# GUS MALZAHN

HEAD COACH | 6TH SEASON

In five years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to a 45-22 record, five consecutive bowl game, a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and an appearance in the BCS National Championship Game (2013). Malzahn has directed Auburn to four New Year's Day bowl games in five seasons, a program first since 2004-06.

Malzahn, 54-25 in six seasons as a head coach, has directed teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 12 seasons as a collegiate coach, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He led the Tigersto a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship win over Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

This past season, Malzahn's team reached as high as No. 2 in the College Football Playoff Poll and played in the SEC Championship Game for the second time in five seasons, knocking off No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama in a November to remember on The Plains. It was the first time in poll history that a program has defeated two top-ranked teams during the same regular season.

The 2017 Tigers were one of four FBS teams to average more than 225 yards rushing and 225 yards passing and averaged 37.1 points per game in league play. Auburn averaged 40.9 points and 491.1 yards in SEC action, both program bests, while winning five of seven conference games by 21 points or more.

In 2016, Malzahn's team won six consecutive games, the third longest win streak by Auburn in 12 years, while finishing second in the nation's most difficult division, the SEC West. Under his direction, the 2016 Tigers ranked in the top 50 nationally in total offense and total defense, an Auburn first since 2005.

Auburn's balance in 2016 was displayed by a team that ranked first in the SEC and sixth nationally in rushing, coupled with a defense that was seventh in the country in scoring defense and 28th in total defense. The special team units have traditionally been a strong point under Malzahn and were no different in 2016 behind the strong leg of All-America and Groza Award finalist kicker Daniel Carlson.





In 2015, the youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced 11 bowl teams en route to a Birmingham Bowl victory over Memphis. Malzahn's 2014 team was ranked in the nation's top 10 for a majority of the season before finishing 8-5 after navigating the nation's most difficult schedule featuring seven ranked foes.

One of the most innovative offensive minds in football, Malzahn's high-powered offense has averaged 450 yards of total offense and 33 points per game in his five seasons at Auburn.

He has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 11 seasons as a college coach, at least one in each season, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 despite missing significant time with injuries and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, he has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas) and this year, in addition to Pettway, Kerryon Johnson notched 862 rushing yards. Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Since Malzahn's arrival, Auburn has the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 253.9 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) have come under Malzahn's leadership.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and SEC Player of the Year in 2013, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards, is second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In his five seasons, a total of 20 players have been selected in the National Football League draft, first round picks Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) of the 2014 draft. This past spring, offensive lineman Braden Smith, running back Kerryon Johnson and defensive back Carlton Davis were all taken in the second round of the 2018 draft.

Malzahn has coached 10 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn: RB Tre Mason (2013), RS Chris Davis (2013), C Reese Dismukes (2014), PK Daniel Carlson (2015-16-17), DL Carl Lawson (2016), DL Montravious Adams (2016), OL Braden Smith (2016-17), DB Carlton Davis (2017), DL Jeff Holland (2017), and RB Kerryon Johnson (2017). Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center and Carlson was a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist

The Tigers have faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's five years on the Plains facing 28 ranked opponents, including 15 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four CFP Semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn has his coaching staff have been highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive Top 10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in the program's history.

Academically, Malzahn's Tigers have excelled as 100-plus players have graduated since his arrival. In the fall 2016 semester a program-best 56 players posted a 3.0 grade point average.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games.

Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Ark., and played football at Arkansas and Henderson State, earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson in 1990.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander. In March, the Malzahns became grandparents with the birth of grandson Anderson James Peek.

## GREG BROWN

DEFENSIVE BACKS | 2ND SEASON

Greg Brown joined the Auburn program in January, 2017, as the Tigers' secondary coach. A 37-year coaching veteran, Brown has coached three winners of the Jim Thorpe Award, and has 20 years of college coaching experience (with three conference titles and 11 bowl berths) and 17 years of professional experience (15 NFL, two USFL) to his credit.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally. The Tigers allowed just 6.0 yards per pass attempt, seventh nationally, and cornerback Carlton Davis earned All-America and all-SEC honors.

Brown came to Auburn from Missouri, where he coached the cornerbacks in 2016; Mizzou tied for the SEC lead in interceptions and corner Aarion Penton was first team all-SEC.

Brown's impressive resume includes stops at Louisville (2014-15), Alabama (2013), Colorado (1991-93, 2006-09, 2011-12), Arizona (2010), Purdue (1989-90) and Wyoming (1987-88). The only coach to have coached three winners of the Thorpe Award, Brown served as defensive coordinator at Colorado and Arizona.

His professional football experience includes work with the secondary of the New Orleans Saints (2002-05), Atlanta Falcons (1994, 2000-01), San Francisco 49ers (1999), Tennessee Oilers (1997-98), San Diego Chargers (1995-96), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1984-86) and USFL Denver Gold (1983-84). In the last regular season game of 1995, safety Shaun Gayle returned a fourth-quarter interception 99 yards vs. the New York Giants for the winning score to put the Chargers in the playoffs in a win-or-go-home game.

During his NFL career, he coached nine Pro Bowl players: Ashley Ambrose (Atlanta), Blaine Bishop (Tennessee), Ray Buchanan (Atlanta), Dale Carter (New Orleans), Rodney Harrison (Chargers), Tim McDonald (San Francisco), Marcus Robertson (Tennessee), Samari Rolle (Tennessee) and Lance Schulters (San Francisco).

His collegiate player roster is a who's who of defensive backs. Three -- Deon Figures (Colorado, 1992), Chris Hudson (Colorado, 1994) and Gerod Holliman (Louisville, 2014) -- won the Thorpe Award. In 2014, Holliman tied an NCAA record with 14 interceptions, and Louisville led the nation with a 17-game string with at least one interception per contest.

The starting safeties in the 2016 Pro Bowl, Ha Ha Clinton-Dix (Green Bay) and Landon Collins (New York Giants), were both coached by Brown at Alabama, where he also tutored Vinnie Sunseri (San Francisco).

At Louisville, Holliman (Pittsburgh), James Sample (Jacksonville) and Josh Harvey-Clemons (Washington) were NFL draft picks, and the corners he coached at Arizona -- Robert Golden (Pittsburgh) and Trevin Wade (New York Giants) -- and at Colorado -- Jimmy Smith (Baltimore) and Jalil Brown (Indianapolis) -- are still playing in the NFL.

A 1980 UTEP graduate with a bachelor's degree in education (history/physical education), he lettered twice at corner (1978-79) before taking his first coaching position as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1981. He earned an associate's degree from Glendale (Ariz.) Junior College in 1978.

Brown graduated from Arvada (Colo.) High School, where he lettered in both football and track. He and his wife, Stacie, have two daughters, Hannah and Grace.





## KODI BURNS

CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/WIDE RECEIVERS | 3RD SEASON

Former Auburn offensive standout Kodi Burns returned to his alma mater for the 2016 season as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach.

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West and playing in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Junior Ryan Davis set an Auburn record with 84 receptions, ranking second in the SEC and 20th nationally in catches per game.

In 2016, 13 different Auburn receivers caught a pass of at least 20 yards, and the Tigers ranked fourth in school history in total offensive yards (5,730).

Burns has already been part of two Auburn BCS National Championship appearances. As a senior wide-out in 2010, he helped the Tigers to a perfect season and the BCS National Championship, scoring the opening touchdown on a 35-yard pass reception in the Tigers' BCS win over Oregon. Burns served as a graduate assistant for offense in 2013, helping Auburn win another SEC Championship and an appearance in the 2014 BCS National Championship game.

Burns, who played at Auburn from 2007-10, came back to his alma mater from Arizona State, where he had been named the running backs coach after the 2015 season. In 2015, Burns served as wide receivers coach at Middle Tennessee State, where he mentored Richie James and Ed Battlies. James led Conference USA with 108 receptions and his 1,346 receiving yards were third in the conference. Battlies' 82 receptions and 1,048 receiving yards ranked fourth and fifth respectively in Conference USA.

Burns was the running backs coach at Samford University in 2014. Under Burns' guidance, Bulldog ballcarrier Denzel Williams tallied more than 1,000 all-purpose yards, including 918 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns, earning all-Southern Conference honors.

In 2013, Burns worked with Auburn's offense as a graduate assistant, as the Tigers led the nation in rushing (328.3 yds/game), and ranked 11th in total offense (501.3 yds/game) and 12th in scoring offense (39.5 pts/game). Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year; he set Auburn single-season records with 2,374 all-purpose yards and 1,816 rushing yards.

Burns began his coaching career in 2012 as a graduate assistant at Arkansas State under Gus Malzahn. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt Conference with a 10-3 record and Burns helped an offense that included a 3,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher.

From 2007-10, Burns earned four varsity letters at Auburn, excelling in a variety of roles. He was a quarterback his first two seasons at Auburn; in 2007, he became the first Auburn true freshman quarterback to start a game since Gabe Gross in 1998. He moved to wide receiver for the second half of his career, collecting nearly 2,300 total yards and 22 career touchdowns.

A native of Fort Smith, Ark., Burns earned his bachelor's degree from Auburn in exercise science in 2011.







## RODNEY GARNER

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/DEFENSIVE LINE | 6TH SEASON

Former Auburn standout player and coach Rodney Garner serves his alma mater as associate head coach and defensive line coach, a position he has held since 2013, when he helped the Tigers to the 2013 SEC Championship and a BCS Championship berth.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally. All-American Jeff Holland, a first-team all-SEC pick, had 10 sacks, 13 TFL and 22 QB hurries.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adams (Green Bay) and Carl Lawson (Cincinnati) were 2017 NFL draft selections.

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history at +8.0 games. Garner coached first team all-SEC defensive end Dee Ford, a first round draft pick of the Kansas City Chiefs, No. 23 overall. Two more D-linemen -- Angelo Blackson (4th, Tennessee) and Gabe Wright (4th, Detroit) -- were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft, and DaVonte Lambert joined Tampa Bay in 2016.

A native of Leeds, Ala., Garner was named all-SEC and honorable mention All-America as a senior at Auburn in 1988, captaining the team that captured the SEC title. Garner served on the Auburn coaching staff from 1990-95 as recruiting coordinator, tight ends coach, and assistant strength and conditioning coach.

During his 15 seasons at Georgia, he was part of a staff that led UGA to 117 victories, two SEC Championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles, seven bowl victories and six Top 10 finishes in the final polls, including No. 2 in 2007 and No. 3 in 2002. He added the title of assistant head coach at Georgia in 2005 after serving as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator there since January, 1998.

The 2005 Georgia team finished eighth nationally in scoring defense (16.4 ppg). The 2003 Georgia defense was second nationally in scoring defense (14.5 ppg), fourth in total defense (276.86 ypg), sixth in passing defense (174.50 ypg, 1st in the SEC); the 2002 Bulldog defense finished first in the SEC and fourth nationally in scoring defense (15.1 ppg), first in the SEC in red zone defense (58.8%) and second in the SEC in rushing defense (114.0 ypg). The 2002 Bulldogs finished 13-1, won the SEC title and Nokia Sugar Bowl and ranked third in the final national polls.

Garner participated in the inaugural Minority Coaches Forum in 2006, was selected as one of 10 coaches to participate in the 2004 NCAA Expert Coaching Academy, and was one of only 20 chosen for the NCAA's 2004 Advanced Coaching Academy.

At Georgia, he coached five NFL first round draft choices -- Richard Seymour (Patriots) and Marcus Stroud (Jaguars), both Pro Bowl starters; David Pollack (Bengals); Charles Grant (Saints); and Johnathan Sullivan (Saints). He also coached draft picks DeAngelo Tyson (7th, Ravens, '12), Geno Atkins (4th, Bengals, '10), Corvey Irvin (3rd, Panthers, '09), Jarius Wynn (6th, Packers, '09), Kedric Golston (6th, Redskins, '06), Robert Geathers (4th, Bengals, '04), Emarlos Leroy (6th, Jaguars, '99), and free agents Ken Veal (Chargers, '04), Paul Snellings (Colts, 2000), Brandon Miller (Colts, 2000), Charles Johnson (Panthers, '07), Tyrone Robertson (Bills, 2000) and Demetric Evans (Cowboys, '01).

After his playing career at Auburn, Garner had a free agent tryout with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers and played with the Pittsburgh Gladiators arena football team in 1989. He began his coaching career at Auburn in 1990. Garner coached tight ends and offensive tackles at Tennessee in 1997 after coaching tight ends for the Volunteers in 1996.

Garner, whose cousin is Charles Barkley, was an outstanding player at Leeds High School. He is married to Kimberly Lawson Garner, a 1988 Auburn graduate in public relations. They have six children: Bridgett, Brielle, Jaiden, Kai, Sydney and Milan.





## J.B. GRIMES

OFFENSIVE LINE | 4TH SEASON

With more than 40 years coaching at the collegiate level, J.B. Grimes, who helped the Tigers to the 2013 SEC Championship and a BCS Championship berth as part of a tenure from 2013-15, returns to The Plains for the 2018 season as offensive line coach.

In between his stints at Auburn, Grimes served as offensive line coach at Cincinnati (2016) and Connecticut (2017).

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history in NCAA records at +8.0 games. Grimes coached All-America left tackle Greg Robinson, the No. 2 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, 2014 Rimington Award winner center Reese Dismukes and 2016 NFL draft pick Shon Coleman.

The 2013 offensive line paved the way for the Tigers to lead the nation in rushing with 328.3 yards per game. The line allowed only 1.29 sacks per game to rank 22nd nationally. Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and named the SEC Player of the Year.

From 2013-15, Grimes tutored four players at Auburn who gained all-SEC recognition: Reese Dismukes, Alex Kozan, Greg Robinson and Braden Smith. His offensive line paved the way for four 1,000-yard rushers and two SEC rushing champions.

Grimes, who has coached in 18 bowl games and developed numerous NFL players, spent the 2012 season as the offensive line coach at Arkansas State with Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn.

At Arkansas State, Grimes coached an offensive line unit that helped set a school record with 481.8 yards of total offense per game while ranking 16th nationally in fewest sacks allowed. Senior offensive lineman Zach McKnight earned first team all-Sun Belt; the offense led the Sun Belt in rushing and ranked in the top 25 nationally in total offense, scoring offense and rushing offense.

Prior to ASU, Grimes spent two seasons at Kansas (2010-11) and Mississippi State (2004-08) as the offensive line coach. Grimes' career also includes stints at East Carolina (2003), Texas A&M (1998-2002), Virginia Tech (1993-97), Arkansas (1989-92), Louisiana-Monroe (1979-80; 1985-88), Missouri (1984) and Delta State (1983) as an assistant. Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

In his first season at Mississippi State, the Bulldogs rushed for 1,744 yards, the most at the school in four years. Behind his offensive line, MSU produced three seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher. In his one season at East Carolina (2003), the Pirates' offensive line paved the way for its third straight 1,000-yard individual rusher. At Texas A&M (1998-2002), Grimes coached the offensive line under R.C. Slocum as the Aggies posted a 40-22 overall record while playing in four straight bowl games. While at Virginia Tech (1993-97) coaching for Frank Beamer, Grimes helped the Hokies to back-to-back Big East titles and five bowl games.

Grimes also coached at Arkansas, serving as a graduate assistant in 1981-82 and as a full-time assistant coach in 1989-92, helping the Razorbacks to the Southwest Conference championship and a Cotton Bowl appearance in 1990. At Arkansas, Grimes worked for coaches Lou Holtz, Ken Hatfield and Jack Crowe.

Grimes spent his first two seasons at the high school level in the state of Arkansas, at Nashville (1977) and Des Arc (1978).

As an offensive lineman at Henderson State, he helped his team to a 40-6 record in four seasons, including a berth in the 1974 NAIA Championship game. He earned a bachelor's degree in education from Henderson State in 1977 and a master's degree in education from Louisiana-Monroe in 1981.

Grimes grew up in Clarendon, Ark., and is married to the former Jennifer Graves, who received a degree in advertising and public relations from Arkansas. The couple has four children, sons Aaron and Nick and daughters Danielle and Lindsey.







## TIM HORTON

RUNNING BACKS/RECRUITING COORDINATOR | 6TH SEASON

SEC veteran Tim Horton joined the Auburn program prior to the 2013 season as running backs coach. He served as recruiting coordinator in 2015-16, producing a fourth consecutive Top 10 recruiting class.

Horton has coached nine all-SEC running backs, 10 different 1,000-yard rushers and two of the SEC's all-time single season rushing leaders in Tre Mason (1,816) and Darren McFadden (1,830). His all-SEC players include: Cameron Artis-Payne, Knile Davis, Kerryon Johnson, Felix Jones, Mason, McFadden, Kamryn Pettway, Michael Smith and Jonathan Williams. In 2017, he became the first coach in SEC history to coach the SEC offensive (Kerryon Johnson) and special teams (Daniel Carlson) player of the year in the same season.

The 2013 Tigers led the nation with 328.3 rushing yards per game. Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 rushing touchdowns, sixth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game and sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game.

In 2014, Cameron Artis-Payne led the SEC in rushing with 1,608 yards, 123.7 yards per game. In 2015, Peyton Barber (1,017) became the seventh 1,000-yard rusher Horton has coached since 2007, and in 2016, Kamryn Pettway rushed for 1,224 yards, leading the SEC in rushing.

In 2017, SEC offensive player of the year Kerryon Johnson led the league in rushing, scoring and all-purpose yardage, as Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West. Horton also coordinated the special teams, as All-America kicker Daniel Carlson set the SEC career scoring record and was a Lou Groza Award finalist for the third consecutive year.

Two Auburn backs were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft -- Mason (3rd round, St. Louis) and fullback Jay Prosch (6th round, Houston). Artis-Payne was a 2015 fifth-round pick by Carolina, and Corey Grant, who led the nation in yards per carry, joined Jacksonville that season. Barber signed with Tampa Bay in 2016. Eleven different running backs coached by Horton have been an NFL starter during the last 10 seasons, including Artis-Payne, Barber, Davis, Grant, Dennis Johnson, Jones, Mason, McFadden, Keiro Small, Williams and Ronnie Wingo.

Prior to Auburn, Horton spent six seasons in a similar capacity at Arkansas, where he was also recruiting coordinator, recognized by Rivals.com and ESPN.com as one of the nation's top recruiters. He was one of just two coaches in the nation, and the only one in the SEC, to coach four different 1,000-yard rushers from 2007-10. Under his watch, 2007 Doak Walker Award winner Darren McFadden and Felix Jones earned All-America honors, while Dennis Johnson, Michael Smith, Jonathan Williams and Knile Davis earned all-SEC honors.

Horton, who played football at Arkansas from 1986-89, returned to his alma mater in 2007 after taking the offensive coordinator and wide receivers coaching position at Air Force in January, 2007. During the 2006 season, he was running backs coach at Kansas State, helping the Wildcats earn a Texas Bowl berth while tutoring future NFL running backs Thomas Clayton and James Johnson.

At Air Force from 1999-2005, serving as the wide receivers (1999-2004) and running backs coach (2005), Horton was recognized by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Colorado chapter as one of its 2004 coaches of the year.

He began his coaching career at Appalachian State in 1990 and helped ASU to a 67-32 record during eight seasons, including Southern Conference championships in 1991 and 1995 and five NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances.

Horton currently serves as the SEC representative to the AFCA assistant coaches' committee and also gives back to the game by serving as the running backs expert for USA football. In 2016, Horton authored a book, "Complete Running Back" published by Human Kinetics.

He earned his bachelor's degree in marketing management from Arkansas in 1990, where he was a four-year letterman and three-year starter as a split end and punt returner under Coach Ken Hatfield. He caught 49 passes for 942 yards and one TD in his career, hauling in 23 catches for 453 yards as a senior in 1989. Horton also returned 78 punts for 657 yards, fifth all-time in school history. The Razorbacks compiled a 38-11 record, still tied for the school record for the most wins in a four-year period, won back-to-back Southwest Conference titles (1988-89) and appeared in four straight bowl games.

A two-time academic all-conference selection, Horton was a second-team all-SWC selection in 1989 and team captain. A two-time all-state running back and track standout at Conway (Ark.) High School, Horton and his wife Lauren have a daughter, Caroline (an Auburn student), and a son, Jackson.







## CHIP LINDSEY

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR | 2ND SEASON

Chip Lindsey returned to Auburn in January, 2017, as offensive coordinator. Lindsey, who has two decades of coaching experience, was on the Auburn staff as an offensive analyst during the Tigers' SEC championship and BCS National Championship game run in 2013.

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, ranked 26th nationally in total offense and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West. All-SEC quarterback Jarrett Stidham, the second Auburn QB ever to throw for 3,000 yards in a season, led the SEC and ranked ninth nationally in completion percentage. Running back Kerryon Johnson was SEC offensive player of the year, and Ryan Davis set an Auburn receiving record with 84 catches.

Lindsey returned to Auburn from Arizona State, where he served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2016. The Sun Devils started 5-1 before losing three quarterbacks to injury; RB Kalen Ballage tied an NCAA record scoring eight touchdowns in a 68-55 win over Texas Tech.

As offensive coordinator at Southern Miss from 2014-15, he developed the Conference USA 2015 Offensive Player of the Year in quarterback Nick Mullens, who ranked second in the league in passing yards (4,145) and TD passes (36), and ranked in the top eight in the nation in both marks in 2015.

The Southern Miss offense broke five single-season school records in 2015: completions (312), passing yards (4,263), total offense yards (6,758), touchdowns (67) and points (528), as the Golden Eagles recorded nine wins, a Conference USA West title, and a berth in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl against Washington.

Lindsey's 2015 Golden Eagle offense ranked fifth in the nation in total touchdowns, seventh in total points, eighth in total passing yards and completions, and 12th in points per game and passing yards per game. The 2015 Golden Eagles tallied more than 4,200 passing yards and just under 2,500 rushing yards. The national leader with 102 explosive plays, they were just the second school in FBS history with a 4,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and two 1,000-yard rushers.

Prior to his first stint at Auburn, from 2011-12, Lindsey served as head coach at Spain Park (Ala.) High School, leading the school to its first Class 6A regional championship.

Lindsey served as quarterbacks coach at Troy University in 2010, following a long and distinguished career as a prep coach (1997-2009) in football and baseball. At Troy, he coached the 2010 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Corey Robinson.

A two-time Coach of the Year honoree (2008-09) at Lassiter (Ga.) High School, he guided the development of Parade All-American Hutson Mason, who broke every single-season state passing record in 2009, including passing yards (4,560) and touchdowns (54). The Trojans went 12-1 and won a regional championship in 2009, and Lindsey received state Coach of the Year honors from the Atlanta Falcons and the Cobb County Touchdown Club. The Associated Press, Marietta Daily Journal and Cobb County Touchdown Club named him the 2008 Georgia Coach of the Year.

Lindsey served as offensive coordinator at Hoover (Ala.) High School in 2007 as the team finished 10-2 and advanced to the third round of the state playoffs. Lindsey's first experience as a head coach came from 2005-06 at Colbert Heights (Ala.) High School, where he earned 2006 Coach of the Year honors from the Florence Times-Daily.

Lindsey spent the 1997-2004 seasons as an assistant coach, including Florence, Deshler, Sparkman, and Springville High Schools in Alabama.

Lindsey played football at the University of North Alabama before transferring as a student to Alabama, where he received his bachelor's degree in history and English in 1997. He earned a master's in educational leadership from the University of Phoenix in 2005.

A native of Madison, Ala., Lindsey graduated from Bob Jones High School, where he was a three-sport letterman. Lindsey and his wife Cecily have four children: Claire, Caroline, Cooper and Conner.







## LARRY PORTER

TIGHT ENDS & H-BACKS/SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR | 2ND SEASON

Larry Porter, a 22-year coaching veteran and two-time national recruiter of the year, joined the Auburn program in February, 2017, as tight ends/H-backs coach and added the duties of special teams coordinator prior to the 2018 campaign. He has been part of 12 bowl teams since 2002, including three CFP bowls (2007 Sugar, 2008 BCS Championship, 2018 Chick-fil-A Peach).

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season, and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play, winning the SEC West and playing in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Porter came to Auburn from North Carolina, where he spent three seasons as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and was a 2016 Broyles Award nominee. Under his guidance, Carolina's running game ranked 18th nationally in 2015, averaging 224.4 yards per game. Running back Elijah Hood, who rushed for 1,463 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2015, was a two-time all-ACC performer and ranked in the school's top 10 in career rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

In 2016, the Tar Heels ranked first in the nation in punt return defense (0.22) and second in the nation in kickoff return average (26.97), and Porter tutored all-ACC running backs Elijah Hood and T.J. Logan (who ranked second nationally in kickoff return average (32.9 with 2 TD)). During Porter's tenure, UNC made three consecutive bowl appearances and won the ACC Coastal Division in 2015; that same season, the Tar Heels set 62 team and individual school records on offense. Hood (Oakland) and Logan (Arizona) were both selected in the 2017 NFL Draft.

Porter went to UNC after one season as the running backs coach at Texas, one year as running backs coach at Arizona State and two seasons as the head coach at Memphis, his alma mater.

Porter spent five years on the LSU coaching staff from 2005-09, coaching running backs while also holding two key roles on staff as assistant head coach and chief recruiter. He was elevated to the position of assistant head coach during the spring of 2006 and was twice (2007, 2009) named National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com. Part of LSU's 2007 national championship team, Porter developed two 1,000-yard rushers at LSU in Jacob Hester (2007) and Charles Scott (2008) as well as having five players (Hester, Joseph Addai, Quinn Johnson, Charles Scott, Trindon Holliday) selected in the NFL Draft.

Porter coached 1,000-yard rushers for three straight seasons while at Oklahoma State. In 2004, Vernand Morency earned all-Big 12 honors after rushing for 1,474 yards and 12 touchdowns. A year earlier, Tatum Bell earned first team all-Big 12 honors with 1,286 yards and 16 touchdowns. Morency was a third-round pick of the Houston Texans in 2005 and Bell was a second-round draft pick by the Denver Broncos in the 2004 NFL Draft.

Prior to his arrival in Stillwater, Porter spent three years at Arkansas State, where he coached Jonathan Adams to back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons.

Porter began his coaching career at Wooddale High School in Memphis, Tenn., before moving to the collegiate ranks, coaching the running backs at Tennessee-Martin in 1998.

A native of Jackson, Miss., Porter lettered four years (1990-93) at Memphis, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1996. He is a member of the University of Memphis Athletics M Club Hall of Fame. Porter and his wife, Sharmane, have three children: sons Brandon and Omari, and daughter Olivia.





## KEVIN STEELE

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR | 3RD SEASON

Kevin Steele, a veteran coach with tremendous success at both the college and NFL level, joined the Auburn coaching staff before the 2016 season as defensive coordinator.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally; Steele was a Broyles Award finalist.

The Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense his first season, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adams (Green Bay), Carl Lawson (Cincinnati), Rudy Ford (Arizona) and Joshua Holsey (Washington) were 2017 NFL draft picks.

A familiar face in the SEC, in 2015, Steele served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach for the LSU Tigers. He went to Baton Rouge from Alabama, where he spent the 2014 season coaching the Crimson Tide linebackers and special assistant to the head coach. In 2013, he served as Alabama's director of player personnel. A proven recruiter who helped Alabama sign the nation's No. 1 class, Steele has held defensive coordinator positions in the SEC and ACC as well as serving as the head coach at Baylor for four years.

Steele served as defensive coordinator at Alabama in 2007 and then held the same position at Clemson for three years from 2009-2011. While at Clemson, the Tigers won the 2011 ACC title, their first since 1991. Steele's 2010 Clemson defense led the ACC and ranked No. 13 nationally in points allowed, surrendering 18.8 points per game.

Before he joined the Alabama staff in 2007, Steele coached with Bobby Bowden at Florida State for four years (2003-06), serving as the executive head coach for the Seminoles. He was named the Rivals.com National Recruiter of the Year in 2005 at Florida State after helping the Seminoles sign the top class in the country.

Steele joined Florida State after serving as the head coach at Baylor University from 1999-2002, spending four seasons as a head coach in the Big 12 Conference.

Steele coached linebackers for the Carolina Panthers in the NFL from 1995-98. Under head coach Dom Capers, the Panthers reached the NFC Championship game in their second season (1996). After four years with Carolina, Steele was hired as head coach at Baylor in 1999.

From 1989-94, Steele coached the linebackers under Nebraska legend Tom Osborne. During his six years in Lincoln, the Cornhuskers went 60-11, appeared in six bowl games, won four conference championships and captured the 1994 national championship with a 13-0 record.

He has also held assistant coaching jobs at Tennessee (1987-88), Oklahoma State (1984-86) and New Mexico State (1983).

The Dillon, S.C., native is a 1981 graduate of the University of Tennessee. He spent his freshman season at Furman before transferring to Tennessee, where he was a member of Johnny Majors' squads. He was a student assistant coach in 1980 and then a graduate assistant the following year (1981) before being promoted to outside linebackers coach in 1982.

## TRAVIS WILLIAMS

LINEBACKERS | 3RD SEASON

Former Auburn linebacker Travis Williams was promoted to linebacker coach at his alma mater prior to the 2016 season, after holding various roles on the Tigers' football support staff.

In 2017, SEC West champion Auburn ranked 14th in total defense and 12th in scoring defense, allowing just 4.67 yards per play, eighth best nationally. Senior linebacker Tre' Williams earned second team all-SEC honors.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957.

Steeped in the Tiger tradition on defense, Williams signed with Auburn in 2001, redshirted his first season and then lettered the next four, earning all-SEC honors in 2004-05. He led Auburn in tackles (80) during the 2004 undefeated season; he was second in tackles in 2005 (68) and third in 2003 (67). He won the Pat Dye Leadership Award on defense in 2004 and 2005.

Williams played for the NFL's Atlanta Falcons during the 2006 and 2007 seasons, before beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Spring Valley (S.C.) High School as a volunteer assistant.

Williams returned to Auburn in 2009 as a defensive graduate assistant, and was part of Auburn's 2010 national championship season. After coaching stops at Northern Iowa and Creekside (Ga.) High School, Williams came back to Auburn in 2014 as a defensive analyst.

He served as an on-field coach on defense in preparations for Auburn's 2015 Outback and 2015 Birmingham Bowl appearances.

Williams earned his bachelor's degree in criminology and criminal justice from Auburn in 2005, and received a master's degree in adult education from Auburn in 2011.

A native of Columbia, S.C., Williams and his wife Jeanine, an Auburn graduate, have three daughters, Tru, Reign and Brave.





# MARCUS WOODSON

DEFENSIVE BACKS | 1ST SEASON

Marcus Woodson joined the Auburn football staff in January, 2018, as an assistant coach working with the Tiger defensive backs.

Woodson came to Auburn from Memphis, where he was defensive backs coach from 2015-16. During his two years there, the Tigers won 18 games and made two bowl appearances, forcing 60 turnovers, the second best total in the nation, including 32 interceptions. In 2017, freshman defensive back T.J. Carter was named to the ESPN.com and USA Today Freshman All-America teams and was the American Athletic Conference Rookie of the Year after setting a Memphis freshman record with five interceptions.

Before Memphis, Woodson spent two seasons at Fresno State, helping the Bulldogs to the 2014 Hawaii Bowl. All-Mountain West defensive back Derron Smith was a sixth-round NFL draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals.

From 2009-13, Woodson was defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Charleston Southern, tutoring all-Big South players Demaris Freeman, Charles James, Chris Kuzdale and Elijah Lee. He added the defensive passing game coordinator title before the 2012 season. In 2013, Charleston Southern finished the campaign with a 10-3 record and a No. 22 national ranking; the Bucs finished the season with the nation's No. 3 pass defense.

Woodson was at Millsaps College from 2005-08, helping produce three consecutive Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) championships. In 2008, Millsaps finished with an 11-1 record and a No. 12 national ranking. In his three seasons, Woodson coached all-SCAC performers Jonathan Brooks, Jacob Hanberry, Marcus Harris and Ray Kline.

He was a two-year letterman at Ole Miss, recording 38 career tackles and an interception as a starter at safety before his career was cut short by a knee injury before his senior season. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science with an emphasis in criminal justice from Ole Miss in 2003, and was selected for the Senior Leadership Unity Council.

A native of Moss Point, Miss., where he was part of two state championship teams at Moss Point High and played in the Bernard Blackwell Classic, Woodson and his wife Chastity, who holds a bachelor's from Loyola (La.) and a master's from Howard University, have two sons, Carter and Bryce.

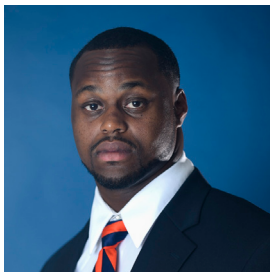

Ken Carter joined the Auburn football staff in 2015 working for the Tigers in player development.

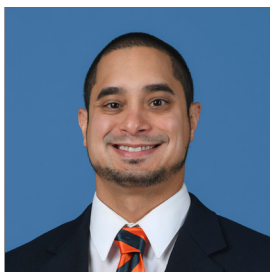

A standout Auburn receiver from 2013-16, Marcus Davis now serves his alma mater as an offensive analyst, working with the running backs.

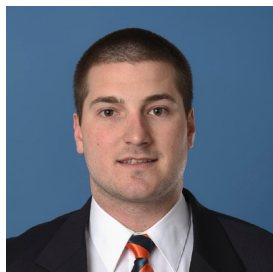

### DEFENSIVE ANALYST



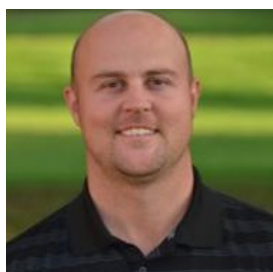

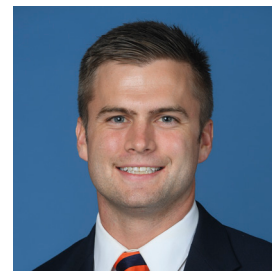
A fourth-degree black belt in taekwondo, Henry did an internship with the EXOS training facility in Pensacola, Fla.

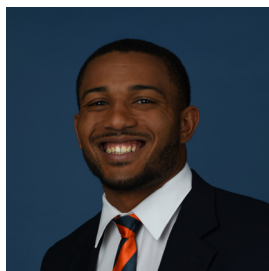

Courtney Prince joined Auburn football in February, 2018, as a graduate assistant for defense, working with the defensive line.

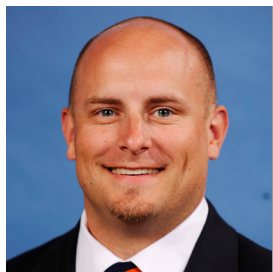

### DIRECTOR OF EQUIPMENT



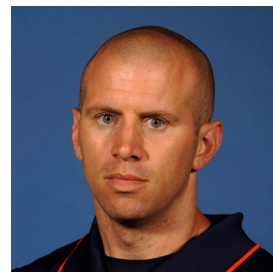
Brad Rapacz serves as the director of equipment for football with the Auburn Tigers, involved in running the day-to-day operation of the football equipment room.

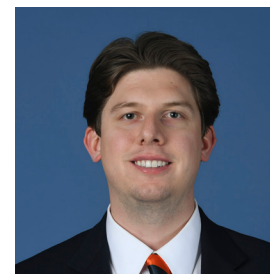

HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER



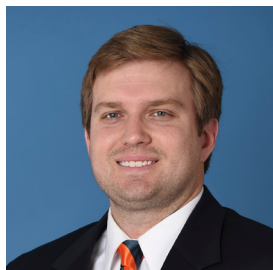
Robbie Stewart joined the Auburn athletics family in July, 2014. He serves as head athletic trainer for football.

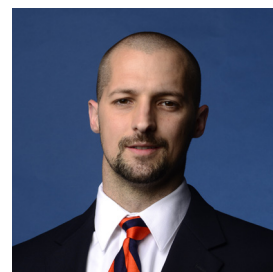

ASSISTANT VIDEO COORDINATOR



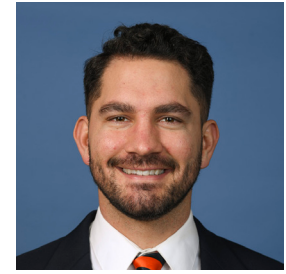

PHYSICAL THERAPY



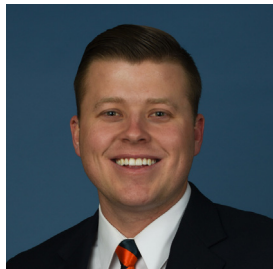

Cole Weeks joined the Auburn Family prior to the 2017 campaign as a graduate assistant working with the Tiger offense.

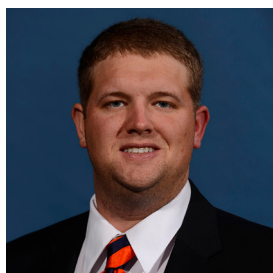
A quarterback at Southern Miss from 2011-14, he started two games as a senior, against UTEP and Marshall, and passed for 761 yards and two touchdowns for the season. He passed for 300+ yards against Louisiana Tech (338) and UTEP (309). An outstanding scholar-athlete, he received the Jim Castaneda postgraduate scholarship from Conference USA.

Weeks came to Auburn from Jones County Junior College, where he was quarterback coach for the Bobcats. He served as a graduate assistant working with the quarterbacks at Southern Miss for the 2015 season.

Weeks graduated from Southern Miss in December, 2014, with a bachelor's degree in coaching education with a minor in physical education. He is working toward a master's degree in adult education at Auburn.

A native of Freeport, Fla., Weeks was a three-sport letterman at Freeport High, leading the Bulldogs to the football district and regional titles as a senior. Weeks is married to the former Alexis Barbaresi, a Southern Miss graduate.

### BRETT WHITESIDE DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS



Brett Whiteside serves as the director of football operations, his second stint with the Tiger program. Whiteside organizes team travel, summer football camps and coaching clinics and assists in the day-to-day operation of the football program.

Whiteside served as the director of recruiting operations from January, 2013, until June, 2017; during that time, Auburn had five consecutive Top 10 recruiting classes, a first in Auburn history. He worked with head coach Gus Malzahn as Director of Player

Personnel at Arkansas State in 2012, organizing on-campus recruiting, coordinating the Red Wolves' team travel and helping oversee the day-to-day operations of the ASU football program.

As a student recruiting assistant at Auburn from 2009-12, Whiteside helped with the recruiting effort of two of the top six recruiting classes in the nation, including the 2011 class, ranked No. 2 nationally and first in the Southeastern Conference. He also assisted with day-to-day operations, including team travel, high school and NFL relations, coaching clinics and summer football camps.

Originally from Southside, Ala., Whiteside graduated from Arkansas State in 2012 with a degree in interdisciplinary studies with an emphasis on business, education and mathematics. He earned his master's degree in higher education administration from Auburn in August, 2015. He is married to the former Natalie Slaten, a 2009 Auburn graduate. They have one son, Davis.

### CHETTE WILLIAMS TEAM CHAPLAIN



Rev. Chette Williams, a former Auburn linebacker, serves as the Auburn football team chaplain. Williams is also the Auburn campus director for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the State Director for Urban Ministries for FCA.

During his playing career (1982-84), Auburn won the Sugar Bowl, the Citrus Bowl and the Liberty Bowl.

The former President of IMPACT Ministries in Spartanburg, S.C. (1995-99), Williams served as Pastor of New Covenant Baptist Church in New Orleans, La. (1993-95) and co-Pastor of New Song Baptist Church in Mobile, Ala. (1991-93). He was licensed as a minister in 1987 and ordained in 1988. He received a bachelor's degree from Auburn in Adult Education in 1985, and a master's of divinity from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary in 1993.

Williams has two daughters, Lauren and Caitlyn, and one son, Chette Jr.

Steven Leath became Auburn University's 19th president on June 19, 2017. As president, Dr. Leath brings extensive land-grant leadership expertise to advance Auburn's mission of instruction, research, and outreach.

As leader of a university renowned for its exceptional student experience, Dr. Leath champions programs that position Auburn students to lead in their professions and engage in their communities. Supporting Auburn's vision to inspire, innovate, and transform, Dr. Leath is focused on elevating Auburn's reputation as a partnership university and empowering students, faculty, and entrepreneurs to discover solutions and develop inventions to improve lives.

Since becoming president, Dr. Leath has launched a number of bold initiatives designed to strengthen Auburn's commitment to student success, transformative research, and scholarship. In support of the university's desire to reinforce instruction and innovation, Dr. Leath has committed to hire 500 new tenure-track, scholarship- and research-focused faculty members by 2022.

Under Dr. Leath's leadership, the university continues to augment the meaningful impact of academic discovery at Auburn. The Presidential Awards for Interdisciplinary Research initiative supports multidisciplinary research teams that will propel Auburn to higher levels of distinction and attract new sources of external funding. Additionally, the Presidential Graduate Research Fellowship recruits top-tier PhD scholars to partner with Auburn faculty in fields of established and emerging research. Both programs are advancing the university's goal of delivering practical solutions to real-world challenges.

A trained plant pathologist, Dr. Leath served at three universities prior to Auburn, playing a key role in advancing teaching, research, and economic development at each, most recently as president of Iowa State University (ISU).

During Dr. Leath's tenure at ISU, the university achieved its highest student graduation rate, lowered student debt, grew research expenditures, set fundraising records, and secured its largest private gift for an academic facility and largest cash gift. He also led efforts for the 200-acre expansion of ISU's research park, generating new jobs and attracting new companies, industry partnerships, and government collaborations.

Dr. Leath also previously served as vice president for research and sponsored programs for the University of North Carolina System, and he held several prominent positions at North Carolina State University. Dr. Leath began his academic career at the University of Illinois, Urbana, as an extension plant pathologist.

Dr. Leath holds a BS in plant science from Pennsylvania State University, MS in plant science from the University of Delaware, and PhD in plant pathology from the University of Illinois.

Dr. Leath and his wife, Janet, have two sons, Eric and Scott, and a yellow Labrador retriever, Quill.

**ALLEN GREENE**  
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Allen Greene, known as a dynamic and energetic leader, is in his first year at Auburn after being named the program's 15th director of athletics on January 18, 2018. Greene served in the same capacity at the University at Buffalo from November 2015 until his arrival at Auburn.

One of the youngest athletics directors in the NCAA power five ranks, Greene, 41, is highly regarded by his peers. A former baseball player at the University of Notre Dame, he is actively engaged in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics, Minority Opportunities Athletics Association, and LEAD1, an association dedicated to preparing today's students to be tomorrow's leaders.

Greene's tenure as director of athletics at the University at Buffalo is noted for success on the field and in the classroom, as well as for donor and corporate development efforts that led to an array of facility enhancements.

Competitively, UB Athletics sent four teams to the NCAA tournament in a two-year span including men's and women's basketball in 2016, the first time a men's and women's MAC school won both titles since 2002.

In the classroom, UB sports teams achieved a GPA of 3.00 or better for 11 consecutive semesters, with football earning their highest team GPA in the programs Division I history.

Greene was instrumental in building donor and corporate support for UB athletics, including arranging an apparel partnership with Nike. He also spearheaded development of the UB athletics facilities master plan and led several capital projects, including the approval of an \$18 million, 92,000 square-foot indoor practice facility that had been on the docket for nearly two decades.

Prior to being named director of athletics at the University at Buffalo, Greene served as the senior associate athletic director for administration and deputy director of athletics at UB. As deputy director of athletics, Greene oversaw the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and was in charge of UB's football and men's and women's basketball programs, including scheduling, game contracts, student-athlete management and post season planning.

Greene also has experience working in the Southeastern Conference, having led several important business development and fundraising functions at the University of Mississippi. Prior to joining Ole Miss, Greene spent two years working as an athletics fundraiser for Notre Dame and five years in its compliance office.

A graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in finance, Greene was a three-year starter for the Fighting Irish baseball team. Greene was selected by the New York Yankees in the 1998 MLB draft and played three years in its minor league system. Greene later received his master's degree from Indiana University.

Greene and his wife Christy, have three children, daughters Rian and Seneca, and son Samuel.

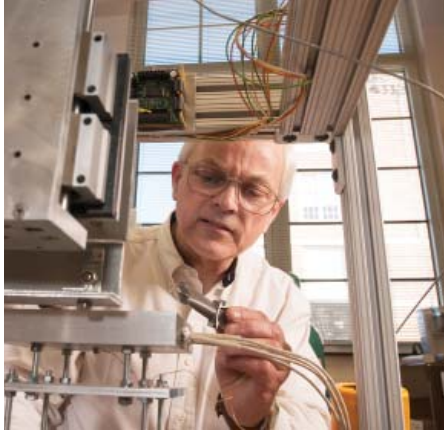

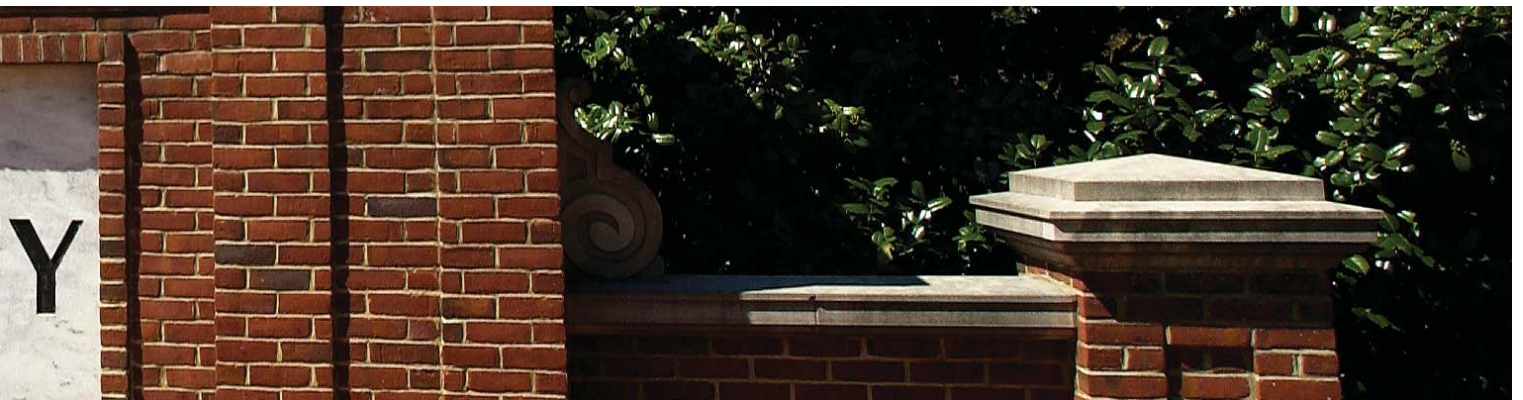

For more than 100 years, eagles have been associated with Auburn football. From a presence on the sidelines to rousing flights over the field, WAR EAGLE has become an Auburn icon.

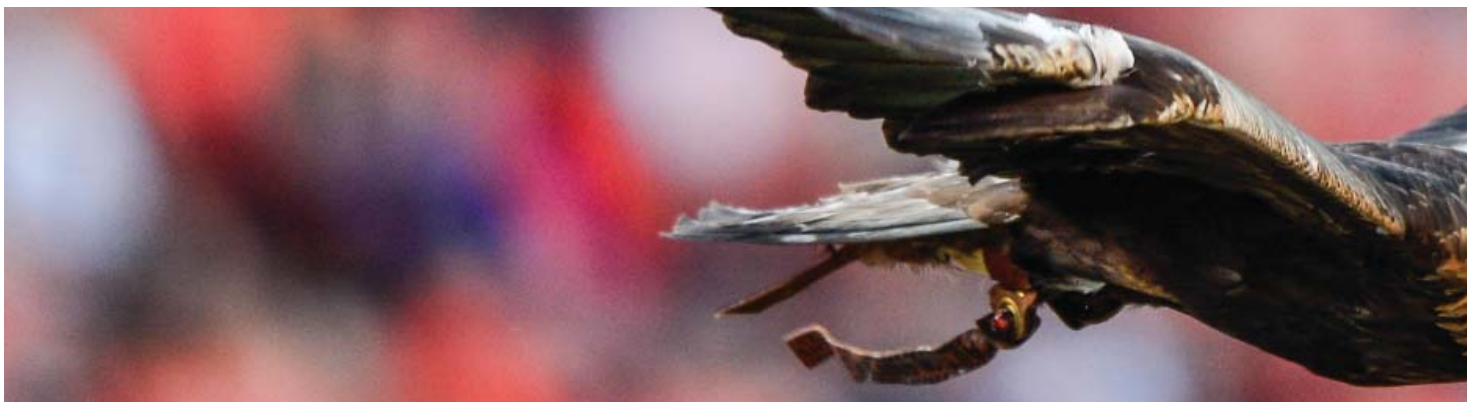
The role of Auburn’s eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine’s Southeastern Raptor Center. The USFWS permits the raptor center to house eagles and use them on hundreds of educational presentations each year—including Auburn’s home football games. Currently, flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are used for these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people, as they have symbolize strength, power, and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage, and the preservation of our environment.

Golden eagle Nova serves as War Eagle VII and is a fixture on the sidelines, while bald eagle Spirit delights fans with pregame flights over Jordan-Hare Stadium. War Eagle VI, nicknamed Tiger, which made the inaugural untethered free flight in 2000, passed away in 2014.

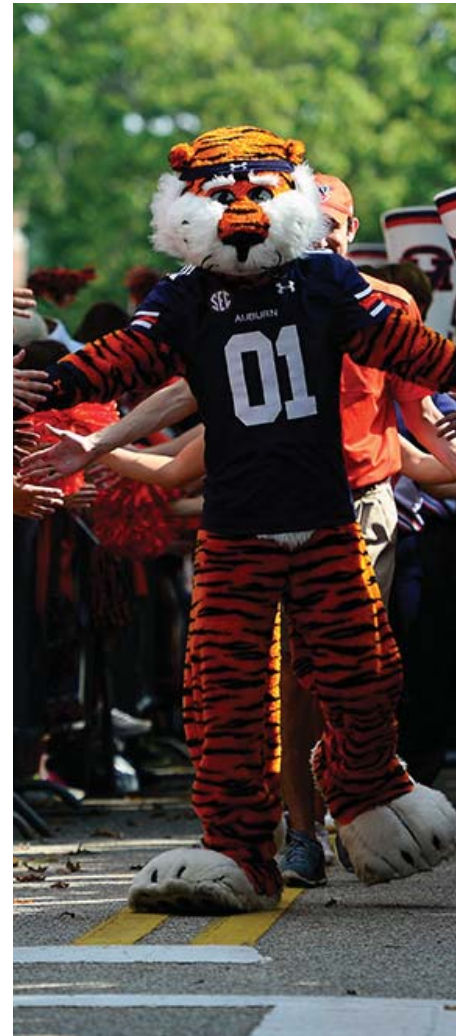

# TIGER WALK: AN AUBURN TRADITION



Tiger Walk is an Auburn tradition that began in the early 1960s when Auburn players walked from Sewell Hall to the football stadium as fans lined Donahue Drive to wish the team well. Over the years, Tiger Walk has grown into a major part of game day at Auburn, so much so that it is listed on the players' game weekend itinerary. The largest Tiger Walk is believed to have taken place prior to the 1989 Iron Bowl, when more than 20,000 well-wishers lined the street. Every Tiger Walk prior to home games draws thousands, and it has become a tradition for Auburn football players as they enter stadiums on the road. Tiger Walk traditionally begins two hours before kickoff for every game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.





# ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER

The rolling of Toomer's Corner was named earlier this year as the nation's "Best Sports Tradition" by the USA Today 10 Best Readers' Choice travel award contest. Toomer's Corner, where Auburn's campus meets the city of Auburn at the intersection of College Street and Magnolia Avenue, has long been the gathering place for Auburn athletic celebrations. After any football win, and significant victories in other sports, Auburn students and citizens alike have joined forces to "roll" the Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner with toilet tissue.

Although there have been various legends as to how the Toomer's Corner tradition began, one of the more popular stories centers around when Toomer's Drugs had the only telegraph in the city. As the story goes, during away football games, when employees of the local drug store received news of a win, they would throw the ticker tape from the telegraph onto the power lines.







The current Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner were planted in February 2017, and fans are asked not to roll the trees because they are not fully established. Fans are encouraged to roll the adjacent trees. In 2016, the university planted 10 descendants of the original Auburn Oaks along a curved walkway in Samford Park, with trees reaching from Samford Hall to Toomer's Corner. The 15-year-old oaks were cultivated from acorns from the original trees, a project managed by Auburn's Forestry Club and Wildlife Society. Fans are also asked not to roll these descendent trees. Members of the Auburn Family have the opportunity to name a tree for themselves or someone of their choosing in recognition of a \$50,000 philanthropic gift benefitting the School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences.





# JORDAN-HARE STADIUM/PAT DYE FIELD

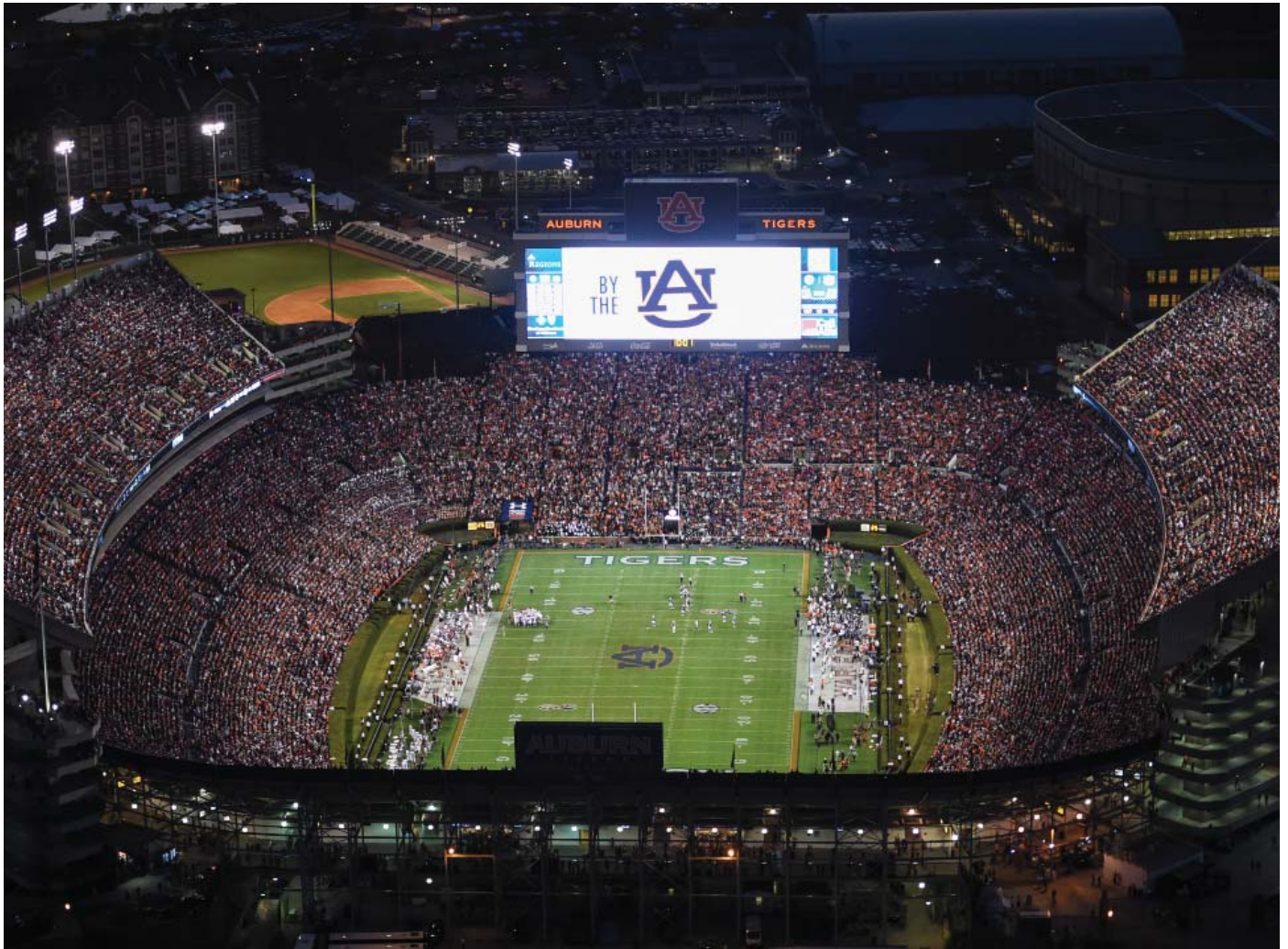
Auburn's showcase football stadium seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side. The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later 14,000 more seats were added and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (named after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan.

The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

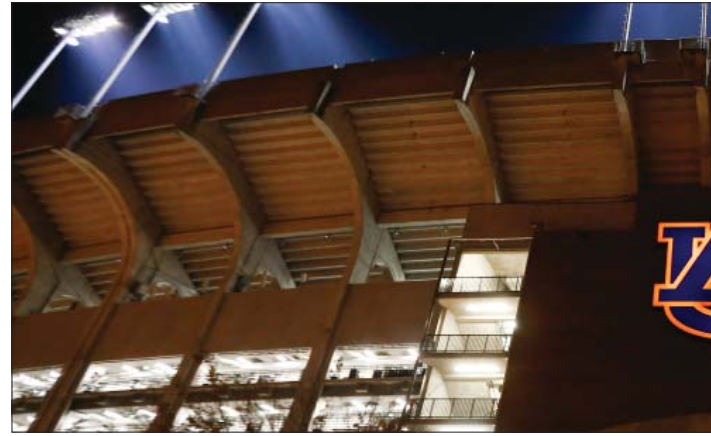

# HEISMAN STATUES

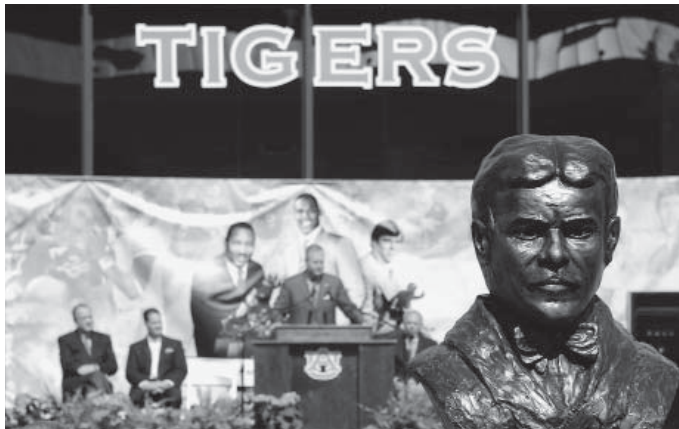

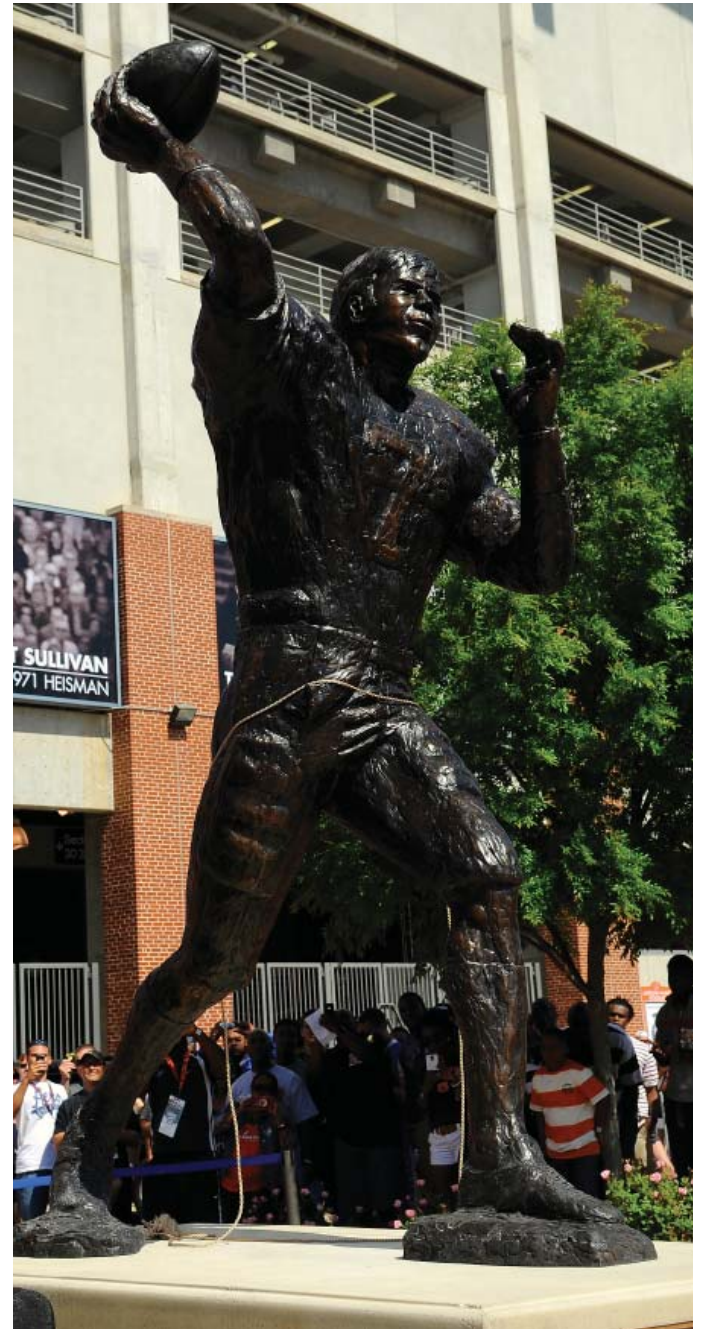

## BO JACKSON 1985

Bo Jackson plowed through defenses in 1985 for 6.4 yards per carry, earning Auburn's second Heisman Trophy. The three-sport athlete ran for 1,786 yards and 17 touchdowns while helping the Tigers to an 8-4 record and a Cotton Bowl appearance.



## CAM NEWTON 2010

Cam Newton put together one of the most remarkable college football seasons ever in 2010, throwing for 30 touchdowns and rushing for 20 while leading Auburn to a 14-0 record and the BCS National Championship. Newton tallied 4,327 yards of total offense while completing 66.1% of his passes.





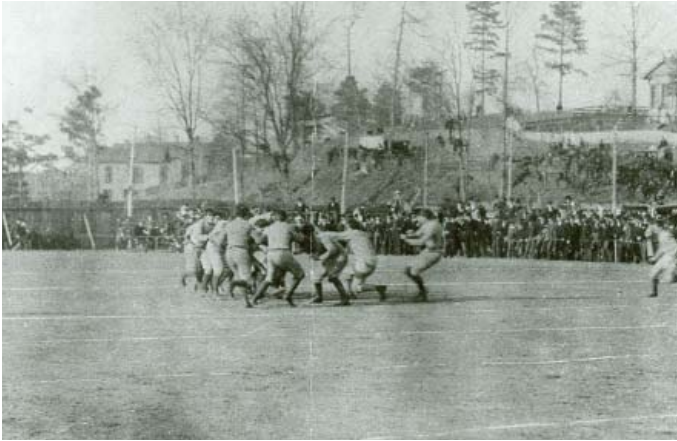
# IRON BOWL

## WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Of the first 53 meetings between Auburn and Alabama, 48 took place in Birmingham. The name "Iron Bowl" comes from Birmingham's historic role in the country's iron industry.

### 1893

The first Iron Bowl was played on Feb. 22, 1893 in Birmingham with Auburn taking the 32-22 win. The Tigers won the first two meetings and six of the first seven.



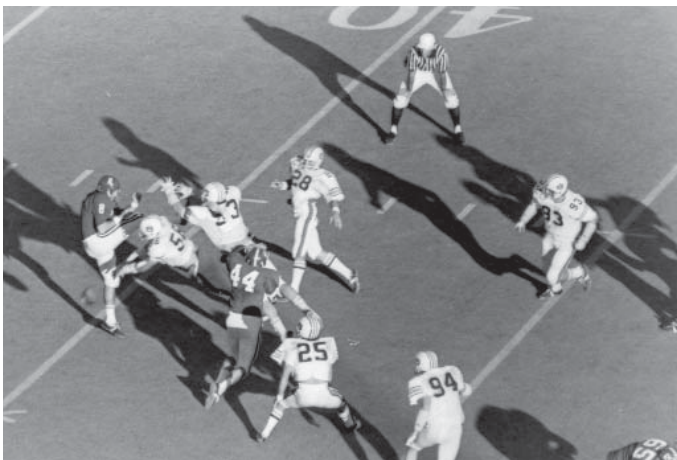
### 1982

The climax to a 23-22 Auburn victory over Alabama in 1982 was Bo Jackson's "Bo Over the Top" 1-yard leap over the Alabama goal line, which capped a 66-yard drive and set the stage for what Auburn people consider the Tigers' "coming out" party in the 1980s.



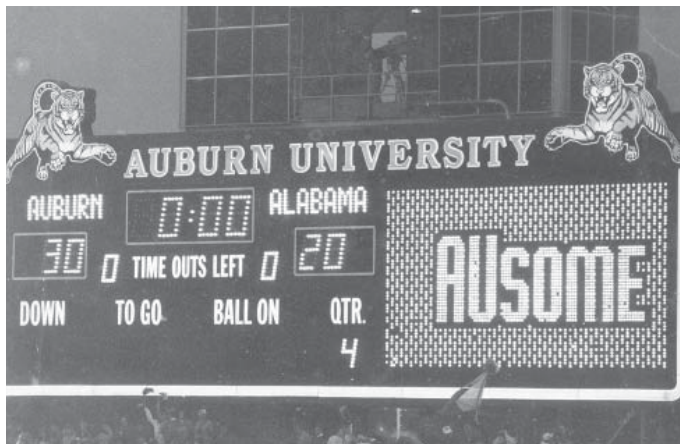
### 1972

Trailing 16-3 with six minutes left, underdog Auburn's David Langner returned two blocked Alabama punts to win the game 17-16, handing the Crimson Tide their first loss of the season and ending hopes of a national title.



## 1989

The first time Auburn and Alabama met in Auburn was in 1989, and the No. 11 Tigers beat the No. 2 Crimson Tide, 30-20, on Dec. 2, 1989.



## 2010

Down 24-0 in the second quarter, the Auburn defense inspired a school-record comeback for a 28-27 win in Tuscaloosa in 2010, en route to a national championship.



## KICK SIX

With one second remaining in the game, Auburn's Chris Davis returned a missed field goal 109 yards to give the Tigers a 34-28 win in the 2013 Iron Bowl.

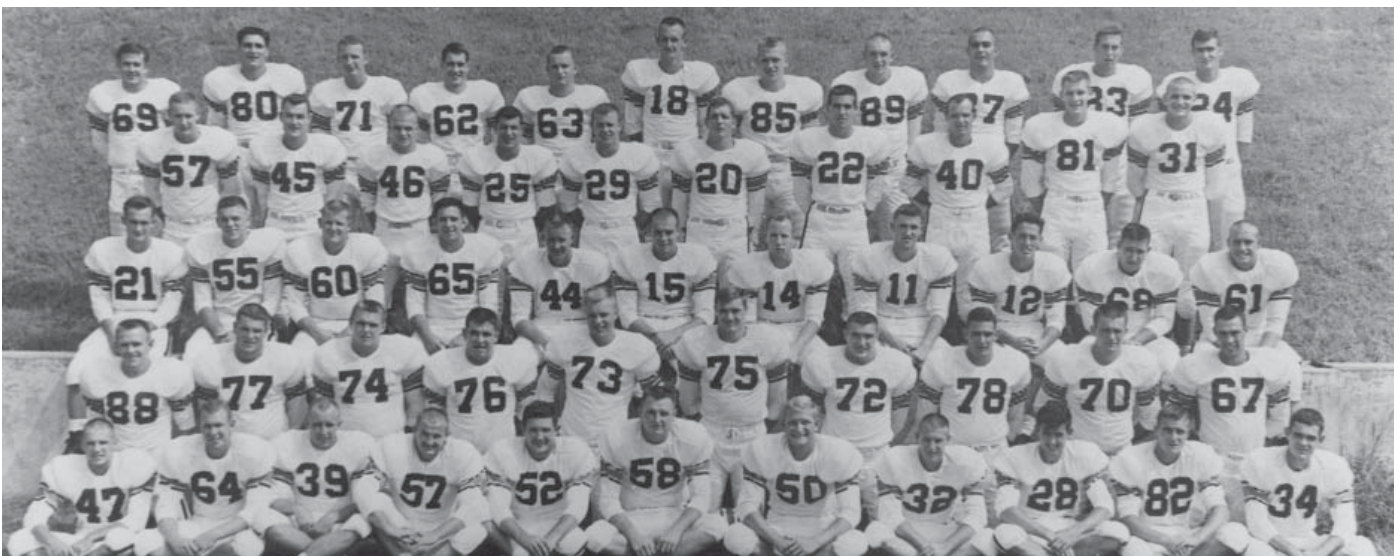

# SEC NETWORK

## SEC NETWORK FACTS

### LAUNCHED

- Launched August 14, 2014.
- 20-year agreement between ESPN and the SEC (through 2034).
- SEC Network linear channel and SEC Network + (digital component) comprise the SEC Network.
- Intended to televise more than 450 live events on SEC Network each year including more than 45 football games, 100 men's basketball games, 60 women's basketball games, 75 baseball games and contests across the SEC's 21 sports.
- Set out to produce more than 550 live events on digital component annually.

### YEAR ONE FACTS

- SEC Network's television launch was the most successful new channel launch in cable history.
- In its debut year SEC Network skyrocketed past its goal of carrying 1,000 live SEC events, and produced more than 1,500. Thanks to the new network, the number of SEC baseball games available on national television quadrupled, softball increased threefold, women's volleyball and soccer coverage quintupled and gymnastics was produced live for the first time. The network carried 48 football games last season, and hundreds of men's and women's basketball games on SEC Network and SEC Network +.
- In its debut year, SEC Network surrounded the 21 SEC-sponsored sports and championships with 1,400 hours of original programming including its flagship news and information show SEC Now, the traveling pregame show SEC Nation, The Paul Finebaum Show, Film Room, SEC in 60, SEC Rewind and many more. ESPN Films premiered nine new SEC Storied documentaries on the network, including "It's Time", which was nominated for two Emmy Awards.

### CURRENTLY AS WE WRAP UP YEAR FOUR AND HEAD INTO YEAR FIVE

- The first four years of the SEC Network have proven to be one of the most successful launches by a network in all of cable television. It has placed the Southeastern Conference, its member institutions and sports teams on a national stage with brand recognition in every corner of the country.
- That was the vision when the SEC and ESPN signed a 20-year agreement through 2034 to create and operate a multi-platform network which launched on Aug. 14, 2014. The network and its accompanying digital platform, SEC Network+, carries SEC live events and programming 24/7, including some 1,500 events each year.
- The network televises 45 football games, more than 100 men's basketball games, 60 women's basketball games, 75 baseball games, and events from across the SEC's 21 sports annually.
- Besides the volume of network-produced programming, all 14 schools built state-of-the-art control rooms and purchased HD camera equipment to provide the same quality coverage for events that viewers have been accustomed to for years across ESPN networks.
- These school-produced events are made available exclusively through the ESPN App as part of SEC Network+ on connected devices, allowing fans to watch their favorite teams anytime, anywhere.
- SEC Network has also become known for its signature studio show "SEC Now" and its traveling weekly football pregame show "SEC Nation," in addition to its weekly wall-to-wall coverage of Saturday SEC football. SEC Network also debuted "Thinking Out Loud" for football fans last fall, recapping each weekend's action with highlights, analysis and viral moments from around the conference.





ESPN Gameday has hosted its show nine times on Auburn's campus, including six times in the last 13 years.



- This season all 12 of Auburn's games will be televised.
- CBS will televise the SEC Championship Game.
- CBS will also continue to air an SEC Game of the Week.
- Games aired on the ESPN family of networks will air on either ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU with simulcasts also offered online via WatchESPN.
- Auburn has appeared on ESPN 118 times - the most in the SEC.
- The Tigers have played in ESPN Gameday's on-site game 18 times, including 14 times in the last 14 years.







**UNDER ARMOUR**

The Auburn-Under Armour relationship began in 2006 and a new nine-year contract signed in 2016 cements the relationship for years to come. The \$78.1 million deal includes \$22.5 million in cash and \$10 million worth of Under Armour stock in a partnership that runs through 2025.
