# YARBROUGH TENNIS CENTER





In 2005, Auburn University set out to make its men's and women's tennis teams two of the best programs in the country, starting with a state-of-the-art facility.

In August of 2006 construction began on Auburn's new facility. On Nov. 2, 2007, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center was dedicated and opened as a new phase in Auburn tennis.

The facility has 33,314-square feet of indoor space with six indoor courts, 12 outdoor courts with stadium seating and 16 clay courts. The Yarbrough Tennis Center also houses a pro shop, men's and women's locker rooms, concessions and a meeting area. All 12 courts are world-class lighted courts used for both competition and practice by the Auburn tennis teams.

As one of the best facilities in the Southeastern Conference, Auburn hosted the 2008 SEC Women's Tennis Championships and the men's tournament in 2009. The facility also played host to NCAA Women's Tennis Regionals in 2016 and 2017.

The City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center replaced the on-campus Luther Young Tennis Complex, Auburn's tennis home since 1978.

# CAROLINE LILLEY Head Coach

2nd Season at Auburn • 2nd Season as a Head Coach

Alma Mater: Georgia Tech, 2012

Hometown: Portland, Ore.

Caroline Lilley is in her second season as the Auburn women's tennis head coach. She was named head coach on June 14, 2019.

Lilley's first season at Auburn, while shortened by the global COVID-19 pandemic, showed tremendous promise as the Tigers had recorded an 8-6 record in dual matches and a 1-3 mark in SEC play when the 2020 season was halted. Several student-athletes earned conference and regional accolades: senior Taylor Russo was named ITA Southern Region Senior Player of the Year and to the SEC Community Service Team, and freshman Selin Ovunc was the ITA Southern Region Rookie of the Year. Russo and Ovunc teamed up in doubles to win the ITA Southern Regional championship and were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally. As a team, the Tigers were No. 42 nationally in the final published ITA ranking of the spring.

Lilley spent the previous four seasons at the University of Kansas where she helped the Jayhawks to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including the program's first-ever Big 12 Conference Championship in 2019.

Named assistant head coach at Kansas in December 2018, Lilley joined the KU staff as an assistant coach in May 2015 after a successful stint as an assistant coach at Gonzaga.

"We are thrilled to welcome Caroline to the Auburn Family," Director of Athletics Allen Greene said. "During the search to find our next coach, Caroline's work ethic, driven personality and intellectual depth was captivating. More importantly, her commitment to the holistic care and development of the student-athlete aligns with our purpose to educate, support and develop our young men and women at every opportunity. Caroline has excelled as both a student-athlete and a coach, and we can't wait for her to get to the Plains."

In the 2018-19 season, Lilley helped KU to a 21-4 record, a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 and the Big 12 title. The Jayhawks were ranked for 16 consecutive weeks during the season, peaking at No. 7 before finishing No. 13 in the final polls. Three Jayhawks, Nina Khmelnitckaia, Janet Koch and Anastasia Rychagova all earned first-team All-America honors by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA). The doubles team of Koch and Khmelnitckaia reached the No. 1 ranking in the country, and Kansas as a team did not lose a doubles point all season.

She made her presence felt immediately at Kansas in her first spring season in 2016, helping the Jayhawks reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 17 years. Kansas

finished second in the Big 12 Conference, the Jayhawks highest finish in 18 years. The four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances were a program first since earning four-straight berths from 1996-99. In 2018 Lilley helped lead KU to its first victory in the NCAA Tournament since 1999.

"I want to thank Allen Greene for the opportunity to lead the women's tennis program. His vision for Auburn Athletics is unprecedented, and his passion for the Auburn Family is unmatched," Lilley said. "I would also like to thank President Leath for his leadership and involvement in this process. Finally, I want to thank Evin Beck, Marcy Girton, and Brant Ust and the rest of the Auburn team for their tireless work in vetting so many qualified candidates."

National rankings have become the norm for KU tennis since Lilley's arrival; the Jayhawks have appeared in the ITA rankings in all or part of every season Lilley has coached at KU. In 2018 KU spent 11-straight weeks in the top-20, including a season-ending ranking of 18 in 2018, the program's highest end-of-season ranking since 1998 (17th).

Individual players as well have earned national rankings under Lilley's tutelage. In fall 2017 junior Anastasia Rychagova became the first Jayhawk singles player to be ranked No. 1 in the country, and in May 2018 she became KU's first singles All-American in 20 years.

In recognition of her work at KU, Lilley was voted ITA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018.

"I am humbled and grateful to be a part of a renowned university and unrivaled athletics department. Auburn is a family and the people are what make this place so special," Lilley said. "The integrity and unwavering character throughout the department is something that impressed me and attracted me from the beginning. I am excited to start working alongside Coach Bobby Reynolds and the entire Auburn tennis staff. War Eagle!"

A Portland, Oregon native, Lilley spent the two seasons prior to joining the KU staff as an assistant coach at Gonzaga, where in 2014 the Zags earned at Top 75 national ranking for the first time in program history, a feat they repeated in 2015. With her help Gonzaga signed the #7 recruiting class for mid-major schools, the highest-ranked recruiting class in school history.

National recognition is nothing new for Lilley. She had an accomplished playing career at both Kentucky (freshman and sophomore years) and Georgia Tech (junior and senior years). She was ranked with five different doubles partners throughout her college career, with a high of No. 6. She was nationally ranked in singles as well, with a high of No. 67.

As a junior she posted a personal-best 26-12 singles record, contributing to Georgia Tech's consistent presence as a top-15 program in the country.

Graduating with a business administration degree with a concentration in finance, Lilley left Georgia Tech with the second-best doubles winning percentage in Tech's history — 69 percent (38-17, including 20-7 in dual match play).

Lilley earned her MBA, with a concentration in finance, from Kansas in 2018.

# RAQUEL ATAWO Assistant Coach

1st Season at Auburn
Alma Mater: California, 2015

Raquel Atawo, a five-time collegiate All-American and 18-time winner on the WTA Tour, was named assistant coach for Auburn women's tennis on July 3, 2020.

Atawo was the nation's top-ranked singles player in 2004 as a student-athlete at California and was the 2003 NCAA doubles champion. She also claimed 18 career WTA titles as a professional and was a three-time Grand Slam semifinalist.

She comes to Auburn after spending the 2019-20 season as a volunteer assistant coach at her alma mater. She was also a volunteer assistant at UC Davis in 2017-18.

"I am honored to be joining Auburn University, and I am looking forward to adding to the incredible athletics program," Atawo said. "Coach Lilley is a passionate and inspiring leader, and I'm excited to join forces and take the women's tennis program to new heights. Thank you to Athletics Director Allen Greene and Associate Athletics Director Evin Beck for this opportunity."

Over a 15-year professional career on the WTA Tour, Atawo was ranked as high as No. 10 in the world in doubles and No. 162 in singles. She won 18 doubles tournament titles as a professional and reached the semifinals at the Australian Open in 2014 and Wimbledon in 2015 and 2016. Throughout her professional career, she appeared in 50 Grand Slam events.

She wrapped up her professional playing career in 2019, reaching the doubles quarterfinals at the Australian Open and second rounds at Wimbledon, Roland Garros and the U.S. Open.

"Raquel's career speaks for itself," Lilley said. "Her seamless transition from amongst the best of collegiate tennis to the elite in professional tennis sets such a great example for college tennis being a viable pathway to the WTA Tour. Raquel's character, desire to learn, and authentic interest in developing relationships will fit incredibly well with our development-focused, process-oriented program. I am thrilled to welcome Raquel and her husband, Toby, to the Auburn Family, and I am grateful and humbled to work alongside someone with her unwavering integrity."

As a collegiate player at Cal, Atawo — then Raquel Kops-Jones — was the 2004 Intercollegiate Tennis Association Player of the Year and Pac-10 Player of the Year. She was ranked No. 1 nationally in singles most of the season and was the first player from Cal to win the Pac-10 singles championship. She and doubles partner Christina Fusano teamed up to win the NCAA doubles title in 2003, and they were the Pac-10 doubles champions in 2002 and 2003.

Atawo was inducted into the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame in 2015. She is married to former Cal track & field athlete Toby Atawo.




