SETTING THE STAGE

The Auburn Tigers (10-2, 1-1 SEC) return to their home floor to begin the home portion of Southeastern Conference play this weekend, playing host to South Carolina at 7 p.m. Friday and Alabama at 1:30 p.m. Sunday. Admission is free to all home Auburn volleyball matches at the Student Activities Center.

AuburnTigers.com will have live streaming video and GameTracker available for both matches. Fans can also follow @AUVolleyball on Twitter for updates throughout the weekend.

ABOUT AUBURN VOLLEYBALL

This is the 41st overall season of Auburn volleyball, and the 27th season since the program was reinstated in 1986. The Tigers have an all-time record of 549-549-4 (.500) and an all-time Southeastern Conference mark of 129-252 (.339).

Auburn enters conference play having won 11 of its past 13 matches and 10 of 12 this season, matching the best record in school history through the first 12 contests of a season. The Tigers are led by senior **Sarah Bullock** (3.21 kills/set), who recorded her 1,000th career kill two weeks ago, and junior Katherine Culwell, who had a career-high 20 kills vs. Texas A&M last Sunday. Junior **Camila Jersonsky** leads the SEC in blocks (1.24/set) and ranks 3rd in hitting percentage (.387).

Head Coach **Rick Nold** enters the weekend with a 21-21 (.500) record in his second season at Auburn. He has a career record of 193-119 (.619).

A LOOK AHEAD

Auburn hits the road again for one of its longest trips of the season in SEC play. The Tigers will travel to face the Arkansas Razorbacks at 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 28, then make the long trek from Fayetteville to Lexington, Ky., to take on the Kentucky Wildcats at 12:30 p.m. (CT) Sunday, Sept. 30.

Rick Nold is in his second season as Auburn's head volleyball coach after spending the previous nine seasons at Jacksonville State.

He posted a record of 11-19 (5-15 SEC) in his first season at the helm of the Tigers, including a pair of victories over archrival Alabama, and brought in a strong recruiting class for the 2012 season.

Nold directed Jacksonville State to unprecedented heights during his tenure, winning three regular season conference titles, three conference tournament titles and making three NCAA postseason appearances. He compiled an overall record of 172-98, while posting an impressive 107-42 (72 percent) mark in league games.

A three-time conference Coach of the Year, Nold led the Gamecocks to Ohio Valley Conference regular season or tournament title in four of the previous six seasons. He captured the OVC regular season in 2006, '07 and '09, while winning the conference tournament title in 2005, '06 and '09.

Jacksonville State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, '06 and '09 under Nold, the only NCAA postseason appearances in the program's history. In 2009, Nold led the program to another milestone, by winning the school's first NCAA Tournament match, defeating Florida A&M.

Nold's 2009 team finished the season 27-8, which was the most wins in program history, swept both conference titles and advancing to the NCAA second round. He was rewarded by being named the OVC Coach of the Year as well as the Midwest Region Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

In 2006, the Gamecocks were 24-5 overall and posted a perfect 18-0 mark in conference play, sweeping all but one conference match. At one time that season, JSU won 49 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation.

Nold's teams not only excelled on the court, but also in the classroom. During his tenure, JSU had 46 volleyball players named to the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll, eight OVC Academic Medal of Honor winners, one Academic All-American and a two-time OVC Female Athlete of the Year.

Nold came to Jacksonville State from Louisville, his alma mater, where he spent six years on the Cardinals' staff, the last four as a full-time assistant whose duties included recruiting coordinator. The Cardinals won four Conference USA titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament five times, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1996 and 1998.

During his time at Louisville, he was the head coach of the 16-and-under and 18-and-under teams for the Kentucky Indiana Volleyball Academy in Louisville, where he

coached teams that won the 1996, 1997, 1998 and 1999 AAU National Championships. His teams also earned Top 5 finishes at the USA Volleyball National Championships in 1997, 1998, 2000 and 2001. He also served as president of the Cheaha Juniors Volleyball Club program from 2002-03.

Nold began his coaching career as an assistant at Assumption High School in his hometown, where he helped the girls' varsity squad to three state championships and a 137-9 overall record before joining the University of Louisville staff in 1996.

Nold served as an intern with USA Volleyball, where he assisted the women's national team in preparations for the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta.

He received a bachelor's degree from Louisville in the spring of 1998 in Sports Administration. He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, the Association of Volleyball Professionals and USA Volleyball Impact Certified Coach.

LOTS OF OFFENSE THIS WEEKEND

This weekend's matches will feature the No. 2, No. 3 and No. 7 players among active kill leaders in the Southeastern Conference. Auburn's **Sarah Bullock**, Alabama's Kayla Fitterer and South Carolina's Juliette Thevenin have combined for 2,993 kills in their collegiate careers.

BULLOCK GETS 1000TH KILL; SEEKS MORE HISTORY

Senior **Sarah Bullock** became the 13th player in Auburn history to record 1,000 career kills, reaching the milestone in Auburn's 3-0 win over SMU on Sept. 8 - doing so in front of numerous friends and family from her nearby hometown of Allen, Texas. She is the first Auburn player to hit the four-digit mark that has played exclusively in the 25-point rally scoring era.

She will look to make more history soon - possibly this weekend - as she is just 23 digs shy of 1,000 for her career. Only four other players in Auburn history have finished their careers with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs:

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

- South Carolina enters the weekend with a 13-0 overall record (2-0 SEC), the best start in program history.
- The Gamecocks are one of just eight undefeated teams remaining in the country and the only one in the SEC.
- Scott Swanson is in his second season as the Gamecocks' head coach; he enters the weekend with a 27-16 record at South Carolina.
- The Gamecocks opened SEC play with a 3-0 sweep of Georgia and a 3-2 win over LSU last weekend in Columbia.
- Carolina ranks second in the SEC and ninth nationally in hitting percentage (.311); SC is also 2nd in the SEC and 17th in the nation in kills (4.28/set).
- Juliette Thevenin is the reigning SEC Player of the Week after averaging 5.00 kills/set in wins over Georgia and LSU.
- Thevenin ranks 3rd in the SEC and 25th in the NCAA with 4.28 kills/set this year. She also hits .325, 14th in the SEC.
- Paige Wheeler is the Gamecocks' top defender with 4.18 digs/set, ranking 6th in the SEC.
- Auburn is 11-21 all-time against South Carolina, but the Tigers have won four of the last six meetings. The teams split their two meetings in 2011 with Auburn winning at home on Oct. 2 and South Carolina winning in Columbia on Nov. 18.

LAST TIME: CAROLINA 3, AUBURN 1 (11/18/11)

Brittney Rhude and **Chloe Rowand** posted career-highs in kills, but the Auburn volleyball team fell short on the road to South Carolina by a 3-1 score (17-25, 19-25, 25-20, 28-30) in Columbia, S.C. Auburn dropped its fourth straight match while South Carolina won on its Senior Night, defeating the Tigers for the first time since 2009.

Rhude shattered her previous best with a 17-kill performance in which she hit .424. Rowand, meanwhile, had 12 kills and just one error while hitting a team-best .550. **Kathia Rud** also equaled her career-best, finishing with 16 kills and a .344 attack percentage; it was her third time this season with a 16-kill performance. **Sarah Bullock** and **Mackenzey Harper** led the Tigers with 16 digs apiece, while **Chelsea Wintzinger** recorded her fourth double-double of the season with 30 assists and 11 digs.

Auburn fell for the first time all year when out-hitting its opponent, swinging at a .292 clip compared to South Carolina's .268. Auburn had 67 kills to the Gamecocks' 54, and out-dug South Carolina 74-69. But South Carolina had five service aces to Auburn's four, and the Tigers committed 13 service errors to the Gamecocks' five.

SCOUTING ALABAMA

- Alabama enters the weekend at 12-2 overall, 1-1 in SEC play. The Crimson Tide are a perfect 3-0 in road matches as well.
- The Tide went 2-1 in three matches last week at home, defeating Samford (3-1) and LSU (3-0) while falling to No. 17 Tennessee (3-1).
- Ed Allen is in his second year as Alabama's head coach and enters the week with a 23-22 overall record with the Tide.
- Alabama is one of the top defensive teams in the SEC, ranking second in opponent's hitting percentage (.152).
- Alabama also ranks second in the SEC and 36th nationally in service aces, averaging 1.56 aces/set.
- Kayla Fitterer ranks second among active SEC players with 1,115 career kills; she has 126 this year (3.71/set) to rank 7th in the SEC.
- Setter Sierra Wilson was named the SEC Freshman of the Week last week, averaging 10.36 assists/set along with 7 kills, 22 digs and 4 blocks. She leads the SEC and is ranked 22nd nationally with 11.42 assists/set.
- Kryssi Daniels leads the SEC and ranks 5th in the NCAA with 29 service aces (0.60/set) this season.
- Alabama holds a 40-29 advantage in the all-time series,



but Auburn has won the last five straight matches. The Tigers swept the Tide 3-0 at home on Sept. 23 of last year then won a five-set thriller on Oct. 30 in Tuscaloosa.

LAST TIME: AUBURN 3, ALABAMA 2 (10/30/11)

Kelly Fidero had a career-high 27 kills and 14 digs to lead the Auburn volleyball team to a season sweep of rival Alabama with a 3-2 (22-25, 25-23, 25-18, 18-25, 16-14) win over the Crimson Tide at Foster Auditorium.

The Tigers snapped a seven-match SEC losing streak, but continued another streak with their fifth consecutive win over Alabama dating back to the 2009 season.

Fidero shattered her previous career-best of 20 kills as she put down 27 attacks along with a career-best 14 digs to lead a Tiger attack. **Kathia Rud**, making her first start since the season's seventh match, recorded a career-best 16 kills as well, hitting at a .394 clip with just three errors on the day.

Chelsea Wintzinger had her third double-double of the year with 42 assists and 10 digs. **Sarah Wroblecky** led the Tigers with 28 digs, while **Sarah Bullock** added 20 digs to go along with eight kills. **Chloe Rowand**, seeing her first action in three weeks, led the Tigers with five blocks.

JERSONSKY NAMED SEC DEF. PLAYER OF WEEK

Junior **Camila Jersonsky** was named the SEC Volleyball Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 10 after her performances against Troy, Texas State, Wichita State and SMU

Jersonsky racked up a total of 21 blocks (1.62/set) over the four-match stretch, recording at least six in each of the three matches at the SMU Doubletree Classic. Her season-high of seven blocks in the three-set win over SMU matched her best output from last season, when she had seven kills on two occasions.

She led an Auburn defense that recorded at least eight blocks in each of the four matches during the week for a total of 38.5 team blocks (2.96/set) and held the Tigers' four opponents to a .162 hitting percentage. Jersonsky also had 27 kills and hit .286 for the week, including nine kills and a .412 hitting

WELCOME BACK, KRIS

After spending the last 12 years in assistant coaching jobs at Ole Miss, Morehead State and Arkansas, along with a stint working in compliance at Michigan, former Auburn head coach **Kris Grunwald** returns to the Tiger sideline for his second stint as an assistant coach.

Grunwald was an assistant under Liz Bitzer for four years (1994-97) before taking the reins of the program for the 1998 and 1999 seasons. The Tigers never posted a losing record in Grunwald's six previous years at Auburn, amassing an overall record of 114-67 (.630) in his previous stint, including the program's only SEC Western Division title in 1996. In his two seasons as head coach, Grunwald led Auburn to a 41-20 mark.

TIGERS PICKED FIFTH IN SEC WEST

Auburn was picked to finish fifth in the SEC's Western Division by the league's coaches, the conference office announced Aug. 6. The Tigers received 58 points, which were compiled on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7 basis for the seven-team Western Division and 1-2-3-4-5-6 for the Eastern Division.

LSU (20 points) was the preseason pick to win the West with conference newcomer Texas A&M (22) tabbed second. Arkansas (27) was third, followed by Ole Miss (52), Auburn (58), Alabama (65) and Mississippi State (71).

GREEN BAY, Wis. – A wild season-opening match went Auburn's way as the Tiger volleyball team rallied from an early deficit to claim a 3-2 victory (17-25, 25-16, 30-28, 16-25, 15-9) Friday afternoon over Central Michigan in the opening match of the Green Bay/Country Inn & Suites Tournament.

The Tigers (1-0) were bested in nearly every statistical category but were able to take advantage of several critical errors by the Chippewas (0-1), a 2011 NCAA Tournament participant and the defending Mid-American Conference Champions, in the second and fifth sets to claim the victory. It was Auburn's seventh win in its last nine season-opening matches.

Auburn was able to spread its offense around as six players had at least five kills in the match. Redshirt junior Katherine Culwell, in her first match back after missing the entire 2011 season with an injury, led the Auburn offense with 11 kills. She also contributed a pair of service aces, five digs and two blocks on the night.

Senior Sarah Bullock and junior Camila Jersonsky had nine kills apiece while junior Courtney McDonald added eight, junior Brittney Rhude had seven and junior Chloe Rowand had five. McDonald also added a team-high five blocks. Junior libero Sarah Wroblicky led the Tigers defensively with 22 digs.

Freshman Ciara Richards made her presence felt immediately as she led the team with 23 assists and barely missed a double-double in her first collegiate match with nine digs. But perhaps her biggest contribution came in the form of four service aces, the most by an Auburn individual since Liz Crouch had five against Troy on Aug. 27, 2010.

MATCH 2 (Green Bay Tournament)

AUBURN 3, DRAKE 0 (25-16, 25-21, 25-19)

Aug. 25, 2012 • Kress Events Center • Green Bay, Wis.

GREEN BAY, Wis. – The Auburn volleyball team made quick work of Drake on Saturday morning, sweeping the Bulldogs 3-0 (25-16, 25-21, 25-19) at the Kress Events Center in the Tigers' second match of the Green Bay/Country Inn & Suites Tournament.

Auburn (2-0) took advantage of a poor-hitting Drake squad (0-2) as the Bulldogs hit just .045 in the match, compared to Auburn's .267 mark. The Tigers had 43 kills to Drake's 30 and out-dug the Bulldogs 51-42.

Junior Katherine Culwell earned Auburn's first double-double of the season with 10 kills and 12 digs; she also contributed three blocks and an assist to the winning effort. Senior Sarah Bullock matched Culwell with 10 kills and fell just shy of a double-double with eight digs. Bullock also had a team-best three service aces - all coming in a four-point stretch in the third set - matching a career-high.

Chelsea Wintzinger led the Tiger setters with 25 assists; she also had eight digs and a kill. Camila Jersonsky contributed six kills and five blocks, and Chloe Rowand had eight kills.

The first set was all Auburn as the Tigers sprinted to a 25-16 win. Auburn led 10-3 after six straight attack errors from the Bulldogs and never looked back as Drake would get no closer than five points the rest of the way. Auburn out-hit Drake in the set .353 to .000 as the Bulldogs had nine kills and nine errors; Auburn recorded 14 kills against just two errors.

Auburn pushed their lead to 2-0 with a 25-21 win in set two despite hitting just .179 with seven errors. The Tigers never trailed, jumping out to a 14-9 lead, but Drake would get as close as two points at 16-14 to force an Auburn timeout. From there, though, Auburn would roll off four straight points, courtesy of three straight Drake errors, to make it 20-14. Drake would fight off three set point attempts, but a kill from Rowand would finally put the set away at 25-21.

After Drake jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the third set, Auburn ran off eight straight points - led by three aces from Bullock - and never looked back en route to a 25-19 win to clinch the match. Drake once again made things interesting, pulling within three points at 18-15, but five kills in six rallies - two from Bullock and one each from Kearney, Culwell and McDonald - gave Auburn a 23-16 lead. Two more kills from Bullock and Jersonsky put the Bulldogs away for good.

AUBURN 3, UW-GREEN BAY 0 (32-30, 28-26, 25-21)

GREEN BAY, Wis. – Auburn's volleyball team captured the Green Bay/Country Inn & Suites Tournament title, defeating host UW-Green Bay 3-0 (32-30, 28-26, 25-21) in a hard-fought match Saturday night at the Kress Events Center.

The Tigers (3-0) got strong play from the middle of the floor with a combined 30 kills from tournament MVP Camila Jersonsky and junior Courtney McDonald and were able to withstand their toughest fight yet from Green Bay (1-2).

Jersonsky recorded a career-high 18 kills on 34 attacks with just two errors for a .471 hitting percentage, giving her 33 kills for the weekend.

Senior Sarah Bullock was named to the All-Tournament team with nine kills in tonight's match to give her 28 for the tournament; she also had 10 digs in tonight's match. Junior libero Sarah Wroblicky earned an All-Tournament nod with 25 digs in tonight's match; she had a total of 61 in the tournament.

McDonald finished one kill shy of a career-high with 12 tonight. Chelsea Wintzinger posted her first double-double of the year with 18 assists and 17 digs, and Katherine Culwell recorded seven kills along with 14 digs.

Auburn out-hit Green Bay .231 to .182 and had 56 kills to their opponents' 43. Auburn also won the digs battle by one, 76-75, but Green Bay had nine blocks to Auburn's three.

Auburn rallied from a seven-point deficit in the first set and fought off three set point attempts from Green Bay to outlast the Phoenix and take a 32-30 win.

The second set was more of the same. Auburn fell behind early, trailing by as many as six points at 20-14, before fighting back to eventually tie the score at 23-23 on the strength of big swings from Jersonsky, Culwell and Halle Kearney. Jersonsky put down her 13th of the night to give Auburn a 28-26 win and a 2-0 lead in the match.

Set three saw Auburn jump out to an early lead, but Green Bay would not go away quietly. The lead changed hands five times and the score was tied on nine occasions in the third set, but Auburn would finally gain an advantage off two Phoenix errors, making it 17-15. Auburn ran off three more in a row to take a 20-15 lead, and the Tigers fought off a mini-rally by the Phoenix to have match point at 24-19. Green Bay would stave off match point twice, but not a third time as Jersonsky put down her 18th kill of the night to seal the deal and earn Auburn a tournament title.

MATCH 4 (War Eagle Invitational)

AUBURN 3, GEORGIA SOUTHERN 1 (23-25, 25-23, 25-19, 28-26)

Aug. 31, 2012 • Student Activities Center • Auburn, Ala.

AUBURN – The Auburn volleyball team stayed unbeaten on the young season, opening the home portion of the schedule with a 3-1 (23-25, 25-23, 25-19, 28-26) victory over Georgia Southern on Friday morning to kick off the War Eagle Invitational.

Auburn (4-0) struggled at times during the match but was able to outlast Georgia Southern (2-2) with tough blocking and improved hitting in the last two sets. Despite that, the Eagles outperformed Auburn in kills (59-52), assists (52-47), and digs (93-75), but the Tigers recorded 11 blocks to GSU's five and out-hit the Eagles .167 to .148.

Junior Camila Jersonsky led the Tigers with 12 kills, taking team honors for the second straight match. She also recorded four blocks, matching Courtney McDonald and Halle Kearney for the team lead. Three players contributed nine kills apiece with Sarah Bullock (16 digs) and Katherine Culwell (10 digs) barely missing double-doubles.

Both Auburn setters earned double-doubles with junior Chelsea Wintzinger notching 19 assists and 11 digs and freshman Ciara Richards posting 22 assists with 11 digs. Junior libero Sarah Wroblicky was the fifth different Auburn player with 10+ digs, posting 14 on the day.

Neither team hit well in the first set with both teams below the .100 mark, but Georgia Southern had one more kill than the Tigers and withstood 10 ties and five lead changes for a 25-23 win. GSU benefitted from an Auburn service error at 23-23, then won the set on Auburn's eight attack error of the game.

The second set was more of the same; however, the Tigers managed to come out on top with a 25-23 win of their own. This set saw 11 ties and seven lead changes as neither team led by more than two points the entire set. After the score was knotted at 20-20, a block from McDonald and Culwell and an service ace from Bullock gave Auburn a two-point advantage, and Auburn would cling to that margin and tie the match at a set apiece.

Auburn jumped out to an early lead in the third set and never looked back, out-hitting GSU .152 to .050 to take a 2-1 lead in the match with a 25-19 second-set win. The Tigers benefitted from nine attack errors and five service errors from the Eagles.

Set four was another back-and-forth affair with 19 ties and seven lead changes. Georgia Southern had a three-point lead at 18-15, then had two set point chances at 24-22. But kills from Culwell and Jersonsky tied it up at 24-24, and a GSU attack error gave Auburn its first match-point chance of the day. The Eagles, however, would fight off two match point attempts before Auburn finally got back-to-back kills from Bullock to put the match away.

AUBURN 3, HIGH POINT 0 (25-19, 25-15, 25-17)

Aug. 31, 2012 • Student Activities Center • Auburn, Ala.

AUBURN – Auburn's volleyball team kept rolling Friday night, making quick work of High Point with a 3-0 sweep (25-19, 25-15, 25-17) at the Student Activities Center in the fourth match of the War Eagle Invitational.

Auburn (5-0) showed notable improvement from the day's earlier match, posting a spiking .345 hitting percentage, the best for Auburn since hitting .381 in a three-set win over Alabama last season. High Point (3-2), meanwhile, earned a split in their matches Friday after defeating Jacksonville State in earlier action.

Auburn had 40 kills to High Point's 30 and out-dug the Panthers 39-30. The Tigers also were improved at the net, posting seven blocks to the Panthers' 30 and holding High Point to a .108 attack percentage.

Senior Sarah Bullock and junior Katherine Culwell led the Auburn offense with eight kills apiece, and Bullock added eight digs. Culwell also was involved in four blocks. Junior Courtney McDonald added seven kills and three blocks, and sophomore transfer Halle Kearney had six kills.

Junior libero Sarah Wroblecky led Auburn with 12 digs, and junior setter Chelsea Wintzinger had a game-high 19 assists.

The match was all Auburn from the start. The Tigers jumped out to a 10-6 lead in the first set and maintained the four-point lead at 16-12 until High Point cut it to a two-point margin. But from there, four errors in five rallies by the Panthers pushed the Auburn advantage to 20-15, and kills from Culwell, Jersonsky and Kearney gave Auburn the first-set win, 25-19. The Tigers hit .385 in the set.

Set two was more of the same as Auburn rolled to a 25-15 win with the Tiger defense holding High Point to a minus-.062 hitting percentage. The score remained close for the first 25 rallies before Auburn finally pulled ahead to a 15-12 advantage on two straight blocks by McDonald and Culwell and a kill from Chloe Rowand. Auburn would finish the set on a 10-2 run, including another block from Jersonsky and Culwell and four straight kills from Culwell, Kearney and Bullock to end the set.

Auburn jumped out early in the third set, sprinting to a 12-5 lead and never looking back on the way to a 25-17 clinching win. The Tigers spread the ball around in the game with Bullock, Culwell, McDonald and Kearney all recording three kills each as Auburn hit .393 in the final frame.

MATCH 6 (War Eagle Invitational)

AUBURN 3, JACKSONVILLE STATE 0 (25-15, 25-18, 25-23)

Sept. 1, 2012 • Student Activities Center • Auburn, Ala.

AUBURN – The Auburn volleyball captured its second straight tournament championship Saturday afternoon, winning the War Eagle Invitational with a 3-0 sweep (25-15, 25-17, 25-23) of in-state foe Jacksonville State at the Student Activities Center.

The Tigers (6-0) have won seven consecutive matches, dating back to the final match of 2011, for the longest winning streak for an Auburn team since the Tigers won nine straight during the 2003 season. With the win over the Gamecocks (4-3), Auburn Head Coach Rick Nold earned his first victory over the team he coached for nine seasons.

Junior Katherine Culwell was named tournament MVP after an 11-kill, three-block performance in Saturday's match, giving her 28 kills (2.80/set) for the week. She was third among all players in the tournament with 10 blocks.

Senior Sarah Bullock and junior Camila Jersonsky were named to the all-tournament team as well. Bullock had her first double-double of the season with a team-high 12 kills along with 10 digs today; she had 29 kills and 34 digs for the tournament. Jersonsky led all players in the tournament with a .500 hitting percentage, putting down 22 kills on 42 attacks with just one error. In today's match, she had five kills and four blocks.

Junior setter Chelsea Wintzinger earned her third double-double of the season with 18 assists and 12 digs, and Sarah Wroblecky led the Tigers with 13 digs.

Auburn controlled nearly every facet of Saturday's match. The Tigers had 44 kills to JSU's 34 and out-hit the Gamecocks .273 to .132. Auburn also won the digs battle, 51-47, had three service aces and had seven blocks to JSU's six.

The Tigers dominated the first set to the tune of a 25-15 win. Auburn hit for an average percentage at .206 but forced Jacksonville State into 10 errors for a -.077 mark. Culwell had Auburn's first five kills of the match as the Tigers sprinted to a 10-3 lead and never looked back.

Set two started out in much the same fashion as the Tigers went on an 8-0 run early to take a 9-4 lead en route to a 25-18 second-set victory. Jacksonville State hit much better in the set at .258, getting seven kills from Hivya Leite. But Auburn registered an outstanding 20 kills in the set, led by five from Bullock and four each from Culwell and Jersonsky and hit at a .354 clip.

Jacksonville State found a bit more consistency in the third set and made Auburn sweat just a bit before the Tigers held on for a 25-23 win and their fourth sweep of the season.

AUBURN 3, TROY 0 (25-19, 25-21, 25-23)

Sept. 4, 2012 • Sartain Hall • Troy, Ala.

TROY, Ala.— Auburn's volleyball team kept up its winning ways on the road Tuesday night, picking up a 3-0 win over Troy (25-19, 25-21, 25-23) at Sartain Hall, equaling the best start to a season in school history.

The Tigers (7-0) have now won seven straight matches to open the season for just the second time in school history, matching a 7-0 start by the 1991 Tigers. Tonight also marked Auburn's eighth consecutive win, dating back to the final match of last season, and kept Auburn unbeaten all-time against Troy (3-4).

Senior Sarah Bullock picked up her second double-double of the season with a season-high 13 kills and 10 digs to lead the Auburn offensive attack. She also had 35 total attacks on the night, giving her 2,916 for her career and moving her into eighth all-time in total attacks in Auburn history. Junior Courtney McDonald matched her season-best with 12 kills, hitting at a .476 clip, and matched a career-high with five blocks on the night. Katherine Culwell recorded nine kills and three blocks, and Camila Jersonsky added eight kills.

The Tigers had 48 kills to Troy's 35 and out-hit the Trojans .220 to .118. It was the fifth time this season the Tigers held an opponent under .200 hitting. Auburn also won the digs battle, 60-54, and had eight total blocks to Troy's five.

Bullock had seven kills in the first set as the Tigers pulled away late for a 25-19 win. After jumping out to a quick 5-1 lead, Auburn saw Troy fight back and tie the score at 8-8 before Auburn went on a 10-4 run to make it 18-12. But four straight points from the Trojans cut Auburn's margin to just two. From there, though, three kills from Bullock would spur a 6-1 run and eventually put away the first set.

Set two saw the Auburn block get involved as the Tigers had four stuffs in a 25-21 win. McDonald was an offensive and defensive key for Auburn with three kills and three blocks in the set, and Jersonsky contributed four kills of her own. While Auburn would never trail in the set, Troy would pull within three points at 14-11, forcing a Tiger timeout. Three straight kills from Jersonsky would extend the Auburn lead to 17-12, and kills from Bullock, Rowand, McDonald and Culwell would close out the set.

The third set was a much closer affair as Troy out-hit the Tigers .282 to .250 in the final game. After an Auburn timeout, the Tigers rolled off three straight points to jump back ahead 17-13, but Troy would again fight back to tie the score at 19-19. Auburn would get kills from McDonald and Culwell to push the lead to 23-20, and kills from Jersonsky and Culwell finally put the Trojans away, 25-23.

DALLAS— Texas natives Katherine Culwell and Sarah Bullock combined for 22 kills in their return to their home state, and Auburn volleyball won its ninth straight match with a 3-0 (25-15, 25-19, 25-19) sweep of Texas State on Friday morning at the SMU Doubletree Invitational.

Auburn (8-0) continued its best start to a season since 1990, when the Tigers won their first nine matches of the season. With a win in the final match of the 2011 season, the Tigers have now won nine straight contests, tying the school record for longest winning streak, held by the 1990 and 2003 teams.

Bullock, a native of nearby Allen, Texas, led the Tigers with 12 kills, giving her 983 for her career and putting her within sight of becoming Auburn's 13th all-time player to reach the 1,000-kill mark. Culwell, meanwhile, racked up 10 kills in front of about a dozen friends and family here in her hometown.

Auburn put down 10 blocks as a team, led by a season-best six from Camila Jersonsky (one solo, five assist), while Culwell had four and Rowand recorded three. Courtney McDonald added a pair of blocks to go along with six kills and a .385 hitting percentage.

Freshman Ciara Richards led the Auburn setters with 16 assists and a service ace, while Chelsea Wintzinger added 14 assists and a pair of aces.

The Tigers hit .345 as a team, equaling a season-best mark, and held Texas State to a .101 percentage, the lowest opposing hitting mark of the season. Auburn had 39 kills to the Bobcats' 29, and out-blocked TSU 10-3. Each team recorded 37 digs.

Auburn hit at a stunning .542 clip in the first set and rolled to a 25-15 opening win. Culwell got off to a hot start in the first set, racking up three kills and two blocks, while McDonald led the opening set with five kills from the middle. From a 9-9 tie, Auburn went on a 13-3 run to take a 22-12 lead, getting four kills, three blocks and a service ace in that stretch.

The Tigers started a bit slower in the second set, but started pulling away midway through en route to a 25-19 win and a 2-0 lead. With the score tied 11-11, Auburn got a kill from Jersonsky, an ace from Richards and a TSU error to jump ahead 14-11. From there, the Tigers would keep rolling, getting four kills from Bullock in the set and holding the Bobcats to a .071 hitting percentage.

Set three would start off strong for the Tigers as they jumped out to a 4-0 lead. Bullock kept swinging away, racking up seven kills in the set, while the Tigers took advantage of poor hitting by the Bobcats (.038) to claim another 25-19 win and their fourth consecutive sweep.

WICHITA STATE 3, AUBURN 1 (25-15, 22-25, 16-25, 17-25)

DALLAS – Auburn’s volleyball team saw its school record-tying nine-match winning streak come to an end Friday afternoon as the Tigers dropped a 3-1 decision to Wichita State (25-15, 22-25, 16-25, 17-25) in their second match of the day at the SMU Doubletree Classic.

The Tigers (8-1) fell for the first time since the penultimate match of last season, a 3-0 loss at Florida on Nov. 20, 2011. Wichita State (5-3), a 2011 NCAA Tournament participant, used a tough service game and outstanding play from its setter to improve to 2-0 at this week’s tournament after a five-set victory over SMU last night.

Senior Sarah Bullock finished tonight’s match with a season-high 15 kills, giving her 998 for her career. She also recorded five digs and hit for a .333 percentage. Katherine Culwell had her second-straight 10-kill match in front of her home fans and narrowly missed a double-double with nine digs.

Camila Jersonsky added six kills and six blocks as the Tigers out-blocked Wichita State 8-5. Halle Kearney matched a season-high seven kills, and Courtney McDonald had five. Sarah Wroblecky led the Tigers with 18 digs.

Auburn controlled the first set from start to finish, winning 25-15 as the Tigers hit .292 in the set and held the Shockers to a -.077 mark. Auburn’s block was strong as the Tigers recorded four total blocks in the game with Jersonsky and Kearney combining on back-to-back stuffs to increase Auburn’s lead to 19-12. Jersonsky would add a kill and an ace from there, and a kill from Kearney would give the Tigers a 1-0 lead.

The Tigers saw their streak of 16 consecutive set victories come to an end in the second game as the Shockers took a 25-22 win to even the match at one set apiece. Both teams hit for an outstanding percentage in the set with the Tigers at .375 and Wichita State at .400, but the Tigers made five errors, three of which came in the form of Shocker blocks. Some late struggles in the serve-receive game, however, proved to be the difference as the Shockers scored three straight points after the score was tied 22-22 to clinch the set and tie things up.

In set three, the Tigers answered with Bullock’s 11th kill of the night and Jersonsky’s fifth block to make it a one-point game, but the Shockers would once again move back ahead by three. Auburn again cut the deficit to one, but this time Wichita State would score three in a row to make it 17-13 and force another Auburn timeout. The Shockers would close on an 8-3 run to take a 25-16 win in the set and a 2-1 lead in the match.

In the fourth set, Shocker setter Chelsea Feekin took over and led her team to a 25-17 win.

DALLAS - Auburn senior Sarah Bullock recorded her 1,000th career kill, and the Tiger volleyball team got back on the winning track Saturday afternoon with a 3-0 victory (25-20, 25-18, 25-17) over tournament host SMU in the final match of the Doubletree Classic at Moody Coliseum.

Bullock, a native of nearby Allen, Texas, became the 13th all-time member of Auburn’s 1,000-kill club and the first since Jessica Glover reached the milestone during the 2008 season. She recorded the milestone kill in the first set on a play that tied the score after Auburn found itself in an early six-point hole.

Auburn (9-1) showed strong resolve in today’s match, bouncing back from its first loss of the season on Friday by fighting back from early deficits in the first two sets. The Tigers also earned their second all-time win over SMU (2-7), evening the all-time series at two wins apiece. The Tigers also matched the best 10-match start in school history; the 1990 team is the only other squad in program annals to post a 9-1 record over its first 10 contests.

The Tigers controlled the play at the net, putting down a season-high 12 blocks to account for 12 of SMU’s 19 hitting errors on the day. As a result, the Tigers out-hit the Mustangs .327 to .124. Auburn had 42 kills to SMU’s 33 and played strong defense with 53 digs to SMU’s 36.

Bullock was joined by Chloe Rowand and Camila Jersonsky, all with nine kills, to share the team lead. Jersonsky also contributed a season-high seven blocks while Rowand matched her career-best with six. Courtney McDonald recorded four blocks along with five kills, and Katherine Culwell had seven kills, 10 digs and two blocks in her final match of the weekend in her hometown. Junior libero Sarah Wroblecky tied Bullock for the team lead with 15 digs.

The Tigers struggled in the early-going of the opening set as SMU ran out to a 15-11 lead. Poor serving from both teams was an issue as each team committed four errors. But the Tigers erased a 19-13 deficit, finishing the set on a 13-1 run to give Auburn a 25-20 first-set win.

Auburn again erased an early deficit in set two, but a much more manageable one as SMU jumped out to a quick 5-2 lead. After Auburn took the lead and saw SMU tie the score at 9-9, the Tigers would never trail again after a 4-0 run to make it 13-9. The Tigers then took advantage of three SMU errors, along with a kill from McDonald, to make it 19-15. From there, kills from Wintzinger, Bullock, Jersonsky and Kearney, along with two more SMU errors, gave Auburn the second-set win at 25-18.

The third set, however, belonged to Auburn almost the whole way as the Tigers finished off the win with a 25-17 score.

AUBURN 3, MISSISSIPPI STATE 0 (25-20, 25-16, 25-17)

STARKVILLE, Miss. — Senior Sarah Bullock had 10 kills and matched a career-high with 21 digs, leading the Auburn volleyball team to a 3-0 win (25-20, 25-16, 25-19) over Mississippi State Friday night at the Newell-Grissom Building.

The Tigers (10-1, 1-0 SEC) continue one of the best starts to a season in school history, winning 10 of their opening 11 games for the first time in program history. Auburn got a measure of revenge over MSU (4-6, 0-1 SEC) after the Bulldogs won both meetings between the teams a year ago.

Bullock picked up her third double-double of the season and inched closer to the career 1,000-dig plateau. With 21 tonight, she now has 972 for her career, just 28 shy of the four-digit mark. It was Bullock's third match with 20+ digs in her career; her previous match with 21 digs came in her freshman year at Arkansas.

Junior Camila Jersonsky had nine kills - seven in the first set alone - and six blocks, and junior Sarah Wroblicky matched Bullock for the team-high in digs with 21. Katherine Culwell added eight kills, seven digs and five blocks, and Kathia Rud had five kills and a pair of blocks. Freshman Ciara Richards led Auburn with 19 assists, and Chelsea Wintzinger had 17 assists and seven digs.

Auburn hit an even .200 as a team and held Mississippi State to .089, the second team Auburn has held below the .100 mark this season. The Tigers had 41 kills to MSU's 32 and out-dug the SEC's leader in digs 64-61. Auburn also controlled the play at the net, recording 11 team blocks to MSU's five.

The Tigers got seven kills from Jersonsky - only one less than MSU had as a team - to win the first set, 25-20. Despite some stingy defense from State, Auburn controlled the early part of the first set and jumped out to a 13-8 lead while getting kills from seven different players and benefiting from five MSU errors. Jersonsky would get kills on her final two swings of the set to put it away.

The Tigers controlled the second set from start to finish, taking a 25-16 win. The Tigers had 13 kills in the set and out-hit MSU .281 to .056, getting six total blocks in the frame.

Auburn again jumped to an early lead at 10-6, but the Bulldogs, with strong play from their left side and a fortunate roll off the net on a service ace, went on a 5-0 run to take an 11-10 lead. But Auburn would never trail again, increasing the lead to 20-15 after a pair of State errors, and Bullock would put the match away herself with two kills and a solo block to secure the victory with a 25-19 third-set win.

TEXAS A&M 3, AUBURN 1 (22-25, 16-25, 25-27, 19-25)

Sept. 16, 2012 • Reed Arena • College Station, Texas

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Junior Katherine Culwell had a career-high 20 kills, but the Auburn volleyball team dropped a 3-1 (22-25, 16-25, 27-25, 18-25) decision on the road Sunday afternoon to Texas A&M before 1,216 fans at Reed Arena.

The Tigers (10-2, 1-1 SEC) were nearly even statistically in most categories with the Aggies (10-1, 2-0 SEC), but struggled in the service game. Texas A&M had eight service aces with just two errors while the Tigers did not record an ace but committed six service errors.

Culwell, a Dallas native, performed well in her second trip to her home state in as many weeks. With 20 kills on 44 attacks with seven errors, she hit .295 in the match and recorded seven kills in a pivotal third set to keep the match alive for the Tigers.

Junior Camila Jersonsky also hit double digits with 10 kills and a .350 hitting percentage; she also contributed five blocks. Both Auburn setters recorded double-doubles - junior Chelsea Wintzinger had 24 assists and 12 digs, and freshman Ciara Richards posted 23 assists and 12 digs. Texas A&M out-hit Auburn .208 to .175 but only had one more kill (58) than the Tigers (57). Auburn won the digs battle, 80-78, and had 9.5 total blocks to A&M's 6.0.

Auburn struggled early in the first set as the Aggies jumped out to a 10-3 lead with some tough serving, taking the Tigers out of system. A&M went on a 3-0 run to take a 22-18 lead, but Auburn once again cut the lead to one at 23-22 on a pair of kills from Bullock and Culwell, forcing an Aggie timeout. The Aggies, though, would find the floor twice more to take a 25-22 first-set win.

Texas A&M came out firing in the second set, sprinting to an 11-3 lead as Auburn committed three hitting errors and had no answer for the Aggie attack. Auburn hit just .132 in the set while the Aggies swung at a .324 clip. The Tigers cut A&M's lead to as little as six points at 21-15 but would get no closer the rest of the way.

An incredible comeback kept Auburn alive with a 27-25 win in set three. The Aggie lead eventually grew to 24-19, giving Texas A&M five attempts at match point. But the Tigers fought off five straight - across two Aggie timeouts - to tie the score at 24-24, courtesy of two kills and a block from Culwell. An Aggie error gave Auburn its first set point attempt at 25-24, but a kill from A&M tied the score once again. But Culwell's sixth kill of the set gave Auburn another chance at 26-25, and her seventh kill, one rally later, sent the match to a fourth set.

Serve-receive once again caused problems for Auburn in the fourth set as the Aggies clinched the match with a 25-18 win. A&M recorded three aces and took the Tigers out of system on several more occasions, leading to easy opportunities for the Aggies.
