 Senior • Forward • Duluth, Ga.

- Averaged 28 points in two games on the week, leading Vanderbilt to wins at Florida and over No. 10/13 Texas A&M.
- Scored 26 points against the Gators, shooting 10-16 from the field, adding seven rebounds and four blocks.
- Scored a career-high 30 points in the upset of the Aggies, adding another seven rebounds.
- Led defensive efforts against Florida's Jennifer George and A&M's Kelsey Bone, holding George to 13 points and Bone, who leads the league in field goal percentage, to 33.3% from the floor.
- Is the only player in the SEC to rank in the top-five of scoring (fourth/16.4), rebounding (t-fifth/8.1), field goal percentage (third/.539) and blocks (fifth/1.5)
- Has led Commodores to a 3-1 record since losing last season's SEC scoring champ, Christina Foggie, to injury.

 Guard • Murfreesboro, Tenn.

- Averaged 8.5 ppg, 3.5 apg and 3.0 spg in wins over Arkansas and Ole Miss.
- Her 8.5 ppg last week is 2.5 ppg higher than her season average entering the week.
- Connected on 80 percent of her shots from the floor during those victories.
- Dished out a game- and season-high six assists against the Razorbacks.
- Scored 13 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the floor at Ole Miss.
- Also collected a game-high four steals versus the Rebels.

Tournament Seeding

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 based upon the final regular season SEC standings.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 -- Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

For the purpose of seeding, if an institution is precluded from participating in the tournament, it shall remain where it finished in the regular-season standings.

Landers' achievement did not receive the same national play as other coaches obtaining the milestone because the NCAA does not recognize his 82 wins at Roane State, a two-year institution. Jasmine Hassell's game-high tallies of 23 points and 10 rebounds supplied her fourth double-double in the last five games. Hassell's double-double stretch comes after she had four double-doubles in her first 121 games played at UGA. Freshmen Shacobia Barbee and Tiaria Griffin chipped in 13 and 12 points, respectively, in Oxford. Griffin, a native of Monticello, Miss., scored 10 first-half points at Ole Miss, her fifth double-digit output in SEC play. This week, the Lady Bulldogs travel to Mississippi State on Thursday and host Vanderbilt in the regular-season finale on Sunday. Georgia is 26-12 all-time against MSU, including a 10-7 mark in Starkville. Mississippi natives Krista Donald (Lake, Miss.) and Tiaria Griffin will enjoy their second homecoming in a week. Junior All-American candidate Kelsey Bone led the team in scoring averaging 16.7 points per game to go along with 11.7 boards. Bone collected an Aggie Reed Arena record Thursday against Ole Miss pulling down 17 rebounds, the most by an Aggies since Yolanda Brown had 18 against SMU in Feb. 1993. Freshman Courtney Walker had 20 points in the defeat to Kentucky with 16 coming in the second half to spark the A&M comeback that fell just short.
