**Jennifer George • Florida
Junior • Forward • Orlando, Fla.**

- Jennifer George was the catalyst in Florida winning its own Gator Holiday Classic, as she totaled 34 points and 23 rebounds en route to earned MVP honors.



- George posted a double-double in both tournament wins, extending her double-double streak to four games, the first time a Gator has strung together as many since Vanessa Hayden did so midway thru the 2003-04 season.

- George shot an incredible 72.2 percent from the floor during UF's two games during the week, hitting 13-of-18.
- George blocked five shots during the tournament and increased her career total to 98, two shy of becoming the eighth Gator to block at least 100 shots.
- In the championship game she pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds – one shy of her career-high – and helped snap Duquesne's program-record eight-game winning streak.

Freshman of the Week

**Hasina Muhammad • Auburn
Guard/Forward • Memphis, Tenn.**

- Auburn freshman Hasina Muhammad stepped up last week, averaging 12.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.0 blocks and 1.5 steals per game.
- Muhammad had a big game against Central Connecticut State, starting and scoring 16 points, 12 of which were in the second half, to drive the Tigers to the 49-40 victory.
- She also pulled down a career-high eight rebounds against CCSU while averaging 6.5 for the week.
- Muhammad was also among the defensive leaders for Auburn, blocking two shots with two steals against CCSU alone.



- Muhammad has scored in double figures in seven games this season and has scored 15 or more in three games.
- She is now Auburn's leading scorer on the season with 10.7 points per game.

Team Notes

Alabama

Alabama improved to 9-4 on the season with a 65-47 victory over the Presbyterian Blue Hose on Monday at Foster Auditorium. Junior guard/forward Erin Hogue scored a career-high 16 points to lead a balanced Crimson Tide scoring attack that saw Alabama put four players in double-digits. Senior guard Ericka Russell and sophomore guard Jasmine Robinson each scored 11 points while junior guard Meghan Perkins added 10. The Tide outscored Presbyterian 44-19 in a dominant second half performance that followed up a somewhat sluggish first half. Alabama shot 17-of-27 (63 percent) from the field in the second half after connecting on just 6-of-24 (25 percent) in the first half. For the game, Alabama held a 28-16 advantage on points in the paint, a 25-11 advantage in points off turnovers and a 24-6 difference in bench points. The 44 points are the most the Tide have scored in a second half this season. Alabama will have 11 days off before hosting Air Force at Foster Auditorium on Dec. 30. Tip-off is set for 6:30 p.m. CT.

Arkansas

Dominique Robinson scored a career-best 20 points in the first half against Texas Southern going on to a 26 point game. Robinson was 8-for-8 in the first half and 11-for-12 in the game, with a pair of three-pointers leading Arkansas to its highest team point total, largest margin of victory and highest shooting percentage of the season. The two wins moved Arkansas to 10-1 and the Razorbacks have won 10 in a row. Arkansas returns from the holiday break hosting Mississippi Valley State in the final game before SEC play.

Auburn

The Auburn women's basketball team (7-4) went 1-1 last week, finishing third at the New York Life Holiday Tournament hosted by Hofstra. The Tigers fell to Marist, 69-61, in the first game, but rebounded for a 49-40 win over Central Connecticut State. Junior Blanche Alverson led Auburn for the week, averaging 13.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 steals per game. She scored 20 points against Marist, hitting four 3-pointers, becoming just the second Tiger to score 20 or more points in a game this season. She also collected six steals against CCSU, a mark that ranks her in a tie for ninth all-time at Auburn in single-game steals. For her efforts, Alverson was named to the New York Life Holiday Invitational All-Tournament Team. Also stepping up was freshman Hasina Muhammad with 12.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. She scored 16 points, with 12 coming in the second half, to lead Auburn in its win over CCSU. The Tigers will break for a week before taking on North Carolina-Charlotte at 7 p.m. CT, Dec. 29 in the first round of the FIU Sun & Fun Classic. The Tigers will then take on either host FIU or Albany in the second round.

Florida

Florida has a few days off for the holiday before returning to the court and playing host to Samford on Dec. 28 in the team's final non-conference game of the year. The Gators then open their SEC slate at home against nationally-ranked Kentucky on Sunday, Jan. 1. Jennifer George has posted a double-double in the last four games, the first time a Gator has done so since

Vanessa Hayden midway thru the 2003-04 season. George was named MVP of the 2011 Gator Holiday Classic after totaling 34 points and 23 rebounds while shooting 72.2 percent from the floor in the two wins. Senior Jordan Jones and sophomore Jaterra Bonds also were named to the All-Tournament Team. During the Dec. 21 win against Duquesne, Jordan Jones sank her 250th career three-pointer. Against Charleston Southern on Dec. 20, Azania Stewart blocked her 160th career shot and moved into fourth place all-time at UF.

Georgia

Georgia reached the holiday break with a 10-2 record. Last week, the Lady Bulldogs lost to No. 25 Gonzaga and defeated Montana State and Appalachian State. Georgia scored the first six points of the game against Gonzaga and led the rest of the way until the Zags' game-winning three with two-tenths of a second left on the clock. Jasmine Hassell scored 21 points versus Gonzaga, her second 20-point outing in a three-game span. Hassell and Khaalidah Miller scored 13 points to lead the Lady Bulldogs to victory over Montana State. Hassell was named to the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic after averaging 17.0 ppg by shooting 65.0 percent from the field and 88.9 percent from the line against Gonzaga and Montana State. Georgia played Appalachian State without starting point guard Jasmine James, who suffered a slight knee sprain against Montana State. Khaalidah Miller scored a season-high 23 points and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds against Appalachian State – her first career double-double. Krista Donald notched career highs of 22 points and 13 rebounds versus the Mountaineers. Donald's 13 boards and 10 FGs made against App State are single-game highs for the Lady Bulldogs this season. Jasmine Hassell posted her first double-double of the season against Appalachian State (13 points and 11 boards). Georgia held Appalachian State to 35 points fewer than its season average entering the contest. The Lady Bulldogs built a 32-10 halftime lead over App State, the fewest points in a half by a UGA opponent since N.C. Central's six in Nov. 2008. Georgia returns to action on Dec. 28 when the Lady Bulldogs host Furman. UGA begins SEC play on Jan. 1 against Arkansas. Georgia is 7-0 all-time against Furman, including a 3-0 mark in Athens. UGA leads its series with Arkansas, 25-4, including an 11-2 record in Athens.

Kentucky

No. 8 Kentucky improved to 11-1 on the season with a 90-61 win over Samford on Wednesday in Memorial Coliseum. UK hit a season-high 54.7 percent from the field, marking its highest field goal shooting performance since hitting 57.1 percent vs. Miami Ohio on Dec. 1, 2009. Sophomore center Samantha Drake led six players in double figures and recorded a near perfect game as she scored a team-high 18 points on 6-6 shooting from the field and 6-7 shooting from the foul line. In the last two games, Drake is an impressive 14-17 (.824) from the field, averaging 19.5 points per game. UK has now won 31 consecutive home games vs. nonconference opponents and holds a 12-game home winning streak which ranks as the sixth longest in school history. Wednesday marked UK's final home game of 2011 as the Wildcats will hit the road for their next two games following the holiday break. The Cats will meet Middle

Tennessee on Dec. 28 and open conference play at Florida on Jan. 1.

LSU

Senior forward LaSondra Barrett led a trio of double-figure scorers with 15 points as the LSU women's basketball team built a double-digit halftime lead and withstood a late charge from Grambling to win its fifth straight game, 62-47. LSU (8-3) remained perfect in the month of December this season. The Lady Tigers broke for the Christmas holiday for three days before resuming practice on Dec. 26 in preparation for one final non-conference game - at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 29 - prior to the start of Southeastern Conference play on Jan. 1.

Ole Miss

Ole Miss improved to 9-3 this season after wins over Cleveland State and Murray State in the Magnolia Classic. Nikki Byrd is fifth in the nation in rebounding (11.4 rpg). Byrd recorded her eighth double-double of the year with 14 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Murray State. Valencia McFarland recorded her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 assists in a win over Cleveland State. Freshman Amber Singletary recorded a career-high 15 points against Murray State while freshman Danielle McCray scored a career-best 12 against Cleveland State. Ole Miss shot a season-best 57.1 percent from the floor in a win over Cleveland State. No opponents has shot more than 50 percent from the floor against Ole Miss. Byrd stretched her team-leading double-digit scoring streak to 13 games dating back to last season. Ole Miss will continue its five-game home stand on December 29 with a game against SELA.

Mississippi State

Mississippi State improved to 9-2 overall as it routed Louisiana-Lafayette 72-38 in the final home non-conference game of the season. State wrapped the home pre-SEC slate 8-0. MSU closes non-conference play Dec. 29-30 at the Peppermill Holiday Classic in Reno, Nev. State opens play against Oklahoma State before meeting either host Nevada or Long Island the following day. Senior guard Diamber Johnson sparked State's win against the Ragin' Cajuns, collecting her second-career double-double with 14 points and 10 assists. Her 10 dishes tied her career high, and she moved into a tie for 10th in career assists. MSU had a season-high 21 assists, the most since last year's squad had 21 in a win against Buffalo. The Lady Bulldogs also had 18 steals, the most since the season-opening win against Jacksonville State. State forced a season-high 27 turnovers, scoring 29 points off those turnovers. The team's 44.9-percent shooting percentage is the highest since the JSU win. Senior Ashley Brown paced State with 15 points while pulling in seven rebounds. Since joining the starting lineup, Brown has averaged 9.2 points and rebounds in six games. Fellow senior Porsha Porter added 13 points in the win, giving her 20.3 ppg in the team's last three games.

South Carolina

South Carolina picked up its 10th win of the season with a 65-30 win over Savannah State Wednesday afternoon. It marks the

first season since head coach Dawn Staley assumed the reins that the Gamecocks have reached double-figure victories prior to the start of conference play. With a 10-2 record, it is South Carolina's best start to a season since opening the 2002-03 campaign with a 13-1 mark. While defense has been the staple of the success, the Gamecock offense has found its rhythm in recent games. In the last four games, South Carolina has averaged 70.5 points and shot better than 43.0 percent from the field.

Tennessee

After compiling a 3-1 record prior to the Christmas holidays, UT now returns to action on Dec. 28 when the Lady Vols host Old Dominion in Knoxville. Tennessee jumps into SEC play at Auburn on New Year's Day, Jan 1. Rookie point guard Ariel Massengale returned to the court after missing three big games with a dislocated finger on her left hand. Massengale injured the hand in practice on Dec. 9 and missed games vs. DePaul, at Rutgers and at UCLA. She returned for limited minutes at Stanford. Lady Vol senior Shekinna Stricklen continues to sport the nation's longest starting streak. She has started 114 consecutive game. Against Stanford, Lady Vols trailed at halftime for the first time this season. Against the Cardinal, UT lost the rebounding battle for the second-consecutive game (third time in 2011-12), pulling down 29 boards to Stanford's 35. In the loss at Stanford, Shekinna Stricklen led UT in scoring, putting up a career-high 27 points on 10-of-17 shooting; 10 field goals made also ties a career high. Stricklen added to her 2011-12 double-digit scoring streak. She has put up 10 or more in all 10 games this season. Senior Glory Johnson had a solid effort on the west coast swing versus UCLA and Stanford. She came up with a season-high 18 points for the Lady Vols against the Cardinal. It topped her previous high of 17 points set against UCLA in the previous game. Twenty-two more wins will put Lady Vol Coach Pat Summitt at her next victory milestone: 1,100 wins. Glory Johnson needs 54 rebounds to reach the 1,000 career boards plateau.

Vanderbilt

The No. 25/23 Vanderbilt women's basketball team improved to 11-1 with a 64-59 victory over ACC foe Florida State on Thursday, December 22, at Memorial Gym. In a game that was won on defensive end and the glass, Vanderbilt center Stephanie Holzer paved the way, scoring 17 points and matching a career-high 13 rebounds to collect her sixth career double-double. Christina Foggie added a game-high 18 points, while Jasmine Lister scored 10 points and dished out six assists. Kady Schrann scored seven points while Elan Brown added seven points and six rebounds. The Commodores win and they will return to action on Thursday, December 29, when they play host to Western Carolina. Tipoff at Memorial Gym in Vanderbilt's final non-conference game of the season is set for 7:00 p.m.

Preseason Polls & Accolades

- Five SEC teams were ranked in the national preseason polls. Tennessee was ranked third in both Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches polls. Georgia was ranked 13th in AP and 12th in the coaches, while Kentucky received enough votes to be 18th in AP and 15th in coaches. LSU was 21st in AP and 22nd in coaches, while Vanderbilt received votes in both polls.
- The media predicted Tennessee to win the regular season title. Tennessee topped the order of finish with 264 points, with Georgia (228), Kentucky (212), LSU (189), Vanderbilt (172) and Florida (151) rounding out the top half of the league. Arkansas (142), South Carolina (107), Auburn (94), Alabama (55), Mississippi State (54) and Ole Miss (48) round out the bottom half.
- Tennessee's Shekinna Stricklen was the overwhelming choice of the media for SEC Women's Basketball Player of the Year. Joining Stricklen on the All-SEC First Team are Georgia's Jasmine James, Kentucky's A'dia Mathies, LSU's LaSondra Barrett and Tennessee's Glory Johnson.
