2022 AUBURN FOOTBALL RECAP

2022 FOOTBALL RECAP

>> The Auburn Tigers were 5-7 overall and 2-6 in SEC play during the 2022 season. The Tigers were 5-3 at Jordan-Hare Stadium and 0-4 away from Auburn.

Bryan Harsin (3-5) was the head coach through October 31; his record at Auburn was 9-12. Carnell Williams (2-2) served as interim head coach for the last four games of the season. Hugh Freeze was named as Auburn's next head coach on November 28.

POSTSEASON HONORS

>> Senior defensive edge Derick Hall was voted first team all-SEC by the league's coaches, and quarterback Robby Ashford was voted to the SEC all-freshman team.

Other all-SEC honors came for Hall (second team AP, Phil Steele; third team PFF); D.J. James (second team AP, PFF; third team Phil Steele), Colby Wooden (third team Phil Steele), Tank Bigsby (third team PFF all-SEC; fourth team Phil Steele) and Oscar Chapman (fourth team Phil Steele).

Anders Carlson, a finalist for the AFCA Good Works Team, the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy and the Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup, was part of the SEC Community Service Team. Derick Hall received the national Freddie Solomon Community Spirit Award.

Anders Carlson became the first three-time first team Academic All-American in Auburn football history. Five players earned CSC academic all-district recognition: Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Tyler Fromm, Jake Levant and Kilian Zierer.

ON OFFENSE

» Auburn has scored in 129 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.08 ppg (4,009 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak of not being shut out in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond on Oct. 4, 1980, in Doug Barfield's final season as the Tigers' head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Colby Wooden was SEC defensive lineman of the week with a 10-yard fourth-quarter strip sack and forced fumble in the Texas A&M win
- » Robby Ashford rushed for 108 yards and two scores at Mississippi State, the first Auburn quarterback to rush for 100 yards in a game since Nick Marshall at Mississippi State in 2014.

Ashford also ranked sixth in the SEC and 28th nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 13.11 yards per reception.

- » Auburn was third in the SEC in net punting at 42.40 yards, ranking ninth nationally; the Tigers ranked second in the SEC in punt return defense (4.10). Punter Oscar Chapman ranked third in the SEC in average (43.9) this season
- >> John Samuel Shenker holds the Auburn career record appearing in 62 career games

- » Butkus Award semifinalist Owen Pappoe finished with 256 career tackles, eighth-best among all Auburn players since 2000; his career high was 16 at Ole Miss this season
- >> Tank Bigsby cracked the Auburn career rushing top 10. The junior ranks seventh with 2,903 career yards and 25 career rushing scores. His eight 30+-yard rushes led the SEC this year
- First team all-SEC defender Derick Hall, a Jason Witten Man of the Year Award semifinalist, recorded 60 tackles, 11.0 TFL, 6.0 sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and six QB hurries this season
- Placekicker Anders Carlson was the only FBS player selected for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for efforts in community service and also as a finalist for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, awarded to the top student-athlete in college football

STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE: ACADEMICS

THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn in-season roster, 17 players (second most in the SEC) had already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

CSC ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson became the first three-time first team CSC Academic All-American in Auburn history with his 2022 selection. Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA with a 4.00 graduate GPA.

Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors for 2021, only the second time that Auburn had two first-team honorees in the prestigious program; LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billings, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These students are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Undergraduates earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. Football had 17 players honored in 2021-22, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Jackson Billings, Cort Bradley, Oscar Chapman, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Jarquez Hunter, Jackson Kelly, Jake Levant, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith and Kyle Vaccarella.

- >> The Tigers rushed for more yards (318) than any opponent against a Nick Saban-coached Alabama team since Saban arrived in Tuscaloosa in 2007 and Auburn's average of 7.4 yards per carry was the most by an SEC opponent, and second among all opponents (7.7 by Georgia Southern, 2011), vs. Alabama under Saban.
- y Junior tailback Tank Bigsby posted the second-highest rushing total of his career with 179 yards on 20 carries at Ole Miss, including TDs of 50 (career long) and 2 yards.

Bigsby got his 2022 campaign off to a productive start with 147 rushing yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season opener against Mercer. He added 121 yards rushing in the win over Texas A&M and finished this season with 963 rushing yards.

The 19th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 2,000 career yards, he ranks seventh with 2,903 career yards and 25 career rushing scores (eighth all-time at Auburn). Bigsby's 13 career 100-yard rushing games are tied for third in program history.

Bigsby's 30 receptions are sixth-most by a running back in a season in Auburn history and the most since Onterio McCalebb caught 32 passes in 2011.

With 1,099 yards last season, Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of 2021.

In 2020, Bigsby was the SEC Freshman of the Year; his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. He was the first Tiger to average 6.0 yds/carry since James Bostic in 1993.

>> Jarquez Hunter opened his sophomore campaign by rushing for three touchdowns on only eight carries against Mercer. It was Hunter's first career game with multiple rushing TDs. Hunter's three rushing scores against the Bears matched his total in 13 games as a freshman.

He was the first Auburn player to rush for three TD since JaTarvious Whitlow against Mississippi State in 2019.

Hunter (3 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) and Bigsby (2 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) were the first Auburn teammates to rush for multiple touchdowns in the same game since Whitlow and Joey Gatewood each rushed for a pair of scores against Kent State in 2019.

Hunter added another rushing score against San Jose' State and scored his first receiving touchdown of the season on a 22-yard throw from Robby Ashford against Penn State.

At Georgia, Hunter's 62-yard touchdown reception from Robby Ashford was the Tigers' longest play of the season to date. His rushing scores against Arkansas and Mississippi State give him six rushing scores this season, along with two touchdown catches.

Hunter' posted 121 rushing yards in the win over Texas A&M, added 109 against Western Kentucky and rushed for 134 yards at Alabama, giving him five career 100-yard games.

Hunter now has 1,269 career rushing yards

to rank 41st among all Auburn career rushers.

He is the first Auburn running back with a 60+yard reception since Harold Joiner recorded a 78-yard reception from Bo Nix against Ole Miss in 2019 and the only Tiger running back with multiple 60+-yard receptions in a season since at least 1996.

Hunter added his first career TD pass against Western Kentucky, a 20-yard completion to Koy Moore.

Nobby Ashford ranked sixth in the SEC and 28th nationally in passing yards per completion, averaging 13.11 yards per reception.

Ashford and Georgia State's Darren Grainger were the only FBS quarterbacks with at least 11 20-yard runs and four 50-yard passes this season.

- Ashford threw for 285 yards and a TD on 24-33 passes and added 87 yards on 19 carries against Arkansas. Ashford now has two of the top seven passing performances by a freshman in Auburn history (also LSU, 337 yards) and he joins Bo Nix as the only Tiger freshman quarterbacks to have two 260+-yard passing performances against SEC opponents.
- » Ashford rushed for 108 yards and two scores at Mississippi State, the first Auburn quarterback to rush for 100 yards since Nick Marshall (100) at Mississippi State in 2014, and added 121 yards at Alabama, the most by an Auburn quarterback in the Iron Bowl. Ashford is the first Tiger to rush for two touchdowns in an Iron Bowl since Carnell Williams in 2003.
- » Among Auburn freshman career records, Ashford finished third in passing yardage (1,608), third in pass attempts (250), third in pass completions (123), second in rushing TD (7), third in TD passes (7), and sixth in rushing yardage (710).
- >> Tight end John Samuel Shenker is the Auburn recordholder for career catches by a tight end with 68, passing Cooper Wallace (63 catches from 2002-05).

Shenker finished second in career tight end receiving yardage at 779, behind only Wallace (829 yards).

Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn TE season record.

Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU last season was the first 100yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had five catches this season at Georgia.

>> Junior Ja'Varrius Johnson led Auburn with 117 yards on four receptions in the Tigers' season-opening win over Mercer. It was Johnson's second career 100-yard receiving game (107 yards vs. Mississippi State in 2021).

Johnson's 117 receiving yards were the most by an Auburn player since Anthony Schwartz with 123 yards and a TD on four catches against LSU in 2020.

Johnson, who scored the Tigers' lone TD against Texas A&M on a 16-yard pass from Robby Ashford and added a 20-yard TD pass from Ashford at Alabama, ranked third in the SEC and 14th nationally in yards per reception (18.96).

>> Ja'Varrius Johnson now has 47 career receptions for 767 yards. Shedrick Jackson finished with 66 career receptions for 874 yards.

FOR THE DEFENSE

With a team-best eight tackles at Georgia, Butkus Award semifinalist Owen Pappoe became the 17th Auburn player since 2000 with more than 200 career tackles.

Pappoe finished with 256 career stops and leads the Tigers with 92 tackles this year; his career high came against Ole Miss this season with 16 stops.

>> Auburn's defense has allowed only 31 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 78 games.

Auburn held the opponent scoreless in the first quarter in seven of 11 games this season.

The Tigers held Texas A&M scoreless in the first half, the first shutout for a first half since the 2021 Alabama game.

- >> Prior to allowing a 1-yard rushing TD against San Jose' State, Auburn had held its opponents without a rushing touchdown in six straight games dating back through the 2021 season, the longest such streak for the Tigers since not allowing a rushing TD in eight straight games during 2016.
- Derick Hall was the SEC defensive lineman of the week for his play in the overtime win against Missouri. Hall had three tackles for loss, two sacks, a 39-yard interception and six tackles overall in the 17-14 Auburn victory. He also earned Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week honors and was a Lott IMPACT Trophy player of the week finalist.

Hall, who was a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Man of the Year Award and was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award mid-season watch list, has 58 tackles, 11.0 TFL, 6.0 sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery this season.

>> Hall has 18.5 career sacks, all in his last 31 games dating back to the middle of 2020.

Hall recorded six tackles, 3.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks and registered his first career interception against Missouri, the first Auburn player with a sack and INT in the same game since Smoke Monday in the 2019 Iron Bowl.

Hall was fourth in the SEC with 12.0 TFL and 6.0 sacks this season. Hall has 29.5 career tackles for loss and 147 career tackles.

Colby Wooden was ninth in the SEC with 11.5 TFL and 6.0 sacks. Wooden has 152 career tackles, 15.0 career sacks and 30.0 career TFL.

Eku Leota, who recorded at least one tackle for a loss in five straight games dating back to the final game of 2021 (6.0 TFL during streak), had 15.0 TFL and 9.0 sacks during his Auburn career. Adding two seasons at Northwestern, he had 25.0 TFL and 15.5 sacks.

Nineteen Auburn defenders had a hand in at least one TFL this season; 12 had sacks to their credit.

- » Colby Wooden was named SEC defensive lineman of the week with a 10-yard fourth-quarter strip sack and forced fumble in the Texas A&M win.
- >> Linebacker Cam Riley's 16 tackles against Mercer were a career high; the junior led the team in tackles for the first time in his career. Riley had the most tackles by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain had 17 tackles against Texas A&M in 2020.
- Auburn is 66-33 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 40-12 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 13-16 when it fails to force a turnover.
- The Ole Miss game was the first time since the 2020 Georgia game (Jamien Sherwood 14, Jordyn Peters 13, K.J. Britt 12, Zakoby McClain 11) four Auburn players registered double-digit

tackles: Owen Pappoe (16), Donovan Kaufman (11), Derick Hall (10), Wesley Steiner (10).

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 26-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, the latest being D.J. James' interception vs. Western Kentucky.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Punter Oscar Chapman ranked third in the SEC in average (43.9) this season and had 12 kicks of 50+ yards.

Chapman averaged 45.9 yards on eight punts against Missouri, including a 61-yard boot that was his longest kick of the season. He was recognized as one of Ray's 8 by the Ray Guy Award for that performance, and received the same Ray's 8 recognition vs. LSU, with a 46.2-yard average on four punts.

He also received Ray's 8 honors for his work at Ole Miss, averaging 49.3 yards on three punts with a long kick of 57 yards.

Chapman had a season-high nine punts at Georgia, averaging 44.7 yards with a long kick of 56 yards.

- » Auburn ranked third in the SEC in net punting at 42.40 yards, ranking ninth nationally. The Tigers were second in the SEC in punt return defense (4.10).
- >> Freshman Alex McPherson was 6-7 this season on field goal attempts. His 51-yarder against Western Kentucky was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2019. McPherson became Auburn's first freshman kicker to make a 50+ yarder since Anders Carlson did so twice in 2018.
- Neionte Scott ranked fourth in the SEC with an 11.2-yard punt return average, ranking 18th nationally. Jarquez Hunter was seventh in the SEC in kickoff return average at 21.57 yards per return.
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (178) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- >> Auburn has seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.
- Nicker Anders Carlson ranks second in Auburn career scoring with 410 points. A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson finished third in career PAT made (173) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (79).

He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

Carlson ranks fifth in SEC career scoring (410), fifth in SEC career field goals made (79) and 11th in SEC career PAT.

- Carlson, whose older brother Daniel (a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist) holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders, had five career FG of at least 50 yards:
 - 53 Washington (2018); Liberty (2018)

- >> Carlson had nine career games with at least three field goals:

With 884 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

- Carlson, a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, was also one of 15 finalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy. Celebrating its 33rd year, the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.
- Team captains for the 2022 season were defensive lineman Derick Hall, linebacker Owen Pappoe and tight end John Samuel Shenker.

Pappoe, also a 2021 captain, is the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45).

Since 2001, Auburn is 164-37 (.816) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 220-45-1 (.829) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 560-65-9 (.890) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 352-12 (.967) when scoring 30 points, 178-3 (.984) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

- >> Auburn outscored its last four opponents 70-33 in the second half while Carnell Williams was interim head coach after being outscored 121-78 in the second half in the first eight games. In the last four games, the Tigers outgained opponents 842-691 in the second half (717-185 on the ground).
- Auburn has an all-time record of 343-91-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .786 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally. There have been 63 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest vs. Penn State, LSU and Texas A&M this season.
- » In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 260-71-6 (.783). Before the Penn State game, Auburn had won 17 straight home games against nonconference opponents dating back to 2016.
- On the 2022 Auburn roster, 51 players have at least one college start to their credit, 29 on offense and 24 on defense.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 432 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 343, losing 91 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .785 against some of the best teams in college football.

Generating explosive plays on the ground and in the air, Auburn kicked off the 2022 season by defeating Mercer 42-16 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The big-play Tigers produced seven plays of 20 yards or more

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives with Jarquez Hunter scoring the season's first points on a 19-yard run on the Tigers' first drive.

Auburn gained 88 yards in two plays on its second possession on a 49-yard run by quarterback Robby Ashford and a 39-yard pass from T.J. Finley to Ja'Varrius Johnson. Auburn made it 14-0 on Finley's 2-yard touchdown pass to John Samuel

Hunter's 2-yard touchdown put the Tigers on top 21-0 early in the second quarter with 84,562 in attendance. Bigsby, who led Auburn with 147 rushing yards on 16 carries, scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 28-0 lead with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

Mercer capitalized on an Auburn interception to score on a 5-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the half.

Derick Hall recorded a third-down sack to force a punt in the third quarter. Ashford threw a 56-yard pass to Johnson to

set up Hunter's third touchdown, a 1-yarder that gave Auburn a 35-7 lea'd before lightning within eight miles of Pat Dye Field delayed the game late in the third quarter.

The Bears added nine fourth-quarter points on a field goal and a touchdown with 25 seconds remaining

Linebacker Cam Riley led Auburn with a career-high 15 tackles, exceeding his 2021 season total of 14.

Johnson made four receptions for 117 yards, averaging 29.3 yards per catch.
Ashford, a redshirt freshman, produced 168 yards of total offense, completing 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards while rushing for 68 yards on six carries.

Trailing 10-7 at halftime, Auburn went for it on fourth-and-3 from San Jose' State's 46-yard-line. On fourth-and-3, T.J. Fin-Iralling 10-7 at hairtime, Auburn went for it on fourth-and-3 from San Jose State's 46-yard-line. On fourth-and-3, I.J. Fin-ley fumbled a snap, recovered and threw to Tank Bigsby for 11 yards to San Jose' State's 35-yard-line. Bigsby rushed 19 yards to the 1, then scored on the next play to give Auburn a 14-10 lead early in the third quarter. Keionte Scott's 22-yard punt return led to a 45-yard field goal from Anders Carlson that put the Tigers ahead 17-10 with 4:48 left in the third. San Jose' State answered with a 27-yard field goal at the start of the fourth quarter, trimming the Tigers'

lead to 17-13

Robby Ashford raced 30 yards on the first play of Auburn's next possession, crossing midfield. Finley fired to Ja'Varrius Johnson for 24 yards to the 4, then scored on a quarterback keeper to give Auburn a double-digIt lead at 24-13 with 12:45 left in the game.

The Spartans made it a one-possession game with their third field goal with 2:11 left but their on-side kick went out of bounds and Auburn rushed for a first down and ran out the clock.

Finley completed 13 of 20 passes for 167 yards. Ashford led Auburn's rushing attack with 61 yards on seven carries. Bigsby and the complete of the completeadded 51 yards on 13 carries while pacing the Tigers with four receptions for 29 yards. Derick Hall led Auburn with eight tackles while Owen Pappoe added seven.

Auburn's defense provided a spark while the offense struggled in the first quarter. On the opening possession, Colby Wooden recorded the first of six first-half Tiger tackles for loss. Marcus Harris made three of them, including a sack. Eku Leota and Scott also had sacks in the first half.

After Auburn's second interception at the end of the first quarter on the Tigers' 28-yard-line, the Spartans had first-and-goal at the 1, but Auburn's defense kept San Jose State out of the end zone, forcing a 33-yard field goal.

Trailing 3-0, Auburn answered with a 75-yard drive on nine plays. Freshman running back Damari Alston rushed for 35 yards on the second play, Auburn's biggest gain of the game. On fourth-and-4, Finley improvised, avoiding a rusher while finding John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards to move the chains. One play later, Finley and Shenker teamed up again for 20 yards to the Spartans' 7.

From there, Jarquez Hunter started running to his left, then cut up the middle for his fourth touchdown of the season to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 6:31 remaining in the second quarter.

San Jose' State regained the lead, driving 75 yards on 12 plays and scoring on a 1-yard touchdown run to go ahead 10-7 with 58 seconds left in the half. Auburn held the Spartans to 54 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.9 yards per rush.

No. 22 Penn State decisively won the red zone and turnover battles Saturday to defeat Auburn 41-12 in the first SEC-Big Ten matchup in Jordan-Hare Stadium history.

Jarquez Hunter leaped a defender on the way to his fifth touchdown of the season on a 22-yard pass from Robby Ashford

in the fourth quarter to account for Auburn's only TD.

Three Auburn first-and-goals netted only a pair of Anders Carlson field goals while Penn State was 5-for-5 in the red zone, forced four turnovers and recorded six sacks without allowing either.

Auburn's defense made its presence felt on the opening series when Owen Pappoe delivered a big hit on Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford, causing a fumble that rolled out of bounds. On the next play, the Tigers stopped Clifford's quarterback sneak for no gain on fourth-and-1 giving Auburn possession at Penn State's 47.

Clifford's 34-yard pass to Mitchell Tinsley gave the Nittany Lions first-and-goal at Auburn's 7-yard-line. One play later, he scored on a quarterback draw to put Penn State ahead 7-3 with 4:21 remaining in the first quarter.

In a most improbable ending, Cayden Bridges recovered a fumble in the end zone after Anders Carlson kicked a field goal to give Auburn a 17-14 overtime victory Saturday on Homecoming at Jordan-Hare Stadium

After Carlson connected from 39 yards on the opening possession of OT, Missouri's Nathanial Peat raced 20 yards but fumbled while reaching for the goal line, with Bridges recovering in the back of the end zone to secure Auburn's victory.

With a minute and half remaining in the fourth quarter, Missouri stopped Auburn on fourth-and-1 at the visiting Tigers'

29-yard-line, then hit a 39-yard pass play to Auburn's 3-yard line, but Mizzou missed a 26-yard field goal as time expired, sending the game to overtime tied 14-14.

After Colby Wooden's sack forced a three-and-out on the game's opening possession, the Tigers turned back the clock

with a 14-play, all rush, touchdown drive that consumed nearly half of the first quarter with 85,750 enjoying a sunny fall afternoon at Pat Dye Field. Tank Bigsby twice moved the chains on fourth-and-short, and first-time starter Robby Ashford scored on an 11-yard quar-

terback draw, his first career rushing TD for a 7-0 Auburn lead.

Derick Hall produced Auburn's first takeaway of the season, intercepting a deflected pass and returning it 19 yards to Missouri's 24-yard-line. Ashford connected with Omari Kelly for 12 yards on third-and-6, then completed to Camden Brown to set up Bigsby's

3-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead late in the first quarter. Koy Moore led Auburn with 74 receiving yards on four catches.

Missouri evened the score in the second quarter, scoring on a 9-yard rush to cap 54-yard drive and a Brady Cook quarter back sneak on fourth-and-goal from inside the 1-yard line with 30 seconds left in the half after a 79-yard drive. Auburn forced five three-and-outs in the second half while shutting out Missouri after the second quarter.

Auburn was plus-two on turnovers thanks to Hall's interception and Bridges' game-ending fumble recovery.

Trailing by four points with five minutes left in the fourth quarter, Donovan Kaufman forced a fumble that Jayson Jones recovered on Auburn's 32-yard line. Needing a touchdown to take the lead, Tank Bigsby rushed for 23 yards across midfield for a promising start to a potential game-winning drive. Jarquez Hunter then picked up a first down at LSÚ's 35, but the Tigers would get no closer. LSU's Greg Brooks Jr. made the Bengal Tigers' fourth takeaway, intercepting Ashford's pass and returning it 30 yards to Auburn's 45. LSU (4-1, 2-0) picked up a first down and ran out the clock

Leading 17-14 at the half, Auburn forced a three-and-out to start the second half, but LSU stopped the Tigers on fourth down and drove 63 yards on seven plays to take a 21-17 lead on John Emery Jr.'s 20-yard run with 3:32 left in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, Auburn drove 65 yards to LSU's 5-yard line, but on second-and-goal from the 10, LSU inter-

cepted Koy Moore's reverse pass, Auburn's second turnover. A muffed punt with 5:31 left in the game accounted for Auburn's third turnover.

Auburn built a 17-0 first-half lead with Ashford throwing for 247 yards and two touchdowns.

The Tigers scored on the opening drive by twice converting on third down, first with Ashford finding Moore for 10 yards on third-and-6, then scrambling and hitting Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 53-yard touchdown to put Auburn up 7-0 in the first two

Late in the opening quarter, LSU's punt pinned Auburn at its 1-yard line but the Tigers drove 99 yards on six plays to take a 14-0 lead. Ashford escaped LSU's pass rush and threw to Jarquez Hunter, who raced 40 yards after the catch for a 61-yard gain. On the next play, freshman Camden Brown leaped in the end zone to snag Ashford's pass for his first career touchdown. Ashford finished with 337 yards and two TDs, completing 19-of-38 passes.

Auburn extended its lead to 17-0 on Anders Carlson's 29-yard field goal with 9:38 remaining in the first half.

LSU scored a defensive touchdown midway through the second quarter when Jay Ward recovered a fumble and returned it 23 yards to trim Auburn's lead to 17-7.

The Bengal Tigers made it 17-14 with 15 seconds left in the half when quarterback Jayden Daniels scored on a 1-yard run to

cap an 11-play, 77-yard drive.

Hunter caught a short pass and spun away from two defenders, racing down the left sideline for a 62-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Trailing 14-0 to start the third quarter, Auburn pressured Georgia quarterback Stetson Bennett on third-and-7 with Colby

Wooden forcing and recovering a fumble at UGA's 19-yard line. Anders Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal to get the Tiger's on the scoreboard at the 11:51 mark of the third quarter.

Georgia answered with its longest drive of the game, moving 81 yards on 11 plays, taking a 21-3 lead on Daijun Edwards' 2-yard touchdown run, his second score of the game.

Trailing 14-3 late in the second quarter after two KJ Jefferson touchdown runs, Auburn drove 93 yards in five plays, with Robby Ashford rushing for 34 yards on third-and-6, then passing to Bigsby for 14 yards. Bigsby raced 41 yards down the side-

line for his seventh touchdown of the season to trim the Razorbacks' lead to 14-10 with 3:43 left in the half.

Arkansas kicked a field goal to lead 17-10 but Auburn drove 52 yards in seven plays in 47 seconds, scoring on Anders Carlson's 24-yard field goal with three seconds left to pull Auburn within four at 17-13 at the half.

Needing a touchdown to take the lead to start the second half, Auburn drove to the Razorbacks' 28-yard line but a thirddown sack and a blocked 52-yard field goal attempt ended the drive with no points

Arkansas (5-3, 2-3) capitalized on the momentum by scoring 21 unanswered points on three consecutive touchdown drives of 64, 94 and 84 yards, respectively.

Jefferson's 11-yard touchdown pass to Jason Haselwood gave the Razorbacks a 24-13 lead after the blocked kick. Two

touchdown runs by Rashod Dubinion extended the advantage to 38-13 in the middle of the fourth quarter.

Ashford threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Camden Brown in the fourth quarter. Ashford and Brown connected for another 50-yard completion to the Razorbacks' 2-yard line in the final minute. The true freshman receiver led Auburn with four catches for 83 yards and a touchdown.

Jarquez Hunter scored on a 1-yard touchdown run with four seconds left to account for the final score.

Ashford completed 24 of 33 passes for 285 yards and a touchdown while leading the Tigers with 87 rushing yards on 19

Raheim Sanders, the SEC's leading rusher, gained 171 yards on 16 carries, including a 76-yarder after an Oscar Chapman punt pinned Arkansas at its 6-yard line

Owen Pappoe and Colby Wooden led the Tigers with eight tackles apiece, with Pappoe adding 1.5 sacks while Wooden had a sack among his two tackles for loss.

Auburn overcame a 21-point deficit and twice took the lead in the fourth quarter before falling to Mississippi State 39-33 in overtime Saturday at Davis Wade Stadium.

Jo'quavious Marks ended the game by scoring a 5-yard rushing touchdown on MSU's third play in OT after a pass interference penalty gave the Bulldogs first down at the 5. Auburn got the ball first in overtime and gained 4 yards before missing a 38-yard field goal attempt.

Robby Ashford rushed for 108 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries and Auburn held the Bulldogs to minus-17 rushing

yards through three quarters.

With Auburn trailing 24-19 In the fourth quarter, Marcus Harris' first-down sack led to a three-and-out that gave Auburn possession at its 40-yard line. The Tigers drove 60 yards on four consecutive rushing plays, with Tank Bigsby racing down the sideline for a 41-yard touchdown that put Auburn ahead 25-24 with 6:36 to play.
Will Rogers' third touchdown pass, a 33-yarder to Rara Thomas, reclaimed a 30-25 lead for Mississippi State with 3:49 to

Áuburn answered again, driving 75 yards in eight plays and taking a 33-30 lead with 1:05 remaining on Jarquez Hunter's 8-yard touchdown run and Ashford's two-point run.

Mississippi State started its next drive at midfield after a short kick and a personal foul penalty on Auburn, driving 24 yards and tying the score at 33-33 on a 44-yard field goal with 29 seconds remaining. The Bulldogs recovered a deflected squib kickoff but missed a 56-yard field goal attempt at the end of regulation to send the game to overtime.

Auburn forced three turnovers but produced only three points after the takeaways

Trailing 24-6 at halftime, Auburn took advantage of a snap fumbled by MSU's punter that gave the Tigers possession at the Bulldogs' 16-yard line early in the third quarter. Two plays later, Ashford scrambled for a 20-yard touchdown that trimmed Mississippi State's lead to 24-12. Auburn went for two but the Bulldogs intercepted Ashford's pass.

Tank Bigsby and Jarquez Hunter both rushed for 121 yards, Auburn kept Texas A&M out of the end zone for 58 minutes, and freshman Alex McPherson kicked two field goals to lead the Tigers to a 13-10 victory Saturday at sold out Jordan-Hare Stadium, the first win for interim head coach Carnell Williams.

Leading 10-3 in the fourth quarter, Morris Joseph Jr. recovered Colby Wooden's strip sack at Texas A&M's 32-yard line, leading to McPherson's 26-yard field goal and a 10-point Auburn lead with 3:02 to play.

Tied 17-17 at the half, Auburn outscored the Hilltoppers 24-0 in the second half, putting the game out of reach on D.J. James' 22-yard interception return for a touchdown with 6:15 to play.

Jaylin Simpson recorded the first of two Auburn turnovers, intercepting a pass to end Western Kentucky's first drive of the

second half After the teams exchanged punts, Bigsby rushed twice for 20 yards, then Robby Ashford faked a jet sweep pitch and threw

deep to Ja'Varrius Johnson for 29 yards to set up Alex McPherson's 28-yard field goal to give Auburn a 20-17 lead.

The Tigers added to their lead late in third quarter on a seven-play, 78-yard drive. On third-and-4 from Auburn's 46-yard line, Ashford faked a toss to the right and ran to his left for 19 yards to WKU's 35.

From there, Ashford tossed left to Bigsby, who followed blocks by left tackle Kilian Zierer and fullback John Samuel Shen-ker 35 yards down the sideline to put Auburn head 27-17 with 1:08 remaining in the third quarter.

After stopping WKU on fourth-and-23 at Auburn's 38-yard line, the Tigers drove 62 yards on four plays, with Bigsby and Hunter both passing the century mark on the drive. One play after Bigsby's 23-yard gain, Hunter raced 40 yards to his right on a toss sweep to give Auburn a 34-17 lead before James' pick-six 93 seconds later concluded the scoring.

Bigsby rushed 18 times for 110 yards and two touchdowns while Hunter gained 109 yards on 13 carries, rushing for a TD

bigsby roshed to times for in yards and two touchdowns while number gained 10-9 yards on its carries, rushing for a 1D while throwing a touchdown pass.

Auburn scored on its first possession, marching 68 yards on 13 plays and scoring on Bigsby's 1-yard run. On fourth-and-3 from WKU's 44, Ashford threw to Shedrick Jackson for 9 yards to extend the drive.

The Tigers led 10-0 after the first quarter thanks to McPherson's 51-yard field goal. Ashford was 5-for-5 for 50 yards on third downs in the opening quarter, picking up three first downs in the process.

After a Western Kentucky field goal, Auburn extended its lead to 17-3 midway through the second quarter when Ashford

pitched to Hunter, who threw a 20-yard touchdown pass to Koy Moore.

The Hilltoppers scored twice before halftime to tie it at 17-17 on a pair of touchdown passes from Austin Reed to Josh Si-

mon, the latter coming with six seconds left in the half.

Before the game, the Tigers honored 24 seniors. Two walk-on seniors figured in the game's final plays, with walk-on Hayden Brice sacking WKU's backup quarterback on fourth down and Auburn quarterback Trey Lindsey taking a knee to run out the clock. Cam Riley led Auburn with eight tackles. The Tigers held WKU to 106 yards in the second half.

Auburn rushed for 318 yards, with Jarquez Hunter netting 134 yards on 11 carries to give Auburn two 100-yard rushers for the third consecutive game for the first time in program history. Tank Bigsby added 63 yards on 15 carries as the Tigers averaged 7.4 yards on 43 rushes. Hunter and Bigsby each surpassed the 100-yard mark in Auburn's wins over Texas A&M and Wester 100 to 100 t Western Kentucky.

After Auburn's defense forced a punt on Alabama's first possession, the Tigers drove 80 yards on six plays, taking a 7-0 lead on Ashford's 24-yard touchdown run. Alabama answered with consecutive touchdown drives sandwiched between an Auburn three-and-out, going ahead 14-7 on Bryce Young's 10-yard pass to Jase McClellan.

A promising Auburn drive ended with a fumble that gave Alabama possession near midfield. The Crimson Tide scored in four plays, taking a 21-7 lead on the first play of the second quarter.

Auburn responded with a 10-play, 75-yard drive, scoring on Ashford's 20-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Varrius Johnson, who

made a sensational over-the-shoulder catch on a perfect throw to narrow Alabama's advantage to 21-14.

After an offensive holding penalty, Alabama faced third-and-19 on its 25-yard line, but Young threw for 39 yards to Kendrick Law and the Crimson Tide scored two plays later on Young's 32-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Corey Brooks to cap a 92-yard drive. Late in the half, the officials ruled Auburn muffed a punt return at Alabama's 37, leading to a 27-yard touchdown pass on a screen for a 35-14 halftime lead.

Young, the reigning Heisman Trophy winner, completed 20 of 30 passes for 343 yards, three touchdowns and an interception as Alabama had 10 pass plays of 15 or more yards. Alabama scored on the opening possession of the second half to go ahead 42-14.

Auburn drove 75 yards and Ashford scored on a 14-yard quarterback draw on third-and-goal midway through the third quarter to cut Alabama's lead to 42-21.

Alex McPherson kicked a pair of fourth-quarter field goals, from 32 and 39 yards respectively, for Auburn's final scores. Auburn shut out Alabama for23 minutes of game action in the second half unilt Jahmyr Gibbs capped the scoring with a

24-yard touchdown run with 1:48 to play after Alabama recovered Auburn's onside kick.

Owen Pappoe stopped a late Alabama drive with his second career interception at Auburn's 18-yard line. Cam Riley led the Tigers with 12 tackles while Pappoe added 10 in his final game.
