THE GAME

Old rivals Auburn and Florida play for the first time since 2002, when a string of 58 consecutive seasons of meeting on the gridiron came to an end, when the Gators visit Jordan-Hare Stadium Saturday at 6:45 p.m. CT. Auburn has not played a team ranked as high as Florida's current No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press poll since 2001, when the Tigers stunned No. 1 Florida, 23-20, in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on the ESPN networks, with Full Circle coverage being shown on ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU simultaneously.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ The Auburn-Florida rivalry is Auburn's third-longest, as the teams will meet Saturday for the 81st time. The only teams that Auburn has played more than Florida are Georgia (109 games) and Georgia Tech (92).
- ▶ Auburn is 6-7-1 all-time at Jordan-Hare Stadium against teams ranked in the Associated Press top five, with three of the six wins coming against Florida.
- ▶ Auburn has won seven of its last eight games against teams ranked in the AP top 10, including five straight home victories.
- ▶ Auburn is 2-8 all-time against teams ranked No. 2 in the AP poll, but has not played a team ranked second since 1992.
- ▶ ESPN's College GameDay will be making its fourth visit to Auburn for Saturday's game and its first since 2004. The Tigers are 2-1 when GameDay is at Auburn.
- ▶ The SEC's top two career receivers will both be playing Saturday, as Courtney Taylor's 124 career catches leads all active SEC players, while Florida's Dallas Baker is second with 122.
- ▶ Auburn has 17 players on its roster from the state of Florida, which trails only Alabama (42) and Georgia (23) among states producing the most Tigers.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2000 season, Auburn has the best record among all SEC teams in regular-season league games with a mark of 39-13. Florida is second with a 38-14 mark.
- ▶ Auburn has won 19 of its last 21 SEC regular-season games, and 20 of its last 22 games against SEC opponents counting the 2004 SEC Championship game.
- ▶ Auburn ranks sixth nationally in scoring defense, allowing 11.3 points per game.
- ▶ Auburn has posted a 27-4 record since the start of the 2004 season, which is the third-best record in NCAA Division I-A during that span.
- ▶ PK John Vaughn is Auburn's all-time leading scorer among kickers and is just 13 points shy of becoming Auburn's all-time leading scorer among all players.

GAMEDAY IN AUBURN

ESPN's College GameDay Built by Home Depot featuring Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit, Lee Corso and Desmond Howard will be in Auburn this weekend for the Auburn-Florida game. It will mark the fourth visit to Auburn by the GameDay crew, which last visited for the 2004 Auburn-Georgia game. Auburn also hosted GameDay for the 1995 Iron Bowl and a 1997 game against Florida. GameDay was scheduled to be at the Auburn-LSU game on Sept. 18, 2004, but the threat of Hurricane Ivan forced the show to be relocated.

It will be the seventh time that Auburn has played in GameDay's on-site game. The Tigers are 3-3 in GameDay contests, including a 2-1 mark at home.

RIVALRY RESUMES

One of Auburn's longest rivalries resumes when the Tigers meet Florida Saturday. The two teams first played in 1912, and met every year for 58 seasons from 1945-2002, splitting the games 29-29-1 during that span (two meetings in 2000 due to the SEC Championship game).

Saturday's game will be the 81st meeting between the two teams. There are only two schools that Auburn has played more times than Florida: Georgia (109) and Georgia Tech (92).

ONLY ONE REMAINS

Tre Smith is the only current member of the Auburn football team that played in the game the last time Auburn and Florida met. In the 2002 game in Gainesville, Smith had four kickoff returns for 57 yards, rushed one time for 7 yards and made a tackle on a kickoff return.

AUBURN-FLORIDA SERIES NOTES

Auburn won the last meeting in Auburn, 23-20 over the then-No. 1 Gators in 2001 ... Prior to the 2001 game, Florida had won three straight game in Jordan-Hare Stadium ... Auburn is 24-8-1 against Florida in games played in Auburn ... Saturday's game will include the highest combined rankings (No. 2 and No. 11 = 13) for the two teams since 1997, when No. 7 Florida won at No. 6 Auburn, 24-10 ... The winner in the last 14 meetings has scored at least 23 points ... The losing team has been held to 10 points or fewer in 13 of the last 20 meetings ... Ten of the last 23 matchups have been decided by seven points or fewer.

AUBURN-FLORIDA CONNECTIONS

Four players on the Auburn roster played at the same high school as members of the Florida team. Sophomore defensive back Lorenzo Ferguson attended Miami's Southridge High School, as did Florida senior cornerbacks Jermaine and Tremaine McCollum. Auburn redshirt freshman defensive back Walter McFadden and Florida redshirt freshman offensive lineman Ronnie Wilson and redshirt freshman linebacker Roderick Blackett both attended Blanche Ely High School in Pompano Beach, Fla.

Junior wide receivers Prechae Rodriguez of Auburn and Andre Caldwell of Florida both went to Tampa's Jefferson High School, and Auburn redshirt freshman wideout Alex Rose attended First Coast in Jacksonville, as did Florida senior cornerback Reggie Lewis, senior wide receiver Kenneth Tookes and redshirt freshman linebacker Ryan Stamper.

There is also a connection in the coaching staff, as Florida offensive line/tackles; tight ends coach Steve Addazio was the offensive line coach at Indiana from 2002-03, when Auburn's Al Borges was the offensive coordinator for the Hoosiers.

FLORIDA TIGERS

FLORIDA QUICK HITTEES

Florida is off to a 6-0 start for the first time since 1996 ... The Gators have won their last five games against nationally-ranked opponents ... Saturday's game will be the second of three straight against nationally-ranked opponents for Florida, which beat No. 9 LSU, 23-10, last Saturday, and after a bye week, plays Georgia Oct. 28 ... The Gators lead the SEC in scoring defense (9.5, second nationally) and rushing defense (56.8, fourth nationally) ... Florida has converted 50.7 percent of its third-down opportunities, which ranks 10th nationally ... Chris Leak's 79 career touchdown passes are the most of any active player in NCAA Division I-A, and his 9,666 career yards ranks third ... Reggie Nelson and Ryan Smith each have four interceptions this season, which ranks tied for eighth in the NCAA

LAST TWO GAMES ARE BARN BURNERS

Each of the last two games in the Auburn-Florida series were decided in the closing seconds, with each team winning one.

In 2001 at Jordan-Hare Stadium, Damon Duval nailed a 44-yard field goal with 10 seconds left to lift Auburn to a 23-20 upset of No. 1 Florida. Duval's kick was set up by Karlos Dansby's interception off Gator quarterback Rex Grossman with under five minutes left in the game.

In 2002 in Gainesville, Auburn rallied from 16 points down in the fourth quarter to force overtime, but couldn't complete the comeback as Duval's potential game-winning 23-yard field goal with 30 seconds left was blocked, forcing overtime. The Gators scored on a 25-yard pass from Grossman to Taylor Jacobs in overtime, then stuffed a fourth-down attempt by Auburn to earn a 30-23 victory.

VS. TEAMS RANKED NO. 2

Auburn owns a 2-8 all-time record against teams ranked No. 2 in the Associated Press poll. The last time Auburn played a team ranked No. 2 was in 1992, when the Tigers fell to Alabama in Birmingham, 17-0. Auburn last hosted a No. 2-ranked team in 1989, when Alabama fell 30-20 to Auburn in the Crimson Tide's first-ever visit to The Plains.

TOP FIVE TEAMS AT JORDAN-HARE

Saturday's game will mark the 15th time that Auburn has hosted a team ranked in the Associated Press top five. Auburn is 6-7-1 in the previous 14 contests, with three of the six wins coming against Florida. In addition to Auburn's 23-20 upset of No. 1 Florida in 2001, the No. 19 Tigers beat No. 4 Florida in 1993, 38-35, and No. 4 Auburn knocked off No. 5 Florida in 1983, 28-21.

Auburn is 2-0 in home games vs. top five teams under Tommy Tuberville. Following the 2001 victory over Florida, No. 14 Auburn beat No. 5 LSU, 10-9, in 2004.

TIGERS TOUGH ON TOP TEN

Auburn has won seven of its last eight games against teams ranked in the Associated Press top 10, following a 7-3 victory over No. 6 LSU on Sept. 16. The Tigers have won five straight home games against Top-10 squads.

Last year, Auburn posted victories at No. 9 Georgia (31-30) and against No. 8 Alabama (28-18). In 2004, the Tigers defeated No. 5 LSU (10-9), No. 10 Tennessee (34-10), No. 8 Georgia (24-6) and No. 9 Virginia Tech (16-13) in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl.

During the Tommy Tuberville era, Auburn is 13-10 in games played against top 10 teams, and has won 13 of its last 18 games dating back to a 23-20 upset of No. 1-ranked Florida Oct. 13, 2001.

Dating back to the 2002 season, Auburn has played 17 games against a top 10 team in its last 46 games (37 percent).

SEC'S TOP TEAMS TANGLE

Since the start of the 2000 season, Auburn and Florida have the two best records in regular season conference games among the 12 SEC schools. Auburn is first with a mark of 39-13 (.750), while Florida is right behind with a record of 38-14 (.731).

BATTLE OF TOP RECEIVERS

Saturday's game will include a battle of two of the SEC's most accomplished receivers. Auburn's Courtney Taylor and Florida's Dallas Baker are the top two active SEC receivers in both career catches and career receiving yards. Taylor ranks first in catches with 124 while Baker is second with 122. In receiving yards, Baker ranks first with 1,810, while Taylor is second with 1,694.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn owns a 10-7 record all-time in games played on Oct. 14. Each of the last two times Auburn played on Oct. 14, the opponent was Florida. In 2000, Florida won 38-7 in Gainesville, while in 1995, the Gators won 49-38 in Auburn. Auburn and Florida also played on Oct. 14 in 1950, with the Gators claiming a 27-7 victory at home. Auburn's last win on Oct. 14 was a 10-6 home victory over LSU in 1989.

IN OCTOBER

Auburn is 281-143-18 (.656) all-time in the month of October, including a 17-12 mark under Tommy Tuberville. The Tigers are 17-6 in their last 23 games in October.

BIG PLAY MAN

Sophomore WR Rodgeriquis Smith leads Auburn in plays of 20 or more yards this season, as six of his 12 catches have netted at least 20 yards. Smith, who is averaging 22.0 yards per reception, owns the Tigers' longest play from scrimmage this season with a 62-yard catch and run vs. Mississippi State. His two touchdown catches have been from 24 and 20 yards out, and he also owns receptions of 41, 31 and 21 yards this season.

NO SHUTOUTS ALLOWED

Auburn has scored in 43 consecutive games, which is the fifth-longest streak in school history. The Tigers have not been shut out since a 23-0 loss to USC to open the 2003 season. Auburn could tie for the fourth-longest streak by scoring Saturday against Florida, while the third-longest streak is just three games away. It would be quite a while before Auburn could challenge the school record, though, as the Tigers scored in 149 straight games from Oct. 4, 1980 through Nov. 14, 1992.

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 19 of its last 21 Southeastern Conference games and 20 of its last 22 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back to more than last year's championship run, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-06.

THREE-YEAR DOMINATION

Auburn has posted a record of 27-4 (.871) since the start of the 2004 season, giving the Tigers the third-best record in the NCAA over the past three seasons. Only USC (29-1, .967) and Texas (28-2, .933) have better winning percentages than Auburn during that span.

TIGERS TOUGH IN THE RED ZONE

Auburn has excelled in the red zone both offensively and defensively this season. The Tigers are tied for the lead in the SEC in red zone defense, allowing just six scores in 12 opponents' trips (50 percent). In wins against both LSU and South Carolina, Auburn held the opposition out of the end zone in the closing seconds to preserve victories.

Offensively, Auburn ranks second in the SEC, scoring on 18-of-20 trips (90 percent). The Tigers have scored 13 touchdowns and kicked five field goals when entering the red zone this season, and have not turned the ball over, missing two field goals for their only unsuccessful trips.

OFFENSE PILES ON POINTS

Auburn's offensive continues to thrive since the arrival of offensive coordinator Al Borges prior to the 2004 season. Under Borges, the Tigers have reached the 30-point mark 18

times in 31 games, and have scored at least 40 points seven times. The Tigers are 18-0 when scoring 30 points since Borges' arrival.

IRONS AHEAD OF LAST YEAR'S PACE

Despite missing the Sept. 23 game against Buffalo, Kenny Irons is still ahead of the pace he set last season when he led the SEC in rushing with 1,293 yards. Irons ranks second in the SEC in rushing with an average of 102.8 yards per game, and his 514 yards rushing through six team games is 13 more than he had after six games last season.

In fact, Irons had more yards rushing on Auburn's first offensive play from scrimmage this season (a 42-yard burst), then he had in the first two games combined last season, when he had just 34 yards rushing through two contests.

SEC RUSHING LEADER RETURNS

The SEC's leading rusher in rushing last season with 1,293 yards (107.8 ypg) and 13 touchdowns, senior Kenny Irons is bidding to become the first player to lead the SEC in rushing in consecutive years since LSU's Kevin Faulk in 1997-98. Irons would become just the second back to accomplish the feat in the last 20 years.

In the last 30 years, Auburn has had three players prior to Irons who returned after leading the SEC in rushing. Although none repeated as SEC rushing champ, all three posted 1,000-yard seasons the following year.

Joe Cribbs had an SEC-best 1,205 yards rushing in 1978, then ran for 1,120 yards and 14 TDs as a senior in 1979. However, teammate James Brooks ran for 1,208 yards as a junior that season to claim the league rushing crown. Brooks totaled 1,314 yards and nine scores as a senior in 1980.

Stephen Davis was the SEC rushing king in 1994 with 1,263 yards, before totaling 1,068 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1995.

LETHAL WEAPONS

True freshman Ben Tate rushed for 114 yards Sept. 23 vs. Buffalo, becoming the latest Tiger to post a big rushing total. In fact, Auburn has six different players on the roster who have rushed for at least 90 yards in a single game, including four that have topped the century mark.

Kenny Irons leads the list with 10 career 100-yard games including a high of 218 last year at LSU. Sophomore Tristan Davis, who is now playing free safety, rushed for 162 yards last season at Kentucky. Senior Tre Smith had a career-best 126-yard effort as a freshman in 2002 at Alabama, while Tate's 114-yard effort is fourth best among current Tigers. Sophomore Brad Lester had a 93-yard performance last season vs. Ball State, while junior Carl Stewart had 91 yards rushing in 2004 vs. the Citadel.

2006 Auburn Football

RUNNING BACK U.

Auburn has more running backs on NFL rosters than any other college, according to data distributed by the NFL. There are six former Tigers currently playing running back in the NFL, including: Ronnie Brown (Dolphins), Stephen Davis (Rams), Heath Evans (Patriots), Rudi Johnson (Bengals), Tony Richardson (Vikings) and Carnell Williams (Buccaneers).

THE 100-YARD MAN

Kenny Irons has eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in 10 of his last 15 games. During the past 15 games, Irons has totaled 1,774 yards rushing (118.3 yards per game). Although he is only in his second season at Auburn, Irons is already ranked 15th in Auburn history with 1,807 career yards, and needs just 193 more yards to become the 12th player in Auburn history to rush for 2,000 yards during a career.

MORE THAN ONE IRONS EXCELLING

Senior cornerback David Irons was granted a sixth-year of eligibility prior to this season, and the extra year has paid dividends. Irons is fifth on the team with 26 tackles (16 solo, 10 assists) this season, including a team-high 10 stops during Auburn's 24-17 victory at South Carolina Sept. 28. Irons has two tackles for nine yards in losses this year, and has an interception, four pass break-ups and a forced fumble.

MUSCHAMP ERA GOING STRONG

Auburn's new defensive coordinator Will Muschamp is continuing a tradition of strong Auburn defenses, in particular during the past three seasons. Since the start of the 2004 season, the Tigers have held 23 of their 31 opponents to fewer than 20 points. Auburn opponents are averaging just 13.0 points per game during that span.

This season, Auburn is ranked sixth nationally in scoring defense (11.3 ppg) and 22nd in total defense (276.5).

TAYLOR'S TIME

Although Auburn lost three wideouts to the NFL following last season, the Tigers are not without a talented returner at that position. In fact, senior Courtney Taylor has more career receptions (124) than any other active player in the SEC. His 1,694 career receiving yards already ranks seventh in Auburn history, and his 124 career catches are fourth best. Of his 124 catches, 85 have resulted in first downs (68.5 percent).

Taylor had a career-best nine receptions for 103 yards Sept. 9 at Mississippi State. His nine catches tied for the ninth-best single-game performance in Auburn history.

SEC ACTIVE LEADERS

Courtney Taylor is not the only Auburn player who leads all active SEC players in a particular statistical category. Tre Smith is the conference's active leader in career total kick return yards (922 yards/621 punts and 301 kickoffs) while John Vaughn, with 146 career PAT kicks made, is the conference's active leader and ranks sixth in SEC history.

FRESH MEAT

A number of true and redshirt freshmen have been contributing for Auburn this season. Redshirt freshmen DL Sen'Derrick Marks, S Aairon Savage and TEs Tommy Trott and Gave McKenzie have all started games this season. Marks has a team-best 3.5 sacks this year, Savage ranks fourth on the team with 27 tackles, McKenzie ranks third with nine catches for 105 yards and a touchdown and Trott has caught six balls including one for a score.

In addition, true freshman RB Ben Tate rushed for 114 yards and two scores Sept. 23 vs. Buffalo, redshirt freshman DB Jeraud Powers has 11 tackles, true freshman LB Craig Stevens and redshirt freshman DE Antonio Coleman have six stops each and redshirt freshman LB Patrick Trahan has four tackles.

OL HAS EXPERIENCE

Although they hadn't started a game as a group prior to the season opener vs. Washington State, Auburn has five offensive linemen that have a wealth of experience, combining for 157 games played and 79 starts. Senior guard Ben Grubbs has played in 43 games, starting the last 31, while his counterpart at guard, senior Tim Duckworth, has played in 26 games on the offensive side, making 16 starts. Senior center Joe Cope has started 16 of his 19 career games played, while senior tackle Jonathan Palmer (39 games, nine starts) and junior tackle King Dunlap (30 games played, seven starts) are new to the starting lineup this year but have seen extensive action.

HEAVENLY BLISS

Senior Kody Bliss is averaging 47.0 yards per kick, which leads the SEC and ranks second in the nation. Eleven of Bliss' 22 punts have traveled at least 50 yards, including three over 60, and he has placed five punts inside the opponents' 20. Bliss was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Sept. 18 following Auburn's 7-3 victory over LSU after averaging 48.2 yards on six punts. He had kicks of 62, 61, 51 and 50 yards, as well as punts of 34 and 31 yards that both pinned LSU inside its own 20-yard-line. He had a career-long 69 yard punt at South Carolina Sept. 28.

JUST FOR KICKS

John Vaughn is having a stellar senior season, hitting 9-of-11 field goals while setting a career long three times. He made a career-high four field goals in Auburn's opener vs. Washington State, including a 52-yarder, then in the SEC opener in Starkville, he nailed a 55-yarder just before the end of the first half, which tied for fourth longest in school history.

Vaughn is Auburn's all-time leader in points scored kicking and currently ranks fourth in Auburn history in career points scored with 263 - just 13 shy of the school record held by Carnell Williams.

EXTRA POINTS

John Vaughn has made 91 consecutive PATs dating back to the 2004 season, and is 146-of-147 for his career. Prior to his only miss, Auburn had made an SEC record 209 consecutive PATs from 1999-2004. Auburn has now made 300 of its last 301 PATs.

SPECIAL TEAMS HAVE BEEN JUST THAT

Auburn has excelled in several aspects of special teams this season. The kickers have been superb, as All-SEC punter Kody Bliss averages a 47.0 yards per punt, which ranks second nationally, kicker John Vaughn has made 9-of-11 field goals, including two from beyond 50 yards, and kickoff specialist Matt Clark has had 24 of his 31 kickoffs result in touchbacks while also converting an onsidess kick. In addition, Tristan Davis has averaged 27.0 yards on eight kickoff returns, which ranks second in the SEC, and Marquies Gunn blocked a field goal attempt at Mississippi State.

NO RETURN POLICY

Auburn's kickoff coverage unit has not been getting much action, as senior kicker Matt Clark leads the SEC with 24 touchbacks on 31 kickoffs this season (77.4 percent), and had a streak of 16 in a row snapped when kicking off

into a stiff wind Sept. 28 at South Carolina. Clark, who also successfully converted an onsidess kick in the third quarter at South Carolina, was named SEC Special teams Player of the Week Sept. 25.

HERRING TRANSITION SUCCESSFUL

One of the more notable changes to the Auburn defense was the move of Will Herring, a three-year starter at free safety, to linebacker. The results have been good, as Herring leads the team with 33 tackles this season, including 3.5 for losses, and has a team-high two interceptions. He also took a direct snap on a fake punt in the season opener against Washington State and rushed 42 yards in the third quarter vs. Washington State.

SENIOR STEPS UP

Karibi Dede, the only returning starting linebacker for Auburn this season, has stepped up during his senior season. Dede ranks third on the team with 29 tackles, including 19 solo stops. He also recovered a fumble Sept. 9 at Mississippi State - the sixth fumble recovery of his career. Dede has started 24 games for Auburn, but had a streak of 15 straight starts snapped when he sat out the Buffalo game Sept. 23.

D-LINE IS DELIGHTFUL

Auburn replaced three starters on the defensive line this season, but the results so far have been favorable. Through the first six games of the season, ends Quentin Groves, Marquies Gunn and Christopher Browder and interior linemen Pat Sims, Sen'Derrick Marks and Josh Thompson have combined for 92 tackles, 22 tackles for losses and 14.5 sacks. Marks has team-bests of five tackles for losses and 3.5 sacks, while Gunn and Groves have three sacks each.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now in its 67th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's ninth-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers are **252-61-7 (.798)** at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a **38-7 (.844)** mark in the last six years. AU went 7-0 at home in both 2000 and 2004, and posted a 6-1 mark last season.

Auburn has won nine of its last 10 games at home and 17 of its last 19 games at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

THE TIME HAS COME

Prior to this season, new timing rules were put into effect to reduce the length of college football games. For Auburn, there have indeed been fewer plays this season. In the previous five seasons, Auburn averaged between 66.2 and 68.3 plays per game, but this year is down to 58.8 plays per game. Auburn games averaged between 126.2 and 134.9 total plays per game over the past five seasons, but this year, Tiger games are averaging 119.8 plays per contest.

The following chart shows the average plays run in games this season compared to the averages from the previous five seasons.

SENIORS GO FOR NEW MARK

Auburn not only established a new school record for victories in a two-year period by winning 22 games over the past two seasons, but the Tigers also set a new three-year mark (30 wins) while tying the four-year record (39). Auburn's senior class entered the 2006 season needing nine victories to tie last year's senior group as the winningest senior class in school history, and 10 wins to become the winningest senior class in Auburn history.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 57-4 when scoring 20 or more points in a game, including a 55-3 mark in the regular season. Dating back to 1995, Auburn is 78-11 when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 40-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 45 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points.

The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four over-time loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 22 years, Auburn is 114-2 when scoring 30 points.

THIRD QUARTER TO REMEMBER

Auburn accomplished a rare feat during the third quarter of its game at South Carolina Sept. 28, controlling the ball for all 15 minutes of the period. Auburn took the kickoff to open the second half, and marched 85 yards on 17 plays, taking 8:38 off the clock before settling for a 24-yard John Vaughn field goal that gave the Tigers a 17-10 lead.

Following the score, Auburn recovered an onside kick at its own 48-yard-line, then ran 12 more plays, reaching the South Carolina 1-yard-line when the third quarter expired. Kenny Irons scored on the first play of the fourth quarter, which was Auburn's 30th play of the half before South Carolina ran its first play.

BIGGEST SENIOR CLASS

Head Coach Tommy Tuberville has a senior class that includes 21 players at Auburn in 2006. The Tigers' group of 21 seniors is the most during the Tuberville era, surpassing the 2004 group that had 18. During Tuberville's tenure, Auburn's other senior classes have consisted of: 15 in 2005, 13 in 2003, 15 in 2002, 10 in 2001, 14 in 2000 and 14 in 1999.

The 2006 seniors include: TE Cole Bennett, P Kody Bliss, DL Christopher Browder, K Matt

Clark, C Joe Cope, LB Karibi Dede, OT Tim Duckworth, OG Ben Grubbs, WR Lee Guess, DE Marquies Gunn, SS Brant Haynie, LB Will Herring, CB David Irons, RB Kenny Irons, P Patrick Martyn, OL Jonathan Palmer, FS Pete Ruzicka, LB Kevin Sears, RB Tre Smith, WR Courtney Taylor and K John Vaughn.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 21 seniors, 12 have seen time in more than 35 games during their careers. Tre Smith and Will Herring, who both have red-shirted during seasons in which they saw limited action, have played in 47 and 46 games, respectively, to lead the group. Kody Bliss joins Smith and Herring as players who have played in all 44 games over the past four seasons. Karibi Dede, Courtney Taylor and Ben Grubbs have played in 43 games, followed by John Vaughn (41), Marquies Gunn (40), Cole Bennett (39), Jonathan Palmer (39), Kevin Sears (37) and Tim Duckworth (37).

STARTS STREAK

Will Herring has a chance to set the Auburn record for consecutive starts this season. Herring has started 42 consecutive games, which is five shy of the school record of 47 held by OL Jeno James (1996-99) and tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the nation. Former QB Stan White (45 games from 1990-93) has the second-longest starting streak in Auburn history.

Senior offensive guard Ben Grubbs has the second-longest active streak, having started 31 straight games.

LOFTY BEGINNINGS

Auburn's preseason ranking of No. 4 in the Associated Press preseason poll was the highest preseason ranking for the Tigers since the 1990 squad was ranked third to open the season.

It marked the 15th season that Auburn started the year ranked in the AP top 10.

Lester's rate of touches per touchdown thus far during his career is far better than even the best touchdown scorers in Auburn history. TUBERVILLE IN EIGHTH SEASON

Tommy Tuberville is in his eighth season at Auburn in 2006 and his 12th as a head coach in the Southeastern Conference. Tuberville has the third-longest tenure in the SEC (second-longest active streak) behind Phillip Fulmer of Tennessee and Steve Spurrier of South Carolina, who will each coach his 14th season in the league this year.

Tuberville has amassed a record of 65-28 in eight seasons at Auburn and an overall mark of 90-48. He has led the Tigers to six straight bowl appearances.

Tuberville is fourth all-time at Auburn in wins, and is the fifth-longest tenured coach in school history.

12 AND COUNTING

In his 12th year as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville has five assistant coaches who have been with him all 12 years. The group includes: defensive tackles/ noseguard coach Don Dunn, running backs/special teams coach Eddie Gran, wide receivers coach Greg Knox, offensive line coach Hugh Nall and defensive ends coach Terry Price.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn begins the season with 11 graduates on the roster, which is the most of any Division I-A football team.

The Tiger graduates include: TE Cole Bennett (business administration), P Kody Bliss (business marketing), C Joe Cope (economics), LB Karibi Dede (rehab special education), OG Ben Grubbs (public administration), WR Lee Guess (business marketing), LB Will Herring (exercise science), CB David Irons (Sociology), P Patrick Martyn (business), RB Tre Smith (business) and RB Carl Stewart (political science).

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 58 lettermen from last season, including 26 on offense, 25 on defense and seven specialists. Auburn returns five

starters on offense and six on defense.

Auburn's roster of 118 players includes 21 seniors, 21 juniors, 26 sophomores, 20 redshirt freshmen and 30 freshmen. The underclassmen (76) represent 64.4 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 16.

FATHERS AND SONS

Auburn tight ends coach Steve Ensminger is the father of Auburn freshman quarterback Steven Ensminger, while junior fullback Danny Perry is the son of Director of Football Operations Jimmy Perry. The younger Ensminger is the first Tiger to have his father on the coaching staff since Joe Whitt, Jr., played wide receiver from 1998-99 while Joe Whitt, Sr., who coached at Auburn from 1981-2005, was a linebackers coach.

Previously, Gene Lorendo, an assistant coach from 1951-75, saw his son Mac letter at offensive tackle from 1970-72, earning All-SEC honors as a senior, and Paul Davis, an assistant coach from 1967-80 and 1987-90, watched his son Rhett letter at split end from 1972-73.

JORDAN-HARE ADDITIONS

Jordan-Hare Stadium underwent a \$30.5 million facelift since last season as Phase Three of the Jordan-Hare Renovation Project. The most noticeable change is the addition of a courtyard on the west side of the stadium. To improve the lack of space in the interior concourse of the stadium, 115,000 square feet was added as the West concourse expanded out toward Donahue Drive. The surface of the concourses in the stadium were upgraded as well.

Also, the southwest ramp leading to the upper deck has been extended, creating a new entrance gate at the bottom of that ramp. The number of lighting fixtures has increased and the quality of those fixtures has improved. There are also more concession stands and women's restrooms in the stadium.

Inside the stadium, two ProAd displays have been placed on the East and West upper deck fascias, and the North end zone scoreboard was replaced. In conjunction with the new scoreboard, all of the timing devices throughout the stadium have been retrofitted so that they will now all be communicating with one another.

TIGERS SWITCH TO UNDER ARMOUR

The Auburn football uniforms may look the same in 2006 to the casual observer, but the Tigers have made one key change to the uniforms. The uniforms are now made by Under Armour Performance Apparel as part of a five-year contract signed in December of 2005 that makes Under Armour the official outfitter of all of Auburn's athletic teams. The contract,

worth \$10.6 million in sponsorship, product and additional benefits, will see Auburn's athletic teams wearing Under Armour uniforms, cleats, apparel and accessories beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.

TUBERVILLE GOES HOLLYWOOD

Head coach Tommy Tuberville appeared in a new Under Armour commercial that debuted during Auburn's season-opening game vs. Washington State. The 30-second spot, which promotes Under Armour's new line of football cleats and apparel, will air nationally throughout the college football season.

TIGER PROS

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. Auburn had 27 players listed on opening day NFL rosters, which was 11th most of any college in the nation. The Washington Redskins have the most former Tigers, with five former Auburn players on the roster.

TIGERS ON CSS

Auburn rallied from 16 points down in the fourth quarter to force overtime against Florida, but the Tigers couldn't complete the comeback. With 30 seconds to play, Damon Duval attempted a 23-yard field goal that was blocked, and the Gators went on to win 30-23 in overtime.

Trailing 23-7 late in the third quarter, Auburn's sophomore quarterback Jason Campbell came off the bench to rally the Tigers with two touchdowns and two two-point conversions.

On Campbell's first possession, tailback Ronnie Brown scored on a one-yard touchdown run to pull Auburn within 10. Campbell then ran in the two-point conversion to make the score 23-15.

After swapping possessions with the Gators, Campbell needed only one play to pull Auburn within two points, hooking up with Brown out of the

backfield for a 54-yard touchdown pass. On the following two-point conversion, Campbell ran it in, tying the game 23-23 with just over five minutes to play.

Auburn's defense stepped up on the Gators' next possession, holding Florida on fourth down to regain possession inside of Florida territory. Dontarrious Thomas stuffed Gator tailback Ran Carthon on fourth-and-one to turn the ball back over to the Tigers.

A steady dose of Brown followed, as the Tigers fought down the field and took time off the clock. With 30 seconds remaining and Florida out of timeouts, Duval tried to beat Florida for the second consecutive year, but Bobby McCray blocked the 23-yard attempt, forcing overtime.

Florida had the ball first and Rex Grossman

found Taylor Jacobs in the end zone on third-and-10 to give the Gators a 30-23 lead. Campbell came up three yards short on a fourth-and-five play on Auburn's possession to end the game.

Florida jumped to a 17-7 first half lead behind a Grossman 13-yard strike to Aaron Walker and a second-quarter Earnest Graham 1-yard run which extended the lead to 14-0.

On the ensuing drive, Auburn lost Carnell Williams for the season as he suffered a leg injury. Brown came off the bench and ran the ball four times for 47 yards on the drive, capped by a 26-yard touchdown run.

Brown finished the game with 163 yards rushing on 22 carries with two touchdowns, as well as the 54-yard touchdown reception.

Kenny Irons rushed for 183 yards and a touchdown and Brad Lester scored twice as fourth-ranked Auburn opened its season with a 40-14 victory over Washington State.

Irons rushed for his ninth career 100-yard game -- and seventh straight in regular season games -- averaging 9.1 yards on 20 carries. He opened up the third quarter with a 58-yard touchdown run that gave Auburn a 26-7 lead a minute in.

Irons also caught three passes for 40 yards, giving him 223 multi-purpose yards, marking his career high.

Lester posted his third career multiple touchdown game, but the first in which he caught a pass and rushed for a score. The sophomore ended Auburn's first-half scoring with a 34-yard pass from Brandon Cox, then rushed for a 12-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter. He ended the game with 37 yards on six carries.

Cox completed 11-of-18 passes for 191 yards and a touchdown. The junior improved to 9-3 all-time as Auburn's starting quarterback and has now thrown a touchdown in 11 of his 12 career starts.

The Tigers scored their first 12 points on four field goals from senior kicker John Vaughn, who connected on attempts of 31, 44, 52 (career long) and 30 yards, marking his career best. It was also the most by an Auburn kicker since Jaret Holmes posted four field goals against Alabama in 1997.

Washington State held the lead briefly in the first quarter after Jason Hill caught a 2-yard pass from Alex Brink, giving the Cougars a 7-6 advantage. The Tigers, however, scored the next 20 points, capped off by Irons' 58-yard run to open the second half.

Cody Boyd ended Washington State's scoring with a 50-yard pass from Gary Rogers midway through the third quarter, bringing the Cougars to within 12. However, Auburn finished off Washington State with Lester's 12-yard run and a 1-yard touchdown run by Carl Stewart late in the fourth quarter. The final score completed Auburn's 40-point night, which marked the most by Auburn against a Pacific-10 Conference opponent.

Karibi Dede paced the Tigers with eight tackles, followed by Merrill Johnson and Aairon Savage, who both had four. Auburn finished with five sacks, led by Sen'Derrick Marks' 1.5.

Will Herring accounted for the game's lone turnover, picking off Brink at the 8:41 mark of the fourth quarter.

The senior linebacker also accounted for Auburn's second-longest run of the game when he took advantage of the Cougars on a fake punt on 4th-and-14. Midway through the third, he took the snap from deep snapper Pete Compton and ran up the middle for a 42-yard gain.

Nine Tigers played in their first game at Auburn, highlighted by Aairon Savage, who also made his first start. Overall, five Auburn players started their first game in the win.

Brad Lester ran for two touchdowns and Courtney Taylor led all receivers with nine catches for 103 yards as fourth-ranked Auburn defeated Mississippi State, 34-0, at Davis Wade Stadium.

Auburn improved to 17-1 in its last 18 Southeastern Conference games and has won 18 of its last 19 games against conference opponents.

The win marked the sixth straight for the Tigers over the Bulldogs and the second straight by shutout. Over the past two games against Mississippi State, the Tigers have outscored the Bulldogs, 62-0.

The Tigers have also held Mississippi State to 18 or less points in the last eight straight games.

Lester's two touchdowns gave him two multiple-score efforts this year and four in two seasons. The sophomore rushed five times for 40 yards, including the two scores. He rushed for a two-yard touchdown less than four minutes in the second quarter. Lester then started off the third quarter with a 20-yard run to put Auburn up, 24-0.

Taylor, meanwhile, surpassed the 100-yard receiving mark for the second time in his career. The senior has now caught at least one pass in 35 of his 39 career games.

Junior quarterback Brandon Cox was 18-of-27 for 249 yards and two touchdowns -- the 12th time in his career he has thrown at least one TD -- in the win. He connected with Gabe McKenzie for a 6-yard touchdown to end the first half, then found Rodgericus Smith for a 20-yard score with less than two minutes left in the third quarter. The touchdowns for McKenzie and Smith represented the first of their careers.

Ten different Tigers caught at least one pass in the win.

Senior kicker John Vaughn set a career-high for the third time in two games this season when he booted a 55-yard field goal with seven seconds left in the second quarter. The field goal was his second of 50 yards or better this season and tied the fourth-longest distance in Auburn (2-0 overall, 1-0 SEC) history. He finished the game 2-for-2, also making a 22-yarder in the fourth quarter.

Auburn dominated defensively, limiting Mississippi State to 161 yards of total offense. The Bulldogs were able to rush for just 79 yards and pass for 82.

For the second straight game, senior Karibi Dede led the Tigers in tackles, this time coming up with six. True freshman Craig Stevens and sophomore Merrill Johnson tied for second on the team with five, followed by two others with four.

Sophomore Pat Sims paced the Tigers with 1.5 sacks as Auburn finished with four overall. Sims forced a fumble in the fourth quarter that was recovered by freshman

Jermarcus Ricks, who returned it 31 yards to the Mississippi State 4-yard-line.

Senior David Irons, meanwhile, intercepted his first career pass while finishing with two tackles.

Mississippi State (0-2, 0-2) had a chance to get on the board for the first time this season in the fourth quarter on a 37-yard field goal, but Adam Carlson's kick was blocked by senior defensive end Marquies Gunn.

The win improved Auburn to 41-27-5 all-time in SEC openers.

Auburn has held 20 of its last 27 opponents to fewer than 20 points dating back to the 2004 season.

A battle between two top-10 teams proved defensive as a Brandon Cox's 1-yard quarterback sneak in the third quarter proved to be the difference in No. 3 Auburn's 7-3 victory over No. 6 LSU at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Cox rushed through the middle of Auburn's line with 4:53 left in the third quarter for Auburn's only score of the game. It capped off a 12-play, 75-yard drive that effectively gave the Tigers the win in the lowest scoring game at Jordan-Hare Stadium since Auburn's 7-0 win over Houston in 1973.

Auburn, however, needed defensive strength to stop LSU twice late in the game.

LSU got to within striking distance on the last drive of the game. Starting at their own 20, the Bayou Bengals moved all the way to Auburn's 19, highlighted by JaMarcus Russell connecting on a 21-yard pass to Dwayne Bowe. Two plays later, Russell found Craig Davis on the left side, but Auburn's Eric Brock brought him down at the 4-yard-line as the clock expired.

The defensive stop came in similar fashion for the Tigers, who held LSU on its second-to-last possession. The Bayou Bengals started on their own 19 and drove to Auburn's 33. Three straight plays on the ground netted LSU 2 yards before Brock came up big, tipping a Russell pass near the goal line that was intended for Early Doucet.

Auburn limited LSU to 311 yards of total offense, with 155 of those coming in the fourth quarter. The Bayou Bengals managed just 42 yards rushing on 23 attempts as the hard-hitting Auburn defense stood its ground.

LSU's defense, however, proved to be just as stingy, holding the Tigers to 182 yards of offense, including 110 through the air. Cox was 11-of-20 for the day.

Kenny Irons, meanwhile, carried the ball 25 times for 70 yards. Courtney Taylor led all Auburn players with three catches for 22 yards.

LSU opened the game's scoring in the second quarter, coming at the end of the half. Russell rushed for 2 yards after fumbling the snap, setting up a Colt David 42-yard field goal on the last play of the half.

Four minutes prior to the field goal, Auburn had its first chance of the game to score but a John Vaughn 26-yard field goal attempt hit the left upright. Auburn had run 16 plays during the preceeding drive against the physical LSU defense.

The first half saw both offenses struggle, as they did for most of the game. Auburn ran 27 plays and gained just 60 yards, while LSU was a little better, gaining 93 yards on 29 plays.

Will Herring paced all Auburn players with six tackles, including three solo and 1.5 for loss. Karibi Dede had Auburn's only sack of the game, a 1 yarder of Russell on the last drive of the game.

Five Tigers were credited with one pass deflection apiece, while the team was credited with six quarterback hurries, led by Antonio Coleman's two.

The game featured a matchup between LSU offensive coordinator and Auburn defensive coordinator Will Muschamp, who coached together at LSU from 2001-04.

The game pitted the two highest ranked teams at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1990.

It marked the second consecutive season the game was decided on the final play and the third straight in the closing seconds.

The win gave Auburn four straight victories over LSU at Jordan-Hare Stadium and improved the Tigers' record to 7-1 win over *Associated Press* top 10 teams since 2004.

Brad Lester and Ben Tate rushed for two touchdowns apiece as No. 2 Auburn overcame a sluggish start for a 38-7 victory over Buffalo at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

All told, the Tigers finished with 261 yards rushing, led by Tate, who entered the game with just four career carries. He finished with a team-leading 114 yards on seven carries against the Bulls.

Lester ran the ball 18 times for 83 yards in his first start of the season.

He rushed for the game's first touchdown from two yards out with 2:46 left in the first quarter but saw the Tigers go into halftime with a 10-0 lead after a John Vaughn field goal at the end of the half.

Lester scored Auburn's second touchdown of the game, a 4-yarder at 12:28 of the third quarter, to put Auburn up 17-0. Buffalo, however, stayed with the Tigers, posting a 5-yard touchdown on an Evan Wallace pass at 5:33 of the third quarter to pull within 10, 17-7.

That turned out to be the Bulls' last gasp as Tate and Tre Smith combined to score the Tigers' last 21 points in the final two quarters to widen the gap for good.

Smith made it 24-7 with a 2-yard TD with 40 seconds left in the third quarter. The score capped off an eight carry, 57-yard day for the senior.

Tate finished Auburn's scoring, rushing for a 42-yard touchdown at 11:17 of the fourth quarter and a 28-yarder with 3:44 to play.

Auburn passed the ball just 14 times, with starter Brandon Cox finishing 6-for-10 for 134 yards and one interception. Blake Field relieved Cox in the fourth quarter and was a perfect 4-for-4 for 19 yards.

Courtney Taylor led all Tigers with three receptions for 48 yards, while Carl Stewart had the game's longest play with a 54-yard pass from Cox at the start of the third quarter.

Defensively, the Tigers shined for the third straight game, limiting Buffalo to 198 yards of total offense, including 111 through the air.

Auburn was credited with 11 tackles for loss and three sacks, with Aairon Savage, Marquies Gunn and Sen'Derrick Marks each claiming one.

Merrill Johnson tied for the team lead with seven total tackles and was credited with three quarterback hurries. Will Herring also finished with seven tackles in the victory.

Kenny Irons rushed for 117 yards and two 1-yard touchdown runs as No. 2 Auburn held off a late South Carolina rally for a 24-17 victory in front of a national ESPN audience on a rare Thursday night appearance.

The Gamecocks, already having scored one fourth-quarter touchdown, threatened late in the game, driving to Auburn's 5 with less than 30 seconds left. A fourth-down pass to Sidney Rice was batted down in the end zone by Auburn's Patrick Lee, preserving the win and sending the Tigers to a 5-0 overall record.

The defense, however, wasn't needed in the third quarter as Auburn's offense ran all 28 plays and held on to the ball for all 15 minutes. Vaughn's field goal at 6:22 ended Auburn's first drive of the quarter, one that lasted for 17 plays and 8:38.

Auburn head coach Tommy Tuberville lived up to his "Riverboat Gambler" moniker after Vaughn's field goal. Matt Clark masked his onside kick perfectly, with the Tigers recovering his 13-yard kick at their own 48. That set up Auburn's 13-play, 52-yard drive that culminated eight seconds into the fourth quarter on Irons' second touchdown of the game.

Irons, who transferred from South Carolina to Auburn prior to the 2004 season, opened the game's scoring with a 1-yard run six minutes in, then scored his second of the game with 14:52 left in the fourth quarter. He topped the 100-yard mark for the second time this season and the 10th time in his career.

Brandon Cox was 13-of-19 passing for 180 yards in the win. He connected on his only touchdown pass of the game in the second quarter, hitting Tommy Trott from 9 yards out with 4:37 left on the clock.

John Vaughn accounted for Auburn's other scoring play, hitting a 24-yard field goal -- his eighth field goal of the season -- with 6:22 to play in the third quarter.

South Carolina got on the scoreboard at 9:09 of the second quarter on a Ryan Succop 49-yard field goal. The Gamecocks then scored late in the first half when Kenny McKinley caught a 13-yard pass from Syvelle Newton to pull South Carolina within four, 14-10.

David Irons led all Auburn players with 10 tackles, including six solo. The Tigers were credited with four sacks, highlighted by Marquies Gunn's two.

The Gamecocks' McKinley led all players with eight catches for 110 yards.

The win gave Auburn 19 victories in their last 20 Southeastern Conference games. The Tigers, overall, have gone 27-3 dating back to the 2004 season.

Darren McFadden and Felix Jones both topped the 100-yard rushing mark as Arkansas upset No. 2 Auburn, 27-10, at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The loss snapped Auburn's five-game winning streak to start the season and dropped the Tigers to 3-1 in Southeastern Conference play. The Razorbacks, meanwhile, improved to 4-1 overall and 3-0 in the SEC.

McFadden led all rushers with 145 yards on 28 carries and a 63-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Jones was not far behind with 13 carries and 104 yards, scoring on a 1-yard scamper in the third quarter.

Quarterback Mitch Mustain and Arkansas attempted just 10 passes in the win, compared to 45 rushes. In the second half alone, the Razorbacks ran the ball 30 times and passed it just twice.

Arkansas opened the game's scoring eight minutes in with a 34-yard field goal by Jeremy Davis. A little more than four minutes later, the Razorbacks upped the score to 10-0 when Mustain tossed a 50-yard touchdown to Marcus Monk.

Auburn pulled to within three with Rodgeriquis Smith's 24-yard touchdown reception to open the second quarter, but the Razorbacks stretched their lead to 10 again midway through the second quarter.

McFadden found a seam and broke away for a 63-yard touchdown run with five minutes remaining in the quarter. It was the first rushing touchdown allowed by the Tigers this season.

John Vaughn connected on his ninth field goal in 11 tries this season at 1:50 of the second quarter, nailing a 36-yarder that made it 17-10. Brad Lester helped set up the field goal with a 68-yard kickoff return that put Auburn on Arkansas' 32-yard-line to start the drive.

The field goal, however, turned out to be Auburn's last points of the game.

Jones scored on a 1-yard rush with 4:54 left in the third quarter, putting the game further out of reach. Davis iced it with 3:53 in the fourth with his second field goal of the game, a 22-yarder.

The Auburn offense could not get on track, managing just 60 yards rushing and 153 passing. Kenny Irons led the team with 75 yards rushing on 15 carries, but the Arkansas defense managed 11 tackles for loss for a total of 60 yards.

Brandon Cox sprayed the ball around to seven different receivers, finishing the game 17-of-29 passing. However, a 24-yard touchdown strike to Rodgeriquis Smith with 14:53 left in the second quarter was the only time Auburn managed to find the end zone.

Courtney Taylor led all receivers with five receptions and was second on the Tigers with 33 yards. Smith caught a career-high four passes for 64 yards while three others -- Irons, Gabe McKenzie and Tommy Trott -- had two receptions apiece.

Eric Brock and Aairon Savage tied for the Auburn team lead with 11 tackles in the loss, marking a personal-best for both. The Tigers did not manage a sack and were credited with two tackles for loss, one each by Karibi Dede and Marquies Gunn.
