

Kim Evans

Head Coach • 21st Season

No. 1 rankings, top 10 finishes in the NCAA Championship, Auburn and Kim Evans all go hand in hand. Evans, who has led the Tigers to eight SEC Championships, has compiled a 2,559-939-45 record as Auburn's head coach while leading the team to 36 tournament titles and 96 top-three finishes in 227 tournaments.

Because of the continued success of the program under Evans, in the fall of 2005, Golfweek named the Auburn women's program the fourth most successful program in the previous five years.

Evans, who is in her 21st year at Auburn, has led the Tigers to 14 NCAA Championship appearances, including seven top-10 finishes with a tie for second in the nation in 2002 and third in 2005. Auburn's eight SEC titles under Evans came in 1996, 2000, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2012. With the eight titles under Evans, Auburn has nine total - a mark that places the Tigers second all-time in the conference in SEC titles.

In all, Evans has coached seven SEC Golfers of the Year, 13 All-Americans to 29 honors and 19 All-SEC recipients for a total of 57 honors. She has also coached seven SEC Freshmen of the Year and one NGCA National Freshman of the Year.

Included among those is 2009 SEC Golf of the Year Candace Schepperle, who became a four-time All-SEC performer in 2010, along with four-time All-SEC performer and Curtis Cup champion Cydney Clanton.

In 2008, Evans was inducted into the National Golf Coaches Hall of Fame. She was also awarded the Horton Smith Award for education by the Dixie Section of the PGA at its 2009 Annual Meeting. She was also the National Golf Coaches' Association National Coach of the Year in 2001-02.

Evans is an ovarian cancer survivor, diagnosed with the disease

in May 2013, just before the Tigers were set to begin postseason play. She went through chemotherapy at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and has been cancer-free since September 2013.

With Evans out of commission for several months, the Tigers struggled in 2013-14, finishing sixth at the SEC Championship and 15th at the NCAA Regional. But when she returned to full-time coaching, the Tigers' fortunes bounced back. Auburn won its first tournament of the 2014-15 season and picked up two individual titles in the first four tournaments of the fall with sophomore Clara Baena winning the "Mo" Morial and freshman Sophia Schubert taking medalist honors with a school-record score at the Alamo Invitational.

Following Evans' diagnosis, the Tigers put together an inspired postseason in 2013, claiming the eighth and final spot in the 2013 NCAA East Regional at the Auburn University Club to advance to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2010. While there, Auburn earned a sixth-place finish, highest among SEC teams and their best since 2005.

Auburn won its third SEC title in the last four seasons in 2012, holding a one-stroke lead over home-team Arkansas. The Tigers tallied five top-five finishes during the regular season as they placed first at the Central Florida Challenge. The season ended with a 12th-place finish at the NCAA Central Regional.

During the 2010-11 season, Evans led Auburn to three top-five finishes and an SEC Championship. The Tigers placed fifth at the Pac-10/SEC Challenge and the Battle at Rancho Bernardo Inn.

During the 2009-10 season, Evans led the Tigers to top-five finishes in nine of their 12 tournaments and top 10 finishes in all but two. Auburn pulled out victories at the Auburn Invitational and

Tiger/Wave Classic while also taking runner-up honors at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational and NCAA Fall Preview.

Auburn compiled a 153-43-5 record on the season and returned to the NCAA Championship, finishing in a tie for 11th. Clanton stepped up at NAAs, tying for third to give her the second-best finish ever at the NCAA Tournament for an Auburn player.

In 2008-09, Evans led the Tigers to top-five finishes in seven of the team's 11 tournaments. Included in those is the 2009 SEC Championship title and three regular-season tournament victories.

Auburn put together an impressive 132-39-1 record with the golfers accounting for 19 individual top-10 finishes. For her work, Evans was named the SEC Coach of the Year for the fourth time in her career.

In 2007-08, Auburn was ranked in the top-15 in the nation throughout the entire season, ending with a 12th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Freshman Cydney Clanton was named an All-American and the NGCA Freshman of the Year. The honor came after she was named SEC Freshman of the Year, earning all-conference honors along with Candace Schepperle and Margaret Shirley. AU finished fourth overall at the SEC Championships. The Tigers finished the 2002 season ranked No. 1 nationally in Golfweek, the team's first-ever No. 1 ranking, and were No. 1 in the nation in Golfweek's 2002-03 preseason poll. In all, Evans has coached the Tigers to 20 tournament titles during her more than 14 seasons on the Plains.

The 1981 Auburn graduate has turned a once mediocre program into a consistent National Championship contender.

The 2007 season saw Auburn finish ninth at the NCAA Championships after winning three tournament titles during the regular season. Nicole Hage was named a third-team All-American





and led a pack of three Tigers that earned All-SEC honors, joining Schepperle and Shirley.

In 2006, Evans coached the Tigers to a sixth place finish at the NCAA East Region and a 12th place finish at the NCAA Championships. Two players were named All-Americans, and Maria Martinez was named SEC Women's Golfer of the Year. The team tied a school record with five tournament victories, taking first place in the Derby Invitational, The LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic, The Lady Gamecock Classic, The SEC Championship and the Lady Buckeye Invite.

In 2005 Evans led the Tigers to the NCAA Central Region title and senior Diana Ramage earned medalist honors in the tournament. Three players were named All-Americans, as well as All-SEC team members in 2005.

In 2004, freshman Hage won SEC Freshman of the Year honors and was named as the Co-SEC Player of the Year. Along with Hage, Maria Martinez earned first team All-SEC honors.

Auburn won three tournaments in 2003 with the SEC Championship, the ACC/SEC Challenge and the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate. Senior Celeste Troche became the first four-time All-American in Tiger history while Danielle Downey was an honorable mention All-American. Troche, Downey and Diana Ramage were all All-SEC first-team selections and Maria Martinez was a second-teamer.

Evans led the Tigers to a school-best tie for second in the 2002 NCAA Championship. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in Golfweek. Courtney Swaim, Troche and Downey each earned All-American honors as Swaim and Troche were first-team selections with Downey on the second team.

Evans was named SEC Coach of the Year for the third time in seven seasons while Kingsley Barrett became the third-straight Tiger to claim SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Downey, Swaim and Troche were first-team All-SEC selections while Troche was also selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers had a then school-best fourth-place finish in the 2001 NCAA Championship. Celeste Troche earned first-team All-America honors and was an Academic All-American and SEC Player of the Year, and Ramage won the Tigers' second consecutive SEC Freshman of the Year award. The Tigers won a school record five tournaments.

The Tigers finished sixth in the 2000 NCAA Championship and won the 2000 SEC Championship for the second time in five years. Freshmen Danielle Downey, who won three individual tournaments

including the SEC Championship, and Celeste Troche, who was the SEC Freshman of the Year, were both named second-team All-Americans. Both were first-team All-SEC selections and a quartet of Tigers, Kami Smith, Crystal Ferrier, Kimberly Strong and Audrey Fisher, were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 15th in the 1999 NCAA Championship while Robin Cook was named a second-team All-American for the second straight year. Kami Smith earned Academic All-America honors. Six Tigers were named All-SEC with Cook earning SEC Player of the Year honors.

In 1998, the Tigers finished 19th at the NCAA Championship. Cook was named second-team All-American and three Tigers garnered All-SEC honors along with three being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 13th in the nation in 1997 as the team advanced to the NCAA Championship at the Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio. Katie Gallina was named an All-American and the Tigers had four All-SEC selections and two SEC Academic Honor Roll picks. Evans led the Tigers to a 143-36 (.799) record during the 1996-97 season. In 1996, Evans became only the second women's golf coach in Auburn history to be named SEC Coach of the Year and District South Coach of the Year, along with the legendary Bud Marsee.

Auburn's 1996 SEC Championship was the school's second ever, the first coming in 1989. Evans also led the Tigers to their first trip to the NCAA Championship in six years in 1996 as the Tigers finished 18th in the country. Marci Clemons was an All-American and won the prestigious Dinah Shore Award and Edith Munson Award. Three Tigers were selected All-SEC and one to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Evans was formerly an assistant coach for the men's golf team at Georgia Tech from 1988-1994 and the assistant executive director of the Atlanta Junior Golf Association for six years.

In 1981, she graduated from Auburn with a Bachelor of Science degree while also lettering for the Tigers from 1978-81.

Upon her graduation from Auburn, Evans worked as a golf activity coordinator and golf professional at Sandestin Resort in Destin, Fla., where she obtained her PGA Class A status.

Extremely involved in the community, Evans has worked with a variety of charities during her time at Auburn. She works every year with the Gary Moore Christmas Meal, an event that provides a holiday dinner for those in need in the Auburn-Opelika area. She also coordinated the inaugural Will Golf For Food Tournament that

assists the Lee-Russell County Aging Foundation.

Evans has a long list of golf achievements including being on the Board of Directors for "The Alabama First Tee Chapter" in 1999 and was the third Vice-President of the National Golf Coaches Association for 1999-2000.

She was awarded the Georgia PGA Junior Golf Leader Award in 1992; was a member of the PGA National Junior Golf Steering Committee from 1992-93; Georgia State Golf Association Advisory Committee, 1992-1994; Georgia Junior Golf Foundation Board of Directors, 1992-1994; Special Olympics Committee for Golf in 1994; and Instructor for the LPGA Mazda Executive Women's Clinic in 1993.

She was the guest speaker for the 1990 USGA Women's Regional Workshop and at the AAHPERD Regional Convention in 1993.

She spearheaded and directed the "See Jane Build Golf Day" in September 1995 to benefit Habitat for Humanity in Lee County and was selected to the South District Selection Committee for 1995-96. While at Georgia Tech, she was involved in several campus activities such as directing the Georgia Tech Annual Gift Giving, The United Way for four years, the Tournament Coordinator of the Local Contributors Golf Tournament for the NCAA Women's Final Four in 1993 and the Mandy Miller Golf Classic (Women's Basketball Scholarship Endowment Program) for three years.

Evans was a co-Director for the "Go For the Gold Twilight Run" (fund raising for women's athletics) in 1991. Evans spends time with many charities and is a member of the Professional Golf Association of America. Among Evans' achievements from the recent past include the creation of the Auburn Tiger Invitational (now named the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational after former Auburn golfer and Curtis Cup Champion Virginia-Derby Grimes). She was also instrumental in landing the 1996 NCAA East Regional and 2003 NCAA Championship at Grand National in Opelika, Ala., and she serves on the steering committee for the PGA Tour's 2015 Barbasol Championship at Grand National.

"The individuals are the best part of coaching," said Evans of her players. "Of course everybody likes to win. But, when you're dealing with individuals, and they accomplish their goals, we all come together and accomplish our team goals."

"When you have quality student-athletes and mix them with the game of golf, I can't see a better combination."

Andrew Pratt

Associate Head Coach • Second Season

Andrew Pratt begins his second season as Auburn's associate head coach for the 2014-15 season. He joined the Tigers' staff on June 7, 2013, after spending the previous two years as head coach at Tulane.

In his first season on The Plains in 2013-14, he helped lead the Tigers to their 20th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance.

During his two seasons at Tulane, Pratt compiled an impressive record which includes an appearance at the 2013 NCAA Championship, appearances at both the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Regionals, the 2013 Conference USA title, 11 Top-5 finishes, 12 Top-10 finishes and being named the 2013 Conference USA Coach of the Year.

Pratt comes to The Plains after guiding Tulane to one of the finest seasons in program history. He led the Green Wave to a Conference USA title, a school-best runner-up finish at the NCAA East Regionals and to a school-record ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Tulane posted eight Top-5 finishes in 11 tournaments, which included four runner-up showings, and completed the season ranked 13th in the final Golfstat.com poll.

Along the way, Tulane set 11 team or individual single season and career records and four golfers completed the year ranked among Golfstat.com's Top-100. For his efforts, Pratt was named the 2013 Conference USA and Louisiana Golf Coach of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Tulane, Pratt spent three seasons as an assistant coach with Tennessee, helping the Lady Vols make three consecutive NCAA Championship appearances and win four regular season tournament titles.

Pratt's own professional experience on the links includes four years on the Nationwide Tour (2004-07) where he compiled five Top-10 finishes and came in runner-up at the 2005 Xerox Classic. Additionally, he was the 2004 and 2005 Tennessee State Open Champion, the 2004 Tennessee State Amateur Champion and appeared in the U.S. Amateur Championship (2000, 2001, 2002, 2003) and the 2004 British Amateur Championship.

A native of Bartlett, Tenn., Pratt played collegiately at Tennessee from 1999-03, lettering all four years, and competed in the 2000 and 2003 NCAA Championship, earned All-SEC Second Team honors in 2002 and was named an All-American Academic three times. He received his undergraduate degree in sports management in 2004.

Pratt and his wife, Sara Buff, are the parents of two sons, Cooper and Weston, and a daughter, Grace.

Since its inception in 1994, the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational has earned a reputation for being one of the nation's finest women's collegiate golf tournaments. The tournament gives each team an early barometer of how it stacks up against the top teams in the nation. The top teams in the country have graced The Derby and 2008 is no exception with a field including Alabama, Arizona State, Auburn, Central Florida, Coastal Carolina, Florida State, Furman, Georgia, Kansas, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Chattanooga, Tulane and Virginia. At the start of the 1998 event, the Auburn Tiger Invitational was

renamed the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational beginning in 1999 in honor of Curtis Cup Champion and former Auburn player and coach, Virginia Derby-Grimes.

Grimes played at Auburn under legendary Coach Bud Marsee in 1985 when the women's golf program was re-instituted after a four-year hiatus. She then came back to coach the Tiger golf team for three years from 1991-94 while leading the team to a pair of NCAA East Regional berths. She orchestrated the beginning of the Auburn Tiger Invitational in 1994.

"We couldn't think of a more distinguished or better person to name our tournament after than Virginia Derby-Grimes," former Auburn athletic director David Housel said. "She has played at Auburn, coached at Auburn, represented Auburn worldwide and still puts her heart and soul into the Tiger program.

"Virginia is a great friend to the game of golf and an even bigger part of our Auburn Family."

Derby-Grimes, whose career is highly-decorated as being one of the top amateur players in the world, anchored the United States team to a thrilling victory in the final day of the Curtis Cup in the summer of 1998. Grimes, who also was a part of the 2000 Curtis Cup championship team, was inducted into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame in 2004. She won the 1998 U.S. Mid-Amateur title and was an alternate for the 1998 USA World Cup team. She is a former Alabama State Amateur Champion and Alabama

Junior State Amateur Champion.

Another important milestone in the tournament's history came in the fall of 2001. With the team planning to attend a fall tournament in Japan, the decision was made to suspend the Derby Invitational for the year and pick it back up again in 2002.

In the wake of the Sept. 11 attacks, one of the top college tournaments in the nation, the Golf World Invitational, was cancelled. With the best teams in the country left without a place to play, the decision was made by the Auburn administration and coaching staff to conduct the Derby Invitational on the November dates of the Golf World Invitational, moving the Derby from its usual September date.

The tournament was a huge success with a field that included Duke and Virada Nirapathpongorn, who would go on to win the 2002 NCAA team and individual titles. Also in the field was Arizona's Lorena Ochoa, who won the tournament with a 6-under-par 210. Ochoa was named the 2007 LPGA Rolex Player of the Year and now has 24 LPGA victories to her credit.

Since the inaugural tournament held in 1994, the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational has consistently attracted top-quality teams and individuals, including several NCAA team and individual champions.

In 2008, the tournament field featured 11 teams ranked in the GolfWeek top 25, including No. 2 Arizona State, No. 4 Georgia, No. 6 Alabama, No. 7 Virginia, No. 12 Auburn and No. 13 LSU. Auburn went on to finish fourth with a 32-over-par 896. Candace Scheppler was the top Tiger, finishing fourth individually with an even-par 216.



Golf Digest tabs Auburn-Opelika No. 1

AUBURN — In its third "Metro Golf" survey, which appears in the August issue, Golf Digest selected the Auburn and Opelika area as the top American metropolitan area for a golfer to live.

The magazine lists 330 metro areas and details the best and worst cities for golfers nationwide. The rankings focused exclusively on public golf.

The survey rated the area on 15 factors, including: golf (45 percent of total score), weather (25 percent), quality of golf (15 percent), and value (15 percent). There was an increased emphasis on weather (temperature and precipitation) this year.

The Auburn-Opelika area earned its No. 1 ranking based on multiple three-star courses and the number of golf holes per population. Area named top spot for golf

Golf Digest names Auburn-Opelika No. 1 in nation

Golfers who for years have claimed that the best golf is found right here in Lee County can now say "I told you so."

In Golf Digest's third Metro Golf survey, which will appear in the magazine's August issue, the Auburn-Opelika Metropolitan Area (AOMA) ranked the No. 1 in the nation.

The survey lists the United States' 330 metro areas and details the best and worst cities for golfers nationwide. And Opelika was found to be the most "Golf-Friendly" in the country.

While nabbing the top spot on the local officials and golf professionals have long known that the counties in Lee County have better than just "average" golf courses.

"What we already know," said Robyn Bridges, communications director with the Auburn-Opelika Convention and Visitors Bureau.

After hearing the news, John Rarabash, head golf professional at Auburn Links, said he wasn't surprised at all either.

AUBURN UNIVERSITY CLUB



The city of Auburn, Alabama, is home to a 16-year-old golf club constructed by Auburn people for Auburn people, The Auburn University Club at Yarbrough Farms. The course opened in the fall of 1999.

The Auburn University Course also played host to the 2003 NCAA East Men's Regional, 2011 SEC Women's Tournament, 2013 NCAA Women's East Regional and numerous PGA Qualifying School events over the years.

The Auburn University Club features an 18-hole championship golf course, state-of-the-art practice facilities and a full service clubhouse as well as office space for the Auburn University golf coaches and locker rooms for both the men's and women's golf teams.

Practice Facility

Utilizing 22 acres, the practice facility features a range of nearly 400 yards with tees at both ends allowing players to train in a variety of wind conditions. Additionally, a unique area has been designed for situation practice so that shots may be re-created and played into actual greens from every conceivable lie and length.

Furthermore, there are bentgrass and bermuda grass putting greens so that team members may prepare for whatever type of surface they may be facing in their next event. The practice facility is ideal for working on all aspects of the game and is outstanding for the golf teams, lessons and clinics, and for summer golf camp programs.

Golf Course

Located off Shug Jordan Parkway, just north of campus, the Auburn University Club at Yarbrough Farms is situated on more than 200 acres of rolling wooded terrain. Endowed with outstanding natural amenities such as Yarbrough Lake, the 25-acre centerpiece of the property, and Saugahatchee Creek, which meanders along the 12th, 13th and 14th holes, the site is one of the top golf courses in the South.

At 7,326 yards from the back tees, the golf course carves through magnificent trees, across wetlands, along creeks and streams and around the lake. Natural and man-enhanced water features play a prominent role at The Auburn University Club as they blend throughout the property and are visible on 14 of 18 holes.

Designed with the intention of hosting an NCAA or other national championship, the course is a challenging yet playable for all levels of golfers. With subtly shaped Tift Eagle greens, surrounded by a balanced mix of chipping areas, bunkers and rough and fairways that roll and blend with the existing contours, The Auburn University Club at Yarbrough Farms is destined to become a distinguished addition to the Loveliest Village on the Plains.

Designer

Former Auburn golfer Bill Bergin designed The Auburn University Club at Yarbrough Farms. The four-time All-SEC selection and member of Auburn's 1981 SEC Championship team began his design career in 1990 under Bob Cupp, the 1992 Architect-of-the-Year.



OTHER AREA COURSES



RTJ Grand National - Lake
Par 72, 7,149 yards

Grand National, by all reports, was the single greatest site for a golf complex Robert Trent Jones, Sr. had ever seen. Built on 600-acre Lake Saugahatchee, 32 of the 54 holes drape along its filigreed shores. Both the Links Course and the Lake Course were in the top 10 of Golf Digest's list of "America's Top 50 Affordable Courses" and all three courses at Grand National - the Links, the Lake and the par-3 Short Course - are listed among the nation's 40 Super Value courses by Golf Digest's "Places to Play."

The Lake Course at Grand National will be the host of the PGA Tour's Barbasol Championship in July 2015.

With 12 holes hugging the shore of Lake Saugahatchee, the Lake Course is one of the most scenic courses you can find. The quarter of par threes is as good as any in the nation. The Lake Course stretches to 7,149 yards from the back tees with a course rating of 74.3 and a 136 slope.

The par-3 15th hole on the Lake Course is the signature hole at Grand National with an island green and swirling winds which make for a difficult tee shot.

The cornerstone of the Grand National complex is the Links course, which is without a single weakness. The par-four 18th hole is without a doubt one of the strongest finishing holes on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. With a course rating of 75.1 and a 135 slope from the tips, the Links course is among the most challenging in the region.

The Short Course is a thing of beauty, with more than half the holes touching the Lake Saugahatchee. This 18-hole course of one-shotters might be the finest anywhere in the country. The Short Course plays 3,328 yards from the back tees.

Grand National is one of 11 sites on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, which features 468 holes on 26 golf courses around the state of Alabama.



FarmLinks at Pursell Farms in Sylcauga - about an hour's drive north of Auburn - has been the No. 1-ranked public course in Alabama three of the last four years.

The course, opened in 2002, is "the world's only research and demonstration golf course," as the course was built with the idea to invite golf superintendents from around the world to see Pursell Technologies' fertilizer and agronomy advances firsthand. Pursell Farms has evolved into a premier regional family farm resort available for Alabama corporate retreats, leisure getaways and weddings.

FarmLinks stretches to 7,444 yards from the back tees with a course rating of 76.3 and a slope of 141.



Auburn Links at Mill Creek
Par 72, 7,090 yards

Auburn Links offers 18 holes of challenging golf and rustic beauty. Designed by Ward Northrup and opened in 1992, the course is open to the public and located just south of Interstate 85 in Auburn.

The course stretches 7,090 yards from the back tees and has a rating of 72.5 with a slope of 129. With one of the best layouts in the area, Auburn Links offers a challenge for players of all skill levels.



Moore's Mill Club
Par 72, 6,871 yards

Designed by Day-Blalock, Moore's Mill Club is carved throughout the rolling terrain, mature hardwoods and towering southern pines, native to Eastern Alabama. Adding to the serenity and beauty of the course is the Moore's Mill Creek, which twists and turns throughout 15 of the 18 holes.

Moore's Mill features a versatile layout, offering just enough challenge for advanced golfers, while remaining player friendly for novice golfers. Numerous bunkers and elevation changes along with the Moore's Mill creek will pose one hazard after another. The course features TifEagle greens, many with severe slope and undulations, along with superbly conditioned tree-lined fairways.

The course is located on the former site of a mill named for one of East Alabama's earliest settlers and millwrights, Spencer Moore. Designers Day-Blalock enhanced the essence of the historical Moore's Mill, by incorporating the remnants of two millraces and the mill's foundation into the course. Hole No. 8 offers a great view of the original mill wheel carved in the hillside and surrounded by rock pilings.



Saugahatchee Country Club
Par 72, 6,800 yards

Saugahatchee Country Club in Opelika was ranked one of the top-five courses in the state of Alabama by Golf Digest, and the Columbus Ledger-Enquirer said the club had four of the best 18 holes in the Chattahoochee Valley. The Ward Northrup-designed championship course spans 6,752 yards from the back tees with a rating of 72.4 and slope of 133.

The course was closed for just under a year in 2012-13 as the green complexes were rebuilt at a cost of \$1.2 million. In addition, square footage of bunkers was reduced from 83,000 feet to 75,000 feet, but 10 new bunkers were added to the course, bringing the total to 71. The course reopened in August 2013 with Champion Ultra Dwarf Bermuda greens. The course, at its current location, opened in 1976.



Just opened in the Fall of 2013 is the new South Donahue Residence Hall. The 245,000-square-foot facility is conveniently located across the street from the Auburn Athletic Complex and the Charlotte G. Lowder Academic Development Center.
