Last Time Out

- Tiffany Dale posted a double-double with 17 points and a career-high 16 rebounds but it was not enough as Tulane fell to Ole Miss, 89-66, on Saturday in Devlin Fieldhouse
- The Rebels hit their first four shots to jump out to an early 10-4 lead and never trailed at any point in the contest
- As a team, Tulane connected on season-low 34.5 percent of its field goals (20-of-58) while allowing Ole Miss to convert on 32-of-62 of its shots from the field (.516)

On The Green Wave

- Tulane is 4-2 on the year and looking to snap a two-game skid after dropping a 69-55 decision at N.C. State on Nov. 24 and an 89-66 contest to Ole Miss on Nov. 30
- As a team, the Green Wave are averaging 68.5 points and 42.7 rebounds per game while allowing opponents to score 59.2 points and pull down 35.8 rebounds a contest

- Auburn enters the contest 4-3 on the year and looking to bounce back from a 68-57 loss to Iowa State on Saturday in the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout in Las Vegas, Nev.
- As a team, the Tigers are averaging 66.0 points and 40.7 rebounds per game while allowing opponents to average 62.0 points and 30.9 rebounds a contest
- Tyrese Tanner leads the team in scoring with a 14.7 average and Tra'Cee Tanner headlines the unit on the glass with 7.1 rebounds per contest

On The Series

- Tuesday's game marks the sixth meeting between Tulane and Auburn on the hardwood and the Green Wave trail in the all-time series 4-1

Tulane Head Coach Lisa Stockton

In her 20th season at the helm of the Tulane women's basketball program, Lisa Stockton is the dean of Green Wave and Conference USA coaches.



Her career record of 463-222 as a collegiate head coach is good for a 67.6 winning percentage and she is 400-195 (.672) during her time at Tulane, including a 179-111 mark in conference play.

During her tenure with the Green Wave, Stockton has led her team to the postseason 14 times (10 NCAAAs, 4 WNITs) and claimed Conference Coach of the Year honors three times (Metro in 1995, C-USA in 2007 and 2010). In addition, Tulane has won C-USA regular season crown four times and the tournament title on five occasions. With 400 wins with the Green Wave, Stockton now has twice as many wins as each of the previous Tulane coaches earned in 19 combined years.

Stockton has guided Tulane to a dozen 20-plus win seasons, including a school-record 27 wins in 1996-97 and 1999-2000. Her student-athletes have earned all-conference honors a combined 46 times, including 12 first-teamers. She also has one C-USA Player of the Year, three C-USA Freshman, Defensive and Sixth Player of the Year, and one C-USA Newcomer of the Year honorees under her watch, and five former Tulane players have gone on to play in the WNBA.

Prior to coming to Tulane for the 1994-95 season, Stockton served as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech from 1990-94, head coach at Greensboro College from 1987-90 and as the volunteer assistant at North Carolina in 1986-87.

Stockton graduated from Wake Forest in 1986 and was a four-year letterwinner for the Demon Deacons where she set school records in points, assists and steals. She earned her master's from North Carolina in 1987.

About Tulane

The Green Wave head to Alabama 4-2 on the year and looking to snap a two-game skid after dropping a 69-55 contest at North Carolina State on Nov. 24 and falling at home to Ole Miss, 89-66, on Nov. 30.

As a team, the Green Wave are averaging 68.5 points, 42.7 rebounds, 16.2 assists, 7.3 steals and 4.2 blocks per game. Junior guard Danielle Blagg is one of three Tulane players averaging double figures offensively and leads the team with 12.5 points per game. Freshman guard Leslie Vorpahl is next with 11.7 points per game while junior point guard Jamie Kaplan follows with an 11.3 average.

Junior forward Tiffany Dale paces the team with 8.8 rebounds per game each and sophomore center Chinwe Duru headlines the defense with 2.3 blocked shots per outing. Kaplan leads the Green Wave with 7.0 assists per game and Vorpahl has a team-high 1.5 steals per contest.

Tulane is connecting at a .428 clip from the field, hitting 145-of-339 shots from the floor, and 30-of-72 tries from beyond the 3-point arc (.417), while allowing opponents to shoot .371 overall (132-of-356) and .272 from 3-point land (28-of-103). Green Wave foes are averaging 59.2 points, 35.8 rebounds, 12.8 assists, 7.5 steals and 3.0 blocks so far in 2013-14.

About Auburn

Auburn enters the midweek match-up 4-3 on the year and fresh off a 1-1 showing at the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout in Las Vegas, Nev., where the Lady Tigers defeated Ball State, 67-51, on Friday before falling to nationally-ranked Iowa State, 68-57, on Saturday.

As a team, the Lady Tigers are averaging 66.0 points, 40.7 rebounds, 14.3 assists, 9.0 steals and 4.4 blocks per game. Tyrese Tanner leads four Auburn players averaging double figures offensively with 14.7 points per game while Hasina Muhammad, Brandy Montgomery and Tra'Cee Tanner follow with respective scoring averages of 13.0, 12.7 and 11.9. Tanner paces the team with 7.1 rebounds and 1.4 blocked shots per contest and Kiani Parker headlines the squad with 3.1 assists and 2.1 steals per outing.

Auburn is hitting 43.2 percent of its shots from the field, connecting on 178-of-412 field goal attempts, including a 22-of-80 showing from beyond the 3-point line (.275). The Lady Tigers' defense has allowed opponents to post a 37.5 shooting percentage (138-of-368) and a 33.8 clip from 3-point land (49-of-145). Auburn opponents are averaging 62.0 points, 30.9 rebounds, 13.9 assists, 9.4 steals and 2.0 blocks per game.

Series History

Tuesday's game between Tulane and Auburn marks the sixth time the two teams will meet on the hardwood and the Lady Tigers hold a 4-1 lead in the all-time series. All of those games have come under the direction of head coach Lisa Stockton.

Tulane's lone win against Auburn to date came in the initial meeting when the Green Wave posted a 64-53 win on Dec. 13, 1998, in then-Fogelman Arena. Auburn won the next two games with a 75-64 overtime victory on Jan. 5, 2003, in Auburn, Ala., and a 54-37 decision on Dec. 5, 2004, in New Orleans. Last season, the Lady Tigers handed the Green Wave a pair of losses. Auburn won a regular-season contest with a second-half rally to post a 70-65 win on Nov. 28 in Devlin Fieldhouse and ended Tulane's season on March 27 with a 72-52 victory in the third round of the WNIT at Auburn Arena.

Tulane Against The SEC

Tuesday's game at Auburn is the second of three games the Green Wave will play against SEC opponents during the 2013-14 season. Tulane dropped an 89-66 decision to Ole Miss on Nov. 30 in Devlin Fieldhouse, and the Green Wave will play host to LSU on Jan. 5.

Tulane is now 24-65 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference. The Green Wave sport winning records against Florida (2-1), Mississippi State (5-4) and Texas A&M (4-3), are 2-2 against Ole Miss, and have sub-.500 marks against Alabama (3-7), Arkansas (1-3), Auburn (1-4), Georgia (0-1), LSU (6-28) and South Carolina (0-12).

In true "road" games, Tulane is 9-29 vs. the SEC: 1-3 at Alabama, 1-1 at Arkansas, 0-2 at Auburn, 0-1 at Florida, 3-15 at LSU, 2-3 at Mississippi State, 1-0 vs. Ole Miss, 0-3 at South Carolina, and 1-1 at Texas A&M.

Tough Stretch

The Green Wave are in the middle of their toughest stretch to date as Tuesday night's game at Auburn is the third of three straight contests and one of six potential games against BCS-league teams during a nine-game stretch.

The big run began on Nov. 24 at North Carolina State – a game the Wave dropped 69-55 – and followed that up with an 89-66 home loss to Ole Miss on Nov. 30. Following today's game against the Lady Tigers, Tulane will play host to next-door neighbor Loyola on Dec. 8 in Devlin Fieldhouse. From there, the Green Wave will play Virginia and St. Francis (Pa.) in the Hilton Garden Inn/Homewood Suites Classic in Ft. Meyers, Fla., on Dec. 20 and 21, respectively, before playing Northeastern on Dec. 28 and either Indiana State or Northwestern on Dec. 29 in the Tulane/DoubleTree Classic.

The Green Wave end their non-conference run when they play host to LSU on Jan. 5 in Devlin Fieldhouse. From there, Tulane will open its 16-game Conference USA slate on Jan. 9 when the Wave travel to Huntington, W.Va., to take on Marshall.

Welcome Back Blagg

The Green Wave welcomed back a familiar face on Nov. 24 at North Carolina State when junior guard Danielle Blagg took the court for the first time during the 2013-14 season. After battling numerous injuries during the preseason, the 2012 Conference USA Freshman of the Year and last year's second-team All C-USA honoree is averaging a team-best 12.5 points per game over the last two games.

Blagg had double-digit point totals in both games of the games she played in so far this season, including a season-best 15 after hitting a pair of 3-pointers among five made field goals to go with a trio of free throws on Saturday against Ole Miss.

For her career, Blagg has scored 625 points (9.2 avg), pulled down 244 rebounds (3.6 avg), handed out 64 assists (0.9 avg), posted 59 steals (0.9 avg) and blocked 35 shots (0.5 avg.). She currently ranks 10th in Tulane career history in 3-pointers (122) and 3-point percentage (.324), 11th in 3-point attempts (376) and blocks per game (0.5), and 19th in blocked shots (35).

Freshman Sensation

While freshmen playing key roles on the team have long been a staple of a Lisa Stockton-coached squad at Tulane, rookie guard Leslie Vorpahl has perhaps exceeded even her head coach's expectations as the native of San Antonio, Texas, currently leads the Green Wave in points scored (70), field goals made (23), 3-point baskets (11) and steals (9) through the first six games of the 2013-14 season.

Vorpahl is also currently tied for first on the team in minutes played (178) and minutes per game (29.7), while sitting second in points per game (11.7), assists (20), 3-point percentage (.458) and free throws made (13), and third in free throw percentage (.765). She posted double-figure scoring totals on four occasions, including a team-best 22-point effort at N.C. State on Nov. 24. She handed out four or more assists three times with a season-best four twice, and has two multiple-steal contests under her belt to date.

Vorpahl was named Conference USA Freshman of the Week on Nov. 25 after averaging 12.7 points, 3.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 0.7 steals per game during a three-game week which saw Tulane post wins over Southeastern Louisiana and UNC-Wilmington.

Getting To The Line

While the Green Wave ran out to a 3-0 start to the 2013-14 season with a trio of lopsided victories, one potential fly in the ointment during that stretch was free throw shooting as Tulane hit just 58.9 percent of its attempts from the charity stripe (33-of-56) during victories over UNO, McNeese State and Southeastern Louisiana.

Following a 4-of-9 showing from the line against the Lady Lions, however, Tulane has turned things around to connect at a .743 clip over the last three contests (58-of-78) while averaging 19.3 makes and 26.0 attempts along the way.

For the season, Tulane is 91-of-134 from the free throw line (.679), including season-high marks of 23 makes in 30 tries (.767) vs. Ole Miss on Saturday afternoon in Devlin Fieldhouse. The Green Wave's best showing from the stripe came at N.C. State on Nov. 24 when Tulane hit 85.7 percent of its free throws (18-of-21).

Spreading The Wealth

Every healthy player on the Green Wave roster has played in at least two games so far in the 2013-14 season, and Tulane has used a balanced attack offensively to start the year as three players have averaged double-digit scoring totals to date.

Junior guard Danielle Blagg leads the way with 12.5 points per game, followed by freshman guard Leslie Vorpahl at 11.7 and junior point guard Jamie Kaplan at 11.3. In addition, four other players are averaging at least 7.0 points per outing: Adesuwa Ebomownyi (9.2), Chinwe Duru (9.0), Tiffany Dale (8.7) and Courtnie Latham (7.0).

Stockton Gets 400th Win At Tulane

Lisa Stockton added to her long list of accomplishments during Nov. 22's 55-50 win at UNC-Wilmington gave the 20th-year Tulane head coach her 400 with the Green Wave.

Already the all-time winningest coach in Tulane basketball history with an overall record of 400-195 dating back to the 1994-95 campaign, the native of Greensboro, N.C., made the historical win that much sweeter as she had several friends and family members on hand as she was strolling the sidelines in her home state.

It is the second consecutive season that Stockton reached a milestone victory as she claimed career win No. 450 last year with a 57-55 win over then-Conference USA foe UCF on Jan. 31, 2013, in Orlando, Fla.

Consecutive Non-Conference Losses

Tulane's 69-55 loss at North Carolina State on Nov. 24 and 89-66 home loss to Ole Miss on Nov. 30 marked the first time the Green Wave dropped consecutive non-conference games since the 2008-09 season when the team sandwiched an 80-66 loss to South Florida on Dec. 30 and a 69-52 loss at Georgia Tech on Jan. 4 around a 57-48 Conference USA win at UTEP on Jan. 2.

The last time the Green Wave lost three-straight non-conference games came earlier that season when Tulane fell 86-53 at Arizona State on Nov. 16, 65-49 at VCU on Nov. 20 and 63-47 at LSU on Nov. 24. The first two of those losses came during the 2008 Preseason WNIT.

The Green Wave never held a lead at any points but rallied from a 15-point second-half deficit to make it a four-point affair twice late in the contest. Auburn, however, hit a pair of back-breaking 3-pointers and connected on 14-of-16 free throw attempts over the final 6:13 to put the game away.

Dealing In Dimes

Junior point guard Jamie Kaplan picked up where she left off during her break-out sophomore season and currently leads the Green Wave with 42 assists. While there is a lot of basketball to be played between now and the end of the season, her 7.0 assists per game would be a Tulane record - surpassing the current mark of 6.6 established by Ashley Langford in 2005-06.

Kaplan opened the season with a career-best 13 assists during the Green Wave's 81-46 win over New Orleans, adding 10 points to post her first career double-double. Her assist total against the Privateers ranks tied for third in Tulane single-game history, falling just one dime shy of the school record of 14 established by Langford against SMU on Feb. 26, 2006, and equaled by Langford vs. UTEP on Jan. 20, 2007.

Kaplan's double-double was the first of the point/assist variety since Roshaunda Barnes had 22 points and 10 assists against Southern Miss on Jan. 20, 2011. So far this season, Kaplan had six or more assists four times, including a nine-dime contest vs. Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 19.

Did You Notice?

During Tulane's 80-52 win over Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 19, the Wave tallied three marks that rank among the all-time best single-game performances in the school's record book.

Tulane's 76 field goal attempts against the Lady Lions ranks tied for sixth, the Green Wave's 26 assists currently sits tied for seventh and the 61.5 3-point percentage (8-of-13) is the 10th best showing from beyond the arc.

The shot total was the most by a Tulane team since launching 83 against Loyola-New Orleans on Nov. 11, 2011, and the 26 dimes were the most since equaling the mark against the very same Wolfpack squad last Jan. 7. The performance from 3-point land, meanwhile, is the best since Tulane connected on 9-of-14 shots from beyond the arc (.643) against East Carolina on March 8, 2012, in the quarterfinals of the Conference USA Championship in Memphis, Tenn.

Double Vision

Three Green Wave players posted double-doubles in the season-opening 81-46 win over the University of New Orleans on Nov. 8 as junior wing Adesuwa Ebomwonyi had 20 points and 15 rebounds, junior point guard Jamie Kaplan had 10 points and 13 assists, and sophomore center Chinwe Duru added 11 points and 11 rebounds.

It was the first time more than one Tulane player had a double-double in the same game since the opening round of the 2012 WNIT when Brett Benzio had 12 points and 10 rebounds while Olivia Grayson had 13 points and 10 rebounds in a 68-61 win over Mississippi Valley State on March 15, 2012, in Devlin Fieldhouse. In addition, it was the first time three Green Wave student-athletes had a double-double in the same game since a 76-71 home loss to Memphis on Feb. 16, 2001, when Gwen Slaughter had 16 points and 10 rebounds, Teana McKiver had 14 points and 10 rebounds, and Janell Burse chipped in with 10 rebounds and 10 blocks.

More Double Speak

In addition to the Green Wave's three double-doubles in the season opener against the Privateers, Tulane added another to the tally on Nov. 19 when junior wing Adesuwa Ebomwonyi had 15 points and 11 rebounds against Southeastern Louisiana and again on Nov. 30 when junior forward Tiffany Dale had 17 points and 16 boards vs. Ole Miss. Tulane's five double-doubles to date are just one shy of the Green Wave's total from a year ago.

Half Dozen In Double Figures

The Green Wave accomplished a rarity during a 80-52 win over Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 19. Not only did it push head coach Lisa Stockton to the cusp of her 400th win at Tulane, but six individual Wave performers finished the contest with double-digit scoring figures.

Tiffany Dale led the way with a season-best 16 points while Adesuwa Ebomwonyi followed with 15 and Jamie Kaplan added 13. Leslie Vorpahl was next with 12 points while Chinwe Duru and Courtnie Latham had 11 each.

Ironically enough, the last time Tulane had six players in double figures was against the very same Lady Lions as Brittany Lindsey (23), Tiffany Aidoo (13), Brett Benzio (13), Roshaunda Barnes (11), Danielle Nunn (11) and Olivia Grayson (10) all had 10-plus in an 85-57 victory on Jan. 3, 2011.

Big Wins To Open The Season

Tulane accomplished a program first during the first three games of the 2013-14 season as the Green Wave posted consecutive wins of 25-plus points to open the current campaign. In fact in the now 38-year history of the women's basketball program, Tulane had never won three straight games by 25 or more points.

The Green Wave began the year with an 81-46 win (35 points differential) over the University of New Orleans on Nov. 8, followed that up with a 74-49 victory (25 points) over McNeese State on Nov. 11 and are coming off an 80-52 (28 points) thumping of Southeastern Louisiana on Tuesday.

The combined 88-point margin of victory in those three contests stands as the second most in program history, falling behind only the 2001-02 squad which opened that season with an 101 point differential.

Tulane Against The State

Tulane's 80-52 win over Southeastern Louisiana on Nov. 19 was the third of five games the Green Wave will play against in-state foes during the 2013-14 season. All five of those games will come in the friendly confines of Devlin Fieldhouse as Tulane has already faced New Orleans on Nov. 8 and McNeese State on Nov. 11, and will play Loyola on Dec. 8 and LSU on Jan. 5.

Tulane is now a combined 131-129 against Louisiana opponents, including winning records against Dillard (5-4), Louisiana-Lafayette (22-6), Louisiana-Monroe (10-6), Loyola (3-0), Nicholls State (29-12) and Southeastern Louisiana (14-6). In addition, the Green Wave are .500 against Southern (4-4) while holding losing marks against Grambling State (1-2), LSU (6-28), Louisiana Tech (2-8), McNeese State (8-12), New Orleans (20-30), Northwestern St. (2-4) and Xavier (5-7).

Since Lisa Stockton took over as the helm of the Tulane program, the Green Wave are 57-18 against in-state foes. Tulane has won 19 of its last 20 games against Louisiana teams with the lone loss coming in a 65-64 overtime decision to Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 19, 2012, in Devlin Fieldhouse.

New On Scholarship

When preseason practice began, the Tulane women's basketball team was without a scholarship senior as walk-on forward Brooke Blankenship represented the lone senior on the roster. That changed on Wednesday, Nov. 6, as head coach Lisa Stockton awarded Blankenship with a scholarship prior to that day's practice. Blankenship has twice earned a spot on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor roll and is a two-time C-USA Academic medalist.

Tough Sledding On Tap

Sixteen home games and 13 potential contests against teams that made the postseason a year ago highlight the 2013-14 Tulane University women's basketball schedule.

The Green Wave slate will once again be a challenging one as the schedule features three certain games against NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago – LSU, Middle Tennessee State and Tulsa – seven assured contests against WNIT participants – Auburn, Charlotte, East Carolina, North Carolina State, FIU, Old Dominion and UAB – and two guaranteed showdowns with Women's Basketball Invitational programs McNeese State and Saint Francis.

Tulane can also play one more team that made the 2013 postseason field as the Wave could potentially face WNIT participant Indiana State in day two of the Tulane/DoubleTree Classic.

The Farewell Tour

While the Conference USA portion of the 2013-14 season is not slated to get underway until Jan. 9, the Green Wave will be making its final go round in the league as Tulane will head to the American Athletic Conference next year.

Tulane was a charter member of C-USA and have won more regular-season crowns (four) and tournament titles (five) than any other current member team since the conference was formed for the 1995-96 season.

Along the way, Green Wave student-athletes have claimed All-Conference USA honors on 33 occasions – including nine first-teamers – Defensive Player of the Year three times (Janell Burse in 1999, 2000 and 2001), Sixth Player of the Year three times (Burse in 1999, Grace Daley in 1997 and Teana McKiver in 2001), Freshman of the Year twice (Daley in 1997 and Danielle Blagg in 2012), as well as Player of the Year (Daley in 2000) and Newcomer of the Year (Indira Kaljo in 2009) once each.

New Look League

Playing its last season as a member of Conference USA in 2013-14, the Tulane women's basketball team will face a new-look league this year as the conference has undergone realignment.

In addition to league staples East Carolina, Marshall, Rice, Southern Miss, Tulsa, UAB and UTEP, the Green Wave will welcome Charlotte - which was a member of C-USA from 1995-2005 - Florida Atlantic (FAU), Florida International (FIU), Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion and Texas-San Antonio (UTSA) to the league this season.

Of those teams, seven made the postseason a year ago. Middle Tennessee, which won the Sun Belt Conference in 2012-13, and Tulsa made the NCAA Tournament while Charlotte, East Carolina, FIU, Old Dominion and UAB joined the Green Wave among the 64 teams selected to participate in the WNIT.

Preseason Prognostications

The Green Wave were picked to finish third in the 2013-14 Conference USA race and junior guard Danielle Blagg claimed a spot on the Preseason All C-USA squad, based on a vote of league coaches released back on Oct. 7.

League newcomer Middle Tennessee, the Sun Belt Conference champions last season, was picked to finish first in the Blue Raiders' inaugural year as a C-USA institution and received eight of the 16 first-place votes. UTEP - which earned six first-place votes - was second in the preseason poll, followed by Tulane, Charlotte and FIU.

Blagg is joined on the C-USA Preseason Team by Jerica Coley of FIU, Jessica Kuster of Rice, Ebony Rowe of Middle Tennessee, Shae Kelley of Old Dominion, Jamierra Faulkner of Southern Miss, Karisma Chapman of UAB and Kayla Thornton of UTEP. Coley, who led the nation in scoring last year with 26.3 points per game, was named C-USA Preseason Player of the Year.

Celebrating 20 Years

The 2013-14 season is a special one for Green Wave head coach Lisa Stockton as she enters her 20th season at the helm of the Green Wave program. She enters the year as the all-time winningest coach in both Tulane and Conference USA women's basketball history with a 400-195 record. In addition, Stockton holds a mark of 170-106 in C-USA games since the league was formed prior to the 1995-96 campaign, which is a high-water mark among conference coaches. Her win total is nearly twice as many as each of the previous Green Wave coaches earned in the 19 years the program played at the varsity level prior to Stockton's arrival.

Along the way, Stockton led Tulane to the postseason 14 times -10 trips to the NCAA Tournament and four berths in the WNIT - while claiming conference Coach of the Year honors three times (Metro in 1995, C-USA in 2007 and 2010). In addition, Stockton has guided the Green Wave to four C-USA regular season championships (1996-97, 1998-99, 2006-07 and 2009-10) and the tournament titles on five occasions (1997, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2010).

Stockton is one of four active coaches to take a Top 60 academic institution as listed in U.S. & World Report to at least 10 NCAA Tournaments. Seventeen of her student-athletes have become members of Tulane's 1,000-Point Club and the Green Wave have averaged better than 20 wins in each of Stockton's previous 19 seasons.

Familiar Face

Long-time Green Wave fans will notice a familiar face on the Tulane bench this year as four-year starter Olivia Grayson is in her first season as a graduate assistant.

A native of nearby Metairie, La., and a 2009 graduate of Archbishop Chapelle, Grayson starred for the Green Wave the last four years and completed her career holding the Tulane career record in games played (134) while finishing second in assists (499), fourth in steals (249), sixth in total rebounds (750) and seventh in points scored (1,442).

Grayson claimed a spot on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team as a rookie in 2009-10, earned first-team All C-USA recognition as a junior in 2011-12, and was tabbed second-team all-conference as a senior last year.

Something In Common

Tulane's true freshmen share common traits as Paije Hall, Courtnie Latham and Leslie Vorpahl bring individual success, team accomplishments and an athletic background to the Green Wave program.

All told, the threesome each earned all-state honors as prep seniors led their high school teams to a combined 314-60 overall record (.839) with 12 total trips to the playoffs. In addition, Hall's father, Carl, and uncle, Charlie, played football at Tulane and were drafted by NFL franchises while Vorpahl's father, Donnie, played college football at Texas Lutheran. Latham's grandfather, Cliff Johnson, and uncle, Mike Eastler, both played Major League Baseball and her uncle, Vince Young, was an All-American quarterback at Texas before embarking on a six-year NFL career.

Hall Out Due To Injury

Tulane will be without one of its freshmen during the 2013-14 season as rookie forward Paije Hall suffered a year-ending Achilles tendon injury during individual practices back in October. Hall will redshirt the season and return with four years of eligibility in 2014-15.

Wave Rolls Past UNO In Opener

Duru, Ebowmwoyi, Kaplan post double-doubles in 81-46 win

NEW ORLEANS—Three Green Wave players posted double-doubles - including 20-point, 15-rebound performance by Adesuwa Ebowmwoyi - as Tulane rolled past New Orleans, 81-46, in the season opener in Devlin Fieldhouse.

Tulane missed its first nine field goal attempts and trailed 8-7 just under seven minutes into the ballgame. From there, however, the Green Wave went on a 12-0 run over the next 4:06 to take control of the game and never looked back.

The Green Wave held a commanding 50-29 rebounding advantage and turned 23 offensive boards into 22 second-chance points. Tulane's defense forced 21 Privateer turnovers, including 11 via steal, and turned the UNO miscues into 24 points. The Wave also used its size inside to hold a 38-16 edge in points in the paint. Despite the Green Wave's slow start offensively, Tulane finished the day with a 48.5 field goal percentage (32-of-66), including a 19-of-30 performance (.633) in the second half.

Jamie Kaplan had a career-best 13 assists to go with 10 points and a steal. while Chinwe Duru added 11 points and 11 rebounds while sharing game-high block honors with Tiffany Dale at four apiece.

With her team down by one with 13:07 to play in the first half, Tierra Jones sparked the game-changing rally with a layup. Courtney Latham followed with a bucket of her own, Jones and Katye Magee combined for five free throws, and Ebowmwoyi capped the run with a layup to make it 18-8 at the 9:01 mark.

A free throw by UNO's Raven Coleman cut the deficit to nine on the Privateers ensuing possession, but a Leslie Vorpahl jumper the next time down the court pushed the advantage to 20-9 and the Green Wave led by double figures the rest of the night.

Duru hit a pair of free throws to open the second half and make it a 20-point affair and Tulane held a 57-37 lead with 9:54 to play in regulation. The Green Wave outscored UNO 24-9 the rest of the way.

Tulane Downs McNeese, 74-49

Jamie Kaplan ties career high with 20 points in the victory

NEW ORLEANS—Jamie Kaplan tied a career high with 20 points and Leslie Vorpahl added 14 as Tulane defeated McNeese State, 74-49, in Devlin Fieldhouse.

With the game tied at 37-all 2:21 into the second half, the Green Wave scored 15 unanswered points over the next 6:25 to take a commanding 52-37 lead they would not relinquish. Tulane outscore the Cowgirls 41-19 after halftime.

It was a back-and-forth battle early on as the team traded the first 24 points before the Cowgirls used a 5-0 run to turn a 12-all tie into a 17-12 advantage with 11 minutes to play in the first half. The McNeese State lead swelled to as many as six at 24-18 just under five and a half minutes later only to see Tulane answer with a pair of Vorpahl free throws and back-to-back 3-pointers by Katye Magee and Vorpahl to claim a 26-24 lead at the 3:35 mark. The two teams traded buckets over the next few possessions and the Green Wave scored the final three points of the stanza to take a 33-30 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Cowgirls rallied to tie the game twice in the early portion of the second half, but Kaplan sparked Tulane's game-changing run with a pair of free throws and a jumper to make it 41-37 with 14:39 to go in regulation. From there, Tierra Jones sandwiched a jumper and a pair of free throws around a Kaplan 3-point bucket and added a layup after a Vorpahl basket to cap the 15-0 charge.

McNeese State's Alaina Verdin halted the streak with a jumper three possessions later but the Cowgirls would get no closer than 12 the rest of the way. Tulane quieted any talks of a comeback as Chinwe Duru and Adesuwa Ebowmwoyi hit layups in consecutive trips down the court, Magee followed with her second 3-pointer of the night, and Kaplan sank a pair of free throws to give the Green Wave a 68-47 edge. An Amber Donnes layup made it a 19-point affair with 3:31 left to play, but that would be the Cowgirls last basket as Tulane scored the last six points of the contest to account for the final score.

Wave Dominates Southeastern, 80-52

Jamie Kaplan ties career high with 20 points in the victory

NEW ORLEANS—Six Green Wave players finished with double-figure scoring totals and Adesuwa Ebowmwoyi posted her second double-double of the year as Tulane rolled to a 80-52 win over Southeastern Louisiana in Devlin Fieldhouse.

The Wave scored the game's first 13 points and the advantage never dipped below seven the rest of the night. As a team, Tulane connected at a 44.7 percentage from the field (34-of-76), including a 17-of-32 showing (.531) in the second half. One of the big reasons for the lopsided score was a 51-31 rebounding advantage with 23 coming off the offensive glass.

Tiffany Dale scored the game's opening points with a layup 1:16 after the opening tip, but that was just the start of things to come for the Green Wave as Ebowmwoyi followed with a 3-pointer and both Jamie Kaplan and Dale hit consecutive layups over the next four possessions to put Tulane on top 13-0.

The Lady Lions did not score until the 14:10 mark when Annessa De La Cruz buried a 3-pointer and Southeastern Louisiana cut the deficit to seven on a trey by Adrina LaVern 1:47 later. That, however, would be as close as SLU would get the rest of the way. After trading the next four points, Tulane used a 12-4 run midway through the opening half to go up 27-12 and led by as many as 18 in the stanza when Kaplan nailed a jumper to make it 39-21 with 58 seconds before halftime.

Southeastern Louisiana scored the final three points of the period to send Tulane into the locker room with a 15-point lead. A Chinwe Duru layup and another Ebowmwoyi 3-pointer to open the second half made it a 20-point affair and the lead never dipped below 16 the rest of the contest. The Green Wave advantage swelled to as many as 32 at 71-39 with 7:59 to play and again at 80-48 at the one-minute mark. The Lady Lions' Aja Gibson hit back-to-back baskets on Southeastern Louisiana's next two possessions to close things out.

Win gives coach Lisa Stockton her 400th victory at Tulane

WILMINGTON, N.C.—Chinwe Duru scored a career-high 18 points, including 10 in the second half, as Tulane headed head coach Lisa Stockton her 400th win with the Green Wave courtesy of a 55-50 road decision over UNC-Wilmington at Trask Coliseum.

Coaching in her home state with family and friends on hand, the native of Greensboro, N.C., celebrated her homecoming in style as she is now 400-193 in her 20th season at Tulane. After running out to 25-plus points wins in the first three games of the season, Tulane found itself in unfamiliar territory as the Seahawks rallied from a double-figure second half deficit to take a one-point lead at 44-43 with 6:09 left to play.

From there, Duru sandwiched a three-point play and a layup around a bucket by Lelsie Vorpahl to give the Green Wave a 51-45 lead they would not relinquish. The Seahawks kept things interesting, but Tulane hit some key free throws down the stretch to come out on top.

It was a back-and-forth battle early on as the two teams battled to a pair of ties and the lead changed hands three times in the first nine-plus minutes of action. A Vorpahl 3-pointer turned a 10-8 deficit into an 11-10 lead and helped spark a 23-10 run over the next 9:23 to give the Green Wave an 11-point edge at 31-20.

A trey by UNC-Wilmington's D'Asia Cain closed out the first-half scoring and proved to be a sign of things to come after the break. Tulane stretched its lead back to double figures early in the second half and appeared to be in control holding a 40-27 lead with 13:36 left to play in regulation.

Things took downward turn for Tulane from there as UNC-Wilmington answered with a 17-3 run over the next 7:10 to take a 44-43 lead. During the Seahawks' run, the Green Wave went 0-for-6 from the field, committed five turnovers and their only points came via free throw during the Seahawks' game-changing rally.

Duru halted the skid with a jumper at the 6:09 mark, and after a UNCW game-tying free throw, added a layup plus an and-one free throw with 5:22 on the clock to put Tulane on top to stay.

The Green Wave stretched the lead to six twice - at 51-45 with 1:35 to go on a Duru jumper and against a 54-48 with 13 ticks remaining on a pair of Jamie Kaplan free throws.

Tulane Falls At N.C. State, 69-55

Vorpahl scores season-best 22, Blagg adds 10 off the bench

RALEIGH, N.C.—Leslie Vorpahl scored a career-high 22 points and Danielle Blagg added 10 in her first action of the season, but it was not enough as Tulane dropped 69-55 decision to North Carolina State in Reynolds Coliseum.

Vorpahl connected on 7-of-12 field goals, including a 2-of-4 performance from beyond the 3-point arc, and converted on all six of her free-throw opportunities. North Carolina State, however, countered with an inside/outside game that saw the Wolfpack outscored Tulane in the paint 20-14 while connecting on eight 3-pointers.

As a team, the Green Wave connected on 35.6 percent of the field goal attempts (16-of-45) while allowing the Wolfpack to hit 40.3 percent of their shots from the floor (25-of-62). Tulane had a solid performance from 3-point line with five treys on eight shots, and sank 18-of-21 free throws.

The difference in the game came in the paint where North Carolina State held a 39-33 advantage and turned 15 offensive boards into 16 second-chance points.

Vorpahl opened the scoring with a 3-pointer 53 seconds into the contest and the Green Wave hung tough early on, facing just a one-point deficit at 10-8 with 14:15 on the clock. From there, the Wolfpack went on a 15-5 run over the next 5:47 to stake N.C. State to a 25-14 lead.

Tulane cut the deficit down to six twice late in the first half, including at 29-23 following a pair of Vorpahl free throws with 37 seconds to play before the break. After holding N.C. State without a field goal for nearly a six-minute span late in the half, the Green Wave gave up an offensive rebound with 25 seconds to play in the frame and Len'Nique Brown buried a jumper from the top of the key as the buzzer sounded to make it 31-23 at the half.

Brown's bucket sparked an 18-6 Wolfpack rally which spanned both halves and give North Carolina State a 47-29 lead with 12:15 left to play. Tulane answered with a 10-2 run over the next 3:52 to make it a 49-39 affair, but that was as close as the Green Wave would get the rest of the way.

Wave Drop 89-66 Game To Ole Miss

Dale posts double-double with 17 points and 16 rebounds

NEW ORLEANS—Tiffany Dale posted a double-double with 17 points and a career-high 16 rebounds, but it was not enough as Tulane fell to Ole Miss, 89-66, in Devlin Fieldhouse.

The Rebels hit their first four shots to jump out to an early 10-4 lead and never trailed at any point in the contest. As a team, Tulane connected on season-low 34.5 percent of its field goals (20-of-58) while allowing Ole Miss to convert on 32-of-62 of its shots from the field (.516), including a 43.8 percent showing from beyond the 3-point arc (7-of-16).

Dale was one of three Tulane players to finish in double figures offensively as Danielle Blagg had 15 points off the bench and Jamie Kaplan added 10. Kaplan led the team with six assists while Leslie Vorpahl paced the defense with four steals.

Tulane took advantage of 20 personal fouls called against the Rebels as the Green Wave connected on 23-of-30 free throws. The game, however, came down to post play as Ole Miss outscored Tulane in the paint 38-22 and turned 13 offensive rebounds into 17 second-chance points.

Ole Miss scored the first six points of the ballgame on baskets by Shequilla Joseph, Tia Faleru and Valencia McFarland and the Rebels' lead never dipped below four the rest of the way. The Green Wave's first four points of the contest came via free throws and their first field goal did not come until the 14:54 mark when Dale hit a layup to make it 15-6.

Tulane hung tough for a while but with the score at 32-24 with 5:03 to go before the break, Ole Miss went on a 11-0 run over the next 2:44 to stretch the lead to 15 at 41-26. A pair of Jones free throws accounted for the final points of the half, and the Green Wave went into the locker room at the half down by 13.

The two teams traded the first eight points of the second stanza before Ole Miss used a 10-2 run to make it a 23-point affair at 55-32 with 14:09 to play. Tulane whittled the deficit down to 19 at 57-38 just over two and a half minutes later but could get no closer. A 3-pointer by Gracie Frizzell two possessions later made it 60-38 and the lead hovered in the mid-20s for the remainder of the ballgame.
