### <u>At the Starting Line</u>

► The No. 12 Auburn men's and women's cross country teams will travel to Maryville, Tenn., to run in the NCAA South Regional on Saturday.

► The women's 6K will get underway at 9 a.m., followed by the men's 10K at 10 a.m. on the Lambert Acres Golf Course.

#### **THIS WEEK IN TIGER CROSS COUNTRY**

Event: NCAA South Regional Date: Nov. 15 Location: Maryville, Tenn. Time: Women's 6K 9 a.m.; Men's 10K 10 a.m. Course: Lambert Acres Golf Club

► Saturday's race is one of nine regional races across the country where teams and individuals will seek a ticket to the NCAA Championships on Nov. 24 in Terre Haute, Ind. The first- and second-place teams earn an automatic bid to Terre Haute and the top-three finishers, not on a qualifying team, will also head to Indiana. At-large selections for teams will be announced on Sunday.

▶ Auburn's men enter the race as the second-ranked squad in the South Region. Alabama is ranked first in the region. The pair of instate rivals are the only two nationally-ranked teams in the field, with Alabama ranked fifth and Auburn 12th. Ranked fourth in the South Region, Florida is receiving votes in the national poll.

▶ The Tiger women are ranked fifth in the South Region. Florida State is ranked first in the region and third nationally. Southeastern Conference foe Florida is ranked second in the region and 15th nationally. Tennessee is receiving votes nationally and is third in the region.

• Auburn is coming off of a successful showing at the SEC Championship on Nov. 3. Freshman Girma Mecheso won the men's 8K title and was followed by Elkanah Kibet and Felix Kiboiywo at third and fourth places, respectively. Holly Knight finished as the women's 6K runner-up. As a team, the men captured runner-up honors and the women placed fifth.

▶ Mecheso was named 2008 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Male Freshman of the Year and was named to the Men's All-Freshman team, the league office announced on Nov. 12. Mecheso, Kibet and Kibioywo each landed a spot on the Men's First Team and Julian Matthews was named to the Men's All-Freshman team. Knight was the only women's runner from Auburn to earn All-SEC accolades, landing a spot on the first team.

#### Pair of Auburn Runners Earn SEC Honors

► Auburn's Girma Mecheso claimed the men's individual 8K title and Holly Knight finished as the women's 6K runner-up at the Southeastern Conference Champion-ship at the Mississippi State Cross Country Course in Starkville on Nov. 3. The 11th-ranked men's team had 62 points for a runner-up finish and the women tallied 127 points to place fifth.

• Mecheso clocked his fastest 8K at 23:11.26 and crossed the line five seconds ahead of runner-up Tyson Davis of Alabama. Mecheso's time is the best in the SEC this season.

► Elkanah Kibet and Felix Kibioywo placed third and fourth, respectively. Kibet clocked a career-best time of 23:20.35 to capture third place. Kibioywo finished fourth in 23:26.98, also a career best.

► Scott Novack placed 22nd, crossing the line in 24:44.47, followed by freshman Julian Matthews in 25:08.92 at 33rd. Matthews was the fifth-highest placing freshman in the race. Running in his first race of the season, Jean-Pierre Weerts clocked in a 25:22.22 and Joby Peake was right behind him at 25:23.20 to claim 39th and 40th places, respectively. Freshman Jeff Sanders rounded out the Tiger lineup, finishing 72nd in a personal best of 26:20.04.

Knight ran to a runner-up finish in 20:18.52 and earned her second All-SEC nod. She has finished among the top four in all of her sophomore season races.

► Laurel Pritchard and Sabrina Fischer finished the race at 20th and 21st, respectively. Pritchard posted her season-best 6K time with a 21:34.39 and Fischer mirrored by notching her season-best with a 21:37.86.

► Two other women's runners placed in the top 50 with Amber Riley completing the course in 22:03.93 to finish 37th, followed by Becca Bell at 50th in 22:42.06.

#### Pair of Auburn Runners Earn SEC Honors

▶ Auburn's Holly Knight and Girma Mecheso were named Female Athlete and Male Freshman of the Week, respectively, for their performances at the Pre-Nationals in Terre Haute, Ind., the Southeastern Conference announced on Oct. 21. Knight received the honor for the first time in her career, while Mecheso earns his second rookie nod.

#### Knight and Kibioywo Finish as Runners-Up at Pre-Nationals

▶ Auburn's Holly Knight and Felix Kibioywo each captured runner-up honors on Oct. 18, at the prestigious Pre-National meet in Terre Haute, Ind. The Tiger men, ranked 16th nationally, had three runners finish among the top 20 en route to a fourthplace team finish with 194 points. The women placed 18th with 498 points.

► Knight edged Washington's Kendra Schaaf 20:13.4 to 20:14.7 to finish as the Blue Race runner-up. North Carolina's Brianna Felnagle won the race in 20:02.4.

▶ The potent men's trio of Kibioywo, Mecheso and Kibet all placed among the top 20. Kibioywo, who ran the same course a year ago at the NCAA Championships, led the way for the Tigers with a runner-up performance. Kibioywo finished the 8K course in 23:35.50 and was 44 seconds behind the individual champion, Samuel Chelanga of Liberty. Mecheso was only two seconds behind Kibioywo in fifth place at 23:37.50. Just outside of the top 10 was Kibet with an 11th-place finish, crossing the line in 23:46.20.

#### **Kibet Cruises Again to Win Tiger Invitational**

► Kibet cruised to an individual title and the No. 21 Auburn men captured the men's Mel Rosen Orange Race team title with 31 points on Oct. 4 at the Tiger Invitational at Indian Pines Golf Course. Holly Knight placed fourth for the Auburn women en route to a sixth-place women's Mel Rosen Orange Race team finish.

► Auburn's trio of Kibet, Kibioywo and Mesecho packed a potent punch, taking first through third places. Kibet, who has won all three of his races this season, crossed the 8K line in 22:16.35, 24 seconds ahead of runner-up Kibioywo (22:40.24). Mesecho took third, finishing in 22:55.52, three seconds better than his 8K at the Roy Griak.

▶ Freshman Julian Matthews was just shy of a top-10 finisher, placing 11th in 23:26.80. Matthews lowered his 8K by over two minutes after running his first-ever 8K at the Roy Griak.

▶ Crossing the 5K line first for the Tigers was Knight in 16:07.83 to take fourth place. The sophomore was the first non-Washington runner to finish, as the Huskies finished first through third and then followed by taking sixth through ninth. In only the second race of the season, Knight has put together a pair of top-five finishes.

▶ Pritchard was the second Tiger to finish at 22nd in 17:15.65. Nine seconds back was Sabrina Fischer in 29th (17:24.22) and Riley was 31st (17:30.64).

#### **Kibioywo Named SEC Athlete of the Week**

Auburn's Felix Kiboiywo was named Southeastern Conference Cross Country Male Athlete of the Week following his performance Sept. 27 at the Roy Griak Invitational, the league office announced on Sept. 30.

Running in his first race of his junior campaign, Kiboiywo placed seventh at the 8K Roy Griak Invitational in a time of 24:17.9. Kiboiywo was one of two top-10 finishers for the Tigers and helped pace the No. 25 Auburn men's cross country team to a fifth-place finish.

This is the second time in Kiboiywo's career that he has received Athlete of the ► Week honors.

#### **Kibet Captures Roy Griak Title; Auburn Men Place Fifth**

Elkanah Kibet captured his second individual title and Felix Kibioywo placed seventh to pace the No. 25 Auburn men's cross country team to a fifth-place finish at the 8K Roy Griak Invitational Sept. 27 in Falcon Heights, Minn.

Kibet cruised to his second title in as many races, crossing the finish line in 23:55.3. He finished 12 seconds ahead of runner-up Hassan Mead of Minnesota.

Running in his first race of the season, returning NCAA qualifier Kibioywo completed the course in 24:17.9 for a seventh-place finish.

Scott Novack and Girma Mecheso were also top-30 finishers for the Tigers. Novack placed 24th in a time of 25:00.0 and Mecheso was six seconds behind him for a 29th-place finish in 25:06.0.

Auburn newcomers Elkanah Kibet and Girma Mecheso were named SEC Male Athlete and Freshman of the Week, respectively, following their performances Sept. 5 at the Powerade Invitational, the league office announced Sept. 8

#### Auburn Men Win Team Title; Women Runner-Up

The Auburn men's cross country team finished in first place and the women tied for second and both teams had the individual champion as the Tigers opened their 2008 seasons at the Powerade Invitational hosted by the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

▶ In the men's 5K race, Auburn captured first through fourth place with junior college transfer Elkanah Kibet and true freshman Girma Mecheso packing the blazing one-two punch in 14:49 and 14:54, respectively. Junior Scott Novack (15:22) and true freshman Julian Matthews (15:31) followed for third and fourth.

On the women's side, the Tigers had three top-10 finishers with sophomore Holly Knight and junior Laurel Pritchard placing first and third, respectively. Knight, who was the top finisher at the same event a year ago, cruised to her second title by completing the two-mile course in 10:56 and finished 26 seconds ahead of runner-up Tara Gietema of UT-Chattanooga. Pritchard crossed the line in 11:22 and sophomore Amber Riley placed sixth for the Tigers.
