THE GAME

Auburn plays its first Halloween game since 1998 when the Tigers host Ole Miss in an SEC West showdown Saturday. Auburn has won the last two meetings in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The game will kick off at 11:21 a.m. CT and be televised by the SEC Network.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn leads the series 24-9, and holds an 11-2 edge in games played in Jordan-Hare Stadium.
- ▶ Auburn will be playing just its second game ever against a team ranked 24th in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. The previous game was a 1996 Independence Bowl victory over Army.
- ▶ Auburn will be playing its first home day game of the season. The Tigers have already played a school-record five night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium.
- ▶ Auburn is seventh in the nation in rushing offense (230.4), 19th in total offense (430.9) and tied for 26th in scoring offense (31.8).
- ▶ If Auburn plays in a bowl game, the Tigers' current pace of 430.9 yards per game would result in a school-record 5,601 yards of offense by the end of the season.
- ▶ Auburn has scored touchdowns on 69.2 percent of its red zone trips (18 of 26), which ranks third in the SEC.
- ▶ Auburn has only allowed nine sacks through eight games this season, which is tied for 20th best in the nation.
- ▶ Ben Tate ranks 11th nationally in rushing (115.4), and has five 100-yard rushing games this season.
- ▶ Tate ranks fifth in school history in rushing (2,882 yards) and needs just 77 more to post the 18th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history.
- ▶ Auburn has 14 touchdown passes this season, including 12 from Chris Todd. Last year, Auburn had just seven touchdown passes as a team during the entire season.
- ▶ Sophomore Darvin Adams and junior Terrell Zachery have combined for 48 catches for 798 yards and nine touchdowns. They entered this season with a combined five catches for 42 yards and no scores.
- ▶ Wes Byrum ranks tied for second nationally in field goal percentage (91.7) among kickers who have attempted at least 10 field goals.
- ▶ Junior linebackers Craig Stevens (69 tackles) and Josh Byner (67) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in the SEC in tackles.
- ▶ Antonio Coleman leads the team with seven tackles for loss, and ranks sixth in school history with 18 career quarterback sacks.

AUBURN-OLE MISS SERIES NOTES

This is the 20th consecutive year that the two schools have faced each other ... Auburn has won the last two meetings in Jordan-Hare Stadium since the Rebels' last victory in Auburn in 2003 ... The last two meetings have been the two lowest-scoring games in the series since 1998 ... The two teams scored a total of 44 points in the last two games combined, after seven of the previous eight games saw the teams combine for at least 40 points ... The largest margin of victory in the series is 41 points when the Tigers defeated the Rebels, 41-0, in 1985 ... Auburn has scored a rushing touchdown in 26 of the last 27 meetings (1999 the only exception) in the series ... Auburn has had 20 rushing touchdowns in the last nine games against Ole Miss, while the Rebels have just six rushing TDs during that span, including only two in the last seven years ... Ole Miss' 233 yards rushing in last year's game was 54 more than the Rebels had in the three previous meetings combined ... There have been three shutouts in the series, all in games won by Auburn.

OLE MISS CONNECTIONS

- ▶ Auburn defensive line coach Tracy Rocker coached the Ole Miss defensive line for Houston Nutt in 2008. Rocker also coached the defensive line for Nutt at Arkansas from 2003-07.
- ▶ Ole Miss defensive line coach Terry Price held the same position at Auburn from 1999-2008. Price and Rocker are also cousins.
- ▶ Auburn offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn was the offensive coordinator for Houston Nutt at Arkansas during the 2006 season.
- ▶ Auburn running backs coach Curtis Luper played running back at Oklahoma State from 1984-87 while Houston Nutt was the Cowboys' wide receivers coach. Rebels running game coordinator/offensive line coach Mike Markuson was a graduate assistant on the staff during Luper's final season in 1987.
- ▶ Ole Miss special teams coordinator/tight ends coach James Shibest coached former Auburn players Rudi Johnson (RB) and Daniel Cobb (QB) at Butler County CC. Shibest was a receiver at Arkansas from 1983-86 and had five catches for 84 yards and a touchdown in a 21-15 loss to Auburn in the 1984 Liberty Bowl.
- ▶ Ole Miss linebacker Patrick Trahan spent two years at Auburn, redshirting in 2005 before playing in 12 games in 2006, collecting 11 tackles including one tackle for loss.

MISSISSIPPI TIGERS

Auburn has three players on its roster from the state of Mississippi: DB Daren Bates (Olive Branch), DB Drew Cole (Picayune) and OL Aubrey Phillips (Olive Branch).

ALABAMA REBELS

Six members of the Ole Miss squad are from the state of Alabama: redshirt freshman LB Josh Lancaster (Mobile), redshirt freshman S Griffin Littlefield (Pike Road), sophomore WR Vincent Moss (Munford), freshman LB D.T. Shackelford (Decatur), freshman RB Tim Simon (Cordova) and redshirt freshman OL Joshua Tatum (Marbury).

OLE MISS QUICK HITTERS

Ole Miss is off to its best start since 2003 with a 5-2 record ... Over its last 11 games, Ole Miss is averaging 35.7 points per outing ... The Rebels rolled up 553 yards of offense and 31 first downs during a 30-17 victory over Arkansas last Saturday ... Dexter McCluster had career highs of 123 yards rushing and 137 yards receiving against Arkansas, becoming the first Rebel in the modern era to have 100 yards rushing and receiving in the same game ... Quarterback Jevan Snead has thrown multiple TD passes in 11 of his last 13 games ... Ole Miss ranks ninth nationally in scoring defense (13.6), 14th in pass defense (166.9) and 20th in total defense (300.0) ... The Rebels also lead the SEC and rank 11th nationally in sacks (3.0 per game) ... Kicker Joshua Shene is a perfect 8-of-8 on field goal attempts this year.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn has an all-time record of 6-6-1 on Oct. 31. The Tigers have not played on Halloween since 1998, when Auburn fell 24-21 at Jordan-Hare Stadium to No. 14 Arkansas. From 1953-1987, Auburn played six times on Halloween, all against Florida, and won five of the contests. The last of those contests, in 1987, was a 29-6 rout of the No. 10 Gators by No. 6 Auburn in front of a then-school record crowd of 85,187 and a national television audience. That streak also included a 1970 contest in which the Tigers set a school record that still stands, throwing for 442 yards in a 63-14 victory over Florida.

IN OCTOBER

Auburn, which earlier this season concluded its sixth consecutive winning month of September, is 289-149-18 (.654) all-time in the month of October. The Tigers are 24-11 (.686) in their last 34 games in October.

VS. TEAMS RANKED 24TH

Auburn will be playing just its second game ever against a team ranked 24th in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. The only previous time that Auburn played a team ranked No. 24 was when the Tigers faced Army in the 1996 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. Auburn won the game by a score of 32-29.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now celebrating its 70th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers, who set a school record by averaging 86,915 fans last season, are 269-68-7 (.792) all-time at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn has had nine straight winning seasons at Jordan-Hare Stadium, posting a mark of 55-14 (.797) at home since the 2000 season. The Tigers were undefeated at home during two of those seasons, going 7-0 in both 2000 and 2004.

FIRST HOME DAY GAME

Auburn will be playing its sixth home game of the season against Ole Miss, but it will be the first game to start prior to 6 p.m. CT. The Tigers opened with five straight home night games, marking the most night games in a season in Jordan-Hare Stadium in history. The Tigers also played two of their first three road games at night, giving the Tigers seven night games already this season.

Auburn's only other day game was an 11 a.m. CT game at Arkansas, meaning that none of the Tigers' first nine games will start between noon and 6 p.m. CT.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

Auburn has 3,447 yards of offense in eight games this year, which is just 188 yards less than the Tigers had all of season last year (3,635). The Tigers have shown drastic improvement in every offensive category this season. Averages and NCAA rankings from major offensive categories are shown below:

RECORD PACE FOR OFFENSE

Auburn's average of 430.9 yards per game would rank as the fourth highest single-season average in Auburn history, and the highest since 1995. If the Tigers maintain their pace, Auburn would finish the regular season with 5,171 yards, which would be the second most in school history. Should the Tigers play in a bowl game as well, that average would equate to a school-record total of 5,601 yards. The current school record for yards in a season is 5,469, set in 2004.

GAINING GROUND

Auburn ranks seventh nationally in rushing offense, averaging 230.4 yards per game. The Tigers collected 301 yards rushing against Louisiana Tech in the season opener before running for 390 yards against Mississippi State the following week. The last time Auburn had back-

to-back games with at least 300 yards rushing was in 1985, when Auburn had three straight games with more than 300 yards rushing (Ole Miss, 438; Florida State, 413; Georgia Tech, 377).

Auburn's current pace of 230.4 yards per game would rank as the 10th-best single-season average in school history. If the Tigers maintained that pace, the 2765 yards accumulated by Auburn by the end of the regular season would be the seventh most in school history.

200+ GROUND GAMES

Auburn has already posted six games with at least 200 yards rushing. That total already equals the number of 200-yard rushing games that Auburn had in the two previous seasons combined. Auburn had four 200-yard rushing games in 2007, and just two in 2008.

PUTTING UP POINTS

Auburn ranks tied for 26th nationally in scoring offense at 31.8 points per game, and more impressively, it took Auburn just six games this season to score more points than it did in all 12 games last season. Auburn scored 208 points last year, and already has 254 this season.

Auburn scored 40+ points in three straight games against Mississippi State, West Virginia and Ball State, marking the first time the Tigers have ever scored 40 or more points in three consecutive contests.

BIG MAN TATE

Running back Ben Tate is having a stellar senior season, ranking second in the SEC and 11th nationally averaging 115.4 yards per game. Tate has five 100-yard rushing games this season, which is the most by an Auburn player since Kenny Irons had eight in 2005. Tate has also added 13 catches for 66 yards and five kick returns for 139 yards (27.8 yards per return). His average of 141.0 all-purpose yards per game ranks 29th nationally. With 923 yards rushing, Tate has easily surpassed his rushing total from last year, when he led the team with 664 yards. He needs just 77 more yards rushing to post the 18th 1,000-yard rushing season in Auburn history.

Tate ranks fifth in Auburn history with 2,882 career rushing yards. He needs 486 more to catch Joe Cribbs for fourth.

O-LINE PAVES THE WAY

Much of Auburn's offensive success can be attributed to the Tigers' offensive linemen. Tackles Andrew McCain and Lee Ziemba, guards Mike Berry and Byron Isom and center Ryan Pugh have a combined 97 starts under their belt. They have not only helped Auburn rank among the national leaders in scoring offense, total offense and rushing, but have allowed just nine quarterback sacks this season, which is tied for 20th nationally. Virtually the same group last year surrendered 21 sacks.

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 30 of its last 45 Southeastern Conference games and 31 of its last 46 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back beyond 2004, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the fourth best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-09.

BIG PLAYS

Auburn has demonstrated a knack for making big plays this year, with nine plays of at least 46 yards, including six of at least 60. Chris Todd has thrown passes of 93, 65 and 46 yards to Terrell Zachery and 82 yards to Mario Fannin. Onterio McCalebb has runs of 62 and 48 yards, Ben Tate and Zachery both have runs of 60 yards and Neil Caudle had a 52-yard scamper. Last season, Auburn had just four plays all year that covered at least 46 yards, and none that went for 60.

TODD'S TURNAROUND

Senior quarterback Chris Todd has shown drastic improvement this season after offseason shoulder surgery. He has established a career high in passing yards three times this year, first with 255 yards against Louisiana Tech, then with 284 yards against West Virginia, then with 287 yards against Ball State. He also threw for what was then a career-best four scores against the Mountaineers, before tying the school record with five the next week against Ball State. Daniel Cobb is the only other Auburn player to throw for five scores, doing it in an overtime game against Louisiana Tech in 2001.

Todd is the first Auburn quarterback in history to throw at least four touchdown passes in consecutive games, and his nine TD passes in a two-week span were two more than Auburn had as a team during the entire 2008 season.

Todd ranks 28th in the nation in yards per completion (13.07) and 45th nationally in passing efficiency (133.71). His 12 touchdown passes are tied for 30th most in the NCAA.

FROM A TO Z

Sophomore Darvin Adams and junior Terrell Zachery were a pair of unknown wide-outs prior to the season, but both have had breakout seasons. Adams leads the team in catches (28), receiving yards (444) and touchdown receptions (five), while Zachery has 20 grabs for 354 yards (17.7 ypc) and four touchdowns. The duo entered this season with a combined five catches for 42 yards during the course of their careers.

Adams caught three touchdown passes against West Virginia, becoming the first Tiger to haul in at least three scores in a game since Alexander Wright caught four TD passes against Pacific in 1989. Zachery's four TD receptions have averaged 53.8 yards this year, including a school-record 93-yarder.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Auburn's offense has excelled at both striking quickly and putting together sustained drives. The Tigers have had 17 scoring drives that used less than two minutes on the clock, including 14 that resulted in touchdowns. In 12 games last year, Auburn had just 10 scoring drives that took less than two minutes, and only six of those ended with touchdowns.

The Tigers also already have eight scoring drives of at least 10 plays this season, including four that took at least 13 plays. Last year, Auburn only had two scoring drives all season that used at least 13 plays.

FIRST DOWN FLURRY

Auburn is currently 33rd nationally in first downs per game, averaging 20.9. The Tigers have had at least 20 first downs in five games this year, including 29 against Mississippi State and 27 against Louisiana Tech. Last season, Auburn only reached 20 first downs in a game twice all year, with a high of 26 against UT Martin. Auburn had not had as many as 27 first downs in a game since collecting 28 at Arkansas in 2005, and the last time Auburn had at least 29 first downs was in the 2004 SEC Championship game against Tennessee.

CONSISTENCY COUNTS

Auburn's offense has not only been explosive, it has been consistent. The Tigers have scored at least once in 26 of 32 quarters this season, and started the season by scoring in the first 20 quarters of the year. Auburn has scored a touchdown in 21 of the 32 quarters played this year, including a streak of 14 in a row earlier this season.

GOING FOR SIX IN THE RED ZONE

Auburn's offense has been efficient in the red zone, as the Tigers have not only scored on 24 of 26 possessions in the red zone (92.3), which ranks tied for 13th in the nation, but 18 of the 24 scores have been touchdowns. Auburn's TD percentage of 69.2 ranks third in the SEC behind only Ole Miss and Kentucky. Ten of the scores have come on the ground and eight through the air.

BUSINESS AS UNUSUAL FOR MALZAHN

Auburn's gaudy offensive numbers are nothing new to first-year offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn. His Tulsa teams led the nation in total offense in both 2007 (543.9 yards) and 2008 (569.9). Last year's Tulsa team also led the country in third-down conversions (57.0 pct.) and yards per play (7.27). Two of the three previous college squads that he coached finished in the top 10 in the nation in rushing, as the 2008 Tulsa team ranked fifth (268.0 yards) and his 2006 Arkansas squad was fourth (228.5).

In the last three seasons, his teams have reached at least 400 yards of offense in 30 of 36 games (85.7 percent).

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

BYRUM ON TARGET

Junior Wes Byrum has excelled during his junior season, connecting on 12-of-13 field goals and all 30 extra point attempts. Among kickers who have attempted at least 10 field goals, Byrum's percentage of .923 ranks tied for second nationally, and no kicker who has attempted as many field goals as Byrum has a better percentage. Byrum, who ranks fifth in school history with 40 career made field goals, is tied for third in the SEC with 12 field goals and tied for second in scoring with 66 points. He made a career-high four field goals in a 26-22 win at Tennessee, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

DEFENSE HOLDING TOUGH

Auburn's offense has stolen most of the headlines, but the defensive unit has performed admirably despite a rash of injuries.

The Tigers have managed despite missing projected starters or second-stringers S Mike McNeil, CB Aairon Savage, LB Spencer Pybus and DE Nosa Egaue for all eight games, DL Zach Clayton for four games, DE Antonio Carter and DB D'Antoine Hood for three games each and LB Eltoro Freeman for two games.

In addition, DT Sen'Derrick Marks and CB Jerraud Powers left school after their junior years to enter the NFL.

TOTALING THE TAKEAWAYS

Auburn ranks tied for 30th in the nation with nine interceptions and tied for 38th with 15 total turnovers forced. Last year, Auburn had just 11 interceptions during the entire season and forced 18 turnovers in 12 games. The Tigers have spread the wealth, with eight different players grabbing interceptions. Auburn picked off five passes against West Virginia, marking the first time since 2004 (at Tennessee) that Auburn intercepted five passes in a game.

JUNIOR LINEBACKERS LEAD DEFENSE

A pair of experienced junior linebackers have stepped up to lead Auburn defensively this season. Craig Stevens leads the team and ranks fourth in the SEC with 69 tackles, while Josh Bynes is fifth with 67. Last year Stevens had 54 tackles all season, and Bynes had 53. Both players have also recorded interceptions, while Stevens is tied for second on the team with 5.5 tackles for loss and Bynes recorded a safety against Ball State. Stevens has recorded double-digit tackles in three games this season, including a career high 12 at Arkansas.

COLEMAN MAKES AN IMPACT

Antonio Coleman, a first-team preseason All-SEC selection, has 30 tackles including a team best of 7.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks, an interception which he returned for a touchdown against Mississippi State and a fumble recovery. Coleman ranks sixth in school history

with 18.0 career sacks, and his seven tackles for loss this year is tied for ninth in the SEC.

YOUNG GUNS GET FIRST ACTION

A whopping 31 Auburn players have played in their first career games as Tigers so far this season. The list of first-timers included: DB Gabe Barrett, DB Daren Bates, DB T'Sharvan Bell, WR DeAngelo Benton, WR Emory Blake, OL Jorell Bostrom, LB Watson Downs, LB Jonathan Evans, DL Nick Fairley, LB Eltoro Freeman, DE Dee Ford, LB Harris Gaston, WR Anthony Gulley, DS Josh Harris, DE Robert Hill, RB Davis Hooper, DL Chris Humphries, TE Philip Lutzenkirchen, DL Derrick Lykes, RB Onterio McCalebb, DB Ikeem Means, OL Andrew Parmer, DB Blake Poole, LB Ashton Richardson, OL Darrell Roseman, WR Travante Stallworth, OL John Sullen, DL Jamar Travis, DB Demond Washington, WR Jay Wisner and TE Bailey Woods.

FRESH FACES

Auburn has had 19 freshmen (14 true, five redshirt) play this season. Three true freshmen have earned starts this season, including safety Daren Bates, who has started all seven games. Running back Onterio McCalebb and offensive guard John Sullen have started one game each. The 14 true freshmen that have played include: Bates, McCalebb, Sullen, WR DeAngelo Benton, WR Emory Blake, LB Jonathan Evans, DE Dee Ford, LB Harris Gaston, WR Anthony Gulley, TE Philip Lutzenkirchen, DB Ikeem Means, DB Blake Poole, WR Travante Stallworth and DL Jamar Travis.

COMEBACK KIDS

Auburn has had to come from behind in four of its five victories, including a fourth-quarter comeback to defeat West Virginia Sept. 19. The Tigers trailed Louisiana Tech, 7-3, late in the first quarter before pulling away for a 37-13 victory. Auburn fell behind Mississippi State, 17-14, late in the second quarter before storming back for a 49-24 victory. Against the Moutaineers, Auburn trailed by 14-0 less than five minutes in, and 21-10 at the end of the first quarter. West Virginia still led 30-27 entering the fourth quarter before Auburn ended the game on a 14-0 run. The Tigers trailed Ball State 7-0 in the first quarter before scoring the game's next 30 points.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 12 seniors, eight have seen time in at least 30 games during their careers, including five with at least 40 games under their belt. Tommy Trott leads the group, having played in 47 career games, including 45 of a possible 46 over the past four seasons. Gabe McKenzie is the only player who has played in all 46 games since 2006. Antonio Coleman is next with 45 games played, followed by Walter McFadden (44 games), Ben Tate (42), Jake Ricks (39) and Andrew McCain (35).

STARTS STREAK

Junior Lee Ziemba has the longest staring streak on the Auburn squad, having started all 33 games over the past three seasons. Only three other players have starting streaks that date back to the 2007 season. Juniors Zac Etheridge and Ryan Pugh both have started 23 straight contests, while junior Craig Stevens has 21 straight starts under his belt.

Senior Walter McFadden has the fifth-longest streak, having started every game since the start of the 2008 season (20 straight).

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Auburn has won 53 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In the last 23 years, Auburn is 122-2 when scoring 30 points.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

In the last 10 seasons, Auburn is 76-9 (.894) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 119-16-1 (.879) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Auburn has had a knack for winning close games in recent seasons. Since the 2003 Capitol One Bowl, Auburn is 19-10 in games decided by seven points or less, even after posting just a 2-4 record in such games during the 2008 season. Nine of the 19 wins were by three points or less, with just four losses coming by that margin.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

Auburn started the season with back-to-back games of more than 500 yards, totaling 556 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech and 589 yards in the SEC opener against Mississippi State. It marked the first time Auburn had back-to-back games with at least 500 yards of offense since 1970, when the Tigers had 566 yards against Florida and 664 against Mississippi State.

Auburn also totaled 400 yards Sept. 19 against West Virginia, 560 yards Sept. 26 against Ball State and 459 yards Oct. 3 at Tennessee. It

marked the first time Auburn had five straight games with at least 400 yards of offense since games 6-10 of the 1994 season.

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS

Auburn established several firsts during its game against Mississippi State Sept. 12. To begin, Ben Tate and Onerio McCalebb both went over 100 yards rushing for the second straight game, marking the first time in school history that the Tigers have had two 100-yard rushers in back-to-back games.

McCalebb established another first by becoming the first Tiger freshman ever to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the first two games of the season. He had 148 in the opener against Louisiana Tech and 114 against MSU.

Finally, Darvin Adams had 116 yards receiving, marking the first time in school history that Auburn had two 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver in the same game. It nearly marked the second straight game that Auburn accomplished that feat, as Terrell Zachery had 104 yards receiving at one point during the season opener, but lost 6 yards on his final reception and finished with 98 yards receiving for the game.

TOP SEC OPENER TOTAL

Auburn's total of 589 yards of offense against Mississippi State was a school record for the most yards ever in an SEC opener. The previous record was 527 yards in the 1995 season opener against Ole Miss. Auburn's 589 yards were tied for 11th most in any game in school history and tied for fourth most in an SEC game, and the most since the Tigers also had 589 yards at Kentucky in 2005.

SCORES IN THREE STRAIGHT FOR THE D

Auburn's defense scored points defensively in three straight games for the first time since available data dating back to 1967. Antonio Coleman returned an interception 20 yards for a score against Mississippi State, Craig Stevens had a 15-yard interception return for a TD against West Virginia and Josh Bynes recorded a safety against Ball State.

RECORD-BREAKING PLAY

Chris Todd and Terrell Zachery teamed up to make school history during Auburn's season-opening win against Louisiana Tech, connecting on a 93-yard touchdown pass. The play was the longest play from scrimmage in school history, surpassing a 92-yard rush by Ralph O'Gwynne vs. Loyola on Nov. 21, 1936. The longest pass play in school history had been an 87-yard pass from Jason Campbell to Silas Daniels on Oct. 9, 2004, also against Louisiana Tech.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

CHIZIK'S STREAK

Gene Chizik won his first five games as head coach at Auburn, which made him a part of 20 consecutive victories as a member of the Auburn coaching staff. His final season as Auburn's defensive coordinator was during the Tigers' 13-0 2004 season, and Auburn also won its final two games in 2003. The 20 straight victories matches the longest winning streak by any Auburn head coach or assistant coach in school history.

Chizik, who was part of 12 straight wins at Jordan-Hare Stadium during the stretch, is just the third coach in Auburn history to win his first five games as head coach. Terry Bowden won his first 20 games from 1993-94, and Mike Donahue went 5-0 in 1904 before losing the 1905 season opener.

Chizik also became just the third SEC coach since the conference expanded in 1992 to win his first five games, joining Bowden and Houston Nutt, who won his first eight games at Arkansas.

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 46 lettermen from last season, including 24 on offense, 18 on defense and four specialists. Auburn returns seven starters on offense and seven on defense.

Auburn's current roster of 113 players includes 13 seniors, 31 juniors, 27 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 31 freshmen. The underclassmen (69) represent 61.1 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 17.

THE SENIOR CLASS

Head coach Gene Chizik has a senior class that includes 12 players at Auburn in 2009. It marks the smallest senior class at Auburn since the 2001 squad had 10 seniors.

The 2009 seniors include: DE Antonio Coleman, H Clayton Crofoot, P Clinton Durst, OT Andrew McCain, CB Walter McFadden, TE Gabe McKenzie, DB Woody Parramore, DL Jake Ricks, DB Aairon Savage, RB Ben Tate, QB Chris Todd and TE Tommy Trott.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn began the season with eight graduates on its roster, which was tied for fifth most among all FBS schools.

The Tiger graduates included: WR Montez Billings (Public Administration), DE Antonio Coleman (Criminology), CB Walter McFadden (Public Administration), TE Gabe McKenzie (Criminology), DB Aairon Savage (Exercise Science), RB Ben Tate (Criminology), QB Chris Todd (Business Finance) and TE Tommy Trott (Public Administration).

WATCH LISTS

Four members of the Auburn team have been named to watch lists for national awards.

Antonio Coleman leads the way, landing on four watch lists, including those for the Lombardi Award (best lineman or linebacker), Bronko Nagurski Award (best defensive player), Chuck Bednarik Award (best defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (best defensive end).

Ben Tate and Chris Todd have been named to the Maxwell Award watch list, for the nation's outstanding player, while Todd has also been added to the Manning Award watch list. Tommy Trott is on watch list for the John Mackey Award, which goes to the nation's top tight end.

TIGER PROS

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. As of Aug. 24, 37 former Auburn Tigers were listed on NFL rosters. The Seattle Seahawks have the most former Tigers, with four former Auburn players on the roster, while the San Diego Chargers have three. Twenty-seven of the 32 teams have at least one former Auburn player on the roster.

RUNNING BACK FACTORY

Auburn has produced four running backs that are currently on NFL rosters, which is tied for most in the NFL according to information compiled by www.kickoffzone.com. Ronnie Brown, Heath Evans, Tony Richardson and Carnell Williams are all former Tigers who are currently in the NFL. The list also does not include former Tiger Brandon Jacobs, who lettered at Auburn in 2003 before transferring to Southern Illinois. Only three other schools (LSU, Miami (Fla.) and Texas) have produced four current NFL running backs.

UNDER THE LIGHTS AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn has been tough to beat in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including victories this season over each of its first four opponents. The Tigers have accumulated a record of 19-4 since the 2000 season in home games starting at 6 p.m. or later. That stretch includes a 4-1 record against ranked opponents, with wins over No. 1 Florida in 2001, No. 2 Florida in 2006, No. 7 Tennessee in 2003 and No. 14

Georgia in 2000.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Auburn is one of just two teams in the Southeastern Conference that is playing three non-conference games this season against teams that went to bowl games last season. South Carolina is the other.

Auburn opened the season with Louisiana Tech, which won the Independence Bowl last season. The Tigers' second non-conference game was against West Virginia, which defeated North Carolina in the Meineke Car Care Bowl. The following week the Tigers hosted Ball State, which fell to Gus Malzahn's Tulsa team in the GMAC Bowl, 45-13.

This season Auburn is debuting a new weekly 30-minute show offering fans a reality-based, behind the scenes style production that will chronicle the inner-workings of the Tigers' football program through the entire 2009 season. The show may be viewed across the state of Alabama and the Southeast on television stations as well as the Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS) regional cable network. The show will also be streamed via the internet at www.auburntigers.com. The show will air either Friday nights or Saturday mornings in all markets.

TIGERS ON CSS

Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) will broadcast encore presentations of Auburn football every Sunday at 6 p.m. ET/5 p.m. CT with Andy Burcham handling play-by-play duties and Cole Cubelic doing color commentary. CSS will also air the Auburn Football Review every Tuesday at 5 p.m. ET/4 p.m. CT.

CSS is a 24-hour regional sports network serving approximately 5.8 million households across 12 Southeastern states.

A trio of second-half interceptions thwarted several scoring chances as the Tigers dropped a 17-7 decision at Ole Miss in Oxford.

Both teams struggled to find their offense in the first quarter, unable to move out of their own half of the field and punting the ball away three times each.

Ole Miss broke open the scoreless game in the second quarter with a Josh Shene 34-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead at the 5:07 mark.

The Rebels added to their lead with quarterback Jevan Snead conducting an 86-yard drive in eight plays that was capped off by a 2-yard touchdown pass to Shay Hodge.

For the first time this season, Auburn went into the locker room at half-time trailing, 10-0.

Auburn's only score of the game came on its first drive of the third quarter. Kodi Burns hit Chris Slaughter with a 37-yard pass to move the Tigers into Ole Miss territory, then facing a third-and-13, Burns rushed for 15 yards to keep the drive alive. Ben Tate took the handoff on the next play and dashed into the end zone from 27 yards out to narrow the Rebel lead to 10-7.

The first six plays of the third quarter yielded 80 yards of offense for the Tigers after totaling just 80 yards during the entire first half. During the third quarter alone, Auburn's offense had four plays of 20 yards or more, two of which

came during the touchdown drive. Burns also connected with Tim Hawthorne and Montez Billings for 21- and 29-yard receptions, respectively.

Auburn started the fourth quarter driving with Burns completing a trio of passes to Slaughter, including a 42-yard reception to move the Tigers to the Ole Miss 17-yard line. Two plays later, a Burns pass was intercepted and the Tigers' scoring effort was thwarted.

The interception resulted in a Rebel touchdown as Snead connected with Derrick Davis from three yards out for the score and a 10-point advantage, 17-7, with less than seven minutes left in the game.

Burns had numerous career-highs, throwing for a career-best 319 yards on career highs of 27 completions and 43 attempts.

Slaughter caught eight passes for 131 yards, a career high in both receptions and yards. The sophomore became the first Tiger receiver to post a 100-yard receiving game since the 2007 season.

The Tigers finished with 394 yards of total offense, 319 through the air and 75 on the ground. Tate was Auburn's leading rusher with 35 yards on five carries with a touchdown.

Defensively for Auburn, Zac Etheridge recorded a game-leading 10 tackles.

2009 Auburn Football Game Recaps

Carrying a three-point lead into the locker room at halftime, the Auburn offense erupted for 24 second-half points en route to a 37-13 season-opening win over Louisiana Tech under the lights at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The win was also the first for Gene Chizik as Auburn's head coach.

The Tigers put up a balanced 556 yards of total offense in the victory with 301 rushing yards and 255 passing yards. Starting quarterback Chris Todd hit his target on 17-of-26 attempts for two touchdowns and no interceptions.

The highlight of the night for Todd came early in the second half following an interception by freshman Daren Bates. Auburn took over possession at its own 2-yard-line and on third down, Todd found Terrell Zachery down the right sideline for a 93-yard touchdown pass. The play is the longest from scrimmage in Auburn history.

Junior kicker Wes Byrum got the scoring started for Auburn in the first quarter, hitting a 25-yard field goal on the Tigers' first possession.

Louisiana Tech took its only lead of the game at the 5:00 mark of the first quarter as Dennis Morris caught a 19-yard pass from Ross Jenkins. Auburn retaliated on its next possession as Kodi Burns scored the team's first touchdown of the season on a 1-yard run.

With 23 seconds remaining in the first half, Louisiana Tech looked poised to take a 10-10 tie into the locker room following a 20-yard field goal by Matt Nelson, but Auburn marched back down the field, gaining 29 yards on three plays, to set up the 49-yard field goal by Byrum with no time left on the clock for the 13-10 lead.

The Tigers' momentum continued to roll as the third quarter started, beginning with the record-setting touchdown from Todd to Zachery at the 10:59 mark. Byrum connected on his final field goal of the game at the 4:28 mark of the period to give Auburn a 23-10 lead. Tech would follow up on its next possession with a field goal of its own by Nelson, cutting the lead to 23-13.

The Auburn defense kept the Bulldogs scoreless in the fourth quarter, capping off a half in which it gave up only 102 yards of total offense.

With 12:45 left in the game, Todd connected with sophomore Darvin Adams for his first career touchdown on a 17-yard pass. True freshman Onterio McCalebb followed with 5:27 remaining in the game with his first career touchdown as well, scoring on a 3-yard run.

McCalebb finished the game with a game-high 148 yards of rushing, becoming the first Auburn true freshman to run for more than 100 yards in a season opener since Bo Jackson accomplished the feat with 123 yards against Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was not the only 100-yard rusher on the team as senior Ben Tate racked up 118 of his own, marking the first time since 2007 against New Mexico State for Auburn to have two 100-yard rushers. Tate also hit another milestone in the game as he became the 13th Auburn player ever to amass 2,000 career rushing yards. He finished the game with a total of 2,076, ranking him 12th all-time at Auburn.

Zachery led the Auburn receiving corps with 98 yards, followed by Mario Fannin with 82 and Adams with 65.

On the defensive end, Zac Etheridge, Craig Stevens and Josh Bynes finished with eight tackles each to lead the Tigers. Senior Antonio Coleman finished with seven tackles and a sack, giving him 15.5 on his career and a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn in the category.

With the win, Auburn holds an 11-0-1 record all-time against Louisiana Tech and is 90-25-2 in season-opening games.

Kodi Burns accounted for four of Auburn's touchdowns, throwing one and running in three, and Onterio McCalebb and Ben Tate each topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the second straight game as Auburn pulled away from Mississippi State with 28 unanswered points to win 49-24 on Saturday night. Tate carried it 20 times for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown while McCalebb rushed for 114 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown, becoming the first pair of Auburn running backs to top the 100-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games.

Burns had nine rushes for 32 yards, scoring on three 1-yard runs, and also was 1-for-1 passing for 13 yards and a touchdown. Ahead 28-17 at the half, Auburn scored twice in the third quarter as Burns threw his fifth career touchdown pass, a strike to Philip Lutzenkirchen to go up 35-17, and then Tate ran it in from 35 yards out for his first touchdown of the season to put Auburn up 42-17.

Mississippi State had scored 17 consecutive points to take a 17-14 lead with 4:44 left in the second quarter before Auburn answered with two late second-quarter touchdowns. A 1-yard run by Anthony Dixon and a Sean Brauchle 29-yard field goal brought Mississippi State to within four, 14-10, before Robert Elliott returned a blocked Clinton Durst punt for the 17-10 lead.

McCalebb's touchdown, a 48-yard run around the left end, regained the lead for Auburn, 21-17, before Burns scored from 1 yard out with 16 seconds left in the half.

Auburn went up 7-0 on its first possession of the game as Burns capped an eight-play, 73-yard scoring drive with a one-yard rush up the middle for his first touchdown of the game.

An Antonio Coleman 20-yard interception return of a Chris Relf pass put Auburn ahead, 14-0, with 2:21 remaining in the first quarter. The interception was the first of Coleman's career and the touchdown was the second of his career, following a fumble return in the 2007 season-opener against Kansas State.

Burns closed out Auburn's scoring with his third touchdown run of the game with 5:56 remaining as Auburn moved to 2-0 on the season.

Chris Todd was 10-of-23 for 186 yards. Most of those passes went to Darvin Adams as he finished the night with five catches for 116 yards. Along with Tate and McCalebb, Adams combined to mark the first time ever for Auburn to have two 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver in the same game.

McCalebb became the first player in Auburn history to top 100-yards rushing in his first two career games.

Auburn's 49 points were the most it has scored in a SEC game since scoring 49 at Kentucky in 2005. With 589 yards of total offense, it also marked the first time that Auburn had 500 or more yards of total offense in back-to-back games since 1970, when the Tigers had 566 yards against Florida and 664 against Mississippi State.

Defensively for Auburn, Zac Etheridge and Josh Bynes led the way with eight tackles each. Neiko Thorpe and Craig Stevens chipped in seven tackles with two of Stevens' coming for loss. Making his first career appearance as a Tiger, sophomore Eltoro Freeman followed with six tackles.

With the win, Auburn is 43-28-5 in SEC openers.

A year earlier in Morgantown, W.Va., it was Auburn that took a 17-10 lead into the locker room at halftime, only to have the West Virginia Mountaineers out-score the Tigers 24-0 in the second half for the come-from-behind win. Auburn returned the favor Saturday, out-scoring West Virginia 31-9 after spotting the Mountaineers a 21-10 lead to pick up the 41-30 victory and improve to 4-0.

With Auburn's running game, that had averaged more than 300 yards per game in the first two games of the season, limited to just 100 yards against the Mountaineers, the Tigers had to go in another direction to get points on the board. The direction ended up being senior quarterback Chris Todd as he threw for career highs of 284 yards and four touchdown passes. Todd was 16-of-31 on the night, including an 82-yard pass to Mario Fanin that tied the game in the third quarter.

West Virginia took the early lead in the game as Noel Devine ran in for two touchdowns in the first five minutes, including a 71-yard run to put WVU up 14-0. Auburn countered with a 46-yard Wes Byrum field goal to put the Tigers on the board. Senior defensive end Antonio Coleman recovered a fumble at the West Virginia 45-yard line on the Mountaineers next possession, helping to set up a 16-yard pass from Todd to Darvin Adams to cut the WVU lead to four at 14-10. The reception was the first of three Touchdown catches on the night for Adams, making him the first Auburn player to tally three touchdown passes in a game in more than 20 years.

The Mountaineers closed out the first quarter with its third touchdown of the period as quarterback Jarrett Brown found Jock Sanders in the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown pass.

Auburn cut away the West Virginia lead in the second quarter, beginning with a 42-yard Byrum field goal. The field goal was the result of a Neiko Thorpe interception. The Tigers marched back up the field in its next possession, capping it off with a 4-yard touchdown pass from Todd to Adams to cut the WVU lead to one at 21-20.

West Virginia scored its final touchdown of the night halfway through the third quarter as Devine took off for 12 yards to extend the Mountaineer lead to 27-20. Tyler Bitancourt missed the ensuing extra-point attempt, setting up the opportunity for Auburn to tie the game on its next possession.

Less than a minute after the West Virginia touchdown, Todd rolled out of the pocket and found Fanin open on the right side. Fanin cut through the Mountaineer defense to streak down the field 82 yards for the touchdown. Byrum's extra-point tied the game at 27-27.

West Virginia took its final lead late in the third quarter on a Bitancourt field goal, 30-27. Auburn shut the Mountaineers out in the fourth quarter, taking the lead on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Todd to Adams early in the period and sealing the victory with a 15-yard Craig Stevens interception return for a touchdown to give Auburn a 41-30 lead.

Fanin's 82-yard reception led the team in receiving yards, followed by Adams with three touchdowns and 80 yards on six receptions. Eric Smith followed with 67 yards on three receptions.

Ben Tate led the Auburn rushing attack with 81 yards on 19 attempts. Oterio McCaleb followed with 25 total yards.

Defensively for Auburn, Josh Bynes led the team with 12 tackles and an interception while Stevens tallied 11 tackles and an interception. Also picking off passes in the game were Walter McFadden, Thorpe and lineman Jake Ricks.

Chris Todd tied an Auburn record with five touchdown passes as the Tigers tallied 560 yards of total offense in a 54-30 win over Ball State. The game marked the second in a row to have a delayed start as thunderstorms in the area forced the game to move from its 6 p.m. scheduled kickoff time to 6:30 p.m.

Ball State struck first against the Tigers, recovering a muffed punt on Auburn's 18-yard line. Four plays later, MiQuale Lewis took the ball around the right side to get Ball State in the end zone at the 12:26 mark in the opening period for its only lead of the game.

Following a Ball State fumble, the Tigers moved the ball to the BSU 6-yard-line, setting up a pass from Todd to Tommy Trott, giving the senior his first touchdown reception of the year with 2:53 remaining in the first quarter.

Heading into the second quarter with the game tied, 7-7, Auburn managed to put up a near record-setting performance while limiting the Cardinals to just a field goal. The Tigers tallied 26 points in the period with three touchdowns and a safety, giving Auburn its highest scoring quarter since racking up 28 against Tennessee-Chattanooga on Sept. 9, 1995.

Terrell Zachery accounted for two of the touchdowns, picking up a 46-yarder at the 13:47 mark and a 65-yarder with 8:22 left in the half. Oterio McCaleb also picked up a touchdown, running in for a yard at the 12:20 mark, immediately after a 62-yard rush put the Tigers in scoring position.

Byrum picked up his first and only field goal of the night with seven second left in the half, connecting on a 32-yard attempt.

The defense also got on the board at the 12:53 mark of the quarter as Josh Bynes tackled Ball State's Lewis in the end zone.

Ball State kicker Ian McGarvey gave the Cardinals their lone points of the quarter, connecting on a 33-yard field goal with 2:35 left in the first half to cut the lead to 30-10.

Auburn made good on its first possession of the second half, taking the opening kickoff and marching down the field to set up a 26-yard pass from Todd to Darvin Adams at the 11:39 mark of the third quarter.

Ball State answered on its next possession as quarterback Page kept the ball on a fake and ran 21 yards for the touchdown.

Auburn did not back down as Todd caught Mario Fanin with a pass in the flat that turned into a 36-yard touchdown reception.

The Cardinals put up 13 fourth-quarter points. Page found Fakes for a 1-yard touchdown pass while McGarvey connected on a pair of field goals.

Neil Caudle gave the Tigers their lone points of the quarter, breaking away for a 52-yard run for a touchdown.

Todd finished the night with 19 completions on 26 attempts for a career-high 287 yards and five touchdowns. Two of those touchdowns went to Zachery, who finished the night with 122 receiving yards on five catches. Adams followed with 73 on five receptions while Fanin was third on the team with 55 yards on three catches.

McCaleb led the Auburn rushing attack with 83 yards and a touchdown. Ben Tate finished second with 63 yards, but led the team in all-purpose yards with 139 after racking up 58 yards from kick returns.

Defensively for Auburn, the Tigers were led by Daren Bates' seven tackles. Josh Bynes, Neiko Thorpe, Craig Stevens and Harris Gaston each finished with six tackles on the night while Bates, Stevens, Dee Ford, Antonio Coleman and Mike Blanc combined for Auburn's five quarterback sacks.

With the win, Auburn improves to 3-0 all-time against Ball State and 7-0 all-time against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

Wes Byrum connected on a career-high four field goals while the Auburn offense racked up more than 400 yards of offense for the fifth time this season as the Tigers (5-0, 2-0 SEC) pulled out the 26-22 win over Tennessee (2-3, 0-2 SEC) at Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tenn.

The game was Auburn's first road game of the season and extended its winning streak to five games over the Volunteers, surpassing the previous record of four-straight victories from 1961-64. The Tigers also pulled out the win in front of a crowd 102,941, the third-largest crowd Auburn has ever competed in front of.

Auburn scored twice in the first quarter with Byrum connecting on a pair of field goals. His first was a 29-yarder at the 5:01 mark in the quarter while the second was a 43-yarder at the 3:36 mark.

Ben Tate scored Auburn's first touchdown of the game at the 8:07 mark of the second quarter, breaking away on an 11-yard run to extend the Tiger lead. Byrum's kick put Auburn ahead 13-0.

Tennessee got on the board with 28 seconds remaining in the first half as Montario Hardesty rushed in for a yard, cutting the Auburn lead to 13-6. Auburn's Nick Fairley blocked the extra-point attempt by Tennessee's Daniel Lincoln, giving the Tigers their first blocked kick of the season.

The Tigers struck first in the second half with Byrum picking up his third field goal of the night, connecting on a 19-yard attempt with 9:34 left in the third quarter.

Auburn extended the lead to 23-6 at the 13:41 mark of the fourth quarter as Chris Todd connected with Terrell Zachary on an 11-yard touchdown reception. Byrum made good on the extra-point attempt following the touchdown.

Tennessee struck back at the 11:36 mark with a 31-yard pass from Jonathan Crompton to Hardesty. Lincoln connected on the extra-point attempt to close to the gap to 23-13.

But, Auburn and Byrum put the win away with a 22-yard field goal with 39 seconds left to play. The Volunteers marched up the field on the ensuing possession, culminating with a 32-yard pass from Crompton to Denarius Moore with no time left on the clock, but it was all for naught as Auburn held on for the 26-22 win.

Onterio McCalebb led Auburn with 204 all-purpose yards, tallying 51 rushing yards while leading the team with 62 receiving yards and 91 kick-return yards. Tate

Ben Tate had his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season for Auburn but Kentucky scored 14 fourth-quarter points as Auburn lost to the Wildcats, 21-14, at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Oct. 17.

Tate had 31 carries for 132 yards, his third straight game with more than 100 yards on the ground, but Kentucky's duo of Derrick Locke (19 carries, 126 yards) and Randall Cobb (12 carries, 109 yards) combined for 235 yards and one touchdown on the ground, helping Kentucky to its first win over Auburn since 1966.

Neiko Thorpe's 69-yard return of a blocked field goal gave Auburn a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter. It was Auburn's first blocked field goal returned for a score since 1981 when Chris Martin returned one 77 yards against Georgia Tech.

Jake Ricks blocked the field goal for Auburn, giving the Tigers their second blocked kick of the season.

Kentucky (3-3, 1-3 SEC) tied the game at 7-7 with a six-play, two-and-a-half minute scoring drive early in the second quarter. Morgan Newton capped the drive with a four-yard touchdown run.

Tate's fourth touchdown in his last three games recaptured the lead for Auburn (5-2, 2-2 SEC) with just six seconds remaining in the first half, putting Auburn up 14-7. Tate, who now has 19 rushing touchdowns in his career, carried it six times on the 14-play, 48-yard drive to give him 38 yards on the ground at the half.

After neither team could put together a scoring drive in the third quarter, Kentucky tied the game at 14-14 with 6:29 left in the game as Will Fidler took a quarterback draw back up the middle for a two-yard touchdown run, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

Cobb's touchdown run with 3:17 remaining put Kentucky ahead for good at 21-14. Cobb accounted for all of Kentucky's yards on the five-play, 68-yard drive, which included a 61-yard rush on second and six from the Kentucky 32.

Tate's became the first Auburn running back go for 100-plus yards in three consecutive games since Kenny Irons did it in 2005.

Kodi Burns finished second on the team in rushing with 38 yards on six carries, followed by Onterio McCalebb with 22 yards on seven carries.

No. 9 LSU was too much for Auburn in Baton Rouge on Oct. 24 as they defeated the Tigers 31-10 before a crowd of 92,654 at noisy Tiger Stadium.

Three turnovers and penalties plagued Auburn in the first half, and while the offense struggled against what Head Coach Gene Chizik called "one of the best defenses in the country," Auburn fought to the end--scoring its only touchdown on the last play of the game.

Auburn's offense finished with a total of 193 yards--with 151 of them coming in the second half. Ben Tate again led Auburn with 67 yards on 18 carries, while Mario Fannin added 56 yards on just six carries.

LSU jumped out to a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter when quarterback Jordan Jefferson found Terrance Toliver in the corner of the end zone on a 14-yard scoring strike.

The Bengal Tigers went ahead 14-0 late in the first quarter after an Auburn turnover deep in its own territory. LSU sacked Todd and forced a fumble at the Auburn 16. Jefferson scampered in from 15 yards out three plays later, stretching the LSU lead to 14-0 with 1:10 remaining in the quarter.

Trailing 14-0, Auburn had its back against the wall as LSU drove to the Auburn 2-yard line, but the Tiger defense came up with a big stop when Zac Etheridge slung Jefferson to the turf, forcing a fumble that Craig Stevens recovered in the end zone, giving Auburn the ball on its own 20 with 10:03 left in the half.

Auburn's final drive of the first half was set up when Antonio Coleman and Mike Blanc sacked Jefferson for a 10-yard loss back to the LSU 23, forcing a punt that set Auburn's offense up at midfield.

The Tigers moved into LSU territory but a sack for a big loss forced an Auburn punt. LSU's ensuing drive was blunted by another sack, as Coleman dropped Jefferson for a two-yard loss.

Auburn committed its third turnover of the half on the ensuing punt, though, when Philip Pierre-Louis fumbled the return. LSU took over at the Auburn 36 with 1:42 left in the second quarter. LSU drove to the Auburn 15 but had to settle for a 32-yard field goal by Josh Jasper to go ahead 17-0 with :09 remaining in the half.

LSU took advantage of a short field on the opening drive of the second half, going 45 yards in 4 plays to go ahead 24-0 on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Jefferson to Brandon LaFell less than two minutes into the third quarter.

Auburn responded with big runs by Ben Tate on a 53-yard, 9-play scoring drive deep into LSU territory. The Tigers settled for a 24-yard Wes Byrum field goal

Auburn's defense was led by freshman linebacker Eltoro Freeman, who had 12 tackles, including a sack and 2 tackles-for-loss, in just his fourth career start. Neiko Thorpe was second on the team with eight tackles.
