

Auburn finished the 2006 season 36-22 overall and 15-15 in Southeastern Conference play, putting the Tigers at third in the conference's Western Division. Auburn lost to No. 11 LSU, 4-1, at the SEC Tournament.

The Tigers went 21-7 in non-conference games this season and finished the year with a 24th ranking in the ratings percentage index. The team went 5-12 against clubs ranked in the top 25.

Holly Currie and Beth DiPietro combined to throw six no-hitters, led by Currie's five, which surpassed Kristen Keyes (four in 2004) for the most in a single-season.

Kristina McCain, who set a season-high with 36 walks, was named to the All-SEC Second-Team, as was junior right fielder Sara Ghezzi. Tatiana Fernandez was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

#### Tigers Advance To First Regional Championship Game ...

Auburn advanced to the championship game of the Tucson Regional for the first time in school history. The Tigers lost to Arizona in the final game of the region, 4-2, in front of a national audience on ESPN2.

Auburn opened the tournament with a 1-0, 10-inning loss to Ohio State, but bounced back for two wins the following day. Holly Currie threw her fifth no-hitter of the season and Auburn's first in NCAA Regional play as the Tigers defeated fourth-seeded Marist, 14-0, in five innings. In a rematch against Ohio State, the Tigers got home runs from Kristina McCain and Tatiana Fernandez in the day-two nightcap, sending Auburn to the game against Arizona.

Currie and Sara Ghezzi hit solo home runs in the loss to Arizona. Auburn had runners on first and second with one out in the seventh, but could not move the runners, allowing Arizona to reach the super regionals against LSU.

**Against Ranked Clubs ...** Auburn played 17 games against teams ranked in the top 25 this season, going 5-12 overall. Of those 16 games, 13 came against teams from the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers went 4-9 against SEC teams in the top 25.

Auburn allowed three runs or less in eight of

those games, and when the Tigers did, went 5-3. In a three-game stretch from Feb. 24-Feb. 28, the Tigers lost to then-No. 16 Arizona State, 1-0, in eight innings, defeated No. 24 Missouri, 2-0, on a Holly Currie no-hitter, then lost a tight contest to No. 7 and defending national champion, Michigan, 1-0.

**No-No's ...** Pitchers Holly Currie and Beth DiPietro combined for six no-hitters this season, the most in a single-season by Auburn pitchers. The feat gives the Tigers multiple no-hitters in the same season for just the second time in program history, following 2004. That year, DiPietro and Kristen Keyes combined for five no-hitters.

**Pitching Trio ...** Holly Currie and Beth DiPietro, the team's No. 1 and 2 pitchers, combined for 35 wins, a 1.81 ERA in 366 1/3 innings and 415 strikeouts in 2006. The team's No. 3 pitcher, Brittany Day, set a career-high with 12 games and threw 26 innings, just shy of the 28 2/3 she worked in 2005.

Day threw in just four games through the first two months of the season, but then saw action from the circle in eight games in April and May. In the month of April, she was 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in 20 1/3 innings.

**Junior Sticks ...** Auburn hit 42 home runs in 2006, highlighted by the junior class, which contributed 18. Sara Ghezzi tied for the team lead with eight round trippers, followed closely by Holly Currie and Kristina McCain, who had six apiece.

The team's freshmen were second with 12. A majority of those home runs came from Tatiana Fernandez, who set a freshman single-season record with eight. The team's seniors and sophomores combined for 10, with the former hitting nine.

**Record Crowds ...** A total of 23,940 fans saw Auburn play in 2006, averaging out to 498 per game. A little less than 10,000 witnessed games at Jane B. Moore Field, averaging 439 per game in 22 dates.

Three of the four largest attendance figures at Jane B. Moore Field were achieved in 2006. On Feb. 28, 1,371 came and saw Auburn fall to defending national champion Michigan, 1-0. That surpassed the previous record of 1,187 that saw the Tigers play Alabama on May 4, 2002.

Two months later, on April 25, the Tigers attracted 1,078 to Jane B. Moore Field for a doubleheader split against Alabama. That figure represented the third-largest single game total. The program's fourth-largest crowd at home came a day later at the series finale.

In Auburn's first game against Ohio State at the regional, 1,358 fans came to Hillenbrand Stadium, the second-largest attendance in team history, regardless of location.

The Tigers had seven dates of 900 or more fans through the 2006 season.

**Setting Marks At The Tucson Regional ...** Auburn made it to the Tucson Regional championship game for the first time in team history, and even though the Tigers lost to Arizona in the finale, 4-2, they set a number of records along the way.

Auburn won its first games away from Jane B. Moore Field in the postseason, defeating Marist, 14-0, and Ohio State, 4-0. The team set a record for runs against Marist, surpassing the 11 against Florida A&M in 2005. Auburn also set a record with 13 hits against

Marist, while Holly Currie threw the program's first postseason no-hitter against the Red Foxes.

The Tigers hit two home runs apiece against Ohio State and Arizona, setting a new team record in the category.

**Ghezzi, McCain and Fernandez Honored By SEC ...** Sara Ghezzi and Kristina McCain were named to the All-SEC Second-Team and Tatiana Fernandez the SEC All-Freshman Team on May 10.

Ghezzi was second on the club with a .295 batting average during conference play. The junior hit two home runs and drove in 13. She was third on the team with five doubles and 10 walks.

McCain, meanwhile, led the club with a .333 batting average, 21 walks and was tied for the team lead with six doubles. She was also fourth on the team with nine RBI, all coming as she batted leaoff for the Tigers.

Fernandez, lastly, led the team with four home

runs and 17 RBI. The Miami native tied McCain for the team lead with six doubles.

The trio of honors marked the third straight season the Tigers have had at least three players honored at the SEC postseason banquet.

**That's A Streak ...** Ashley Griffin surpassed Sara Dean for the most consecutive starts in an Auburn uniform against LSU in the SEC Tournament and finished her career seeing her name on the lineup card in 221 straight games. Griffin did not miss an Auburn game since Feb. 23, 2003 when the Tigers defeated Alabama A&M, 12-1, at the Holiday Inn Invitational in Macon, Ga. She started the final 35 games of the 2003 season.

Griffin started 240 games for her career (out of 241 games played overall) putting her into third place in team history.

**Currie Says 'No-No' Five Times ...** Holly Currie threw her fifth no-hitter of the season May 19 against Marist in Tucson, Ariz., giving her the team record for most in a single-season, surpassing Kristen Keyes' four in 2004. Currie no-hit Mercer (Feb. 18), Missouri (Feb. 24), Tennessee Tech (April 4) and Ole Miss (May 5).

The junior from Pisgah, Ala., now has six no-hitters in her career after tossing a perfect game against the College of Charleston last season. Currie is now the program's all-time leader in no-hitters.

**Against The WCWS Field ...** Auburn finished the 2006 season 2-6 against clubs that advanced to the Women's College World Series. Auburn was 0-1 against both Arizona and Arizona State and 1-2 against each Alabama and Tennessee.

**Five Tigers Honored ...** Jorja Bell, Sara Ghezzi, Robin Martin, Nicole Russo and Lauren Walton were honored by Auburn on April 18 as Top Tigers. The group was one of 185 student-athletes at Auburn who earned a minimum 3.0 GPA in their last academic term or over their career.

The Auburn softball team has now had at least five players honored as Top Tigers for the past six consecutive years. Ghezzi, Martin, Russo and Walton are two-time honorees.

**Nation's 20th Toughest Schedule ...** Auburn's schedule was rated as the 20th strongest in the nation. That mark was the sixth toughest among SEC clubs, trailing Arkansas (ninth), Alabama (10), South Carolina (15), Florida (18) and Tennessee (19).

**No. 600 ... Twice ...** Auburn head coach Tina Deese won her 600th career game March 8 against Samford, then coached in her 600th game with the Tigers on April 8 in the second game of a doubleheader against LSU in Baton Rouge.

**Four Hit Four ...** Entering the season, the Tigers had seen a player produce four hits in a game just seven times, the most recent coming by Holly Currie against Arkansas on March 12, 2005.

That didn't stand long. Three Tigers produced four four-hit efforts in 2006. Ashley Griffin started it against Mercer on Feb. 18, followed by Myesha Finney connecting against Boston College on March 5. Tatiana Fernandez made it two-in-a-row, accomplishing the feat against Florida on March 28 and then against Arkansas on April 22.

**Climbing Up The Record Books ...** Sara Ghezzi and Holly Currie finished the 2006 season featured prominently in the Auburn career record books. Ghezzi enters the 2007 season ranked fifth in on-base percentage (.396), sixth with 64 walks and eighth in average (.311) and games started (184). Ghezzi is also 10th in slugging percentage (.456), games played (186), RBI (79) and total bases (220).

Currie, meanwhile, is making an assault on the team's pitching career records. She finished the 2006 season tied for first with 11 career saves and is second in ERA (1.91), wins (51), batting average against (.185), innings (519.1) and strikeouts (627), among other categories. Offensively, she is third with 27 home runs and a .566 slugging percentage and fourth in on-base percentage (.397) and RBI (119). She's narrowly ahead of Ghezzi with 68 walks and is seventh with a .316 batting average.

**Continuing An SEC Tradition ...** Auburn advanced to its seventh straight SEC Tournament and eighth in the 10th year of the program. The Tigers eventually lost to third-seeded LSU, 4-1, but not before a first-inning home run by Ashley Griffin gave Auburn a 1-0 lead.
