2008 Season Final Notes

2008 In Review

Since Tim Gray stepped on to the Plains to coach the Auburn women's tennis team, history has been made, and 2008 was no exception.

The Tigers went 17 10, 5 6 SEC, and advanced to the second round of both the conference and NCAA tournament for the second consecutive season. The Tigers also sent three individuals to compete in the NCAA Individual Championship for the second year in a row.

Auburn began 2008 with a tough loss to No. 1 Georgia Tech, but bounced back to win five straight shut out victories, eight total, before beginning.

The Tigers began conference play in Fayetteville, Ark, and captured a 4 3 upset over the Lady Backs. Auburn suffered a tough loss to LSU, but earned two straight conference wins over Ole Miss and Mississippi State. Auburn took a break from the SEC to defeat the then No. 15 TCU Horned Frogs. Freshman Gaby Beelen clinched the win and earned SEC Freshman of the Week.

Auburn fell in five tough SEC matches, but ended the regular season with two conference victories over South Carolina and Alabama.

In the SEC Tournament, held in Auburn at the Yarbrough Tennis Center, Auburn defeated the Gamecocks for a second time to advance to the second round. The Tigers fell to the one seeded Gators in the second round.

The Tigers moved on into the NCAA tournament, playing the first and second round in Gainesville. Auburn defeated Ohio State in the first round, with Fani Chifchieva clinching the victory. The Tigers' season ended at the hands of the Gators as they prevailed again over the Auburn.

Three Tigers, however, went on to compete in the NCAA Individual Tournament. Chifchieva picked up four wins and advanced to the semifinals. She was selected as an ITA All American for the second year in a row. She concluded the season ranked as the No. 11 singles player in the nation.

Alex Haney and Melissa Koning represented the Tigers in the doubles bracket. The pair picked up a win in the first round, but fell in the second. Both Haney and Koning were named All Americans after a great season. The pair ended 2008 ranked as the No. 10 doubles team in the nation; the highest final ranking of any Tiger in the program's history.

Auburn in the Polls

The Tigers began the 2008 season ranked as the No. 27 team in the country and remained there for two straight weeks. Auburn has fallen as far as the No. 41 team, but rose again and remained in the top 30 for five straight weeks. Auburn is ranked No. 28 in the final season rankings.

Two Tigers are ranked in the top 125 singles players in the nation, and one doubles team makes the cut for the top 60.

Sophomore Fani Chifchieva began the season unranked and since has worked her way to the No. 11 singles player in the nation.

Alex Haney began the season ranked at No. 86, but briefly fell out of the polls. However, she returned at No. 107, and rose up to the No. 66 spot. She finished the season ranked as the No. 70 singles player.

Haney along with doubles partner Melissa Koning began the season unranked, but the pair debuted in the rankings at No. 47 on March 4, and finished the season ranked as the No. 10 doubles team in the nation, the highest ranking of any Tiger in program history.

Chifchieva Making History

The past two seasons have been benchmark years for the Tigers, and Fani Chifchieva has been the leader in that movement. Last year, Chifchieva was named the program's

first ITA All-American as well as South Region Freshman of the Year. This year she became the program's first SEC Women's Tennis Athlete of the Year, posting a 21-2 singles record. Following the First Round of the NCAA Tournament, Chifchieva was named ITA Player to Watch.

Following an impressive run in the NCAA Individual Singles Championship, Chifchieva was again selected as an All-American.

Haney on the Rise

Auburn Junior Alex Haney is the other driving force in Auburn's success. She posted an 18-5 regular season record, going 8-3 in the conference, and earned herself a First Team All-SEC selection for the first time in her career.

With three great seasons under her belt, Haney is also etched in the records of AU history. She is second on the Auburn all-time combined victories list with 157. Haney holds the spot with second most career singles victories in AU History with 87. She is third most doubles victories with 72 and for second most single season victories with 29, and tied third most doubles victories with 25.

Double Team

Alex Haney and Melissa Koning have paired up to become one of the best doubles duo's in the nation, and for their efforts in 2008, the pair became the first doubles All-Americans in Auburn history.

Haney and Koning went 13-3 overall and 9-2 in the conference. The duo began the season unranked and debuted at No. 47. Since then they climbed steadily and were ranked No. 10 in the final season rankings; the highest ranking for any Tiger in the program's history.


