Auburn Returns To SEC Play vs. Florida

The Series ... Auburn stays at home for a three-game series with Florida. Saturday's doubleheader begins at 1 p.m. CT with the series finale Sunday at 1 p.m.

Saturday's doubleheader is designated as StrikeOut Cancer Day. Fans in attendance can donate per strikeout (counting for both teams) while the first 250 fans in attendance will receive a commemorative lunch cooler.

One-Hitter Over USA ... Anna Thompson struck out 12 and allowed just one hit as the Tigers defeated South Alabama, 3-0, on Tuesday. The 12 strikeouts marked the 10th double-digit strikeout effort for Thompson this season.

It was Thompson's first win since March 27 at Arkansas.

Coming Up ... Auburn stays at home to host a doubleheader with Alabama A&M on Wednesday. The Tigers then travel for their final road trip of the season April 21 and 22 at No. 1 Tennessee.

Things To Note ...

• Anna Thompson needs 20 strikeouts to tie Holly Currie's 250 in 2005. Thompson is currently fourth in AU single-season history with 230 strikeouts.

• Lauren Walton is on a three-game hit streak and is 4 for 7 during that stretch.

• Holly Currie is 8 for 25 all-time against Florida, having hit one home run while walking seven times.

• Ashley Arcuri leads the Tigers with seven doubles after hitting one against South Alabama.

A Look At Florida ... The Gators are 32-17 this season and 8-9 in SEC play. Florida has won four of its last five games after taking two of three from Arkansas in Gainesville last weekend. The Gators also took a doubleheader over Florida State prior to the series with the Lady Backs.

Kim Waleszonias paces the club offensively with a .368 average. while three players are tied for the team lead with four home runs apiece. Florida, as a team, is a tick above the Tigers with a .247 batting average in 49 games.

Three pitchers have seen action for the Gators, although Corrie Brooks has appeared in just three games and four innings. Stacey Nelson leads the club with a 19-10 record and 1.08 ERA in 195 innings. She has struck out 176 while allowing 138 hits. Opponents are batting .199 against her this season. Stacey Stevens, meanwhile, is 13-7 with a 2.22 ERA in 24 starts. She has struck out 94 in 138 2/3 innings.

The All-Time Series ... Auburn leads the all-time series, 15-13, and is 9-4 in games played on The Plains. The Tigers have won four of the past six games after the Gators had taken the previous three.

Last Season ... Florida took two of three from the Tigers last season in Gainesville. Beth DiPietro threw her only no-hitter of the year in a 2-1 win in the first game of the series, but saw Auburn lose the final two games, 5-4 and 5-0.

Jump Up ... Auburn's Rating Percentage Index entering the series with Florida is at 48, up a spot from 49th. The Tigers saw themselves at 50 in the initial RPI last week.

That's due in large part to the team's strength of schedule, which was upgraded to No. 2 nationally after getting swept by No. 3 Alabama last weekend. That shouldn't change much after the series with Florida, which is 16th in the latest RPI. The Gators, meanwhile, have the nation's fourth-strongest strength of schedule.

StrikeOut Cancer Day ... Saturday will be StrikeOut Cancer Day at Jane B. Moore Field.

The American Cancer Society will be on hand at the game to accept donations. A pledge program will also be set up where fans attending the game can donate a certain amount per Auburn or Florida strikeout. Pledge forms will be made available at the American Cancer Society table on game day.

The first 250 fans to the doubleheader will also receive a lunch cooler commemorating the day. Admission to all regular season games at Jane B. Moore Field is free.

All Alone At No. 4 ... Anna Thompson struck out 12 against South Alabama Tuesday, giving her 230 this season. That places her in fourth on the AU single-season list. She is just the third Tiger to reach the 200-strikeout plateau in a single-season. She joins Kristen Keyes (2002, 2004) and Holly Currie (2005, 2006) as the only Tigers to reach that feat.

Thompson needs 20 strikeouts to tie Currie for third on the list. Currie had 250 in 2005.

Walton On A Three-Gamer ... Lauren Walton stretched her season-high hit streak to three games by going 2 for 3 with two runs scored in the 3-0 win over South Alabama Wednesday. Walton is 4 for 7 during the three-game streak.

Arcuri, Arcuri, Arcuri ... Ashley Arcuri posted Auburn's first hit of the game Tuesday against the Jaguars, doubling to left center. She later scored when Tatiana Fernandez flew out for a sac fly.

Arcuri now leads the Tigers with seven doubles this season. That comes after she hit just three doubles as a freshman.

Against Florida ... Holly Currie, Sara Ghezzi and Lauren Walton have each seen extensive time against the Gators, playing in nine career games against Florida. Currie leads the pack with a .320 average, one home run and seven walks. Ghezzi, meanwhile, is at a .292 clip and Walton is hitting .286 in six starts.

To Tie A Record ... Myesha Finney already held the single-season record for most hit by pitches, but the sophomore took it to a career level after getting plunked in the second inning against South Alabama. Finney has now been hit 26 times in two seasons with the Tigers, which ties Ashley Moore (1999-2002). Finney's single-season record is now at 17.

And Then To Score A Run ... When the Auburn offense lights up the scoreboard, it does it in style. The Tigers are 16-4 this season when scoring three or more runs in a game. At home, that number jumps up to 7-0. Since 2001, the Tigers are 202-49 when scoring three or more runs in a game.

Then There's Pitching ... Meanwhile, when the Tiger pitching staff and defense limit what the opponents can do, the Tigers will come out on top. Auburn is 16-6 this season when allowing two runs or less and 196-29 since 2001.

If The Season Ended Today ... Anna Thompson is one pace for 184 innings through the end of the regular season. If she stays on pace, she will strike out 298 batters, which would be good for second-most in AU single-season history.

At Home ... Of the team's final 13 regular season games, 10 of those will be played at Jane B. Moore Field, including six in Southeastern Conference play. Auburn is 7-9 at home this season, but over the past four seasons, the Tigers have won better than 72 percent of their games at home.

Against Remaining Opponents ... The Tigers are 59-57-1 (.509) all-time against the team's six remaining regular season opponents.

To Get To .500 ... Auburn has 13 games remaining in the regular season. Already having played 44, the Tigers, barring rainouts, will play 57

games this season. At 19-25 this season, the Tigers will need to finish 10-3 through the last 13 games to reach a 29-28 record entering the SEC Tournament.

Why is that figure important? To be eligible for an NCAA Regional, teams must finish with a winning record (after postseason tournaments).

Jane B. Moore Field ... Auburn calls Jane B. Moore Field home for the 10th straight season. The venerable facility hosted its first game in 1998 and was officially dedicated in Dr. Moore's name in 2003. The facility, which hosted a 2005 NCAA Regional, seats 1,500 and will be the site of the 2007 SEC Tournament.

The Tigers are **137-89 (.606)** at Jane B. Moore Field since 1998 and are **71-27 (.724)** the past three seasons.

Last season, the Tigers rode a 19-win season at home as the team saw an average of 439 fans at Jane B. Moore Field, easily a record.

14 Again ... Anna Thompson struck out 14 for the second time this season in a 4-1 loss to LSU May 31 in the second game of a doubleheader.

Thompson now has nine double-digit strikeout efforts this season en route to her team-leading 218 strikeouts.

You Won't Score ... Because Anna Thompson won't let you. The freshman has inherited 21 runners this season when entering a game -- including three against Florida Atlantic -- and has allowed just two to score. Those two came in the first game of the season against DePaul.

That's A Record ... Holly Currie struck out six in two appearances against Ole Miss March 17-18 and in the process set a new Auburn strikeout record.

With her first strikeout of the series against Ole Miss, it coming against Ashley Dowdy, Currie surpassed Kristen Keyes, who had 727 strikeouts from

2002-04. Currie, who already held the Tiger record for appearances and starts, now has 756 career strikeouts. She is at 129 for the 2007 season.

Tiger Seniors ... Auburn's seniors have been the most accomplished group in team history, winning 147 games overall and 61 in SEC play since 2004.

She's Swift ... Lindsey Harrelson tied an Auburn single-game record by swiping three stolen bases in the series finale against Ole Miss on March 18. She stole second in the third inning, then second again in the sixth. Harrelson then took third to tie the record and was going for a fourth on a double steal. But the Rebels were able to get her out in a rundown.

The Tigers actually stole a season-high six bases in the win, putting them just two off tying a single-game record eight set in 1999 against Alabama A&M. The six stolen bases tied a single-game record against an SEC opponent.

Deese In 11th Season ... Auburn head coach Tina Deese is in her 11th season at the helm of the Auburn softball program and 19th overall. The former Huntingdon College head coach is 353-311-1 in 11 seasons with the Tigers and has taken Auburn to three straight NCAA postseason berths.

Deese is the only SEC head coach to remain with her club since its inception. She has the second-most tenure of any SEC coach, trailing South Carolina's Joyce Compton, who is in her 21st year with the Gamecocks.

Deese won her 600th career game in Auburn's 1-0 victory March 8 of the 2006 season. That came just a month after she won her 300th game at Auburn in 15-1 defeat of Miami (Ohio) in the second game of the season on Feb. 10.

Change In The SEC Schedule ... The Southeastern Conference reduced its schedule by two games for the 2007 season, giving each team 28

Thompson is just the second Tiger to earn SEC Freshman honors after the conference instituted it last season. Tatiana Fernandez was the first.

Just Learn To Say 'No' ... Holly Currie's no-hitter against Georgia State Feb. 14 marked the seventh of her career. The senior holds the AU career record for no-no's. She also holds the single-season record with five last season. She is the only Tiger with a perfect game, achieved February 11, 2005 against the College of Charleston.

About The Auburn Assistants ... Head coach Tina Deese is assisted by coaches Jack Byerley and Stewart McGill. Byerley is in his third season with the Tigers and McGill his first, although he has served as a student manager the past two seasons.

Byerley came to the Auburn program prior to the 2005 season after two seasons as the head coach at Francis Marion in South Carolina. Prior to serving as head coach there, he was an assistant at Florida. His first stop in the SEC came after a four-year stint as the head coach at Central Alabama Community College. Byerley was the head coach at Robertsdale (Ala.) High School from 1989-96.

McGill is well-known in SEC circles after serving as a student manager with Auburn the past two years after two seasons in the same position at Arkansas. He also has two years of international head coach experience after guiding the Florida Quicksilver at the annual Canada Cup in British Columbia. Current Tigers Lauren Walton, Holly Currie, Ashley Arcuri and Jorja Bell played for McGill's team this past off-season.

Tigers Switch To Under Armour ... The Auburn softball uniforms may have looked the same in 2006 to the casual observer, but the Tigers made one key change to the uniforms. The uniforms are now made by Under Armour Performance Apparel as part of a five-year contract signed in December of 2005 that makes Under Armour the official outfitter of all of Auburn's athletic teams. The contract, worth \$10.6 million in sponsorship, product and additional benefits, will see Auburn's athletic teams wearing Under Armour uniforms, cleats, apparel and accessories beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.
