**TV:** The game will be televised live nationally on both ESPN2 and ESPN 3D. On ESPN2, Sean McDonough will provide the play-by-play and Jay Bilas the analysis. On ESPN 3D, Mark Jones will call the action and Mark Gottfried the commentary.

**Radio:** The contest will be broadcast live on the Rutgers Radio Network, WOR 710 AM in New York and WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Chris Carlin will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU (88.7) will also broadcast the game.

After consecutive home victories, Rutgers takes flight for Pittsburgh to meet SEC-member Auburn in a 12:30 p.m. tip-off on Saturday at the Consol Energy Center in the DirecTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational. First-year RU head coach Mike Rice is no stranger to the Steel City. Born in Pittsburgh, Rice served as head coach at Robert Morris in nearby Moon Township, Pa., the past three seasons (2007-10) after working as an assistant at Pittsburgh in 2006-07. His father, Mike Rice Sr., was the head coach at Duquesne from 1979-82.

Saturday afternoon's match-up marks the sixth meeting between the Scarlet Knights and Tigers in a series that dates back to 1967, with Auburn holding a 4-1 advantage in victories. The Tigers won the last meeting at home by an 82-70 score on Dec. 8, 2002. The prior season (11/24/01), Rutgers defeated AU 57-56 at the RAC. The initial three meetings in the series were on neutral courts, with the Tigers winning all three.

Rutgers is coming off a 64-48 home victory over Marist Tuesday evening. Gilydas Biruta and Dane Miller both posted double-doubles as RU overcame a 27-21 halftime deficit. Biruta had 15 points and 10 rebounds, while Miller chipped-in 12 points and 10 boards. Biruta supplemented his performance by shooting 7-of-10 from the field with four blocks, three charges, two slam dunks and a three-point play. Jonathan Mitchell scored 16 points on six-of-11 shooting and Mike Coburn added 14 points. Eleven of Mitchell's points came after the break, when he shot a perfect 4-of-4 from the field. Rutgers shot 55.2 percent (16-29) in the second half, while Marist shot just 27.7 percent (13-47) for the game against an RU defense that forced 21 turnovers.

In the most recent NCAA stat report, Rutgers ranks among the nation's best in turnovers (16th), blocked shots (24th), turnover margin (29th) and steals (31st). Individually, Coburn leads the BIG EAST and ranks 38th nationally in steals-per-game, while also placing fifth in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio. Sophomore big man Austin Johnson (Elkins Park, Pa.) leads the conference in field goal percentage (.700), while Biruta places sixth in the league in that category (.591).

Auburn, under the leadership of first-year head coach Tony Barbee, has won three of its last four games after opening the season with three straight losses. The Tigers earned a 76-72 home win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Sunday. After trailing at the break, the Tigers allowed just 24 second half points for a second-straight game to earn the win. Sophomore guard Andre Malone leads the team in scoring with 13.7 points per game.

## RUTGERS SEASON NOTABLES

- With wins over Fairfield (68-53), Miami (61-45) and Norfolk State (83-59) it marked the first time Rutgers had defeated three-consecutive Division I opponents by 15-plus points since Dec. 22-28, 1977 [Manhattan (91-76), St. Peter's (93-55) and Seton Hall (93-78)].

## DIRECTV SEC-BIG EAST INVITATIONAL

The fourth annual DirecTV SEC-Big East Invitational will be held Dec. 8 and Dec. 11 in Louisville (Arkansas vs. Seton Hall/Kentucky vs. Notre Dame) and Pittsburgh (Auburn vs. Rutgers/Tennessee vs. Pittsburgh), respectively. The BIG EAST holds a 7-5 record in the first three years of the event. The two conferences have combined to produce four of the last eight NCAA Men's Basketball Champions: Florida (2006 & 2007), Connecticut (2004), Syracuse (2003); and seven of the last 15 national champions: Connecticut (1999), Kentucky (1996 & 1998).

## THE COACHES' KIDS

Four members of the RU coaching staff followed in their father's footsteps - head coach Mike Rice, assistant coach Jimmy Martelli, coordinator of operations/video Corky McMullen and assistant to the head coach Brad Wachtel.

**Rice** - Son of Mike Rice Sr., head coach at Duquesne (1979-82) and Youngstown State (1982-87). Rice coached for 13 years at the high school level, posting a career record of 245-71, before moving to college coaching in 1977. In four seasons at Duquesne, Rice amassed a 62-49 record, earning two berths in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) and twice being named the Eastern Eight Coach of the Year. At Youngstown State, Rice picked up 75 wins in five years, as the Penguins twice finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference.

**Martelli** - Son of Phil Martelli, the current head coach of Saint Joseph's in Philadelphia. Martelli is in his 16th season with the Hawks, coming into the year with a 289-187 record, including 17 postseason wins. Martelli has taken SJU to the postseason in seven of the last 10 years and was the 2004 Consensus National Coach of the Year.

**McMullen** - Son of Tim McMullen, the current head coach of Letchworth High School in western New York. McMullen - who began coaching in 1983 - has won 296 games with the Indians. McMullen led the squad to its only sectional championship in 1999, with Corky on the squad, and the school's lone Livingston County Division II championship in 2007.

**Wachtel** - Son of Artie Wachtel, former assistant coach at Long Island University and head coach of Perth Amboy Tech. Wachtel spent 18 years with the Blackbirds, working with head coach Paul Lizzo from 1976-1994. In 1995, Wachtel became the head coach of the Patriots.

### PLAYING THE BEST

In addition, West Virginia, North Carolina and Cincinnati are receiving votes.

### RUTGERS VS. AUBURN ALSO TO BE TELEVISED ON ESPN 3D

The Rutgers versus Auburn game on Saturday, Dec. 11 at the Consol Energy Center in Pittsburgh, already slated to be televised live nationally at 12:30 p.m. on ESPN2, will also be broadcast live on ESPN 3D. The game is part of the annual SEC/BIG EAST Invitational.

ESPN 3D is the television industry's first 3D network. Launched on June 11, 2010, ESPN 3D brings together more than three years of research and development. ESPN's first 3D telecast was the USC at Ohio State college football game on Sept. 12, 2009. This successful telecast to audiences in theaters across the United States was the catalyst for ESPN to announce on Jan. 5, 2010 that it intended to bring 3D to fans in their homes. ESPN 3D is available nationwide to more than 45 million households and has carriage agreements with DirecTV, Comcast and AT&T. It will also launch soon on Time Warner.

Mike Rice, who compiled a 73-31 (.702) record as head coach at Robert Morris University en route to three consecutive post-season appearances and a pair of NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament berths, was named the head men's

basketball coach at Rutgers University on May 6, 2010. Rice is the 17th head coach in the history of the Rutgers men's basketball program.

Rice signed a five-year contract through the 2014-15 season.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa. and a graduate of Fordham University in New York, Rice has made 10 NCAA or NIT appearances as either a head or assistant coach during his 16-year tenure in the collegiate coaching ranks.

Rice directed Robert Morris to first place, regular season finishes in each of his three seasons (2007-08 to 2009-10) and captured back-to-back Northeast Conference Tournament championships in 2009 and 2010. He was named the NABC District Coach of the Year, as well as NEC Jim Phelan Coach of the Year, in both 2008 and 2009. A total of 17 school records were either tied or broken under Rice's watch, including victories (26 in 2007-08), NEC wins (16 in 2007-08) and consecutive victories (14 in 2007-08). RMU also posted 15 straight NEC road wins over the course of the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons, a conference record.



### Game Notables:

- RU also dominated the paint, notching 40 points to McGill's 22.
- The Scarlet Knights came out shooting 7-for-10 from the floor before missing their next five shots. For the first half, RU ended 17-for-36 (.472).
- Rutgers withheld from turning the ball over until 6:50 to go in the first half. The Scarlet Knights only turned the ball over three times in the first half, 13 times overall. RU's assist to turnover ratio was 3.33 in the first half, 1.2 overall.
- The Scarlet Knights had four runs of five-or-more, going on a 5-0 and 7-0 streak in the first half and ripping off six-straight and nine-straight in the second stanza.
- Rutgers allowed just one field goal in the first 4:58, causing two turnovers and jumping out to a 13-4 lead.
- Head coach Mike Rice sent a player to the table 30 times in the first half. In comparison, McGill head coach Dave DeAveiro subbed 13 times in the first 20 minutes.
- Gilydas Biruta took the first offensive charge of the season with 14:42 to go in the game.

### Game Notables:

- Four Scarlet Knights scored in double-figures with James Beatty (15), Dane Miller (14), Mike Poole (14), and Mike Coburn (10) all scoring 10-plus. Last season, four players scored in double-digits eight times.
- Rutgers went to overtime once last season (won against Rider, 80-70).
- Dane Miller notched double-figures for the 17th time in his career. This was the fourth time in a Scarlet uniform that James Beatty notched 10-plus.
- Mike Coburn played a career-high 40 minutes.
- Head coach Mike Rice went with the starting lineup of James Beatty, Dane Miller, Mike Coburn, Jonathan Mitchell and Gilydas Biruta. The Scarlet Knights have started a freshman in 18-straight contests.
- Rutgers used 10 of its 12 available players in the contest.

- Biruta led the Scarlet Knights to an 8-2 run to start the game, shooting 3-for-3 from the floor and notching all eight points. Austin Johnson led the next 10-2 run (15:50-12:35), scoring six points on 3-for-3 from the field.
- This was the third time three players have scored in double-figures. RU is 2-1 when that happens.
- Mike Coburn matched his career high with four steals (at Princeton, Nov. 12). Mitchell matched his career high with three blocks (vs. Drexel, Nov. 20, 2009).
- In all six games this season, RU has forced more turnovers than its opponent.
- This is the fifth time this season that RU has scored more points in the paint that its opponent (32-30).
- RU notched season highs in free throws made (eight) and percentage (.889) in the first half. It also marked a season high FT made for the game (20) - the first time since NJIT (22-for-26) last season RU has made 20 from the charity stripe.
- The two three pointers made marked a season low and the fewest since the Drexel game (2-for-7 from behind the arc) on Nov. 20, 2009.
- Head coach Mike Rice went with the starting lineup of James Beatty, Mike Coburn, Dane Miller, Jonathan Mitchell and Gilydas Biruta for the sixth-straight contest. The Scarlet Knights have started a freshman in 23-straight contests.

- Gilydas Biruta and Dane Miller notched double-doubles for the Scarlet Knights - the first time two players have tallied double-doubles in a game since RU played at Seton Hall (2/23/10) last season (Jonathan Mitchell 11 points/13 rebounds and Hamady Ndiaye 12 points/14 rebounds).
- Miller tallied his third career double-double with 12 points and season-best 10 rebounds. It was the third time this season, 13th overall, the sophomore has led the team in boards.
- For the fourth-consecutive game, Biruta tallied double-figures with 15 points. The forward added a career-high 10 rebounds (five offensive).

- The eight field goals allowed in the first half was the fewest in 20 minutes since Saint Peter's last season (eight, 12/22/09). It was the lowest amount made by an opponent in the first stanza since Princeton last season (five, 12/13/09).
