Scouting Auburn

The Tigers ended the Paradise Jam on a high note as the team clawed back from an 18-point deficit to defeat Western Michigan, 95-86. The 95-86 ledger marked was the highest combined scoring effort since Jan. 20, 1990, when the Tigers defeated Vanderbilt, 96-93, in double overtime.

Auburn picked up its first two losses of the season on Nov. 23 (Xavier) and Nov. 24 (Marquette) and are now 4-2 on the season. One year ago today, the Tigers hosted the Gamecocks and picked up its fourth win of the 2005-06 season (91-70). It was the most points that Auburn scored all season last year.

Two Tigers earned their first collegiate starts in St. Thomas - freshman forward **Jordan Greenleaf** and sophomore forward **Trevesha Jackson**. Greenleaf combined to grab 11 rebounds in the two games she started (Marquette, Western Michigan), six of those were offensive boards. Jackson posted her first double-double against Western Michigan with 14 points and 10 rebounds (seven offensive).

Since returning from nose surgery two weeks ago, sophomore **DeWanna Bonner** has set a new career high (28 point vs. WSSU) and led Auburn in scoring against Marquette (16) and Western Michigan (27). For her efforts she was named to the All-Tournament team. She currently averages 21.8 ppg, a team high, and 7.0 rpg through four games.

Three Tigers are currently averaging in double figures for scoring - Bonner (21.8), **Sherell Hobbs** (14.8) and **Tamela McCorvey** (10.3) - all three are starters for tonight's game. Four players are averaging at least 5.0 rpg, led by **KeKe Carrier** with 7.3 (Bonner - 7.0, Jackson, 6.3 and Greenleaf 5.7).

Scouting Jacksonville State

Jacksonville State, 3-4 on the season, is in its second of a three-game road tilt. The Gamecocks lost to Alcorn State, 74-63, on Monday evening after pulling to within one on three occasions in the second half. Junior guard **Courtney Slaughter** led the team with a season-high 21 points.

The Gamecocks have had two players named Ohio Valley Conference Plays of the Week, most recently freshman **Jolie Efezokhae**. Efezokhae averaged 15.0 points and 8.0 rebounds against Furman and Georgia State. Senior **Cobie Carlisle** was named OVC POW on Nov. 13 after her double-double performance (17 pts./10 rbs.) against Kennesaw State.

Sophomore **LaTonya McKinney** leads all scorers with 14.3 ppg and Efezokhae is the leading rebounder with 6.6 rpg. As a team, the Gamecocks are shooting 41.1 percent compared to 42.8 percent by its opponents. JSU has shot 36.1 percent from 3-point range and is 73.6 from the charity stripe.

Jacksonville State is coached by Becky Geyer who is in her first year as head coach.

Up Next

Auburn returns to road action on Dec. 1-2, in Reno, Nev., at the Nuggett Classic. The Tigers will face host Nevada on Friday (9 p.m. CT) and UC Riverside on Saturday (7 p.m. CT).

Series Record

Since 1979, Auburn has put together an 11-1 record versus Jacksonville State. The lone loss to the Gamecocks came on Jan. 2, 2005, in Jacksonville, 66-71. When playing in Auburn, the Tigers own a perfect 8-0 ledger.

We Be Jammin'

DeWanna Bonner was named to the Paradise Jam All-Tournament team after averaging 19.6 point per game during the three-day competition. Bonner led Auburn in scoring against Marquette (16) and nearly equalled her career-high against Western Michigan (27). She also contributed 5.6 rebounds during the three games.

Putting Up the Points

On the final day of the Paradise Jam, the Auburn women clawed back from an 18-point deficit to defeat Western Michigan, 95-86. The combined 181 points scored in the game was the highest point total in an Auburn women's game since the Tigers beat Vanderbilt 96-93 in double overtime on Jan. 20, 1990.

Tigers Versus the Ohio Valley Conference

Auburn has had much success against current Ohio Valley Conference opponents (OVC) and has put together a 21-2 record against those 11 opponents. The two losses came from Jacksonville State (Jan. 2, 2005) and Tennessee Tech (Dec. 21, 1989).

Double-Digiting

Auburn has had at least three players scoring in double-digits in all six of its game this season and in the first three games of the season the Tigers had four players in double-digits. In the four games that **DeWanna Bonner** has played in, she has put up double figures in all four. **Sherell Hobbs** leads the team with five double-figure scoring games.

Around the Conference

The Tigers continue to be dominant in the blocking category as the team has out-blocked its opponents by 19 this year. Auburn is second in the SEC in blocks with 5.5 bpg (0.75 bpg behind Mississippi State). **KeKe Carrier** leads the league in blocks with 3.00 bpg. The Tigers are ranked third or higher in three other statistical categories - 3-pt. FG pct. defense (.300), assists (18.00 apg) and assist/turnover ratio (1.19). Individually, **Whitney Boddie** and **Tamela McCorvey** are tied for second in assists (5.67 apg).

Charles-Furlow Elected to Women's Basketball Hall of Fame

Auburn assistant coach **Daedra Charles-Furlow** was selected as one of six inductee's into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. The group will be inducted during the June 8-9 celebration at the hall's headquarters in Knoxville. Joining Charles-Furlow in the class of 2007 will be Georgia women's head coach Andy Landers, former Texas player Andrea Lloyd Curry, former Louisiana Tech player Pam (Kelly) Flowers, a teammate of Charles-Furlow's at Tennessee, Bridgette Gordon, and Philadelphia Inquirer reporter Mel Greenberg.

Tigers Successful in Home Season Openers

In 36 seasons (including 2006-07), Auburn has put together a 31-5 record in season home openers. The last loss in a season opener in Auburn came on November 20, 1978 to Florida, 80-63.

Sweet Home Alabama

Head coach **Nell Fortner** has made recruiting in the state of Alabama a priority and it has paid off. The 2006-07 Tiger roster boasts five players from the state including **Whitney Boddie** (Florence), **DeWanna Bonner** (Fairfield), **Alexis Ogubie** (Huntsville), **Reneisha Hobbs** (Huntsville) and **Sherell Hobbs** (Huntsville). The group is tied for the largest contingent all-time at Auburn with the 1991-92 team who also had five players. For the 2007-08 season, Fortner has added three more from the state and will bring the total to eight next season.

Season Openers

Auburn is 28-8 all-time in season-opening games. The victory marked the second consecutive year the Tigers have opened up with a win. It is the first season-opening back-to-back wins since 2001-02 and 2002-03.

Rise and Shine

The Nov. 10 season tipoff vs. Western Carolina marks the earliest start in Auburn women's basketball history. Prior to this game, the earliest start came in the 2003-04 season when the Tigers opened up at the WBCA Tournament in Boulder, Co., on Nov. 14 against Notre Dame.

Home Cookin'

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 105-4 record against non-conference opponents in Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum. The four losses during that time were to Connecticut, 64-55 on Dec. 8, 1993, 73-56 to Illinois Dec. 30, 2000, 61-80 to No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 and 58-60 to Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005. Before the loss to Duke, Auburn had won 42 straight non-SEC home contests.

Bringin' Some Bling Back

DeWanna Bonner's suitcase coming back from Mexico City was a little bit heavier this summer. Bonner scored 14 points for Team USA in the finals of the FIBA Americas U20 Championship en route to the U.S. capturing the gold medal.

Sister Act

For the first time since the 1988-89 season, the Tigers roster features sisters. Freshman **Reneisha Hobbs** joined sophomore sister **Sherell Hobbs** this year. The pair hail from Huntsville, Ala. R. Hobbs, a 5-10 guard, was the 5A and Gatorade Player's of the Year as a senior. She averaged 21 points and eight rebounds per game in her final high school campaign.

Experience Factor

Only one of the 13 member's of the 2006-07 Auburn team have played for more than one season as a Tiger. That lone person is junior **Alexis Ogubie** (forward), who over the last two seasons has competed in 58 games and has totaled 289 points.

Tall Order

Once again, fans this season will notice a large lineup for the Tigers - one that has an average height of 72.62 inches (or approximately 6-1). With 13 players on the roster, eight are 6-0 and above.

Tigers in the Rankings

The Tigers snuck into the preseason rankings by Sportspage Magazine as the group selected Auburn 25th. It is the first time since **Nell Fortner** joined the Tigers that one of her AU teams has been ranked in the preseason.

Bonner Highlights Preseason National Nods

Sophomore guard **DeWanna Bonner** not only received preseason recognition in the SEC, but also earned national nods. *Street & Smith's* and Sportspage Magazine selected her honorable mention All-American

Preseason Picks

Auburn was picked to finish eighth in the Southeastern Conference by writers at SEC Media Days in October. **DeWanna Bonner** was selected to the Preseason All-SEC First Team by the league coaches and the preseason All-SEC second team by the writers.

Charles-Furlow Joins Coaching Staff

After spending the past three season as an assistant coach at the University of Detroit, **Daedra Charles-Furlow** joined the Auburn staff in July. Charles-Furlow, a two-time KODAK All-American at Tennessee, was part of two NCAA Championship teams as a Lady Vol. At UT, she was named SEC Female Athlete of the Year and became the first player from the SEC to win the Wade Trophy. A member of the 1992 U.S. Olympic team, she competed professionally overseas in Japan, Italy and France, before returning to the States to play for the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks in 1997.

Tigers on the Tube

Auburn is currently schedule to play on television three times (all three in Auburn) during the season. The Tigers will be televised on FSN South twice (vs. Ole Miss and Georgia) and CSS when the Lady Vols come to the Plains.

Auburn, Ala. - Sherell Hobbs netted a career-high 22 points and added nine rebounds as Auburn (2-0) topped Alabama State (0-1), 84-47, Wednesday night at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum. Hobbs' performance was a five-point improvement on her previous career high, 17, which was Nov. 10 at Western Carolina.

"To have Sherell playing at the level she is playing right now is a real plus for us," Auburn head coach Nell Fortner said. "That helps this team get to another level."

Three other Tigers improved their career bests in the game as well. KeKe Carrier was one block away from a triple-double, tallying a career-high nine to go with her 11 points and ten rebounds. Joanna Clayden hit five threes, four in the second half, for a career-high 15 points, while Whitney Boddie dished a career-best nine assists.

Auburn pulled away from the Hornets in the second half, the result of a 21-0 run midway through the period. An Erin Etheridge layup at the 7:50 mark of the second half ended a Hornets scoreless streak of seven minutes and 36 seconds. During the stretch Auburn made six of eight attempts from the field, while Alabama State misfired on 12 consecutive shots.

Auburn's largest lead of the first half, 38-22, came on the strength of a 14-6 run to close the period. Prior the run, the Hornets had climbed to within eight points on the strength of a L'Teisha Holloway jumper.

Auburn opened the game with 12 unanswered points, while the Hornets missed their first eight field goal attempts before Holloway nailed a jump shot at the 10:20 mark.

Holloway was Alabama State's leading scorer, putting 14 points on the board and adding six rebounds and five assists.

Auburn out-rebounded the Hornets 51-31, an effort that contributed to 16 second-chance points against just two for Alabama State. The Tigers also outscored the Hornets 22-12 in the paint and 20-8 off of turnovers.

Auburn, Ala. - The Auburn women scored early and often in an 85-47 rout of Winston-Salem State Friday night at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum. The win moved the Tigers to 3-0 on the young season and dropped the Lady Rams to 0-3.

"I thought the game was good in the sense that we ran the ball in transition," Auburn head coach Nell Fortner said. "We got into lanes better than we have in the past. It was a point of emphasis for us to fill lanes and score in transition, and we did that tonight."

DeWanna Bonner returned from an injury to lead Auburn in scoring, hanging a career-high 28 points on the Lady Rams in just 29 minutes. She added 11 rebounds and five assists for her fifth career double-double. Three other Tigers also managed double figures in the game. Alexis Ogubie netted 12 points, while Tamela McCorvey scored 11 and Sherell Hobbs scored 10. McCorvey also dished 11 assists for the first double-double of her Division I career.

Auburn scored 30 points in a largely inconsequential second half as every Tiger in uniform saw action. Auburn's 85 points was its second highest total of the season.

The Tigers pulled away late in the first half, scoring 15 points in the final five minutes while allowing WSSU just two baskets over the same stretch. The 17 points allowed by Auburn in the opening period were the fewest this season and the fewest allowed in a first half by Auburn since the 2005 season-opener vs. Texas Pan-American.

Auburn opened the game with 11 unanswered points, nine of which came from McCorvey three-pointers. McCorvey finished 3-of-7 from beyond the arc and 4-of-9 overall.

Auburn shot 50.7% from the field as a team against just 30.9% for the Lady Rams. The Tigers also created 22 turnovers in the game, which they turned into 25 points. Auburn also recorded 26 assists, the most for the team since a Dec. 20, 2005 win at Furman.

Candace Saunders and Shalonda Carter scored ten points each to lead WSSU in scoring.

St. Thomas, VI. - KeKe Carrier notched a double-double and two other Tigers put double figures on the score-board, but poor shooting in the second half left Auburn (3-1) with a 75-64 loss to Xavier (4-0) Thursday night in the opening round of the Paradise Jam. Carrier scored 10 points and grabbed 13 rebounds, while Sherell Hobbs added 19 and DeWanna Bonner scored 16.

"They showed a lot more poise than we did down the stretch," Auburn head coach Nell Fortner said. "I felt like we played with energy tonight, but we didn't defend penetration very well and we missed some easy shots."

Auburn shot 35.1% from the field in the game and made only 12 shots on 43 attempts in the second half. The poor shooting prevented the Tigers from keeping up with a Xavier team that scored 17 fast-break points and 48 points in the paint. Prior to the loss, Auburn had never given up 75 points to a non-conference opponent under Fortner.

Xavier pulled away from the Tigers with a 10-4 run midway through the second half. With Auburn trailing by just six at the 9:02 mark, Xavier's Joeli Clyburn hit a pair of free throws and a fast-break layup on consecutive possessions to expand the Xavier lead to 10. Auburn's Tamela McCorvey and Xavier's Miranda Green each made a shot on her team's ensuing possession.

After McCorvey made two free throws to cut the lead to eight, Jordan Greenleaf put Michelle Miller on the foul line, where she dropped two free throws to up the advantage to 10. After an errant Bonner jumpshot, Amber Harris converted another fast-break opportunity to increase the Xavier lead to 12. The Musketeers would lead by as many as 13 later in the period, but Auburn never climbed within six points again.

Xavier took the lead for good, 39-37, with a three-pointer from Suntana Granderson at the 15:55 mark of the second half. The Musketeers opened the second frame with 5 consecutive points to take a 34-32 lead before Greenleaf and Bonner hit shots to put Auburn back ahead.

Auburn took a 32-29 lead to the locker room at halftime after forfeiting a 15 point advantage earlier in the period. Xavier jumped out to an 8-4 lead before Auburn scored 19 unanswered points to pull ahead, 23-8.

After the rally, the Tigers went cold from the field and turned the ball over four times in the final six minutes of the half. During that stretch, Xavier shot 7-of-14 from the field to cut the deficit to three.

Clyburn was the leading scorer for Xavier, netting 23 points on 9-of-15 shooting. She also had six rebounds, four assists and three blocks in the contest.

The Tigers out-rebounded Xavier 43-31 in the game and scored 21 points on second chances. The turnover battle went the Musketeers way, 14-13, but Auburn put 19 points on the board off of miscues compared to 15 for Xavier.

St. Thomas, VI. - Auburn trailed by double digits in each half and battled back both times to take the lead, but the Tigers (3-2) couldn't hang on and suffered a 65-61 loss to Marquette (4-1) Friday afternoon in the second round of the Paradise Jam. DeWanna Bonner netted 16 points, while Tamela McCorvey scored 15 and Trevesha Jackson added 11 in the loss. Both McCorvey's and Jackson's efforts were season highs.

"We fought hard and kept doing things to get back in the ballgame," Auburn head coach Nell Fortner said. "We just couldn't get over the hump and hold on to a lead."

Bonner gave Auburn its third one-point lead at the 1:27 mark with the second of two free throws, but Marquette's Danielle Kamm answered with a short jumper to give the Golden Eagles a 62-61 advantage. On Auburn's next possession, McCorvey misfired on a three-point attempt. Kamm grabbed the rebound and started a fast break that led to a Krystal Ellis layup and a three-point Marquette advantage. McCorvey missed another three with eight seconds remaining and Efueko Osagie-Landry grabbed the rebound, forcing Auburn to foul and effectively ending the game.

The Tigers battled back from a ten point deficit earlier in the half with a 15-4 run and took a short-lived lead, 54-53, with 3:50 remaining in the game. A Christina Quaye three-pointer just ten seconds later put Marquette back on top.

Auburn trailed the Golden Eagles by three at halftime after falling behind by 12 points early in the contest. The Tigers shot poorly early in the game and quickly found themselves on the short end of an 18-6 run by Marquette. When Krystal Ellis hit a three-pointer to put the Golden Eagles up 12 at the 12:32 mark, Auburn had taken 12 shots and found the bottom of the net on only three. The Tigers also turned the ball over seven times in the first period with four of those miscues coming in the first nine minutes.

Auburn eventually calmed down and took a one-point lead late in the first period. Trailing by seven with 5:40 to play in the half, Auburn capped an 11-4 run with a Bonner jumpshot to tie the game at 25. After Marquette's Efueko Osagie-Landry put the Golden Eagles ahead with a free throw, Jackson converted a layup to give the Tigers a one-point advantage. Marquette closed the period with four unanswered points to take a three point lead to the locker room.

Quaye was the leading scorer for Marquette with 21 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the field and seven conversions from the charity stripe. Ellis also put 20 points on the board for the Golden Eagles.

The Tigers managed to shoot the ball with more success Friday, going 23-of-56 (41.1%) from the field. Marquette was slightly better, converting on 22 of 47 attempts (46.8%). Marquette out-rebounded Auburn 33-32 and scored seven second-chance points to Auburn's five. Each team turned the ball over 16 times, but Marquette scored 16 points off of turnovers to the Tigers' 13.

St. Thomas, VI. - DeWanna Bonner scored 27 points and added five rebounds and an assist to lead Auburn (4-2) back from an 18-point deficit to win 95-86 over Western Michigan (1-6) at the Paradise Jam in the Virgin Islands. The contest was the highest scoring Auburn women's game in more than 15 years.

"That was an incredible second half," Auburn head coach Nell Fortner said. "I am proud of the way we came back. I don't like it when we get down like that, but I was impressed with the fight we showed today."

Bonner, who was named to the all-tournament team, was one of three Tigers to put up strong numbers in Auburn's final game of the Paradise Jam. Sherell Hobbs scored 17 points and added four assists, while Trevesha Jackson posted a double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

The Tigers completed their comeback and took their first lead of the second half when Bonner hit a long three-pointer at the 6:29 mark to give Auburn a 78-77 advantage. The Tigers never trailed again and Auburn's largest lead was its margin of victory, nine points, after WMU was forced to foul in the closing minutes.

Western Michigan opened the second period looking to put the game away, increasing its lead to 17 points, 59-42, after just two minutes and 36 seconds of play. The Broncos led by 14 with 10:37 left in the game after a pair of Carrie Moore free throws. The next four minutes and eight seconds saw Auburn outscore WMU 21-6 and take the lead on Bonner's three.

Auburn came out of the locker room shooting well to start the game and jumped out to a 12-4 lead, but shortly thereafter Western Michigan found its offensive rhythm and quickly tied the game at 14 with 15:12 to play in the half. WMU jumped ahead by five before KeKe Carrier scored on consecutive possessions to cut the deficit to one at 19-18. After an Amanda Parker three, Bonner scored twice to tie the game at 22.

WMU's Carrie hit two consecutive threes to answer Bonner and the Broncos were off and running. They increased their lead to as many as 18 in the first half, but led by only 12 at halftime due to a 12-4 run by Auburn to close the period.

Moore was the Broncos' leading scorer, netting 32 points while contributing five assists and three rebounds. She was the first player to score more than 30 points against Auburn since Nov. 20, 2005, when Kent State's Lindsey Shearer dropped 38 points on the Tigers. The combined 181 points in the game was the most for an Auburn women's game since Auburn defeated Vanderbilt, 96-93, on January 20, 1990, in double overtime.

Auburn hit the boards harder than its opponent for the fourth time this season, taking a 42-32 rebounding advantage in the game.

The Auburn bench continued to contribute, scoring 25 points against just 12 from the Broncos. Joanna Clayden led Auburn in that category, posting nine points on 3-of-7 shooting from beyond the arc. The Tigers also continue to pass well, as they dished 24 assists in the game, their third single-game assist total of more than 15 this season.

Auburn turned the ball over 16 times to WMU's 14, but was more efficient in converting turnovers to points as they netted 25 points off of miscues against just 19 for the Broncos.

NELL FORTNER

Head Coach

When Nell Fortner became the fifth head coach in Auburn women's basketball history on April 22, 2004, she brought with her a unique blend of experience that she has used to lay a foundation for the Auburn program as she is dedicated to bringing the Tigers back into the national spotlight in her third year.

As an Olympic and World Championship gold medal coach, a well-respected television analyst and a sought after motivational speaker, and with head coaching experience at all levels, Fortner has one of the most complete resumes in women's basketball.

In her first season at Auburn, Fortner led the Tigers to a 16-13 overall record and a 6-8 ledger in the SEC. Fortner's inaugural team felt the loss of two key post players in Mandisa Stevenson and Le'Coie Willingham, as both moved on to spots on WNBA rosters. The Tigers were not expected to be a threat in conference play that year, but Fortner had her own plans that season. The Tigers became the most dangerous team in the league, nearly knocking off No. 1 LSU twice.

Fortner began a foundation for the Auburn program by inking high school All-American and Miss Basketball from Alabama and Louisiana: DeWanna Bonner, Whitney Boddie and KeKe Carrier, in 2004.

With a roster equipped with a mere three upperclassmen, one of which was a junior transfer, the Tigers 2005-06 season was one of learning for the eight underclassmen. In her second year, Fortner guided the young team to a 14-15 overall record, including a 4-10 mark in SEC play. The freshman did shine in their inaugural campaign as Bonner became the first freshman to lead the team in scoring since Becky Jackson in the 1980-81 season. Over the summer, Bonner added to her resume as she helped lead team USA to a gold medal in the FIBA Americas U20 Women's Championship in August. Classmate Carrier was also a member of the U20 trials roster.

Fortner's third recruiting class brings in a versatile group in forward Jordan Greenleaf, guard Reneisha Hobbs and forward/center Milaika Pickard, as well as, junior transfer guard Tamela McCorvey and sophomore transfer forward Trevesha Jackson. Of the 13 players on the 2006-07 squad, 12 were brought to Auburn by Fortner and staff. The third-year coach has raised the bar this season and is ready to make strides in the conference and on the national level in 06-07.

Fortner's impact at Auburn is much more than just on the court. She is a staple in the Auburn/Opelika area and is well-known through her community service efforts and public speaking. The Jackson, Miss., native also travels around the country for numerous speaking engagements including the Tucson Duramed FUTURES Golf Classic, which was held in May in Tucson, Ariz., and at the USOC in Colorado Springs at the "Women in Coaching" convention in September.

In addition to her work in the community, Fortner's reach is global. During her first season on the Plains, she was named as the spokesperson for the Auburn University War on Hunger in conjunction with the World Food Programme and continues in her commitment to the program.

On the national scene, Fortner is most frequently recognized by coaching Team USA to the gold medal in the 2000 Olympics. As the USA coach from 1997 to 2000, Fortner led the squad to a 101-14 record (which in addition to the Olympic gold medal included a 1998 World Championship gold medal) during that time, the most wins of any coach in Women's USA Basketball history. For her efforts, Fortner was named the 2000 USA Basketball Coach of the Year.

In 1999, Fortner was named the head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever and was later appointed the head coach and general manager, a position she held for three years. In order to complete her commitment to USA Basketball, the Fever granted Fortner the time necessary and joined the team for the 2001 season. While with the Fever, Fortner led the team to a 42-56 record and the 2002 WNBA Eastern Conference playoffs.

Fortner's tour with USA Basketball did not begin in the 2000 season. Starting in the summer of 1995, Fortner served as an assistant to 1996 Olympic coach Tara VanDerveer, helping lead the team to a 52-0 run. Included in that run was an 8-0 ledger in the Olympic games, which culminated with a gold medal. Fortner's duties as an assistant included overseeing the national team's strength and conditioning program, the development of perimeter players and scouting of opponents and video game analysis.

Fortner's resume as a collegiate head coach is just as impressive as she led the Purdue squad to a share of the Big Ten regular season title in 1997 with a team that returned just four players. The first-year coach was named the National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times and was awarded Big Ten Coach of the Year honors for her efforts. That season, the Boilermakers played to a 12-4 conference mark and a 17-11 overall record, as well as a second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Fortner served as an assistant under Hall of Fame coach Leon Barmore at Louisiana Tech from 1991-95. During those five seasons, the Lady Techsters went 123-37 and made five consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament and a National Championship game appearance in 1994.

Including the 1997 season, collegiate teams associated with Fortner made nine consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament and tallied a 10-year record of 252-66 (.792) during that time.

After graduating from Texas, Fortner took on responsibilities as the head girl's basketball coach at Killeen High School in Texas. From there, she served as a graduate assistant at Stephen F. Austin in 1987 while completing her Master's degree in education and was then promoted to a full-time assistant, where she served from 1988-90. While at SFA, the Ladyjacks played to an 87-12 record and attended three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Fortner graduated from the University of Texas in 1982, playing for mentor, and Hall of Fame coach, Jody Conradt for the 1978-81 seasons. As a player, Fortner helped guide the Longhorns to a 127-26 record during her four seasons and led Texas to its first national ranking in women's basketball and a seventh-place finish at the AIAW National Tournament. While at Texas, Fortner scored 1,466 points, which remains near the top of the scoring leaders list at UT. The multi-sport athlete also played middle hitter for the Texas volleyball team and helped lead the Longhorns to the 1981 AIAW national championship. In 1978, Fortner was a part of the silver medal-winning U.S. Olympic Festival South Team, averaging 6.0 points and 4.3 rebounds per contest.

In November of 2001, Fortner was appointed to the University of Texas Women's Athletics Wall of Honor and the Texas Hall of Fame.
