AROUND THE SEC

• **Vanderbilt's Lance Goulbourne**, a 6-foot-7, 225-pound junior forward from Brooklyn, N.Y., was named SEC Player of the Week after he averaged 14.5 points and 13.0 rebounds in wins over Ole Miss and 22nd-ranked St. Mary's (Calif.). Goulbourne, who leads the SEC in rebounding in SEC games only, had 14 points and 16 rebounds against the Rebels and 15 points and 10 boards against the Gaels. The 16 rebounds against Ole Miss was a new career-high and tied the Stallings-era record in a single game. They are also the most in an SEC game this season. The two double-doubles are the first two of his career.



• **Kentucky's Brandon Knight**, a 6-foot-3, 185-pound guard from Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., was named SEC Freshman of the Week after averaging 18.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals in games at Alabama and at South Carolina. Knight scored in double-figures for the 13th and 14th straight games last week. He recorded his eighth 20-point game with a game-high 23 points in UK's win at South Carolina. The eight 20-point games ties for third most by a freshman in school history, one off the record. Has hit 13 triples over the last four games. Knight pulled down a career-high seven rebounds in win at South Carolina.



• The Jan. 24 NCAA RPI has seven SEC teams ranked in the top 100: Kentucky 13th, Tennessee 17th, Vanderbilt 18th, Florida 19th, Georgia 42nd, Ole Miss 73rd and South Carolina 81st.

• The SEC's four teams ranked in the top 20 of the NCAA RPI are the second-most of any conference in the nation.

• Five SEC teams are receiving mention in the latest Associated Press poll. Kentucky is ranked 14th, Vanderbilt is 19th and Florida is 24th while Georgia and Tennessee are receiving votes.

• In the latest NCAA rankings, 10 SEC teams rank in the top 100 for blocked shots per game. Kentucky ranks third nationally (6.8 bpg), South Carolina is fourth (6.7 bpg) and Arkansas is seventh (6.4 bpg) nationally.

• Florida's Billy Donovan earned his 340th victory at Florida on Dec. 22. He currently currently has the third-most wins by an SEC coach with 346. He trails only Kentucky's Adolph Rupp (875) and LSU's Dale Brown (448).

• Seven of the SEC's top 20 scorers are freshmen. Kentucky's Terrence Jones leads all SEC rookies and ranks third overall with 18.3 point

• The SEC is 4-4 against teams ranked in the Top 10 of the Associated Press poll with wins over No. 3 Pitt (Tennessee), No. 6 Kansas State (Florida), No. 7 Villanova (Tennessee) and No. 8 North Carolina (Vanderbilt). Overall, the SEC is 9-9 against non-conference opponents ranked in the Associated Press Poll at game time.

2011 SEC Tournament

March 10-13 • Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga.

The 2011 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament will be held in a familiar setting as the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga., again plays host to this event. The Georgia Dome, a world-class facility with basketball seating configuration of 26,000, serves as the site of the 12-team tournament for the ninth time in 14 years and the 10th time overall in league history. The Georgia Dome has hosted the SEC Tournament in 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008 and has been the site of the NCAA Tournament Final Four in 2002 and 2007. The 2011 event will mark the 13th time Atlanta has played host to the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament (1933, 1934, 1987, 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008).



The winner of the 11-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds, conference championship and division titles are determined by the 16-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded by their divisional finish and features Eastern Division-Western Division matchups in every game should the higher seed win each contest.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year lay-off (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2010 tournament will be the 51st in league history and the 32nd since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 23 of the last 30 tournament champions have advanced to at least the Sweet 16 with five of the last 14 going on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 26 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee ranks third with four. Florida and Mississippi State each have three championship trophies and Georgia has two. Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.

Media Tabs Florida as 2011 SEC Champion

Florida was predicted to win the 2011 Southeastern Conference men's basketball championship in voting by a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Each SEC school selected media members that cover their team and additional writers from across the nation were selected by the conference office to form the voting panel.

The Gators are coming off a 21-13 season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. They earned eight first-place votes, topping Mississippi State which earned three votes. Tennessee and Kentucky each received two votes and Georgia garnered one vote as SEC Champion. Florida returns all five starters, including Kenny Boynton, Erving Walker, Chandler Parsons, Alex Tyus and Vernon Macklin while adding one of the top recruiting classes in the nation.

Florida was the media's favorite to win the East with 110 total points (13 first-place votes), ahead of second-place Kentucky's 95 points (three first-place votes). Georgia (72 points) and Tennessee (71 points) were separated by just one point while Vanderbilt and South Carolina rounded out the top six.

In the West, Mississippi State's 118 total points (18 first-place votes) were ahead of Ole Miss' 84 points (two first-place votes). Alabama was picked third with 82 points. Arkansas, LSU and Auburn round out the top six in the West.

Lowe's Senior CLASS Award Candidates

Ole Miss' Chris Warren - a student-athlete who excels both on and off the court - has been tabbed as candidates for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School™, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Three SEC Players On Preseason Wooden List

Three SEC players were on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list that was announced in October by The Los Angeles Athletic Club. The list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. SEC players on the list are: Florida's Kenny Boynton, Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Georgia's Trey Thompkins.

Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the preseason list. These players and others who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for December's Midseason list and the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Five SEC Players On Naismith Award Preseason Watch List

Five players from the Southeastern Conference are listed on the 2010-11 Naismith preseason watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Nov. 16.

Included on the list are Kentucky's Brandon Knight, Florida's Chandler Parsons, Vanderbilt's Jeff Taylor, Georgia's Trey Thompkins and Ole Miss' Chris Warren. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

UK's Knight Named Cousy Award Finalist

Kentucky's Brandon Knight is among 20 finalists for the Bob Cousy Award candidates for nation's top point guard as announced by The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

The Bob Cousy Award is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard. Nominations are solicited from across the country from head coaches and the winner is selected by a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee made up of the biggest names in college basketball.

Strong NBA Presence

The Southeastern Conference maintains its strong presence in the NBA for the 2010-11 season as 40 former players were on 20 of the 30 NBA team's rosters to open the season. Nine of the 12 SEC schools have former standouts holding roster spots at the beginning of the league's 65th season.

Kentucky tops the list with 13 and former players on the rosters of 12 different NBA squads. Florida lists nine players on eight teams while LSU has seven former players with six different franchises. Boston, Chicago and San Antonio each have four former SEC standouts on its team while Charlotte, Miami and Orlando all have three SEC alums on their rosters.

Bolstering the list of former SEC players, Alabama has four former players in the league. Arkansas has three players while Auburn, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee each have one.

Pat Riley (Kentucky) and Ernie Grunfeld (Tennessee) highlight the front office list as team presidents for the Miami Heat and Washington Wizards, respectively. The NBA also lists nine assistant coaches who attended college at a current SEC institution.

Poll Worthy

The SEC is the one of just two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the Associated Press top 25 (excluding pre-season polls) since 1999-00. Simply stated, every SEC team has been a top-25 team nationally at one point in the last 10 seasons.

Big Attendance Numbers, Again

More than 2.5 million fans have witnessed SEC basketball in each of the last four seasons. The SEC posted the fourth-largest season attendance in league history, totaling **2,518,749** fans for games featuring SEC teams in 2009-10. A record 2,638,852 fans saw SEC basketball in 2008-09 while 2,562,073 were in attendance in 2006-07 and 2,561,545 for the 2007-08 season.

Kentucky and Tennessee were both ranked among the top five nationally in average attendance. The Wildcats led the nation with an average of 24,110 fans per game while the Vols were fourth with an average of 19,168.

The SEC is 43-22 (66.2 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 12 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

How Sweet It Is

The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 20 of the last 21 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

SECond To None

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979)

Spreading The Wealth

Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

Triple-Doubles

SEC players have recorded eight triple doubles in the past three seasons, including two players who have achieved the feat this season.

Vanderbilt's **Brad Tinsley** became the 20th SEC player to record a triple-double when he achieved the feat in the Commodores' season-opener against Presbyterian on Nov. 12, 2010. His 11 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists marked the first triple-double in Vanderbilt's 110-year history.

South Carolina's Sam Muldrow became the 21st SEC player to record a triple-double when he had 16 points, 14 rebounds and a school record 10 blocks against Vanderbilt on Jan. 8, 2011. It marked just the second triple-double in South Carolina history.

Alabama improved to 12-7 overall and 4-1 in the league for the first time since 2004-05 with Saturday's win at Auburn. the Tide has now won seven of its last eight games. - Auburn became the 10th opponent this season held to fewer than 60 points and the third in SEC play. and the Tigers shot 38 percent to become the 14th opponent to shoot less than 40 percent this season against the Tide's defense. UA's defense also held UK to a season-low 66 points. UA's defense is ranked eighth nationally in points allowed at 57.3 points per game. opponents .360 field goal percentage is the second lowest mark in the nation and the 0.83 points allowed per possession leads the nation. That defense had a season-high 15 steals against Auburn. UA is 2-1 in SEC road games this season, tying last year's total and is the most league wins on the road since the 2005-06 team won three league road games. JaMychal Green's free throw with 17:10 left in the first half was his 1,000th career point at UA. He finished the game with 1,014 career points, 43rd all-time in UA history ... Alabama hosts LSU on Saturday at home where it is 11-0 this season. the Tide has led for all but 16:57 of the 400 minutes of basketball played at Coleman Coliseum this season and are holding visiting squads to just 50.0 points per game in those 11 contests.

The Razorbacks had a tough week on the road dropping an overtime decision at South Carolina before a loss at Florida on Saturday night. The Razorbacks played very well in the Carolina contest coming back from an early deficit to take a second half lead, but could not find the scoring touch that it needed in the closing moments. The Razorback losses are the first back-to-back losses by Arkansas this season. Sophomore Marshawn Powell continues to step up his game now that his is fully recovered from his off season injury. The Newport News, Va., native has double digits in scoring in each of his last five games which is the second longest streak of his career behind a seven-game stretch that spanned the months of December and January last year. Senior Delvon Johnson also continues to play well, leading the SEC in blocks for all games and leading the conference in shooting percentage for SEC only statistics. The Razorbacks are home on Tuesday night when they take on the Auburn Tigers at 8 p.m. at Bud Walton Arena before going on the road on Saturday to take on the Vanderbilt Commodores in Nashville, Tenn.

This is the 41st meeting between the Tigers and Razorbacks with Arkansas holding a 24-16 series lead. The two teams split last season, each winning at home. Auburn defeated Arkansas 92-83 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum while the Razorbacks defeated the Tigers 82-79 in overtime in Fayetteville. Auburn is 3-16 in Fayetteville, including a 2-15 mark in Bud Walton Arena. The Tigers* three wins in Fayetteville came in a 73-51 victory (Arkansas' worst loss ever in the 16-year history of Bud Walton Arena) on Jan. 24, 2009, a 52-37 victory in Bud Walton Arena on Jan. 11, 2003, and in a 100-89 victory over the eighth-ranked Razorbacks in 1993, the final season of Barnhill Arena. Tony Barbee and John Pelphey played against each other twice during the 1991-92 season. Barbee and UMass under coach John Calipari lost to Pelphey and the Wildcats 90-69 in Rupp Arena in Lexington. UMass and Kentucky met again that year in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 as the Wildcats pulled out an 87-77 victory in Philadelphia. The win set up the classic between Kentucky and Duke when Christian Laettner nailed the 3-pointer at the buzzer to put the Blue Devils into the Final Four en route to their 1992 National Championship. Auburn assistant coach Randall Dickey is a native of Valley Springs, Ark., 75 miles from Fayetteville. He was an all-state selection in basketball and all-conference in baseball at Valley Springs High. Dickey earned his bachelor's degree in Education from Ouachita Baptist in 1983 where he was a four-year letterman and three-year starter from 1979-83. He earned honorable mention All-Arkansas and honorable mention NAIA District 17 honors.

The University of Florida improved to 15-4 overall and 4-1 in SEC play with a convincing 75-43 win in its most complete effort of the season. In the process, UF held its second straight SEC opponent under 45 points for the first time since 1947. Combined with holding Auburn to 40 points on Thursday, it was the fewest two-game point total allowed in SEC play under Billy Donovan (83 points). The previous low was a two-game stretch in 2005 when UF allowed 90 points in victories over Georgia (38) and Kentucky (52). Kenny Boynton had 20 points, his highest total since Nov. 23, hitting 4-of-7 threes on the night. Just as importantly, he was solid defensively again, locking down Rotnei Clarke, holding him scoreless on the night. Alex Tyus and Vernon Macklin had 13 points each, while Chandler Parsons had a career-high 15 rebounds. The Gators hit 50 percent from the floor and held Arkansas to just 29.4 percent from the floor and 14.3 percent from three-point range. UF improved to 5-1 over the last two seasons when having three days or less between regular season games in SEC play. Georgia wraps up a 3-game homestand Tuesday night when it entertains Florida in the two teams' first encounter of the 2011 season. The Bulldogs enter this game with a 14-4 overall record, 3-2 in SEC play and a game behind the Gators in the early East Division standings. Most recently, Georgia defeated Mississippi State 86-64 on Saturday in a game highlighted by dominant rebounding (48-23) and season-best 3-point shooting (57.9%) by the host Bulldogs. Indeed, it's been 21 years since Georgia amassed a +25 rebounding ledger against an SEC team, going back to a 1990 win over Kentucky (53-25 rebs.). The win was Georgia's 14th for the season, equaling the Bulldogs' victory total in all of 2010. The game also marked Georgia's third consecutive sellout for the first time since 2007. Florida leads the overall series between these two programs 103-98, largely on the strength of its recent success. Gator teams have won 12 of the past 14 meetings. The two Georgia victories, however, came in the past two seasons, most recently a 78-76 win on Feb. 27, 2010 in Athens. Georgia remains within the Eastern Division this Saturday when the Bulldogs complete their regular-season series with Kentucky. They opened the SEC schedule with a 77-70 victory over the Wildcats in Athens. Georgia is on track to have a positive Assist / Turnover Ratio for the first time since 2003. Leading the way is junior Dustin Ware, who ranks 2nd among all NCAA Division I players in this category in the most recent national rankings. Ware is second on the team with 70 assists and has committed just 17 turnovers this season, none in the past two weeks.

The Tigers play just one game this week with the mid-week bye and will face Ole Miss Saturday at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in the first game of the SEC Network doubleheader at 12:30 p.m. CST. LSU is 2-1 after splitting games last week, downing Arkansas at home and losing on the road at Kentucky. Garrett Green had double figure games in both contests, both off the bench, playing 34 minutes against Arkansas to record his second double double in an eight-game period with 10 points and 10 rebounds, while against Kentucky he played 26 minutes and had 13 points and nine boards, including career best two three-point field goals in the game. Green has had all six of his LSU career double figure scoring games in the last eight contests and leads the team in scoring and rebounding in SEC play with an average of 13.7 points per game and 8.0 rebounds a game. Matt Derenbecker, who has started the three conference games for the injured Ralston Turner, is averaging 10.3 points per game in the conference play. This will be the final home game in January for LSU, who leads the Ole Miss series by a 116-82 count and a 74-28 advantage in games played in Baton Rouge. Ole Miss swept both games last year.

Ole Miss earned its first league victory with a 78-51 rout at LSU on Saturday. It snapped the Rebels' 0-4 start to SEC play, which was its worst since the 2000 season when they dropped five straight games to start conference play but still went on to earn an NIT postseason berth. Chris Warren led four players in double figures with 18 points. Zach Graham added 17, Nick Williams 14 and Terrance Henry his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Reginald Buckner blocked six shots, one off his career high. The 27-point margin marked Ole Miss' biggest SEC road win since a 94-64 drubbing at Georgia Tech in 1952 and LSU's worst SEC home loss since 1996. Warren continues to lead the nation in free-throw percentage at 94.8 percent. His current streak of 35 straight conversions from the foul line is two shy of the school record and ranks 15th in league history. He is three 3-pointers shy of tying for fifth place in SEC history in career treys. Ole Miss fell 84-74 at Vanderbilt on Wednesday, with Warren and Dundreous Nelson sharing team-high honors with 17 points each. The Rebels return home from the two-game road swing to play Tennessee on Saturday, followed by nationally ranked Kentucky on Tuesday.

Junior guard Dee Bost is now just 72 points shy of becoming the 33rd player in school history to score 1,000 points for a career. With 5 assists at Georgia against Auburn, Dee Bost now has 370 for his career, the sixth most in school history. Ravern Johnson now has 1,277-career points, the 17th most in school history. The Bulldogs are two home wins shy of winning at least 10 for the 13th time with Rick Stansbury at the helm. MSU is still looking for its first win on a Saturday (0-6) this season. The Bulldogs have won eight in a row against Vanderbilt in Starkville. The Commodores' last won at the Hump came in February of 1993, 80-39. Rick Stansbury-coached teams are 35-38 all-time against teams from the Eastern Division in the regular season and 45-46 overall. In the last four years, MSU is 16-10 versus the East, including action in the SEC Tournament. Against Georgia, MSU was out-rebounded 48-23, marking the largest margin on the boards since being out-rebounded by Kentucky last February at Humphrey Coliseum, 52-35. The 23 rebounds tied for the fewest in SEC play with Rick Stansbury at the helm. Last year against Florida in the SEC Tournament, MSU also had 23. However, the two offensive boards marked the fewest for MSU under Stansbury, while the fewest total rebounds came in the 2002 NCAA Tournament against Texas, 22.

South Carolina split a pair of SEC road contests last week, suffering a 57-47 loss at Alabama on Wednesday before rebounding with a convincing 72-69 win at Florida on Saturday. Carolina hit season lows with just 16 shots made for a 28.6 (16-56) field goal percentage vs. the Crimson Tide. The Gamecocks rebounded with a win at Florida on Saturday, leading the majority of the contest, including a 10-point advantage at halftime. South Carolina out-rebounded Florida 39-36. The Gamecocks entered the matchup leading the SEC in rebounding margin (+7.3). The Gamecocks have now out-rebounded 11 of 16 opponents this season. Carolina collected 14 offensive rebounds in the contest, just below its season average of 14.4 per game. Sophomore forward Lakeem Jackson tallied a team high three offensive rebounds vs. the Gamecocks. Freshman point guard Bruce Ellington tallied his sixth 20-point effort of the season with 23 points vs. Florida. It marked the seventh time this season Ellington has led, or shared the team lead, in scoring. His 23 points marked his second-highest point total of the season (season high of 31 vs. Furman). Senior forward Sam Muldrow blocked three shots in the contest. He has now blocked 25 shots in the last four games for a 6.25 blocks per game average during the stretch. South Carolina newcomers accounted for 48 of the 72 Gamecock points scored in the contest (Ellington 23, Richardson 10, Harris 8, Cooke 7). The Gamecocks begin a three-game homestand hosting Arkansas on Wednesday.

The Tennessee Volunteers split a pair of games last week, handing Georgia its first home loss of the season on Tuesday before falling at eighth-ranked UConn Saturday. UT held National Player of the Year frontrunner Kemba Walker to a season-low 16 points during the loss to the Huskies. At 12-7 (2-2 SEC), the Vols' remaining 12 regular-season games are all league clashes, with head coach Bruce Pearl unable to coach in the four upcoming contests per a suspension handed down from SEC Commissioner Mike Slive earlier this season. In the first four games of Pearl's eight-game suspension, UT went 2-2 under the direction of acting head coach Tony Jones. Tennessee's opponents are shooting .400 from 3-point range over the last three games, but the Vols are 2-1 during that span. UT's +5.0 rebounding margin in SEC play is second only to Georgia (and the Vols out-rebounded the Bulldogs in Athens). Junior shooting guard Scotty Hopson continues to lead the Vols in scoring with 16.2 ppg this season. Freshman forward Tobias Harris' 17.3 points per game in SEC play rank sixth in the conference and second among league freshmen. Harris' 8.8 rebounds per game in SEC play rank tied for third in the entire league. Harris' overall scoring average of 15.3 ppg ranks fourth among all freshmen in the six "major" conferences. Four of Tennessee's 28 wins last season came against this week's opponents, as the Vols defeated both LSU and Ole Miss twice last season. The Vols host LSU Wednesday (8 p.m. ET, SEC Network) before playing at Ole Miss Saturday (4 p.m. ET, SEC Network).

The Commodores went 2-0 on the week wins over Ole Miss and St. Mary's. Vanderbilt moved to 2-2 in league play with the win over Ole Miss, and 3-1 in games (North Carolina, Georgia, St. Mary's) against ranked opponents this year with the win over St. Mary's. The 19-point win against St. Mary's matches the third largest margin of victory over a ranked opponent in the Stallings era. The win over the Gaels marked the largest margin of victory over a ranked non-conference foe in the Stallings era. Vanderbilt has now won 21 consecutive games against non-conference opponents at Memorial Gym and finished the season 9-0 against non-conference foes at home. Saturday was the fourth time this season Vanderbilt has shot 50% or better from beyond-the-arc (11-22); the Commodores are 4-0 in those games.
