## Tiger Headlines

The Auburn volleyball team is in its 20th year of existence holds a 312-307 (.504) record... Laura Farina enters her fourth season at the helm of the Tigers, owning an 30-75 (.286) record at AU ... Last season the Tigers competed in the SEC Tournament for the first time since 1999 ... AU has six freshmen and a junior added to the mix this season.

## Who's on the Schedule This Week

The Tigers conclude the regular season on the road this weekend with matches at South Carolina on Friday at the Volleyball Competition Facility (6 p.m. CT) and Sunday afternoon (1:30 p.m.) in the Stokley Athletics Center on the Tennessee campus.

## Recapping Last Weekend

For 2005 seniors Jennifer Amobi and Bailey Veit, last weekend was the final time for the pair to compete in Auburn. On Friday evening the duo was honored following the four-game match against Georgia. AU kept it close with the Bulldogs and won game three (30-24, 30-27, 17-30, 30-23). On Sunday afternoon with TV cameras rolling, the Tigers met its highest ranked opponent of the season, #6 Florida. The Gators quickly picked up games the first two games but Auburn came out strong in game three, winning 30-24. This was the first time AU has won a game against UF since the 1999 season and it marked the first game won by AU head coach Laura Farina. Florida ended up victorious in the end (30-16, 30-19, 24-30, 30-16).

## Series History

Auburn will look to pick up its seventh all-time win over South Carolina on Friday as the Gamecocks have the series lead 12-6. The last time AU defeated South Carolina was the 1995 match in Auburn. AU has been more successful when playing in Columbia as the Tigers have won four of nine meetings.

The Tigers and Vols have met 23 times since 1987 and UT holds the series advantage, 14-9, over Auburn. Tennessee has won in every meeting since the 1998 match in Auburn. Prior to this, AU had claimed the previous five matches.

Tiger head coach Laura Farina will look to pick her first win over both Tennessee and South Carolina this weekend. In the team's first meeting this season in Auburn, the Gamecocks and Lady Vols won in four.

## Veit Inches Close to 1,000-career Dig Mark

Senior libero Bailey Veit jumped up two spots to No. 6 all-time for digs after posting 30 last weekend. For her career she has accumulated 978 and needs just 22 more to become just the sixth AU player to reach the 1,000 mark.

After last season, Veit was No. 7 all-time for DPG. If the season were over now she would be No. 4 on this list with 2.79 DPG for her career.

## Bosler on the Books

Junior Julie Bosler moves up to fifth on the all-time career solo blocks list with 59. Bosler needs only two more to move into fourth place. With six more blocks, Bosler could move into the all-time total blocks list, overtaking Sarah Watson (1992-95) who has 226. Bosler has 220 career total blocks (82 this season).

## Sixth-Sense

In Auburn's final home match, sophomore Rachel Shanks turned in her sixth double-double of the season - this time with 10 kills and 13 digs. Her other five this season were at Arkansas (11 kills/15 digs), at Alabama (10 kills/13 digs), vs. Arkansas (15 kills/13 digs), vs. Alabama A&M (12 kills/13 digs) and vs. Georgia Southern (21 kills/13 digs).

## Keeping the Streak Alive

Sophomore middle blocker Whitney Jacob continues her streak of starting every match since joining the program in 2005. Jacob started all 27 matches last season and has continued this into this season with 22 consecutive starts. Jacob currently leads the team in service aces with 36 in 2005.

#### Scouting South Carolina

On a five-match losing streak (as of Nov. 8), the Gamecocks are fighting for a spot in the SEC Championships and currently stand at 10-13 (3-10 SEC). The last win for the Gamecocks was in Auburn on Oct. 16.

The Gamecocks have been a strong blocking team this season and are ranked No. 4 in the SEC in blocks for all matches (247.5). For SEC matches only, the team is fifth in the league with 2.65 BPG. S.C. has also been successful in serving and has tossed up 130 total aces this season - making them No. 5 in the SEC.

Nicole Miller leads their blocking with 89 total blocks this season and is followed closely by Shonda Cole with 72. Cole leads the team in kills with 360 (4.29 KPG). The Gamecocks defense is headed up by Sarah Morgan who has recorded 244 (2.87 DPG) digs this season.

#### Scouting Tennessee

The Lady Vols enter Wednesday's match against South Carolina with a 16-7 (10-3 SEC) overall record and are second in the Eastern Division. The team is currently on a five-match win streak dating back to Oct. 21. The biggest news coming out of Knoxville was the Lady Vol's upset of then-No. 4 ranked Florida in five games on Oct. 30 (30-22, 32-30, 19-30, 37-39, 15-12).

On the national scene, the Lady Vols are 24th in BPG with Sarah Blum leading the way with a No. 25 ranking with 1.46 BPG. As a group, the Lady Vols are ranked in the top-five in the SEC in every category except service aces. This includes having the third highest hitting percentage (.241 all matches, .230 SEC).

Kristen Andre leads the league in hitting percentage (all matches) with a .384 average and is second in SEC matches with a .374 average. Yuliya Stoyanova has posted the most kills on the team with 326 (4.41 KPG) and Amy Morris is the leader in digs with 321 (4.79 DPG). Sarah Blum is the team leader in blocks with 98 this season (1.46 BPG).

#### Auburn in the SEC

In SEC matches only, the Tigers are No. 6 in aces (61) and digs (758, 15.16 DPG). Auburn also holds the No. 7 spot in blocks with 2.44 BPG. Three Tigers are ranked sixth in different categories for SEC matches - Jennifer Amobi (kills, 197), Joanna Pappas (assists, 339) and Whitney Jacob (service aces, 22).

**Quoting Head Coach Laura Farina ....**

**On the final home weekend of action...**

We knew we had to win one of those two matches to keep our chances alive to get into the SEC Tournament. On Friday night against Georgia we lost the first two games and probably could have won game two, and just got into a rotation where we were inconsistent with our passing and that led to some attack errors. We were able to bounce back in game three and win. We looked like we had some life in game four and we got into some passing woes and weren't able to recover from that and Georgia leaves with a 3-1 win over us. Sunday against Florida there was that 'nothing to lose' mentality and after that first game when we got rid of those jitters from some of our freshmen, I thought we competed really well. Winning game three was definitely a season highlight for the team so far. Game three seems to be the magic game for us this season. The team stuck with the game plan in game three in that they served aggressively and our passing came together. We also capitalized on the opportunities that Florida sent back over the net to us.

**On the SEC Tournament...**

I told the team after the Florida match that as far as numbers go it looks like we will not be competing at the SEC Tournament. We knew we had to win a match at LSU or Arkansas or one against Georgia and Florida this past weekend. If we were to win both matches this weekend, at best it would put us in a tie for eighth but we would lose the tiebreaker. I told them that there is still a lot to play for. This team has been resilient, worked hard in the gym everyday and improved and has been a joy to coach. It is not that the team does not compete or does not know how to compete it just comes down to competing consistently on a high level.

**On the South Carolina match...**

When South Carolina was here the match was definitely not one of the better one's I have ever seen - from both sides of the net. There were numerous ball handling errors and Joanna Pappas had just returned from being injured. Going there on Friday, I anticipate the game will be played much cleaner. It will come down to being able to serve them tough and capitalizing on opportunity balls. Our consistency within our hitters really needs to be on to win the match against South Carolina.

**On the Tennessee match...**

Tennessee is a good team and had been ranked in the top 25 early in the season before having a couple injuries. It is exciting to play against a talented team like Tennessee; they are a team that we really look forward to competing against. They are aggressive and it seems to make us more aggressive. It is an important match for us to have in that if we were to win, it would be the marquee victory of the season.

**On last weekend of play...**

The team knows this is our last weekend of competition and I expect that they will come in to practice this week focused and ready to work hard in preparation for South Carolina and Tennessee this weekend. We want to end the season knowing that we did our best.

**The Laura Farina File...**



Beginning her fourth season leading the Auburn volleyball program is Laura Farina. Named the Tigers' eighth head coach on March 29, 2002, the 36-year-old Farina is in the process of returning the program back to the prominence it once enjoyed during late 1990's.

Farina's rebuilding process took a major step toward solidifying the foundation during the 2004 campaign as the Tigers collected six conference wins, the most for the Tigers since the 1999 season. Auburn's trip to the SEC post-season was also its first since 1999 as the Tigers battled eventual SEC Tournament Champion Tennessee through a tough four-game match. Throughout the course of the season, Farina's recruits began to show why they were so highly sought after with the culmination coming in late November when freshman Whitney

Jacob was named to the SEC's All-Freshman team.

In her second year as head coach, she guided the Tigers to an incredible nine-win turnaround, posting 10 wins following consecutive one-win seasons for the program. With the change in record was a renewed enthusiasm for Auburn volleyball.

Farina came to the Plains after a three-year stay at Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wis., where she took over a Golden Eagle team that had won just 11 matches in the year prior to her first year on the job. During her stint in Milwaukee, her teams collected two 18-plus win seasons as well as two sixth-place finishes in Conference USA. Farina's first year at the helm in 1999 saw MU go 18-13 for a .581 winning percentage, the best by a Marquette team since 1985. The Golden Eagles' 9-7 C-USA record also represented MU's highest number of conference wins since joining the league in 1995.

The Strasburg, Ill., native has coached a SEC All-Freshman selection, seven All-Conference USA players, one all-region selection and 15 of her players have earned all-academic honors during her tenure.

Prior to her arrival at Marquette, Farina spent six seasons (1993-98) at Michigan State where she served as the first assistant coach. During her time with the Spartans, Farina helped build a program that won Big Ten Championships in 1995 and 1996, made five consecutive NCAA Tournament Championships (1994-98) and was a NCAA national semifinalist in 1995. She developed and implemented the team's national recruiting strategy that enabled the Spartans to land six Fabulous 50 recruits during that span.

Farina went to Michigan State after a year as a teacher and coach of the Mile High Volleyball Club in Denver, Colo. During the summer of 1998, she toured Europe with the American Management Group (AMG), which exposed college players to international volleyball.

Farina, the former Laura Bush, led Illinois to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances as a player including back-to-back trips to the national semifinal in 1987 and 1988. A two-time Academic All-American, Farina was also named to the AVCA/Russell All-America Second Team in 1989. She was named the Illinois Female Athlete of the Year in 1990 and still ranks among the top 10 in several Illini all-time categories, including career aces and digs.

Farina received her bachelor's degree in English from Illinois in 1992 and her master's in student affairs administration from Michigan State in 1998. Farina was married to John Farina on May 25, 1996. The couple resides in Auburn.

### The Assistant

Joanna Pappas stepped onto the collegiate court for the first time at the ASU Tournament. She served as AU's setter during the tourney where she racked up 113 assists (10.27 APG) in three matches. Pappas started in this role until the Sept. 30 match against Arkansas where she injured her thumb in practice. Pappas returned to the court on Oct. 14 and for the season has posted 584 assists.

### Stepping Up

Newcomer Alison Jacobs stepped up to the challenge of playing in a new role against Arkansas and LSU. Jacobs served as the setter during both matches, tallying 99 assists for the weekend (54 against Arkansas). She stayed in this role in Mississippi, posting 67 in both matches. She saw time at the setting position again at LSU (Oct. 28).

### AU in SEC Openers

Auburn is 6-14 all-time in SEC openers after falling to Alabama in the league debut on Sept. 21. The last time Auburn opened up conference play with a win was 1999 against Mississippi State.

### And the Award Goes To...

Senior Jennifer Amobi was named MVP of the Mizuno/Auburn Challenge after turning in 39 kills in the three matches and leading AU to the tournament title. Senior Bailey Veit and sophomore Rachel Shanks earned All-Tournament honors. Veit had 45 digs and Shanks turned in a double-double against Alabama A&M and a career-high 22 digs against Furman.

### Tigers on the ASU All-Tournament Team

Senior Bailey Veit and junior Julie Bosler were named to the All-Tournament team after outstanding performances over the two-day competition. Veit led the team in digs in all three matches, with a 24 in the five-gamer with Texas State. Bosler racked up 13 blocks for the weekend and 23 kills.

### Can you Dig It?

Bailey Veit's 31 digs were not only an AU and career record, but also reached another milestone in the AU books. The last time a player had 25-or-more digs, before Veit broke the record on Sept. 2, was Oct. 12, 1999 when Stephanie Jackson turned in 25 at Georgia State. The most digs in a five-game match before Veit's 31 were 30 by Lori Russell on Sept. 5, 1992 (at Butler).

### Ace Auburn

Whitney Jacob served up five aces against Grambling State to set a new lifetime best mark. As a team, AU had 12 aces on the evening versus GSU. She tied this mark in AUs win over Mississippi State on Oct. 21. So far this season, Auburn has 116 aces.

### AU in Season Openers

The Tigers notched their second consecutive season-opening victory under Laura Farina when the Tigers defeated Grambling State. This also marked the first since since the 1994-1995 stretch that the Tigers were victorious in back-to-back season openers. Auburn won its opening tilt in 2004 as they defeated East Tennessee State.

### Tigers Excel in the Classroom

The 2004 Auburn volleyball team was among 274 schools honored by the American Volleyball Coaches Association this past July after achieving the Game Plan/AVCA Team Academic Award. The award honors college and high school teams that displayed excellence in the classroom by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team GPA on a 4.0 scale (4.10 on a 5.0 scale) during the 2004-05 school year. NCAA Division I institutions had 45 award recipients, Auburn included.

### On the Road Again

Auburn will take trips to Arizona, Kentucky, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, South Carolina and Tennessee as well as two trips inside the state of Alabama, for a total of 8,670 miles traveled during the 2005 season.
