BULLDOGS OPEN SEC SLATE WITH AUBURN

Mississippi State welcomes Auburn to campus on Thursday for the first Southeastern Conference game of the season. The game is slated for a 6:30 p.m. kickoff, and will be televised by ESPN. The Bulldogs and the Tigers have squared off on the gridiron each year since 1955, and the two teams have met 83 times, making Auburn the fourth most-frequent opponent in Bulldog football history (Alabama, LSU, Ole Miss).

DOGS MAKE RETURN TO ESPN'S THURSDAY NIGHT

Mississippi State has been a common fixture on ESPN's Thursday night football package dating back to a rousing victory over the 13th-ranked Florida Gators in 1991. State has appeared 14 times on the weeknight telecast, posting a 6-8 overall record.

SELLOUTS BECOMING THE NORM AT DAVIS WADE

Since Dan Mullen took over the Mississippi State football program in 2009, the Bulldog faithful have responded in record numbers. Six of the school's nine largest crowds have come in the past two seasons. The last four State home games have all been sellouts and rank among the top five highest attended games on campus.

Last weekend's game against Memphis drew 56,032 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in school history and largest ever season-opener.

MULLEN AIMING FOR ANOTHER YEAR 2 SUCCESS STORY

Head coach Dan Mullen had coached two or more seasons at six schools prior to taking the top spot at Mississippi State, and at nearly every stop along the way Year Two has seen marked improvement. Wagner College went 6-5 in 1994 and 8-2 in 1995; Notre Dame improved from 5-7 in 1999 to 9-3 in 2000; Bowling Green went 8-3 in 2001 and 9-3 in 2002; Utah jumped from 10-2 in 2003 to 12-0 in 2004; and Florida improved from 8-3 in 2005 to 13-1 and national champions in 2006.

OFFENSE POSTS NEAR RECORD-BREAKING NUMBERS IN OPENER

En route to scoring 49 points in the season-opening victory over Memphis, the Bulldog offense racked up 569 total yards, the fifth-highest mark in school history. State's two quarterbacks combined to complete 20-of-25 passes for 372 yards, which tied for 8th most in a single game. State's 49 points were the most in a season-opener since 1974, the most in any game since 2002 and the most against a Division I-A opponent since 2000.

After Week 1, Mississippi State's offense ranks atop the national standings in passing efficiency, sixth nationally in both passing and total offense and 15th in scoring offense.

DIAZ, WILSON LEAD DEFENSE TO IMPRESSIVE DEBUT

Defensive coordinator Manny Diaz and co-defensive coordinator Chris Wilson joined the coaching staff with hopes of improving a defensive unit that finished 10th in the Southeastern Conference in total defense a year ago. If the first game is any indication, the Bulldogs have a chance to do much better than that. State's defense smothered Memphis for the first three quarters before the Tigers gained 92 of their 237 yards in the final stanza. Memphis finished the game with only 41 rushing yards, and State ranks 10th nationally in rushing defense as a result.

RUSHING ATTACK WAS AMONG NATION'S BEST IN 2009; AND FOUR OFFENSIVE LINE STARTERS RETURN

A year ago, the Bulldog rushing attack averaged 227.6 yards per game, a total that ranked ninth nationally and led the SEC. The offensive line that paved the way for the rushing attack returns four players that started all 12 games, and the group now has 89 combined career starts.

In its first outing of 2010 State ran for 197 yards on 41 carries, an average of nearly five yards per attempt.

RUSSELL HAS COMING OUT PARTY AGAINST TIGERS

Redshirt freshman Tyler Russell might be the most highly touted quarterback prospect ever to sign at Mississippi State, and his first game action didn't disappoint. Russell completed 13-of-16 passes for 256 yards and tied a school record with four touchdowns. Through Sunday, his passer rating of 298.15 leads the nation.

He led the Bulldog offense on a seven-play, 91-yard drive in his first series, as he completed all three passes for 51 yards, capping the scoring drive with a 20 yard strike to Brandon Heavens. Russell started the second half completing six consecutive passes for 109 yards and a pair of scores as Mississippi State opened up a 42-0 lead midway through the third quarter.

NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR EFFORT

Following his outstanding collegiate debut, Russell was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week. Teammates Corey Broomfield and Johnthan Banks each earned the honor last season, the first year the league began honoring freshman with the weekly award.

RELF SOLID IN FIRST CAREER START

Junior quarterback Chris Relf earned his first career starting nod in the season opener, and completed 7-of-9 passes for 116 yards and a touchdown. After his first pass was intercepted, Relf settled in and completed seven of eight and led State to three scoring drives.

PAIR OF YOUNG WIDEOUTS ECLIPSE 100-YARD MARK

Sophomore wide receivers Chad Bumphis and Brandon Heavens both got off to quick starts in their sophomore seasons. Heavens led the Bulldogs with five receptions for 112 yards and his first two career touchdowns, while Bumphis pulled in four catches for 100 yards and also scored twice. The sophomores became the first Mississippi State duo to break the 100-yard mark since Justin Jenkins and McKinley Scott did it against Houston in 2003.

WHITE TAKES OVER AT MLB, RECORDS CAREER-HIGH IN TACKLES FOR LOSS

Taking over for Jamar Chaney, now with the Philadelphia Eagles, Chris White had big shoes to fill as he made the transition from outside linebacker to the middle of the field. In his first game at his new position, White posted six total tackles and recorded 2.5 tackles for loss, a new career high, and the highest total of tackles behind the line for a Bulldog linebacker since Chaney reached the same number in 2006 against Kentucky.

LANGSTON KEEPS THEME OF TWO IS BETTER THAN ONE GOING IN DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Last season it seemed as if every time a Bulldog defensive back picked off a pass, he quickly picked off another. Charles Mitchell, Johnthan Banks and Corey Broomfield each had a two interception day (and Banks did it twice). In the season-opener against Memphis, **Maurice Langston** picked up where they left off, intercepting a pass in both the second and third quarters.

KNOX HAS EXPERIENCE AT AUBURN, WITH CHIZIK

Running backs coach **Greg Knox** spent 10 years serving as the wide receivers tutor and recruiting coordinator on Tommy Tuberville's staff at Auburn. During Knox's time there, current Auburn head coach Gene Chizik served as defensive coordinator from 2002-2004.

The pair also coached on the same staff at Stephen F. Austin from 1992-94, where Auburn running backs coach Curtis Luper earned all-Southland Conference honors in 1993.

KOENNING, GRIMES WORKED TOGETHER AT TEXAS A&M

Offensive coordinator **Les Koenning** was the wide receivers coach at Texas A&M in 1996 when Auburn offensive line coach Jeff Grimes served as a graduate assistant for the Aggie offense.

MULLEN, THIGPEN WERE AT BGSU IN 2001-02

Dan Mullen and Auburn safeties coach Tommy Thigpen worked on Urban Meyer's 2001-02 teams at Bowling Green. Thigpen coached cornerbacks and special teams while Mullen mentored the quarterbacks.

BULLDOG NAMES ABOUND ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Through the summer, preseason watch lists for college football awards were announced and Mississippi State players were mentioned on quite a few. Senior defensive end **Pernell McPhee** was named to both the Bednarik and Lombardi lists, while offensive lineman **Derek Sherrod** joined him on the Lombardi watch list. Junior tight end **Marcus Green** was recognized by the Mackey Award and senior center **J.C. Brignone** caught the attention of Rimington Trophy. Senior linebackers **K.J. Wright** and **Chris White** were both on the initial Butkus Award list, while **Leon Berry** was among the watch list for the Hornung Award, given to the nation's most versatile player.

TWO DOGS HAVE EARNED ALL-SEC HONORS, SIX RECOGNIZED AS FRESHMEN

Pernell McPhee and **Derek Sherrod** each were named to All-Southeastern Conference teams following the 2009 campaign. State tied for the league lead with four players named to the freshman team, as **Johnthan Banks**, **Corey Broomfield**, **Chad Bumphis** and **Fletcher Cox** were each honored by the league's coaches. **Quentin Saulsberry** and **Charles Mitchell** both earned freshman team recognition in 2008.

CAPTAINS SELECTED FOR 2010 TEAM

Mississippi State announced permanent team captains for the 2010 team prior to the first game of the year. By a vote of their teammates, **Pernell McPhee**, **Derek Sherrod**, **Chris White** and **K.J. Wright** earned the honor.

BULLDOGS EXCEL IN CLASSROOM

22 Bulldog football players were named to the 2009 SEC Academic Honor roll, including 18 members of the 2010 team. Over the past two season, 50 members of the football program have earned the honor, including 29 current players.

THE LAST MEETING...

AUBURN, Ala. - After a momentum-swinging first half that saw both teams lead, Auburn played solid defense in the second stanza and pulled away from visiting Mississippi State for a 49-24 win Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the Southeastern Conference opener for both schools.

State dropped to 1-1 on the young 2009 campaign while Auburn improved to 2-0.

Auburn looked as if it was going to run away with the game early on, jumping out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter of the contest. After the teams traded punts on their opening drives of the game, Auburn mounted a 73-yard drive, capped with three straight runs by Kodi Burns, who crossed the goal line from a yard out for the first score of the night.

The teams traded punts again before the Tigers would take a 14-0 lead when the first miscue of the evening was committed by State. Chris Relf's pass attempt was picked off by AU's linebacker Antonio Coleman who then rumbled 20 yards into the end zone.

But the Bulldogs rebounded early in the second quarter with 17 unanswered points of their own.

MSU manufactured an impressive 12-play, 83-yard march - which started late in the first period - and concluded it when Anthony Dixon rushed five consecutive times for 15 yards, the last a 1-yard plunge on fourth down. Auburn led 14-7 with 12:05 to go before the half.

State then stopped Auburn's ensuing drive on three downs and a muffed Tiger punt left the Bulldogs with great field position at the 50. After a 26-yard run by Relf, the Bulldog drive from there stalled at the AU 12 and Sean Brauchle nailed a 29-yard field goal to trim the Tiger lead to 14-10.

The Bulldogs then got a huge play after holding Auburn on three downs once again on the next series. On the punt attempt from Auburn's Clinton Durst, MSU's Patrick Hanrahan broke through the line and blocked the AU kick. Bulldog Robert Elliott scooped up the loose ball and returned it 10 yards for the score and a 17-14 MSU lead at the 4:44 mark of the second quarter.

But Auburn would roar back to end the half with two touchdowns for a 28-17 halftime advantage. The first scoring drive came on a quick five-play, 80-yard drive featuring five rushes, the last a 48-yard explosion down the left sideline by Tiger Onterio McCalebb. After holding Mississippi State to a short 20-yard drive, Auburn went to work again, creating an eight-play, 78-yard drive in just 1:13. Three passes of 20+ yards from Chris Todd to Darvin Adams, the third going out of bounds at the MSU 1, set up a 1-yard run by Burns just before the intermission.

The Tigers pulled away in the third period, outscoring State 14-0 for a 42-17 lead. An 81-yard Auburn drive ended at the 3:52 mark of the period when Burns hit tight end Philip Lutzenhirchen on a 13-yard touchdown pass. Running back Ben Tate accounted for 42 yards rushing on the drive. After MSU's next drive stalled quickly, Auburn racked up 72 yards on just four plays, Tate breaking free down the right sideline for a 35-yard score to complete the march.

Mississippi State opened the fourth quarter well, completing a 10-play, 57-yard drive. Tyson Lee hit Christian Ducre on a 1-yard pass for the score. The big play on the drive came when Relf connected with Leon Berry for a 32-yard strike to the AU 3-yard line.

Auburn would get one more score when Burns scored from a yard out, solidifying a lengthy 13-play, 75-yard drive for the Tigers midway through the fourth quarter. Burns accounted for four Auburn touchdowns on the evening - three rushing and one passing.

Auburn's running game provided much of the Tiger offense on the evening, with both Tate (157) and McCalebb (114) cracking the 100-yard mark. Dixon was State's leader with 92 yards on the ground.

Adams had 116 yards receiving for AU as well. State's Berry hauled in four receptions for 60 yards.

DAN MULLEN

HEAD COACH • SECOND SEASON

Dan Mullen was widely regarded as one of the top young minds in college football when he arrived at Mississippi State, and he brought not only an impressive offensive resume and a list of NFL-developed quarterbacks but also an energy and passion for the college game. With 15 years of experience in the collegiate coaching ranks, Mullen was named the 32nd head football coach in the history of Mississippi State University on December 10, 2008.

From the moment of Mullen’s announcement, Mississippi State fans have been reenergized. Supporters have turned out in the form of capacity crowds at Mullen’s appearances around the Southeast and the Bulldog faithful set a new State of Mississippi record with more than 31,000 in attendance at the team’s 2009 Maroon-White Spring Game in April.

The excitement continued throughout Mullen’s first fall on campus, as MSU set school records for total home attendance, average home attendance and posted three of the school’s top four largest single-game crowds.

Improvement wasn’t limited to fan enthusiasm, as Mullen ignited the Bulldog offense despite facing the nation’s toughest schedule. State’s rushing attack, led by first-team all-Southeastern Conference selection Anthony Dixon, finished ninth nationally with a 227.6 rushing yard average per game. State averaged 371.9 yards of total offense per game, the eighth highest total in school history and the most since 2000.

Mullen’s first season concluded with a rousing 41-27 victory over MSU’s in-state rival, which brought the Golden Egg back to Starkville. He became the only the third Mississippi State coach to win his Egg Bowl debut since 1939, joining Allyn McKeen and Jackie Sherrill. The Bulldogs posted a 5-7 overall record in 2009, including three road victories.

During the previous four seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Florida, Mullen molded a Heisman Trophy, Davey O’Brien and Maxwell Award winning quarterback, along with a Rimington Trophy finalist and a Biletnikoff Award semifinalist.

In 2008 alone, Mullen’s offensive attack ranked third nationally in scoring – averaging better than 45 points per game as the Gators scored at least 30 points in 12 of 13 games. The 587 points scored eclipsed the previous University of Florida mark, set in 1996.

Florida has rushed for a new-school record 41 touchdowns that season and UF’s 80 rushing touchdowns over the two seasons ranked second nationally. Overall, Florida’s rushing yardage of 2,987 this year ranks ninth nationally and is the third-highest total in school history.

Seven offensive players were recognized as All-Southeastern Conference selections following the season in which Florida claimed its second SEC Championship and a chance to play for its second national championship in three seasons.

The Gator offense ranked first in the SEC in scoring offense and total offense for a second-straight season in 2008, averaging 45.2 points and 442.4 yards per game. Under Mullen’s tutelage in 2007, UF averaged 42.5 points and 457.2 yards.

In 2007, Mullen directed the Gator offense to the third-highest point total ever by a UF unit and the top single-season marks for rushing touchdowns and third-down conversion percentage. Florida’s offense scored 75 touchdowns during the season most in the SEC.

Mullen orchestrated a UF attack that was the only one in the nation to have rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in every game during the season. He also helped UF score on 83 of 152 drives in 2007 for a league-best 54.6 percent, marking the best number since the stat was tracked by the SEC in 2000. Florida also averaged 7.0 yards per play last year, the fourth-best total in the nation and the Gators averaged 5.3 yards per rush, the second-best number in school history.

In 2007, he helped coach sophomore quarterback Tim Tebow into a Heisman Trophy, Maxwell and Davey O’Brien award winner, 78th Sullivan Award winner and AP first-team All-American among other honors.

He also tutored six offensive players to the All-SEC team: Tebow, Percy Harvin, Cornelius Ingram, Brandon James, Jim Tartt and Drew Miller.

Mullen played an integral role in Florida’s 2006 national championship, overseeing an offense that averaged 29.7 points and 396.1 yards per game. In the BCS National Championship Game, he engineered an attack that produced 41 points against a top-ranked Ohio State squad that was limiting opponents to less than 11 points per game on the year. Under Mullen’s tutelage, quarterback Chris Leak opened the contest by going 9-for-9 for 99 yards and a touchdown en route to earning Offensive MVP honors.

The 2006 Gator offense posted 76 plays of 20 yards or more, 19 of which went for touchdowns. Florida passed for 29 touchdowns in 2006, while Leak ranked among the national leaders with 23 scoring tosses. Tebow matched UF’s single-season record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with eight scores, and his 5.3 average yards per carry were second nationally among signal callers. Six different players averaged at least 5.0 yards per carry last season, including SEC Freshman of the Year Harvin.

In 2005, Chad Jackson played his way to Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after matching the UF single-season record with 88 receptions, a figure that led the SEC and finished sixth nationally. Center Mike Degory was also named a finalist for the Rimington Trophy, given annually to the nation’s top center, during that campaign. Both earned first-team All-SEC honors under Mullen’s tutelage.

Mullen went to Florida from Utah with head coach Urban Meyer, with whom he had spent the past 10 seasons. While the quarterbacks coach at Utah, Mullen developed Alex Smith – the first overall selection in the 2005 NFL Draft – from a pocket passer into an efficient executer of the spread offense, making him one of the most versatile threats in college football. Smith took over the starting job three games into Mullen’s tenure, passing for 2,247 yards and running for 452 to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in total offense in 2003.

The 2004 campaign saw Smith earn National Player of the Year honors from The Sporting News and Sports Illustrated, while also becoming Utah’s first-ever Heisman Trophy finalist and garnering final consideration for the Davey O’Brien and Walter Camp National Player of the Year Awards. Smith passed for 2,952 yards and 32 touchdowns and ran for 631 yards and 10 scores on the year, ranking second in the nation with a 176.5 efficiency rating and leading the Utes to a perfect 12-0 season and a Fiesta Bowl championship. As a team, Utah finished the 2004 season third in the nation in scoring offense (45.3) and total offense (499.8).

Prior to his stint at Utah, Mullen served as quarterbacks’ coach at Bowling Green for two seasons, putting up 6,627 yards of total offense and scoring 81 touchdowns during that span. In 2002, quarterback Josh Harris threw for 2,425 yards, ran for 737 yards and completed the campaign as the nation’s third-leading scorer.

Mullen spent the two years before his Bowling Green stint as a graduate assistant at Notre Dame, making a Fiesta Bowl appearance, and assisted with Syracuse’s 1998 BIG EAST championship and Orange Bowl run.

A two-year starter at tight end for Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pa., Mullen earned first-team All-Centennial Conference honors as a senior. He is married to the former Megan West, and the couple has a one-year-old son, Canon.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Little time was wasted in Mississippi State establishing its dominance.

Two drives, in fact.

Saturday night in front of an electrified crowd of 56,032 at Scott Field, the fourth largest in school history, the Bulldogs ushered in the 2010 campaign in grand fashion by blowing past Memphis, 49-7, and spoiling the debut of Tigers coach Larry Porter.

It was MSU's largest margin of victory since routing East Tennessee State 53-6 in October of 1998.

MSU racked up 569 yards of total offense with 372 coming through the air behind the arms of both Chris Relf and Tyler Russell. The Tigers (0-1), on the other hand, manufactured just 237 yards and were stymied throughout the night by the Bulldogs' tenacious defense.

The first score was the result of a 55-yard strike from Relf to Leon Berry, his first-career touchdown, while the second came less than four minutes later when Russell made his highly-anticipated debut.

The former Meridian standout wasted little time living up to the hype coming out of high school when his first drive was capped with a 20-yard throw to Brandon Heavens to swell the lead to 14-0 with 6:11 left in the opening frame.

From that point, the scoring momentarily slowed. But with 2:21 left to intermission, the Bulldogs again found the endzone, this time when Vick Ballard, who had a game high 60 yards on the ground, scored his first-career touchdown on a 51-yard scamper to put his team up 21-0.

Heavens, who totaled a game-high 112 receiving yards, scored his second touchdown, this time on a 27-yard pass across the middle from Russell at the 12:23 mark. Three minutes later, Ballard found pay dirt again when he powered his way up the middle from the 1 for a 35-0 lead.

Then it was Chad Bumphis' turn to get in on the scoring fun.

With 6:57 left in the third, the sophomore from Tupelo hauled in a 57-yard pass from Russell to go up 42-0. Early in the fourth, the two hooked up again, this time from 25 yards out for a 49-0 lead.

Bumphis finished with 100 receiving yards, while Russell was 13-of-16 passing for 256 yards and four touchdowns. Relf was 7 of 9 for 116 yards.

Defensively, Charles Mitchell led MSU's assault with nine tackle, while Maurice Langston had two interceptions.
