- 

• **Florida's Kenny Boynton**, a 6-foot-2, 183-pound sophomore guard from Pompano Beach, Fla., was named SEC Player of the Week after he scored 15 points in leading the Gators to a win over sixth-ranked Kansas State. Boynton earned MVP honors of the Orange Bowl Classic after shooting 6-of-12 from the field. With the Gators' leading in the second half, Boynton went on a personal 8-0 run knocking down two threes and a jumper that broke the game open, broke Kansas State's back, and gave UF a 17-point lead, its largest of the night. Boynton was equally good on the defensive end holding All-American Jacob Pullen to just 6-17 shooting, and just 1-7 on three-point attempts. Boynton's defensive effort spearheaded the fewest points ever surrendered by UF against a ranked opponent, while holding a ranked opponent under 50 points for the first time in nearly 43 years.

• **Alabama's Trevor Releford**, a 6-foot-1, 180-pound guard from Kansas City, Mo., was named SEC Freshman of the Week after averaging 11.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists against Southeastern Louisiana and Oklahoma State. Releford made half of his 18 shots from the field on the week. He scored in double figures in both games and has scored in double digits six times this season. Releford is tops among freshmen point guards in assist-to-turnover ratio. He had four assists to one turnover in a season-high 36 minutes against Oklahoma State.
- The SEC is 4-3 against teams ranked in the Top 10 of the Associated Press poll with wins over No. 3 Pitt (Tennessee), No. 6 Kansas State (Florida), No. 7 Villanova (Tennessee) and No. 8 North Carolina (Vanderbilt).
- Four SEC teams are receiving mention in the latest Associated Press poll. Kentucky (13th), Tennessee (19th) and Florida (20th) are among the Top 25 while Vanderbilt is receiving votes.
- Six SEC players are on preseason watch lists for either the John R. Wooden Award or the Naismith Award. Jeff Taylor (VU) and Trey Thompkins (UG) are listed on both preseason lists. Kenny Boynton (UF) is on the Wooden list while Brandon Knight (UK), Chandler Parsons (UF) and Chris Warren (UM) are on the Naismith watch list.
- Brandon Knight (UK), Bruce Ellington (SC) and Chris Warren (UM) are among Bob Cousy Award candidates for nation's top point guard.
- The SEC finished with a 3-1 record in the fourth annual SEC/Big East Invitational. Arkansas and Kentucky earned victories over Seton Hall and No. 23 Notre Dame, respectively, on Wednesday, Jan. 8, in Louisville, Ky. Tennessee upset No. 3 Pittsburgh while Auburn fell to Rutgers at the CONSOL Energy Center in Pittsburgh on Dec. 11.

2011 SEC Tournament

March 10-13 • Georgia Dome • Atlanta, Ga.

The 2011 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament will be held in a familiar setting as the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga., again plays host to this event. The Georgia Dome, a world-class facility with basketball seating configuration of 26,000, serves as the site of the 12-team tournament for the ninth time in 14 years and the 10th time overall in league history. The Georgia Dome has hosted the SEC Tournament in 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008 and has been the site of the NCAA Tournament Final Four in 2002 and 2007. The 2011 event will mark the 13th time Atlanta has played host to the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament (1933, 1934, 1987, 1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008).



The winner of the 11-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds, conference championship and division titles are determined by the 16-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded by their divisional finish and features Eastern Division-Western Division matchups in every game should the higher seed win each contest.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year lay-off (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2010 tournament will be the 51st in league history and the 32nd since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 23 of the last 30 tournament champions have advanced to at least the Sweet 16 with five of the last 14 going on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 26 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee ranks third with four. Florida and Mississippi State each have three championship trophies. Arkansas, Auburn, Georgia, LSU, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.

Media Tabs Florida as 2011 SEC Champion

Florida was predicted to win the 2011 Southeastern Conference men's basketball championship in voting by a select panel of both SEC and national media members. Each SEC school selected media members that cover their team and additional writers from across the nation were selected by the conference office to form the voting panel.

The Gators are coming off a 21-13 season and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. They earned eight first-place votes, topping Mississippi State which earned three votes. Tennessee and Kentucky each received two votes and Georgia garnered one vote as SEC Champion. Florida returns all five starters, including Kenny Boynton, Erving Walker, Chandler Parsons, Alex Tyus and Vernon Macklin while adding one of the top recruiting classes in the nation.

Florida was the media's favorite to win the East with 110 total points (13 first-place votes), ahead of second-place Kentucky's 95 points (three first-place votes). Georgia (72 points) and Tennessee (71 points) were separated by just one point while Vanderbilt and South Carolina rounded out the top six.

In the West, Mississippi State's 118 total points (18 first-place votes) were ahead of Ole Miss' 84 points (two first-place votes). Alabama was picked third with 82 points. Arkansas, LSU and Auburn round out the top six in the West.

Lowe's Senior CLASS Award Candidates

Ole Miss' Chris Warren - a student-athlete who excels both on and off the court - has been tabbed as candidates for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School™, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

The candidate class will be narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Three SEC Players On Preseason Wooden List

Three SEC players were on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list that was announced in October by The Los Angeles Athletic Club. The list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. SEC players on the list are: Florida's Kenny Boynton, Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Georgia's Trey Thompkins.

Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the preseason list. These players and others who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for December's Midseason list and the official voting ballot released in March. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

The 35th annual Wooden Award ceremony, which will include the announcement of the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, a special tribute to Coach Wooden and Wooden Award founder Duke Llewellyn, and the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award, will take place the weekend of April 8-10, 2011.

Five SEC Players On Naismith Award Preseason Watch List

Five players from the Southeastern Conference are listed on the 2010-11 Naismith preseason watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Nov. 16.

Included on the list are Kentucky's Brandon Knight, Florida's Chandler Parsons, Vanderbilt's Jeff Taylor, Georgia's Trey Thompkins and Ole Miss' Chris Warren. The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2010-11 college basketball season. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2011 NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston.

In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will vote to narrow the list to the four finalists.

Three Named Cousy Award Candidates

Brandon Knight (UK), Bruce Ellington (SC) and Chris Warren (UM) are among Bob Cousy Award candidates for nation's top point guard as announced by The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

The Bob Cousy Award is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard. Nominations are solicited from across the country from head coaches and the winner is selected by a Blue Ribbon Selection Committee made up of the biggest names in college basketball.

Strong NBA Presence

The Southeastern Conference maintains its strong presence in the NBA for the 2010-11 season as 40 former players were on 20 of the 30 NBA team's rosters to open the season. Nine of the 12 SEC schools have former standouts holding roster spots at the beginning of the league's 65th season.

Kentucky tops the list with 13 and former players on the rosters of 12 different NBA squads. Florida lists nine players on eight teams while LSU has seven former players with six different franchises. Boston, Chicago and San Antonio each have four former SEC standouts on its team while Charlotte, Miami and Orlando all have three SEC alums on their rosters.

Bolstering the list of former SEC players, Alabama has four former players in the league. Arkansas has three players while Auburn, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee each have one.

Pat Riley (Kentucky) and Ernie Grunfeld (Tennessee) highlight the front office list as team presidents for the Miami Heat and Washington Wizards, respectively. The NBA also lists nine assistant coaches who attended college at a current SEC institution.

Poll Worthy

The SEC is the one of just two conferences in the nation to have all of its teams ranked at least one week in the Associated Press top 25 (excluding pre-season polls) since 1999-00. Simply stated, every SEC team has been a top-25 team nationally at one point in the last 10 seasons.

Big Attendance Numbers, Again

More than 2.5 million fans have witnessed SEC basketball in each of the last four seasons. The SEC posted the fourth-largest season attendance in league history, totaling **2,518,749** fans for games featuring SEC teams in 2009-10. A record 2,638,852 fans saw SEC basketball in 2008-09 while 2,562,073 were in attendance in 2006-07 and 2,561,545 for the 2007-08 season.

Kentucky and Tennessee were both ranked among the top five nationally in average attendance. The Wildcats led the nation with an average of 24,110 fans per game while the Vols were fourth with an average of 19,168.

The SEC is 43-22 (66.2 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 12 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

How Sweet It Is

The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 20 of the last 21 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

SECond To None

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979)

Spreading The Wealth

Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 SEC schools has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

Alabama returns home to begin a three-game non-conference homestand on Tuesday evening against Lipscomb. The Crimson Tide returns to the friendly confines of Coleman Coliseum where the team is a perfect 5-0 this season. In its last outing, the squad dropped a 68-60 decision to Oklahoma State in Oklahoma City to fall to 5-6 on the season. Alabama has held its opponents to 58.1 points per game and only two of UA's 11 opponents have scored more than 70 points while five have been held to 50 or fewer points. Additionally, nine of the 11 have turned the ball over at a higher rate than their season average against the Tide's defense. Since returning to the lineup against Providence, junior JaMychal Green has averaged 15.7 points and 10.3 rebounds per game while shooting 48.3 percent from the field and 82.6 percent from the free-throw line. Of his 31 rebounds, 15 have come off the offensive glass to tie him for first in the SEC in offensive rebounding. Tony Mitchell, who has scored in double digits in all but one game this season, leads the team in rebounding with 8.1 per game to go along with his 13.5 points per game. Alabama outscored OSU, 20-16, in the paint and has yet to be outscored in the paint this season. UA's last three opponents away from home (Purdue, Providence, OSU) are a combined 30-4 this season.

The Razorback men's basketball team went 1-1 on the week to move to 7-2 on the year with a mid-week victory over Mississippi Valley State and an overtime loss in Dallas, Texas, to No. 25 Texas A&M. Delvon Johnson continues to be a force for Arkansas in the paint with his third consecutive double-double in the MVSU contest (15 points, 10 rebounds) and even though he didn't have the offensive numbers against A&M, he still contributed seven blocked shots which ties for the ninth-best single game total in school history. Johnson has 40 blocked shots on the year, a total that leads the SEC and ranks among the nation's leaders, and is on pace to become the second Arkansas player to record 100 blocks in a year and shatter the Arkansas school record of 112 by Oliver Miller in 1991. Junior Rotnei Clarke was held scoreless for the first time since his freshman year against Mississippi Valley, but returned to the court to hit four three-point baskets and 14 points against the Aggies. Sophomore Glenn Bryant made the most of his minutes this week with his first career double-double against MVSU (12 points, 10 rebounds in 14 minutes) and another solid outing (9 points, 9 rebounds in 28 minutes) against Texas A&M. The Razorbacks have one game this week before taking a holiday break. The Hogs play Texas Southern on Wednesday, Dec. 22 at Bud Walton Arena.

This is the first meeting between the Tigers and Spartans. Auburn head coach Tony Barbee is 1-0 coaching against USC Upstate. Barbee's UTEP Miners defeated USC Upstate 77-69 in the Sun Bowl Tournament on Dec. 21, 2007, in El Paso, Texas. The USC Upstate game on Tuesday is Auburn's final contest prior to the holiday break. The Tigers have eight days in-between games as Auburn will play host to Georgia Southern on Dec. 29 in Auburn Arena. Georgia Southern is coached by former Auburn assistant Charlton Young. Young spent seven years at Auburn from 1994-96 as an administrative assistant and 1996-97 and 2000-04 as an assistant. Junior Frankie Sullivan has played in Auburn's last two games, averaging 4.5 points and 2.5 assists in 15.0 minutes per game. He played nine minutes at South Florida on Dec. 15 in his first game action of the season after coming back from left knee surgery on July 27. He missed Auburn's opening eight games this year. The Uniontown, Ala., native drained a 3-pointer with a second left, was fouled and made the free throw as Auburn closed to within 28-24 at halftime. He finished with four points, two assists and two steals. Sullivan totaled five points, three assists and two steals in 20 minutes vs. Presbyterian on Dec. 18. Last season, Sullivan averaged 12.7 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.9 steals for Auburn while starting all but one of the 31 games. He scored a career-high 27 points vs. Florida in Auburn's SEC Tournament first round loss. Auburn is in the midst of playing its final five non-conference games all at home. The Tigers lost to Presbyterian College 62-59 on Saturday, play USC Upstate on Tuesday, Georgia Southern on Dec. 29, Grambling on Dec. 31 and Florida State on Jan. 3.

The University of Florida fell at home to Jacksonville, 71-68 in overtime Monday afternoon, snapping a nine-game winning streak in the series for the Gators. Erving Walker had a season-high 21 points, while both Vernon Macklin (13/10) and Alex Tyus (10/11) posted double-doubles but Florida could not overcome 17 turnovers and just 35.6 percent shooting. The Gators out-rebounded the Dolphins 48-31, including 22 offensive boards, and had 24 second chance points. Florida hit just 3-of-14 shots from three-point range as they continue to struggle offensively. The Gators allowed an opponent to reach 70 points for just the second time this season. In their three losses they've surrendered 73.7 points per game, compared to 53.6 points per game in their eight wins. The Gators have another quick turnaround as Radford comes to the O'Dome Wednesday night for UF's third game in five days.

Georgia aims for its fifth consecutive win when it plays host to Big South Conference foe High Point on Tuesday night at Stegeman Coliseum. The Bulldogs improved to 7-2 on the season last Saturday with a 68-59 victory over Arkansas State. The fourth straight victory marked the longest win streak of the Mark Fox era at UGA. Georgia hasn't strung together five wins in succession since the 2007 season. The 9-point margin last Saturday seemed like a relative blowout in a season full of close games thus far. It was the largest since Georgia's win over Colorado in the second game of the season on Nov. 16. The Bulldogs' 21-point lead in the second half was their largest of the season so far. That game also was just the second time this season only one player has played over 30 minutes. Perhaps the most telling aspect of the Arkansas State win was that Georgia handed out at least 20 assists for the second straight game, and that its Assist/Turnover ratio was overwhelmingly positive (20/12). Late in the Arkansas State game, junior Trey Thompkins became the 40th player in UGA history to score 1,000 career points. The most recent Bulldog to reach that milestone was Terrance Woodbury in 2009. Thompkins became the first Georgia player since Ezra Williams (2001-03) to reach 1,000 points in his third collegiate season. It must be noted that two other Bulldogs of fairly recent vintage -- Jumaine Jones and Jarvis Hayes -- reached 1,000 in less than two full seasons. Georgia will waste no time resuming its 2010-11 season after Tuesday's game. The Bulldogs wrap up their pre-Christmas slate of games with a Thursday night contest at Mercer. It will be their third true road game of the season thus far, and it will be Georgia's first time playing at Mercer since Dec. 3, 1994.

Both games will be televised by CST. LSU closes out 2010 at Rice on Dec. 29 (CBS College) before going to Virginia for a Jan. 2 game on FSN's ACC Sunday Night Hoops.

Ole Miss went 2-0 this week with big wins over Mississippi Valley State (101-69) and ETSU (71-50). Tennessee is coming off a rough week that saw it fall from the ranks of the unbeaten and stumble to setbacks against Oakland at home and Charlotte on the road.
