NOTABLES

Auburn improved to 4-0-0 with a pair of overtime wins in the Auburn Classic this past weekend ... The #16 Tigers defeated #22 Dartmouth, 1-0, as Amanda Garcia converted on a PK for the first game-winning goal of her career ... The Tigers then needed a second overtime to knock off William & Mary, 2-1, as freshman Caitlin King scored her first career goal ... The goal by William & Mary 57 seconds into the second half marked the first time AU has trailed in a game all season as it was the first goal that AU has allowed all season ... This is the fourth time that Auburn has started a season 4-0-0 (2004, 2002, 2001) ... Auburn's Soccer America ranking of #10 is the highest in program history ... The win on Sunday was the 150th in head coach Karen Hoppa's career ... 86 of those wins have come at the helm of the Tigers and she is now the fifth active SEC coach to have won 150 games in a coaching career (Becky Burleigh, Don Staley, Warren Lipka and Brian Lee) ... The Tigers hit the road for the first time this season this weekend, traveling to the Illinois tournament where they will face Portland State on Friday and then the host Illini on Sunday.

SCOUTING THE VIKINGS

Portland State heads to Champaign looking for its first win - and goal - of the season as the Vikings have been shutout in four straight games to start the season 0-3-1. PSU lost to Pacific and Long Beach State, 1-0, to open the season and then fell to Toledo, 4-0, this past weekend in Flagstaff, Ariz., before playing to a scoreless tie against Ball State on Sunday.

Cris Lewis has played the majority of minutes in net for PSU, allowing six goals in 270 minutes while Rachel Jarvis as not surrendered a goal in 120 minutes. Juli Edwards leads the team with eight shots, seven of which have been on goal.

SCOUTING THE ILLINI

Host Illinois opened the season with a 1-0 win over South Carolina but have gone winless since, getting shutout in three straight contests, which included a 1-0 loss to Texas on Sunday in double-overtime. Ella Masar has scored UI's lone goal on the season and the Fightin' Illini have used three different net-minders, with Lindsey Carstens seeing the most action (233 minutes).

TIGERS IN THE RANKINGS

Auburn entered the top-10 for the first time since Nov. 2, 2004 when Soccer America released its poll, ranking the Tigers 10th in the nation. The ranking is the highest in school history in the Soccer America poll and the Tigers have only been ranked higher in any of the four major polls (NSCAA, Soccer America, Soccer Times, SoccerBuzz) four times (#9 - NSCAA - Nov. 2, 2004, SoccerBuzz - Sept. 16, 2002; #10 - NSCAA - Oct. 25, 2004, SoccerBuzz - Nov. 3, 2003).

The Tigers are also ranked in all four polls for the first time since Nov. 9, 2004 when they were #12 in Soccer Times, #16 in SoccerBuzz and NSCAA and #22 in Soccer America. This is also just the fifth time that AU has been ranked in all four polls in one week, the other four times all coming in the 2004 season (Oct. 18 through Nov. 9).

TIGERS AGAINST THE RANKED

With Auburn's 1-0 win over #22 Dartmouth las Friday night, it gave the Tigers their second win over a ranked team this season. Auburn's record for wins over ranked squads in a season is three in 2001, when AU defeated #6 Virginia (1-0), #16 Tennessee (2-1) and #19 Georgia (3-2). The Tigers will have to wait at least another week before facing a ranked team as neither Portland State or Illinois are ranked this week.

AU's school record for winning percentage against ranked teams in a season (more than one game) is .500 from the 2004 season when the Tigers went 2-2 against top-25 opponents. AU was 1-5 against ranked opponents a year ago.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK ZEROS

Auburn shutout its first three opponents for the first time in school history. The record for consecutive shutouts is four, set in the middle of the 2002 season. AU's run of scoreless play ended just 57 seconds into the second half against William & Mary on Sunday, ending AU's scoreless streak at 319:31 for the season.

FREE SOCCER

Auburn's back-to-back overtime victories in the Auburn Classic marked the first time in school history that the Tigers had won back-to-back overtime contests. In the five previous times that AU played back-to-back OT games, two times AU tied both (1994, 1996), once it lost the first game and tied the second (2001), once it tied the first and lost and the second (2003) and once it lost the first and won the second (2005).

The last time AU won a pair of OT games in a single season was in 2000 when AU went 2-1 in overtime contests. The only other time AU won two OT games in a single season was in 1994.

REACHING 150

With two victories this past weekend, Auburn Head Soccer Coach Karen Hoppa reached the 150 career win plateau. She is the fourth coach currently coaching in the SEC to have reached the 150 career wins mark. All of her wins have come at either Auburn (86) or Central Florida (64).

FRESHMEN MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Auburn's freshman class had an immediate impact during the opening weekend, collecting three goals and three assists as Auburn won back-to-back games to open the season. Lizzie Hamersly, Kasey Warren and Becca Howell all scored in the 4-0 win over Jacksonville State while Gabi Rivera and Caitlin King joined Warren in chipping in assists in the opening weekend.

RETURN OF JAC

After missing the 2005 campaign due to a leg injury suffered during the preseason last year, senior Jac Schwarz returns for her fifth and final year on the Plains. An offensive catalyst, she has assisted on 16 goals in her career, putting her sixth in the AU annals. Her next assist with tie her with Jill Palmer (1995-98) for fifth on the AU career chart.

In the first weekend of action, Schwarz tallied her first goal since the 2003 season as she headed in a cross from Gabi Rivera for her 10th career goal.

New Auburn assistant coach Keidane McAlpine (pronounced KEH-donny Mik-al-pine) joined the Auburn soccer staff on July 20. He came to the Tigers after a five-year run as the head coach at Birmingham Southern.

AUBURN - Junior Sarah Steinmann scored her second goal of the day in overtime as the Auburn soccer team defeated Illinois 2-1 here Sunday afternoon at the AU Soccer Complex.

Steinmann started off the scoring for the Tigers at 9:48 as she took passes from Jada Stewart and then Chrissy Culver. Steinmann received the pass from Culver and broke through the Illinois defense to send a shot past Fighting Illini goalkeeper Leshia Alcía.

Illinois tied up the game in the second half Jessica Bayne header past Auburn's Megan Rivera just inside the right post. Bayne's header was set up by Christen Karniski's direct kick from and Auburn foul right outside the box.

At the end of regulation, Auburn and Illinois were tied at 1-1 and were to play a 10 minute overtime period.

With just 3:09 remaining in the first overtime, Erin Hinson and Lindsay Giblin set up another Steinmann goal. Giblin crossed the ball to Steinmann, who was far down the left side. Steinmann took the bad angle and sent the shot over Alcía's head for the 2-1 win.

Kristin Stewart went down the right side of the 10-yard box to create the collapse of the AU offense as the UT defense was packed in the box and then fired a cross into the box. The ball ricocheted off of a UT defender and past Pfenninger, sending the crowd of 2,259 into a frenzy.

The game was very physical in the second half as Auburn was flagged nine times for fouls while Texas was whistled just three times. Texas also muscled up 10 shots to Auburn's two, but a stout Auburn defense and quick reflexes by Whitworth preserved Auburn's first season-opening victory over a ranked team since a 2-0 win over #17 West Virginia to kick off the 2002 campaign, when AU went on to win the SEC Championship.

The two teams played a scoreless first half with neither team putting up a sustained attack. Auburn was out-shot by the Longhorns, 5-4, but their hustle was evident as the Tigers had three corners to UT's one.

The crowd was the second largest home crowd in Auburn soccer history.
