THE GAME

Auburn begins its 117th year of football when it hosts Louisiana Tech in the 12th all-time meeting between the two schools. The game, which is the season opener for both schools, begins at 6 p.m. CT.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn has an 89-25-2 record in season-opening games. Auburn has won 18 of its last 23 openers, including a current streak of three straight wins.
- ▶ Auburn's 89 season-opening victories is just one win behind Alabama for the most among the 12 Southeastern Conference schools.
- ▶ The Sept. 5 season opener marks the latest opener for the Tigers in 17 years, since opening on Sept. 5 in 1992.
- ▶ Gene Chizik will be making his head-coaching debut for the Tigers. He previously coached at Auburn from 2002-04 as the Tigers' defensive coordinator.
- ▶ Auburn head coaches have an all-time record of 16-8-1 in their first games as head coach of the Tigers, and the last four have all been victorious in their Auburn debuts.
- ▶ Auburn has never lost to any of the current members of the Western Athletic Conference with a 14-0-1 record.
- ▶ Auburn returns 100 percent of its passing yardage and more than 80 percent of its rushing yardage from last season.
- ▶ Entering its 70th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's tenth-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers are **265-67-7 (.792)** at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a **51-13 (.797)** mark since the start of the 2000 season.
- ▶ Auburn is 15-3 in home night games since the 2000 season, including victories over four nationally-ranked teams.
- ▶ Senior Ben Tate needs 41 yards rushing to become just the 13th player in school history to amass 2,000 career rushing yards.
- ▶ Senior defensive end Antonio Coleman has 14.5 career sacks, and needs one more to move into the top 10 in Auburn history for career sacks.
- ▶ Auburn has won 49 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points in a game, dating back to a 56-49, four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.
- ▶ Auburn has eight players on its squad that have already graduated, which is tied for sixth most in the nation among FBS schools.

GENE CHIZIK ERA BEGINS ON THE PLAINS

A new era of Auburn football begins as Gene Chizik enters his first season as Auburn's head coach. It marks Chizik's second stint on the Plains, as he previously served as defensive coordinator from 2002-04, helping lead the Tigers to a perfect 13-0 record in 2004 while earning the Frank Broyles Awards as the nation's top assistant coach. His defense led the nation in scoring that season (11.3 ppg) and the Tigers were 30-9 overall during his previous three-year stint.

Chizik went on to help guide Texas to the 2005 national championship while serving as assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator for the Longhorns. After two seasons in Austin, he was named head coach at Iowa State, where he spent two more years prior to returning to Auburn.

Chizik's reputation as an outstanding teacher is evident by the fact that he coached three consecutive Thorpe Award Winners, starting with Auburn's Carlos Rogers in 2004, followed by Texas' Michael Huff and Aaron Ross in 2005 and 2006, respectively.

AUBURN RECORD IN HEAD COACH DEBUTS

Auburn head coaches have an all-time record of 16-8-1 in their first games as head coach of the Tigers. Auburn's last four head coaches and seven of the last eight have won their debuts. The only time since 1944 that Auburn lost its first game with a new head coach came in 1976, when Doug Barfield suffered a 31-19 loss at Arizona.

Auburn's largest margin of victory during a head coaching debut was a 32-0 win over Samford during Carl Voyles' first game in 1944. No Auburn head coach has ever had to face a nationally-ranked team in his debut. Also of note is that legendary coach John Heisman was unsuccessful in his debut, falling 9-6 at Vanderbilt in 1895.

AUBURN IN OPENERS

Auburn has an 89-25-2 record in season-opening games. The Tigers have won three straight season openers after dropping three of their previous four. Auburn beat ULM last year, 34-0, Kansas State in 2007, 23-13, and Washington State, 40-14, in 2006. The Tigers' last loss in a season opener was a 23-14 decision against Georgia Tech in 2005. Auburn has won 18 of its last 23 season openers.

OPENING W's TIED FOR SECOND IN SEC

Auburn's total of 89 season-opening victories is just one behind Alabama for the best among the 12 Southeastern Conference Schools.

The Tigers are tied with Arkansas for second, followed by Georgia with 88 wins in season openers. Ole Miss is next with 85, followed by Tennessee and LSU (82), Kentucky (79), South Carolina and Florida (75), Mississippi State (74) and Vanderbilt (66).

NON-CONFERENCE OPENERS

Since 1977, Auburn is 22-5 in season openers against non-conference opponents. In 114 years of football at Auburn, the Tigers are 52-15 when opening the season versus non-conference foes.

LATEST SEASON OPENER IN 17 YEARS

When Auburn opens its 2009 season on Sept. 5, it will mark the latest the Tigers have opened a season since 1992, when Auburn also began play on Sept. 5, at Ole Miss. Prior to 1992, Auburn had only started its season earlier than Sept. 5 twice (1991, 1984).

OPENING DAY SUPERLATIVES

Auburn has had numerous outstanding individual and team performances in season-opening games. Bo Jackson's 290 rushing yards versus SW Louisiana in 1985 and Alexander Wright's 263 receiving yards in 1989 against Pacific are the best season-opening performances by an SEC player.

The Tigers' 565 rushing yards and 695 yards of total offense against SW Louisiana in the 1985 opener are school single-season records.

LA TECH QUICK HITTERS

Head coach Derek Dooley is in his third season as head coach at Louisiana Tech ... Dooley is the son of coaching legend Vince Dooley, who lettered at quarterback for Auburn for three seasons from 1951-53 ... The Bulldogs return 17 starters (nine offense, seven defense, one specialist) from last year's team that finished 8-5 and won the Independence Bowl with a 17-10 victory over Northern Illinois ... The Independence Bowl victory was Tech's first bowl win since 1977 ... Louisiana Tech was picked to finish tied for third by the coaches and fourth by the media in the Western Athletic Conference's preseason polls ... Senior running back Daniel Porter was named to the Doak Walker Award watch list after rushing for 1,164 yards and nine touchdowns as a junior ... Louisiana Tech ranked 13th in the nation in

rushing defense last season, allowing 103.8 yards per game ... The Bulldogs' special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country in 2008 in the culmination of net punting, punt returns, kickoff return defense and kickoff returns.

LA TECH-AUBURN CONNECTIONS

▶ Louisiana Tech defensive line coach Jimmy Brumbaugh was a defensive lineman at Auburn from 1995-99. He registered 291 career tackles, including 22 tackles for loss and 15 sacks. He was a first-team All-SEC selection as a junior.

▶ Auburn assistant head coach/wide receivers coach Trooper Taylor was the wide receivers coach at Tulane from 1999-2003, working under Green Wave offensive coordinator Frank Scelfo, who is now the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Louisiana Tech.

▶ Louisiana Tech head trainer Keith Bunch earned his master's degree from Auburn in 2004 while working on the Tigers' sports medicine staff.

▶ Louisiana Tech junior quarterback Steven Ensminger was a member of the Auburn team in 2006 before transferring to Tech. His father, Steve Ensminger, was on Auburn's coaching staff from 2003-08, coaching quarterbacks (2003) and tight ends (2004-08).

LOUISIANA TIGERS

Auburn has two members of its squad who hail from the state of Louisiana. WR DeAngelo Benton is from Bastrop and LB Ashton Richardson is from New Orleans.

ALABAMA BULLDOGS

Louisiana Tech has two players on its roster from the state of Alabama: LB Adrien Cole (Mobile/McGill-Toolen) and LB Solomon Randle (Mobile/Leflore Academy).

AUBURN-LA TECH SERIES HISTORY

Auburn owns a 10-0-1 record against Louisiana Tech and has won the last seven meetings in a row, all since 1989. All 11 games have been played in Auburn. The Tigers won the last meeting, 52-7, during Auburn's undefeated 2004 season. The closest call during the current seven-game streak was a 48-41 overtime victory in 2001. The one tie in the series came in 1948 (13-13).

AGAINST THE WAC

Auburn has played just 15 games in its history against teams currently in the Western Athletic Conference, and 11 of those contests were against Louisiana Tech. The Tigers have never lost to any of the WAC teams with a 14-0-1 record.

In addition to Auburn's 10-0-1 record against the Bulldogs, the Tigers are 2-0 against New Mexico State, including a victory in 2007, and 1-0 against both Fresno State and Idaho.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn has only played three previous times on Sept. 5, owning a 2-1 record in those games. Auburn defeated both TCU (24-16) in 1981 and Texas (31-3) in 1987, but fell to Ole Miss in 1992, 45-21.

IN SEPTEMBER

Auburn is 144-47-5 (.747) all-time in the month of September, and has won 20 of its last 24 September contests. The Tigers have posted a winning record during the month of September in each of the previous five seasons, and 25 of the previous 27.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now celebrating its 70th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers, who set a school record by averaging 86,915 fans last season, are 265-67-7 (.792) all-time at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn has had nine straight winning seasons at Jordan-Hare Stadium, posting a mark of 51-13 (.797) at home since the 2000 season. The Tigers were undefeated at home during two of those seasons, going 7-0 in both 2000 and 2004.

UNDER THE LIGHTS AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn has been tough to beat in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a season-opening victory over Louisiana-Monroe last year. The Tigers have accumulated a record of 15-3 since the 2000 season in home games starting at 6 p.m. or later. That stretch includes a 4-1 record against ranked opponents, with wins over No. 1 Florida in 2001, No. 2 Florida in 2006, No. 7 Tennessee in 2003 and No. 14 Georgia in 2000.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Auburn is one of just two teams in the Southeastern Conference that is playing three non-conference games this season against teams that went to bowl games last season. South Carolina is the other.

Auburn opens the season with Louisiana Tech, which won the Independence Bowl last season. The Tigers' second non-conference game is against West Virginia, which defeated North Carolina in the Meineke Car Care Bowl. The following week the Tigers host Ball State, which fell to Gus Malzahn's Tulsa team in the GMAC Bowl, 45-13.

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 28 of its last 40 Southeastern Conference games and 29 of its last 41 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back beyond 2004, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the fourth best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games, just two games behind the leader. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-08.

OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

Auburn's offense returns all of its passing yardage and more than 80 percent of its rushing yardage from last season, although the Tigers will need to fill the void left by last season's leading receiver, Rodgeriquis Smith, and their two leading kick returners, Tristan Davis and Robert Dunn. Still, Auburn has at least 56 percent of its firepower back in every category this season.

RUNNING BACK U.

Auburn looks to continue its tradition of producing high-caliber running backs, as its top two rushers from last season and four of the top five return in 2009. Senior Ben Tate led the team for the second year in a row with 664 yards rushing in 2008, and enters his season ranked 14th in school history with 1,959 career rushing yards. He needs just 227 yards to move into the top 10 in rushing in school history, and an 852-yard season would push him into the top five.

Junior quarterback Kodi Burns was second on the team in rushing last year with 411 yards, while junior Mario Fannin added 238 yards on the ground and sophomore Eric Smith had 83.

GONE ON D

Defensively in 2009, Auburn returns seven starters from last year's squad that ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense (18.0) and 29th in total defense (317.8). The Tigers will need to replace two interior defensive linemen, as tackle Sen'Derrick Marks left following his junior season to become a second-round pick of the Tennessee Titans, and nose guard Tez Doolittle completed his final season of eligibility. The secondary had just one departure, but it was another top-flight player, as Jerraud Powers also declared for the NFL draft after his junior year, becoming a third-round pick of the Indianapolis Colts. The linebacking corps lost third-leading tackler Chris Evans.

The returning group includes junior safeties Zac Etheridge and Mike McNeil, who led the team with 75 and 65 tackles, respectively, last season. Juniors Craig Stevens (54 tackles) and Josh Bynes (53 tackles) lead the returners at linebacker, and senior defensive end Antonio Coleman, who led the team with six sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss, heads the defensive line.

Other returning starters on the defense include junior end Michael Goggans and senior cornerback Walter McFadden, while DT Mike Blanc, DE Antonio Carter, DL Zach Clayton, DB D'Antoine Hood and DB Neiko Thorpe all started at least one game last season.

WATCH LISTS

Three members of the Auburn team have been named to preseason watch lists for national awards.

Antonio Coleman leads the way, landing on four watch lists, including those for the Lombardi Award (best lineman or linebacker), Bronko Nagurski Award (best defensive player), Chuck Bednarik Award (best defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (best defensive end).

Ben Tate has been named to the Maxwell Award watch list, for the nation's outstanding player, and Tommy Trott is on watch list for the John Mackey Award, which goes to the nation's top tight end.

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 46 lettermen from last season, including 24 on offense, 18 on defense and four specialists. Auburn returns seven starters on offense and seven on defense.

Auburn's current roster of 113 players includes 13 seniors, 31 juniors, 27 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 31 freshmen. The underclassmen (69) represent 61.1 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 17.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Auburn's kicking specialists return intact for the upcoming season, although the Tigers will need to replace their leading kick returners from 2008.

Junior Wes Byrum has led Auburn in scoring in each of the past two seasons, converting 28-of-42 field goal attempts during his career for 141 career points.

Senior punter Clinton Durst was fifth in the SEC and 26th in the NCAA last season averaging 42.1 yards per punt, while junior Ryan Shoemaker averaged 42.4 yards per kick as a freshman in 2006, ranking 16th nationally.

As for returners, the Tigers lost the SEC's leader in kickoff return average (Tristan Davis - 27.4) and punt return average (Robert Dunn - 16.0). Junior Mario Fannin is the leading kick returner, with 30 career kickoff returns for 647 yards (21.6 avg.). No current member of the Auburn roster has returned a punt in college.

THE SENIOR CLASS

Head coach Gene Chizik has a senior class that includes 13 players at Auburn in 2009. It marks the smallest senior class at Auburn since the 2003 squad had 13 seniors.

The 2009 seniors include: WR Montez Billings, DE Antonio Coleman, DS Clayton Crofoot, P Clinton Durst, OT Andrew McCain, CB Walter McFadden, TE Gabe McKenzie, DB Woody Parramore, DL Jake Ricks, DB Aairon Savage, RB Ben Tate, QB Chris Todd and TE Tommy Trott.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 14 seniors, seven have seen time in at least 30 games during their careers. Tommy Trott leads the group, having played in 39 career games, including 37 of a possible 38 over the past three seasons. Gabe McKenzie is the only senior to have played in all 38 games over the past three years. Antonio Coleman is next, with 37 games played, followed by Walter McFadden (36 games), Ben Tate (34), Montez Billings (33) and Jake Ricks (31).

STARTS STREAK

Junior Lee Ziemba enters the 2009 season with the longest starting streak on the squad, having started all 25 games over the past two seasons. Only three other players have starting streaks that date back to the 2007 season. Juniors Zac Etheridge and Ryan Pugh both have started 15 straight contests, while junior Craig Stevens has 13 straight starts under his belt.

Three other players return for the 2009 season that started all 12 games last year, including senior Walter McFadden and juniors Michael Goggans and Mike McNeil.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Auburn has had a knack for winning close games in recent seasons. Since the 2003 Capitol One Bowl, Auburn is 18-9 in games decided by seven points or less, even after posting just a 2-4 record in such games during the 2008 season. Nine of the 18 wins were by three points or less, with just four losses coming by that margin.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn begins the season with eight graduates on its roster, which is tied for sixth most among all FBS schools.

The Tiger graduates include: WR Montez Billings (Public Administration), DE Antonio Coleman (Criminology), CB Walter McFadden (Public Administration), TE Gabe McKenzie (Criminology), DB Airon Savage (Exercise Science), RB Ben Tate (Criminology), QB Chris Todd (Business Finance) and TE Tommy Trott (Public Administration).

Auburn has won 49 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 23 years, Auburn is 118-2 when scoring 30 points.

In the last 10 seasons, Auburn is 71-8 (.899) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 114-15-1 (.881) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.
