

## Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- A win against Alabama will give Auburn its 15th victory on the season, making the team eligible for post-season play
- Alli Smalley scored the 1,500th point of her career at Arkansas, becoming the ninth Auburn player to reach the plateau
- Five different Tigers have tallied at least 20 steals so far this season
- Auburn will be a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena
- Auburn utilized its sixth different starting lineup of the season at LSU, including freshman Jassany Williams
- Sophomore point guard Morgan Toles leads the SEC assist-to-turnover ratio and assists
- The Tigers are 13-7 in their last 20 games after starting the season 1-4
- This will be the 74th meeting between Auburn and Alabama with Auburn leading 40-33; 24-8 when in Auburn
- Auburn is coming off a 64-59 win at Arkansas; Alabama is coming off a 64-59 win over Florida
- Auburn won the last meeting, 66-55, in Tuscaloosa on Jan. 2, 2011
- The Tigers won the last meeting in Auburn, downing Alabama, 74-62, on Jan. 14, 2010
- This will be the sixth meeting between Nell Fortner and Alabama's Wendell Hudson with Fortner leading the series 4-1
- The Tigers have a 186-155 all-time record in the SEC
- Auburn is 8-2 all-time when playing on Feb. 17, 2-1 when playing Alabama; Nell Fortner is 2-0
- The Tigers are 147-87 all-time in the month of February, 23-26 under Fortner
- Auburn is 216-55 all-time against teams from the state of Alabama, Nell Fortner is 22-2 against in-state teams
- Senior Alli Smalley moved into the top 10 in career scoring at Auburn against LSU; she now has 1,500 points
- Smalley recorded her 200th career 3-pointer vs. Ole Miss, becoming the first Auburn player ever to reach the plateau
- Six different Tigers have led the team in scoring this season
- Auburn is 85-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- The Tigers are averaging 18.6 points per game scored on turnovers and have scored 20 or more points off turnovers on eight occasions this season
- Sophomore Blanche Alverson was named to the Capital One Academic All-District Second Team
- Auburn is playing its first season in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena
- The season-opening win over Mercer was the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility
- Alli Smalley broke the Auburn career 3-point record against Temple, she now has 212 on her career
- Alli Smalley and Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team on Nov. 27
- Auburn was picked sixth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, Tennessee was picked to win the league
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC First Team and to the media's Second Team
- Nell Fortner is beginning her seventh season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Chicago State game was Nell Fortner's 200th as Auburn's head coach, she was 121-79 in her first 200 games
- The Tigers welcome five newcomers: Peyton Davis, Camille Glymph, Courtney Strain, Tyrese Tanner, Jassany Williams
- Carla McGhee returns to Auburn for her second stint as an assistant coach

**SCOUTING ALABAMA**

Alabama went 11-2 in the non-conference portion of the season, but has struggled with a 2-10 mark so far in SEC play. The Crimson Tide has caught on lately, though, winning two of their last three games. Alabama defeated Mississippi State, 66-61, on Feb. 13 before picking up a 64-59 win over Florida last Sunday. In between the victories, the Crimson Tide dropped an 81-54 decision at Georgia.

Four different Alabama players average more than 8.0 points per game with Tierney Jenkins leading the way with 16.4 per game. Ericka Russell averages 9.8 points, followed by Kaneisha Horn and Jasmine Robinson with 8.9 and 8.4, respectively.

Alabama uses its defense to fuel its offense, averaging 10.8 steals per game on 23.3 opponent turnovers per game. Four different players are averaging at least 1.0 steals per game.

As a team, Alabama shoots 37.1 percent from the field and 26.7 percent from 3-point range, averaging 3.7 3-pointers per game.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN**

Blanche Alverson and Morgan Toles went 4-for-4 from the free-throw line in the final minute Feb. 13 at Arkansas, preserving Auburn's lead as the Tigers hung on for a 64-59 win over the Razorbacks. Senior Alli Smalley scored a team-high 19 points to lead the Tigers to the win while freshman Courtney Strain notched a career-high 12 points.

The teams traded the lead early in the first half, but Auburn was able to pull away by seven, 25-18, with 4:06 left. However, Arkansas finished the half on an 11-3 run to take a 29-28 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The teams traded the lead again early in the second half with neither team able to pull away by more than three points. Arkansas led by two after a Ricketts jumper gave the Razorbacks a 42-40 lead with 12:06 remaining when Smalley caught fire.

A Smalley basket and a subsequent 3-pointer gave Auburn the lead for good with 8:57 left. She scored again a minute later to give Auburn a four-point lead. The Tigers would go on to lead by as many as seven points with Arkansas getting no closer than three points the rest of the way. While Auburn's last field goal came with 1:46 left in the game, Auburn went 6-for-6 from the line the rest of the way to hold on to the lead and the win.

Ashley Daniels and Sarah Watkins each notched double-doubles to lead Arkansas. Watkins scored 12 points with 10 rebounds while Daniels tallied game-highs of 22 points and 11 rebounds.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR ALABAMA**

Senior Tierney Jenkins scored a game-high 18 points to lead Alabama to a 64-59 win over Florida in its first game at newly-renovated Foster Auditorium on Feb. 13. Junior Ericka Russell and freshman Kaneisha Horn each scored 12 points as the Crimson Tide notched its first victory in the building since last playing here on Dec. 3, 1981.

Trailing 34-24 at intermission, Alabama embarked on a 13-1 run over the first 6:04 of the second half to take a 37-35 lead. During the stretch, the Crimson Tide forced 10 Florida turnovers, including five straight at one point, and held the Gators without a field goal. From there, the Tide increased the margin even further, taking a 53-43 lead at the 8:49 juncture following a Russell.

Florida would cut the lead to two at one point, but that would be the closest the Gators would come as Alabama held on for the 64-59 win.

**FORTNER VS. HUDSON**

This will be the sixth meeting between Nell Fortner and Alabama's Wendell Hudson with Fortner leading the series, 4-1.

Fortner is in her seventh season at Auburn and eighth overall as a collegiate head coach, holding a 147-95 career record. Hudson is in his third season at Alabama and holds a 38-47 record.

**AGAINST THE SEC**

Auburn has a 186-155 all-time record in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers have won five SEC titles and four SEC Tournament titles, most recently winning the regular-season title in 2009 after 14-2 league mark.

**LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA (Jan. 2, 2011)**

The Tigers held Alabama without a field goal for more than 10 minutes in the second half, building up an 18-point lead that would help the Auburn women's basketball team hold on for the 66-55 win against the Crimson Tide in the teams' Southeastern Conference opener.

Senior Jordan Greenleaf scored a career-high 19 points along with nine rebounds in the win. Freshman Tyrese Tanner tied her career high with 15 points, scoring Auburn's final four points at the free throw line to preserve the win.

The teams traded the lead in the first half with neither team leading by more than four points. After Alabama's Tierney Jenkins hit a free throw to tie the game with 10 seconds left in the first half, but Auburn found senior Alli Smalley open for a 3-pointer as the buzzer sounded for a 28-25 halftime lead.

The Tigers were able to build their lead to seven early in the second half when a Jenkins jumper cut it to five with 17:04 remaining. That would be the last field goal for the Crimson Tide for more than 10 minutes as Auburn rallied off an 18-7 run for a 53-39 lead with 6:32 remaining. The Tigers led by as many as 18 points during the run.

Alabama would come back, cutting the Auburn lead to as few as six points with 1:20 left in the game. But, a 3-pointer with 47 seconds left as the shot clock was running out from Toles and four free throws from Tanner sealed the 66-55 Tiger win.

**LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA IN AUBURN  
(Jan. 14, 2010)**

Auburn junior Alli Smalley scored a career-high 27 points to lead the Tigers to a 74-62 win over Alabama Jan. 14 at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Senior KeKe Carrier added 20 points and a team-high nine rebounds while redshirt junior Jordan Greenleaf surpassed the 500-rebound plateau, finishing the contest with eight and 502 on her career.

The Tigers came out quick, connecting on 11 of their opening 15 attempts from the field. With 16:38 on the clock, Smalley and Carrier single-handedly outscored the Tide 14-2, posting seven points apiece. A five-point flurry from Smalley capped the run at 12:35, giving the Tigers a, 25-9, lead, forcing an Alabama 30-second timeout. Smalley scored 16 points by the 10-minute mark of the first half.

Auburn opened the game to a 21-point lead with just over five minutes left in the half, courtesy of a Nicolle Thomas jumper. However, the Crimson Tide clawed their way back to within 13 as the Tigers took a 43-30 lead into the half.

Alabama was able to break Auburn's double-digit lead with eight minutes left in the game, but a quick nine-point run would return the lead to 18 as the Tigers held on for the 14-point win. Carrier contributed six points in the run, highlighted by back-to-back layups courtesy of Alabama turnovers.

Celiscia Farmer led the Tide with 18 points while Ericka Russel pulled down eight boards.

**ON THIS DATE . . .**

Auburn is 8-2 all-time when playing on Feb. 17, and is 2-0 under Nell Fortner. Auburn is also 2-1 when playing Alabama on Feb. 17. The Tigers won their last game on Feb. 17, downing South Carolina, 83-72, in 2008.

**IN FEBRUARY**

Auburn is 147-87 all-time in the month of February, including a 23-26 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

**AGAINST THE STATE**

Auburn is 216-55 all-time versus schools in the state of Alabama. Of the 55 losses, 33 have come to Alabama.

Nell Fortner is 22-2 all-time versus schools in the state, with the only losses coming to Alabama on Jan. 8, 2006 (54-68) and on Feb. 7, 2010 (53-55).

**COUNTING DOWN TO 800**

The Auburn women's basketball team is counting down to 800 victories in the program's history, currently sitting at 793. With four regular-season games remaining, along with potential postseason play, Auburn could reach the 800 plateau this season.

**1,500 FOR ALLI**

With her 19 points at Arkansas on Feb. 13, senior Alli Smalley joined an exclusive club as she became just the ninth Auburn player ever to score 1,500 career points. The 19 points gave her exactly 1,500 points on her career. She is the second player recruited to Auburn by Nell Fortner to reach the plateau, joining DeWanna Bonner.

**DEADLY TANDEM**

Alli Smalley and Blanche Alverson have hit 298 combined 3-pointers in their career, making them the second-most dangerous long-range duo in Auburn's history.

Samantha Williams and Kristen Mulligan hold the honor as Auburn's most prolific 3-point duo, connecting on 310 from 1992-96.

**STINGY TIGERS**

Five different Tigers have at least 20 steals so far this season. Senior Alli Smalley leads the way with 42, followed by Morgan Toles with 29. Blanche Alverson has 23 while freshman Jassany Williams and junior Morgan Jennings have 21 and 20, respectively.

**A NEW LINEUP**

With the departure of Jordan Greenleaf from the team, Auburn utilized its sixth different starting lineup of the season Feb. 10 at LSU. Included in the lineup was freshman Jassany Williams, who earned the first start of her career. Sophomore Blanche Alverson is the only Tiger to have started in every game this season.

**ALVERSON NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Jan. 17)**

For the first time in her career, Auburn sophomore Blanche Alverson was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week, the league announced Jan. 17. Alverson earned the award after leading the Tigers to a 2-0 record during the previous week, averaging 18.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game.

Included in the week was a career-high 27 points and five 3-pointers vs. Ole Miss. She also tallied a career-high four steals vs. LSU along with two blocked shots.

**BOUNCING BACK**

After winning the season-opener, Auburn went on to lose the next four games, including two to ranked teams. Since then, the Tigers have notched a 13-7 record to move above .500 for the first time since the season-opener.

**TURNING ON THE DEFENSE**

Senior Alli Smalley has turned up the defensive pressure lately. The senior has 42 steals on the season, but 26 of them have come in the last 13 games. Since the Dec. 30 game vs. Jacksonville State, Smalley is averaging 2.0 steals per game. Her 1.7 steals per game on the season tie her for 10th in the SEC.

**DONE AT 106**

Senior Alli Smalley earned her first career start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career. That would be the first of 106 consecutive starts for Smalley. The run ended Feb. 6 as

she was held out of the starting lineup vs. Mississippi State because of illness.

Her 106-game consecutive start streak is the second-longest in team history, trailing only Kristen Mulligan and her 118-game consecutive start streak from 1992-96.

**BREAKING INTO THE TOP 10**

With her layup at the 3:42 mark of the first half of the Jan. 16 game vs. LSU, senior Alli Smalley tied former Tiger Lori Monroe (1979-83) for 10th all-time in career scoring at Auburn with 1,409 points.

Smalley went on to score 10 points in the game, giving her sole possession of 10th. She currently ranks ninth with 1,481 career points.

**BOMBS AWAY**

With her two 3-pointers on Jan. 20 at Mississippi State, sophomore Blanche Alverson moved into Auburn's top-10 career 3-point list. The pair gave her 75 on her career, moving her past DeWanna Bonner for sole possession of 10th all-time.

She currently ranks ninth with 86 on her career.

**CLEARING 20**

Senior Alli Smalley became the first Tiger to clear the 20-point plateau this season, scoring 22 in Auburn's loss to Temple on Dec. 4. It marked the 14th time in her career to clear 20 points.

Sophomore Blanche Alverson followed with her first career 20-point game against Ole Miss on Jan. 13 with a career-high 27 points. Fellow Sophomore Morgan Toles notched one of her own on Jan. 30 against South Carolina, scoring a career-high 21 points in the win.

**OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION**

Auburn tied its season-high with 85 points scored against Ole Miss on Jan. 13. It ties the mark the Tigers set earlier in the season against Seton Hall. The 85 points is also the most for the Tigers against an SEC opponent since Auburn racked up 94 points against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

**DOUBLE DOWN**

Senior Jordan Greenleaf pulled down 12 rebounds with 16 points in the season-opener against Florida State, earning her first double-double of the season and fourth of her career. She came back with another at South Florida, scoring 13 points with 10 rebounds.

Against Jacksonville State, sophomore point guard Morgan Toles notched her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 assists. She became the first Auburn player to record a points-assists double-double since Whitney Boddie accomplished the feat against Ole Miss on March 6, 2009 in the SEC Tournament.

**LEAGUE BEST**

Sophomore Morgan Toles has proven herself to be among the best point guards in the SEC this season. She currently leads the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio and assists. Toles has a league-best 2.4 assist-to-turnover ratio, well ahead of second-place Jence Rhoads (1.8) of Vanderbilt. Toles also averages 5.2 assists per game, leading Rhoads and her 5.0 per game.

### SEC Women's Basketball Notes

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 121-45 (.729) non-conference record during the 2009-10 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2,774-844 (.767) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 29 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 116 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
- SEC teams have won 329 NCAA Tournament games against 168 losses (.662) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 29-year history.
- The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
- The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
- The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
- In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
- In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

### DEFENSE MAKES OFFENSE

Auburn has used its defense to create its offense this season. So far, the Tigers have scored a total of 464 points off of turnovers (more than 30 percent of Auburn's total points scored), including a season-high mark of 39 against Alabama A&M. AU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers in eight games this season.

While averaging 9.0 steals, 4.1 blocks and 19.0 opponent turnovers per game this season, Auburn has turned the efforts into an average of 18.6 points off turnovers per game.

### BALANCED SCORING

Auburn had five players score in double figures in its last two non-conference games. Against Alabama A&M, it was Greenleaf (15), Alverson (14), Smalley (12), Hilliard (12) and Toles (11). Against Jacksonville State, it was Alverson (17), Greenleaf (15), Smalley (11), Tanner (11) and Toles (10).

Against Florida in the SEC home opener, the Tigers had four players score in double figures: Hilliard (17), Alverson (15), Greenleaf (11) and Smalley (10). It marked the fifth time this season for Auburn to have four players in double figures. The other times were against South Alabama with Smalley (15), Williams (13), Greenleaf (11) and Toles (10) scoring in double figures; and against Seton Hall with Smalley (15), Jennings (14), Toles (12) and Alverson (12).

### DOMINATING THE PAINT

Auburn has out-scored its opponents in the paint 12 times this season, but against Alabama A&M it was a dominating effort with 44 points scored in the paint. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers in the paint in almost two years as it was the most since Auburn tallied 56 against Arkansas on March 1, 2009.

### SPREADING THE WEALTH

After freshman Tyrese Tanner led Auburn with 15 points at Chicago State, she became the sixth Tiger this season to lead Auburn in scoring. Others are Alli Smalley, Blanche Alverson, Chantel Hilliard, Morgan Toles and Jordan Greenleaf.

### LONG DISTANCE RECORD BREAKER

With her 3-pointer with 1:22 left in the Temple game on Dec. 4, Auburn senior Alli Smalley recorded the 185th 3-pointer of her Auburn career, giving her sole possession of the AU 3-point record. She now has 212 on her career.

### NO. 200 FOR NELL

The Dec. 21 game at Chicago State marked the 200th for Nell Fortner as Auburn's head coach. She picked up the win and had a 121-79 record through her first 200 games.

### STARTING OFF WITH A WIN

Auburn opened SEC play at Alabama on Jan. 3 with a 66-55 victory, marking the third time under Nell Fortner for the Tigers to win their SEC opener and just the second time for Auburn to win its SEC road opener. All-time, the Tigers are now 12-20 in SEC road openers.

The Tigers came out in their next game to defeat Florida, 73-56, in Auburn's first SEC game in the new Auburn Arena. AU is now 18-14 in SEC home openers and 3-4 under Nell Fortner.

### TOUGH START

Auburn is coming off its most difficult start to a season in the program's history. After opening against Mercer, Auburn played 16th-ranked Florida State and sixth-ranked Duke, giving the Tigers two ranked opponents in the first three games for the first time in school history.

### BREAKING THE STREAK

Auburn's 85-51 win over Seton Hall broke a four-game losing streak for the Tigers - a streak that tied for the longest losing streak since the 2004-05 season. Auburn has not lost more than four consecutive games since it lost six in a row from Dec. 31, 2004 - Jan. 20, 2005.

### TURN IT IN TO POINTS

The Tigers have notched a pair of impressive defensive performances this season. In the first, Auburn forced 31 Seton Hall turnovers on Nov. 27, turning them in to 36 points on the other end of the floor.

The Tigers were at it again against Alabama A&M, forcing 29 turnovers on 18 steals, turning them into 39 points on the other end. It marked the most points scored by the Tigers off turnovers since Auburn scored 39 against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008. The 18 steals were also the most since AU picked up 22 against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 2008.

### DISHING IT OUT

By playing in her 30th career game against Mercer, Auburn sophomore became eligible for the career assist rankings. With 246 on her career, she ranks fifth all-time at Auburn with 4.8 per game.

### I'M FIRST!

While it was Mercer's Sharnea Boykin who scored the first field goal in Auburn Arena, sophomore Blanche Alverson came down on the very next possession to pick up Auburn's first field goal and the first 3-pointer in the facility.

### OFFENSE WINS GAMES

Auburn is 85-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 45-82 during the Fortner era.

### HOME COOKIN'

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 129-10 record against non-conference opponents when playing at home.

**SMALLEY AND TANNER NAMED TO JUNKANOO JAM**

**ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

For their play at the Junkanoo Jam, senior Alli Smalley and freshman Tyrese Tanner were named to the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament Team.

Smalley averaged 13.5 points, 2.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds per game in the two games, scoring a team-high 15 points in Auburn's win over Seton Hall. Tanner averaged 6.0 points and 3.5 rebounds, along with a team-high 2.5 steals per game on the week.

Also on the all-tournament team were Boston College's Stafanie Murphy and Sacred Heart's Callan Taylor. BC's Carolyn Swords was named the tournament MVP.

**SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

Auburn senior Alli Smalley was named to the Preseason All-SEC team by both the coaches and the media. The Coaches selected Smalley to the Preseason All-SEC First Team while the media voted her to the Second Team.

Smalley averaged 15.7 points per game last season, chipping in 4.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per outing.

**AUBURN PICKED SIXTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS**

Coming off a 15-16 season, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked sixth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. Tennessee was the preseason favorite in both polls.

**FIRST GAME IN AUBURN ARENA**

Auburn won its inaugural game in the new \$86 million Auburn Arena. The Tigers defeated Mercer, 79-61, for the first regular-season Auburn win, men or women, in the new facility.

The Tigers move across the street this season from its former home,

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum - the team's home since 1974. Auburn played its first game in BEMC on Jan. 11, 1974, defeating in-state rival Alabama, 69-31.

**MAKING IT HOME**

Nell Fortner enters her seventh season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

**NEW FACES**

Auburn welcomes five new faces to its lineup this season in freshmen Peyton Davis (Birmingham, Ala.), Camille Glymph (Greenville, S.C.), Courtney Strain (Woodland, Ala.), Tyrese Tanner (Birmingham, Ala.) and Jassany Williams (Davie, Fla.). The recruiting class was ranked 18th in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

**TIGERS SIGN HASINA MUHAMMAD FOR 2011-12**

The Auburn women's basketball signed 6-1 guard/forward Hasina Muhammad (Ridgeway HS, Memphis, Tenn.) to a National Letter of Intent, head coach Nell Fortner announced on Nov. 10.

Muhammad is ranked as the No. 66 overall player in the country by ESPN's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 17th-best guard in the country and No. 2 prospect in Tennessee by HoopGurlz.

Muhammad was also ranked by two other recruiting services. She is the No. 50 overall prospect according to the All-Star Girls Report and No. 47 in the Girls Basketball Report.

**WNBA CHAMPION... AGAIN**

After winning a WNBA title in 2009 with the Phoenix Mercury, former Tiger Le'Coe Willingham put herself in select company when she turned around and won it again in 2010, this time with the Seattle Storm.

Willingham, a native of Augusta, Ga., averaged 5.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game as she helped the Storm to a league-best 28-6 record.

The Storm swept Los Angeles in the first round of the playoffs, setting up a meeting of Willingham and her former team, the Mercury, in the conference finals. She defeated her old team, and former Tiger DeWanna Bonner, in a sweep for a trip to the WNBA finals.

Seattle made it a perfect run through the playoffs, sweeping the Atlanta Dream in three games for the title.

**Quoting Head Coach Nell Fortner**

On Alabama . . .

“It’s always a good game between the two of us. A lot of it is not just because it’s a SEC game, it’s an in-state rivalry. We are just working hard, putting our best foot forward and see what we can do.”

On the rivalry . . .

“It’s Auburn-Alabama. There is not a lot to talk about. It is what it is. Every time these schools get together to play anything, it’s one of the best in-state rivalries in the country.”

On coming home with a new lineup . . .

“We are looking forward to playing at home, but it does not guarantee a win. We are settling in to the new lineup and I feel good about it. They are coming along, working hard and hopefully playing at home will give more added energy.”

On production of young players . . .

“I think the players are taking advantage of minutes that are to be had. There are a lot of minutes to make up for and they are making the most of it. I think everybody has always been hard workers, but I think every player is taking advantage of time on the court.”

**TIGERS ON THE TUBE**

As part of the SEC’s television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women’s basketball team will be televised six times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPN2. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Auburn will be televised three times at home at the new Auburn Arena and three times on the road. The first will be the SEC-opener on Jan. 2 at Alabama on CSS, followed by a Jan. 16 home meeting with LSU on CSS. The Tigers will appear on CSS again a week later, on Jan. 23, as Tennessee comes to town.

Auburn will then make an ESPN2 appearance on Feb. 13 at Arkansas before traveling to South Carolina for a Feb. 20 game on the Fox Sports Net.

The Tigers will close out the regular season with a Feb. 27 home game against Kentucky on the SEC Network.

**AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT  
FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS**

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women’s Basketball Tournament. Auburn’s bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between 1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico, The Pit/Bob King Court); Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park, Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center); Columbus, Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthy Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion); University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco, Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

The 16 advancing teams will continue play at four regional sites: Dayton, Ohio (University of Dayton Arena), Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center) and Philadelphia, Pa. (Liacouras Center). The 2011 NCAA Women’s Final Four will be held at Consecro Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. on April 3 and 5.

Senior Alli Smalley led the Tigers in scoring with 12 points while freshman Tyrese Tanner came off the bench for 10 points and three steals. Jordan Greenleaf pulled down a team-high seven rebounds.

Auburn took an early 7-2 lead, but saw it slip away after a pair of Cougar 3-pointers. Chicago State would go on to lead most of the first half, capping it off with a Tressa Beckel jumper with 14 seconds remaining that gave CSU its largest lead of the game at 32-24.

The Tigers responded early in the second half, opening up with an 8-2 run to cut the Cougar lead to two. Chicago State would build its lead back up to six with 6:28 left in the game, but Tanner sparked an Auburn charge that would have the Tigers out-scoring CSU 22-12 in the final minutes.

Auburn finished the game 21-of-32 from the free throw and was 11-of-13 in the final 52 seconds of the game.

Morgan Toles scored 14 points followed by Blanche Alverson with 13. Jordan Greenleaf led Auburn on the boards with 12.

**AUBURN** - The Auburn women's basketball team struggled to find an offensive rhythm Feb. 6 as the Tigers fell to Mississippi State, 57-45, at Auburn Arena. Sophomore Blanche Alverson led the Tigers in scoring with 19 points while Mississippi native Chantel Hilliard scored 12 with a team-high six rebounds in her second start of the season.

Hilliard was starting in place of senior Alli Smalley, who missed the last two days of practice with an illness. Smalley still made it into the game, scoring five points with two steals off the bench. The missed start ended a 106-game consecutive start run for Smalley, the second-longest in Auburn history behind Kristen Mulligan's 118 consecutive starts.

The game was also Auburn's Pink Zone Game to bring awareness to breast cancer. The Tigers teamed with Alfa Insurance to donate \$5,000 to the Montgomery-based Joy to Life Foundation.

Coming off a tough 69-38 loss at Kentucky on Thursday, the Tigers' offensive woes continued as Auburn shot 33.3 per cent from the field, including a season-low 17 points in the second half. As a team, the Bulldogs were 22-of-58 from the field, for 38 percent, and 5-of-7 from the line. Although entering the game last in the conference for 3-point shooting, State finished the day 8-of-15 from outside the arc.

Porter led the Bulldogs with 21 points followed by Mary Kathryn Govero with 12. Catina Bett pulled down a game-high 11 rebounds with her six points.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. - Blanche Alverson and Morgan Toles went 4-for-4 from the free-throw line in the final minute Feb. 13 at Arkansas, preserving Auburn's lead as the Tigers hung on for a 64-59 win over the Razorbacks. Senior Alli Smalley scored a team-high 19 points to lead the Tigers to the win while freshman Courtney Strain notched a career-high 12 points.

The teams traded the lead early in the first half, but Auburn was able to pull away by seven, 25-18, with 4:06 left. However, Arkansas finished the half on an 11-3 run to take a 29-28 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The teams traded the lead again early in the second half with neither team able to pull away by more than three points. Arkansas led by two after a Ricketts jumper gave the Razorbacks a 42-40 lead with 12:06 remaining when Smalley caught fire.

A Smalley basket and a subsequent 3-pointer gave Auburn the lead for good with 8:57 left. She scored again a minute later to give Auburn a four-point lead. The Tigers would go on to lead by as many as seven points with Arkansas getting no closer than three points the rest of the way. While Auburn's last field goal came with 1:46 left in the game, Auburn went 6-for-6 from the line the rest of the way to hold on to the lead and the win.

Ashley Daniels and Sarah Watkins each notched double-doubles to lead Arkansas. Watkins scored 12 points with 10 rebounds while Daniels tallied game-highs of 22 points and 11 rebounds.
