LEADING OFF

- Auburn is 40-18 all-time against Troy, including a 27-7 mark in games played at home.
- The Tigers are 6-4 against Troy in their last 10 meetings.
- Auburn is looking to snap a four-game losing streak, its longest of the year.
- Auburn has been hit by pitch 51 times this year, including at least once in 28 of 33 games. The single-season record is 73 in 2010; Auburn is on pace to be plunked 88 times this season (1.6 HBP/game).
- Auburn is third in the league in average in conference games (.289) but is 11th in runs scored (40).
- Sophomore Jordan Ebert (.385) entered the week as the top hitter in the Southeastern Conference. Ebert had his first career four-hit game at Ole Miss (4/4).

- Opponents are hitting just .171 against freshman RHP Keegan Thompson, which ranks 3rd in the SEC.
- Thompson has the SEC's 10th-best earned run average (1.71).
- Auburn leads the SEC with 56 stolen bases this year. Auburn is on pace for 95 steals in the regular season, which would rank sixth in school history for a single-season.
- Senior Damek Tomscha is on a 10-game hitting streak and has reached base safely in 32 straight games dating back to last season.

SETTING THE STAGE

The Auburn Tigers are looking to get back on the winning track this week as they return home for a midweek non-conference tilt against the Troy Trojans on Tuesday. First pitch is set for 6 p.m. at Plainsman Park.

The Tigers (19-14, 5-7 SEC) are looking to snap a four-game losing streak after suffering a sweep at the hands of Ole Miss in Oxford over the weekend, along with a midweek loss to Samford last Tuesday.

Troy (16-16, 4-7 SBC) is also seeking redemption after being swept at home by nationally ranked Louisiana-Lafayette over the weekend. This will be Troy's second game against an SEC opponent in three weeks; the Trojans fell to Alabama 10-5 on March 25 in Pensacola.

Rod Bramblett and Andy Burcham will have the call on the Auburn IMG Sports Network with air time set for 5:45 p.m. Locally, the broadcast can be heard on WINGS 94.3 FM. Fans can also follow live stats, audio and video at AuburnTigers.com.

TOMSCHA ON A TEAR

Coming into this week, senior Damek Tomscha is riding a 10-game hitting streak. He has also reached base in all 31 games with a plate appearance this year; his total reached-base streak is 32 dating back to the final game of the 2013 season.

For his Auburn career, Tomscha has reached base safely in 78 of 85 games (47 of 54 in 2013).

FOUR FOR THE ROAD

Sophomore Jordan Ebert had the first four-hit game of his career on April 4 at Ole Miss, going 4-for-5 with a run and an RBI in the Tigers' 13-inning loss. Ebert continues to lead the SEC with a .385 average heading into the week.

AUBURN OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE

Auburn has gone 14-7 in non-conference play this year ... The Tigers are hitting .294 in games outside the SEC this year, and nine of Auburn's 11 home runs have come in non-league play. Auburn pitchers boast a 2.57 ERA in non-conference games, holding opponents to a .220 average.

EVERYONE'S GOTTA MAKE SACRIFICES

The Tigers lead the Southeastern Conference with 42 sacrifice bunts this season, eight more than the second-place teams in that category in the SEC (Florida).

Jordan Ebert is the third in the SEC with eight sac bunts, and Damon Haecker has six sacrifices, which ties for fifth in the league.

OUCH!

The Tigers are the among the best in the SEC at leaning into one. Auburn batters have been hit by pitch 51 times so

far in 2014, which ranks third in the league. The Tigers were hit by a pitch at least once in the first 23 games of the season.

Freshman Damon Haecker has been hit 11 times, which ties for the league lead, and senior Damek Tomscha has been plunked eight times so far this year.

Auburn is on pace to be hit 88 times during the regular season, which would shatter the existing team record of 73, set in 2010. In addition, Haecker is one HBP away from entering the single-season Auburn top 10. The individual school record for a season is 20 (Robert Lewis, 1994).

FINDING A WAY TO GET ON BASE

As a team, Auburn ranks second in the Southeastern Conference with a .380 on-base percentage.

Damek Tomscha has reached safely in all 32 games in which he has played, a career-long streak for the senior. He ranks second in the SEC with a .476 on-base percentage.

Senior IF Dan Glevenyak saw his streak of reaching base safely in every game come to an end in a loss at Tennessee on March 23. He had reached in 26 straight games dating back to last season, one game shy of his career-best streak.

Freshman Anfernee Grier had a 15-game reached base streak to start the season before failing to reach at Kennesaw State (3/11).

AUBURN vs. TROY

Auburn is 40-18 all-time against Troy, including a 27-7 mark when the game is played in Auburn. The Trojans won last year's meeting at Troy, but Auburn has won four straight home meetings. A look at the last 10 meetings:

STEALING THE SHOW

Through 33 games, the Tigers have 56 stolen bases, which leads the SEC and eclipses Auburn's total from the entire 2013 season (33). The Tigers are on pace to steal 95 bases in the regular season this year, which would rank as the sixth-most in program history.

In the season-opening Snowbird Classic, the Tigers swiped a combined 10 bases (on 12 attempts) during the weekend. The Tigers did not steal their 10th base until the 14th game of the 2013 season, and Auburn's six steals vs. Connecticut (2/16) and Presbyterian (3/2) were more than in any game last season.



Senior Dan Glevenyak has 11 steals this season, which ties him for fourth in the SEC. Fellow senior Ryan Tella is tied for sixth in the league with 10 steals.

MOWING THEM DOWN

Senior catcher Blake Austin is on pace to break the Auburn school record for runners caught stealing in a career. He came into the season third on the list with 40, and is within striking distance of the top two spots. He has thrown out six of 13 would-be base stealers so far in 2014.

HERE HE COMES TO SAVE THE DAY

In just a season and a half on the Plains, senior right-hander Terrance Dedrick has moved into the all-time top 10 in career saves as an Auburn Tiger. He had nine saves in SEC play last season (10 overall) and has earned three more already this year, giving him 13 for his Auburn career and moving him into a tie for sixth place in program history.

SEASON-LONG NOTES

GOING THE DISTANCE

Auburn has had two pitchers combine for three complete games this season, which leads the SEC. In fact, the other 13 SEC teams have combined for five complete games on the year.

Freshman Keegan Thompson has pitched a pair of complete games in his first five starts, pitching a one-hit shutout against Presbyterian on March 1 before coming back 14 days later with nine innings against Texas A&M in his first career SEC start.

Senior Dillon Ortman was the predecessor to Thompson's second complete game as he went the distance in Auburn's 4-0 win over Texas A&M on March 14. It was the longest outing for the Auburn senior as he shut out the Aggies on just four hits.

JOINING THE 700 CLUB

Auburn's 7-3 victory over Missouri on March 29 was the 700th of head coach Sunny Golloway's career. Not counting one abbreviated season as interim head coach at Oklahoma in 2005, Golloway has averaged nearly 42 wins per year in 16 full seasons as a collegiate head coach.

Coming into the 2014 season, Golloway ranked 15th among active coaches in career winning percentage (.669).

MARCHING RIGHT ALONG

Good things happened for Auburn baseball in the month of March. From March 1-31, the Tigers tied for the most wins in the SEC.

ONE ISN'T THE LONELIEST NUMBER

After going 12 seasons since pitching their last one-hitter, the Tigers did it twice in a span of 11 days this month. Keegan Thompson pitched a complete-game, one-hit shutout against Presbyterian on March 1 for the first one-hitter since 2002.

On March 11 at Kennesaw State, four pitchers - Justin Camp, Terrance Dedrick, Jay Wade and Rocky McCord - held the Owls to just one hit in a 6-1 victory.

DAMEK THE DESTROYER

During the opening week of SEC play, Damek Tomscha hit .529/.526/1.118 with four doubles, two homers and 5 RBI.

Over 10 games from March 7-19, Tomscha hit .484 with a .541 on-base percentage and a slugging percentage of 1.000. He also has four home runs plus eight RBIs in the last 10 games.

Through 22 games of the season, he found his way into the SEC's Top 10 in batting average (.414-T2nd), slugging (.750-2nd), on-base pct. (.532-2nd), RBI (18-8th), home runs (5-2nd) and hit by pitch (7-T3rd).

404: ERRORS NOT FOUND

From March 18-23, the Tigers had a stretch of five games without committing a fielding error. Research back through the 1993 season could not find a longer error-free streak.

Over an eight-game stretch from March 14-23, Auburn committed just three errors, compiled a .990 fielding percentage and allowed just one unearned run. Compare that to the first 17 games of the season, where Auburn committed 30 errors, had a .956 fielding percentage and allowed 18 unearned runs.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Five freshmen were in Auburn's opening-day lineup - 1B Keegan Thompson, 2B Damon Haecker, OF J.J. Shaffer, OF Anfernee Grier, and DH Daniel Robert. Two other freshmen - IF Brett Binning and C Blake Logan - saw the first action of their careers during the opening weekend.

RHP Kevin Davis made his first start on Feb. 25 vs. Alabama A&M, and Connor Short had two hits in each of three games vs. Presbyterian (2/28-3/2) in his first collegiate action.

CAN'T SPELL KEEGAN WITHOUT 'K'

In his collegiate pitching debut, freshman RHP Keegan Thompson was masterful, allowing just one unearned run on two hits in a 5.2-inning start vs. Connecticut, picking up the win. He also struck out nine Huskies on the day, which

ranked as the most strikeouts by an Auburn pitcher since Jon Luke Jacobs had 11 vs. South Alabama during the 2012 season.

His second outing featured fewer strikeouts, but was even more impressive. He retired 16 ETSU hitters in a row at one point, the longest streak since Grant Dayton sat down 17 Tennessee batters in a 2009 game. Thompson pitched into the ninth, giving up just one earned run on four hits while walking none.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

During the week of Feb. 25-March 2, Auburn hit .362 as a team, scoring 21 runs and getting on base at a .452 clip. The four-game stretch vs. Alabama A&M and Presbyterian raised Auburn's team batting average by 62 points to .270.

Six Auburn players hit better than .400 for the week. Senior OF Ryan Tella hit .643/.647/.786 and headed into the Capital City Classic leading the team with a .433 average. He was 9-for-14 with 2 2B, 2 RBI and 5 runs, along with 2 stolen bases.

Senior 3B Damek Tomscha hit .583/.667/.917 for the week, going 7-for-12 with a double, a home run and seven RBI. He took the team lead with 10 RBI and hit Auburn's first home run of the season in a win over Presbyterian (3/2).

GRIER'S STREAK ENDS AT 11

Freshman OF Anfernee Grier hit safely in each of Auburn's first 11 games, the only player for Auburn that can claim a season-opening hitting streak. Grier was two games shy of matching Jordan Ebert, who had a 13-game streak to open the 2013 season, for the longest by an Auburn freshman since 2002.

CAPITAL CITY CLASSIC STREAK ENDS

Auburn's 4-3 loss to Alabama on March 5 in Montgomery ended a five-year streak of wins over the Crimson Tide in the annual Capital City Classic. It was the Tigers' first loss in the annual game that started in 2009.

THOMPSON NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF WEEK

Auburn freshman RHP/1B Keegan Thompson was named the SEC Freshman of the Week as the league office announced its weekly baseball awards Monday.

Thompson pitched the first one-hitter for Auburn in 12 years with a 3-0 win over Presbyterian on Saturday. It was the first complete-game, solo one-hitter for Auburn since Colby Paxton one-hit Kentucky on March 17, 2002. Thompson allowed only three base runners to reach, one via a bloop hit and the other two coming because of Auburn errors.

Offensively, Thompson was 5-for-12 (.417) during the week with a double, an RBI and two runs scored. He has a five-game hitting streak, dating back to a Feb. 21 contest with Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Through three starts on the mound, the Cullman, Ala., native leads Auburn with a 2-0 record, 0.39 ERA, 19 strikeouts and just two walks in 23.0 innings pitched. He is holding opposing hitters to a paltry .093 average.

THESE BOOTS AREN'T MADE FOR WALKING

In the win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Feb. 21, senior Dillon Ortman became the first Auburn pitcher to strike out at least 11 batters in a game without allowing a walk since Eric Brandon struck out 12 in his perfect game against Murray State on March 2, 2002.

Over the three-game Tiger Classic, Auburn pitchers issued a total of six walks, all coming in the Saturday game against California. The following weekend, Auburn issued just four free passes (one intentionally) in three games vs. Presbyterian.

EXPERIENCED LINEUP

Auburn returns 21 letterwinners from its 2013 roster, including eight of nine Opening Day position starters from last year. Sophomore LF Jordan Ebert is the leading returning hitter after batting .303 last year with four home runs and 22 RBI. Senior 3B Damek Tomscha tied for the Auburn home run lead last year with seven, and he hit .274 with 26 RBI. Senior C Blake Austin was a .290 hitter last year with 3 HR and 23 RBI, and senior CF Ryan Tella was the team leader in RBI (37) and stolen bases (14) last season.

Sunny Golloway was named Auburn's 17th head baseball coach on June 14, 2013. Golloway spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at the University of Oklahoma, where he led the Sooners to seven NCAA Regional berths, four NCAA Super Regionals and the 2010 College World Series.

"I'm really excited about this opportunity because I've always held the Auburn baseball program in very high regard," Golloway said. "The history of the Auburn program was a huge factor in making this decision. Secondly, the Southeastern Conference is the top baseball conference in America. Being able to compete in the SEC is a challenge that we look forward to. With our location, we are in a hotbed of talent. We will be able to hit the road recruiting right away, and we look forward to recruiting the best student-athletes to represent this outstanding university."

Golloway said he and his family were impressed with Auburn as soon as they arrived on campus for a visit with Jacobs.

"I had heard quite a bit about Jay and really wanted to meet him," Golloway said. "And right after I met him, I knew it was going to be a great fit. I think that's very important - who you're working with on a daily basis, the commitment to the student-athletes in your program, and making sure that everything is in place to pursue an opportunity to win championships. That's what we want to be about - we want to win championships."

Golloway has been a proven winner at each of his head coaching stops. In 16 full seasons as a head coach - eight seasons each at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts - Golloway has amassed a record of 681-337-1 (.669), including 12 seasons with at least 40 wins. He recorded a mark of 346-181-1 (.656) in eight-plus seasons as the Oklahoma head coach, an average of more than 40 wins per season. Prior to the 2013 season, Golloway's winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches.

Last season at Oklahoma, Golloway led the Sooners to a 43-21 overall record, a Big 12 Tournament title, an NCAA Regional title and a Super Regional appearance. His final team at Oklahoma also produced a pair of All-Americans, including pitcher Jonathan Gray, the No. 3 overall pick in last week's Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Under Golloway, Oklahoma posted the program's fifth-straight 40-win regular season in 2013, making Oklahoma one of few programs nationally to win at least 40 games in five consecutive years. The Sooners finished third in the Big 12 standings while making the program's sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance (36th overall). OU finished the 2013 campaign ranked as high as No. 18 in the nation after falling to LSU in the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional.

"The goal in this search was to find a proven winner who can put our baseball program in a position to compete for championships, and we found our man in Coach Golloway," Jacobs said. "His program at Oklahoma is one of only a handful nationally to have won 40 or more games each of the past five years, so his record speaks for itself. After having the chance to hear his vision for Auburn baseball, there is no doubt in my mind he has the tenacity, the passion and the drive to get our program back to a level that matches our strong baseball heritage."

The Sooners hosted three NCAA Regionals under Golloway while appearing in the program's only Super Regional appearances (2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013) and making it back to the College World Series in 2010 for the first time since 1995.

Golloway has 22 years' experience as a collegiate coach. He served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1992-95, helping lead the Sooners to three trips to the College World Series in those four years and a national title in 1994. He took over as head coach at Oral Roberts in 1996, and the Golden Eagles won the Mid-Continent Conference title and advanced to an NCAA Regional in each of his final six seasons at ORU.

He returned to Oklahoma as associate head coach in 2004 and was elevated to interim head coach on May 1, 2005. Two months later, he was named Oklahoma's eighth head baseball coach.

Golloway has produced 80 MLB draft picks in his 16-year tenure as a collegiate head coach, and a total of 113 players have been draft selections in his 22 years in college baseball. He has

also coached 94 all-conference selections between his two head coaching stops, including 61 All-Big 12 selections at Oklahoma in the last eight years.

Three of OU's recruiting classes under Golloway have ranked in the top 10 in Collegiate Baseball's national rankings, including the 2007 group of newcomers that was tabbed the fourth best in the country, the highest ranking since 1987 and tied for the second best in program history. At ORU, Golloway posted a mark of 335-156 (.682). He coached 16 All-Americans, three Freshman All-Americans and 26 of his ORU players were drafted or signed professional contracts. He was honored four times as Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year by his peers (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002).

In his final six seasons at Oral Roberts, Golloway was responsible for turning the Golden Eagles into one of the nation's winningest programs. The program flourished under Golloway's guidance and tallied 277 wins in that time, an average of more than 46 victories per season, and a .731 winning percentage. Golloway and the Golden Eagles dominated the Mid-Continent Conference after joining the league in 1998, winning six consecutive regular season and tournament titles, and advancing to six consecutive NCAA Regionals. ORU was an amazing 85-5 in conference play over his last four seasons.

Golloway is a former Team USA assistant and head coach of several collegiate summer teams. In the summer of 2002, he was selected to serve as pitching coach for the USA Baseball National Team. Under his direction, the team recorded the lowest ERA in its history. Golloway also helped team USA to a silver medal.

Born in Springfield, Mo., Golloway grew up in Stillwater, Okla., and graduated from Stillwater High School in 1979. He attended Northeastern Oklahoma A&M Junior College in Miami, Okla., for one year before transferring to Oklahoma Christian College where he received his bachelor's degree in business in 1984. He has also done graduate work at the University of Central Oklahoma and the University of Oklahoma.

Golloway and his wife, Charlotte, have three children: Sunni Kate, Taylor and Callen.
