SCOUTING ARKANSAS

The Razorbacks closed out non-conference play with two impressive wins over Texas (67-61) on Jan. 6 and over Oklahoma (96-88) on Dec. 30 before opening SEC play with three straight losses to Mississippi State (70-56), at Ole Miss (74-65) and at Florida (80-65) ... Michael Washington leads the Razorbacks in both scoring and rebounding by averaging a double-double with 17.3 points and 10.3 rebounds ... Washington leads the SEC in rebounding and offensive rebounding (3.6), is third in field goal pct. (.596) and is eighth in scoring ... freshman Courtney Fortson, a Montgomery, Ala., native, is averaging 14.7 points and 6.4 assists (2nd in SEC) while Stefan Welsh chips in 12.6 points per game and freshman Rotnei Clarke averages 10.8 points while shooting 39 percent from 3-point range ... the Razorbacks have a week off before playing host to Auburn.

AUBURN-ARKANSAS SERIES

This is the 37th meeting between the Tigers and Razorbacks with Arkansas holding a 23-13 series lead.

The Hogs have won five of the last six games between the two with the lone Auburn victory coming Feb. 21, 2007, in a 67-59 win in Auburn.

The Tigers have a 10-7 series edge in Auburn (all at BEMC).

Auburn is 2-15 in Fayetteville, including a 1-14 mark in Bud Walton Arena. Auburn has lost five straight games in Fayetteville.

The teams are 1-1 at neutral sites.

The Tigers' two wins in Fayetteville came in a 52-37 victory in Bud Walton Arena Jan. 11, 2003, and in a 100-89 victory over the eighth-ranked Razorbacks in 1993, the final season of Barnhill Arena.

JEFF LEBO vs. ARKANSAS

Auburn's Jeff Lebo is 2-6 against Arkansas as a head coach.

The Tigers and Razorbacks split the season series in 2005 and 2007 with Arkansas sweeping Auburn in 2006 and 2008.

Lebo was 2-5 against the Razorbacks as an assistant.

JEFF LEBO vs. JOHN PELPHREY

Auburn's Jeff Lebo is 1-2 against Arkansas' John Pelphrey as a head coach. Auburn defeated Pelphrey's South Alabama Jaguars 82-71 last season in Auburn and the Tigers lost to the Razorbacks twice in 2008.

Lebo is 2-6 against the Razorbacks while Pelphrey is 2-1 vs. Auburn.

LAST 5 LOSSES IN FAYETTEVILLE

After losing to Arkansas 62-60 in Fayetteville in 2002 and defeating the Razorbacks 57-52 in Bud Walton Arena in 2003, Auburn has lost five straight games in Bud Walton by an average of 19.8 points (99).

In the last two games vs. the Hogs in Fayetteville, Auburn has narrowed the margin by losing by an average of 10.5 points.

Arkansas thrashed Auburn 74-52 in 2004 and blasted the Tigers 95-59 in the worst loss in series history in 2005. In 2006, Arkansas pounded Auburn 84-64 in Bud Walton, defeated the Tigers 65-57 in 2007 and 77-64 in 2008.

4th NATIONALLY IN STEALS

Auburn ranks fourth nationally and leads the SEC averaging 10.3 steals per game. Four Tigers rank fourth through ninth in the SEC rankings led by DeWayne Reed in fourth with 2.0 steals per game, Quntez Robertson in fifth with 1.8, Tay Waller in eighth with 1.8 and Frankie Sullivan in ninth with 1.6 steals per game.

FREE? THROWS

Auburn ranks last in the SEC shooting 59.5 percent from the foul line this year. Bad free throw shooting has cost the Tigers in four of their six losses this year.

BRUTAL STRETCH

Auburn closes out its brutal SEC opening stretch at Arkansas Saturday. The Tigers lost at South Carolina and to Florida, defeated Alabama and lost at Kentucky in the first four games of conference play.

The five teams are a combined 65-20 (.765) while the three teams Auburn plays on the road in South Carolina, Arkansas and Kentucky are a combined 29-3 (.906) at home.

DEFENSE

Auburn is ranked third in the SEC in scoring defense as it allows only 62.0 points per game. The Tigers lead the league averaging 10.3 steals per game and are second in the league with a +3.8 turnover margin.

SPEED REED

DeWayne Reed is averaging 19.2 points in Auburn's last six games while shooting 46 percent (40-of-87) from the field.

He had career-high tying 22 points at Kentucky, 19 points vs. Alabama and 21 points at South Carolina after having back-to-back 20 point games vs. Tulane and Southeastern Louisiana.

The Houston, Texas, native made the

game-winning 3-pointer in Auburn's 58-56 victory at Virginia on Dec. 20 and made the game saving block of a UVa. 3-point attempt with five seconds remaining.

He is averaging a team-high 13.9 points and dishing out 3.7 assists per game.

He had back-to-back game-highs with a career-high 22 points when Auburn only scored 59 points in a one-point loss to Dayton in overtime and followed that up with 21 points when Auburn scored 61 points vs. Northern Iowa.

BARBER SHOP

Korvotney Barber is averaging 11.3 ppg and 10.7 rpg in the past nine games. He ranks fifth in the SEC averaging 8.5 rebounds per game.

He had a career-best 18 rebound effort at South Carolina on Jan. 10 and had 16 boards vs. Southeastern Louisiana on Dec. 31.

He is averaging 12.4 points and 8.5 rebounds while shooting a team-best 55 percent from the floor this year.

Barber has five double-doubles on the season and 13 in his career.

The Manchester, Ga., native recorded his first double-double of the season and the ninth of his career with 11 points and 10 rebounds vs. Northern Iowa Nov. 29.

Barber scored a game-high 22 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field in

Auburn's 75-60 season opening win over Missouri State and had 18 points, nine rebounds and two blocks in the win over Alabama on Jan. 17.

Last year, he was leading the nation shooting 72.0 percent from the field when he broke his left hand three minutes into Auburn's Dec. 29, 2007, game vs. Towson and missed the rest of last season.

MANCHESTER MATES

Manchester (Ga.) High School has been good to Auburn as two of the Tig-

gers' top leading scorers, Korvotney Barber and Tay Waller, were teammates there.

The duo is combining for 34.7 percent of Auburn's scoring and 30.3 percent of the Tigers' rebounding by averaging 24.7 points and 11.0 rebounds per game.

Barber is averaging 12.4 points and is fifth in the SEC with 8.5 rebounds per game while shooting a team-best 55 percent from the field. Waller is averaging 12.3 points and has made a team-high 51 three-point field goals.

T(R)AY WALLER

Tay Waller snapped out of a mini-slump with a career-high tying 22 points vs. Alabama on Jan. 17 while making 6-of-8 three-point attempts. The Manchester, Ga., native made three of his treys to help give Auburn a 23-6 lead over Alabama in the first five minutes.

Coming into the Alabama game, Waller was only 6-of-29 (.207) from behind the arc in the previous four games.

Waller ranks third in the SEC shooting 35.9 percent from 3-point range.

He followed that up by scoring six points on 2-of-10 shooting from the field vs. Kentucky on Jan. 21, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range.

BARRETT BUCKETS

Senior Rasheem Barrett has averaged 14.7 points on 48 percent (19-of-40) shooting from the field in Auburn's last three games.

He scored a season-high 17 points in 28 minutes at Kentucky on Jan. 21 while also totaling 15 points and had five rebounds vs. Florida Jan. 14 and 12 points vs. Alabama on Jan. 17 in his first start of the season.

He has scored in double figures in seven of his last nine games.

He has bounced back from a slow start (0.5 ppg in Auburn's first six games) after battling a groin injury and then missed the Alabama A&M game Dec. 29 with a sore hamstring.

FRANKIE GOES HOLLYWOOD

Freshman Frankie Sullivan is averaging 6.9 points in only 18.8 minutes per game

He scored a career-high 23 points in only 23 minutes off the bench to go along with six steals in Auburn's 81-74 loss at Xavier Dec. 3.

The Uniontown, Ala., native scored 17 of his points in the second half, including 13 straight for the Tigers as they cut a 22-point Xavier lead down to six.

Sullivan went 6-of-9 from the field, including 4-of-6 from 3-point range and a perfect 7-of-7 from the foul line.

SENIOR TIGER TRIO STARTERS

Auburn's senior trio of Quantez Robertson, Korvotney Barber and Rasheem Barrett has started all but 42 combined games (including all 16 this year plus 20 last year with Korvotney Barber injured) of the 108 games they have played in during the last four seasons.

Robertson has started all 108 games in his Tiger career, while Barber has started 84 of 88 games that he has played and Barrett has started 70 of 106 games.

Jodie Meeks scored a game-high 31 points, Patrick Patterson added 12 points and a career-high 18 rebounds and Perry Stevenson 13 points and 12 boards to lead Kentucky to a 73-64 victory over Auburn before 22,760 in Rupp Arena. DeWayne Reed tied a career-high with 22 points while Rasheem Barrett had a season-high 17 points to lead Auburn. The Tigers were outscored 26-2 from the free throw line. Frankie Sullivan scored five straight points to cap off a 13-2 Auburn run to give the Tigers a 51-48 lead with 9:09 to play. The Wildcats responded with a decisive 12-0 run to take a 60-51 lead with 4:40 left. The game was close throughout as there were 14 lead changes and eight ties. In the first half, the largest lead by either team was four points and a Quantez Robertson 3-pointer gave Auburn a 31-28 lead with 2:43 before halftime. The Tigers led by one going for the last shot and Patterson

blocked a Reed jumper with five seconds on the clock and assisted Ramon Harris on a layup just before the buzzer to give Kentucky a 34-33 halftime lead. Auburn forced 22 Kentucky turnovers, but the Wildcats outshot the Tigers from the foul line, 26-of-32 to 2-of-6.

LAST TIME vs. ARKANSAS

**Arkansas 77, Auburn 64
(Mar. 8, 2008, in Fayetteville, Ark.)**

Sophomore Patrick Beverley scored a career-high 27 points to go along with eight rebounds and four steals to lead Arkansas to a 77-64 victory over Auburn on Senior Night before 19,173 in Bud Walton Arena. Beverley shot 9-of-11 from the field, including a perfect 6-of-6 from 3-point range. Darian Townes, one of six Razorback seniors, added 12 points and 14 rebounds as Arkansas shot both a blistering 53 percent from the field and 3-point range. Arkansas turned a 7-6 deficit into a 45-23 lead with 1:39 left in the half. The Hogs made 8-of-14 treys in the first half to lead 45-26. The Tigers cut the lead to 54-43 with 13:22 remaining but could never get closer than 71-61 with 1:55 left. Frank Tolbert led Auburn with 17 points, Rasheem Barrett added 13 points and Quantez Robertson 12. The Tigers shot a frigid 37 percent in the first half, including 27 percent (4-of-15) from 3-point range. The Hogs outrebounded the Tigers 39-26 for the game.

QUOTING JEFF LEBO

(On going to Arkansas)

"This another very difficult place for us to go play in a tough week playing at Arkansas and at Kentucky. To me, they are two of the toughest places to play in our league and two of the toughest places to play in all the country. We will have our work cut out against a team that has had a week to prepare for us."

(What does Auburn have to do to win at Arkansas?)

"Our transition "D" has to be solid. We can't let them get going with easy baskets in transition which they get a lot of buckets, especially at home. We have a lot of attention placed upon being able to play (Michael) Washington inside. He's having a great season this year. They can play small. They can go a little bit bigger. We have to do a better job offensively in getting some more people, too, than we did against Kentucky."

(On Arkansas beating Oklahoma & Texas & being 0-3 in the SEC)

"They are a young team. That is the one thing. As a coach when you have a young, talented team, it is hard to figure them out all the time. The consistency maybe is not there all the time. But, when they play at home, typically they are pretty good as long as I can remember. They are very good at home. It seems like your young kids are more comfortable playing in your home environment. Anybody that is good enough to beat Texas and Oklahoma certainly when they put it all together and beat those teams, it is something to marvel at. Those are two of the better wins in our league, obviously, at their place. League play is different. For the young kids, it is a long, hard season and having to get up every single game to be ready to play is a difficult thing. Young players have the hardest time adjusting to that."

(What kind of atmosphere are you expecting with Arkansas having a week to get ready at 0-3)

"A difficult one. They are looking at it, too, as a game they need to win at home to shake off their 0-3 start. They are playing at home and always I think have a little added pressure when you are playing at home because you have to take care of

those games at home. They are looking at having a week off and are ready to get back and play against somebody different. They probably had a tough week of practice under Coach (John) Pelphrey in getting them prepared. I think they will be ready to play."

NEW ARENA OPENING 2010-11

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

The arena, with approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more

With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation into a site for concerts, other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 41st year of service to the

University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena, the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

COLISEUM RECORD LOW POINTS

Auburn allowed its fewest points in the 41-year history of Beard-Eaves-Memorial in the 75-32 victory over Tuskegee Wednesday. Tuskegee's 32 points were the fewest an Auburn opponent scored since a 55-23 victory over Oglethorpe on Feb. 12, 1948.

7 POINTS IN ONE POSSESSION

In Auburn's 85-71 victory over Alabama on Jan. 17, the Tigers scored seven points in one possession while the Tide had only six total points for the game at the time. Here it is:

Despite DeWayne Reed's career-high 22 points, including 21 in the second half, Auburn lost to Dayton 60-59 in overtime in the Chicago Invitational third round at the Sears Centre. Tay Waller and DeWayne Reed made back-to-back 3-pointers in the final two minutes and Reed blocked a game-winning 3-point attempt to give Auburn a 58-56 victory at Virginia before a raucous crowd of 11,070 at John Paul Jones Arena. Virginia scored 12 straight points to turn a 50-42 deficit with 9:15 remaining into a 54-50 lead with 4:45 left. The two teams then traded baskets with Virginia going up 56-52 with 4:02 left on a Sammy Zeglinski jumper, which turned out to be Virginia's final points of the game. Auburn had its largest lead ahead by 13 points at the 18:24 mark of the second half. After Virginia battled back to regain the lead, Auburn answered with a 3-pointer by Waller to draw the Tigers to within 56-55 with 2:16 left. Waller was 1-of-9 from behind the arc before the shot. Korvotney Barber, who led the Tigers with team-bests of 14 points and a season-high 13 rebounds, stole the ball from Virginia's Mike Scott on the ensuing possession. It was Barber's second double-double of the season. The Tigers then turned the turnover into what was the shot of the game by Reed, who drained a 3-pointer to give Auburn the lead for good at 58-56 with 1:24 remaining. Virginia had two more possessions to tie or take the lead but Zeglinski, who scored all nine of his points in the second half, had his game-winning 3-point attempt blocked by Reed on the right baseline with four seconds on the clock. Auburn opened the game with a 9-2 run less than three minutes in, and Virginia only led for two seconds in the first half at 12-11. A pair of Sylvan Landesberg free throws tied it at 21 with 6:02 left in the half, but the Cavaliers wouldn't score again as the Tigers closed on a 11-0 run for a 32-21 halftime advantage. In fact, Virginia didn't score a field goal in the final 7:48 of the first half and a point in the final 4:02 of the game. The Tigers outrebounded the Cavaliers 44-30, including a whopping 14-2 advantage on the offensive glass. Auburn had a 12-0 advantage in second chance points. Virginia was led by Landesberg's game-high 22 points, including 10-of-14 shooting from the foul line. Auburn played the game without a pair of players in guard Frankie Sullivan and forward Brendon Knox. Sullivan did not make the trip as he was attending the funeral of his cousin who died tragically in an automobile accident.

Auburn scored 17 straight points and forced eight consecutive turnovers to erase an 11-point deficit in the final 8:33 to claim a 77-72 victory over Alabama State. Auburn won its fourth straight game and trailed 54-43 with 8:33 remaining before it started to inch back into the game. Trailing 59-51 with 5:47 remaining, the Tigers went on their 17-0 run in just over three minutes to take a 68-59 lead on a Tay Waller 3-pointer with 2:25 left. Alabama State did not attempt a shot from the field during the span. Alabama State has lost to Auburn, Ole Miss and Mississippi State by a combined 18 points. The Hornets used an 11-0 run midway through the first half to take a 21-15 lead on a Rashad Provitt 3-pointer. Auburn scored six straight to tie the game at 21 but Alabama State scored another eight straight points to go up 29-21 before settling for a 29-24 lead at intermission. Leading 38-37 with 13:04 to play, Alabama State scored 10 straight points to take a 48-38 lead with just under 11 minutes to play. The Hornets pushed their lead to 11 points on two separate occasions before Auburn mounted its comeback. Tay Waller tied a career-high with six made 3-pointers on 12 attempts to lead Auburn with 21 points, five rebounds and four steals as five Tigers scored in double figures. Rasheem Barrett continued his stellar play off the bench as he chipped in 12 points, five rebounds (four offensive) and three assists in 28 minutes. Quantez Robertson added 11 points while Lucas Hargrove and Korvotney Barber had 10 points apiece. Barber recorded his second straight double-double with 10 rebounds, and it was his third this season and 11th of his career. Brandon Brooks led Alabama State with a game-high 24 points, seven rebounds and six turnovers. Rashad Provitt scored 14 points and had a game-high 14 rebounds.

Robertson moved into fifth on Auburn's all-time assist list with 467. Johnnie Lett scored a career-high eight points in 17 minutes. Leading 18-12, Auburn went on a 10-0 run over a five minute period to take a 28-12 lead with 9:33 left in the half as Alabama A&M went scoreless for seven minutes. The Tigers then coasted to a 46-28 halftime lead as they made 9-of-15 (.600) shots from 3-point range. The Tigers limited the Bulldogs to only 12 second half points as the Bulldogs made only 3-of-23 (.130) shots from the field and 1-of-9 (.111) from 3-point range.
