

2006-07 Season Review

Auburn came within 40 seconds of winning the Southeastern Conference's Western Division, and the Tigers' 17-15 record (7-9 SEC) marked the first winning season since 2003.

Not having a senior on the roster, Auburn defeated five teams that were nationally-ranked in the top 25 in No. 12 Alabama, No. 22 Tennessee (NCAA Sweet 16) and at No. 25 Alabama. The Tigers also defeated Sweet 16 participant Vanderbilt and LSU, both of whom were ranked during the season.

The Tigers swept Alabama for the first time since 1999, and it was the first time in history when Alabama was nationally-ranked both times. The win in Tuscaloosa was the Tigers' second in the last 23 years.

Playing for the SEC Western Division title on the final day of the regular season for the first time since 2003, Auburn had the ball up 77-74 with 45 seconds to play, but had two-straight costly turnovers and lost 83-79 at Ole Miss. The Rebels were co-Western Division Champions with Miss. State with an 8-8 record.

Quan Prowell, who had a career-high 26 points including 20 in the second half, tried to feed Frank Tolbert for a layup but the wild pass was picked off by senior Bam Doyne. Senior Clarence Sanders tied the game at 77 with a 3-pointer with 39 seconds left. After the in-bounds pass, freshman DeWayne Reed had his pocket picked by senior Todd Abernethy, who fed it to Jermey Parnell for a layup and a 79-77 Ole Miss lead with 33 seconds left.

Josh Dollard, who had a season-high 21 points and 10 rebounds, tied it at 79 on an offensive putback with 26 seconds remaining. Rasheem Barrett was called for a blocking foul with 3 seconds left and Doyne sank both foul shots for an 81-79 lead. Auburn was not in the one-and-one situation so Ole Miss fouled Reed near midcourt with 0.7 seconds left. The Tigers ran a near-perfect in-bounds play from halfcourt but Barrett's pass to Prowell barely hit off the rim.

Playing without Quan Prowell for the first 11 games and Josh Dollard for the first six games, Auburn opened the season with four-straight wins over Troy, Winston-Salem State, East Tennessee State and Miles College. Korvotney Barber was named SEC Player of the Week after recording his first career double-double

with 13 points and a career-high 16 rebounds in the season-opening come-from-behind 71-68 victory over Troy.

The Tigers lost two-straight in the South Padre Invitational in South Padre Island, Texas, to Oklahoma State (66-65) and to No. 7 Wisconsin (77-63) without Prowell and Dollard.

A pair of wins over Nicholls State (92-87) in overtime and over Louisiana-Monroe (81-60) preceded a loss to No. 2 Pittsburgh (74-66). Barber scored 19 points vs. Pitt while Dollard notched his first career double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds.

Three wins over South Alabama (82-71), Wofford (86-76) and Tennessee State (86-59) followed. Prowell led Auburn with 20 points vs. No. 13 Texas A&M, but it wasn't enough as the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 bound Aggies thrashed the Tigers, 87-58.

The Tigers closed out non-conference play with a 10-5 record, defeating Charleston Southern (69-53) and suffering a tough 56-54 loss at Southern Miss. In the Southern Miss loss, Courtney Beasley sank the game-winning 15-foot jumper with :03 left. DeWayne Reed, who hit the front rim on a 60-foot shot at the buzzer, tied the game at 54 with :19 left.

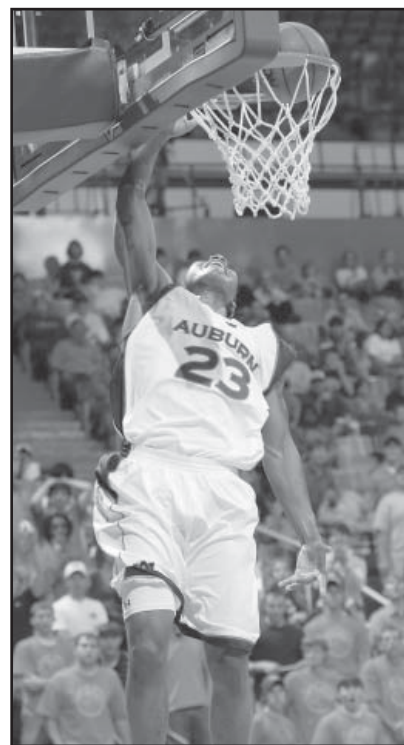
Rasheem Barrett scored a season-high 22 points as Auburn made a season-high 14 three-pointers to defeat eventual NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 participant Vanderbilt 68-65 in the SEC opener.

The Tigers then lost at Kentucky (84-57) and at No. 13 LSU (65-63). Auburn used an 18-0 run after being down by 14 points with 9:31 to play to upset eventual Sweet 16 team and No. 22 Tennessee 83-80. It was the Tigers' first win over a ranked team in 16 tries, dating back to 2004. The Tigers, an SEC worst 63 percent foul shooting team on the year, made 14-of-17 free throws in the final three minutes.

Auburn lost at Mississippi State (87-76) before routing No. 12 Alabama (81-57) to snap a seven-game losing streak to the Tide. Auburn opened the second half with a 25-7 run en route to shooting 68 percent from the field after halftime. It was the largest margin of victory in history by an unranked Auburn team over a nationally-ranked team, and the win gave the Tigers two-straight victories over ranked teams since 1995-96.

The partition in the south upper end zone of the Coliseum was lifted for the first time since it was put into place in 1994-95 and an overflow crowd of 11,700 witnessed two-time National Champion and No. 1 Florida defeat Auburn, 91-66.

Barber led five Tigers in double figures with 16 points and 11 rebounds as Auburn defeated South Carolina 80-75 for the fifth-straight time in Columbia. Barber was 8-of-9 from the field as the Tigers shot 57 percent from the field and 50 percent from 3-point range and outrebounded USC 38-19. The win pushed

Auburn's record to 14-9 (4-4 SEC).

The Tigers suffered their longest losing streak of the season with consecutive losses to Ole Miss (82-59), at Arkansas (65-57), Mississippi State (91-83) and at Georgia (86-79).

Auburn reeled off three-straight wins over Arkansas (67-59), at No. 25 Alabama (86-77) and LSU (80-68). In the win at Alabama, Barber had 17 points and 10 rebounds and Prowell scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half.

Barber earned his second SEC Player of the Week honor after recording back-to-back double-doubles in the wins over Arkansas and at Alabama. He is the first Tiger to win the award twice in the same season since All-American Chris Porter in 1998-99 and just the fourth ever along with All-American Chuck Person in 1984-85 and first-team All-SEC Chris Morris in 1987-88.

The Tigers then had their most heartbreaking defeat of the season at Ole Miss and then lost to Georgia (80-65) in the SEC Tournament first round.

DeWayne Reed was named to the Coaches Freshman All-SEC team averaging 5.4 points and 3.0 assists and starting 13 games. Auburn's 15 wins at home tied for the most wins in the 39-year history of Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum with the 1999 SEC Championship team.

Sophomore Quantez Robertson dished out more assists (293) in his first two seasons than any other Tiger in history.

2006-07 Notes

1st WINNING SEASON SINCE 2003

Auburn's 17-15 record marked the Tigers' first winning season since going 22-16 in 2002-03. That year, the Tigers reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

The Tigers' 17 wins this year are the most since that same season.

Auburn also won seven SEC games to give them the most league wins since going 8-8 in 2002-03.

TIGERS DEFEAT 5 RANKED TEAMS

Auburn defeated five teams that were ranked in the top 25 nationally with wins over No. 12 Alabama (81-57), No. 22 Tennessee (83-80), at No. 25 Alabama (86-77). The Tigers defeated Vanderbilt 68-65 before the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16-bound Commodores climbed to No. 13 nationally and also defeated LSU 80-68 after the Tigers had been nationally-ranked.

TIED FOR MOST HOME WINS

Auburn's 15 wins at home in 2006-07 tied for the most wins in the 39-year history of Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

The Tigers went 15-5 at home, including wins over No. 12 Alabama and No. 22 Tennessee. Auburn went a perfect 15-0 at home in the 1999 SEC Championship season.

BALANCED SCORING

The difference in scoring average among Auburn's top five scorers is a mere 1.5 points. Here is a listing of them:

TEZ BREAKS ASSIST MARK

Sophomore Quantez Robertson has dished out more assists in his first two seasons than any other Tiger in history.



Korvotney Barber became just the fourth Tiger in history to earn two SEC Player of the Week honors in the same season.

Gerald White (1983-87), who is Auburn's assist leader with 624, previously held the mark of 279 assists through his sophomore season.

Robertson currently has 293 assists, including 130 last year as a freshmen and 163 in 2006-07.

DISHING IT OUT

Sophomore Quantez Robertson has started all 60 games in his two years at Auburn and was the only Tiger to start all 32 games in 2006-07. He ranked fourth in the SEC with 5.1 assists and third in the league with a 2.26 ast/to ratio.

Robertson has dished out more assists in his first two seasons than any other Tiger in history with 293, surpassing Gerald White's 279 assists from 1983-85.

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native dished out a career-high 10 assists to only two turnovers vs. No. 12 Alabama Jan. 23. He had eight assists to two turnovers at Mississippi State Jan. 20 and seven assists to three turnovers vs. No. 22 Tennessee.

Robertson tied a career-high with 17 points (7-of-8 fgs) and dished out five assists vs. No. 1 Florida Jan. 27.

He totaled 11 points, seven assists, four rebounds and only one turnover in 34 minutes at South Carolina.

VOT, 2-TIME SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore forward Korvotney Barber earned his second SEC Player of the Week honor this year after recording back-to-back double-doubles in leading the Tigers to a pair of wins over Arkansas Feb. 21 and at No. 25 Alabama Feb. 24.

Barber is the first Tiger to win the award twice in the same season since All-American Chris Porter in 1998-99 and just the fourth ever along with All-American Chuck Person in 1984-85 and first-team All-SEC Chris Morris in 1987-88.

Barber was named the first SEC Player of the Week of 2006-07 on Nov. 13 after recording his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 16 rebounds in Auburn's season-opening come-from-behind 71-68 win over Troy.

DeWAYNE REED, FROSH ALL-SEC

DeWayne Reed was named to the Coaches

Freshman All-SEC team a year after Rasheem Barrett and Quantez Robertson were named to the team in 2005-06. Reed averaged 5.4 points and 3.0 assists and started 13 games.

FLOOR BURN FRANK

Frank Tolbert had 70 floor burns on the season compared to 79 for the entire Auburn team. He even had nine crashes into the scorer's table this year.

LARGEST UNRANKED AUBURN WIN vs. RANKED TEAM

Auburn's 81-57 victory over No. 12 Alabama Jan. 23 was the largest margin of victory in Auburn school history when an unranked Tiger team defeated a nationally-ranked team.

The previous best was a 19-point win over No. 2 Kentucky in 1983-84 in Auburn.

Rasheem Barrett, Korvotney Barber and Archie Miaway combined for 58 of Auburn's 87 points to lead the Tigers to an 87-75 exhibition victory over Faulkner in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Barrett had a game-high 22 points, making 5-of-10 three-pointers while Barber totaled 18 points and eight rebounds and Miaway 18 points and five steals. Auburn jumped out to an 11-2 lead but Faulkner scored the next 12 points. Trailing 17-15 with 7:45 left, the Tigers outscored the Eagles 32-17 to end the half with a 47-34 lead. Auburn led by as much as 24 points twice, last at 69-45 with 12:03 to play. The Tigers led by 18 with 90 seconds left before the Auburn bench was emptied. Auburn scored 29 points off 30 Faulkner turnovers. Freshman DeWayne Reed totaled 10 points, four assists, three steals and three rebounds in 24 minutes. Faulkner's Jon Uriarte was the only Eagle in double figures with 11 points.

Joseph Manuel totaled 21 points and eight rebounds and made the final six points of the game to lead AUM to a 69-64 exhibition upset over Auburn in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Manuel hit a jumper with 32 seconds left as AUM regained the lead 65-64, one possession after Archie Miaway gave Auburn a 64-63 edge, the Tigers first lead since 34-32 at half-time. Quantez Robertson then drove the right side and fouled out by charging into Nathan Thomas. Manuel then made four-straight free throws in the final 15 seconds. After Korvotney Barber tied the game at 46 on a dunk with 13:58 remaining, AUM went on a 9-0 run to take a 55-46 lead with 11:05 left. The Tigers kept chipping away until finally taking the lead with 48 seconds left. However, it was all AUM after that. The Senators were coached by former Auburn standout and 30-year AUM legend, Larry Chapman. Frank Tolbert led Auburn with 21 points and 10 rebounds while Barber added 16 points and six boards.

Frank Tolbert caught a Rasheem Barrett airball under the basket and scored the layup to put Auburn ahead to stay with 18 seconds left in the Tigers season opening 71-68 come-from-behind win over Troy in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Tolbert, who scored all 14 of his team-high points in the second half, put the Tigers up 69-68 with his clutch basket and added a pair of free throws with :02 left. Korvotney Barber, who notched his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 16 rebounds, blocked Troy's potential game-winning shot with 9 seconds remaining. He then stole Troy's inbounds pass following Tolbert's made free throws to seal the win. The Tigers trailed by nine points three different times in the second half, lastly at 50-41 with 13:10 to play. A 7-0 run in the next 90 seconds brought Auburn back. The Tigers have won all 10 games in the series with the Trojans and won their ninth-straight season opener. Richard Chaney scored a game-high 21 points and added 12 rebounds to lead Troy. Rasheem Barrett had 11 points and nine rebounds for the Tigers while Quantez Robertson added 12 points, eight assists and six rebounds. Auburn shot a miserable 40 percent (6-15) from the foul line.

Auburn used an 18-0 run after being down by 14 points with 9:31 to play to upset No. 22 Tennessee 83-80 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. It was the Tigers' first win over a ranked team in 16 tries, dating back to a win at No. 24 LSU in 2004. Auburn made 14-of-17 free throws in the final three minutes to secure the win. Tennessee used an 8-0 run to take a 66-52 lead with 9:44 left, but it was all Auburn after that. Rasheem Barrett made a conventional 3-point play on a runner in the lane to tie it at 66 with 5:07 left. Barrett then had a huge block on Chris Lofton, the SEC's leading scorer, who finished with 22 points. However, Lofton did not score a point in the second half until his layup with 3:04 to play ended the 18-0 Auburn run. Quan Prowell, who scored 19 of his season-high 21 points in the second half, put the Tigers ahead to stay at 69-66 on a 3-pointer at the top of the key with 3:35 left. The Vols' Dane Bradshaw tried to save the rebound from going out of bounds by bouncing it off Josh Dollard. It went through Dollard's legs to Barrett, who fed Prowell with the clutch shot. With Auburn leading 78-75 with 22 seconds to play, Tennessee coach Bruce Pearl was whistled for a technical. Prowell then made the two technical foul shots, was fouled two seconds later and made two more foul shots for an 82-75 Auburn lead with 20 seconds left. The Tigers jumped out to a 6-0 lead and led 18-12. With the score tied at 27, the Vols went on a 10-0 run en route to a 38-29 halftime lead. Frank Tolbert scored a season-high 24 points for Auburn while Ramar Smith added 19 for Tennessee. Auburn's 2-2 SEC start is its best in five years.

The Bulldogs were 22-of-26 from the foul line compared to the Tigers at 9-of-13.

Korvotney Barber had his second-straight double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds and Quan Prowell scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half to lead Auburn to a season sweep of No. 25 Alabama in an 86-77 victory before a sold out Coleman Coliseum crowd of 15,316. It was the Tigers' first sweep of the Crimson Tide since 1999 and only their second win in Tuscaloosa in 23 years. It also marked the first time in history that Auburn swept a nationally-ranked Alabama hoops team twice. There were seven ties and four lead changes in the first 11 minutes of the game, but the Tigers took the lead for good on a Quantez Robertson bucket for a 23-21 lead with 8:23 left. That started an 11-2 run that gave Auburn a 32-23 edge with five minutes left in the half. Leading 38-34 at the half, Auburn scored on its first five possessions of the second half to take a 47-36 lead two minutes in. The Tigers gradually pushed their lead to the largest at 68-50 on a Prowell 3-pointer with 7:44 remaining. Alabama went on an 11-0 run to cut it to 68-61 with 4:39 left but a Tolbert layup ended that rally. An Alonzo Gee 3-pointer brought Alabama to within 74-68 with 1:29 left, but the Tigers made 14-of-18 free throws in the final 1:39 to seal the win. Auburn shot 54 percent from the field, 39 percent from 3-point range and 75 percent from the foul line while outrebounding the much taller Tide 32-30. Both teams committed only 12 turnovers. Richard Hendrix led Alabama with 17 points and 13 rebounds. Preseason All-American point guard Ronald Steele only had two points in five minutes while struggling with an injury. The win, which was Auburn's first road win over a ranked team since 2004, tied the Tigers with Alabama for third in the SEC West and left them a game behind first-place Ole Miss and Miss. State with two games to play.

Auburn went on a 23-6 run two minutes into the second half to earn an 80-68 victory over LSU that vaulted the Tigers into a four-way tie for first place with only one game left. Auburn, Alabama, Ole Miss and Mississippi State are all tied for first with a 7-8 SEC record. Josh Dollard scored a team-high 16 points while Korvotney Barber just missed his third-straight double-double with 14 points and eight rebounds. DeWayne Reed added 12 points and six assists and Quan Prowell 11 points. Associate head coach John Cooper filled in for Tigers head coach Jeff Lebo, who was at home with a stomach virus. Cooper also coached for Lebo in last year's loss at Arkansas when he was sick with the flu. Auburn led 37-32 but Prowell was called for walking with six seconds before the half. LSU's Garrett Temple nailed a 3-pointer at the buzzer to bring LSU to within 37-35 at halftime. LSU scored the first five points of the second half to take a 40-37 lead. Auburn went on the game-deciding 23-6 run over the next 10 minutes to lead 62-48 with 8:52 left. LSU, which was playing without injured leading scorer Glen Davis, never got any closer than nine points the rest of the way. LSU's Tasmin Mitchell scored a career-high 24 points. Auburn shot a season-best 53 percent from 3-point range and had a season-low nine turnovers.

Auburn had the ball up 77-74 with 45 seconds to play but had two-straight costly turnovers and lost the Western Division title and the game, 83-79, to Ole Miss in Tad Smith Coliseum. Quan Prowell, who had a career-high 26 points including 20 in the second half, tried to feed Frank Tolbert for a layup but the wild pass was picked off by senior Bam Doyne. Senior Clarence Sanders tied the game at 77 with a 3-pointer with 39 seconds to play. After the inbounds pass, freshman DeWayne Reed had his pocket picked by senior Todd Abernethy who fed it to Jermy Parnell for a layup and a 79-77 Ole Miss lead with 33 seconds left. Josh Dollard, who had a season-high 21 points and 10 rebounds, tied it at 79 on an offensive putback with 26 seconds remaining. Rasheem Barrett was called for a blocking foul with 3 seconds left and Doyne sank both foul shots for an 81-79 lead. Auburn was not in the one-and-one situation so Ole Miss fouled Reed at midcourt with 0.7 seconds left. The Tigers ran a near-perfect inbounds play from halfcourt but Barrett's pass to Prowell barely hit off the rim. Auburn led by as much as 20-11 six minutes into the game and were behind as much as 45-37 before trailing at the half 45-41. The Rebels again pushed its lead to 51-43 but Prowell went through a stretch where he scored 16 of Auburn's 22 points to give Auburn a 75-71 lead with 1:48 to play. Without a senior on the team, Auburn was playing for a Western Division title in the regular season finale for the first time since 2003. Auburn, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Alabama all entered the final game tied for the lead at 7-8 with all four teams playing each other. The Tigers had 13 second half fouls to only six for the Rebels.
