournament.
- The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 20 of the last 21 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.
- Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.
- Southeastern Conference coaches have led their teams to 37 conference championships and 25 conference tournament championships while collecting 29 conference coach of the year honors over the course of their head coaching careers.
- Seven SEC players were chosen in the 2010 NBA Draft. Kentucky's John Wall, who was the No. 1 overall selection, led five SEC players that were chosen in the first round of the draft. Over the last three NBA Drafts, 21 SEC players have heard their names called.

2011 SEC Tournament

March 10-13 • Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga.

The 2011 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament will be held in a familiar setting as the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga., again plays host to this event. The Georgia Dome, a world-class facility with basketball seating configuration of 26,000, serves as the site of the 12-team tournament for the ninth time in 14 years and the 10th time overall in league history. The Georgia Dome has hosted the SEC Tournament in 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008 and has been the site of the NCAA Tournament Final Four in 2002 and 2007. The 2011 event will mark the 13th time Atlanta has played host to the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament (1933, 1934, 1987, 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008).



The winner of the 11-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds, conference championship and division titles are determined by the 16-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded by their divisional finish and features Eastern Division-Western Division matchups in every game should the higher seed win each contest.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year lay-off (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2010 tournament will be the 51st in league history and the 32nd since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 23 of the last 30 tournament champions have advanced to at least the Sweet 16 with five of the last 14 going on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 26 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee ranks third with four. Florida and Mississippi State each have three championship trophies. Arkansas, Auburn, Georgia, LSU, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.

Media Tabs Florida as 2011 SEC Champion

Florida was predicted to win the 2011 Southeastern Conference men's basketball championship in voting by a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Each SEC school selected media members that cover their team and additional writers from across the nation were selected by the conference office to form the voting panel.

The Gators are coming off a 21-13 season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. They earned eight first-place votes, topping Mississippi State which earned three votes. Tennessee and Kentucky each received two votes and Georgia garnered one vote as SEC Champion. Florida returns all five starters, including Kenny Boynton, Erving Walker, Chandler Parsons, Alex Tyus and Vernon Macklin while adding one of the top recruiting classes in the nation.

Florida was the media's favorite to win the East with 110 total points (13 first-place votes), ahead of second-place Kentucky's 95 points (three first-place votes). Georgia (72 points) and Tennessee (71 points) were separated by just one point while Vanderbilt and South Carolina rounded out the top six.

In the West, Mississippi State's 118 total points (18 first-place votes) were ahead of Ole Miss' 84 points (two first-place votes). Alabama was picked third with 82 points. Arkansas, LSU and Auburn round out the top six in the West.

Georgia junior Trey Thompkins was the choice of the media for SEC Men's Basketball Player of the Year with 18 votes. Ole Miss senior Chris Warren (one vote) and Kentucky Freshman Brandon Knight (one vote) also received votes in the Player of the Year voting.

Thompkins, Warren and Knight were joined on the All-SEC First Team by Georgia junior Travis Leslie and Vanderbilt junior Jeffery Taylor.

Arkansas' Marshawn Powell led All-SEC Second Team honors and was joined by Florida's Boynton and Parsons, Alabama's JaMychal Green and Tennessee's Scotty Hopson.

Points were compiled on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for each division. Each media member also voted for one team as an overall conference champion and a five-player All-SEC Team.

Big Attendance Numbers, Again

More than 2.5 million fans have witnessed SEC basketball in each of the last four seasons. The SEC posted the fourth-largest season attendance in league history, totaling **2,518,749** fans for games featuring SEC teams in 2009-10. A record 2,638,852 fans saw SEC basketball in 2008-09 while 2,562,073 were in attendance in 2006-07 and 2,561,545 for the 2007-08 season.

Kentucky and Tennessee were both ranked among the top five nationally in average attendance. The Wildcats led the nation with an average of 24,110 fans per game while the Vols were fourth with an average of 19,168.

Poll Worthy

The SEC is the one of just two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the Associated Press top 25 (excluding pre-season polls) since 1999-00. Simply stated, every SEC team has been a top-25 team nationally at one point in the last nine seasons.

A look at SEC teams in the AP top 25 show the league's diversity since the 2000 season. Every team has been in the top 25.

First Round Success

The SEC is 43-22 (66.2 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 12 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

How Sweet It Is

The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 20 of the last 21 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

SEC Among Final Four Leaders

In the last 18 NCAA Tournaments (1993-2010), the SEC's 12 Final Four appearances are the third-most by any conference.

The SEC has had a total of five different teams to make the national semifinals, behind only the Big Ten and Big East's seven over the 17-year span.

SEC teams have made a total of 22 all-time appearances in the Final Four (27 including five appearances by Arkansas prior to joining the SEC).

SECond To None

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979)

Spreading The Wealth

Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

The growth and maturation of the point guard position will be critical to the Crimson Tide's success in 2010-11. With former All-SEC point guard Mikhail Torrance and Anthony Brock gone due to graduation, head coach Anthony Grant will utilize a sophomore, a true freshman and a junior college transfer to direct his offense this season. Sophomore Ben Eblen is the lone returnee in the group having played in 26 games last season as an understudy ... The Crimson Tide's perimeter guards and wing players boast some of the greatest depth on the UA roster with four returnees that have seen extensive action. The most veteran of the group is senior Senario Hillman who started 23 games and filled a variety of different roles for the Tide last season while averaging 7.9 points per game and leading the team in steals. SEC All-Freshman selection Tony Mitchell also brings back his tremendous athleticism after a freshman campaign in which he started 18 contests and averaged 9.2 points and 5.9 rebounds per game ... Alabama's frontcourt returns two experienced starters in junior JaMychal Green and senior Chris Hines. Green, a two-year starter and former McDonald's All-American, is the team's top returning scorer after posting 14.1 points and 7.2 rebounds last season with six double-doubles. Hines, a junior college transfer in 2009-10, learned quickly on the bench before jumping into the starting lineup during the final 14 games of the season and was named the team's Most Improved Player.

Arkansas begins the 2010-11 regular season schedule by hosting Grambling State University on Thursday, Nov. 18 at Bud Walton Arena. Several Razorbacks have been recognized with preseason honors and awards this season and that trend continued with the release of the SEC preseason media and coaches teams. Sophomore Marshawn Powell was named to the All-SEC second team by the media and first team by the SEC Coaches. Powell was the only underclassmen to be named to the first team. Junior Rotnei Clarke was named to the coaches second team after finishing the 2009-10 season ranked No. 9 in the nation in both three-point baskets per game and three-point shooting percentage. If there is one thing that Arkansas has in abundance its guards. With nine on the roster and five with significant Division I experience, look for a guard heavy presence by the Razorbacks on the floor.

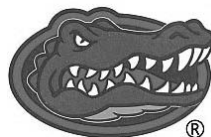

With Frankie Sullivan and Ty Armstrong out with injury, only 12 percent of Auburn's scoring returns from last year's 15-17 team ... Auburn's leading returning scorer and rebounder is sophomore Earnest Ross, who averaged 2.8 points and 3.0 rebounds in 13.4 minutes per game ... As a starter, Earnest Ross averaged 7.9 points in 24.4 minutes last year while only averaging 1.2 points in 9.7 minutes coming off the bench ... Coach Tony Barbee's first signee at Auburn was Josh Langford, the No. 1 ranked player in the state of Alabama from Huntsville's Lee High School ... Auburn does not have a senior on the roster and there is not one scholarship player on the roster that has lettered two years at Auburn ... Frankie Sullivan has lettered twice but he is out with injury ... Auburn's starting point guard is walk-on sophomore Josh Wallace, who averaged 1.2 points and 0.5 rebounds in 7.5 minutes per game last year.

The University of Florida returns all five starters from last year's NCAA Tournament team, the first time UF has returned its entire starting lineup since 2007 ... All five starters averaged in double-figures a year ago led by Kenny Boynton's 14.0 ppg ... The Gators return 89.7 percent of their scoring, 89.2 percent of their three-point shooting, and 74.2 percent of their rebounding ... Florida's frontcourt has six players 6-8 or bigger, its deepest front court since the 2007 team which featured three future first round NBA picks and a second round pick ... More consistent defense will be a priority for this deep Gator roster, as the Gators surrendered 60.1 ppg in their 21 victories and 76.6 ppg in their 13 losses last season, a difference of over 16 ppg.

Georgia brings back four starters and five of its top seven scorers from last season's team, which went 14-17 overall. The final record was accrued against a 2010 schedule was rated as the 16th most difficult in the nation by season's end. Three of Georgia's 14 wins came over Top 25 opponents ... In addition to four starters, the Bulldogs welcome two transfers from Division I schools: guard Gerald Robinson, Jr., and wing player Connor Nolte. Robinson scored over 1,000 points in two seasons at Tennessee State while Nolte was a part-time starter for the Paladins in the 2008-09 seasons. Already, Robinson is Georgia's leading career scorer with 1,021 points ... Georgia returns 76 percent of its scoring from last season, 75 percent of its total rebounds, 74 percent of its assists and 66 percent of its total minutes played. Three of the Bulldogs' returning starters (Thompkins, Leslie and Ware) each played an average of 30.7 minutes per game last season as sophomores ... Trey Thompkins and Travis Leslie combined to average 32.5 points per contest last year, nearly half of the Bulldogs' total average of 68.6. That's the best 1-2 combination by a Georgia pair since 2003, when Jarvis Hayes and Ezra Williams averaged 34.9 points together ... Georgia's schedule features as many as 17 games against teams that played in post-season tournaments last season. It will also mark the first time in the program's history that every regular-season game will be televised.

UK men's basketball players Josh Harrellson and Jon Hood, along with other collegiate players, traveled with Sports Reach to China on May 14 through May 31 to compete in games against local clubs, including the Bayi Basketball Club, traditionally one of the top teams in China. According to several recruiting experts, the Wildcats and Coach Calipari reeled in the top ranked recruiting class in the country for the second straight year. ESPN, Rivals.com and Scout.com all list the Wildcats at the top of their lists after UK signed five players in the top 50. The Wildcats return just one starter (Darius Miller) and four lettermen overall from last year's team that posted a 35-3 overall record and advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. Darius Miller is the Cats' top statistical returner in scoring (6.5 ppg), rebounding (2.5 rpg) and assists (1.5 apg). Kentucky's non-conference schedule includes games at North Carolina, vs. Notre Dame, Indiana, at Louisville and against Penn in addition to participating in a Maui Invitational field that includes Oklahoma, Virginia, Washington, Connecticut, Wichita State, Michigan State and Chaminade.

LSU plays Memphis in Tupelo early in the year. LSU has a 7-2 walk-on, Andrew DiPiero, a former tuba player on the Golden Band From Tigerland. He is listed as a redshirt sophomore in eligibility.

Ole Miss lost six players (four starters) from last year's 24-11, NIT Final Four team, including second round NBA draft pick Terrico White, and the team welcomes six newcomers to the fold, including highly touted freshmen Demarco Cox and Dundreous Nelson, as well as Indiana transfer Nick Williams, who sat out last year after starting 29 games as a freshman at IU ... All-SEC point guard Chris Warren enters his senior year with a chance to break several school records, including most 3-pointers in a career. He currently has 239 and the school record is 278 ... Warren also enters his senior season having made at least one 3-pointer in 45 straight games. It is the longest active streak among NCAA players and the third-longest in SEC history. The SEC record is 60 by Arkansas' Pat Bradley (1996-98) ... Head coach Andy Kennedy, who received a contract extension through 2014, has led the Rebels to three postseason bids, three 20-win seasons and two SEC West titles in his first four years. No Ole Miss coach has ever claimed four 20-win seasons or three division titles.

Ravern Johnson is 32 points shy of becoming the 32nd player at MSU to score 1,000 for a career ... Rick Stansbury ranks 14th all-time in SEC history with 255 wins ... MSU has a 2 1/2 road trip with stops in the Bahamas, Hawaii and Las Vegas ... Can Twany Beckham and Elgin Bailey remain healthy throughout the year.

South Carolina will look to fill the scoring void left by the graduation of Devan Downey and Brandis Raley-Ross (combined 33.1 points per game) with five returning letterman, one transfer student-athlete and six newcomers in 2010-11 ... South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn and his staff brought in a highly-touted recruiting class to Columbia this season. The class ranked as high as No. 17 in the country according to Scout.com ... The Gamecocks will travel to face 2009 and 2010 Final Four team Michigan State, and will also make a trip to Big Ten foe Ohio State during non-conference play ... South Carolina senior forward Sam Muldrow needs just 78 blocks to break the South Carolina record for career blocks. He currently ranks fifth with 172 blocks in the Garnet and Black ... Redshirt-junior forward Malik Cooke is eligible to play for South Carolina this season after sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. There are several milestones within reach for this year's crop of Volunteers. Tennessee needs 29 wins to reach 1,500 all-time victories, dating to the inaugural 1908-09 season. Junior guard Scotty Hopson is 238 points shy of becoming the 43rd member of Tennessee's 1,000-point club. And head coach Bruce Pearl, in his 19th collegiate season, needs only seven wins to reach 450 for his career. Pearl could potentially log his 150th win at Tennessee as well this season, as he is 24 wins from that milestone. Pearl has averaged 25.2 wins per season in his five years on Rocky Top ... Tennessee State is the only Division I basketball program in the state the Volunteers have not faced during Bruce Pearl's tenure. Since 2005-06, the Vols have played—and beaten—every in-state Division I team except the Tigers. Those schools include Austin Peay, Belmont, Chattanooga, ETSU, Lipscomb, Memphis, Middle Tennessee, Tennessee Tech, UT-Martin and Vanderbilt. Under Pearl, UT owns a 23-5 (.821) record against in-state Division I teams. Tennessee has eight games scheduled against in-state teams this season ... Tennessee's 57 SEC wins since the 2005-06 season are the most in the conference over that period. The Vols are the only SEC squad to record double figure league wins in each of the last five years (regular season) ... With an average height of 6-5, this year's Tennessee roster boasts great length once again. A total of 10 players—or 62.5 percent of the team—is 6-5 or taller.

Vanderbilt returns nine scholarship players from 2009-10 and three walk-ons to the fold for the 2010-11 campaign. The Commodores' roster will sport three seniors (Joe Duffy, Darshawn McClellan, Chris Meriwether), seven juniors (Jeffery Taylor, Brad Tinsley, Andre Walker, Festus Ezeli, Steve Tchiengang, Lance Goulbourne, and Aaron Noll), two sophomores (John Jenkins, Jordan Smart), and four freshmen (Kyle Fuller, Josh Henderson, Rod Odom, James Siakam) ... Two Vanderbilt All-SEC players from 2009-10, Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy, have departed the Commodore roster for the 2010-11 campaign. Beal, who graduated in May, and Ogilvy, who left school early to pursue professional basketball opportunities, combined to score 36.4% of the team's points a year ago. Both also left as 1,000-point scorers ... Junior forward Jeffery Taylor, an All-SEC 2nd team member last year and a member of the All-SEC Defensive team, put on 25 pounds of muscle this offseason and is ready for a breakout season in 2010-11. Taylor has scored in double-digits in 45 career games, and has started every game of his Vanderbilt career ... Sophomore sensation John Jenkins (6'4 guard, Hendersonville, Tenn.) has added 10 pounds to his frame and has been working tirelessly in the gym all summer. His 48.3% from three ranked as the third-best single-season three-point percentage in the program's history last year, and ranks as the 11th-best single season in SEC history. He also set a new freshman three-point made record with 72.
