- Averaged 17.3 ppg and 7.0 rpg in three key SEC wins last week.
- In a must win over #7/7-ranked Kentucky on Monday, she scored 18 points and grabbed 6 rebounds while connecting on 66.7 percent of her shots.
- In that game, Stricklen eclipsed the 1,700 career points and 800 career rebounds threshold versus Kentucky.
- She led the Lady Vols with 22 points and 12 rebounds in a key road victory at Mississippi State on Thursday night. It marked her fourth double-double of the season.
- On Sunday at Ole Miss, Stricklen tossed in 12 points including 2 of 3 three-pointers and grabbed three rebounds.
- For the week, Stricklen averaged 17.3 ppg while shooting 53.8 percent from the field (21-39), 50.0 percent (3-6) from three-point land and 87.5 percent (7-8) on her charity tosses. She also added 4 assists, 3 blocks and 2 steals while averaging 30.0 mpg.

- Came off the bench in three key SEC wins last week vs. #7 Kentucky, at Mississippi State and at Ole Miss to help propel the Lady Vols back into the SEC race for the top spot.
- She doubled her season averages for the week in rebounds, assists and blocked shots.
- In three contests, she averaged 7.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 2.7 apg and 1.0 bpg while averaging 18.0 mpg. She connected on 66.7 percent of her shots (10-15).
- In limited duty vs. Kentucky (10 minutes) she grabbed 5 rebounds, dished 3 assists and added a bucket.
- At Mississippi State, she logged 26 minutes while scoring 10 points, grabbing 7 rebounds, dishing 3 assists and blocking 2 shots.
- Against Ole Miss, she dropped in 10 points on 4 of 5 shooting (.800), collected 6 rebounds and dished 2 assists in 18 minutes.

Team Notes

Alabama

Alabama went 1-1 this week, first collecting a 77-75 win over No. 7 Kentucky, followed by a 69-55 loss to No. 25 South Carolina. The win over the Wildcats was the Crimson Tide's first over a top-10 opponent since February 10, 2000, when the Tide beat No. 7 LSU, 72-68. Sophomore Jasmine Robinson scored 17 points and grabbed six rebounds to lead the Tide against the Wildcats. In addition to Robinson's 17 points, Perkins scored 14 points and junior Kyra Crosby added 10 for Alabama. Junior Jessica Merritt grabbed seven boards to lead the Tide in rebounding. Freshman Aneesah Daniels grabbed five boards to go along with nine points. Alabama played its best half of basketball all season in the first 20 minutes of the game, shooting 70 percent from the floor, while holding Kentucky to 33.3 percent of its attempts. On the flip side, the Tide struggled offensively against the Gamecocks, managing just 27.5 percent for the game (19-for-69). Robinson would, once again, lead Alabama in scoring with 17 points, while Crosby collected her first double-double in the crimson and white with 11 points and 10 rebounds. The Tide will finish out the regular season on the road as it is slated to take on Auburn on Thursday and Vanderbilt on Sunday.

Arkansas

The University of Arkansas improved to 20-6 overall and 9-5 in the SEC winning 20 games for the second consecutive season under head coach Tom Collen. Senior C'eira Ricketts paced Arkansas to a 1-1 week with a loss to LSU and a win over Mississippi State. Ricketts scored 19 against LSU and 18 against the Bulldogs averaging 18.5 points per game for the week. Senior Ashley Daniels had her second double-double of the year with 10 points and a career-best 16 rebounds in the win over State. The duo paced four Razorbacks who scored in double figures. Arkansas travels to Tennessee and South Carolina to round out the SEC regular season.

Auburn

The Auburn women's basketball team (11-16, 3-11 SEC) had its off-week last week, playing just one game at LSU on Sunday. The Tigers dropped their lone game, 51-47, to the Bayou Bengals. Freshman Hasina Muhammad led Auburn with 12 points while senior Chantel Hilliard added nine points and three steals. Auburn will return home for its final two regular-season games. The Tigers will host in-state rival Alabama at 8 p.m., Thursday, before taking on Ole Miss at 2:30 p.m., Sunday.

Florida

Florida plays host to Mississippi State on Thursday in the team's final home game of the regular season, as team squad has won five straight in the O'Connell Center. The Gators then travel to Knoxville and play nationally-ranked Tennessee on Sunday. It will be the first meeting of the year against both teams on this week's schedule. Eleven of UF's 14 SEC games this year have been decided by 10 points or less, with 10 of the 14 being decided by 6 points or fewer. Florida's win versus Georgia was the 27th time in program history the Gators have upset a ranked team when being unranked themselves. The victory against the Bulldogs also marked the team's 47th all-time upset over a higher-ranked team. Head coach Amanda Butler collected her 95th win in five seasons at her alma mater. In the

win against Georgia, Jennifer George's 15 points gave her exactly 800 for her career. George also surpassed 600 career rebounds and has a career total of 604.

Georgia

The Lady Bulldogs enter the final week of the regular season with a 20-7 overall record and a 9-5 mark in SEC play. Georgia is currently tied for third in the league standings with Arkansas, LSU and South Carolina. Last Thursday, Georgia defeated South Carolina in Columbia, 61-59, behind 18 points from Jasmine Hassell. Jasmine James became the Lady Bulldogs' 32nd 1,000-point career scorer during the victory over the Gamecocks. Saudia Roundtree, the 1996 National Player of the Year and the last Lady Bulldog to wear No. 10 before James, was in attendance in Columbia. James is now 22 points away from Roundtree and the No. 31 position among UGA's career scoring leaders. Georgia dropped a 61-57 decision to Florida on Sunday in Gainesville. Jasmine James' 15 points paced the Lady Bulldogs against the Gators. Georgia wraps up the regular season with home dates against Ole Miss and LSU on Thursday and Sunday, respectively. The Lady Bulldogs are 28-11 all-time against Ole Miss, including a 14-1 mark in Athens. Georgia topped the Lady Rebels, 61-47, on Jan. 22 in Oxford behind double-doubles from both Anne Marie Armstrong (15 points and 11 rebounds) and Meredith Mitchell (10 points and 14 rebounds). Georgia leads its series with LSU 20-17, including an 11-5 record in Athens.

Kentucky

No. 7/7 Kentucky looks to get back on the winning track after dropping their last two outings on the road at LSU and No. 13/11 Tennessee. Despite the losses, the Wildcats sit atop of the SEC race, one game ahead of the Lady Vols with four games remaining. The Cats are just one win away from tying the most SEC wins in school history at 11, and their four SEC road wins are two shy of tying the school record of 6 set in 2005-06. Leading the way for the Wildcats is junior All-America and SEC Player of the Year candidate A'dia Mathies. Mathies leads the team in scoring (15.0), steals (2.7) and 3-point field goal percentage (.368). She is second on the team in rebounding (5.3), assists (2.5), blocks (0.7) and 3-point field goals made (39). SEC Freshman of the Year contender Bria Goss follows in the scoring column with 11.6 ppg. She has scored in double digits in three of the last four games, including a team-high 15 points at Tennessee. Sophomore forward Samarie Walker is the leading rebounder with 6.3 rebounds per game. UK ends a three-game road stand at Alabama on Thursday before playing host to Vanderbilt for its second straight Big Monday matchup. The Cats and the Commodores will tip off at 9 p.m. ET in Memorial Coliseum.

LSU

The LSU Lady Tigers stretched their win streak to five games last week after wins at Arkansas (50-42) and Auburn (57-41). LSU improved to 19-8 overall and secured a winning record in SEC play with a 9-5 mark. The Lady Tigers head into this week in a tie for third place in the league standings. As a result of Georgia's loss Sunday, LSU now owns the longest win streak in the SEC. The win at Arkansas snapped the Razorbacks' eight-game win streak. During the current win streak, LSU is holding

opponents to 45.8 points per game and 31.7 percent shooting. The Lady Tigers have held four consecutive opponents under 50 points. All-America candidate LaSondra Barrett is averaging 14.8 points per game and 40-of-52 from the free throw line during the win streak. A season-high 6,763 fans watched LSU defeat Auburn Sunday, representing the largest crowd to see a Lady Tiger game in the PMAC since Feb. 2009. LSU closes its home slate against Vanderbilt at 8 p.m. CT Sunday before traveling to face Georgia at 4 p.m. CT Sunday in Athens.

Ole Miss

Ole Miss fell to 12-15 overall and 2-12 in SEC play after falling in a close game to No. 10 Tennessee, 66-56, Sunday afternoon. Prior to the game, Ole Miss honored its three seniors, Nikki Byrd, LaTosha Laws and Whitney Hameth. Valencia McFarland led Ole Miss with 21 points which marks her ninth career 20-point game and fifth of the season. Ole Miss tied its season-high making eight threes with McFarland going 4-6 and Amber Singletary going 2-2. Tia Faleru recorded a team-high six rebounds while Nikki Byrd had five. For the season, Ole Miss is led by McFarland who is averaging 13.6 points per game and Byrd who is averaging 11.9. Byrd leads the team in rebounding, averaging 8.8 boards per game while Danielle McCray is second, averaging 4.4. The Rebels will close out the regular season on the road. Playing at No. 15 Georgia on Thursday and at Auburn on Sunday.

Mississippi State

Mississippi State had a tough week, dropping hard-fought contests to No. 10/13 Tennessee and Arkansas. The Lady Bulldogs travel to Florida on Thursday before wrapping the regular season at home against No. 7 Kentucky on Sunday. Against the Lady Vols, MSU surrendered its fewest points in the series (57). Freshman Kendra Grant was sensational against UT, scoring a career-high 17 points on 6-13 shooting. The Richland, Miss., native scored 11 of the team's 13 first-half points. It was the week of the freshman for MSU, as rookie Jerica James was the Lady Bulldogs' leading scorer at Arkansas on Sunday. In the first game back in her home state, the North Little Rock native drew the first start of her career and scored 12 points. Senior Diamber Johnson dished out seven assists against Tennessee, her most since tying a career high with 10 against Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 19. Johnson added six assists at Arkansas on Sunday, giving her 13 for the two-game span after she compiled 13 in the seven previous games. Fellow senior Porsha Porter tallied 15 points vs. Tennessee and nine at Arkansas. Including an 18-point showing against Ole Miss a week ago, she is averaging 14.0 ppg in her last three contests.

South Carolina

South Carolina captured its 20th win of the season and its ninth in the SEC. It is the first season with marks that high since 2002-03. The nine wins is the second-most the Gamecocks have won in a season since joining the league in 1991-92. The Gamecocks split a pair of games last week, bouncing back from a two-point loss to Georgia with a 69-55 win at Alabama on Sunday. South Carolina's trio of starting guards continue to shine as the top three scorers in last week's games, highlighted by La'Keisha Sutton's 16.5 points per game that included a 20-point outing against Georgia. Markeshia Grant added 11.0

points per game, while junior leasia Walker posted 9.5 points, 4.5 assists and 5.0 rebounds per game last week. The frontcourt did its share of damage in the win at Alabama, scoring 31 of the team's 69 points, which helped the Gamecocks to a season-high 55.6 percent field goal shooting against the Crimson Tied. South Carolina closes out its season at Kentucky on Thursday before Senior Day festivities honor the five Gamecocks in their final regular-season home game against Arkansas on Sunday.

Tennessee

Tennessee will be home this week for the final two regular season games. The Lady Vols will entertain Arkansas on Thurs., Feb. 23 in Thompson-Boling Arena at 7 p.m. on FS-South (please note change to FS-South). UT will close the book on the 2011-12 regular season facing Florida on Sun., Feb. 26 at 3:30 p.m. in Thompson-Boling Arena on ESPNU where the Big Orange will salute the seniors in pregame ceremonies. This will mark the Lady Vols second appearance against Arkansas this season. On Jan. 8, UT handed the Razorbacks their third SEC loss, 69-38, in Fayetteville as the Orange raced out to a 31-11 halftime lead. Since that time, UA has been a hot SEC squad fashioning a 9-2 conference slate. Tennessee picked up SEC win number 10 on the season at Mississippi State on Feb. 16. All-time, the Lady Vols have registered double-digit victories in conference play an incredible 18 times, including 14 times in the last 15 years since conference play expanded. At Ole Miss on Feb. 19, the Lady Vols picked up the 20th win on the season. It marked the 36th consecutive year a Lady Vol team reached at least 20 wins in a season under head coach Pat Summitt. Summitt has only had two teams fail to reach 20-win seasons during her 38-year tenure – in her first and second seasons (1974-75 and 1975-76) at UT, the Lady Vols were 16-8 and 16-11, respectively. Vicki Baugh grabbed six rebounds at Mississippi State and is now a member of the 500-point, 500-rebound club with the Lady Vols. Baugh has 582 career points and 508 career rebounds in limited games. Glory Johnson now has 1,115 career boards after collecting 15 at Mississippi State. She is also closing in on 1,500 career points – with 1,492 entering the game with Arkansas. Sophomore Meighan Simmons went over 800 career points at Ole Miss. She now has 803.

Vanderbilt

The Vanderbilt women's basketball team won its only game on the week, defeating Florida, 75-59, in overtime on Thursday, February 16. In a game featuring nine ties and 10 lead changes, the most important tie came at the end of regulation when Christina Foggie banked in an off-balance three to force overtime. During the extra period, the Commodores outscored Florida, 10-4, to take the win. Tiffany Clarke and Stephanie Holzer kept Vanderbilt in the game, each recording double-doubles. Clarke matched a career-high with 17 rebounds while scoring 18 points, while Holzer scored 14 points and grabbed 12 boards. The win gives Vanderbilt its 13th-consecutive 20-win season. The Commodores face a busy week, with three contests over the final seven days of the regular season. They travel to Kentucky on Monday, February 20, visit LSU on Thursday, February 23, then host Alabama in the regular-season finale on Sunday, February 26.

Preseason Polls & Accolades

- Five SEC teams were ranked in the national preseason polls. Tennessee was ranked third in both Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches polls. Georgia was ranked 13th in AP and 12th in the coaches, while Kentucky received enough votes to be 18th in AP and 15th in coaches. LSU was 21st in AP and 22nd in coaches, while Vanderbilt received votes in both polls.
- The media predicted Tennessee to win the regular season title. Tennessee topped the order of finish with 264 points, with Georgia (228), Kentucky (212), LSU (189), Vanderbilt (172) and Florida (151) rounding out the top half of the league. Arkansas (142), South Carolina (107), Auburn (94), Alabama (55), Mississippi State (54) and Ole Miss (48) round out the bottom half.
- Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen was the overwhelming choice of the media for SEC Women's Basketball Player of the Year. Joining Stricklen on the All-SEC First Team are Georgia's Jasmine James, Kentucky's A'dia Mathies, LSU's LaSondra Barrett and Tennessee's Glory Johnson. Second Team includes Arkansas' C'eria Ricketts, Ole Miss' Valencia McFarland, Tennessee's Meighan Simmons, and Vanderbilt's Stephanie Holzer.
- Tennessee was predicted to win the Southeastern Conference women's basketball regular season championship by the coaches.

 - Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary).
 - Coin flip by the Commissioner.
- Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.
 - Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 -- Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
 - Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary).
 - If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
 - If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.
