AUBURN VS. ARKANSAS:

Auburn is 39-32 all-time against Arkansas, including a 18-12 mark at Plainsman Park ... Auburn has won three straight series over Arkansas, with Arkansas being ranked in the top 13 in all three of them ... Auburn is 6-6 against Arkansas under John Pawlowski.

THE ROAD TO HOOVER:

Auburn clinched its fourth straight appearance in the annual SEC Tournament at Hoover, Ala., with its series win at Florida ... With one conference weekend remaining, Auburn, which currently sits in 10th place, could finish as high as sixth or as low as 12th ... If the season ended today, Auburn would be facing Alabama in a first round elimination game.

SENIOR DAY:

Auburn will honor its four seniors prior to Saturday's season finale ... Players to be recognized will be infielder Garrett Cooper, catcher Kody Ortman, infielder Mitchell Self and outfielder Cullen Wacker ... Senior Cameron Blinka, the assistant to the director of baseball operations, will also be recognized along with student managers Tyler Bradshaw and Matt Mulhern.

AUBURN VS. THE REST OF THE WEST:

Auburn is currently 6-9 against the SEC West but has typically found success in its division under John Pawlowski ... Since 2009, Pawlowski's first year at Auburn, the program is 6-9 vs. Alabama, 6-6 vs. Arkansas, 6-9 vs. LSU, 9-6 vs. Ole Miss, 8-7 vs. Mississippi State and 2-1 vs. Texas A&M for a total mark of 37-38 (.493).

COOPER DONE AT 15, ON AT 12:

Senior first baseman Garrett Cooper had his team- and personal-best 15-game hitting streak snapped with an 0-for-2 night on Tuesday

but he does bring a 12-game SEC-only hitting streak into Thursday's game ... During his 15-game streak, which was Auburn's longest since 2011, he hit .431 (25-for-58) with three doubles, three home runs, six RBI and eight runs scored ... All three of his home runs were solo shots ... During his current 12-game SEC hitting streak, he is hitting .465 (20-for-43), collecting seven multi-hit games during the streak ... In 27 league games, he has hit safely in 23 of them and been on base in all but one of them.

TERRANCE THE TERMINATOR:

Closer Terrance Dedrick is 3-0 with seven saves in his last 11 appearances dating back to March 29 ... In those 11 appearances, he has thrown 20 1/3 innings, allowing three runs (all earned) for a 1.33 ERA, striking out 21 and walking just six ... Teams have hit just .108 against him during that time ... All seven of his saves have come in SEC play, where he has a 2.03 ERA in 12 appearances ... His eight overall saves are the most at Auburn since Austin Hubbard finished the 2010 campaign with 10 and they are currently 11th in the league while his seven league saves are tied for fourth.

EVERYDAY I'M SHUFF-FAPA-FULLIN':

Auburn's has used the same lineup in each of the last eight games (minus the DH) and it has paid off for many... Since settling on the current lineup, which coincides with a 6-2 record, Auburn's lineup is hitting .333 with 49 runs scored (7.0 runs/game).

DOUBLE-DIGIT HITS:

Auburn has collected 10-or-more hits in seven of its last eight games, going 6-2 in those seven contests, hitting a combined .313 with 89 hits and 50 runs scored ... Of the 89 hits, 26 have gone for extra-bases (15 doubles, 11 triples) ... As a team, Auburn is 21-5 this season when collecting 10-or-more hits.

THAT BALL IS GONNA GO!

Auburn collected six home runs during its series win at Florida to give it 30 on the year ... 20 of Auburn's home runs have come in SEC play, which is tied with LSU for the most in league play ... Auburn is 16-4 this season when it hits a home run, 9-3 in SEC play ... Garrett Cooper and Damek Tomscha are tied for the team lead (and seventh in the SEC) with seven home runs each, though six of Cooper's have come in league play compared to just four for Tomscha.

TWO-OUT DAMAGE:

Auburn collected 12 of its 15 runs at Florida with two outs and now has driven in 91 runs with two outs ... As a team Auburn is batting .282 with two outs, led by Patrick Savage's .400 mark (14-for-35) with Garrett Cooper next at .324 (23-for-71) ... Ryan Tella leads the team with 15 two-out RBI followed by Cooper (14), Cullen Wacker (13) and Savage (12).

PLAYING FROM BEHIND:

Auburn has logged 20 come-from-behind wins this season and also has 21 losses, meaning that Auburn has trailed in

41 out of 52 games (79 percent) this season ... Auburn has come back from a one-run deficit 10 times, a two-run deficit seven times and a three-run deficit twice ... Auburn also overcame an eight-run deficit at Jacksonville State, trailing 8-0 in the eighth but scoring 12 runs in the inning to win 12-8, hitting three home runs in the frame, including a pair of two-run shots off the bat of Dan Glevenyak ... Last year Auburn had just nine come-from-behind wins the entire season.

STARTING THE MONTH OUT RIGHT:

Auburn started the month of May with a series win over No. 18 Ole Miss, giving it its third SEC series win of the season and its second over a top-25 team (No. 18 Texas A&M, April 5-7) and continued that with a series win at Florida, its first since 2006 ... Auburn is now 6-3 in the month, hitting .297 with 28 extra-base hits (16 doubles, 12 home runs) ... The team is averaging 5.67 runs per game in the month while allowing just 4.67.

EBERT NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK:

Jordan Ebert was named the SEC Freshman of the Week as he helped Auburn to a 4-1 week against Jacksonville State, Samford and Florida ... He led Auburn with a .579 batting average for the week and a .545 mark during the series win at Florida ... For the week he was 11-for-19 with two doubles, a home run (.842 slugging percentage), four RBI and five runs scored ... He also walked three times for a .636 on base percentage ... Defensively he had a perfect fielding percentage on 33 chances (15 putouts, 18 assists) and helped turn five of Auburn's six defensive double plays.

CALL HIM MR. CLUTCH:

Of Damek Tomscha's seven home runs, four of them have either tied the game or given Auburn the lead in the sixth-inning or later ... He started the year out with a solo walk-off home run against Maine, followed that with a solo home run to tie the Samford game at 2-2 in the seventh, hit a two-run, game-tying home run in the sixth on Saturday against Ole Miss and then hit a game-winning, solo home run in the eighth against Ole Miss ... As a team Auburn has hit a total of seven home runs in the sixth inning or later that tied the game or gave Auburn the lead.

BULLPEN BULLIES:

Auburn's 16 saves have come from six different people with Terrance Detric picking up eight, Justin Camp, Trey Cochran-Gill and Conner Kendrick each

The bullpen has also accounted for 19 of the team's 31 wins (61 percent) against just five losses (25 percent).

THE O'NEAL FACTOR:

Junior left-hander Michael O'Neal has quickly made his mark on the Auburn pitching staff ... Sitting at eight wins through 13 starts, his eight wins are already more than any Auburn pitcher had in all of 2012 and tie Grant Dayton's 8-3 mark at the conclusion of 2010 ... O'Neal has seven quality starts on his resume and his 2.85 ERA and .228 opponent batting average are both second-best among the Auburn starters ... O'Neal has eight of the starting pitching staff's 11 wins so far, with Rocky McCord picking up two and Conner Kendrick one.

AUSTIN AND THE RECORD BOOKS:

Junior catcher Blake Austin has now registered 38 caught stealing by in his three year career, which is currently fourth in Auburn history ... He needs one more to tie Josh Bell (2003-05) for third ... So far this year, he has thrown out 18, tied for third in the SEC.

In his fifth season, he is the longest-tenured coach at Auburn since Hal Baird's 16-year run (1985-00) and the fourth-longest tenured overall ... With the team's 6-3 win over Brown on Sunday, March 10, he became the third-winningest coach (by victories) in Auburn history while the team's 12-8, come-from-behind win at Jacksonville State on Tuesday, May 7 was the 500th of his coaching career.

In SEC play, Auburn has gone 4-5 in series openers, 5-4 in middle games and

2-7 in series finales ... Auburn is hitting .262 and scoring 3.6 runs per game in openers, .293 and averaging 4.7 runs per game in middle games and .233 with 2.2 runs per game in series finales ... The pitching staff has a 3.38 ERA in series openers, allowing 4.9 runs per game, a 3.76 ERA in middle games, allowing 4.3 runs per game, and a 4.68 ERA in series finales, allowing 4.9 runs per game.

BULLPEN NOT GIVING IN:

Auburn's bullpen has allowed 42 of 117 (36 percent) of its inherited runners to score this season ... Leading the way is Reid Carter, who has inherited a team-high 22 runners but has allowed just three to score (14 percent) ... Terrance Dedrick has also been stingy when it comes to inherited runners, allowing five of 18 (28 percent) to score.

PITCHING LEADING THE WAY:

Auburn's pitching staff has a 3.42 ERA through the first 52 games ... The ERA is the lowest for an Auburn pitching staff this deep into a season since the 1995 staff had a 3.37 ERA at the same mark ... That team had allowed 226 runs (175 earned runs) in 467 1/3 innings, striking out 379 as the team was 45-7 (17-4 SEC) ... This year the staff has allowed 229 runs (174 earned) in 457 2/3 innings, striking out 296.

WHAT COMES NEXT?

Auburn's 11-16 start in conference play is one game behind its 12-15 mark from a season ago, when it finished the year 13-17 in SEC play ... Auburn's best mark under John Pawlowski eight series in was when it was 17-10 in 2010.

ROAD WARRIORS:

Auburn concluded it's away season 9-10 in games played on the road ... Auburn hit .278, averaging 4.1 runs per game while the pitching staff has a 4.08 ERA, allowing 4.7 runs per game.

AUBURN VS. THE NON-CONFERENCE:

Auburn went 20-5 during the regular season non-conference portion of its schedule ... Auburn hit .283 against non-conference opponents, 10 points higher than the overall average (.273), and averaged 6.4 runs per game ... Auburn's pitching staff had a 2.91 ERA in the non-conference and allowed 102 runs (73 earned) as teams hit .236 against the staff (compared to .253 overall).

EBERT GOES 10-PLUS TWICE:

Freshman Jordan Ebert has had two double-digit hitting streaks this season, collecting a 13-game streak and a 12-game streak ... He has also been on base in 44 of the 50 games he has played in.

EXTRA, EXTRA!

Since the 2009 season, John Pawlowski's first, Auburn has gone 12-7 in extra-inning games, including 4-1 since the start of the 2012 season.

GIVING IT UP:

Junior shortstop Dan Glevenyak goes into the week sixth in the SEC in sacrifice bunts with 11, which was also tied for 57th nationally entering the week ... As a team Auburn has 32 sacrifice hits and 22 sacrifice flies.

DOUBLE YOUR FUN:

Auburn enters the weekend third in the SEC in doubles with 97 ... It's 95 doubles entering the week were tied for 51st nationally while its 1.86 doubles per game were 62nd.

AUBURN IN MLB:

Three former Auburn baseball players were on Opening Day rosters as Major League Baseball's 2013 season kicked off this past Monday ... Josh Donaldson (Athletics), Tim Hudson (Braves) and David Ross (Red Sox) each opened the season on their respective club's 25-man roster while Evan Crawford is on the 40-man roster for the Blue Jays.

BIG CROWDS:

Auburn's three-game series with Alabama attracted 11,589 fans, the third-largest three-game series crowd in Plainsman Park history ... The record is 13,606, set against Alabama in 2003 ... Auburn is averaging 2,660 fans per game, 21st-best in the country, and its 71,838 total fans is 2nd in the nation.

KILLED BY ERROR:

Auburn's pitching staff had a miniscule 1.00 ERA for its three-game series against Alabama but won just one game after allowing eight unearned runs over the series ... So far this season Auburn has committed 62 errors, fourth-most in the SEC, and has allowed a league-high 55 unearned runs ... The most

victimized pitcher on the Auburn staff is Conner Kendrick, who has allowed 14 unearned runs and 17 earned runs while next in line is Michael O'Neal (26 earned runs, 10 unearned runs).

TRYING SOMEONE NEW:

Justin Camp made his first start of the season on Sunday at Florida and became the ninth different starting pitcher of the season, joining Michael O'Neal (13), Daniel Koger (eight), Will Kendall (eight), Conne Kendrick (seven), Rocky McCord (five), Dillon Ortman (four), Trey Cochran-Gill (three) and Trey Wingenter (two) as starters.

ONE-RUN GAMES:

Auburn has played 10 one-run games and is 7-3 in them ... All 10 of the one-run games this season featured come-from-behind wins for the winner ... Auburn played 18 one-run games last season, going 8-10 in those games.

WHERE EVERYBODY KNOWS YOUR NAME:

Auburn played its first 11 and 18 of its first 20 games all at Plainsman Park this year and is 20-10 at home ... In John Pawlowski's five-year reign, Auburn is 113-59 (.656) at Plainsman Park, going 22-13 in 2009, 30-9 in 2010, 19-14 in 2011 and 22-13 in 2012 ... Auburn will play a total of 34 home games this season.

******* SEASON-LONG NOTES *******

APRIL SHOWERS:

April was very kind to Auburn as the team went 9-6, hitting .278 and scoring 56 runs while the pitching staff had a 3.05 ERA ... Cullen Wacker hit .421 throughout the month (24x57) with four doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI ... Of Auburn's 19 double-digit hit games, seven came in the 15 April games ... Trey Cochran-Gill led the pitching staff with a 1.64 ERA in five appearances (two starts).

TOMSCHA NAMED SEC POW:

Junior third baseman Damek Tomscha was named the SEC Player of the Week as he helped Auburn pick up a series win over No. 18 Ole Miss, its fourth straight over the Rebels ... On Saturday he hit a two-run, game-tying home run in the sixth as Auburn came-from-behind to win 8-5 and even the series ... On Sunday he hit a two-out, game-winning solo home run in the eighth as Auburn rallied for a 5-4 series-clinching win ... He hit .333 for the weekend, driving in three runs and scoring four.

PICKING UP A SECOND STRAIGHT SERIES WIN:

Auburn picked up a second straight series win when it defeated Georgia following a series win at Texas A&M ... The back-to-back SEC series wins was Auburn's first since it won three straight to open the 2012 season.

TOMSCHA AT EIGHT:

Third baseman Damek Tomscha had his career-best eight-game hitting streak snapped on Friday at No. 18 Texas A&M ... During the streak he hit .481 (13-27).

THE WACK ATTACK:

Senior Cullen Wacker had his career-best 10 game hitting streak snapped with an 0-for-3 night on Tuesday at Troy ... During the streak he hit .351 (13-for-37) with four doubles and five RBI (.459 slugging percentage) and had a .442 on base percentage.

EBERT'S 13-GAME HITTING STREAK ENDS:

Jordan Ebert had his season-best 13-game hitting streak end on Tuesday night at Kennesaw State with an 0-for-3 showing at the plate ... The freshman from Foley, Ala., went 19-for-47 (.404) during the streak and of his 19 hits, 17 went for singles along with a double and a home run ... He scored nine runs and drove in six RBI all while hitting in the nine hole in the lineup ... His 13-game hitting streak was the longest by an Auburn freshman since Sean Gamble hit in 13 straight games as a freshman in 2002 ... He did reach base on a walk to extend his consecutive games reaching base safely to 14.

INSIDE THE PARK HOME RUNS:

Ryan Tella's first home run of the season was an inside the park job against College of Charleston ... It was the first inside the park home run by an Auburn player since Trent Mummey did it at Florida State in 2009 and the first by an Auburn player at Plainsman Park since Jeff Boutwell hit an inside the park grand slam against Florida in 2005.

WALKING OFF ON OPENING DAY:

Damek Tomscha's walk-off home run against Maine on Opening Day was Auburn's first walk-off home run since Brian Fletcher hit a walk-off against Boston College on Feb. 26, 2010 ... Tomscha's walk-off was the fourth for Auburn on an Opening Day since 1979, joining Tony Haney (1987), Sean Gamble (2003) and Justin Hargett (2009).

EXPERIENCED LINEUP:

Auburn returns its top four hitters off of last year's team, which led the SEC with a .304 team batting average ... Returning this season is junior outfielder Ryan Tella (.360), senior outfielder Cullen Wacker (.350), senior first baseman Garrett Cooper (.324) and junior shortstop Dan Glevenyak (.319) ... In total, Auburn returns 57 percent of its at-bats and 58 percent of its runs scored from last season.

SOPHOMORIC STAFF:

Auburn's pitching staff is loaded with sophomores this season, including two in the Opening Weekend rotation ... Lefty Daniel Koger was 4-5 with a 3.19 ERA as a weekend starter last season while righty- Rocky McCord was 0-0 with a 4.58 in 10 appearances (three starts) last year ... Other sophomore's on the staff include Trey Cochran-Gill (5-2, 3.67 ERA in '12), who can be used as either a starter or long reliever, and Chase Williamson (0-0, 2.70), who appeared in four games last year.

BOOKS OVER THE BIGS:

Auburn has six players on its team that chose to attend Auburn rather than signing a professional contract.
