## Auburn Travels To Columbus For NFCA

**The Tournament ...** Auburn travels to Columbus, Ga., for the 12th annual NFCA Leadoff Classic. The tournament features 20 teams for three days and will be played at the South Commons Stadium and Complex. For a full tournament description, visit [www.nfca.org](http://www.nfca.org).

**On The 'Net ...** Live stats will be available for all Auburn games, as will full statistics and game recaps following each contest's conclusion.

**Tigers 3-2 At Their Own Tournament ...** Auburn went 3-2 at the Tiger Invitational, defeating Tennessee Tech, 6-3, Tulsa, 9-1, and UAB, 5-1, to improve to 5-7 this season.

The Tigers' two losses came by one run. They dropped a 3-2 contest to Notre Dame and managed just one hit in a 1-0 loss to Virginia Tech the next day.

Holly Currie paced the Tigers by going 7 for 12 with two home runs and five walks. She was named Tournament MVP for her efforts. Myesha Finney and Anna Thompson were also named to the Tiger Invitational All-Tournament Team.

**A Look Ahead ...** Auburn continues its busy first month of play after the NFCA Leadoff Classic. The Tigers travel to Jacksonville State Tuesday for a non-conference tilt, then head to Tampa, Fla., for the USF Louisville Slugger Tournament from March 2-4. Opponents there include Utah, Central Michigan, Maryland, New Mexico State and host South Florida.

The Tigers are close enough now to see SEC play in their sights. The team travels to Kentucky March 10-11 to open conference play.

**Thompson Named SEC Freshman Of The Week ...** Anna Thompson earned Auburn's first SEC weekly honor, taking the Freshman of the Week award on Monday. She earned the honor on the strength of a 2-0 record at the Tiger Invitational, where she posted a 1.52 ERA and 27 strikeouts in 18 1/3 innings.

Thompson is just the second Tiger to earn SEC Freshman honors after the conference instituted it last season. Tatiana Fernandez was the first.

**A Look At The Field ...** Of the 20 teams at the NFCA Leadoff Classic, seven are currently ranked in the top 25 of the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 poll released on Tuesday. Michigan, the Tigers' second opponent at the tournament, is currently 13th and the highest ranked team in Columbus.

**And Now A Look At Auburn's Pool ...** The Tigers' four opponents in Columbus -- Hofstra, Michigan, North Carolina and Southern Illinois -- all made an NCAA Regional last season. Here is a closer look at how these teams have fared thus far in 2007.

**Hofstra:** The Pride are 3-2 this season as of Feb. 20. Hofstra is led by Casey Fee, who is batting .385, and Erika Bernstein, who has four RBI through the early part of the season.

**Michigan:** The Wolverines have started off the 2007 season fast, going 9-1. Alessandra Giampaolo is batting .484 with two doubles, while Lorilyn Wilson is 5-1 with a 1.10 ERA and 50 strikeouts in 38 1/3 innings.

**North Carolina:** The Tar Heels are 4-5 this season, having most recently lost to Illinois State, 11-4. North Carolina's Stephanie Murad is batting .400, while Jennifer Jacobs has 10 RBI in just nine games.

**Southern Illinois:** The Salukis scored a big win over then-No. 5 LSU, 8-5, on Sunday to improve to 8-2 this season. Amanda Clifton is batting .381 while Katie Wagner has four home runs in 10 games.

**Where They'll Play ...** With a number of games going on at the tournament, the NFCA Leadoff Classic will utilize a number of fields in Columbus. Auburn will open play against North Carolina at the Commons Stadium, then go to field 2 for Michigan. On Saturday, Auburn is at field 4 for both Southern Illinois and Hofstra.

**Deese In 11th Season ...** Auburn head coach Tina Deese is in her 11th season at the helm of the Auburn softball program and 19th overall. The former Huntingdon College head coach is 335-291-1 in 11 seasons with the Tigers and has taken Auburn to three straight NCAA postseason berths.

Deese is the only SEC head coach to remain with her club since its inception. She has the second-most tenure of any SEC coach, trailing South Carolina's Joyce Compton, who is in her 21st year with the Gamecocks.

Deese won her 600th career game in Auburn's 1-0 victory March 8 of the 2006 season. That came just a month after she won her 300th game at Auburn in 15-1 defeat of Miami (Ohio) in the second game of the season on Feb. 10.

**A Close Look At Thompson And Currie ...** Anna Thompson and Holly Currie have combined to start 11 of Auburn's 12 games and pitch in 79 1/3 of the team's 81 2/3 innings. Combined, the duo has 122 strikeouts and allowed just 52 hits.

Even better, Thompson and Currie have walked a total of 27 batters. The duo's WHIP (Walks plus hits per inning pitched) is at an astounding .99. Thompson and Currie's strikeouts to walks ratio is an incredible 4.5:1.

**Ghezzi Nearing 200 ...** Sara Ghezzi needs just two games played to become the 10th Tiger in team history to see action in 200 career games. With three starts, she'll become just the seventh AU player with 200 or more starts.

**Poll Watch ...** The Tigers' tough schedule is represented well in the most recent polls. Eight of the Tigers' opponents are ranked in the top 25 of the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll, while nine are represented in the USA Today/NFCA version.

Michigan, Auburn's second opponent at the NFCA Leadoff Classic, is 13th in both polls. Southern Illinois, whom the Tigers will play Saturday, is ranked 24th by the NFCA.

Auburn is 0-2 against teams ranked in the top 25 this season, losing two 1-0 contests to then-No. 15 Nebraska while in Honolulu.

**Tigers Are Big In The 60's ...** Of the Tigers 12 returning players, a strong offensive and defensive nucleus return. Below are 2006 statistics accomplished by this season's returners.

**Tiger Seniors ...** Auburn's seniors have been the most accomplished group in team history, winning 133 games overall and 55 in Southeastern Conference play since 2004.

**That's A Mighty Fine Schedule You Have There ...** The 2007 schedule may be one of the best in Auburn's history. Of the team's 37 opponents this season, 18 reached the postseason last year. In fact, the Tigers will face stiff tests throughout their early season tournaments. Auburn will play eight teams that made it to an NCAA Regional last year through the first month of play. The Tigers will be especially tested at the NFCA Leadoff Classic Feb. 23-25 where they will face North Carolina, Michigan, Southern Illinois and Hofstra, all postseason clubs a year ago.

**Just Learn To Say 'No' ...** Holly Currie's no-hitter against Georgia State Feb. 14 marked the seventh of her career. The senior holds the AU career record for no-no's. She also holds the single-season record with five last season. She is the only Tiger with a perfect game, achieved February 11, 2005 against the College of Charleston.

**Currie, Part 2 ...** Holly Currie also has 684 career strikeouts, placing her second in team history. Her 101st strikeout this season will give her 728 for her career, which would surpass Kristen Keyes, currently the team's record holder, who had 627 from 2002-04.

Currie has 21 career double-digit strikeout efforts.

**TV Time ...** Currently, the Tigers are scheduled to air on television once in the third game a three-game series at Tennessee. The game will be April 22 at 1 p.m. CT. and will air on Fox Sports.

Should the Tigers advance to the SEC Tournament Championship Game, they will be on Fox Sports at 12 p.m. CT.

She also posted four doubles and 16 RBI. Brittany Scott went 7 for 15 in the eight games while Holly Currie was 11 for 24 with two home runs and nine RBI.

Anna Thompson led the team's pitchers with 34 strikeouts in 14 innings. She limited opponents to a .087 batting average. Opponents hit .094 against Currie, who worked 16 innings, striking out 25

while walking just four. Brittany Day, meanwhile, struck out nine batters in nine innings. She allowed just three hits.

**Change In The SEC Schedule ...** The Southeastern Conference reduced its schedule by two games for the 2007 season, giving each team 28 conference games instead of the 30 that had been the norm since the SEC's inception in 1997.

Beginning this year, teams will play 14 games on the road and at home. Each team will still play two midweek series -- one away and one at home -- although those will now be two games instead of three. Those games will be played as a doubleheader.

**Jane B. Moore Field ...** Auburn will call Jane B. Moore Field home for the 10th straight season. The venerable facility hosted its first game in 1998 and was officially dedicated in Dr. Moore's name in 2003. The facility, which hosted a 2005 NCAA Regional, seats 1,500 and will be the site of the 2007 SEC Tournament.

The Tigers are **134-82 (.620)** at Jane B. Moore Field since 1998 and are **68-20 (.772)** the past three seasons.

Last season, the Tigers rode a 19-win season at home as the team saw an average of 439 fans at Jane B. Moore Field, easily a record.

**Hosting The 2007 SEC Tournament ...** Auburn's Jane B. Moore Field will be the site of the 2007 SEC Softball Tournament, scheduled to be held May 10-12. It marks the first time the tournament will come to Auburn as the Tigers are just the fourth program to host since it came on-campus in 2004. Alabama, Florida and Georgia have also hosted the tournament.

The SEC Tournament is a single-elimination tournament, with four games scheduled for the first day. The championship game will be held that Saturday with the winner guaranteed the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament.

**SEC Tournament Tickets ...** Tickets for the tournament went on sale Feb. 1. Single-session tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth (18 and younger). A full-tournament ticket can also be purchased for \$20 for adult and \$10 youth. It will be good for all seven games of the tournament.

**What returns in 2007 ...** The Auburn softball team returns 12 letterwinners from last season's club that went 36-22 overall and earned its first berth into an NCAA Regional Championship game. The Tigers have four seniors -- Holly Currie, Sara Ghezzi, Nicole Russo and Lauren Walton -- who will anchor the 18-player roster. Currie and Ghezzi are multiple postseason award-winners, while Russo and Walton have seen substantial playing time.

As noted above, the Tigers return approximately 60 percent of their offense from last season, with Currie, Ghezzi and sophomore Tatiana Fernandez headlining the lineup. Ghezzi earned All-SEC Second Team honors last season while Fernandez was recognized as a All-Freshman honoree.

**Newcomers ...** The Tigers welcome six newcomers into the fold this season, including four freshmen and two transfers. The four freshmen are pitcher Anna Thompson and infielders Whitney Wyatt, Krista Klein and Alicia Hunolt. Junior transfer Jessica Martin and sophomore Lindsey Harrelson both come from Central Alabama Community College in Alexander City.

Current Auburn assistant coach Jack Byerley headed the program at CACC from 1996-2000.

**About The Auburn Assistants ...** Head coach Tina Deese is assisted by coaches Jack Byerley and Stewart McGill. Byerley is in his third season with the Tigers and McGill his first, although he has served as a student manager the past two seasons.

Byerley came to the Auburn program prior to the 2005 season after two seasons as the head coach at Francis Marion in South Carolina. Prior to serving as head coach there, he was an assistant at Florida. His first stop in the SEC came after a four-year stint as the head coach at Central Alabama Community College. Byerley was the head coach at Robertsdale (Ala.) High School from 1989-96.

McGill is well-known in SEC circles after serving as a student manager with Auburn the past two years after two seasons in the same position at Arkansas. He also has two years of international head coach experience after guiding the Florida Quicksilver at the annual Canada Cup in British Columbia. Current Tigers Lauren Walton, Holly Currie, Ashley Arcuri and Jorja Bell played for McGill's team this past offseason.

**Tigers Switch To Under Armour ...** The Auburn softball uniforms may have looked the same in 2006 to the casual observer, but the Tigers made one key change to the uniforms. The uniforms are now made by Under Armour Performance Apparel as part of a five-year contract signed in December of 2005 that makes Under Armour the official outfitter of all of Auburn's athletic teams. The contract, worth \$10.6 million in sponsorship, product and additional benefits, will see Auburn's athletic teams wearing Under Armour uniforms, cleats, apparel and accessories beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.
