## 2019 Season Recap

### 2019 AUBURN FOOTBALL REVIEW

» Auburn finished the 2019 season 9-4 overall and 5-3 in SEC action. The Tigers were ranked No. 14 in the final Associated Press and USA Today polls, and 12th in the final CFP rankings. Auburn was 6-1 at home, 2-2 in opponent stadiums and 1-1 in neutral-site games. The Tigers concluded the season facing Minnesota in the Outback Bowl in Tampa, Fla., January 1, Auburn's seventh consecutive bowl appearance.

» Auburn's 25 seniors: Wil Appleton, Derrick Brown, Sal Cannella, Craig Carter, Marlon Davidson, Javaris Davis, Jeremiah Dinson, Jack Driscoll, Phelps Gambill, Marquel Harrell, Will Hastings, Mike Horton, Trent Kelley, Kaleb Kim, Sage Ledbetter, Kam Martin, Spencer Nigh, Pace Ozmint, Jacob Rogers, Bailey Sharp, Sam Sherrod, Daniel Thomas, Gary Walker, Prince Tega Wanogho and Jay Jay Wilson. Nick Coe, Noah Igbinoehene and Arryn Siposs declared after the season their intentions to enter the NFL draft.

### BOWL GAMES

» In the Outback Bowl vs. Minnesota, Auburn made its 44th bowl appearance all-time, and its seventh straight under Gus Malzahn, the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling eight straight years from 2000-07. Auburn is 24-18-2 all-time in bowl games.

### DOMINATING DEFENSE

» Winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy and a Nagurski, Outland, Bednarik and Wuerffel finalist, consensus All-American Derrick Brown was named SEC defensive player of the year by the league's coaches and by AP. He's the first Auburn player since Tracy Rocker (1988) to win that nod from the coaches and the first since Nick Fairley (2010) to win the AP honor.

Brown is Auburn football's 31st consensus All-American and just the ninth unanimous All-American in Auburn football history; others: Jimmy Phillips (1957), Pat Sullivan (1971), Terry Beasley (1971), Bo Jackson (1985), Brent Fullwood (1986), Ben Tamburello (1986), Tracy Rocker (1988) and Ed King (1990).

Brown was the SEC defensive lineman of the week vs. Texas A&M with four tackles, two sacks, three TFL, a forced fumble and two PBU against the Aggies; he was the Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week, Bednarik player of the week and a nominee for Lott IMPACT Trophy national player of the week. Two sacks and three TFL were career single-game bests for Brown.

Brown added four tackles, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and a 9-yard sack in his dominant performance at Florida, earning another SEC weekly award, and he picked up his third SEC weekly award with his team-best seven tackles and a TFL vs. Ole Miss. After recording seven tackles and 3.5 TFL against Alabama, he finished his career with 169 career tackles, 33.5 TFL and 13.0 sacks.

### KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Six of Auburn's 2019 opponents won 11 games or more: #1 LSU (15), #4 Georgia (12), #5 Oregon (12), #6 Florida (11), #8 Alabama (11), #10 Minnesota (11)

» Auburn's opponents totaled 111 wins this season, an average of 8.54 per team, behind only South Carolina (8.91 avg)

» SEC defensive player of the year Derrick Brown won the 2019 Lott IMPACT Trophy and Senior CLASS Award, and was a finalist for the Outland Trophy, the Bronko Nagurski Award, the Bednarik Award, the Wuerffel Trophy and the Pop Warner college player of the year

» Derrick Brown is the ninth unanimous All-America selection in Auburn history, and the 31st consensus All-American at Auburn

» With 13 fumble recoveries and 15 forced fumbles, Auburn ranked fifth nationally in recoveries and ninth in forced fumbles

» Tigers on the all-SEC coaches' and AP first and second teams: Derrick Brown, Marlon Davidson, K.J. Britt, Jeremiah Dinson, Christian Tutt, Prince Tega Wanogho

» Christian Tutt finished fifth nationally in punt returns, averaging 13.6 yards on 23 punt returns this season. Tutt tied for second nationally with six returns of at least 20 yards

» SEC freshman of the year Bo Nix holds the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and TD passes (16)

» Auburn, Alabama, Clemson, Iowa and Washington are the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense each of the last four seasons

» Auburn faced an FBS-best six opponents that finished the season with 11 wins or more

» There were 21 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2018 season, including current team members Chris Bobo, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Tanner Dean, Josh French, Phelps Gambill, Marquel Harrell, Alec Jackson, Trent Kelley, Traivon Leonard, Spencer Nigh, Jordyn Peters, Jacob Rogers, Prince Micheal Sammons, Sam Sherrod, Bill Taylor and Barrett Tindall. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athletes will also be recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

**AD HONOR ROLL**

» Student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 12 players honored in 2018-19, including current team members Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Tanner Dean, Jack Driscoll, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Erik Piedy, Jacob Rogers, Malcolm Russell, Sam Sherrod and Anthony Schwartz.

**SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL**

» Auburn football had 13 representatives on the 2018-19 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Devonte Booker, Jack Driscoll, Jalil Irvin, Jacob Jasinski, Harold Joiner, Russ Logan, Jackson McFadden, Cameron Payne, Erik Piedy, Jacob Quattlebaum, Malcolm Russell, Cord Sandberg and Brooks Walton.

» First team all-SEC defensive lineman Marlon Davidson, a second team All-American, was selected as the SEC defensive lineman of the week four times this season, recording six tackles, 2.0 TFL and three QB hurries against Tulane and six tackles, 2.5 sacks vs. Kent State.

He added a team-best five tackles, 3.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and fumble recovery at Arkansas, making him the first Auburn player to record multiple sacks, TFL and force/recover a fumble in the same game since Nick Fairley at Alabama in 2010.

Davidson had 48 tackles, 12.5 TFL and 7.5 sacks this season and finished with 175 career tackles, 17.0 sacks (eighth in Auburn history) and 29.5 TFL.

» Senior safety Jeremiah Dinson was a second-team all-SEC selection (AP). Dinson earned SEC defensive player of the week honors with his 13-tackle performance against Oregon; he also had two TFL and a 6-yard sack. Dinson followed that performance up with an interception and team-best six tackles vs. Tulane and a team-high eight tackles vs. Kent State. He had four tackles, a 16-yard sack and a fumble recovery vs. Mississippi State and an interception vs. Samford.

Dinson led the squad with 88 tackles this season and ranked eighth in the SEC in tackles averaging 7.3 per contest.

» Linebacker K.J. Britt earned first team all-SEC honors from AP and second team from the league's coaches. He totaled 69 tackles, 10.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble this season.

» Auburn has held 18 of 53 opponents (16-2 record) below 300 yards total offense in Steele's four seasons. That exceeds the times Auburn held an opponent below 300 in the previous six years combined (14 in 79 games).

» Auburn's defense has allowed only 12 first-quarter touchdowns in the last 42 games, and only 11 in the opening period since the start of 2017 (six this season).

» Auburn has allowed only 18.577 points per game in Kevin Steele's four seasons as coordinator, 10th among FBS teams.

Before 2016, Auburn opponents hadn't been under 24.1 ppg (2010) since 2008 (18.0), the end of seven straight years of holding opponents under 20 ppg.

» Auburn, Alabama, Clemson, Iowa and Washington are the only teams to finish the season ranked in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense each of the last four seasons.

» Auburn has allowed a touchdown on just 71 of its opponents' 153 redzone chances in Steele's tenure as defensive coordinator. The 46.4 redzone touchdown percentage is best in the country since the start of the 2016 season.

» Auburn forced Georgia into nine 3-and-outs and Samford seven; the Tigers average 5.08 3-and-outs/gm (66 total), ranking fourth nationally.

» In 24 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 23.92 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times. Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked foes to 17 or fewer points (18.4%).

» Auburn is third nationally in the FBS allowing just 38 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 111 total TD during that span.

» Auburn ranks 11th nationally allowing less than five yards per play since the start of 2016, allowing 4.93 yards per play during that period (53 games).

» Auburn had at least four TFL in every game this season and ranked 19th nationally (second in SEC) with 86.0 TFL (6.62/gm); the Tigers led the league with 6.71 TFL per game in SEC play.

In 53 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 127 sacks (2.39 per game) and has been held without a sack only seven times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 32 of those games, most recently 13.0 vs. Samford, 11.0 at Florida, 9.0 at Arkansas, 7.0 at Texas A&M and 6.0 at LSU.

The Tigers have forced 76 turnovers (37 INT, 39 FR) and allowed only 34 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» Auburn had two interception returns for touchdowns vs. Alabama, by Smoke Monday (29 yards) and Zakoby McClain (100 yards); McClain's return was the longest by an Auburn player since the 2010 Outback Bowl (Walter McFadden). It's the first time Auburn has had two interception touchdowns in a game since 1994 vs. LSU.

Auburn and Utah (vs. BYU) were the only FBS teams with two pick sixes in a game this season.

At Arkansas, the Auburn defense recorded two interceptions in a game (Javaris Davis, Chandler Wooten) for the first time since last season's Music City Bowl.

Christian Tutt and Jeremiah Dinson recorded interceptions vs. Samford, and Javaris Davis added a pick vs. Minnesota in the Outback Bowl.

» Auburn held Samford to 117 yards of total offense, the fifth time this season the Tigers held an opponent to less than 300 yards total offense and the 18th time in 53 games under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele, compared to just 15 such games in the previous 89 games (back to 2009).

## WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

» With 13 fumble recoveries and 15 forced fumbles this season, Auburn ranked fifth nationally in recoveries and ninth in forced fumbles.

» Auburn recovered four opponent fumbles at Florida, the most for the Tigers in a game since 2002 vs. Mississippi State. Auburn recovered three fumbles in the first quarter; in records dating back through 1996, it was the first game Auburn recovered three fumbles in a quarter. The last time Auburn recovered two fumbles in a quarter was vs. Arkansas in 2017 (third quarter).

» Big Kat Bryant's 83-yard fumble recovery against Oregon was the first of his career and the longest fumble return by Auburn through records back through the 1996 season; the previous long during that period was an 82-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Justin Garrett vs. Louisville in 2015.

» Jeremiah Dinson grabbed the season's first interception with a third-quarter pick against Tulane, his third career interception. Javaris Davis and Chandler Wooten had interceptions at Arkansas, and Roger McCreary had his first career pick at LSU.

Daniel Thomas forced and recovered a fumble at Texas A&M. Zakoby McClain and Owen Pappoe forced fumbles vs. Mississippi State, and Jeremiah Dinson and Jordyn Peters had fumble recoveries against the Bulldogs. Christian Tutt's 57-yard interception return to run out the clock sealed the Ole Miss win.

» Auburn is 32-9 under Gus Malzahn when it wins the turnover battle and 15-6 when turnovers are even, compared to 14-16 when the Tigers lose the turnover battle.

In wins, Auburn has a +39 turnover margin, and in losses, the Tigers are -15 in turnovers during Malzahn's tenure.

The Tigers are 21-5 when they play turnover-free football and 43-17 when they have no more than one turnover under Malzahn.

The Tigers are 19-5 in games when they force multiple turnovers under defensive coordinator Kevin Steele.

» Auburn is 53-20 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 33-9 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 9-11 when it fails to force a turnover.

**FRESHMAN DEBUT**

» SEC freshman of the year Bo Nix was the first true freshman to start an Auburn season opener at quarterback since Travis Tidwell in 1946, a 13-12 Auburn win vs. Southern Miss in Montgomery. Nix was the first SEC true freshman QB to start a season opener since Tennessee's Brent Schaeffer in 2004.

» Nix holds the Auburn freshman records for passing yardage (2,542), pass completions (217), pass attempts (377) and touchdown passes (16). Those totals rank ninth in passing yardage, second in passes attempted, third in passes completed and 10th in touchdown passes for a season at Auburn.

For the season, Nix had a 125.02 efficiency rating, with five 200-yard and two 300-yard passing games. He ends the season with a current string of 191 pass attempts without an interception, an Auburn record.

» Versus Mississippi State, Nix had the first 300-yard passing game of his career, completing 16-21 attempts for 335 yards and two TD. He was also Auburn's leading rusher with 56 yards and a rush TD, earning SEC freshman of the week honors.

Nix posted another 300-yard game vs. Ole Miss, with 30-44 passing for 340 yards. His 340 passing yards were the second-most ever by an Auburn freshman passer, and his 30 completions (T-2) and 44 attempts (4) ranked among the all-time Auburn freshman top five.

» Nix was 13-31 for 177 yards passing with two scores vs. Oregon, going 4-6 on the gamewinning drive, capped by a 26-yard TD to Seth Williams, and converting a 4th-and-3 rushing, earning SEC freshman of the week.

Against Tulane, Nix was 19-37 passing for 207 yards including a 31-yard touchdown pass to Will Hastings. He added TD passes to Eli Stove vs. Kent State and again to Seth Williams at Texas A&M and at Florida.

Nix had three TD passes and a rushing TD at Arkansas, and added rush and pass TDs at LSU and against Georgia. His 50 pass attempts vs. Georgia were fifth-most in a game in Auburn history, and 30 completions tied his own mark for fourth-best ever in a game at Auburn.

**TOTAL OFFENSE**

» Auburn totaled 633 yards of total offense against Kent State, the 21st 600-yard game in program history, the most yards since recording 688 yards vs. ULM in 2016 and 10th-most in program history.

There have been 10 600-yard total offense games and 29 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn.

Under Malzahn, Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 18 times; latest: 200 yards in the third quarter vs. Kent State, and nine times against SEC teams (latest: 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss last year).

» Auburn has scored in all 93 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

» Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 64-93 (.688) games, with 37 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn gained 32 first downs against Kent State, the sixth time the Tigers have gained at least 30 first downs under Malzahn. Auburn averages 21.87 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn has scored first in 32 of its last 44 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including seven times this season. The Tigers are 46-15 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

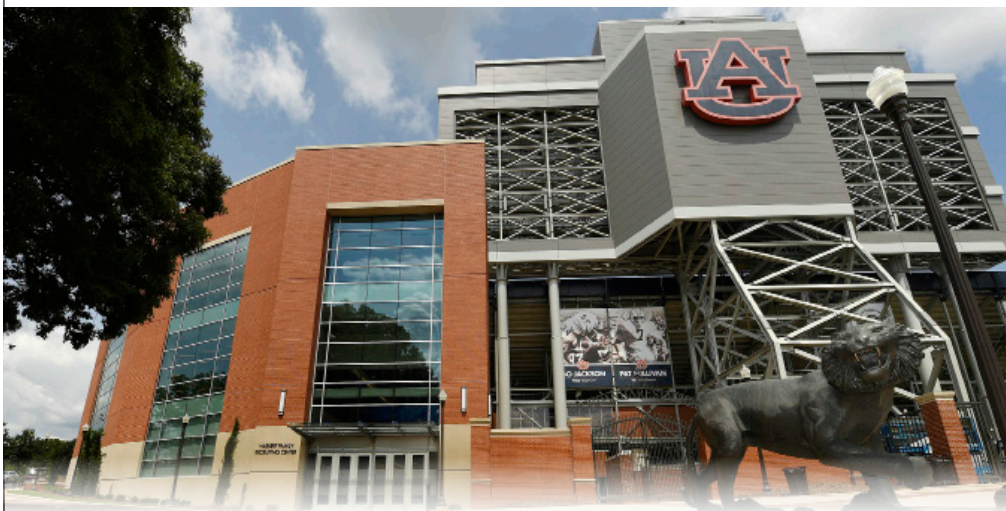

» The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State in 2018 are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 34 times in 92 games, 50+ points 17 times and 60+ points three times.

Auburn scored 50+ points in four games in a season for just the third season in program history; others were in 2010 (6) and in 2016 (4).

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 55 of 93 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Fourteen different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (69 100-yd performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher under Malzahn is 43-12; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 13-0 and 1-0 with three 100-yard rushers.

» The Tigers' 467 rushing yards against Kent State were the sixth most in program history and the most since running for 543 yards vs. Arkansas in 2016.

Auburn had three players with 100+ rush yards - JaTarvious Whitlow/135, Joey Gatewood/102, Shaun Shivers/102 for the first time since 1983 -- Tommie Agee/219, Lionel James/115, Bo Jackson/105 vs. Maryland.

» True freshman D.J. Williams posted his first 100-yard game with 130 yards on 13 carries at LSU, earning SEC freshman of the week honors. His 10.0 yards per carry was the highest average by an Auburn freshman in a SEC game (min. 100 yards) ever. Williams ranks 16th on the Auburn freshman season rushing list with 400 yards and two scores.

» Senior Kam Martin finished 29th among Auburn's career rushing leaders, with 1,564 career yards, eight career rush scores and three 100-yard games. This season, he gained 332 yards on 60 carries with two rush TDs.

» With his 135-yard, 2 TD performance against Kent State, JaTarvious Whitlow became Auburn's 47th career 1,000-yard rusher. Whitlow gained 787 yards as a freshman and started this year with a 110-yard performance vs. Oregon and 96 yards against Tulane, with a 14-yard score. He scored twice in the first quarter vs. Samford and added a 114-yard rushing effort against Alabama.

He scored three first-half rushing touchdowns against Mississippi State, gaining 55 yards on just 10 carries. Whitlow has 16 career rushing touchdowns (10 this season) and two career TD receptions.

With 1,550 career rushing yards, the sophomore ranks 29th among Auburn leaders.

» The Tigers rushed for 1,464 yards after halftime, 21st among FBS teams, including 45 runs of 10+ yards after intermission (t-18th). The Tigers' 24 runs of 10+ yards in the final period tied for 13th-most among FBS teams.

» Auburn tied for 30th nationally with 33 plays from scrimmage of at least 30 yards. The Tigers ranked T-20th nationally with 13 rushes of 30+ yards. Auburn's 31 rushing TD ranked 24th nationally.

» Sophomore Seth Williams led the team with 59 catches for 830 yards and eight touchdowns.

Williams posted his third career 100-yard receiving game with a career-best 13 catches for 121 yards against Georgia.

Williams posted his second 100-yard receiving game with a career-best 161 yards on a eight catches against Mississippi State, including touchdowns of 39 and 32 yards from Bo Nix (most yards in a game by an Auburn receiver since 2014; Sammie Coates 206 vs. Alabama).

Williams is tied for 27th nationally with eight receptions of at least 30 yards, and is T-47th nationally with 13 catches of 20+ yards.

Williams, who scored the game-winning touchdown against Oregon on a 26-yard reception from Bo Nix with just 0:09 remaining, caught three passes for 44 yards on the game-winning drive. He added a 40-yard reception in the win over Tulane and a 9-yard TD catch from Nix at Texas A&M.

After a 32-yard TD reception from Nix at Florida and TD catches of 48 and 15 yards at Arkansas and 5 yards at LSU, Williams now has seven touchdowns for the season and 12 career TD catches. He was the first Auburn player with TD catches in five straight games since Emory Blake (seven games) in 2010-11.

Williams ranks 17th among Auburn career leaders in receiving, with 1,364 yards to date. His 85 career receptions rank 19th among Auburn career leaders.

In his career, 65 of Williams' 85 catches have resulted in either a first down or a touchdown, including TD on six of his red zone receptions and 11 of his 16 catches in the fourth quarter.

» Redshirt junior Eli Stove has surpassed 1,300 career yards from scrimmage (92 catches for 827 yards and three scores and 48 rushing attempts for 503 yards and four TD).

Stove's first score of the 2019 campaign was an 11-yard TD catch from Bo Nix vs. Oregon; he added a 4-yard rushing touchdown against Tulane and a 49-yard TD catch vs. Kent State, the first Tiger to score in three straight games since Kerryon Johnson (2017).

» Anthony Schwartz's 57-yard touchdown run at Texas A&M was a career long for the speedster and Auburn's longest rushing play this season. After adding a 13-yard TD run against Mississippi State, Schwartz recorded a 28-yard catch at Arkansas and now has seven career rushing scores and 10 overall TD. He led the Tigers with nine catches for 89 yards

vs. Ole Miss. This season, 30 of his 52 touches resulted in a TD or first down.

Last year, Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the year and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

» Auburn finished 25-27 in the red zone with 21 TDs in SEC play. The Tigers' 77.78 TD percentage led the SEC in conference play. Over their last five regular-season games, the Tigers converted all 20 of their red-zone chances with 15 TDs.

» Bo Nix' 78-yard pass play to Harold Joiner vs. Ole Miss was Auburn's longest completion of the season and ties for the 13th longest pass play in Auburn records. It's the longest Auburn completion since 2013 (Sammie Coates from Nick Marshall vs. Arkansas, 88 yards).

**N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE**

» Before the Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers score a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interceptions and one missed field goal, the latest being two interception return touchdowns vs. Alabama.

Against Minnesota, Auburn scored on a 96-yard kickoff return by Noah Igbingohene to make Gus Malzahn 19-1 in games with a non-offensive touchdown.

The last time the Tigers had lost a game in which they scored a non-offensive touchdown was at Mississippi State in 2012, when Auburn lost 28-10 despite a 100-yard Oterio McCaleb kickoff return to start the second half.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

» Noah Igbingohene's 96-yard kickoff return touchdown in the Outback Bowl vs. Minnesota was his first of the season and second of his career. It was the first kickoff return for a touchdown by Auburn since a 96-yard return by Igbingohene in the 2018 Arkansas game and the first KOR touchdown in Auburn bowl history.

» Christian Tutt ranked fifth in the country averaging 13.6 yards on 23 punt returns this season. Tutt tied for second nationally with six returns of at least 20 yards. He tied for fourth in the nation with three returns of 30+ yards; his long return was 41 yards vs. Oregon.

» Auburn is one game behind Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (143) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Auburn kickers converted 304 consecutive PAT attempts between the 2013 Tennessee game and this year's Arkansas contest, setting the NCAA record.

Cody Parkey (2013) Daniel Carlson (2014-17), Ian Shannon (2015-18), Anders Carlson (2018-19) and Sage Ledbetter (2017-19) were Auburn's kickers during the streak; Daniel Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The previous NCAA record was 302 consecutive PAT kicks made by Florida State from 2012-16.

» Last season, Anders Carlson was 15-25 on field goals (10-11 inside 40 yds), with two 53-yarders made, 44-44 on PATs and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs.

This season, Carlson was 48-49 on PAT and 18-25 on field goals, with a long of 48 at Florida and four made FG in the Iron Bowl, earning him SEC special teams player of the week honors. He was 47-78 on touchbacks on kickoffs.

» With 665 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (734 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally in 2018 in net punting (41.91), the highest net average at Auburn back through 1996. Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards.

Siposs ranked 28th nationally in 2019 with a 43.8 average. His 10 punts at LSU were a career high, and he had three punts for 50+ yards vs. Georgia.

**AVERAGE PER DOWN**

» Here's a breakdown of Auburn's offensive production on first, second, third and fourth down, in terms of the plays run, yards gained and average gain:

- 1st:** 414 att, 2,507 yds, 6.06 avg
- 2nd:** 316 att, 1,799 yds, 5.69 avg
- 3rd:** 190 att, 866 yds, 4.56 avg
- 4th:** 13 att, 70 yds, 5.38 avg

» Auburn's offensive TDs have come 27 times on first down (15 rush, 12 pass), 15 times on second (11 rush, 4 pass), five times on third down (3 rush, 2 pass) and four times on fourth down (2 rush, 2 pass).

**RANKINGS**

» Auburn's 2019 schedule included six of the teams in the final AP Top 10: #1 LSU, #4 Georgia, #5 Oregon, #6 Florida, #8 Alabama and #10 Minnesota.

» Auburn's wins over then-#11 Oregon and #17 Texas A&M were two of only 36 over top 25 opponents away from home this season in the FBS; Auburn, Georgia, LSU, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Penn State, Wisconsin and Arizona State were the only teams with three wins over teams ranked in the Top 20 at the time.

It's the first time since 1974 Auburn has beaten two ranked teams in its first four games of a season (#14 Tennessee, #16 Miami).

» Auburn is 113-163-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 522-42-2 at home against ranked teams, 28-70-2 on the road and 33-51-2 on a neutral field.

» Auburn has played 42 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 93 games as the Tigers' head coach (45.2 percent of total games, most of any Auburn coach). Of those, 24 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 19-23 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including 8-16 against Top 10 teams.

» This is the third time under Coach Gus Malzahn that Auburn has defeated three AP Top 20 opponents (also 2013 and 2014).

» Auburn is 16-19 all-time against ranked non-conference opponents in regular-season action, including 10-7 at home, 3-7 on the road and 3-5 at neutral-site locations.

» The Oregon game was the fifth time in Malzahn's seven seasons as head coach the Tigers played a regular-season non-conference game against a ranked opponent (3-2 record). Prior to Malzahn's tenure, Auburn had only played four such games in the previous 22 seasons combined.

» Auburn is the only FBS team to open the last two seasons with a win over an AP-ranked opponent (#6 Washington, #11 Oregon).

» The Tigers are 89-131-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (42-33-2 at home, 28-63-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 58-51-3 overall (28-10-1 at home, 19-31-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 327-119-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 185-32-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 141-87-4 all-time.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 80-75-4 (35-13-1 at home, 22-39-1 away and 23-23-2 on a neutral field).

#### MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» Auburn faced an FBS-best six opponents that finished the season with 11 wins or more.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 324-253-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 137-60-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 187-192-12 overall. The Tigers are 33-22 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since SEC action began in 1933 is 254-69-6. Auburn's non-conference record during the Malzahn era is 27-6.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 149-28 (.842) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 205-36-1 (.849) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 545-56-9 (.901) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 341-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 173-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 81-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» On the 2019 squad, 43 players had at least one college start to their credit, 24 on offense and 19 on defense.

Eleven Tigers had at least 20 starts: Marlon Davidson 51, Jack Driscoll 45, Derrick Brown 39, Javaris Davis 37, Jeremiah Dinson 36, Mike Horton 32, Prince Tega Wanogho 32, Marquel Harrell 32, Daniel Thomas 28, Eli Stove 22 and Noah Igbinoghene 22.

» Tigers earned 14 SEC weekly player of the week awards: Derrick Brown (DL/3), Marlon Davidson (DL/4), Jeremiah Dinson (DPOW), Zakoby McClain (DPOW), Anders Carlson (STPOW), Mike Horton (OL), Bo Nix (FR/2), D.J. Williams (FR). Auburn is the first team ever to win seven DL of the week awards in a season.

#### SEC LEGEND: KARLOS DANSBY

» A linebacker at Auburn from 2000-03, Dansby earned All-America honors as a senior, recording 84 tackles, 5.5 quarterback sacks, 13 tackles for loss and four caused fumbles while helping an Auburn defense that finished fifth nationally in total defense. Twice first team all-SEC, Dansby recorded 218 tackles, 10 sacks, 31 TFL and eight interceptions. The 2003 Atlanta Touchdown Club DB of the Year, Dansby helped Auburn to a pair of SEC West titles. A 2004 second-round pick of the Arizona Cardinals, Dansby enjoyed a 14-year NFL career with four teams, becoming one of five players in NFL history to record 40 career sacks and 20 interceptions. He concluded his career with 1,417 tackles, 43 sacks, 127 tackles for loss and 20 interceptions in 212 games.

**GUS MALZAHN » HEAD COACH**

**FAST FACTS**

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.

» Now in his seventh season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **62**, **Gus Malzahn (6)**; **48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **29**, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4).

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 25 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season four times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 46-11 (807) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018 and 6-1 in 2019 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In eight seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 76 of 93 games (81%).

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, and coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 415 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 327, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .792 against some of the best teams in college football.

Nine years ago, Auburn beat Oregon on a last-second field goal. On Saturday night, quarterback Bo Nix didn't want to put it on the kicker again. Instead, the true freshman tossed a 26-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams with nine seconds left to lead the Tigers past Oregon, 27-21, in the season opener.

On the play before, Nix completed a 13-yard pass to Williams to put the Tigers in field-goal range with a chance to win. But rather than play it safe, he took a shot on the next play, throwing a jump ball to Williams who wrestled it away from the defender at the goal line.

The touchdown gave Auburn its first lead of the game and capped a 15-point second-half comeback. It was the largest comeback since the 2010 Alabama game when the Tigers overcame a 24-point deficit to win 28-27.

What changed? For starters, the defense clamped down in the second half and made a huge stop on fourth down midway through the fourth quarter to thwart an Oregon drive and keep it a one-point game. The offense also found its rhythm with Nix under center.

Nix, the first true freshman to start at quarterback for Auburn since 1946, threw for 177 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 42 yards in his first college game. His first career touchdown pass came late in the third quarter when he threw a quick pass to Eli Stove who took it in from 11 yards out to cut the Oregon lead to 21-13.

On the opening drive of the fourth quarter, Auburn used a heavy dose of running back Ja'Tarvious Whitlow to get down to the goal line where it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who took his first snap and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 21-20.

Whitlow recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 110 yards on 24 carries. The sophomore also surpassed 1,000 career all-purpose yards (897 rushing, 173 receiving). As a team, the Tigers ran for 206 yards and threw for 177 yards in Saturday's win.

Defensively, senior safety Jeremiah Dinson led Auburn with 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack - the third of his career. K.J. Britt, making his first at middle linebacker, finished second on the team with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

It was also a career night for defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell, another first-time starter, who made two clutch stops late and recorded six tackles, one tackle for loss and half a sack.

At the half, Auburn trailed, 14-6, and it could have been worse if not for an 83-yard fumble recovery from Big Kat Bryant that led to an Anders Carlson field goal and swung the momentum. It was the longest fumble return by an Auburn player through records dating back to 1996.

With the win, the Tigers open the season 1-0 for the third straight year. They will return home next week to face Tulane in the first game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn did not allow a touchdown in the No. 10 Tigers' 24-6 home-opening win Saturday over Tulane.

"Defensively, we did a super job against an offense that's been averaging a lot of points and a lot of yards rushing," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "They were 2-of-15 on third down. It was just a great third-down plan and execution."

Jeremiah Dinson's interception led to a touchdown as the Tigers shut out the Green Wave in the second half.

"The defensive line got a good push," Dinson said. "The quarterback tried to hit the tight end and the ball was in the air for a long time. I was the middle field safety, just ran it down and made a play."

After Dinson picked off Tulane at Auburn's 18-yard line, the Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays with Ja'Tarvious Whitlow rushing for a 14-yard touchdown and a 21-6 Auburn lead with 1:51 left in the third quarter.

Whitlow led Auburn with 96 yards on 23 carries.

Anders Carlson kicked a 22-yard field goal with 12:36 left in the game for the final score.

Bo Nix completed 19 of 37 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown.

"The offense played well in the second half and the defense played lights out the entire game," said Nix, who made his Jordan-Hare Stadium debut. "In college football, any win is great."

Dinson, Daniel Thomas and Marlon Davidson paced Auburn's defense with six tackles each. Davidson made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

The Tigers gained 152 of their 172 rushing yards in the second half, outgaining Tulane 379-223 for the game.

"Second half, we changed it up a little bit and we got our groove," offensive lineman Jack Driscoll said. "In big-time games coming up, we've got to be able to establish the run in the first half."

Trailing 3-0 after the first quarter, Nix hit Will Hastings for a 31-yard touchdown pass to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 12:54 left in the half. Hastings gained 75 yards on five receptions.

"It felt really, really good," said Hastings, who rehabilitated from two knee surgeries in the past 18 months. "It was awesome getting in the end zone and celebrating with my teammates."

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix connected with Seth Williams for a 40-yard gain to Tulane's 1.

Eli Stove capped the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run to increase Auburn's lead to 14-3. Tulane kicked a 32-yard field goal with 40 seconds left in the second quarter to make it 14-6 at the half.

A crowd of 85,317 attended the Tigers' home opener. Auburn (2-0) remains at home next week, hosting Kent State at 6 p.m. CT for Homecoming.

"I think it's a quality win and we took care of business," Malzahn said. "They played extremely hard and that was a quality opponent. We're 2-0 and we're looking forward to playing at home next week."

Revvng up the running game, No. 8 Auburn rushed for 467 yards and six touchdowns in a 55-16 Homecoming win over Kent State Saturday in the Tigers' tune-up for SEC play.

JaTarvious Whitlow gained 135 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns. Shaun Shivers and Joey Gatewood each rushed for 102 yards. It's the first time since 1983 a trio of Auburn rushers has topped the 100-yard mark.

Kam Martin added 71 yards and a touchdown on seven carries. Quarterbacks Bo Nix (one) and Gatewood (two) added rushing touchdowns. The Tigers averaged 7.5 yards on 62 carries.

SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week Marlon Davidson recorded 2.5 of Auburn's five sacks. Tyrone Truesdell had 1.5 sacks with Big Kat Bryant getting one.

After Kent State kicked a field goal on the game's opening drive, Auburn answered with Whitlow rushing for a 3-yard TD with 5:47 left in the first quarter to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead.

Martin made it 14-3 on a 35-yard scoring run with 11 seconds remaining in the opening quarter.

After a Kent State 53-yard touchdown pass, Nix hit Sal Cannella on a 27-yard pass to set up Nix's 1-yard TD run.

Anders Carlson kicked a 45-yard field goal at the end of the half to give Auburn a 24-10 halftime lead.

Whitlow scored his second rushing touchdown on the opening drive of the second half putting the Tigers on top 31-10.

Nix hit Eli Stove on a 49-yard flea-flicker for a 38-10 Auburn lead. Nix was 12 of 16 for 161 yards and a touchdown.

Shivers' 27-yard run set up Carlson's second field goal, a 37-yarder on the opening play of the fourth quarter to make it 41-10.

After Kent State's second touchdown, Malcolm Askew intercepted the Golden Flashes' pass to negate a two-point attempt.

Gatewood scored on a pair of 2-yard runs in the fourth quarter.

A Homecoming crowd of 84,542 saw the Tigers improve to 26-6 in non-conference games in the Malzahn era.

Auburn (3-0) plays its SEC opener next Saturday at Texas A&M at 2:30 p.m. CT on CBS.

Auburn's perfect record in Kyle Field remains intact after the 8th-ranked Tigers went on the road Saturday and knocked off No. 17 Texas A&M, 28-20, in their first SEC game of 2019. With the win, Auburn is now 4-0 all-time in College Station.

The Tigers struck early and often in Saturday's contest. On their opening drive, sophomore wide receiver Anthony Schwartz took a reverse and went 57 yards to the house to make it 7-0. It was Auburn's longest rush of the season and the longest rush in Schwartz's career. It was also the longest rush by any Auburn in the series against Texas A&M.

Two drives later, Auburn found the end zone again. This time, it was backup quarterback Joey Gatewood who connected with John Samuel Shenker on a six-yard touchdown pass. For Gatewood, it was his first career touchdown pass.

The Tigers took a 14-3 lead into the locker room at halftime.

In the second half, it was the Auburn defense that served as the catalyst. After allowing just 12 yards rushing to Texas A&M in the first half, the Tigers caused a turnover on the first play of the second half when safety Daniel Thomas forced a fumble and recovered it himself.

The turnover led to another Auburn score as starting quarterback Bo Nix marched the offense down the field and found Seth Williams for a 9-yard touchdown reception to make it 21-3.

Nix, a true freshman who was playing in his first true road game, finished 12 of 20 through the air for 100 yards and the touchdown. He also rushed 12 times for 38 yards, including a 7-yard run on third-and-five late in the fourth quarter to put the game away.

As a team, the Tigers outgained Texas A&M on the ground, 193-56.

The Aggies didn't score their first touchdown until early in the fourth quarter, but Auburn responded with a 12-play, 69-yard drive that took over six minutes and was capped off by an 8-yard touchdown run from JaTarvious Whitlow. The sophomore running back led the Tigers with 67 yards on 18 carries.

Senior Derrick Brown was dominant for the Auburn defense with four tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks, two pass break-ups and a forced fumble. The two sacks and three tackles for loss were single-game career highs for the preseason All-American.

Fellow defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell also added a sack, and the Tigers won the battle up front as they recorded seven tackles for loss, seven quarterback hurries and held Texas A&M to just 56 yards rushing, the fewest by the Aggies all-time in the series.

Auburn, who is now 49-32-5 all-time in SEC openers, moves to 4-0 on the season and will return home to face Mississippi State next Saturday. The game is set to kick off from Jordan-Hare Stadium at 6 p.m. CT and will be televised on ESPN.

A touchdown on the Tigers' first offensive play set the tone Saturday in No. 7 Auburn's 56-23 dismantling of Mississippi State at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

"I'm really excited about the win tonight," Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn said. "The way the game started, our fans were electric and really got into the game and helped us. Our defense and special teams gave the offense some short fields, and they capitalized with touchdowns. It really gave us some momentum."

Quarterback Bo Nix completed 16 of 21 passes for 335 yards and two touchdowns, adding 56 rushing yards and a third touchdown.

Auburn (5-0) scored six touchdowns in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission. Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.

The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19. Nix scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second touchdown from three yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark. Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss. "Overall, I'm proud of our team," Malzahn said. "We had a big, emotional win last week on the road, and it could have been easy to let up or look forward to the next game. Our guys didn't do that. We played our best football game as a team to date tonight."

No. 7 Auburn suffered its first loss of the season Saturday as the Tigers dropped a 24-13 contest on the road at No. 10 Florida.

"Disappointing loss," Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn said. "We've got a very disappointed locker room. Our guys fought. Our defense played outstanding, had four turnovers, gave the offense the ball on some short fields. We just didn't get it done offensively. That starts with me. I have to do a better job of preparing our guys and having our guys ready."

The Gators struck first with a long touchdown on their first possession, but the Auburn defense responded with three turnovers on the next four Florida drives. Two of the turnovers led to field goals (48, 39) by Anders Carlson, who made it 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Sophomore Christian Tutt forced the first turnover when he sacked Florida quarterback Kyle Trask and jarred the ball loose. Chandler Wooten fell in on it for the fumble recovery. It was the first career forced fumble for Tutt and first career fumble recovery for Wooten.

Then, on the very next Florida possession, Auburn linebacker K.J. Britt made a big hit on the running back to pop the ball loose. This time, it was defensive lineman Tyrone Truesdell who came up with it for his second career fumble recovery.

And then with Florida knocking on the door late in the quarter, it was the Auburn defense that came up with yet another fumble and recovery. Senior Marlon Davidson shot off the edge and hit Trask just as he was trying to throw the football. Fellow defensive lineman Derrick Brown picked up the loose ball and returned it 42 yards.

In records dating back through 1996, this was the first game the Tigers recovered three fumbles in a quarter.

The Auburn offense found the end zone early in the second quarter when, on the first play after a failed fake punt attempt, quarterback Bo Nix connected with Seth Williams on a 32-yard touchdown pass. It was Nix's eighth touchdown pass this season, and the fifth receiving touchdown for Williams, who now has 10 for his career.

Williams led the Tigers with four catches for 79 yards and the touchdown. Auburn still trailed 17-13 at the half, and it stayed that way for most of the second half until late in the fourth quarter when Florida extended the lead with an 88-yard touchdown run from Lamical Perine.

Prior to that, Brown made another game-changing play early in the fourth quarter when he got to Trask, knocked the ball away and then grabbed it out of the air for his second fumble recovery of the game. The last Auburn player to with two fumble recoveries in a game was Montravius Adams at Mississippi State in 2016.

As a unit, the Auburn defense finished with seven tackles for loss, four sacks and the four fumble recoveries. Sophomore linebacker Zakoby McClain led the way with 10 tackles.

The Tigers are now 5-1 (2-1) heading into an open week, and then in two weeks, it's back on the road for another SEC tilt at Arkansas.

Marlon Davidson and Derrick Brown set the tone on the opening series while the Tigers' quick-strike offense scored seven touchdowns in No. 11 Auburn's 51-10 SEC West victory at Arkansas.

Arkansas won the toss and elected to receive, hoping to gain early momentum. Instead, it was Auburn's defense making a statement from the get-go.

On the second play, the 320-pound Brown ran down Razorbacks running back Rakeem Boyd for no gain. On the next play, Davidson sacked quarterback Ben Hicks, forcing and recovering a fumble at the Arkansas 22-yard line.

Two Bo Nix passes to Anthony Schwartz gained 18 yards, then Nix kept for a 4-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 Auburn lead with 12:38 left in the first quarter.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Kam Martin began another three-play touchdown drive by racing down the right sideline 52 yards to the Razorbacks' 11-yard-line.

Shaun Shivers' 6-yard TD run put Auburn ahead 14-0 fewer than five minutes into the game.

Auburn made it 17-0 with 51 seconds left in the first quarter on Anders Carlson's 44-yard field goal, capping a 13-play, 55-yard drive.

Davidson recorded his second sack on third-and-8 early in the second quarter. On the next play, Chandler Wooten made his first career interception on Arkansas' fake punt pass.

The Razorbacks kicked a 27-yard field goal after a 16-play, 77-yard drive that took half of the third quarter to make it 17-3.

Auburn answered quickly, scoring 14 points in 22 seconds, with Nix hitting Seth Williams for a 48-yard touchdown pass at the 4:10 mark of the third quarter.

Carlson's extra point was Auburn's 303rd consecutive PAT, an NCAA record streak that started in 2013.

Javaris Davis' diving interception immediately regained possession for Auburn, then after Schwartz gained 28 yards on a reverse, Nix and Schwartz combined for a 28-yard touchdown pass and 31-3 Auburn lead.

Arkansas scored its only touchdown on a 45-yard pass after recovering a fumble, trimming Auburn's lead to 31-10 after three quarters.

Nix and Williams hooked up for their second touchdown of the game and seventh TD of the season to put Auburn on top 37-10. After 304 consecutive PATS, Auburn missed the extra-point try.

Joey Gatewood relieved Nix and completed a 17-yard touchdown pass to Jay Jay Wilson, his first Auburn TD.

Harold Joiner capped the scoring with a 32-yard touchdown run.

Davidson, Brown, Roger McCreary and Jamien Sherwood each tallied five tackles to lead Auburn's defense. Michael Harris recovered a fumble for Auburn's fourth takeaway.

Auburn improved to 9-0 after open dates under Malzahn. The Tigers (6-1, 3-1) play their final road game of the regular season next Saturday at LSU at 2:30 p.m. CT.

No. 9 Auburn, playing in its second top-10 matchup this month, held No. 2 LSU to a season-low 23 points Saturday, but the upset bid from the visiting Tigers came up short in a 23-20 loss on the road.

Auburn was up to the challenge early, holding LSU to 47 total yards and no points in the first quarter. It was only the second quarter this season that LSU was held scoreless. Thanks to a 30-yard field goal from Anders Carlson, Auburn led 3-0 after the first quarter.

Following an LSU touchdown, Auburn answered with a touchdown of its own when quarterback Bo Nix took it in from a yard out on 4th-and-1 to give his team the lead back late in the first half. The drive started deep in LSU territory after Jeremiah Dinson forced a fumble on a punt return that was recovered by teammate Jamien Sherwood.

LSU tacked on a late field goal to tie the score, 10-10, going into the locker room at halftime.

Auburn jumped out early in the second half behind a 70-yard run from freshman D.J. Williams that led to another Carlson field goal to put the visitors back on top, 13-10. Williams recorded his first career 100-yard rushing performance with 130 yards on 13 carries.

It was the defense's turn after that as Auburn came up with two critical stops in the third quarter to keep LSU off the board. First, the defense made a goal-line stand. Auburn stuffed three straight runs inside the 3-yard line, and on 4th-and-goal, Dinson and Noah Igbinoghene converged to make the tackle for no gain on a screen pass. Then, on the very next drive, sophomore cornerback Roger McCreary intercepted LSU quarterback Joe Burrow at the 1-yard line.

For McCreary, it was his first career interception at Auburn. It was only the fourth interception thrown by Burrow this year.

Burrow and the LSU offense responded, however, with a touchdown late in the third quarter and then another one early in the fourth to take a 23-13 lead.

But Auburn continued to fight and with less than three minutes to go, Nix connected with Seth Williams on a 5-yard touchdown pass to make it 23-20. The sophomore wide receiver led the team with four catches for 65 yards and the touchdown, and he also became the 28th player in Auburn history to go over 1,000 career receiving yards.

The ensuing onside kick was recovered by LSU, which all but sealed the outcome.

Defensively, five different Auburn players finished with 10 or more tackles - led by Dinson, who tied his career high with 15 tackles. Freshman linebacker Owen Pappoe also had a career high in tackles with seven and recorded 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

It was another outstanding performance from senior defensive lineman Derrick Brown, who finished with seven tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack.

After being on the road the entire month of October, Auburn (6-2, 3-2) will return home for four straight home games in November, beginning with Ole Miss next Saturday. The game is scheduled to kickoff at 6 p.m. CT and will be televised on ESPN.

Auburn (5-0) scored six touchdowns in the first half and led 42-9 at intermission.  
 Ja'Tarvious Whitlow scored three touchdowns in the first half, including a 30-yarder on Auburn's first play.  
 The Tigers forced three-and-outs on State's first two possessions, after which the Bulldogs' rushing yardage was minus-19.  
 Nix scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 14-0 lead with 9:46 left in the first quarter.

After Jordyn Peters recovered a fumble at State's 18-yard line, Malik Miller's block paved the way for Anthony Schwartz on a 13-yard TD sweep to make it 21-0 just six minutes into the game.

After a Mississippi State touchdown, Whitlow scored his second touchdown from three yards out to put Auburn ahead 28-6 with 13:18 left in the second quarter.

Nix's 39-yard touchdown pass to Seth Williams gave Auburn a 35-9 lead at the 5:33 mark.  
 Jeremiah Dinson recovered a fumble late in the half. Nix connected with Schwartz for a 48-yard pass, the game's longest play. With 12 seconds left in the half, Whitlow scored his third touchdown.

Auburn kept the pressure on in the second half, scoring on the opening drive on Nix's 32-yard pass to Williams. Nix and Williams teamed up eight times for 161 yards and two touchdowns. Nix went over the 300-yard mark for the first time in his Auburn career on a 31-yard pass to Sal Cannella.

Kam Martin scored Auburn's final touchdown on a 7-yard run with 14:16 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers gained 578 yards.

Auburn forced two turnovers and limited State's Kylin Hill, the SEC's leading rusher, to 45 yards on 17 carries, a 2.6 per carry average, less than half of his 6.1 average.

Daniel Thomas led Auburn with six tackles. K.J. Britt added five, including two of the Tigers' five tackles for loss.  
 "Overall, I'm proud of our team," Malzahn said. "We had a big, emotional win last week on the road, and it could have been easy to let up or look forward to the next game. Our guys didn't do that. We played our best football game as a team to date tonight."

No. 13 Auburn rallied for two fourth-quarter touchdowns to earn two opportunities for game-tying drives before falling 21-14 Saturday to No. 5 Georgia at a sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Deep South's Oldest Rivalry.

Trailing 21-0 after three quarters, Auburn's comeback began with Bo Nix's 3-yard touchdown pass to Eli Stove with 10:04 left in the fourth quarter, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

After a three-and-out by Auburn's defense, Auburn struck quickly, driving 57 yards on five plays in 68 seconds. Nix's 2-yard touchdown run, the first rushing TD allowed by Georgia this season, pulled Auburn within seven points with 7:03 remaining.

Again, the Tigers' defense came through, forcing a three-and-out to regain possession for Auburn at its 28-yard line with 6 minutes to play.

On fourth-and-5 from midfield, Nix scrambled for 8 yards to keep Auburn's hopes alive at Georgia's 42.  
 On fourth-and-2 at UGA's 34, Nix's pass to Harold Joiner was incomplete, giving the ball back to Georgia.

Once again, Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, giving the Tigers' possession at Auburn's 30 with 2:03 to play, but the Tigers were unable to get any closer.

Nix completed 30 of 50 passes for 245 yards and touchdown, adding 42 rushing yards on 13 carries and a TD.  
 Seth Williams made 13 receptions for 121 yards. Jeremiah Dinson led the defensive effort with eight tackles, while Daniel Thomas made two of Auburn's five tackles for loss.

Auburn trailed 21-0 heading to the fourth quarter after Georgia drove 88 yards on 12 plays, scoring on Jake Fromm's third touchdown pass, a 5-yarder to Eli Wolf with 13 seconds remaining in the third quarter.

Auburn found success in the first half with slants to Williams. On the game's opening possession, Nix and Williams teamed up three times for 22 yards, twice picking up first downs and driving to Georgia's 29 before Auburn missed a 47-yard field goal.

Auburn then forced a three-and-out on Georgia's first possession, but the Bulldogs scored on their second drive on a 51-yard touchdown pass from Fromm to Dominick Blaylock for a 7-0 lead with 5:56 left in the first quarter.

Near the end of the quarter, Auburn defensive linemen Derrick Brown and Marlon Davidson made tackles for loss on successive plays, with Brown's TFL on second-and-10 preceding Davidson's sack on third-and-12.

Auburn drove again into Georgia territory before being stopped on fourth-and-1 from the 37.

The Tigers' defense delivered three consecutive three-and-outs, allowing zero yards on nine plays.  
 After the second three-and-out, Nix and Williams connected on another slant for 28 yards, Auburn's biggest play of the half, advancing to Auburn's 45. In the half, Williams made seven receptions for 66 yards.

On third-and-9, Nix found Anthony Schwartz for 10 yards to Georgia's 44, but the Bulldogs recovered a fumble on the next play to end the drive.

Holding Samford to 114 yards while forcing four turnovers, No. 16 Auburn tuned up for the Iron Bowl with a 52-0 shutout Saturday at rainy Jordan-Hare Stadium.

"Any time you shut out an opponent in college football, that's really something," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "I thought our offense did a good job on the ground and through the air."

In the first half, Auburn held the Bulldogs to 35 yards while recovering two fumbles and making an interception. The takeaway parade began on the game's opening drive, when Christian Tutt recovered a fourth-down fumble and returned it 8 yards to midfield.

Auburn promptly drove 51 yards in nine plays with JaTarvious Whitlow's 1-yard touchdown run giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead. Jeremiah Dinson intercepted Samford's next play.

Whitlow made it 14-0 Auburn early in the second quarter with a 3-yard touchdown run after a 31-yard gain. Auburn forced a third consecutive three-and-out, setting up Nix's 10-yard touchdown pass to Harold Joiner. Nix's 185 completions broke Stan White's freshman season record from 1990 and his 14th touchdown pass tied White's mark. He needs 49 more passing yards to break White's freshman record of 2,242.

Nix was 15 of 23 for 150 yards and a touchdown. Auburn gained 544 yards, including 293 rushing yards.

On back-to-back plays, Zakoby McClain made a tackle for a loss and forced a fumble, which Roger McCreary returned 15 yards to Samford's 19, Auburn's third turnover of the first half.

Auburn scored quickly, needing only three plays to make it 28-0 on Shaun Shivers' 4-yard touchdown run at the 7:14 mark of the second quarter.

Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal gave Auburn a 31-0 halftime lead. Early in the third quarter, Tutt returned an interception, Auburn's fourth takeaway, 26 yards to Samford's 9. Two plays later, D.J. Williams put Auburn ahead 38-0 with a 2-yard touchdown run.

Cord Sandberg relieved Nix and threw a pair of fourth-quarter touchdown passes to Zach Farrar covering 27 and 4 yards, respectively. Sandberg was 5-for-7 for 84 yards and two touchdowns, adding 31 rushing yards on six carries.

"To protect the football with no turnovers, there were a lot of different people who touched the ball. That's a really good plus carrying forward."

Auburn made 13 tackles for loss, including 2.5 from Marlon Davidson, who also had a sack. Caleb Johnson had Auburn's other sack.

Kick Six, meet the Pick Six twins. On the sixth anniversary of Chris Davis' Iron Bowl winning kick return, No. 16 Auburn returned two interceptions for touchdowns, Anders Carlson kicked four long field goals and Shaun Shivers scored the game-winning touchdown in a back-and-forth 48-45 victory over No. 5 Alabama.

"Big win for us," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "So proud of our team. We hung in there, found a way to win at the end. Just an electric environment. So thankful for our fans. This is the best atmosphere in college football."

Smoke Monday and Zakoby McClain both returned interceptions to put the Tigers in front, but each time, the visitors responded with quick touchdowns in a game that featured 11 lead changes.

After Jaylen Waddle's fourth touchdown gave Alabama a 45-40 lead early in the fourth quarter, Auburn answered with a 77-yard game-winning drive, with Shivers crashing in on a sweep from the 11 for the go-ahead score. Bo Nix passed to Shedrick Jackson to put Auburn on top 48-45 with 8:08 remaining.

"I made a big play at the end of the game," Shivers said. "It's a big thing because it's the Iron Bowl, the best rivalry in college football. This goes down in the book. Everybody will be talking about this for years."

There was still work to do. Alabama drove to Auburn's 10 before a potential game-tying 30-yard field goal attempt bounced off the upright with two minutes to play.

Needing one first down to run out the clock, the Tigers confused Alabama on fourth down by lining up Arryn Siposs at receiver with the regular offensive unit, resulting in an illegal substitution penalty on UA that effectively secured the win.

Auburn trailed 31-27 after a wild first half. After an early Alabama field goal, Christian Tutt's 36-yard punt return set up Bo Nix's 7-yard touchdown run with 2:07 left in the first quarter.

After Najee Harris' 6-yard TD run put Alabama ahead 10-7, Carlson kicked his first field goal, a 43-yarder, to tie it at 10-10. Playing centerfield, Monday intercepted an overthrown pass, returning it 29 yards to give Auburn a 17-10 lead with 5:36 left in the half. Waddle returned the ensuing kick 98 yards to even the score at 17-17, then after an Auburn fumble, Alabama took a 24-17 lead on a 3-yard touchdown pass with 4:12 to go.

Auburn drove 75 yards, with Seth Williams, Will Hastings and Sal Cannella all making highlight-reel catches on the left sideline. Cannella's 14-yard touchdown catch again evened the score at 24-24 with 1:06 remaining in the half.

Waddle's second touchdown, a 58-yard reception, put Alabama back on top 31-24 with only 33 seconds left in the half, but Auburn drove to the 34 with one second left, allowing Carlson to drill a 52-yarder to make it 31-27 as the half expired.

Carlson connected from 43 yards early in the third quarter to pull the Tigers within one point at 31-30.

Alabama drove to Auburn's 2-yard line, but Zakoby McClain intercepted a tipped pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards to give Auburn a 37-31 lead. Waddle's third touchdown, a 12-yarder, regained the lead for Alabama at 38-37 with 4:57 to go in the third quarter. Carlson's fourth field goal, a 44-yarder, gave Auburn the lead once more at 40-38 with 49 seconds left in the third quarter.

Waddle scored again early in the fourth quarter on a 28-yard pass to give Alabama a 45-40 lead, setting the stage for Shivers' game-winning score on an 11-play drive that consumed five and a half minutes.

There were some early fireworks from No. 12 Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl, but it wouldn't be enough as the Tigers' bid for 10 wins fell short with a 31-24 loss to No. 18 Minnesota on Wednesday.

"Bottom line is they made plays," Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn said. "They made the plays to win the game when the game was on the line, so you have to give them credit. We didn't overlook them. I think our guys were ready to play. I think our guys played hard. But they made the plays. We didn't."

Auburn started the game on defense where linebacker K.J. Britt made a tackle for loss on the opening play, and then three plays later, senior cornerback Javaris Davis intercepted Minnesota quarterback Tanner Morgan and returned it 23 yards to the Gophers' 17-yard line.

The turnover led to three points as Anders Carlson drilled a 24-yard field goal to give the Tigers the early 3-0 advantage.

After Minnesota tied the game with a field goal, Auburn answered immediately with another big play. This time, it was on special teams as Noah Igbinoghene returned the ensuing kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. The junior cornerback found a seam thanks to a block from teammate Matthew Hill, and once he found daylight, there was nobody catching him.

It's the first kickoff return for a touchdown by Auburn since a 96-yard return by Igbinoghene in 2018 against Arkansas, and it's the first in Auburn bowl history. It also matched the longest kickoff return for a touchdown in Outback Bowl history.

Minnesota scored the next 14 points to take its first lead of the game, but the lead didn't last long as the Auburn offense put together a 7-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 37-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Sal Cannella on a critical 4th-and-5 play.

Nix, the SEC Freshman of the Year, escaped to his right and found Cannella wide open in the middle of the field. It was a career-long reception for Cannella and his second score of the season. It was the 16th touchdown pass of the season for Nix, who added to his season-long freshman records at Auburn with 17 completions (217) for 176 yards (2,542) and the lone score (16) Wednesday.

Minnesota reclaimed the lead with another touchdown drive before the half and took a 24-17 lead into the locker room at the intermission.

In the second half, Auburn struck first with another long scoring drive midway through the third quarter and tied the game when sophomore running back Ja'Tarvious Whitlow leaped into the end zone on a 3-yard touchdown run. The Tigers went 86 yards on 13 plays, and the touchdown from Whitlow was his 10th of the season on the ground.

The Auburn defense responded with a three-and-out on the next drive and then made a critical fourth-down stop early in the fourth quarter to keep the score even.

Minnesota would finally break through with 10:26 left when Morgan connected with Tyler Johnson for 73 yards and the go-ahead touchdown. Johnson finished with 12 receptions for 204 yards and two touchdowns to earn MVP honors.

Defensively, Jeremiah Dinson led the Tigers with nine tackles. The safety was part of a senior class at Auburn that all opted to play in the bowl game and finish their careers together. The group also included Derrick Brown, the SEC Defensive Player of the Year, and Marlon Davidson, a First-Team All-SEC selection.

Brown recorded five tackles in what was his final game wearing an Auburn uniform.

"I really appreciate our seniors," Malzahn said. "They just did an outstanding job their whole career. I'm disappointed for them that we couldn't get them out with a victory. They led us today and played extremely hard."

Highlighted by wins over Alabama and Oregon, Auburn finished the season at 9-4. All four losses came to teams ranked in the top 20 of the College Football Playoff rankings.
