Xavier comes into the Auburn game after defeating Miami (Ohio) 60-53 Saturday behind a career-high 23 points from Derrick Brown ... the Musketeers' impressive resume also includes winning the Puerto Rico Tip-Off by defeating No. 12 Memphis 63-58 in the championship game as well as Missouri (75-71) and Virginia Tech (63-62 in ot) ... Dayton has also defeated Toledo (81-65) and IPFW (71-43) ... Derrick Brown leads a balanced Xavier attack averaging a team-high 12.7 points per game ... B.J. Raymond adds 10.7 ppg followed by C.J. McLean (8.0 ppg, 5.8 rpg), Dante' Jackson (6.8 ppg) and Terrell Holloway (7.8 ppg) ... Xavier has a smothering defense that limits opponents to only 58.7 points per game, 35 percent shooting from the field and 29 percent shooting from 3-point range ... Xavier has attempted 211 free throws compared to 124 to its opponents for an average of 35.2 per game to 20.7 per game for its opponents ... they have almost outscored their opponents double from the foul line, 141-75 or 23.5 per game to 12.5 ... the Musketeers are the preseason pick to win the Atlantic 10 Conference ... Xavier, which hammered Auburn 80-57 last season on Jan. 6, 2008, behind an impressive 16-of-26 (.615) shooting percentage from 3-point range, returns two starters from last year's 30-7 team that won the Atlantic 10 with a 14-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight ... last year against Auburn, B.J. Raymond came off the bench to score 18 points by making 6-of-8 three-pointers.

AUBURN-XAVIER SERIES

This is the seventh meeting between Auburn and Xavier with the series tied 3-3. The Tigers won the first three games played between the two while the Musketeers have won the last three.

Last year's 80-57 win at Auburn was the first game between the two in 35 seasons since playing three straight from 1970-72.

Xavier has a 1-0 record in Auburn, 1-0 vs. the Tigers in Cincinnati, but Auburn is 3-1 vs. Xavier in neutral sites.

Auburn won the first three games of the series, 64-57 in the Sugar Bowl Tournament in New Orleans on Dec. 28,

1962, 75-73 in the Mobile Classic on Dec. 28, 1968, and 86-73 in the Old Dominion Tournament in Norfolk, Va., on Dec. 29, 1970.

Xavier defeated the Tigers 71-60 in Birmingham on Dec. 18, 1971, and then 67-60 in Cincinnati on Dec. 19, 1972.

JEFF LEBO vs. XAVIER

Auburn's Jeff Lebo is 0-1 vs. Xavier as a head coach as the Tigers lost to the Musketeers last season.

As an assistant coach at East Tennessee State, Lebo was on the ETSU staff that defeated Xavier in Cincinnati 82-79 on Dec. 27, 1991.

JEFF LEBO & SEAN MILLER

Auburn's Jeff Lebo is 0-1 coaching against Xavier's Sean Miller with the only game between the two coming last season in Auburn.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Auburn senior Quantez Robertson, who attended Cincinnati Withrow High School, played in high school against Xavier's C.J. Anderson of Winton Woods High.

HOMECOMING FOR TEZ

The trip to Xavier is part of a home-and-home series between the Tigers and Musketeers to allow Auburn senior point guard to return to his hometown of Cincinnati. It is the first time in his collegiate career that he will have played in Cincinnati. Robertson was a two-year letterman at Withrow High School where he led the team to a 20-1 record earning second-team all-state honors averaging 12 points a game as a senior. He was a city of Cincinnati player of the year nominee.

Robertson is expecting around 50 family and friends to be in attendance at the Auburn-Xavier game.

TIGERS WON 4 of LAST 8 GAMES vs. NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Auburn has won four of its last eight games vs. Top 25 teams. Last season, the Tigers defeated No. 15 Ole Miss (80-77) and lost at No. 2 Tennessee (89-70), to No. 17 Vanderbilt (93-82) in the SEC Tournament and at No. 18 Vanderbilt (78-71).

Two years ago, Auburn won at No. 25 Alabama (86-77), lost to No. 1 Florida (91-66), defeated No. 12 Alabama (81-57) and No. 22 Tennessee (83-80) Jan. 17, 2007.

The Tigers had lost nine-straight games away from Auburn prior to their win at No. 25 Alabama (86-77) on Feb. 24, 2007.

The stretch started after an 80-68 Auburn win at No. 24 LSU Feb. 18, 2004.

SPEED REED

DeWayne Reed has averaged 21.5 points in Auburn's last two games while shooting 41.1 percent (7-of-17) from 3-point range. He had back-to-back game-highs with a career-high 22 points when Auburn only scored 59 points in a one-point loss to Dayton in overtime and followed that up with 21 points with 3-of-5 three-pointers made when Auburn scored 61 points vs. Northern Iowa. He also

WELCOME BACK VOT

Korvotney Barber is averaging 13.2 points while shooting a team-best 55 percent from the floor this year.

He recorded his first double-double of the season and the ninth of his career with 11 points and 10 rebounds vs. Northern Iowa.

He scored a game-high 22 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field in Auburn's 75-60 season opening win over Missouri State. The Manchester, Ga., native backed that up with 17 points vs. Mercer.

He was leading the nation shooting 72.0 percent from the field when he broke his left hand three minutes into Auburn's Dec. 29 game vs. Towson and missed the rest of last season.

MANCHESTER MATES

Manchester (Ga.) High School has been good to Auburn as two of the Tigers' top three leading scorers, Korvotney Barber and Tay Waller, were teammates there.

The duo is combining for 37.4 percent of Auburn's scoring by averaging 25.7 points per game.

Barber is averaging 13.2 points per game while shooting 55 percent from the field.

Waller is averaging 12.5 points while shooting 35 percent from the field.

Auburn lost to Northern Iowa 67-61 in the final round of the Chicago Invitational at the Sears Centre as DeWayne Reed once again led the Tigers with a game-high 21 points. Auburn used an 18-6 run to turn an 11-7 deficit into a 25-17 lead with 4:27 left in the first half as a pair of Tay Waller 3-pointers contributed to it. The Tigers held a 28-20 lead with 3:18 remaining in the half on a Brendon Knox jumper, but Northern Iowa scored the final eight points of the half to tie the score at 28-28. six minutes into the second half. Eight points by Reed helped bring the Tigers to within 46-44 with 10:55 left. Northern Iowa pushed the margin back up to nine at 58-49 with 2:27 remaining, but the Tigers still had life left as a Reed layup closed it to within 64-58 with 35 seconds left. Rasheem Barrett then stole the ball and missed a 3-pointer from the right baseline that would have cut the lead in half with 28 seconds on the clock. Northern Iowa outshot Auburn 53.7 percent to 40.0 percent from the field and 47.1 percent (8-of-17) to 29.6 percent (8-of-27) from 3-point range. Northern Iowa, which shot 60 percent from the field and 44 percent (4-of-9) from 3-point range in the first half, made 4-of-8 three-pointers in the second half. The Tigers outrebounded the Panthers, 31-30 and committed only 11 turnovers to forcing 16. The Panthers shot 68.2 percent (15-of-22) from the foul line while the Tigers were only 55.6 percent (5-of-9). Korvotney Barber recorded his first double-double of the season with 11

points and 10 rebounds while Tay Waller added 10 points. 7-foot-1 center Jordan Eglseder had 10 points and 10 rebounds for Northern Iowa, Ali Farokhmanesh scored a team-high 14 points and Johnny Moran added 13 points.

QUOTING JEFF LEBO (On Xavier)

"They are a top 15 team and a team that has won a lot of close games. They have size. They will be the biggest, most experienced team that we have played and that concerns me. They are averaging 35 foul shots a game. They have taken 211 free throws this year. They have offensive rebounding, the ability to get the ball in around the basket area off the bounce and post up positions. They are big and strong. We can't get in a free throw shooting contest really with anybody right now. We have to be aggressive without fouling. We can't put them on the foul line where they score so many points from the line. Thirty-five a night is unbelievable. In six

games, they have taken 211 foul shots and that is incredible."

(On learning about Auburn in Chicago)

"We have to make some adjustments in some things that we do. We didn't get a lot out of our inside guys in Chicago. Defensively for the most part we were good enough and we competed enough. Offensively, we shot the ball horrendous. Making shots is like an energy pill for you defensively. For the last three games, we really didn't score two consecutive times or three consecutive times down the floor. We only averaged 60 points the last three games. So, when you shoot the ball as poorly as we do and we shoot poorly from the foul line. We beat Dayton if we make just two more (free throws). We were 12-of-26 in that game. We lost to Mercer, and we shot poorly from the line (16-of-28) against Mercer. That's frustrating because when you get there you have to capitalize on them. A lot of times we got the ball right where we wanted to and there was a foul and come out with nothing. Free throw shooting has hurt us. Our shot selection at times was bad in Chicago more than anything else. That hurt us at times. We ended up having to play the small lineup when we got behind a little bit against Northern Iowa. We probably should have doubled a little more against the big guy. We will learn from it hopefully and try to figure out what our best lineup is and move forward. It is a tough one to have your next one with Xavier up there."

(On Auburn's low post players)

"Right now, people are being very physical with our post playing them one on one in behind and they are being physical

because they are not afraid to foul them. If they foul them, right now in that position, we are shooting 48 percent from the foul line. That's not too good when they foul you in there. That's one of our issues right now. They are really clamping down on our perimeters making it tough for them to get looks. We have to have somebody step up there inside. Vot (Barber) showed some toughness. He played a little tentative still with his broken nose. He broke it two days before the game (last Wednesday in practice) in Chicago. Obviously, he is our best low post option. We have to get something solid out of the other two guys. They are not going to be guys who are going to be big number guys, but they have to give us a little more in scoring. When they do get fouled in there, they have to be able to capitalize much better on the free throw line because that has absolutely killed us."

QUOTING QUANTEZ ROBERTSON

(On Going Back Home to Cincinnati)

"I am looking forward to going and seeing friends and family. I will get a chance to see some family that I haven't seen in awhile and give them a chance to see me play. It is going to be quite an Auburn fan club at the game come Wednesday."

"We need to start knocking in the open shots, getting better and defense and following the game plan. Also, we need to try to get our big men more involved in the game instead of relying on outside shots. We have been playing pretty good basketball, but we just need to make the open shot when we get the chance and step up to the free throw line and make

NEW ARENA OPENING 2010-11

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

The arena, with approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertain-

ing opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation in to a site for concerts and other cultural events, convocations and other com-

munity gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 41st year of service to the University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena, the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

TIGERS IN BEMC

In its 41st year of play in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, Auburn boasts a 279-112 record (.714) over the past 25 seasons. Overall, the Tigers are 366-174 (.678) since their first season in the Coliseum in 1968-69. Only five times in the 41-year history of the arena has Auburn experienced a losing record at home. The Tigers are 3-1 at home last season.

AUBURN TRIPLE-DOUBLES?

Never in the 103 seasons and 2,215 games of Auburn Basketball (1181-1033-1) (.533) has a Tiger recorded a coveted triple-double.

OVERTIME RECORD

Auburn has a 44-43 (.506) record in overtime games in its history. The Tigers last overtime game was a 60-59 loss to Dayton in the Chicago Invitational on Nov. 28, 2008. Auburn is 0-1 in overtime games this year.

WHAT'S NEXT?

The Warhawks have a week off before playing the Tigers after losing at Tennessee Tech 108-70 last Saturday. ULM has defeated Stephen F. Austin (60-58) and Morehead State (56-54) while also losing at Missis-

sippi State (78-49) and to McNeese State (82-63). Jarvis Hill averages a team-high 14.8 points while Tony Hooper adds 10.3 points per game. ULM averages 59.6 points per game, allows 76.0 points and shoots 36 percent from the field, 26 percent from 3-point range and 58 percent from the foul line. The Warhawks return two starters from last year's team that went 10-21 overall and finished seventh in the Sun Belt with a 4-14 record. They are picked to finish fifth in the West Division of the Sun Belt by Blue Ribbon.

Tay Waller scored a game-high 27 points in only 21 minutes to lead Auburn to a 98-50 exhibition victory over Morehouse College. Waller made 7-of-12 shots from 3-point range as part of 10-of-16 shooting from the field while not playing the final 12:18 of the game. Quantez Robertson added 19 points making all four 3-pointers attempted, and had 10 rebounds and 5 assists in 31 minutes. Auburn led by as much as 51 at 92-41 with 3:56 left. The Tigers pulled away in the final five minutes of the first half as they increased a 24-15 lead to as much as 46-19 before settling for a 46-22 halftime edge. Auburn led 71-31 with 13:29 left in the game and the lead never dipped below 40 points the rest of the way. For the game, Auburn shot 51 percent from the field (39-of-76) and 46 percent from 3-point range (15-of-33) but was poor from the foul line shooting 36 percent (5-of-14). Morehouse College was led by Kenney Boyd's 21 points and 10 rebounds as the Maroon Tigers were held to 36 percent shooting from the field, 22 percent from 3-point range and were outrebounded 47-35.

Waller added 14 points on 4-of-8 three-point shooting for the Tigers, Hargrove had 13 points, five assists and three rebounds, Brendon Knox 10 points and three rebounds off the bench and Quantez Robertson seven points, seven rebounds and four assists. Chris Cooks led Missouri State with 18 points and Spencer Laurie added 14 points and six rebounds while Cardell McFarland had 14 points and three rebounds. Auburn had 20 assists on its 28 made field goals and outscored Missouri State 42-14 in the paint.

The Tigers were outrebounded 46-21 by the Bears and only made 6-of-14 foul shots in the second half, including a poor 2-of-8 in the final 7:20 after Auburn took a 67-65 lead. Atlantic Sun Conference member Mercer improved to 2-0 against the SEC Western Division as it won at Alabama 72-69 four days prior. Tay Waller led Auburn with 22 points on 6-of-13 three-point shooting but missed several minutes down the stretch with cramps. Auburn lost to Northern Iowa 67-61 in the final round of the Chicago Invitational at the Sears Centre as DeWayne Reed once again led the Tigers with a game-high 21 points. Auburn had an 18-6 run to turn an 11-7 deficit into a 25-17 lead with 4:27 left in the first half as a pair of Tay Waller 3-pointers contributed to it. The Tigers held a 28-20 lead with 3:18 remaining in the half on a Brendon Knox jumper, but Northern Iowa scored the final eight points of the half to tie the score at 28-28. With the score tied at 34, the Panthers scored 10 straight points to take their largest lead of the game at 44-34 just over six minutes into the second half. Eight points by Reed helped bring the Tigers to within 46-44 with 10:55 left. Northern Iowa pushed the margin back up to nine at 58-49 with 2:27 remaining, but the Tigers still had life left as a Reed layup closed it to within 64-58 with 35 seconds left. Rasheem Barrett then stole the ball and missed a 3-pointer from the right baseline that would have cut the lead in half with 28 seconds on the clock. Korvotney Barber recorded his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 10 rebounds while Tay Waller added 10 points. 7-foot-1 center Jordan Eglseder had 10 points and 10 rebounds for Northern Iowa, Ali Farokhmanesh scored a team-high 14 points and Johnny Moran added 13 points.
