GUS MALZAHN HEAD COACH | 8TH SEASON

In seven years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to seven consecutive bowl games, a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and an appearance in the 2014 BCS National Championship Game. Malzahn has directed Auburn to five New Year's Day bowl games.

Malzahn, 71-34 in eight seasons as a head coach, has directed teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 14 seasons as a collegiate coach, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship win over Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The second-longest active tenured head coach at one school in the SEC, Malzahn is one of only nine active FBS head coaches that have played in a national championship game. During his time at Auburn, the Tigers are one of three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

Last season the Tigers had one of the nation's most difficult schedules while posting a 9-4 record with wins over nationally ranked Oregon and Alabama to bookmark the regular season schedule. Auburn's schedule included four games against teams in the top nine of the final CFP rankings. Senior Derrick Brown was a consensus All-America and SEC Defensive Player of the Year while helping a Tiger defense rank in the top 20 nationally. Offensively, Auburn was led by true freshman quarterback Bo Nix, who was named the SEC Freshman of the Year. The Tigers concluded the regular season third in the SEC in scoring offense and fourth in total offense.

In 2018, the Tigers posted an 8-5 regular season record while facing six opponents that were ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 (four of those played away from home), including four teams of the top 11 teams. The Tigers capped the season with an impressive 63-14 win over Purdue in the Music City Bowl. With Malzahn at the helm calling the plays, the Tigers' 63 points were a new SEC bowl game record for points, and the 56 first-half points were the most ever by a college football team in one half of a bowl game.

In 2017, Malzahn's team reached as high as No. 2 in the College Football Playoff Poll and played in the SEC Championship Game for

the second time in five seasons, knocking off No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama in a November to remember on The Plains. It was the first time in poll history that a program has defeated two top-ranked teams during the same regular season.

The 2017 Tigers were one of four FBS teams to average more than 225 yards rushing and 225 yards passing and averaged 37.1 points per game in league play. Auburn averaged 40.9 points and 491.1 yards in SEC action, both program bests, while winning five of seven conference games by 21 points or more.

In 2016, Malzahn's team won six consecutive games, the third longest win streak by Auburn in 12 years, while finishing second in the nation's most difficult division, the SEC West. Under his direction, the 2016 Tigers ranked in the top 50 nationally in total offense and total defense, an Auburn first since 2005.

Auburn's balance in 2016 was displayed by a team that ranked first in the SEC and sixth nationally in rushing, coupled with a defense that was seventh in the country in scoring defense and 28th in total defense. The special team units, traditionally been a strong point under Malzahn, were

led by the strong leg of All-America and Groza Award finalist kicker Daniel Carlson.

In 2015, the youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced 11 bowl teams en route to a Birmingham Bowl victory over Memphis. Malzahn's 2014 team was ranked in the nation's top 10 for a majority of the season before finishing 8-5 after navigating the nation's most difficult schedule featuring seven ranked foes.

He has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 14 seasons as a college coach, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 despite missing significant time with injuries and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Since Malzahn's arrival, Auburn has the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 234.6 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) have come under Malzahn's leadership.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards and was second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5

Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In Malzahn's seven seasons, a total of 32 players have been selected in the National Football League draft, including four first round draft picks, including Derrick Brown (No. 7) and Noah Igbinoghene (No. 30) in the 2020 NFL Draft. Malzahn's other first round picks including Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) of the 2014 draft. In the last two drafts, 12 Auburn players have been drafted, the most in a two-year span in the common draft era.

Malzahn has coached 13 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn: RB Tre Mason (2013), RS Chris Davis (2013), OT Greg Robinson (2013), C Reese Dismukes (2013-14), PK Daniel Carlson (2015-16-17), DL Carl Lawson (2016), DL Montravius Adams (2016), OL Alex Kozan (2016), OL

Braden Smith (2016-17), DB Carlton Davis (2017), DL Jeff Holland (2017), RB Kerryon Johnson (2017) and DL Derrick Brown (2019). Brown won the Lott IMPACT Trophy last season, Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center and Carlson was a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist.

The Tigers have faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's seven years on The Plains facing 34 ranked opponents, including 18 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four CFP Semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn and his coaching staff have been highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive Top 10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in the program's history. Six of his

eight recruiting classes have been in the Top 11 nationally.

Academically, Malzahn's Tigers have excelled as nearly 200 players have graduated since his arrival. In the fall 2016 semester a program-best 56 players posted a 3.0 grade point average.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010

when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Award.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games. Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Ark., and played football at Arkansas and Henderson State, earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson in 1990.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander. The Malzahn's have two grandsons, Anderson James Peek (March 2018) and Arthur Elliott Peak (December 2019).

JACK BICKNELL, JR. OFFENSIVE LINE | 1ST SEASON

Jack Bicknell Jr., a successful coach at the collegiate and professional level for over three decades joined Auburn as its offensive line coach in January of 2020. Bicknell, who was at Ole Miss the previous three seasons as offensive line coach, has 33 years of coaching experience, including 25 years in college and seven in the National Football League.

Last season at Ole Miss, the Rebels were second in the Southeastern Conference and ninth nationally in rushing averaging 251.2 yards rushing per game. Freshman

quarterback John Rhys Plumlee averaged 113.7 yards rushing per game, first in the SEC and eighth nationally.

Bicknell's second season in Oxford saw an offensive line protect quarterback Jordan Ta'amu, who threw for an SEC-best 326.5 passing yards per game to rank fourth nationally. Tackle Greg Little earned first team All-SEC honors and was the top Rebel picked in the 2019 NFL Draft.

In his first year in Oxford, Bicknell coached an offensive line that protected Ole Miss quarterbacks and allowed them to throw for a conference-leading 328.4 yards per game (11th nationally). With the help of the offensive line, the Rebels ranked second in the SEC in total offense (462.3 ypg) and sixth nationally in red zone offense (.953). Under Bicknell's guidance, Little earned second team All-SEC honors in just his second season as a Rebel.

Bicknell spent eight seasons as the head coach at Louisiana Tech (1999-2006), where his 43 victories are still the third-most in school history. Following the 2001 season, he was named WAC Coach of the Year after leading the Bulldogs to a conference championship in its first year of membership. Bicknell also served as the Bulldogs' offensive line coach from 1997-98. Bicknell joined the Ole Miss staff after spending two seasons as assistant offensive line coach with the NFL's Miami Dolphins. Working with offensive line coach John Benton, Bicknell assisted to guide the Dolphins' offensive line that helped protect quarterback Ryan Tannehill during a pair of 4,000-yard passing seasons. Bicknell's line also paved the way for running back Lamar Miller to rush for 1,971 yards over the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

In 2014, the Dolphins produced 361 first downs, tied for the second-most in franchise history and most since 1985 when the team had the same amount.

Bicknell coached a variety of offensive linemen who found success under his watch. Mike Pouncey was tabbed as his second-straight Pro Bowl in 2014. Tackle Ja'Wuan James became the eighth offensive lineman in Dolphins history to start all 16 games as a rookie, en route to earning PFWA All-Rookie Team honors.

Bicknell came to Miami after spending the 2013 season as the offensive line coach for the Pittsburgh Steelers. While in Pittsburgh, Bicknell's unit helped running back Le'Veon Bell amass 1,259 yards from scrimmage, the most by a Steelers rookie.

Prior to joining the Steelers, Bicknell served as the offensive line coach for the Kansas City Chiefs in 2012 where he directed a unit that was instrumental in helping running back Jamaal Charles return to All-Pro form after an ACL injury cut short his 2011 season.

Bicknell began his NFL coaching career with the New York Giants in 2009 and was a member of a coaching staff that helped lead the franchise to its fourth Super Bowl title with a 21-17 victory over the New England Patriots on Feb. 5, 2012. During the 2011 season, the Giants' line anchored an offense that finished fifth in the NFL in passing while only allowing 28 sacks.

Bicknell began his coaching career at his alma mater, Boston College, as a graduate assistant from 1985-86. Following his two seasons with the Eagles, Bicknell joined the staff at the University of New Hampshire in 1987 and spent 10 seasons with the Wildcats coaching the defensive line (1987-92) before moving to the offensive line (1993-96). Bicknell returned to Boston College in 2007 as the Eagles' assistant head coach/offensive line coach for two seasons (2007-08) before joining the Giants in the NFL.

A three-year letterwinner as an offensive lineman, Bicknell played collegiately for his father at Boston College from 1981-85 where he was the center for 1984 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Doug Flutie. It was Bicknell who snapped the ball to Flutie on the final play of the Boston College/Miami game which led to one of the most memorable conclusions to a game in college football history. The Flutie "Hail Mary" game-winning touchdown pass to wide receiver Gerald Phelan propelled the Eagles over the Miami Hurricanes in the 1984 Orange Bowl. In Bicknell's final season at Boston College, he was honored with the Scanlon Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a Boston College football player, the Scarminch Award for athletic and academic excellence and the Dean's Award in the school of education.

Bicknell comes from a family of coaches. His father, Jack, was the head coach at Boston College (1981-90) prior to becoming the head coach of the Barcelona Dragons (1991-03) of NFL Europe.

Born in North Plainfield, New Jersey, Bicknell attended Orono (Maine) High School. He and his wife, Helen, have three children, John, Katelyn and Alyse.

KODI BURNS

CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/WIDE RECEIVERS | 5TH SEASON
PASSING GAME COORDINATOR

Former Auburn offensive standout Kodi Burns returned to his alma mater for the 2016 season as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach. Burns took on the duties of passing game coordinator for the Tigers in 2019.

In 2019, Bo Nix set four Auburn freshman passing records, and Will Hastings signed as a free agent with New England following the season.

Auburn set all-time records for bowl game scoring and total offense in 2018 in a 63-14 win over Purdue; Ryan Davis finished his career as Auburn's all-time receptions leader (178) and freshman Seth Williams led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in yards per reception (20.54). Darius Slayton was drafted by the New York Giants, and Davis signed with New England.

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West and playing in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Junior Ryan Davis set an Auburn record with 84 receptions, ranking second in the SEC and 20th nationally in catches per game.

In 2016, 13 different Auburn receivers caught a pass of at least 20 yards, and the Tigers ranked fourth in school history in total offensive yards (5,730).

Burns has been part of two Auburn BCS National Championship appearances. As a senior wideout in 2010, he helped the Tigers to a perfect season and the BCS National Championship, scoring the opening TD on a 35-yard pass reception in the Tigers' BCS win over Oregon. Burns served as an offensive graduate assistant in 2013, helping Auburn win the SEC Championship and an appearance in the 2014 BCS National Championship game.

Burns, who played at Auburn from 2007-10, came back to his alma mater from Arizona State, where he had been named the running backs coach after the 2015 season. In 2015, Burns served as wide receivers coach at Middle Tennessee State, where he mentored Richie James and Ed Battlies. James led Conference USA with 108 receptions and his 1,346 receiving yards were third in the conference. Battlies' 82 receptions and 1,048 receiving yards ranked fourth and fifth respectively in Conference USA.

Burns was the running backs coach at Samford University in 2014. Under Burns' guidance, Bulldog ballcarrier Denzel Williams tallied more than 1,000 all-purpose yards, including 918 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns, earning all-Southern Conference honors.

In 2013, Burns worked with Auburn's offense as a graduate assistant, as the Tigers led the nation in rushing (328.3 yds/game), and ranked 11th in total offense (501.3 yds/game) and 12th in scoring offense (39.5 pts/game). Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year; he set Auburn single-season records with 2,374 all-purpose yards and 1,816 rushing yards.

Burns began his coaching career in 2012 as a graduate assistant at Arkansas State under Gus Malzahn. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt Conference with a 10-3 record and Burns helped an offense that included a 3,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher.

From 2007-10, Burns earned four varsity letters at Auburn, excelling in a variety of roles. He was a quarterback his first two seasons at Auburn; in 2007, he became the first Auburn true freshman quarterback to start a game since Gabe Gross in 1998. He moved to wide receiver for the second half of his career, collecting nearly 2,300 total yards and 22 career touchdowns.

A native of Fort Smith, Ark., Burns earned his bachelor's degree from Auburn in exercise science in 2011.





RODNEY GARNER
ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/DEFENSIVE LINE | 8TH SEASON

Former Auburn standout Rodney Garner serves as associate head coach and defensive line coach, a position he has held since 2013, when he helped the Tigers win the SEC title and a BCS Championship berth.

In 2019, Auburn's defense ranked eighth nationally in both red-zone and third-down defense, allowing only 19.5 points per game against a schedule that featured six 11-win opponents. Consensus All-America defensive tackle Derrick Brown won the Lott

IMPACT Trophy and was the No. 7 overall NFL Draft pick by the Carolina Panthers; second-team All-American Marlon Davidson (Atlanta) was a second-round pick.

The 2018 Auburn defense ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense (19.2) and allowed only nine rushing touchdowns. The Tigers ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks (38) and TFL (96). Dontavious Russell was drafted by Jacksonville. In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth nationally. All-American Jeff Holland, a first-team all-SEC pick, had 10 sacks, 13 TFL and 22 QB hurries.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, holding eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adams (Green Bay) and Carl Lawson (Cincinnati) were 2017 NFL draft selections.

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history (+8.0 games). Garner coached all-SEC DE Dee Ford, a first round draft pick of Kansas City (#23 overall). Two more D-linemen -- Angelo Blackson (4th, Tennessee) and Gabe Wright (4th, Detroit) -- were 2015 picks, and DaVonte Lambert joined Tampa Bay in 2016.

Garner was all-SEC and honorable mention All-America as a senior at Auburn in 1988, and team captain of the SEC champs. After college, Garner had a free agent tryout with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers and played with the Pittsburgh Gladiators arena team in 1989. Garner worked at Auburn from 1990-95 as recruiting coordinator, tight ends coach, and assistant strength and conditioning coach. Garner coached tight ends and offensive tackles at Tennessee in 1997 after coaching tight ends for the Volunteers in 1996.

During his 15 seasons at Georgia, the Bulldogs posted 117 victories, two SEC Championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles, seven bowl wins and six Top 10 finishes, including No. 2 in 2007 and No. 3 in 2002. He added the title of assistant head coach in 2005 after serving as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator since January, 1998.

The 2005 Georgia team finished eighth nationally in scoring defense (16.4 ppg). In 2003, Georgia was second nationally in scoring defense (14.5 ppg), fourth in total defense (276.86 ypg), sixth in pass defense (174.50 ypg, 1st in the SEC); the 2002 Bulldog defense finished first in the SEC and fourth nationally in scoring defense (15.1 ppg), first in the SEC in red zone defense (58.8%) and second in the SEC in rush defense (114.0 ypg). The 2002 Bulldogs finished 13-1, won the SEC title and Sugar Bowl and ranked third in the final national polls.

Garner participated in the inaugural Minority Coaches Forum (2006), was one of 10 coaches in the 2004 NCAA Expert Coaching Academy, and was among 20 chosen for the NCAA's 2004 Advanced Coaching Academy.

At Georgia, he coached five NFL first-round draft picks -- Richard Seymour (Patriots) and Marcus Stroud (Jaguars), both Pro Bowl starters; David Pollack (Bengals); Charles Grant (Saints); and Johnathan Sullivan (Saints). He also coached draft picks DeAngelo Tyson (7th, Ravens, '12), Geno Atkins (4th, Bengals, '10), Corvey Irvin (3rd, Panthers, '09), Jarius Wynn (6th, Packers, '09), Kedric Golston (6th, Redskins, '06), Robert Geathers (4th, Bengals, '04), Emarlos Leroy (6th, Jaguars, '99), and free agents Ken Veal (Chargers, '04), Paul Snellings (Colts, '00), Brandon Miller (Colts, '00), Charles Johnson (Panthers, '07), Tyrone Robertson (Bills, '00) and Demetric Evans (Cowboys, '01).

From Leeds, Ala., where he was a standout at Leeds High, Garner, whose cousin is Charles Barkley, is married to Kimberly Lawson Garner, a 1988 Auburn PR graduate. They have six children: Bridgett, Brielle, Jaiden, Kai, Sydney and Milan.



COACHING STAFF



WESLEY McGRIFF DEFENSIVE BACKS | 2ND SEASON

A veteran coach with both collegiate and professional experience, Wesley McGriff returned to Auburn in February, 2019, for his second stint on Coach Gus Malzahn's staff. He also was the Tigers' secondary coach for the 2016 season.

In 2019, Auburn's defense ranked eighth nationally in both red-zone and third-down defense, allowing only 19.5 points per game against a schedule that featured six 11-win opponents. Corner Noah

Igbinioghe was a first-round pick of the Miami Dolphins and Daniel Thomas (Jacksonville) was a fifth-round selection.

McGriff served as defensive coordinator at Ole Miss during the 2016-17 seasons, adding the title of associate head coach the second year. In 2016, McGriff orchestrated a defense that included NFL draft picks in Breeland Speaks (second round) and Marquis Haynes (fourth round); the duo combined for 14.5 sacks, and both earned second team all-SEC honors. Linebacker DeMarquis Gates had his biggest season, registering 114 tackles, the most by a Rebel in a single season since 2006. In 2017, sophomore linebacker Mohamed Sanogo was fourth in the SEC with 112 tackles and joined Gates in 2017 as the only two Ole Miss defenders with 100+ tackles in the previous 12 seasons.

McGriff came to Auburn in 2016 after three seasons with the NFL's New Orleans Saints, working with the defensive backs. In his first two seasons, McGriff oversaw the development of safeties Rafael Bush, Kenny Vaccaro and Pierre Warren and cornerback Terrence Frederick, while also depending on veterans safety Jairus Byrd and cornerback Keenan Lewis, who led the Saints with 13 passes defended, while adding two interceptions. Vaccaro led the New Orleans secondary with 113 tackles.

In his first season in New Orleans, the Saints ranked fourth in the NFL in total defense (305.7 ypg.), second in opponent passing yards per game (194.1 ypg.) and fourth in scoring defense (19.0 ppg.), posting an 11-5 record and advancing to the divisional round of the playoffs.

McGriff spent 2012 as co-defensive coordinator/cornerbacks at Ole Miss, which finished second in the SEC and in the top 15 in the NCAA in tackles for a loss (7.7) and sacks per game (2.8). Linebacker Denzel Nkemdiche was named to the FWAA All-America and SEC all-freshman teams, defensive tackle Isaac Gross earned conference all-freshman honors and was named to the CollegeFootballNews.com Freshman All-America team and safety Trae Elston was named to the ESPN SEC all-freshman team.

McGriff spent the 2011 season as defensive backs coach/recruiting coordinator at Vanderbilt, where he helped the Commodores to only their fifth all-time bowl appearance. His secondary produced 12 interceptions (three returned for TD). McGriff helped Green Bay Packer Casey Hayward become the first Vanderbilt All-American in four years, posting seven interceptions, the third-highest season total ever by a Commodore.

McGriff spent four seasons as the secondary coach at Miami (Fla.). In 2010, the Hurricanes ranked second in the nation in pass defense, allowing just 164.3 yards per game; the Miami defense ranked 16th nationally and 21st in scoring defense. In 2009, he tutored All-America defensive back Brandon Harris, seven-year NFL veteran safety Kenny Phillips (2007 All-American and first round NFL draft pick) and Green Bay defensive back Sam Shields.

McGriff served as the defensive backs coach/recruiting coordinator at Baylor from 2003-06 and enjoyed his first SEC stint at Kentucky from 2001-02. He spent 2000 as the secondary coach at Eastern Kentucky where he mentored all-Ohio Valley Conference DB Jeremiah Bell, who was drafted by the Miami Dolphins in the sixth round in 2003.

From 1995-99, McGriff served in multiple roles including assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kentucky State and was named the AFCA's NCAA Division II National Assistant Coach of the Year. The Thoroughbreds had the No. 1 defense in the nation in 1995.

He began his coaching career at his alma mater, Savannah State, from 1990-94. Starting as a graduate assistant, McGriff tutored running backs before coaching the secondary in 1991 and later serving as defensive coordinator and interim head coach.

McGriff, a Tifton, Ga., native, started at linebacker for Savannah State from 1987-89 and was named the conference's 1989 Male Academic Athlete of the Year. He received his bachelor's degree while graduating cum laude in 1990 and earned a master's in public administration from Georgia Southern in 1993. McGriff was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army in 1990 and was a member of the Army Reserves until 2001. He is a member of Omega Psi Phi fraternity.





CHAD MORRIS

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR | 1ST SEASON

A 28-year coaching veteran, Chad Morris joined Auburn as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in December 2019. Morris spent the last 10 years as one of the top offensive minds in college football helping three programs finish in the top 10 in the FBS in scoring average.

A Dallas, Texas, native, Morris served as head coach at Arkansas (2018-19) and SMU (2015-17) after four record-breaking seasons as offensive coordinator at Clemson (2011-14). A legendary high school coach in the state of Texas for 16 years from 1994-2009, Morris broke into the college game as associate head coach and offensive coordinator at Tulsa in 2010.

In three seasons at SMU (2015-17), Morris used his Texas recruiting roots and offensive prowess to take the Mustangs from a 1-11 campaign in 2013 before he took over to the program's first bowl bid five years with a 7-5 mark in 2017.

Morris' offensive scheme increased the team's scoring output from 128th the year before his arrival into the nation's eighth-highest scoring offense (40.1) in 2017. The 2017 Mustangs were one of just two FBS teams that featured a 3,000-yard passer, 1000-yard rusher and multiple 1,000-yard receivers.

Morris' impact during his four years at Clemson as offensive coordinator helped result in a 41-11 record, the 2011 ACC Championship and four bowl berths, including two BCS Orange Bowl appearances. Under Morris' offense, the Tigers set 127 offensive records (89 individual/38 team) and posted the top three scoring seasons in school history, as well as four of the top five passing seasons at Clemson.

The Clemson offense in its second season under Morris with ACC Player of the Year Tajh Boyd at quarterback set school records for total yards per game (512.7) and points per game (41.0), ranking sixth in the nation in scoring and ninth in the nation in total offense. The 2013 squad backed up those numbers with 508.5 yards and 40.2 points per game, both top 10 nationally.

Morris' record-setting offense in 2012 and 2013 marked the first time in ACC history that an active member of the conference had averaged more than 40 points per game in back-to-back seasons. Clemson was also one of just two FBS schools with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver every year from 2011-13.

For his work, Morris was named AFCA National Assistant Coach of the Year and one of five finalists for National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by 247Sports.com in 2013, and the National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by Rivals.com in 2011.

From the 2012 NFL Draft to 2015 NFL Draft, Morris saw seven of his offensive players drafted, including four wide receivers, tied for the most from any school over that span. Included in the quartet of wide receivers drafted were first round picks DeAndre Hopkins (Houston Texans) and Sammy Watkins (Los Angeles Rams). Morris also recruited 2015 All-Americans Deshaun Watson and Shaq Lawson, who both went on to be first round NFL draft picks.

Morris' collegiate debut came as the associate head coach/offensive coordinator at Tulsa in 2010. In his one season as offensive coordinator working specifically with the quarterbacks, Morris helped the Golden Hurricane average 41.4 points per game, sixth nationally, and finish with a 10-3 record. Tulsa scored 50 or more points in four games and finished as one of five FBS teams with over 30 rushing and 30 passing touchdowns.

Morris became a legend in the state of Texas during his 16 years as a head coach at the high school level, posting a 169-38 record overall and winning back-to-back undefeated state championships in his final two seasons at Lake Travis High School. Morris led six of his teams to the Texas State Championship game, highlighted by three titles, and he earned Coach of the Year honors 11 times.

Morris earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics with a minor in statistics from Texas A&M University in 1992. He and his wife, Paula, have two children, daughter Mackenzie and son Chandler.



COACHING STAFF



AL POGUE OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS | 1ST SEASON

Al Pogue, a former Auburn football staff member rejoined the Auburn family in February of 2020 as a defensive assistant coach. Pogue spent the past season as outside linebackers coach at West Virginia after five seasons coaching cornerbacks at Troy.

Prior to Troy, Pogue spent three years at Auburn as the offensive quality control coach (2011), special teams quality control coach (2012) and director of high

school relations (2013).

While Pogue was with the Tigers, Auburn played in the 2013 BCS National Championship game, won the 2013 SEC Championship and won the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl.

During a three-year window from 2016-18, Pogue helped a Troy defense allow 20.8 points per game, ranking No. 4 nationally among non-power 5 schools. During his four years, the Trojans were No. 2 nationally among FBS schools in takeaways (106) and tied for No. 7 nationally with 63 interceptions.

In 2018, Troy's defense gave up 22.0 points per game, ranking No. 28 nationally and was No. 3 nationally in turnovers gained (31), No. 5 in interceptions (18) and fumbles recovered (13), and No. 11 in turnover margin (0.77). Troy also led the Sun Belt Conference in sacks, interceptions, turnovers, red zone defense and was No. 2 in rushing defense, total defense and No. 3 in scoring defense.

The Trojans led the nation in red zone defense in 2017 as the Trojans set a school record for wins, won the Sun Belt Championship and ended LSU's 49-game non-conference home winning streak. Troy was No. 3 in tackles for loss (8.6), No. 7 in sacks (3.23) and rushing defense (105.7). The Trojans were No. 15 nationally in interceptions (17), No. 16 in turnovers gained (26) and No. 26 in turnover margin (0.54).

The 2016 Trojans posted a 10-3 record and earned a victory in the Dollar General Bowl, the first top-25 ranking in school and conference history and tied for the best win-improvement in the country.

Troy finished No. 2 nationally in passes intercepted, No. 4 in turnovers forced, No. 9 in passes defended per game (5.9), No. 17 in rushing defense, No. 21 in scoring defense (22.1) and No. 28 in third-down defense.

The 2015 defense finished with the No. 2-best turnaround nationally in opponent third-down percentage, No. 4-best turnaround in yards per play allowed, No. 5-best improvement in tackles for loss and No. 16-best improvement in total defense.

Troy scored five defensive touchdowns, third-most in the country and most by a Trojan team since 2004 and finished No. 5 in the nation with 13 fumble recoveries. Troy forced 16 turnovers over the final six games of the season after registering just three in the first six games.

In 2014, the Trojans finished with 11 interceptions, most by a Troy team since 2010 and improved its pass defense by 105.7 yards per game from the previous season.

Pogue spent six years as a high school head coach at Carver High School in Montgomery, Alabama, from 2008-10, St. Jude High School in Montgomery from 2006-07 and at Calhoun High School in Montgomery in 2002. He oversaw Carver's first undefeated season in 2008.

Pogue was a three-year starter as a safety and cornerback at Alabama State from 1993-96, earning All-America and All-SWAC honors at free safety.

A native of Mobile, Alabama, Pogue earned his bachelor's degree in special education from Alabama State in 1998. He, and his wife, Nikita, also a graduate from Alabama State, have two children, Allison and Nasir.





LARRY PORTER

TIGHT ENDS & H-BACKS/SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR | 4TH SEASON

Larry Porter, a 24-year coaching veteran and two-time national recruiter of the year, joined the Auburn program in February, 2017, as tight ends/H-backs coach and added the duties of special teams coordinator prior to the 2018 campaign. He has been part of 14 bowl teams since 2002, including three CFP bowls (2007 Sugar, 2008 BCS Championship, 2018 Chick-fil-A Peach).

In 2019, Christian Tutt and Noah Igbinoghene (a first-round NFL draft selection of the Miami Dolphins) were among the national leaders as return specialists. H-back Spencer Nigh (Pittsburgh) and punter Arryn Siposs (Detroit) were signed as NFL free agents.

In 2018, Auburn set all-time records for bowl game scoring and total offense in 2018 in a 63-14 win over Purdue. Auburn ranked fifth nationally in net punting, recorded a national-best seven blocked kicks and was one of only two schools to rank in the top 50 in kickoff return average and defense, net punt and punt return average, earning Porter a Broyles Award nomination. H-back Chandler Cox was drafted by the Miami Dolphins.

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West and playing in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Porter came to Auburn from North Carolina, where he spent three seasons as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and was a 2016 Broyles Award nominee. Under his guidance, Carolina's running game ranked 18th nationally in 2015, averaging 224.4 yards per game. Elijah Hood, who rushed for 1,463 yards and 17 TDs in 2015, was a two-time all-ACC performer ranked in the UNC top 10 in career rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

In 2016, the Tar Heels ranked first in the nation in punt return defense (0.22) and second in the nation in kickoff return average (26.97), and Porter tutored all-ACC running backs Elijah Hood and T.J. Logan (who ranked second nationally in kickoff return average (32.9 with 2 TD). During Porter's tenure, UNC made three consecutive bowl appearances and won the ACC Coastal Division in 2015; that same season, the Tar Heels set 62 team and individual school records on offense. Hood (Oakland) and Logan (Arizona) were both selected in the 2017 NFL Draft.

Porter went to UNC after one season as running backs coach at Texas, one year as running backs coach at Arizona State and two seasons as head coach at Memphis, his alma mater.

Porter spent five years on the LSU coaching staff from 2005-09, coaching running backs while also holding two key roles on staff as assistant head coach and chief recruiter. He was elevated to the position of assistant head coach during the spring of 2006 and was twice (2007, 2009) named National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com. Part of LSU's 2007 national championship team, Porter developed two 1,000-yard rushers at LSU in Jacob Hester (2007) and Charles Scott (2008) as well as having five players (Hester, Joseph Addai, Quinn Johnson, Charles Scott, Trindon Holliday) selected in the NFL Draft.

Porter coached 1,000-yard rushers for three straight seasons while at Oklahoma State. In 2004, Vernand Morency earned all-Big 12 honors after rushing for 1,474 yards and 12 touchdowns. A year earlier, Tatum Bell earned first team all-Big 12 honors with 1,286 yards and 16 touchdowns. Morency was a third-round pick of the Houston Texans in 2005 and Bell was a second-round draft pick by the Denver Broncos in the 2004 NFL Draft.

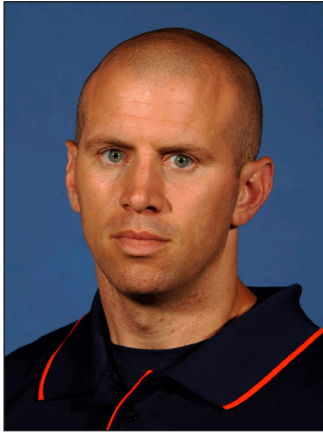
Prior to his arrival in Stillwater, Porter spent three years at Arkansas State, where he coached Jonathan Adams to back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons.

Porter began his coaching career at Wooddale High School in Memphis, Tenn., before moving to the collegiate ranks, coaching the running backs at Tennessee-Martin in 1998.

A native of Jackson, Miss., Porter lettered four years (1990-93) at Memphis, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1996. He is a member of the Memphis Athletics M Club Hall of Fame. Porter and his wife, Sharmane, have three children: sons Brandon and Omari, and daughter Olivia.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL

Ryan Russell serves as the executive director of football/assistant athletics director for athletic performance, heading up the strength and conditioning for Auburn football as he continues his professional partnership with Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn. As executive director of football, Russell leads the character development and mental skills training program for freshman players.

Russell held a similar position on Malzahn's staff at Arkansas State, where he served as director of athletic performance during the 2012 season.

From 2010-11, Russell served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Auburn, working with the football program. He was also football's director of sports nutrition. He was an associate strength and conditioning coach for the Boise State football team from 2007-09.

He served professional internships as a strength and conditioning coach at Pitt (2005) and Louisville (2004-05) before coming to Auburn as a graduate assistant in 2005-06.

Russell played professional football in the Arena Football League for the Las Vegas Gladiators and the Louisville Fire in 2003.

Russell received his bachelor's degree in Exercise Science from West Liberty State in 2003 and his Doctorate in Sports and Performance Psychology in March 2020 from the University of Western States.

He played wide receiver for West Liberty State from 2000-02, receiving all-conference honors all three years. He earned his master's degree in Adult Education from Auburn in December 2006. He holds a number of professional certifications, including CSCS, SCCC, SNC, USAW Level 1, and FMS.

A native of San Bernardino, Calif., he met his wife, the former Sarah Porter (an Auburn graduate with a degree in nutrition and food science), during his first stint at Auburn.





KEVIN STEELE

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR | 5TH SEASON

Veteran coach Kevin Steele joined the Auburn coaching staff before the 2016 season as defensive coordinator.

In 2019, Auburn's defense ranked eighth nationally in both red-zone and third-down defense, allowing only 19.5 points per game against a schedule that featured six 11-win opponents. Consensus All-America defensive tackle Derrick Brown won the Lott IMPACT Trophy and was the No. 7 overall pick in the

NFL Draft of the Carolina Panthers. Corner Noah Igbinoghene was a first-round pick of the Miami Dolphins, second-team All-American Marlon Davidson (Atlanta) was a second-round pick and Daniel Thomas (Jacksonville) was a fifth-round selection.

The 2018 Auburn defense ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense (19.2) and allowed only nine rushing touchdowns. The Tigers ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks (38) and TFL (96) and were ninth nationally with three interception returns for scores. Deshaun Davis (Cincinnati), Jamel Dean (Tampa) and Dontavious Russell (Jacksonville) were NFL draft picks.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally; Steele was a Broyles Award finalist.

The Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense his first season, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adams (Green Bay), Carl Lawson (Cincinnati), Rudy Ford (Arizona) and Joshua Holsey (Washington) were 2017 NFL draft picks.

A familiar face in the SEC, Steele served as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach for LSU in 2015, going there from Alabama, where he spent the 2014 season coaching the Crimson Tide linebackers and special assistant to the head coach. In 2013, he served as Alabama's director of player personnel. A proven recruiter who helped Alabama sign the nation's No. 1 class, Steele has held defensive coordinator positions in the SEC and ACC as well as serving as the head coach at Baylor for four years.

Steele served as defensive coordinator at Alabama in 2007 and then held the same position at Clemson for three years from 2009-2011. While at Clemson, the Tigers won the 2011 ACC title, their first since 1991. Steele's 2010 Clemson defense led the ACC and ranked No. 13 nationally in points allowed, surrendering 18.8 points per game.

Before he joined the Alabama staff in 2007, Steele coached with Bobby Bowden at Florida State for four years (2003-06), serving as the executive head coach for the Seminoles. He was named the Rivals.com National Recruiter of the Year in 2005 at Florida State after helping the Seminoles sign the top class in the country.

Steele joined Florida State after serving as the head coach at Baylor University from 1999-2002, spending four seasons as a head coach in the Big 12 Conference.

Steele coached linebackers for the Carolina Panthers in the NFL from 1995-98. Under head coach Dom Capers, the Panthers reached the NFC Championship game in their second season (1996). After four years with Carolina, Steele was hired as head coach at Baylor in 1999.

From 1989-94, Steele coached the linebackers under Nebraska legend Tom Osborne. During his six years in Lincoln, the Cornhuskers went 60-11, appeared in six bowl games, won four conference championships and captured the 1994 national championship with a 13-0 record.

He has also held assistant coaching jobs at Tennessee (1987-88), Oklahoma State (1984-86) and New Mexico State (1983).

The Dillon, S.C., native is a 1981 graduate of the University of Tennessee. He spent his freshman season at Furman before transferring to Tennessee, where he was a member of Johnny Majors' squads. He was a student assistant coach in 1980 and then a graduate assistant the following year (1981) before being promoted to outside linebackers coach in 1982.

Steele and his wife, Linda, have a son, Gordon, and a daughter, Caroline (an Auburn graduate); and a granddaughter, Sawyer Kate. Gordon is on the football coaching staff at Alabama.



COACHING STAFF



CARNELL WILLIAMS RUNNING BACKS | 2ND SEASON

Former Auburn All-American Carnell 'Cadillac' Williams returned to his alma mater in January, 2019, as the Tigers' running backs coach.

During his first season, the Tigers posted five 100-yard rushing performances and D.J. Williams was named SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance against LSU.

As a player, Williams helped lead Auburn to an undefeated season in 2004 while earning All-America honors that year. The 2005 NFL Rookie of the Year, Williams had a seven-year NFL career before entering the coaching ranks.

A native of Gadsden, Alabama, and product of Etowah High School, Williams finished his Auburn career (2001-04) with 3,831 yards on 741 attempts with 45 touchdowns. He broke the Auburn career record of most rushing attempts, passing Joe Cribbs, and most touchdowns scored, passing Bo Jackson, while finishing second in total rushing yards and all-purpose yards.

As a senior in 2004, Williams helped lead the Tigers to one of the best seasons in program history, winning an SEC Championship en route to a perfect 13-0 season and a Sugar Bowl victory. He led Auburn in rushing with 1,165 yards and 12 touchdowns while tallying 1,718 all-purpose yards. He earned All-America honors, was the SEC Special Teams Player of the Year, and named to the All-SEC team.

In his four seasons at Auburn, Williams earned nine SEC Player of the Week honors, the most in league history. During his time on the Plains, the Tigers were 37-14 and won three SEC Western Division titles (2001, '02, '04).

He remains as Auburn's No. 2 all-time rushing and is the Tigers' career leader in rushing attempts and rushing touchdowns.

The fifth overall pick of the 2005 NFL draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Williams was named the NFL Rookie of the Year after leading all rookies in rushing yards with 1,178, while posting six 100-yard rushing games in 14 starts. Williams spent six seasons with Tampa Bay before spending his final season in 2011 with the St. Louis Rams.

After being slowed by injuries for several years, Williams was narrowly edged for the AP 2009 Comeback Player of the Year Award by Tom Brady, finishing second after rushing for 821 yards on 210 carries with a 3.9 average and four touchdowns during the 2009 season.

Williams finished his NFL career with 4,038 yards with 21 touchdowns and 148 receptions for 1,002 yards and four scores.

Williams' coaching career started at Henderson State in 2015 where he served as the running backs coach. After a stint at the University of West Georgia in 2016, Williams was the running backs coach for IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida for two seasons (2017-18). Williams served as the running backs coach for the Birmingham Iron of the Alliance of American Football (AAF) prior to his appointment at his alma mater.

Williams graduated from Auburn in December, 2014. He and his wife Evan have two boys: Cole and Cuinn.





TRAVIS WILLIAMS

LINEBACKERS/CO-DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR | 5TH SEASON
RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Former Auburn linebacker Travis Williams serves as co-defensive coordinator, a role he received prior to the 2019 season, and linebacker coach for the Tigers. He became the Tigers' recruiting coordinator as well in January, 2020.

Williams was promoted to linebacker coach at his alma mater prior to the 2016 season, after holding various roles on the Tigers' football support staff.

In 2019, Auburn's defense ranked eighth nationally in both red-zone and third-down defense, allowing only 19.5 points per game against a schedule that featured six 11-win opponents.

The 2018 Auburn defense ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense (19.2) and allowed only nine rushing touchdowns. The Tigers ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks (38) and TFL (96) and were ninth nationally with three interception returns for touchdowns. Top tackler Deshaun Davis, a first team all-SEC honoree, was drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals and Darrell Williams signed with the New Orleans Saints.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally. Senior linebacker Tre' Williams earned second team all-SEC honors.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957.

Steeped in the Tiger tradition on defense, Williams signed with Auburn in 2001, redshirted his first season and then lettered the next four, earning all-SEC honors in 2004-05. He led Auburn in tackles (80) during the 2004 undefeated season; he was second in tackles in 2005 (68) and third in 2003 (67). He won the Pat Dye Leadership Award on defense in 2004 and 2005.

Williams played for the NFL's Atlanta Falcons during the 2006 and 2007 seasons, before beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Spring Valley (S.C.) High School as a volunteer assistant.

Williams returned to Auburn in 2009 as a defensive graduate assistant, and was part of Auburn's 2010 national championship season. After coaching stops at Northern Iowa and Creekside (Ga.) High School, Williams came back to Auburn in 2014 as a defensive analyst.

He served as an on-field coach on defense in preparations for Auburn's 2015 Outback and 2015 Birmingham Bowl appearances.

Williams earned his bachelor's degree in criminology and criminal justice from Auburn in 2005, and received a master's degree in adult education from Auburn in 2011.

A native of Columbia, S.C., Williams and his wife Jeanine, an Auburn graduate, have three daughters, Tru, Reign and Brave.

DR. JAY GOGUE
PRESIDENT



Jay Gogue returned to his alma mater on July 16, 2007, as Auburn University's 18th president and retired as president emeritus on July 1, 2017. He was appointed by the university's Board of Trustees to serve as interim president effective July 8, 2019, and later named president. The Waycross, Ga., native earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Auburn and a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

During his tenure as president, the academic strength of Auburn's student population increased, a new research center was established in Huntsville, Ala., a common book program that generates a shared academic experience was instituted and outreach partnerships with underserved schools in surrounding communities were established. His leadership during a period of sharp reductions in state support for the university budget protected Auburn's academic quality and prevented elimination of academic programs. During his brief retirement, Dr. Gogue remained engaged in the realm of academia, advising colleagues at numerous universities and teaching a course on higher education leadership to Auburn students.

Dr. Gogue was selected in 2013 for the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2012, he was inducted into the Alabama Academy of Honor, a group of 100 Alabamians "chosen for accomplishment or service greatly benefitting or reflecting great credit on the State."

Before returning to Auburn, Dr. Gogue served as president of New Mexico State University beginning in 2000 and, in 2003, he was named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System. He started his higher education administration career in 1986 at Clemson University as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected him as provost in 1995.

Dr. Gogue is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. He met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Like Dr. Gogue, Mrs. Gogue also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the parents of three children and have one grandchild.

ALLEN GREENE
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Allen Greene, known as a dynamic and energetic leader, is in his third year at Auburn after being named the program's 15th director of athletics on January 18, 2018. Greene served in the same capacity at the University at Buffalo from November 2015 until his arrival at Auburn.

One of the youngest athletics directors in the NCAA Power Five ranks, Greene, 43, is highly regarded by his peers. He is actively engaged in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, Minority Opportunities Athletics Association, and LEAD1, an association dedicated to preparing today's students to be tomorrow's leaders.

Auburn has achieved great success competitively under Greene's leadership as 30 programs have finished ranked in the top 25 nationally, including 10 programs in the top 10. The Auburn equestrian program has won a pair of national championships since his arrival and the men's and women's golf programs each advanced to the national semifinals once.

The 2018-19 academic year was historic as the men's basketball program made its first-ever trip to the Final Four, while the baseball program returned to the College World Series for the first time in 22 years.

Academically during Greene's time at Auburn, 276 athletes have earned their degrees and 525 have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Greene's tenure as director of athletics at the University at Buffalo is noted for success on the field and in the classroom, as well as donor and corporate development efforts that led to an array of facility enhancements.

Prior to being named AD at Buffalo, Greene served as the senior associate athletic director for administration and deputy director of athletics at UB. Greene previously worked in fundraising at Ole Miss and two years as an athletics fundraiser for Notre Dame and five years in its compliance office.

A graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in finance, Greene was a three-year starter for the Fighting Irish baseball team and played three years in the New York Yankees minor league system. Greene later received his master's degree from Indiana University's South Bend campus.

Greene and his wife, Christy, have three children, daughters Rian and Seneca, and son Samuel.

AUBURN UNIVERSITY

A HISTORY OF EXCELLENCE

Auburn University has a history of excellence, tradition, and forward-thinking that dates back to its founding in 1856 and becoming a land-grant institution in 1872. It continues those aspects today with strong, committed faculty, engaged students, and devoted alumni.

The institution has had four official names: East Alabama Male College (1856-72), Agricultural and Mechanical College (1872-99), Alabama Polytechnic Institute (1899-1960), and Auburn University (1960-present). The fall 2020 enrollment is 30,737, with students choosing from more than 150 degree options in 12 colleges and schools at the undergraduate, graduate, and professional levels.

U.S. News & World Report ranks Auburn as a top 50 public university in the U.S. and lists Auburn as the top university in Alabama. The Princeton Review includes Auburn on its 2021 list of “Best 386 Colleges,” including No. 1 for Best Recreational Facilities, No. 3 for Students Pack the Stadium, No. 8 for Students Love It Here, and No. 10 for Happiest Students. Money has proclaimed Auburn the best value in Alabama.

Auburn is one of the few universities to carry the torch as a land-, sea-, and space-grant university, and the exceptional learning environment at Auburn prepares students to excel in a global society. According to the National Survey of Student Engagement, Auburn provides a supportive campus environment, and its students report higher satisfaction with their overall academic experience than students at peer institutions. Kiplinger’s places the university on its list of “100 Best Public College Values,” a recognition that means Auburn delivers more for less. As a result, 93 percent of recent graduates indicate that they would choose Auburn all over again.



A TOWN AND GOWN PARTNERSHIP

The city of Auburn consistently receives accolades for the lifestyle and amenities it offers—Auburn earned a top spot on Southern Living’s list of “The South’s Best College Towns.” The city has also been featured in numerous lists of best places to live and retire in publications such as Forbes and U.S. News & World Report.

Situated on a verdant campus of 2,116 acres, the university is a hub of activity in one of the state’s fastest growing cities, one frequently cited as a top place for entrepreneurs and families alike. Auburn is in east-central Alabama, approximately 30 miles from the Georgia border, 100 miles southwest of Atlanta, 100 miles southeast of Birmingham, and 50 miles east of Montgomery. With a mild climate and a wealth of cultural and recreational offerings, Auburn is an exceptional place that’s full of small-town charm and offers an atmosphere unlike any other.

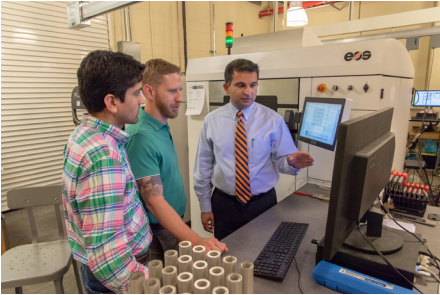

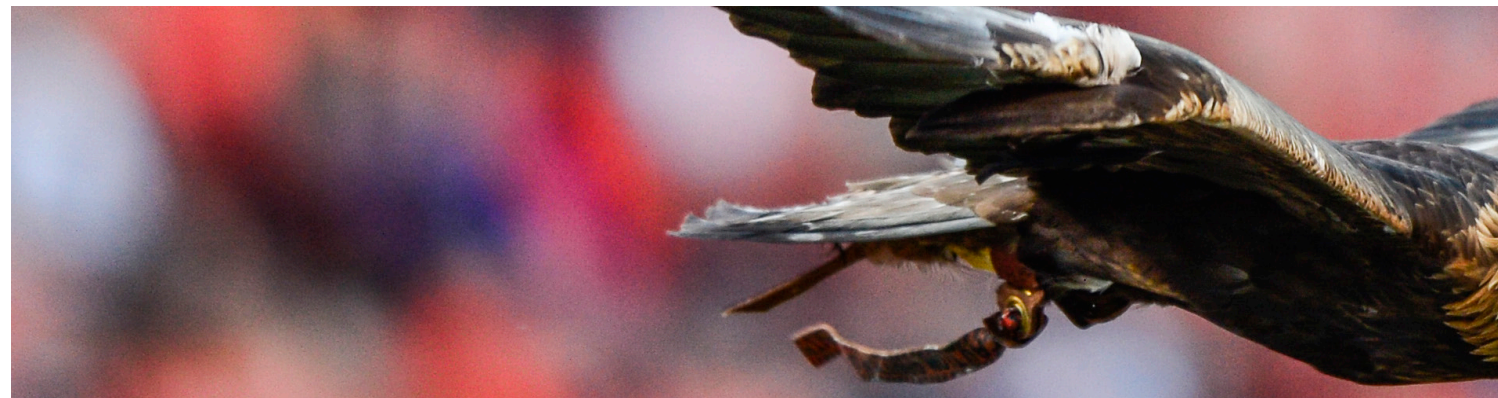
The role of Auburn’s eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine’s Southeastern Raptor Center. The USFWS permits the raptor center to house eagles and include them on hundreds of educational presentations each year—including Auburn’s home football games. Currently, flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are showcased in these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people, as they have symbolized strength, power, and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage, and the preservation of our environment.

Golden eagle Nova serves as War Eagle VII and is a fixture on the sidelines, while bald eagle Spirit delights fans with pregame flights over Jordan-Hare Stadium. War Eagle VI, nicknamed Tiger, which made the inaugural untethered free flight in 2000, passed away in 2014.

“War Eagle” is Auburn’s battle cry, not Auburn’s nickname. There are several legends concerning the origin of the War Eagle battle cry, dating back to 1864 and the Civil War at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia.

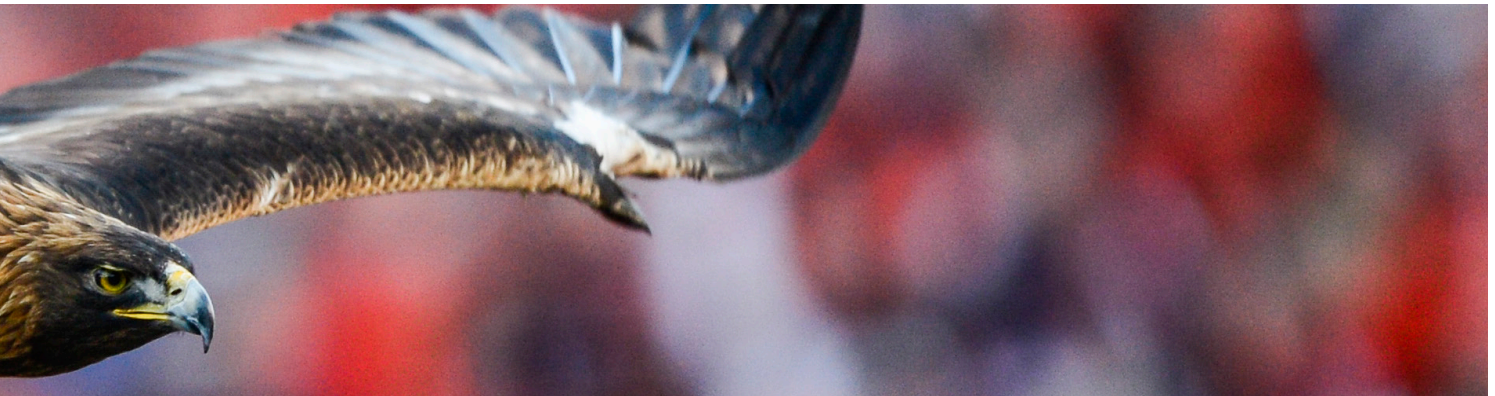

TRADITIONS: TIGER WALK



Tiger Walk is an Auburn tradition that began in the early 1960s when Auburn players walked from Sewell Hall to the football stadium as fans lined Donahue Drive to wish the team well. Over the years, Tiger Walk has grown into a major part of game day at Auburn, so much so that it is listed on the players' game weekend itinerary. The largest Tiger Walk is believed to have taken place prior to the 1989 Iron Bowl, when more than 20,000 well-wishers lined the street. Every Tiger Walk prior to home games draws thousands, and it has become a tradition for Auburn football players as they enter stadiums on the road. Tiger Walk traditionally begins two hours before kickoff for every game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.



ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER

The rolling of Toomer's Corner was named in 2018 as the nation's "Best Sports Tradition" by the *USA Today* 10 Best Readers' Choice travel award contest. Toomer's Corner, where Auburn's campus meets the city of Auburn at the intersection of College Street and Magnolia Avenue, has long been the gathering place for Auburn athletic celebrations. After significant sports victories, Auburn students and citizens alike have joined forces to "roll" the Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner with toilet tissue.

Although there have been various legends as to how the Toomer's Corner tradition began, one of the more popular stories centers around when Toomer's Drugs had the only telegraph in the city. As the story goes, during away football games, when employees of the local drug store received news of a win, they would throw the ticker tape from the telegraph onto the power lines.



ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER



The current Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner were planted in February 2017, and fans are asked not to roll the trees because they are not fully established. Fans are, however, encouraged to roll the adjacent trees. In 2016, the university planted 10 descendants of the original Auburn Oaks along a curved walkway in Samford Park, with trees reaching from Samford Hall to Toomer's Corner. The 15-year-old oaks were cultivated from acorns from the original trees, a project managed by Auburn's Forestry Club and Wildlife Society. Fans are also asked not to roll these descendent trees as they are not fully developed. Members of the Auburn Family have the opportunity to name a tree for themselves or someone of their choosing in recognition of a \$50,000 philanthropic gift benefitting the School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences.



JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Auburn's showcase football stadium seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side. The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later 14,000 more seats were added and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (named after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan.

The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

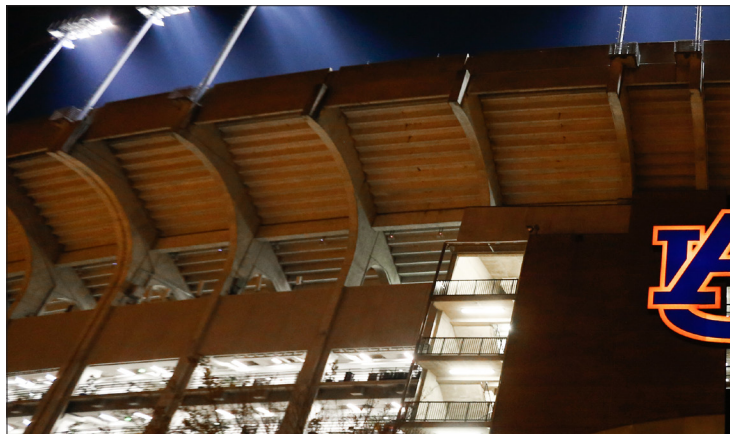

SOUTH END ZONE RENOVATION

A leadership gift from Raymond and Kathryn Harbert allowed for the construction of the Harbert Family Recruiting Center, a gameday support and recruiting facility in the southwest corner of Jordan-Hare Stadium that opened prior to the 2018 season. The five-level, 44,000-square-foot facility includes exceptional recruiting space for football and Olympic sports, a club space for fans, a press box for media, and expanded and renovated locker rooms.

The Harbert Family Recruiting Center is the gold standard in college athletics recruiting. Also included in the redevelopment was the redesign of the former press box into a new premium seating experience for Auburn football's most loyal donors on the stadium's west side. Known as the Broadway Club, this luxury area offers the highest level of service within an upscale atmosphere and includes a spectacular view of the 50-yard line, deluxe interior finishes and furnishings available to 120 patrons.



HEISMAN STATUES

The Auburn Family honored three of its all-time greats in a stirring ceremony under sunny skies on the east side of Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday, April 14, 2012.

A crowd of thousands roared as former Heisman Trophy winners Pat Sullivan, Bo Jackson and Cam Newton took the stage moments before towering statues immortalizing the Auburn greats from three different eras were unveiled.



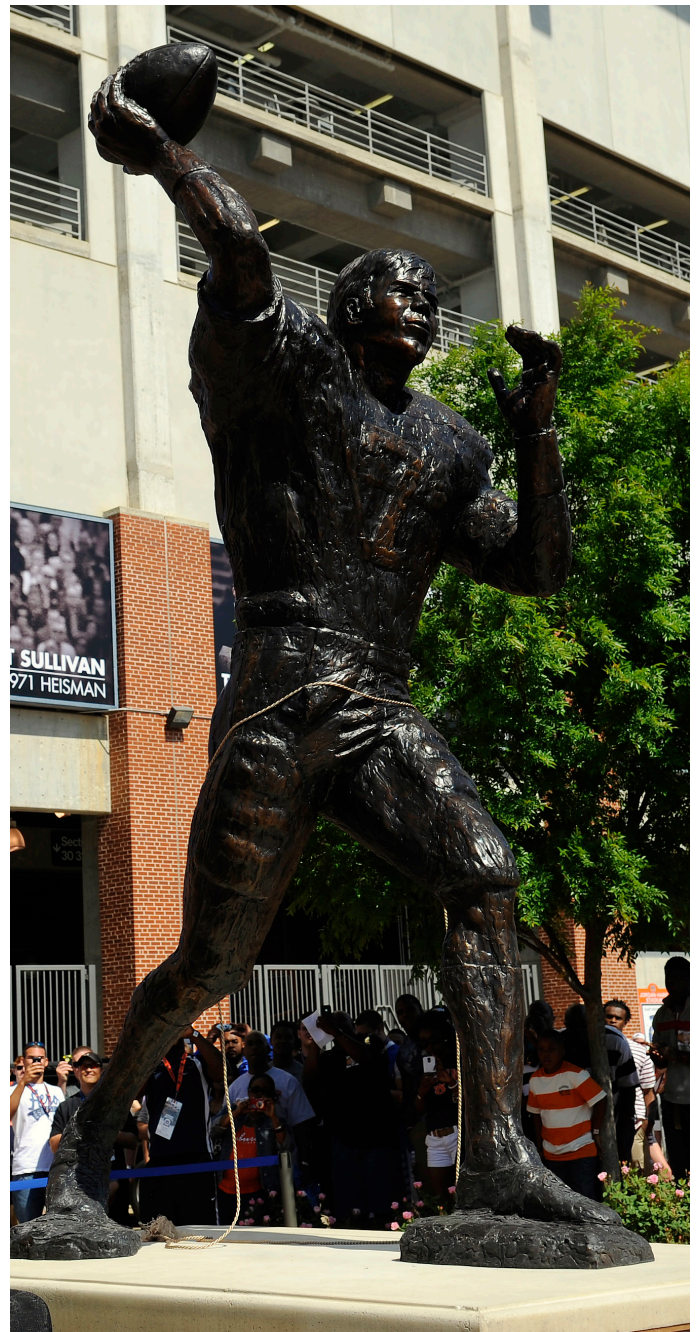

PAT SULLIVAN 1971

Auburn quarterback Pat Sullivan picked up the Tigers' first Heisman Trophy in 1971 after throwing for 20 touchdowns and racking up 2,096 yards of total offense. He led Auburn to a 9-2 record and a Sugar Bowl appearance in his senior season.



HEISMAN STATUES

BO JACKSON 1985

Bo Jackson plowed through defenses in 1985 for 6.4 yards per carry, earning Auburn's second Heisman Trophy. The three-sport athlete ran for 1,786 yards and 17 touchdowns while helping the Tigers to an 8-4 record and a Cotton Bowl appearance.



CAM NEWTON 2010

Cam Newton put together one of the most remarkable college football seasons ever in 2010, throwing for 30 touchdowns and rushing for 20 while leading Auburn to a 14-0 record and the BCS National Championship. Newton tallied 4,327 yards of total offense while completing 66.1% of his passes.



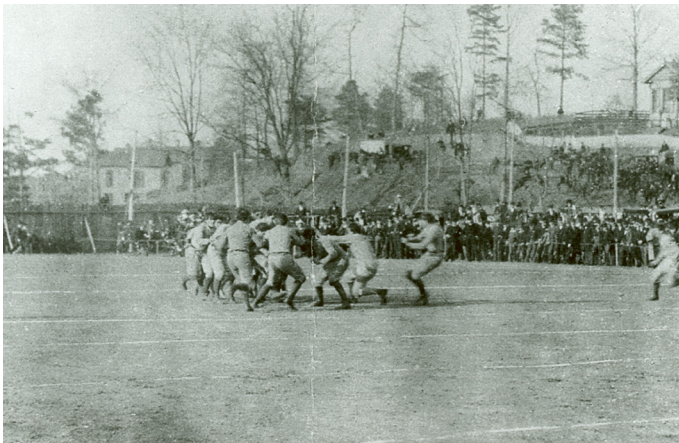
THE IRON BOWL

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Of the first 53 meetings between Auburn and Alabama, 48 took place in Birmingham. The name "Iron Bowl" comes from Birmingham's historic role in the country's iron industry.

1893

The first Iron Bowl was played on Feb. 22, 1893 in Birmingham with Auburn taking the 32-22 win. The Tigers won the first two meetings and six of the first seven.



1982

The climax to a 23-22 Auburn victory over Alabama in 1982 was Bo Jackson's "Bo Over the Top" 1-yard leap over the Alabama goal line, which capped a 66-yard drive and set the stage for what Auburn people consider the Tigers' "coming out" party in the 1980s.



1972

Trailing 16-3 with six minutes left, underdog Auburn's David Langner returned two blocked Alabama punts to win the game 17-16, handing the Crimson Tide their first loss of the season and ending hopes of a national title.



1989

The first time Auburn and Alabama met in Auburn was in 1989, and the No. 11 Tigers beat the No. 2 Crimson Tide, 30-20, on Dec. 2, 1989.



2010

Down 24-0 in the second quarter, the Auburn defense inspired a school-record comeback for a 28-27 win in Tuscaloosa in 2010, en route to a national championship.



KICK SIX

With one second remaining in the game, Auburn's Chris Davis returned a missed field goal 109 yards to give the Tigers a 34-28 win in the 2013 Iron Bowl.

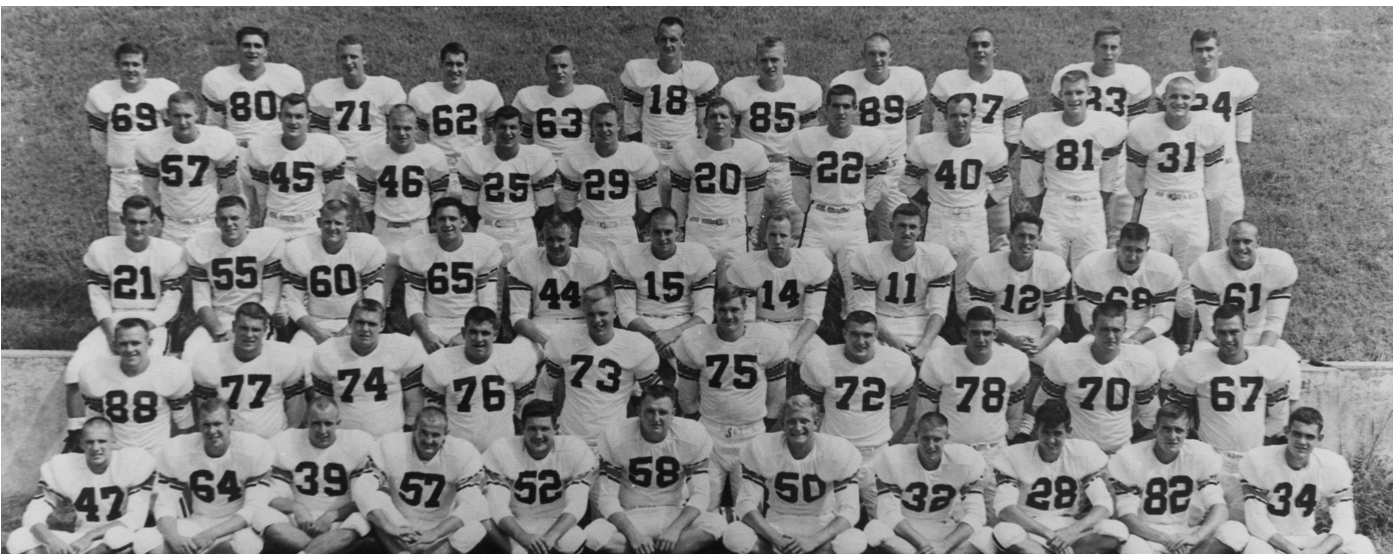
