- Junior Keyla Snowden came off the bench and scored a career-high 28 points in 19 minutes in UK's only game of the week vs. Arkansas Pine-Bluff.
- Hit almost 60 percent from the field, netting 10-of-17 attempts, including 6-of-12 from beyond the arc.
- Nailed a career-high tying six three-pointers.
- Tied the school record for consecutive games with a three-pointer at 20 in a row.
- Also had two rebounds, three assists and one steal in the game.

Guard • Sacramento, Calif.**

- Named MOP of the Gator Holiday Classic, totaling 47 points and 10 assists, while shooting 47.4 percent from the field, including a 42.9 percent (6-14) from the three-point arc.
- Against Alabama State, scored a career-high 28 points and became the first Gator this season to eclipse the 20-point plateau this season, besting her previous career high of 16 points set against Harvard.
- Against Robert Morris, scored seven consecutive points during a 12-3 run late in the first half that helped UF begin to distance itself and take an 11-point halftime lead. Finished the game with 19 points and tied for a game-high four assists.

2011 SEC Tournament



On Feb. 7, 1980, the first SEC women's basketball tournament began play. It ended four days later with Tennessee defeating Ole Miss for the title. Fast forward 31 years later and the SEC Tournament is still enjoying success and increased popularity.

Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011), North Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010).

The winner of the 11-game tournament will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds and conference champion will be determined by the 16-game regular-season SEC schedule. The top four seeds earn a first-round bye.

The 2011 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament will once again enjoy live television coverage. FS South continues its dedication to SEC events by televising all first round and all second round games. The semifinals will be aired on ESPNU, while the championship game will again be televised on ESPN2.

Public tickets for this year's event went on sale October 1 and can be purchased through the SEC website or by calling 1-800-732-4849.

Prices are: reserved tournament book, \$90; general admission Dr Pepper Six-Pack tournament book, \$60; reserved single-session (six sessions total), \$17; and general admission single-session, \$12 (can only be purchased day of event at arena box office).

Team Notes

Alabama: The Alabama women's basketball team picked up its 10th win of the season with a 67-62 victory over Alabama A&M last week. The Crimson Tide's 10-2 record marks its best performance in the first 12 games of the season since 2002 where Alabama posted the same mark. Senior Tierney Jenkins notched her 10th double-double of the season with 19 points and 15 rebounds, while junior Ericka Russell added 14 points and freshman Kaneisha Horn contributed 10 points. The Tide continued its solid defense forcing 25 Lady Bulldog turnover and grabbing a season-high 16 steals. Alabama also had one of its better performances from the line shooting 72.0 percent (18-of-25) from the charity stripe.

Arkansas: The Razorbacks open the season 11-0 under head coach Tom Collen. It is the second time in Collen's four years at Arkansas that the Razorbacks have started with at least 11 wins. Arkansas opened 15-0 in 2007-08, Collen's first year. The 11-0 start is the second-best in program history. Arkansas broke into both the Associated Press and USA TODAY/ESPN Coaches Polls last week. The Razorbacks check in at No. 25 in both polls. Arkansas' return to the AP Poll is the programs first since the 2007-08 season. That year, Collen guided the Razorbacks to a 15-0 start, the best start in Arkansas history.

Auburn: The Auburn women's basketball team (4-6) went 1-1 last week, picking up a 52-45 win at George Washington before falling to Purdue, 76-56, at Conseco Fieldhouse in Indianapolis. Senior Alli Smalley led the Tigers for the week, averaging 16.0 points per game, knocking down four 3-pointers in each of the two games. Sophomore Blanche Alverson followed with 13.0 points per game while Jordan Greenleaf averaged a team-best 7.5 rebounds per game. Alverson led the Tigers against the Colonials, tying her career high with 16 points. Smalley followed with 14 points while Greenleaf pulled down 11 rebounds. Against Purdue, it was Smalley leading with 18 points, followed by Alverson with 10. Auburn will play one more game before it breaks for the Holidays, taking on Chicago State at 1 p.m., Tuesday in Chicago.

Florida: Florida plays in-state rival and nationally-ranked Florida State on Dec. 28 in Tallahassee in its final non-conference game of the season. UF is 0-3 entering the Dec. 28 contest playing a true away game. With victories against Alabama State and Robert Morris and capturing its own Gator Holiday Classic, Dec. 20 and 21, Florida capped its home slate versus non-league teams with a 10-game winning streak. The Gators blocked 13 shots in the win against Alabama State, tying for the second most in program history. Brittany Shine became the third freshman named MVP of the Gator Classic in the 20-

year history of the tournament, while follow freshman Jaterra Bonds earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

Georgia: Georgia improved to 8-2 on the year with a 66-61 victory over High Point on Sunday, the Lady Bulldogs' first game in 12 days. Georgia's sophomore Jasmynes led the way against the Panthers. Jasmine Hassell scored a game-high 16 points, while Jasmine James added 13 points. Porsha Phillips led the Lady Bulldogs in rebounding for the ninth time in 10 games with nine boards. Georgia has connected on 50 percent of its field goals in five of 10 games this season after doing so only twice in 34 games last season. The victory was the 795th in the history of Lady Bulldog Basketball. Only nine women's basketball programs have compiled 800 all-time victories.

Kentucky: Kentucky entered its holiday break on a high note after a 107-35 romping of Arkansas Pine-Bluff in Memorial Coliseum on Dec. 21. The 72-point win was the third-largest margin of victory in school history and it marked UK's 23rd consecutive home victory. It also was the 100th career win for head coach Matthew Mitchell, including his 70th victory at UK. Junior guard Keyla Snowden came off the bench to lead all scorers with a career-high 28 points after netting 6-of-12 from beyond the arc. A'dia Mathies had 16 while Bernisha Pinkett and Victoria Dunlap followed with 14 and 11 points, respectively.

LSU: The LSU Lady Tigers (8-4) have won four in a row since losing to top-ranked Connecticut. LSU has beaten Nicholls State, Texas Southern, UT-San Antonio and Louisiana Tech during the streak. All four have been of the double-digit variety including a 68-53 win over Louisiana Tech on Sunday in Baton Rouge. LSU held the Lady Techsters to a season-low 31.8 percent shooting and the Lady Tigers continue to lead the SEC in field goal percentage defense (32.1). LSU is allowing only 52.8 points per game. Adrienne Webb leads LSU in scoring with 13.1 points per contest.

Ole Miss: Ole Miss fell to 7-5 on the year with a loss to Miami in its only game last week. Turnovers have plagued the Rebels in its last two losses with a combined 59 in two games. Freshman Kenyotta Jenkins remains perfect from the free throw line, making all eight of her attempts this year. Senior Kayla Melson has recorded 925 career points and needs 75 points to reach 1,000 for her career. Melson is also close to breaking into the top-five in career assists. She has recorded 420 assists during her career. She needs to record 36 assists this season to claim the fifth spot on the career list (456). Ole Miss suffered just its second loss at home this year to Miami and the Rebels are now 5-2 at the Tad Smith Coliseum. In the national stats

through Dec. 19, Ole Miss is ranked 48th (out of 333 teams) in the nation in rebounding margin with +6.5 rebounds per game. Ole Miss will closeout non-conference play when they travel to Jersey City, N.J. for the St. Peter's Holiday Classic Dec. 29-30.

Mississippi State: Mississippi State (6-3), split a pair of games this week, defeating Southern Miss 50-40 before falling to 5th-ranked Xavier in Cincinnati on Friday. The Lady Bulldogs held USM to just 12 percent shooting in the second half and below 30 percent for the game. Against Xavier, Mary Kathryn Govero led the way with 16 points, converting on three 3-point field goals. Mississippi State will host Mississippi Valley State on Monday to close out its non-conference home schedule. Tip time is set for 7 pm at the Humphrey Coliseum on the MSU campus.

South Carolina: South Carolina closes out its non-conference schedule this week with games against Presbyterian and South Carolina State. The Gamecocks have won their last six home games, matching its longest stretch without dropping a home game since the 2007-08 season. Junior guard Marah Strickland has scored in double figures each of the last three games, while junior guard La'Keisha Sutton has handed out four or more assists in each of the last five outings.

Tennessee: Tennessee is now 11-2 on the season and has one more non-conference game before heading into SEC play. Rutgers will visit Knoxville on Dec. 30 for a special 3 p.m. tip-off. Tip-off has been changed so Tennessee fans can catch the Vol football team in the Music City Bowl in Nashville at 6:30 p.m. that same night. When senior Angie Bjorklund connects on her first three-pointer against Rutgers on Dec. 30, she will break the school record for most treys in a career at Tennessee. Bjorklund tied the record against East Tennessee State on Dec. 22 with four taking her to 266 for her career which tied her with Shanna Zolman for the all-time mark.

Vanderbilt: Playing its final game before Christmas break, Vanderbilt cruised to a 74-48 win over Western Kentucky on Tuesday. The win was Vanderbilt's fourth in a row and moved the Commodores to 8-3 overall. Vanderbilt trailed by as many as seven in the first half before outscoring WKU 58-19 over the next 24:37 of the game. Vanderbilt was led by senior Jence Rhoads who scored a season-high 21 points. VU dialed up its defense and held Western Kentucky to 26.2 percent shooting and 7.7 percent shooting from three. Vanderbilt returns to the practice floor Dec. 26 and will travel to Blacksburg, Va., to play in the Hilton Garden Classic Dec. 29-30.

SEC In The Polls

In terms of rankings, the SEC has the richest history of any conference in the nation, boasting more poll appearances than any other.

Since the 1982-83 season, SEC teams have been ranked in the AP poll for 521 consecutive weeks. League teams have been ranked 2,617 times including 1,294 Top 10 appearances and 732 Top Five appearances.

Overall, the league teams have been ranked 596 consecutive weeks, with teams ranked a total of 2,7796 times. The SEC has 1,431 Top 10 appearances and 791 Top Five appearances overall.

SEC teams can also boast of 136 No. 1 rankings in the AP Poll and had had the top three teams in the AP Poll twice. In week three in 2005 and in week eight in 1989.

A nation-leading eight SEC teams were ranked at one point in the AP and CNN/USA Today Top 25 polls during the 1995-96 season. The league mirrored that feat during the 1996-97 season.
