The Bulldogs, who defeated Auburn 85-66 on Jan. 16 in Starkville, have won three of their last four games vs. Arkansas 67-56 on Wednesday, at LSU 58-57 last Saturday and Florida 71-64 on Jan. 29 ... the lone loss in the stretch came at Alabama 75-61... in Wednesday's win over the Razorbacks, Dee Bost scored 18 points, making 4-of-6 three-pointers while Renardo Sidney had 12 points and 10 rebounds ... Mississippi State held Arkansas to 33.3 percent shooting from the field and outrebounded the Hogs 41-28 ... Ravern Johnson, who has missed the last two games due to suspension, ranks fourth in the SEC with both 17.7 points and 2.7 three-pointers made per game ... Dee Bost averages 17.2 points per game while Renardo Sidney adds 13.5 ppg and 6.8 rpg and Kodi Augustus 11.9 ppg and 7.6 rpg ... Riley

AUBURN-MISS. STATE SERIES

This is the 135th meeting between the Tigers and Bulldogs with Auburn holding a 70-64 advantage. The Tigers have won three of the last five games between the two.

Mississippi State defeated Auburn 85-66 in Starkville on Jan. 16 in the first meeting between the two this year.

The Tigers defeated the Bulldogs 89-80 in the final game of Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum history last year in Auburn on March 3 behind Tay Waller's 22 points, Brendon Knox's 21 and DeWayne Reed's 16.

The Tigers hold a 42-22 lead in Auburn. The Tigers have won nine of the last 14 games played between the two in Auburn.

The Bulldogs have a 39-25 series lead in Starkville, including 24-12 in Humphrey Coliseum. Mississippi State has won 10 of the last 11 games against Auburn in Humphrey Coliseum.

The series is tied at three in neutral sites.

TONY BARBEE vs. MISSISSIPPI STATE

Auburn head coach Tony Barbee is 0-1 coaching against Mississippi State as the Bulldogs won earlier this year in Starkville.

Mississippi State head coach Rick Stansbury is 15-10 against Auburn, including an 10-3 mark in Humphrey Coliseum and a 5-7 record in Auburn.

AUBURN-MISS. STATE TIES

Mississippi State 6-foot-11 junior Arnett Moultrie, who is redshirting this season after transferring from UTEP, played for Auburn head coach Tony Barbee the previous two seasons in El Paso. The Memphis, Tenn., native, averaged 9.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 2.1 blocks last year for the Miners.

Bulldog 6-foot-3 true freshman Jalen Steele signed with Auburn out of Knoxville (Tenn.) Fulton High School, but opted to go to Mississippi State after Auburn's coaching change. Steele is averaging 5.1 points in 16.5 minutes per game while shooting 33.3 percent from the field and 27.9 percent from 3-point range. He scored 10 points against Auburn on Jan. 16 in Starkville, but has averaged 2.8 points per game since.

REBOUND IMPROVEMENT ...

Auburn has outrebounded Mississippi State three times in the last five games between the two and the Tigers are 3-2 in those games.

In the 15 games prior, the Tigers never outrebounded the Bulldogs and went 2-13.

Earnest Ross scored a career-high 30 points at Georgia last Saturday, going 12-of-18 from the field, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range. He scored Auburn's final nine points of the game, including four points in a 3.7 second span to send the game into overtime vs. the Bulldogs.

Ross is the first Tiger to score at least 30 points since Tay Waller had 32 vs. Mis-

Mississippi State in 2009.

MOST IMPROVED IN SEC

Auburn sophomore Earnest Ross' scoring average has improved 10.4 points from last year. He is averaging 13.2 points this season compared to 2.8 points as a freshman last year.

Auburn's Kenny Gabriel and Rob Chubb also rank fifth and eighth, respectively, on the list.

4 OF 6 AT AUBURN ARENA

Auburn begins a stretch of playing four of their next six games in Auburn Arena beginning with Mississippi State this Saturday.

The Tigers play at Ole Miss on Feb. 16, Vanderbilt on Feb. 19, at Alabama on Feb. 23, Arkansas on Feb. 26 and Ole Miss on March 2.

Auburn plays its regular season finale at LSU on March 5.

(Jan. 16, 2011, in Starkville, Miss.)

Mississippi State shot 62 percent from the field and jumped on Auburn early to defeat the Tigers 85-66 behind 21 points from Ravern Johnson in Humphrey Coliseum. The Bulldogs had a 22-3 lead nine minutes into the game and were never threatened by the Tigers. The closest Auburn would get the rest of the way was 12 points in the second half. The Tigers fell behind by as much as 30-9 before ending the half down 41-22. Mississippi State pushed its lead to 46-23 and then led 53-36 before Auburn scored five straight

points behind a layup and 3-pointer both by Earnest Ross to close to within 53-41 with 13:50 remaining. The Bulldogs grew their lead to as much as 68-43 with 7:55 left. Earnest Ross led Auburn with 15 points, six rebounds and four steals, but went 5-of-17 from the field, 2-of-9 from 3-point range and 3-of-7 from the free throw line. Kenny Gabriel added 14 points and seven boards while freshman Chris Denson scored a season-high 12 points off the bench on 4-of-6 shooting from the field, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range. Josh Wallace added 10 points, five assists and three steals. Renardo Sidney had 15 points and six rebounds for Mississippi State.

LAST TIME vs. MISSISSIPPI STATE in Auburn

Auburn 89, Mississippi State 80 (Mar. 3, 2010, in Auburn, Ala.)

Auburn's seniors sent the final game in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum off with an impressive performance as the Tigers defeated Mississippi State 89-80. Tay Waller's 22 points, Brendon Knox's 21, DeWayne Reed's 19 and Lucas Hargrove's 16 accounted for all but 11 of Auburn's points. Auburn never trailed after taking a 7-4 lead but Mississippi State, behind Dee Bost's 25 second half points, closed to within 70-68 with seven minutes to go. Eight straight points by Auburn pushed the lead back out to 10 as the Tigers began the final stages of closing out the Coliseum's 42nd season. Waller made 6-of-11 3-point field goals to continue his torrid four game stretch of averaging 26.5 points on 27-of-42 (.643) 3-point shooting. Wally Tinker, the first to make a basket in the Coliseum's

first game in Auburn's 90-71 victory over LSU on Jan. 11, 1969, banked-in the ceremonial final shot in the postgame ceremonies. The 1968-69 Auburn team cut down one of the nets while former coaches Sonny Smith, former women's coach Joe Ciampi, former players Wesley Person, Doc Robinson, Gerald White, Lance Weems, Keith Bagwell (AU's Director of Facilities who has not missed a men's home game since 1960) and then current Athletic Director Jay Jacobs cut down the other net.

LAST TIME OUT

Georgia 81, Auburn 72 (ot) (Feb. 5, 2011, in Athens, Ga.)

Earnest Ross scored a career-high 30 points, including Auburn's final nine points, but the scrappy Tigers lost an 81-72 overtime heartbreaker to Georgia in Stegeman Coliseum. Ross, who made 5-of-7 three-pointers, scored four points in 3.7 seconds to send the game into

overtime. Georgia led by six with under three minutes to go in regulation and led 67-63 before Ross made a layup with 13.7 seconds remaining, stole the inbounds pass at midcourt and drove in for the tying layup with 10 seconds left. Gerald Robinson drove the length of the court and missed a layup in traffic just before the buzzer as the game went into overtime tied at 67. Ross opened the extra period with another layup to give Auburn a 69-67 lead, its first since 15-13 just under eight minutes into the game. After Robinson split a pair of free throws and sank a 3-pointer to put the Bulldogs back in front, Ross drilled his career-high tying fifth 3-pointer to give the Tigers a 72-71 lead with 3:13 to play. Georgia scored the game's final 10 points after that. Auburn jumped out to a 14-8 lead but Georgia went on a 13-1 run while holding the Tigers scoreless for nearly five minutes. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Travis Leslie and Sherrard Brantley helped extend the Bulldogs lead to their largest of the game at 29-20 with 6:26 to go in the half. The Tigers made three-straight 3-pointers as Ross banked-in a trey and swished another, and Josh Langford drained one from the left corner. That was followed by a Chris Denson drive in the lane for an 11-2 run to bring Auburn to within 33-32 with 2:05 to go. Trailing 38-34 at halftime, Ross scored two straight layups to tie the game a minute into the second period. His fourth 3-pointer of the game brought Auburn to within 60-55 with 8:11 remaining. A Gabriel jumper and Forbes' shot in the lane on Auburn's next two possessions brought the Tigers within 60-59 with 6:20 to go. A Josh Wallace steal and fastbreak layup by Denson closed the Georgia lead to 66-63 with 1:33 on the clock to set up the heroics in the final seconds of regulation. Kenny Gabriel had 11 points for Auburn while Denson scored 10 points off the bench. Ross also pulled down seven rebounds and had three steals along with 12-of-18 shooting from the field. Ty Armstrong pitched in five points and six boards in 20 minutes while Adrian Forbes had four points and six rebounds. Jeremy Price's 22 points and 14 rebounds led Georgia as Travis Leslie added 20 points and eight boards and Trey Thompkins totaled 16 points, six rebounds and five assists. Auburn shot 42.0 percent from the floor but made a season-high nine 3-pointers on 18 attempts for a season-high 50.0 percent. The Tigers converted only 5-of-

14 free throws compared to Georgia's 25-of-37. Georgia shot 49.0 percent from the field and was 6-of-17 from behind the arc. Much taller Georgia outrebounded Auburn 48-30. The Tigers only had nine turnovers for the second straight weekend, forced 17 Bulldog miscues for a 16-6 edge in points off turnovers.

QUOTING TONY BARBEE (On Mississippi State)

"They are a very talented team, and they are starting to get their chemistry together since (Dee) Bost has come back. He is one of their better players. With him back in the lineup, he brings them to another dimension. (Renaldo) Sidney is starting to get into shape now. They are one of the most talented teams in our conference."

(On Auburn's first game vs. Mississippi State this year)

"Defensively, we didn't play well the first game. We made it really easy for them because we didn't defend well. We had a lot of defensive breakdowns that caused them to get easy baskets under the basket or a 3-point shot. We didn't get back in transition either. We are definitely going to have to get back in transition because with Bost in there, he is looking to score in transition. They are going to pound it down inside to Sidney, and we need to find a way to defend him."

(On having a week off)

"It's good in a way because you have time to prepare for the next game, but it can hurt you because even though we lost at Georgia (last Saturday), we played well. We had some good momentum going also. It may hurt you in that way as far as the rhythm, but I think our guys got after it the last couple of days, and we should be okay. Then, if you have guys with nagging injuries, it can help injuries also. It has good things and bad things in it, but overall, we will be ready to play."

He recorded his fourth career double-double with 20 points, a career-high 13 rebounds and five assists vs. Alabama on Jan. 22.

He is averaging 16.4 points (82) and 7.6 rebounds (38) in Auburn's last five games.

He is the most improved player in the SEC with a +10.4 scoring average improvement from last year when he averaged 2.8 ppg as a freshman.

After coming off the bench for only the second time all season vs. Florida, Ross drilled his first three 3-point attempts in the first half and finished with 11 points on 4-of-6 shooting from the field, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range.

He had 15 points on 5-of-17 shooting from the field, six rebounds and four assists at Mississippi State on Jan. 16.

Ross had 21 points on 5-of-15 three-pointers vs. LSU in the SEC opener.

He notched his third double-double of the season with 10 points and a career-high tying 11 rebounds in the win vs. Florida State on Jan. 3. He had 14 points, nine rebounds and three steals vs. Grambling.

He totaled 20 points, six rebounds, three assists and two steals in the win over Georgia Southern on Dec. 29 and had 16 points and six rebounds vs. USC Upstate on Dec. 21.

Ross recorded the second double-double of his career with 15 points, 10 rebounds and five assists vs. Rutgers on Dec. 11.

He scored a career-high 22 points in Auburn's win over Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 21 on 8-of-13 shooting from the field, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range.

The Cary, N.C., native recorded his first career double-double with 18 points and a career-high 11 rebounds vs. Jacksonville on Nov. 27. He also had four steals.

On the season, he is averaging a team-high 13.2 points and 6.9 rebounds, which ranks 14th in the SEC.

CHUBB

Sophomore Rob Chubb scored a career-high 18 points and had six rebounds in Auburn's 79-64 win at South Carolina on Jan. 29.

He has missed the last two games as he was suspended for a violation of team rules.

He has the eighth most improved scor-

ing average in the SEC this year with a +5.3 increase from 2.8 ppg as a freshman last year to 8.1 ppg this season.

He had 10 points each at No. 15 Kentucky, vs. Florida State and Grambling while scoring 12 against Georgia Southern.

He scored 15 points in 25 minutes vs. Presbyterian on Dec. 18 and had 14 points in 25 minutes vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Dec. 5. Entering the game making 5-of-15 free throws on the season, Chubb made 5-of-6 foul shots in the final minutes and was 6-of-8 for the game. Chubb scored seven of his 14 points in the decisive 11-0 Auburn run in the final four minutes of the game.

He scored 13 points in Auburn's win over Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 21 in only 20 minutes by making half of his 10 shots from the field. The Peachtree City, Ga., native also recorded a career-high 10 rebounds vs. UNC Asheville in the season opener.

KENNY G. ON A ROLL

Kenny Gabriel had a career-high tying 13 rebounds and eight points in Auburn's 79-64 win at South Carolina on Jan. 29.

He has the fifth most improved scoring average in the SEC this year with a +6.8 increase from 2.8 ppg as a freshman last year to 9.6 ppg this season.

He had 12 points vs. Florida on Jan. 20 and 14 points and seven rebounds at Mississippi State on Jan. 16. Gabriel notched 17 points and 7 rebounds vs. LSU in the SEC opener followed by 13 points and nine boards at No. 15 Kentucky.

He recorded the second double-double of his career with 17 points, 12 rebounds and 3 steals vs. Grambling on Dec. 31.

Gabriel scored 15 points vs. Georgia Southern on Dec. 29, totaled 10 points and six rebounds vs. Presbyterian on Dec. 18 and 10 points, five rebounds and four blocks vs. USC Upstate on Dec. 21.

He tied his career-high with 18 points on 4-of-7 field goals, including 3-of-5 three-pointers and 7-of-8 free throws vs. Rutgers on Dec. 11. It was the first time the Charlotte, N.C., native reached double figures since the season opener when he had a double-double with 18 points and 13 rebounds vs. UNC Asheville.

On the season, he is averaging 9.6 points and 6.0 rebounds.

WALLACE MAKING A POINT

Sophomore walk-on Josh Wallace leads the SEC with 2.0 steals per game, is third averaging 3.8 assists and is second in the league with a 2.0 assist-to-turnover ratio.

He scored a career-high 17 points to go along with four rebounds, three assists and two steals in Auburn's 79-64 victory at South Carolina.

In the last 14 games, he is averaging 6.7 points (94) and 3.3 assists (46). He had only averaged 1.8 points in the five games prior.

Wallace had 10 points, five assists, three steals and three rebounds at Mississippi State on Jan. 16.

He scored a career-high 13 points vs. USC Upstate on Dec. 21, had nine points vs. Presbyterian, and eight points and five assists vs. Georgia Southern.

Wallace's finest game as a Tiger came in the win over Florida State in which he totaled nine points, a career-high seven assists and a career-high four rebounds. He scored five straight points to give Auburn a 57-50 lead with 1:13 remaining.

The Pensacola, Fla., native is averaging 5.6 points, 4.0 assists and 1.9 steals in 26.8 minutes per game this year.

BRINGING THE PAYNE

Freshman Allen Payne is averaging 9.3 points and 4.3 rebounds in Auburn's last four games.

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native had team-highs of 13 points and seven rebounds vs. Tennessee on Feb. 3. He had six points and a career-high eight rebounds in Auburn's 79-64 win at South Carolina on Jan. 29.

Payne had 13 points and three assists at Arkansas on Jan. 25. He scored a SEC-high 15 points at No. 15 Kentucky on Jan. 11 on 2-of-4 shooting from 3-point range. He also had five rebounds two assists and two steals.

On the season, he is averaging 6.1 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.0 steals in 21.3 minutes per game.

CD PLATINUM

Freshman Chris Denson is averaging 8.0 points in Auburn's last four games after going scoreless in the previous two.

Denson had 10 points off the bench for the second time in three games at Georgia on Feb. 5.

He scored 10 points, all in the second half, in 12 minutes off the bench in Au-

burn's 79-64 win at South Carolina on Jan. 29 and followed that up with five points and two steals vs. Tennessee on Feb. 3.

Denson had a season-high 12 points in a season-high 19 minutes at Mississippi State on Jan. 16. He was 4-of-6 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range.

Prior to the game, the Columbus, Ga., native had only scored four total points in 48 minutes in five games.

Denson then started the first game of his career vs. Florida on Jan. 20, going scoreless but dishing out four assists in 15 minutes.

He started three straight games and had seven points and five rebounds at Arkansas on Jan. 25.

FROSH JOSH

Freshman Josh Langford scored an SEC-high nine points in 16 minutes vs. Tennessee on Feb. 3. He scored a career-high 16 points on 4-of-5 three-pointers in the win vs. Florida State on Jan. 3. He entered the game shooting 4-of-12 from 3-point range on the season.

He had seven points and two rebounds in nine minutes vs. Alabama on Jan. 22.

Langford scored 13 points, all in the first half, vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff before being saddled by foul trouble in the second half.

He scored 11 points, all in the first half, against Georgia Southern on Dec. 29.

He is averaging 5.1 points and 2.8 rebounds in 15.5 minutes per game this year.

FORBES 500

Junior Adrian Forbes scored a career-high 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field at Arkansas on Jan. 25 in 21 minutes off the bench. He also had three rebounds, an assist, block and steal.

He had four points and six rebounds in 25 minutes at Georgia on Feb. 5.

On the season, he is averaging 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds in 14.4 minutes per game.

TY ARMSTRONG RETURNS

Auburn sophomore forward Ty Armstrong played for the first time this season against Florida on Jan. 20 coming back from successful surgery after injuring his left knee in mid-August.

Armstrong played eight minutes against the Gators with two points and three rebounds.

The Melbourne, Fla., native, had five

points and six rebounds in 20 minutes at Georgia on Feb. 5.

He is no longer eligible for a medical hardship waiver.

FRANKIE SULLIVAN OUT FOR YEAR

Auburn junior guard Frankie Sullivan will miss the rest of the season because of his left knee injury in July, announced head coach Tony Barbee on Jan. 17.

Averaging 8.2 points and 3.0 assists in 24.7 minutes per game, Sullivan played in Auburn's six games prior to SEC play and hasn't played since.

Sullivan missed Auburn's opening eight games this year and has not played in a SEC game. Auburn will apply for a medical hardship waiver for him.

He played nine minutes at South Florida on Dec. 15 in his first game action of the season after coming back from left knee surgery on July 27.

Auburn was on a season-best four game winning streak and it is no coincidence the run started with Frankie Sullivan returning to the starting lineup. The Tigers were 4-0 in the four games Sullivan started vs. Florida State, USC Upstate, Georgia Southern and Grambling.

He averaged 10.0 points per game as a starter.

The 6-foot-1, 185-pound Uniontown, Ala., native, averaged 12.7 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists last season. Sullivan shot 43 percent from the field, 37 percent from 3-point range and was second in the SEC shooting 85 percent from the foul line. He scored a career-high 27 points in last year's SEC Tournament first round loss to Florida.

NOEL JOHNSON TRANSFERS TO AUBURN

Noel Johnson, a 6-foot-7, 200-pound, sophomore guard has transferred from Clemson to attend Auburn University and play basketball in 2011-12, head coach Tony Barbee announced on Jan. 14. Johnson will be eligible following the 2011 fall semester and will have 1.5 years of eligibility for Auburn.

"We are excited about Noel joining the Auburn Family," said Barbee. "He is a talented player. When you have a guy with his size and his skills, a 6-foot-7 guard who can handle it, who can shoot it, who can pass it, he is a matchup nightmare for teams. He is a big-time shooter. When he lets the ball go you think it is going in every time. He shoots with range. He can

do a lot of things. He is very skilled.

"As good of a basketball player as he is, he is just as good a person. I am excited about what Noel is going to bring the Auburn Family on and off the floor."

A consensus top 56 prospect coming out of Fayette County High School in Fayetteville, Ga., in 2009, Johnson was rated as the nation's No. 30 prospect by ESPNU, No. 40 by HoopsReport.com, No. 48 by PrepStars, No. 53 by Rivals.com, No. 54 by Hoop Scoop and No. 56 by Scout.com.

Johnson played in seven games this year for Clemson while starting one and averaged 2.9 points and 1.6 rebounds in 13.1 minutes. He played the most minutes in Clemson's freshman class last season playing in all 32 games, averaging 4.8 points in 14.8 minutes per game. He shot 36.7 percent (29-of-79) from 3-point range and 73 percent from the foul line.

Johnson averaged 9.0 points in Clemson's postseason games against NC State and Missouri in the NCAA Tournament First Round. In the ACC Tournament first round game vs. NC State, he scored an ACC-high 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting from 3-point range.

Rated as the No. 3 small forward in his class by ESPNU, Johnson earned first-team All-State honors as a senior when he averaged 21 points, eight rebounds and four assists for coach Andre Flynn. He led Fayette County to the Class 4A state championship game and a pair of region championships.

He averaged 23.8 points and 8.4 rebounds as a junior, was a three-time team MVP and scored over 1,500 points in his high school career.

Johnson enrolled in classes at Auburn on Jan. 13. He is the son of Lynbert "Cheese" Johnson, a star at Wichita State from 1976-79, who played for the NBA's Golden State Warriors.

With Frankie Sullivan and Ty Armstrong (returned Jan. 20 vs. Florida) out with injuries, only 12 percent of Auburn's scoring returned from last year's 15-17 team.

INJURED TIGERS

Auburn lost two starters to injuries in a span of three weeks this summer.

Junior Frankie Sullivan underwent successful surgery on his left knee on July 27 while Ty Armstrong had successful surgery after injuring his left knee in mid-August and played his first game of the season vs. Florida on Jan. 20.

Sullivan missed the first eight games of the season before coming back at South Florida on Dec. 15, scoring four points in nine minutes. He played in six games and then missed the SEC opener vs. LSU.

Sullivan is out for the season while Armstrong has only played in limited action since his first game of the season vs. Florida on Jan. 20..

Armstrong, who is 6-foot-9, 220, played in 30 games last year, averaging 2.0 points and 1.6 rebounds in 6.6 minutes per game.

No. 1 PLAYER IN THE STATE

Huntsville's Josh Langford was ranked No. 1 on the final 2010 Birmingham News Boys Super Seniors list last year. He was named the Alabama MVP in the annual Alabama-Mississippi All-Star Classic in March 2010 after scoring a game-high 25 points to go along with 9 rebounds while making 11-of-17 shots from the field.

He averaged 22 points and 13 rebounds on the season in leading Lee High School to the Class 5A State Championship as a senior in 2009-10.

Langford is the first No. 1 player in the state of Alabama that has signed with Auburn since Selma High School's Doc Robinson signed on Nov. 13, 1995. Rob-

inson became a first-team All-American point guard who helped Auburn to the 1999 SEC Championship and a 29-4 record, a state of Alabama Div. I record for wins.

NO SENIORS ON ROSTER

There is not one single senior on this year's Auburn's roster. In fact, Frankie Sullivan is the only player on scholarship who has earned two varsity letters, and he is out for the season with injury.

WALK-ON STARTING POINT GUARD

Sophomore walk-on Josh Wallace started the first five games at point guard this season and has now started since returning to the lineup vs. USC Upstate on Dec. 21.

The 5-foot-10, 160-pounder played in 24 games last year, averaging 1.2 points and 1.0 assist in 7.5 minutes per game.

PAIR OF WALK-ONS ADDED

Coach Tony Barbee added a pair of walk-ons prior to the start of the season in 6-foot-9 senior Doug Merrell and 5-foot-9 freshman T.J. Rice.

Merrell was a three-year letterman at Vestavia Hills High in Birmingham and averaged 10 points and 10 rebounds as a junior and senior.

Rice was a four-year letterman at Alpharetta (Ga.) High where he averaged 10 points and five assists as a senior.

AUBURN ARENA QUICK SKETCH

The official groundbreaking of the new \$86 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008.

The Auburn Arena, with a capacity of 9,121, includes over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum and two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., worked with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham served as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility features chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also provides improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along

with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility enables the team another practice areas.

The arena has 12 luxury suites on the arena level that not only open inside the facility, but also opens on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating also is available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration offers better sight lines and moves fans closer to the court. The furthest seat is just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in Auburn Arena being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard features a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there is a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility serves as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation into a site for concerts, other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

NATHANIEL ROOT BOOK

Nathaniel Root, Auburn's video coordinator, will have a book out in April titled *Root: A Blues City Hoop Dream*

Root's book is about how he discovered he had a heart problem in high school, but overcame it to achieve his dream, playing basketball at Memphis.

"It's a motivational book ... a feel good story about coming out of Adamsville (Tenn.) and having a heart condition that almost kept me out of basketball," Root said. "I went unrecruited, but my dream was to play at Memphis."

Root had heart surgery in August 1998 prior to his senior year at Adamsville High School. He was cut during tryouts for Coach John Calipari's Memphis' basketball team as a freshman but was called back to join the Tigers when a football

player who also played basketball decided to play just football.

Root started practicing and dressed out on game days after a week. He earned a scholarship after his sophomore year and started his first career game vs. UAB in The Pyramid as a junior.

His No. 32 Adamsville jersey was retired by his high school in 2004.

2010 FALL SIGNEEES

• Cedrick McAfee, 6-3, 175, G Memphis, Tenn. (Melrose)

Cedrick McAfee, ranked 74th nationally by Rivals.com and the 19th top guard in the country, plays for Melrose High School, which is the No. 1 ranked team in America. McAfee had 18 points in the Golden Wildcats' season-opening 66-34 victory over Fairley.

He averaged 24 points per game at Craigmont High last year before transferring to Melrose in the middle of the season.

McAfee chose Auburn over Memphis, Baylor, South Carolina, Missouri, Miami, Arkansas and Florida International. This past summer, he attended the LeBron James camp in Akron, Ohio, the NBA Top 100 camp in Charlottesville, Va., and the Paul Pierce Skills Academy in Chicago.

"I am excited about our first full-time signing class for this fall," said Auburn head coach Tony Barbee. "I think we addressed some needs that we have as a program and are continuing to build the depth as a part of this team, especially in the guard position with Cedrick McAfee. He is going to add a lot in terms of his versatility and his ability to play multiple positions because of his athleticism at 6-3 and his skill to be able to score the ball and also run a team.

"I am excited about Cedrick and what he is going to bring to the floor but also because I think all three of the guys are going to be great Auburn men. They really represent what Auburn stands for ... great people, great character and really good students who are fantastic basketball players and more importantly, they all come from winning programs under great coaches as (Melrose) Coach (Jermaine) Johnson and (Central Park Christian) Coach (Donovan) Broadnax. So they understand what winning is about, and I have always said winning breeds winning, and that's what we like to recruit."

• Willy Kouassi, 6-10, 215, C

Birmingham, Ala. (Central Park Christian)

A native of the Ivory Coast, Willy Kouassi (pronounced Kuh - Wah - See) is ranked 87th nationally by Rivals.com and the 11th best center in the country. Kouassi averaged 12 points and 10 rebounds for loaded Birmingham Central Park Christian. He chose Auburn over Florida, Memphis, Pittsburgh, Georgia Tech, Missouri, Georgia, Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, Wake Forest, Alabama, UAB, Arkansas, Ole Miss, Nebraska and Tulsa.

"Willy and Bernard (Morena) are going to be fantastic players for us," said Auburn head coach Tony Barbee. "They are fantastic kids and fantastic students, but they both bring a different dimension. Willy brings us a bigger presence along the frontline who can rebound and really block shots. He is very athletic for his size at 6-10 and has a high motor and high energy level. He has to get better on the offensive end of the floor, but he can score down there given the opportunity."

• Bernard Morena, 6-8, 195, F Birmingham, Ala. (Central Park Christian)

Bernard Morena (pronounced Ma - rain - a), a native of the Ivory Coast and a teammate of Willy Kouassi at Birmingham Central Park Christian, averaged 10 points per game last year. He chose Auburn over UAB, Alabama, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt. Now in their second year at Central Park Christian, Kouassi and Morena led the school to the National Association of Christian Athletes national title last season.

Kouassi is interested in studying agricultural economics and Morena is planning to major in engineering.

"I am excited about Bernard because he gives us a 6-8 versatile inside-out player who can play on the wing," said Auburn head coach Tony Barbee. "He can play from the post. He can shoot it. He can score around the basket. He has long arms, and he is very athletic so he will be a very good defender on the perimeter with his length. We are excited about this first full-time class and look forward to possibly signing a couple more late."

AUBURN TRIPLE-DOUBLES?

Never in the 105 seasons and 2,301 games of Auburn Basketball (1226-1074-1) (.533) has a Tiger recorded a coveted triple-double.

OVERTIME RECORD

Auburn has a 45-47 (.489) record in overtime games in its history. The Tigers are 1-2 in overtime games this year, losing at Georgia 81-72 on Feb. 5, defeating Georgia Southern 88-84 on Dec. 29 in Auburn while losing to UNC Asheville 70-69 in this year's season opener.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Auburn plays at Ole Miss (16-8, 4-5) next Wednesday at 7 pm Central in Tad Smith Coliseum in Oxford. The game will be televised on the SEC Network. The Rebels, who play at Alabama on Saturday, have won four of their last five games over LSU 66-60, at Arkansas 69-60, No. 10 Kentucky 71-69 and at LSU 78-51 with the lone loss coming to Tennessee 74-57. Chris Warren ranks second in the SEC averaging 18.7 points per game, second with 2.7 three-pointers made and fourth in the league with 3.8 assists. Zach Graham adds 14.3 points. Ole Miss leads the SEC shooting 75.3 percent from the foul line and is third averaging 74.9 points per game and third shooting 34.5 percent from 3-point range.

Steve Peterson made a fade-away, contested 18-footer from the baseline just before the shot clock expired with 15.1 seconds remaining in the game to give Columbus State a 54-52 exhibition victory over Auburn in Auburn Arena. The Tigers had three shots in the lane to tie it as Earnest Ross missed a jumper, Kenny Gabriel's tip-in fell off followed by a Rob Chubb putback that went awry as time expired. Ross led Auburn with 14 points and six rebounds and Gabriel had eight points and 11 boards while Andre Malone chipped in 10 points off the bench. The Tigers shot a woeful 7-of-20 from the foul line and made a valiant effort coming back from a 12 point deficit with 12 minutes to play. Auburn jumped out to a 10-2 lead but let Div. II Columbus State score 11 straight points. Down 32-27 at the half, the Tigers scored only two points in the first 8:16 as the Cougars built their largest lead of the game at 41-29 with 12:19 to play. Auburn then scored 8 straight points to get to within 41-37 with 9 minutes to go, but Columbus State pushed its lead back out to 50-42 with 3:46 left. Andre Malone scored a career-high 28 points but it couldn't offset Samford's 18 made three-pointers en route to the Bulldogs' 79-68 victory over Auburn in the Global Sports Hoops Showcase in Auburn Arena. Malone made 6-of-10 three-pointers but Samford's Josh Davis scored a career-high tying 30 points on 8-of-10 treys. Josh Bedwell added 21 points for the Bulldogs on 5-of-7 made 3-pointers. The 18 made threes by Samford set an Auburn home game record dating back to the 1986-87 season when the 3-point shot was instituted by the NCAA. The 18 made threes broke the record of 15 made by Auburn against Arkansas in 1996, vs. West Florida in 1994 and Nicholls State in 2004, all in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Samford broke away from a 54-52 lead with 9:32 remaining by scoring 13 straight points to go ahead 67-52 with 6:27 left. Auburn got to within seven points twice the rest of the way but that is as close as the Tigers could get. Davis went a perfect 7-of-7 from 3-point range in the first half to give Samford a 38-32 lead at intermission. Malone did his best to match him for Auburn as he went 5-of-7 from behind the arc for 18 first half points. Kenny Gabriel and Allen Payne each scored eight points for the Tigers. Auburn shot 42.1 percent (8-of-19) from 3-point range, 42.4 percent from the field and went 10-of-15 from the foul line. Samford, which defeated Auburn for only the second time in 24 meetings and the first since 1940, shot 57.8 percent from the field, 54.5 percent (18-of-33) from 3-point range and 9-of-15 from the free throw line.

Mississippi State shot 62 percent from the field and jumped on Auburn early to defeat the Tigers 85-66 behind 21 points from Ravern Johnson in Humphrey Coliseum. The Bulldogs had a 22-3 lead nine minutes into the game and were never threatened by the Tigers. The closest Auburn would get the rest of the way was 12 points in the second half. The Tigers fell behind by as much as 30-9 before ending the half down 41-22. Mississippi State pushed its lead to 46-23 and then led 53-36 before Auburn scored five straight points behind a layup and 3-pointer both by Earnest Ross to close to within 53-41 with 13:50 remaining. Erving Walker was the only Florida player to score in double figures with 12 points to lead the Gators by Auburn 45-40 in Auburn Arena. Kenny Gabriel had 12 points and Earnest Ross 11 for the Tigers. With Auburn holding a 40-37 lead with 1:52 remaining, Kenny Boynton and Walker made back-to-back 3-pointers to put Florida ahead 43-40 with 1:14 left. The Tigers had one last chance to tie it, but Ross missed a contested 3-pointer from the corner with 11 seconds to go. Auburn's defense held Florida to the fewest points scored in Gator head coach Billy Donovan's 15 years at the school. It was the fewest points in a league the Tigers have allowed since a 52-37 victory at Arkansas on Jan. 11, 2003, and it was the fewest points Auburn has scored since a 38-36 overtime victory over Mississippi State in the 1982 SEC Tournament. Auburn, which had been down by 20 plus points in the first half of each of its previous three SEC games, held its largest lead of the game at 18-11 on a Ross 3-pointer with 9:33 left in the opening period. Ross nailed the third of his three treys to give the Tigers a 24-18 lead with 6:51 left. The Tigers went scoreless the rest of the half but still had a 24-23 halftime edge. The game was close for the remainder of the contest with Auburn leading most of the way and never trailing by more than one point until the final 74 seconds. Ty Armstrong, who had 2 points and 3 rebounds in 8 minutes playing his first game of the season since having successful surgery on his left knee in mid-August, had an offensive put-back to give the Tigers their largest lead of the second half at 34-30 with 9:39 left. The Gators were 3-of-24 from 3-point range before catching fire and making their final two attempts from behind the arc. Auburn held Florida to only 28.3 percent from the field and 19.2 percent from 3-point range. The Tigers shot 37.5 percent from the floor, were 3-of-11 on 3-pointers and a woeful 1-of-8 (.125) from the free throw line.

Earnest Ross had 20 points, 13 rebounds and five assists but it wasn't enough as Alabama pulled away in the end for a 68-58 victory over Auburn before a sold out crowd at Auburn Arena. The Tigers trailed 51-49 on a jumper by Rob Chubb with 5:07 left but went scoreless for the next 4:06 as the Crimson Tide pulled ahead 59-49. Alabama made 15-of-18 free throws in the final 2:14 as Auburn had to foul. In the first half, Auburn had a 22-17 lead with 7:17 left but had another five-minute dry spell without a point as Alabama scored eight straight points. The game was close throughout until the final minutes as there were 19 lead changes and nine ties. Auburn jumped out to an 11-7 lead and then pushed it out to 22-17. Alabama, which snapped a four-game losing streak to the Tigers in Auburn, ended the half on a 12-5 run to take a 29-27 halftime lead. After the Auburn football team accepted the James E. Foy ODK Sportsmanship Trophy at intermission for beating Alabama 28-27, neither team led by more than three points in the second half until the Tide pulled away at the end. Auburn's defense held Alabama to 41.7 percent from the field and 4-of-20 (.200) from behind the 3-point arc and the Tigers outrebounded the taller Tide 36-29. The Tigers, which averaged 13.8 turnovers in SEC play, turned it over 21 times and were outscored 25-11 in points off turnovers. Alabama missed only six of its 30 foul shots for 80 percent. Auburn shot 38.0 percent from the floor, 4-of-14 (.286) from behind the arc and 16-of-22 (.727) from the foul line. Gabriel added 11 points, six rebounds and three steals for the Tigers while Chubb added nine points and Josh Langford seven. JaMychal Green and Tony Mitchell each scored 15 points for Alabama.

Rob Chubb scored a career-high 18 points, Josh Wallace added a career-high 17 points while Kenny Gabriel tied a career-high with 13 rebounds and 8 points to lead Auburn to a 79-64 victory over South Carolina in Colonial Life Arena for its first SEC win of the season. The Tigers held the Gamecocks scoreless for five minutes down the stretch after South Carolina closed and 11 point deficit to 57-52 with 8:12 remaining. Auburn went on a 10-0 run and outscored South Carolina 22-12 the rest of the way as the road team won for the eighth time in nine tries in the series. Trailing 15-8 at 12:22, Auburn scored 9 straight points to take a 16-15 lead on a pair of Allen Payne free throws, and Tony Neysmith's tear drop in the lane put the Tigers ahead 25-20 with 7:14 left. Auburn never trailed again after 7 lead changes and 3 ties. Rob Chubb's tip-in gave the Tigers their biggest lead at 31-24 with 2:17 left capping a 23-9 run. Auburn held a 33-28 lead at intermission. Chubb's baby hook in the lane, a Josh Wallace steal and follow dunk by Payne quickly gave Auburn a 37-28 lead 42 seconds into the second half. The Tigers pushed it to 47-36 at 15:42 to play on a Chris Denson layup that was triggered by an Adrian Forbes block and Wallace full court assist. Earnest Ross had 10 points and 7 rebounds, and Denson totaled 10 second half points and 3 rebounds off the bench in 12 minutes for the Tigers. Payne pitched in 6 points and a career-high 8 rebounds. The Tigers held the Gamecocks to 34.5 percent shooting from the floor and 7-of-33 (7-of-33) from 3-point range. Auburn only committed nine turnovers.

The Volunteers pushed their lead to 13 points at 19-6 just over eight minutes into the game. With Tennessee leading 37-24 at the half, Josh Wallace made a layup for the first points of the second half but that is as close as Auburn would get the rest of the way. Tennessee built its lead to 52-34 and then 60-38 with nine minutes to play. The Vols led 66-44 with 5:10 to play before the Tigers ended the game on a 12-3 run. Earnest Ross scored a career-high 30 points, including Auburn's final 9 points, but the scrappy Tigers lost an 81-72 overtime heartbreaker to Georgia in Stegeman Coliseum. Ross, who made 5-of-7 3-pointers, scored 4 points in 3.7 seconds to send the game into overtime. Georgia led by 6 with under 3 minutes to go in regulation and led 67-63 before Ross made a layup with 13.7 seconds remaining, stole the inbounds pass at midcourt and drove in for the tying layup with 10 seconds left. Gerald Robinson drove the length of the court and missed a layup in traffic just before the buzzer as the game went into overtime tied at 67. Ross opened the extra period with another layup to give Auburn a 69-67 lead, its first since 15-13 just under eight minutes into the game. After Robinson split a pair of free throws and sank a 3-pointer to put the Bulldogs back in front, Ross drilled his career-high tying fifth trey to give the Tigers a 72-71 lead with 3:13 to play. Georgia scored the game's final 10 points after that. Auburn jumped out to a 14-8 lead but Georgia went on a 13-1 run while holding the Tigers scoreless for nearly 5 minutes. Back-to-back 3-pointers by Travis Leslie and Sherrard Brantley helped extend the Bulldogs' lead to their largest of the game at 29-20 with 6:26 to go in the half. The Tigers made 3-straight 3-pointers as Ross banked in a trey and swished another, and Josh Langford drained one from the left corner. That was followed by a Chris Denson drive in the lane for an 11-2 run to bring Auburn to within 33-32 with 2:05 to go. Trailing 38-34 at halftime, Ross scored 2 straight layups to tie the game a minute in. His fourth 3-pointer of the game brought Auburn to within 60-55 with 8:11 left. A Gabriel jumper and Forbes' shot in the lane on Auburn's next 2 possessions brought the Tigers within 60-59 with 6:20 to go. A Josh Wallace steal and Denson fastbreak layup closed the Georgia lead to 66-63 with 1:33 left to set up the heroics in the final seconds of regulation. Kenny Gabriel had 11 points for Auburn while Denson scored 10 points off the bench. Ross also pulled down seven rebounds and had three steals along with 12-of-18 shooting from the field. Jeremy Price's 22 points and 14 rebounds led Georgia as Travis Leslie added 20 points and eight boards and Trey Thompkins totaled 16 points, six rebounds and five assists.
