



# 2004 IN REVIEW



Auburn started off the season with a bang, winning its first five games and 14 of 17 en route to its finest season ever. The Tigers finished the season 42-18, were one game away from reaching the Southeastern Conference Championship game and made their second ever NCAA Regional appearance.

The Tigers earned their first ever ranking, reaching as high as No. 12 in the nation before finishing the season ranked 23rd.

Auburn advanced to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament, then traveled to Stanford, Calif., for the NCAA Tournament. Fresno State and Hofstra, however, got the better of the Tigers in the postseason, knocking Auburn out of the tournament in two closely contested games.

Nevertheless, Auburn made a striking impression nationally and in the SEC in 2004, proving the Tigers are on the rise.

### **GETTING EVEN**

After defeating South Carolina on March 28, the Tigers returned to .500 softball (232-232-1) for the first time since the third game of the 1998 season. After that, Auburn went 16-14 in its final 30 games to go two games above .500 in the program's history.

## NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Auburn was good on the road, but even better at Jane B. Moore Field. The Tigers went 19-5 at home in 2004. Auburn rode a 12-game winning streak at home (Feb. 13 to March 20) to start the year, then won pivotal games against then-No. 7 Georgia (April 17 and 18) and No. 13 Alabama (April 20) as the season wound down.

#### **OPPONENTS DON'T RANK EARLY**

Auburn did not play a ranked opponent until March 27 against No. 15 South Carolina - the 28th game of the season. At that point, the Tigers went on to play 23 games against teams in the top 25, going 11-12 against such clubs. The Tigers won three series against top 15 teams, sweeping South Carolina and taking two of three each against Alabama and Georgia.

### **STAKING THEIR CLAIM**

Catcher Sara Dean, right fielder Sara Ghezzi and shortstop Ashley Griffin started every one of the team's 60 games. That alone would be significant, but they also played every game at their respective positions. Dean hit .333 en route to an SEC first-team nomination while Ghezzi had nine multi-hit games, fourth best on the team. Griffin, meanwhile, batted .273 with a team-leading six home runs.

#### **LET'S PLAY TWO**

Former Chicago Cub Ernie Banks would be proud. Auburn went 29-11 in doubleheaders in 2004, going 16-4 in the first game, 13-7 in the second. The Tigers swept five doubleheaders against the same opponent, while getting swept just once.

### FRESHMEN DUO MAKE THEIR MARK

Beth DiPietro and Holly Currie combined to go 14-6 in 41 appearances. They threw 162 innings, and struck out 143 while opponents batted just .188 against them.

### **K'S FOR KEYES**

Kristen Keyes carried the Tigers from the rubber, striking out 320 batters. She finished 14th in the NCAA in strikeouts per seven innings (9.2), having fanned 10 or more batters in a game 15 times. Even though the Tigers lost both their NCAA Regional games, Keyes shined, striking out a combined 34 batters in 18 1/3 innings against Hofstra and Fresno State.

### **KEYES, PART II**

Think strikeouts were impressive? Try looking at Keyes overall. The senior from Clearwater, Fla., went 27-12 to lead the Tigers, had an ERA of 1.06, threw 25 complete games - 13 of which were shutouts - and left Auburn as the school's all-time winningest pitcher with 60 victories. Opponents hit just .134 against her in 2004.

### **GET IT GOING EARLY**

Auburn was right on the money when scoring first, going 36-4 in such games. Conversely, if the Tigers allowed their opponent to score first, Auburn went 4-11. By the same token, the Tigers were 38-2 when leading after six innings and 0-12 when the opponent held the lead late in the game.

### **SPEEDY PATHS**

Opponents couldn't catch up to the Tigers. Auburn stole just shy of 80 percent of the bases it attempted to steal (106 of 133), led by Shannon Anderson's 33. The junior was caught just six times during the season, only twice during SEC play.

## **CAN'T KEEP HER DOWN**

Sara Dean seemingly hit everything thrown her way in 2004. En route to batting a team-leading .333, Dean got hits in every SEC series except one - Auburn's two-game road trip to LSU. She claimed at least one hit against every other conference opponent, including a season-high seven in three games at South Carolina.

For those efforts, Dean was named to the SEC First-Team and was a Third-Team All-American.

#### **SEC UNSTOPPABLE**

Paige Jones batted .212 leading up to the SEC Tournament, then went 4-for-11 with one home run and two RBI in Tuscaloosa, Ala. That effort earned her All-Tournament Team honors.

## FRESHMEN DOING AMAZING THINGS

Kristina McCain and Sara Ghezzi proved their transition to the college game wasn't too hard in 2004. Both earned Freshmen All-SEC honors this past year, Ghezzi on the strength of 14 RBI and McCain after collecting an Auburnleading 24 walks.

## LESS BAM MEANS MORE IN THE BANK

Auburn hit six fewer home runs in 2004 (22) than in 2003, but crossed the plate 56 more times. That accounts for almost one run more per game.

The Tigers also held opponents to 108 runs in 2004, down from 200 in 2003. That accounts for a 1.40 ERA for Tiger hurlers in 2004, while opponents sported a 2.72 ERA in games against Auburn.

### **RANK ME**

March 31, 2004 will be a date to remember in Auburn history. The Tigers appeared as the No. 22 team in the NFCA/USA Today poll, the first time in the program's history it garnered a top 25 bid. The Tigers never fell out of the top 25 from that point on, earning a ranking as high as 12th on May 16 before ending the year at 23. The Tigers, in fact, played in three games in

2004 in which they were ranked higher than their opponent. Ranked 12th, they fell to No. 15 Alabama, 7-1, on May 13, then lost to unranked Hofstra and No. 16 Fresno State in NCAA Regional play.

## **DOUBLE DUTY**

Holly Currie struck fear into the hearts of opponents from both the circle and the batter's box. She finished 2004 with a .278 batting average in 53 games, accounting for four home runs and 21 RBI. She appeared in 21 games from the rubber, starting 18. She finished the season with an 8-3 record and 2.13 ERA.

### STRIKEOUTS WITH A VENGEANCE

Auburn hurlers easily set a single-season Tiger record with 467 strikeouts in 2004.

Kristen Keyes led the group with 320, followed by Holly Currie's 91 and Beth DiPietro's 52. Averaged out, the Tigers struck out 1.15 batters per inning last season.

Conversely, opponents got three strikes on Auburn batters just 287 times in 2004, an average of .72 per inning.

## **SLICK FIELDING**

Tiger fielders committed just 50 errors in 2004, less than one per game. Auburn had a team fielding percentage of .969, turned 10 double plays and allowed opposing base stealers to steal less than 60 percent of their attempts (catcher Sara Dean threw out 22 runners in 54 attempts).
